Board Continues Strategic Plan

The Board continued to implement the Strategic Plan approved in June 1989. One of the major focuses of the Plan was to review the structure and class offerings in the high school. A second major goal of the Plan was to bring additional technology such as video, data, and voice communications, additional computer labs, and computer aided design units to the high school. In addition, the Board worked with the community to pass an additional millage to replace money taken away by the State of Michigan. At the yearly Board meeting at Northville High School, the Board heard reports about student trips to Europe and Africa, and also met students receiving academic honors. The board also adopted a special resolution commending the football team for a special "dream season."





Support For Special Needs Students

Prevention and Intervention

The Student Assistance Program at Northville High School was implemented in November 1987. It is a school-based program which provides education, support, and awareness in order to intervene, identify, assess, and refer when necessary for students and families involved in or concerned about chemical use, abuse, and dependency. Students can be referred by families, staff, friends, or be self referred. Students are seen in groups such as Aftercare, Chemical Awareness, Relationships, and Fresh Start Stop Smoking.

Students benefit from this program and in most cases, it helps them take a hard look at their substance abuse problem, as well as the positives and negatives of relationships they are in.

"Project Pride Day"


Last March, Northville High held its first "Project Pride Day" featuring speaker Laurie Stewart. Although the three hour assembly seemed to promise only boredom and lectures, it instead captivated the audience by including students in demonstrations and by telling anecdotes. Stewart spoke of a topic that all high school students are familiar with: self-esteem. She spoke about how much positive and negative criticism affects a person more than others realize. Phrases such as, "Criticism hurts. It hurts you, it hurts me. It injures our goals," made students realize that everyone has feelings. The assembly ended emotionally as students spoke to the school about thanking and apologizing to friends. Then everyone was allowed to seek out their friends for a hug, thank you, or apology. After the assembly, classes held discussions relating to self-esteem, and in the evening, parents were invited to listen to Stewart speak. Laurie Stewart taught students and parents not only about themselves, but also about others.





NHS Awards Conferred







Debate Has Winning Season

























Cagers Set New Record









Men's Tennis Is Promising



The Junior Varsity team had a great season with a 9-5-1 record.










Best Team Ever!
