## Officers Help Solve

## Students' ${ }^{\text {roblems }}$

Keeping the school running with a minimum of confusion is the joint problem of administrators and counselors. Administrators deal with large-scale operational problems, such as class schedules for 1150 students, while counselors help solve personal problems.

This year two members of Vorthville's counseling staff experimented with an in-town counseling center called U-Kan. The purpurpose of opening this center was to give students more opportunity to talk with their counselors and make counseling appointments with working parents more convenient.

The administration has not been without problems this year. They enacted what started out to be a very controversial hall pass policy. Every student in the hall was required to carry a pass from his classroom. However, students found little inconvience with the system and the controversy subsided.
