## Architect model of the New High School

All of us are looking forward to the new high school which will be completed some time early in 1959. It will be located directly behind the Amerman Grade School. The price will be approximately $\$ 1,850,000$.

The ground breaking cerempnies for the building were held March 14, with Mayor, Dick Stuber, turning up the first piece of sod. Mr. Ellison expects to have six hundred and fifty students entering the school upon its completion. At first it will be used for grades nine through twelve, but as the number of students increase, it will be used as a Senior High School and a Junior High School will be built for grades seven through nine.

The new school will have many facilities that this one does not contain. It will have
 a lunchroom and cafeteria facilities. Educational and vocational counselors will be on hand for the benefit of the students. Both the home economics and driver training facilities will be greatly expanded. There will also be much improved music rooms which will be acoustically treated. It will include an auditorium with six hundred fifty theater type seats. The gym will be large enough so that it can be divided into two full sized basketball courts - for boys and girls. For sports, there will be a baseball diamond, a football field, a track, and tennis courts. There will also be a parking lot big enough to hold 300 cars.
