

At the end of our Sophomore year our financial standing amounted to \$34.25.

There were two outstanding events in our Junior year. They were, need I mention them (?), the Junior Play and the J-Hop. Mrs. Frank Hawkins did a splendid job of directing the play, "Little Miss Dreamer", and the acting ability of a lot of our classmates was certainly brought to the surface. The Hop was a very gala event, with its colorful spring decorations. The So-Phis-To-Cats were engaged to furnish us with music for the evening. This proved to be our first big money-making project; a profit of \$90.00 was added to our savings. President Arlene Blake, Vice-President Ken Wolfe, Secretary Jean Orr, Treasurer James Dixon and Alderman Pat Klein, helped make this year a success with their leadership.

The Senior Booth at the fair did not plan out as well as was expected owing to the fact that our profits only came to \$147.00 but we didn't let this discourage us. Everyone worked hard and we appreciate the guidance given us by Mr. William Hensch and Mrs. Ida B. Cooke.

The Senior Prom was a huge success and all of us enjoyed dancing to the music of Jerry Beisel and his Orchestra. Profits on that dance, we are proud to inform you, were \$110.

Next in line was our last but not least money-making venture, the Senior play, "Girl Shy", directed by E. C. Mollema and Charles Yahne. Again we proved that some of our class members were dramatically inclined.

Then at long last, on April 29, 38 smiling, excited Seniors were given a hilarious farewell at the Northville Depot and off they went to Washington. Mr. and Mrs. William Hensch and Mrs. Ida B. Cooke chaperoned this group and they say as we all do that they will never quite forget the wonderful time we had.

This June, 53 Seniors will be graduated from Northville High and soon they will be looking back, some perhaps a little wistfully, and realizing that their school days are behind them forever.
