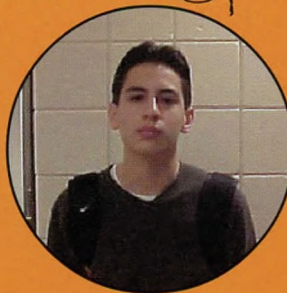

Sick and tired of not getting enough sleep? Ever been too tired to get work done? Through the year, many students encountered this problem daily.

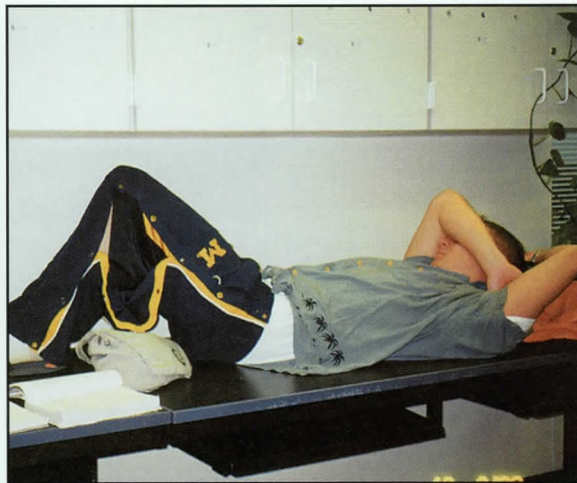

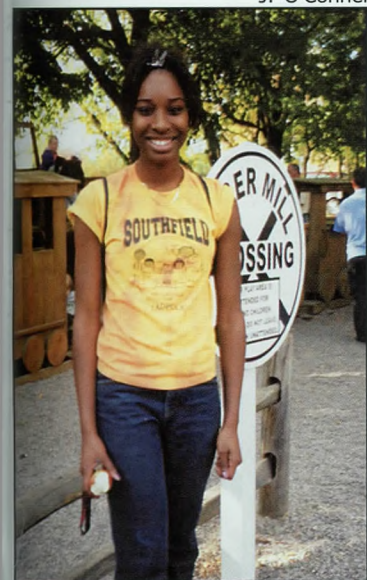

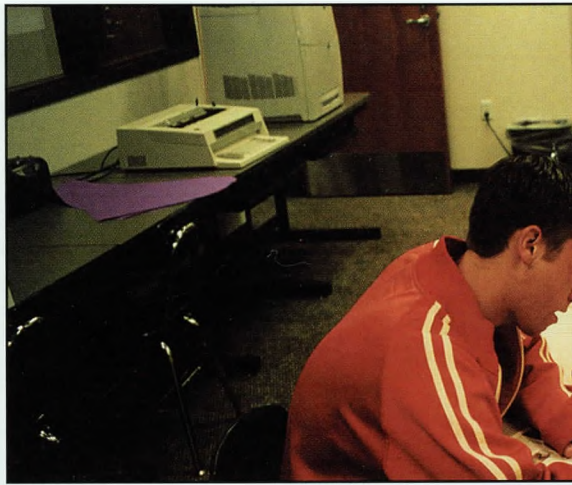

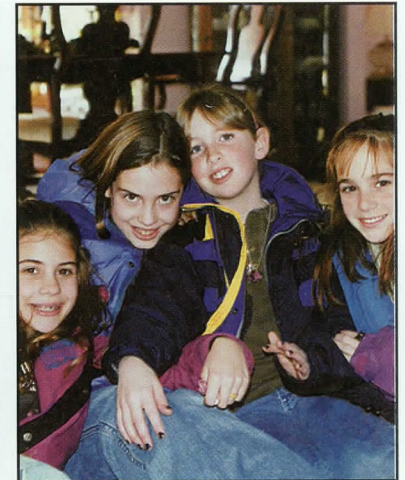

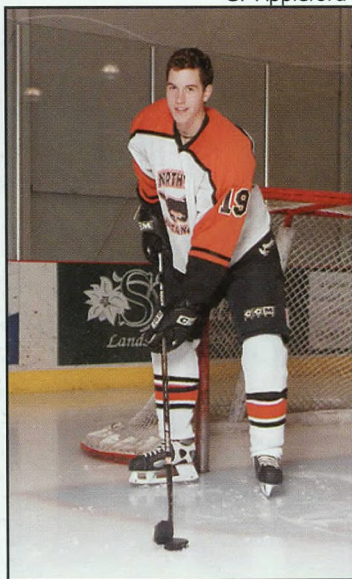

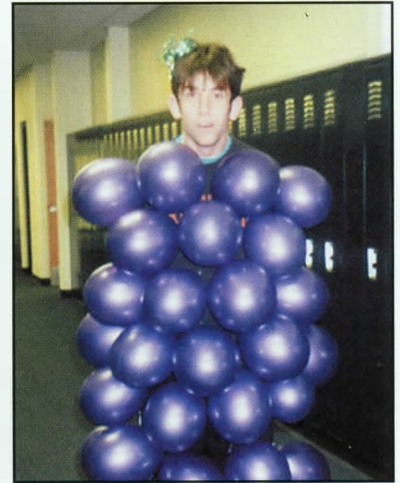

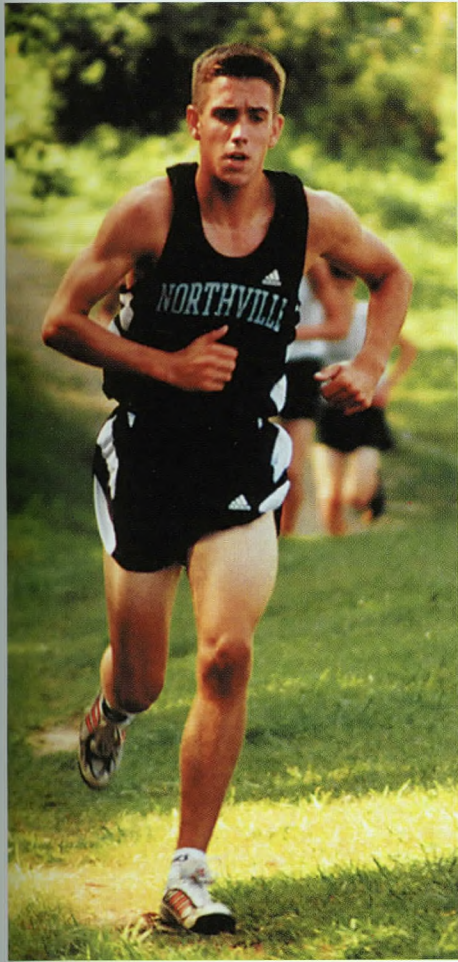

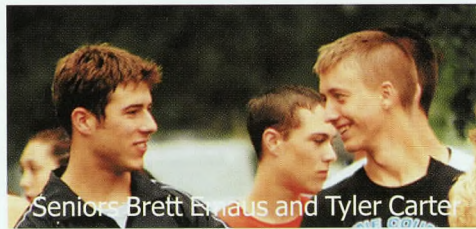

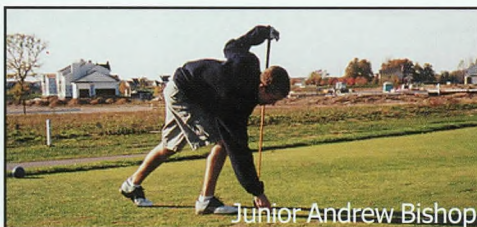

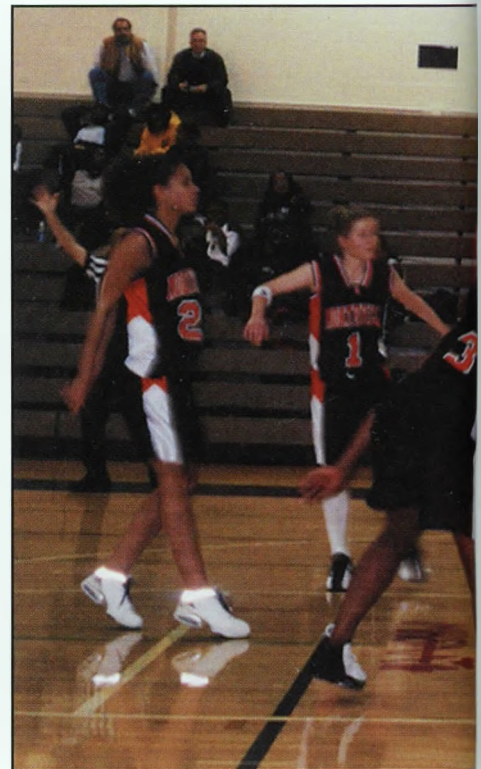

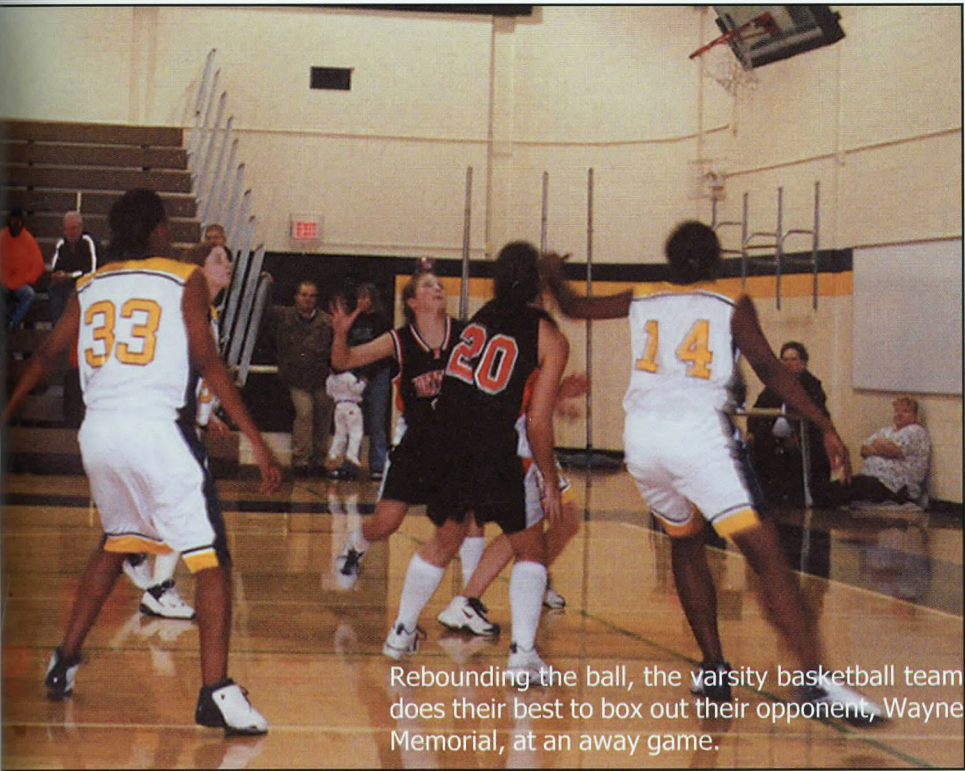

team also defeated rival schools Livonia Churchill and Livonia Stevenson.

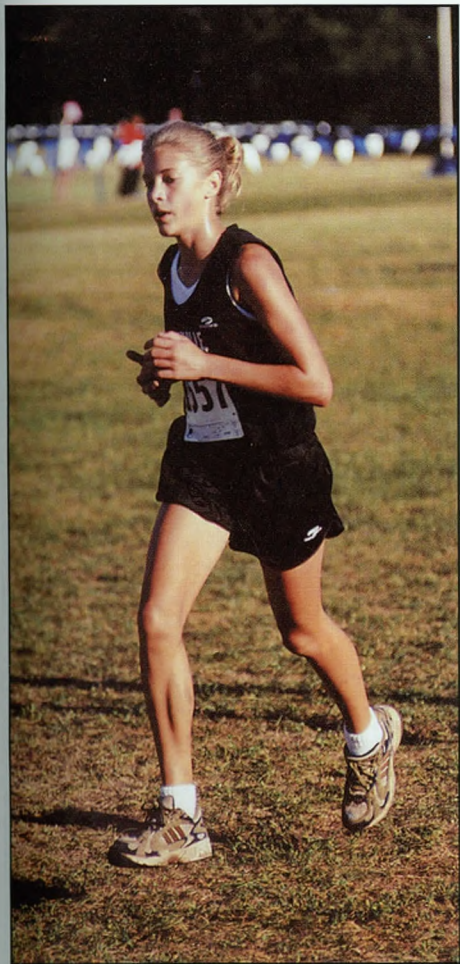

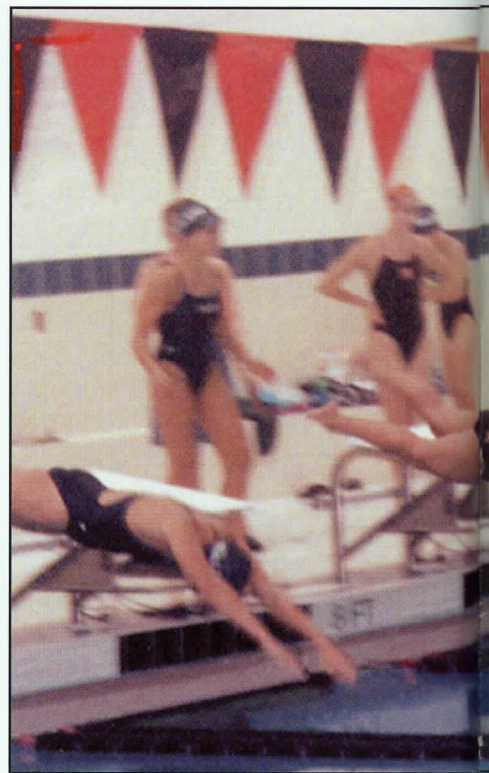

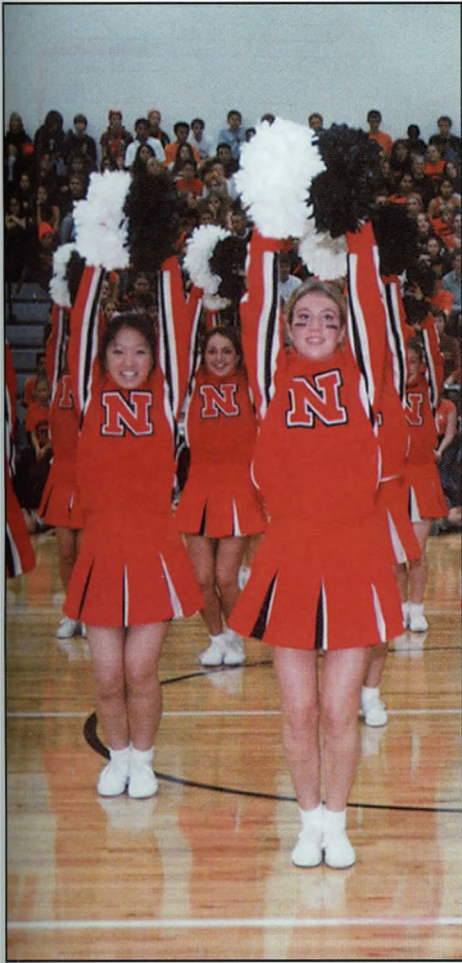

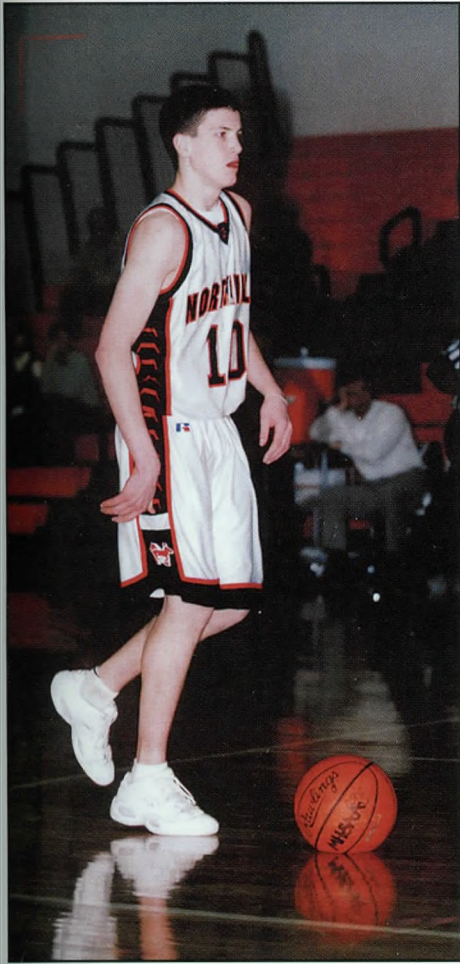

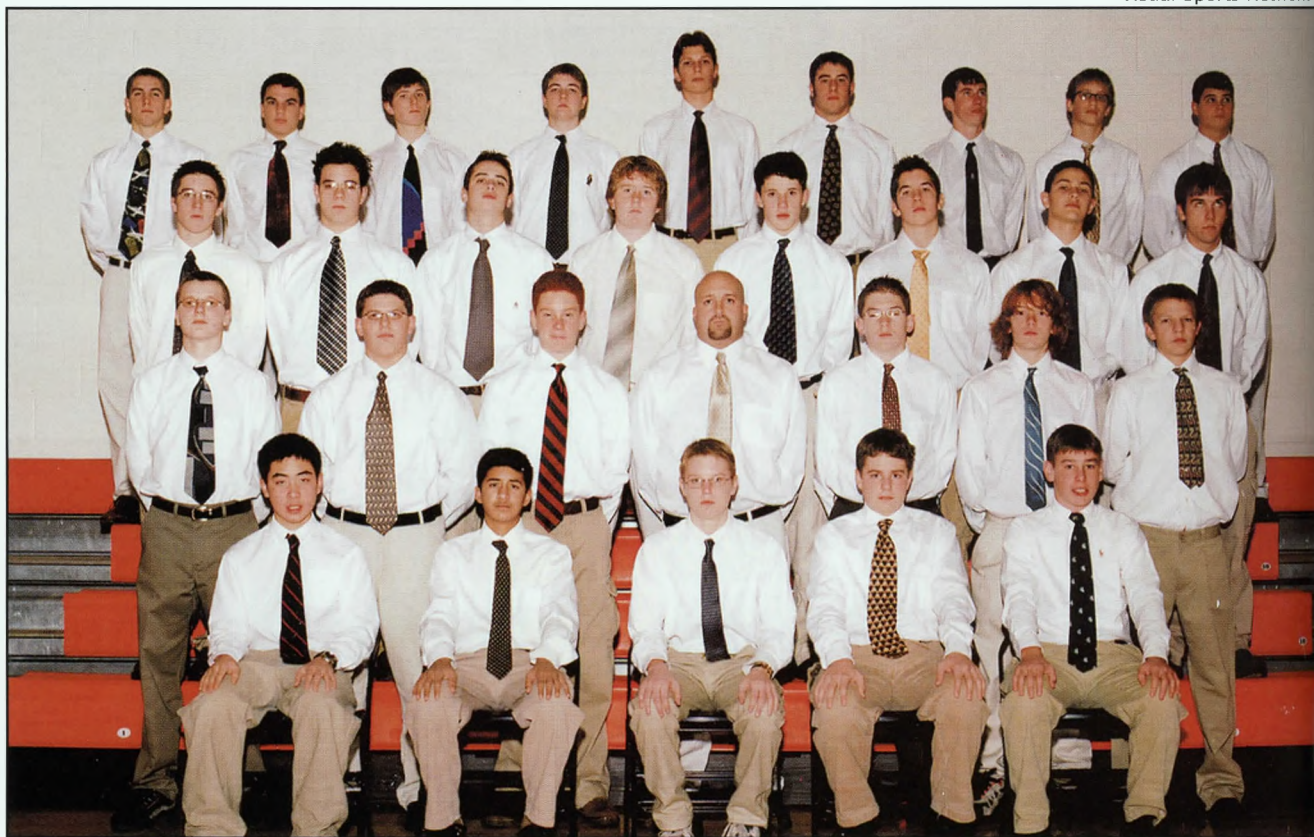

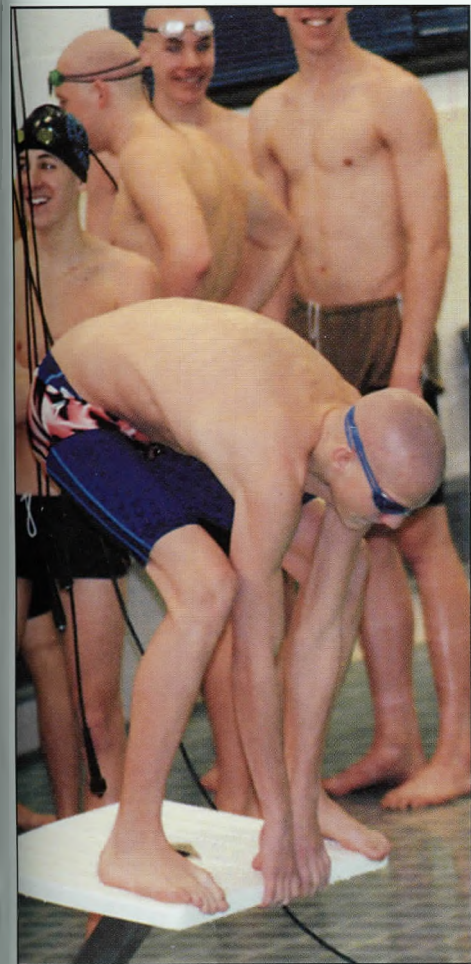

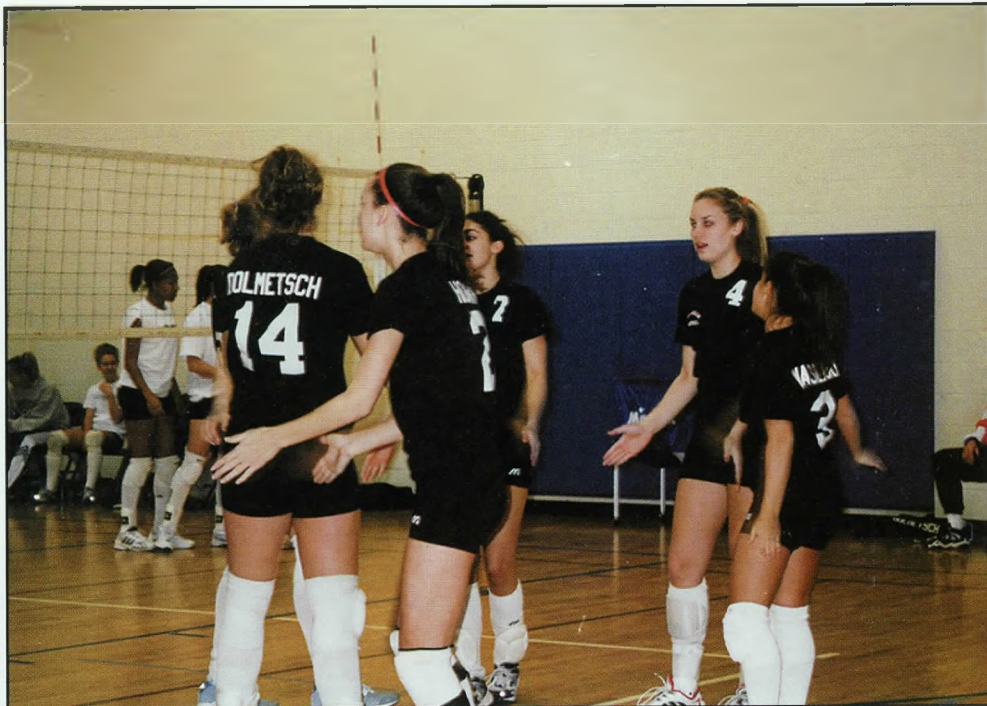

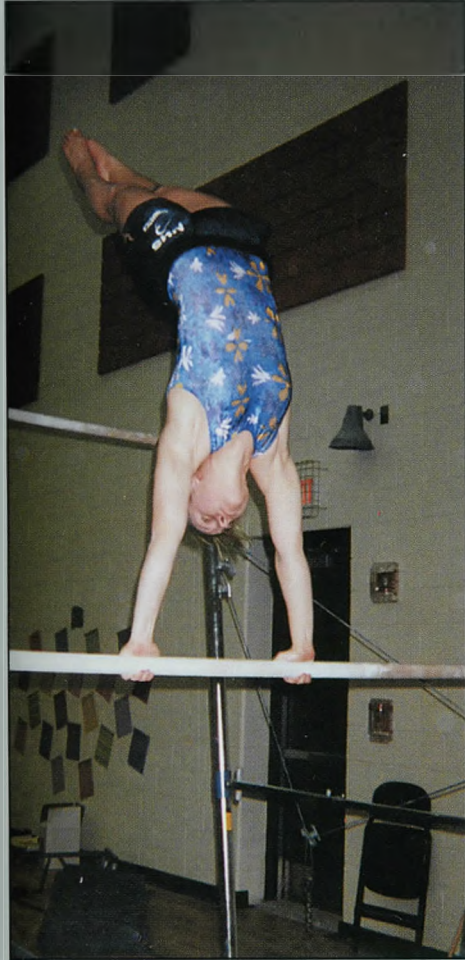

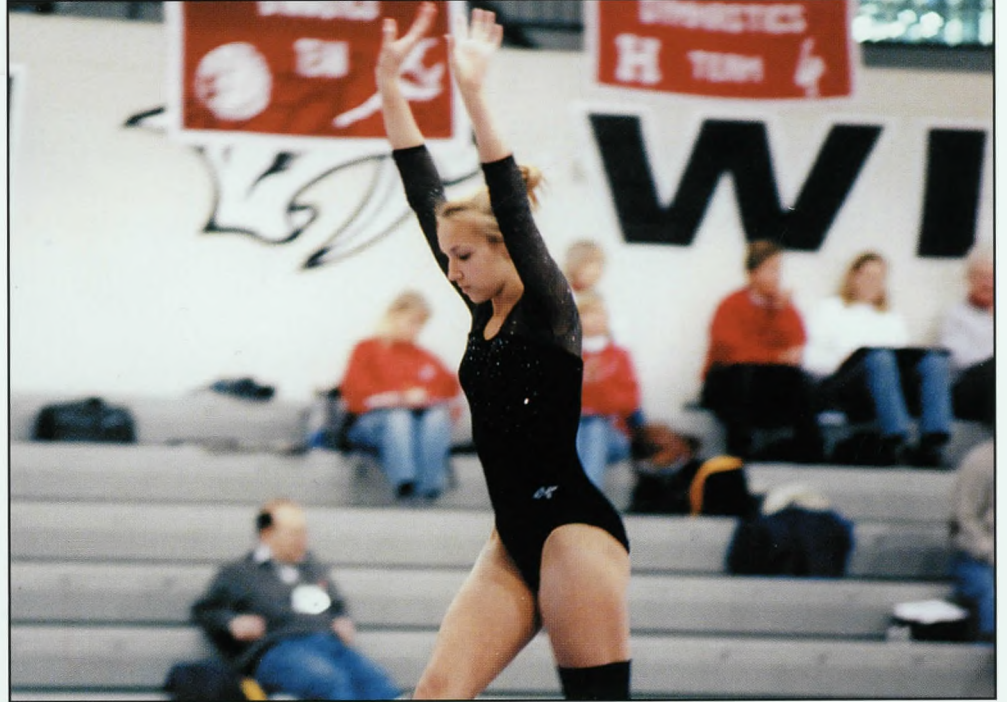

As a whole, this year served as a very successful year for the organizations within Northville High School. Just as in years past, the number of organizations grew.

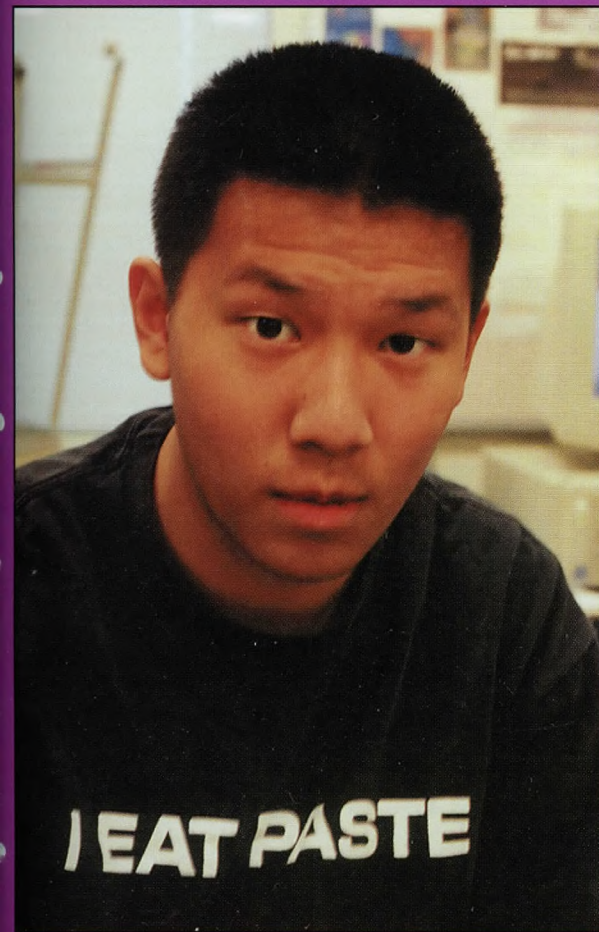

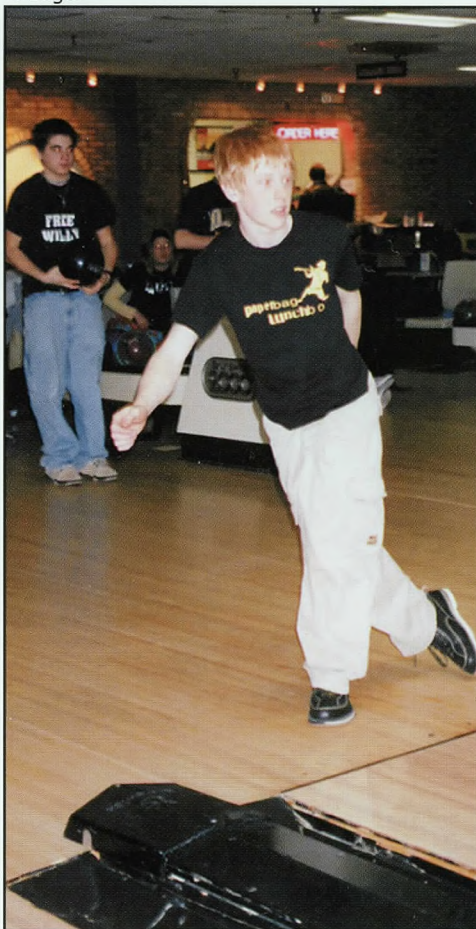
Practices ran Monday through Thursday, from three to five, at Novi Bowl, and the team competed in tournaments and games against such schools as Canton, North Farmington and Salem.

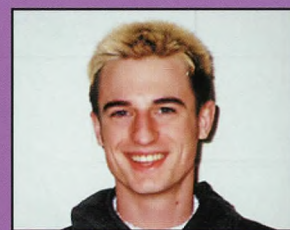

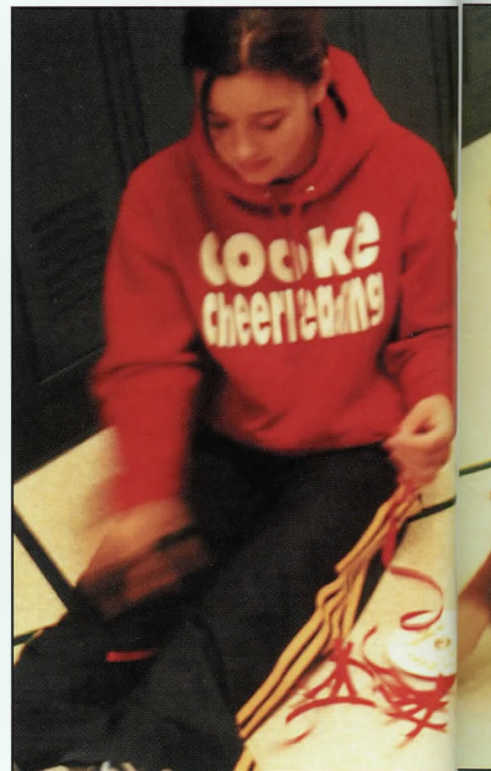

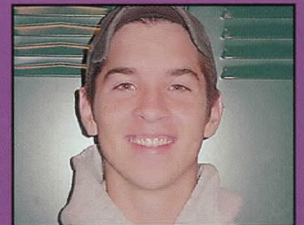

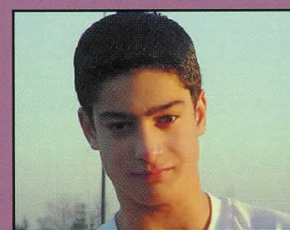

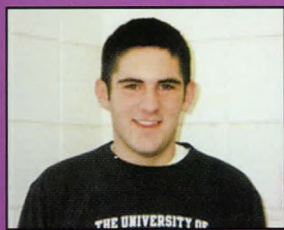

This large group of students was lead by seniors Joseph Lunn,

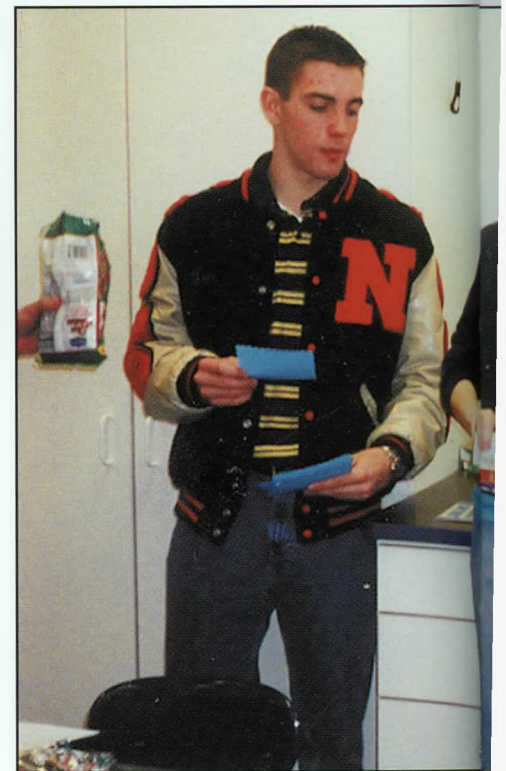

Meeting after school and during seminar, the French Club, with its sponsor, French teacher Ms. Murray, enjoyed celebrating the French culture while sharing the language with each other.

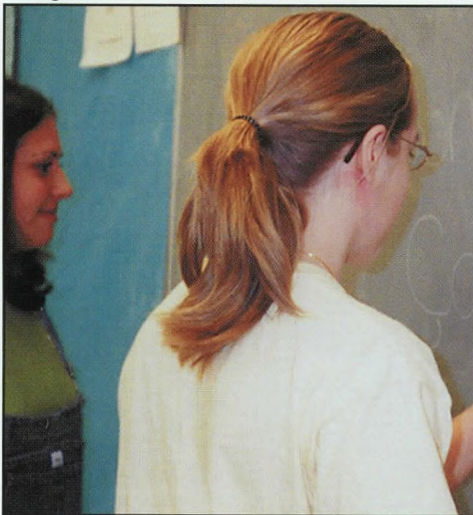

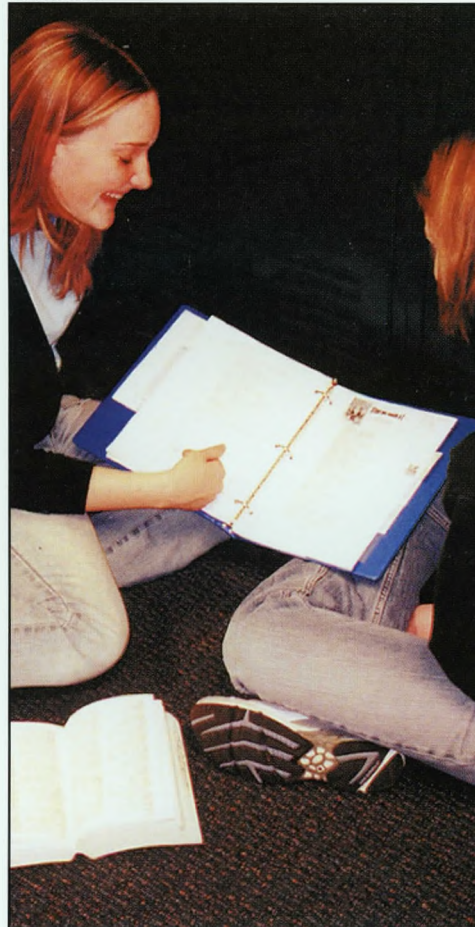

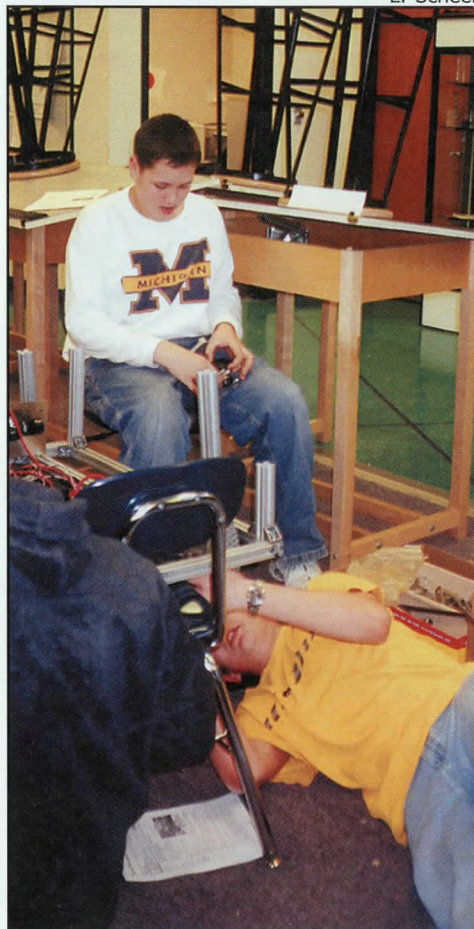

and writing assignments of their own.

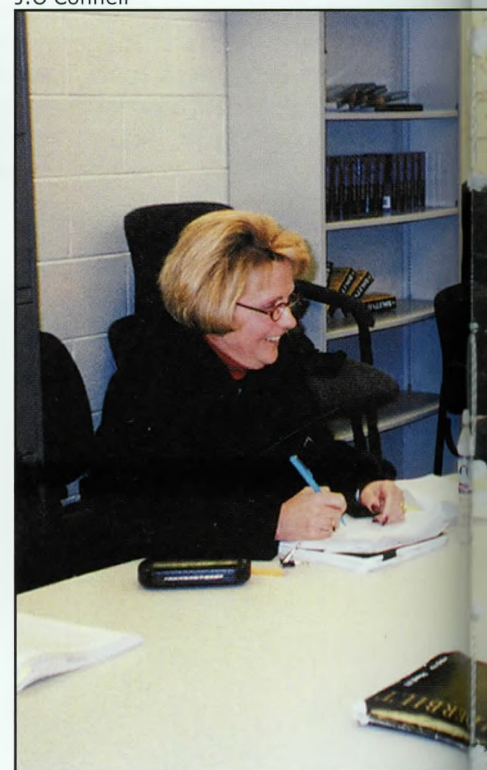

Have you ever looked for a place to discuss faith inside your school but couldn't find one? This year there was a new group that could have helped you!

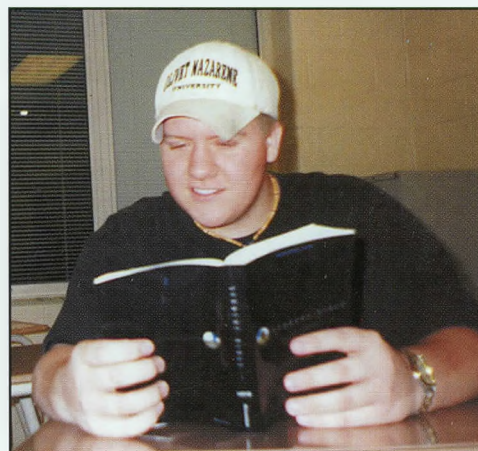

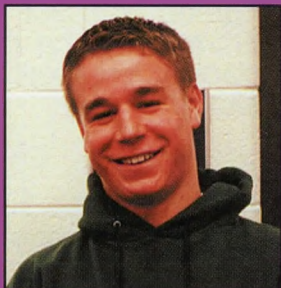
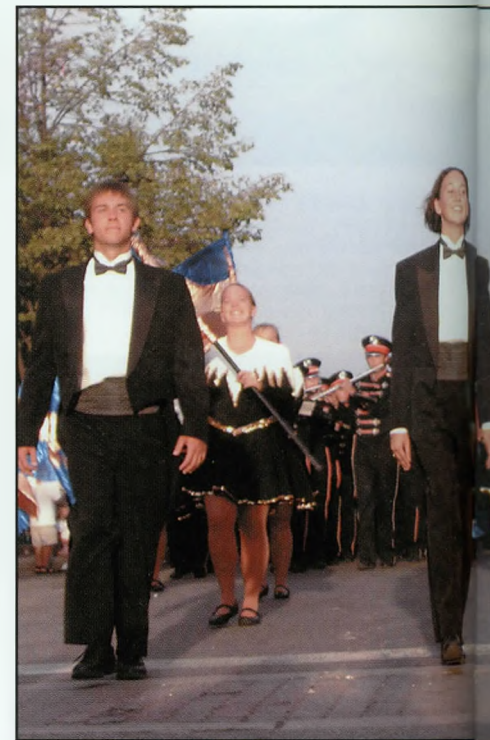
After the completion of a grueling marching

Many kids also developed a warm friendship with the office staff. If a student had a problem, whether it was personal or

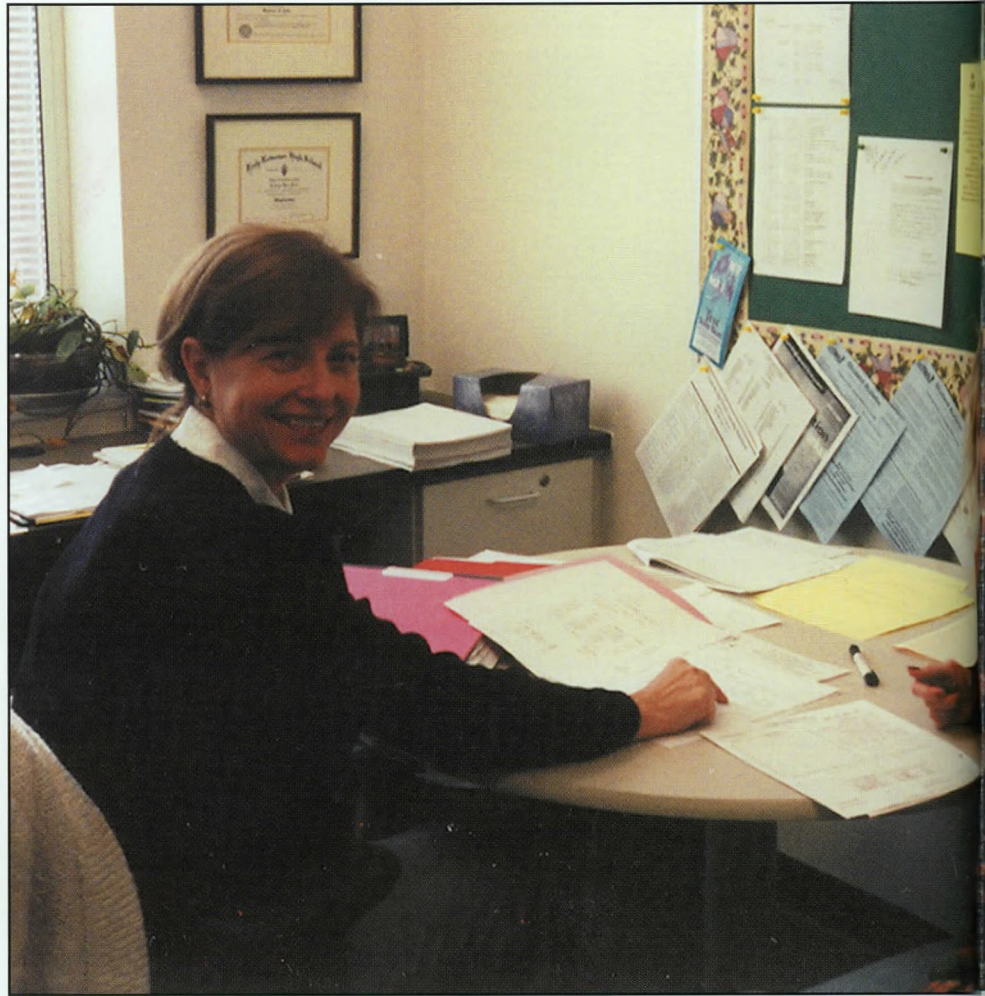

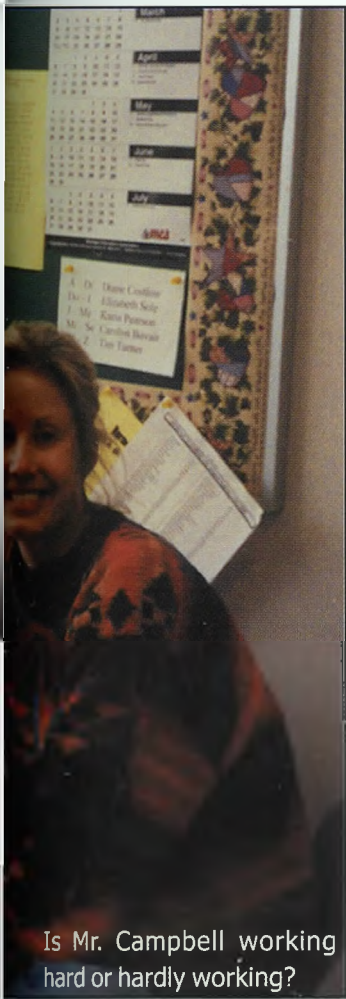

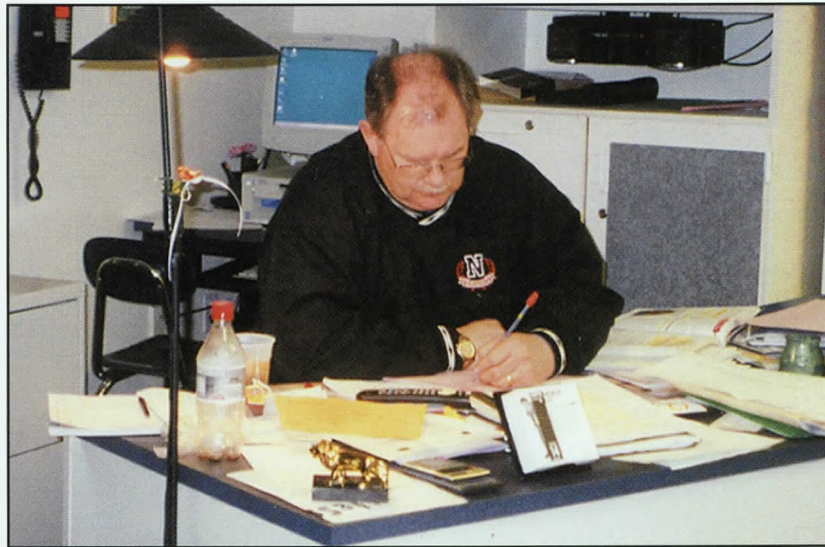

The students' problems never end, so where can they go for help? For assistance, the counseling office, assisted learning rooms, and special education classrooms offer welcome relief and advice.

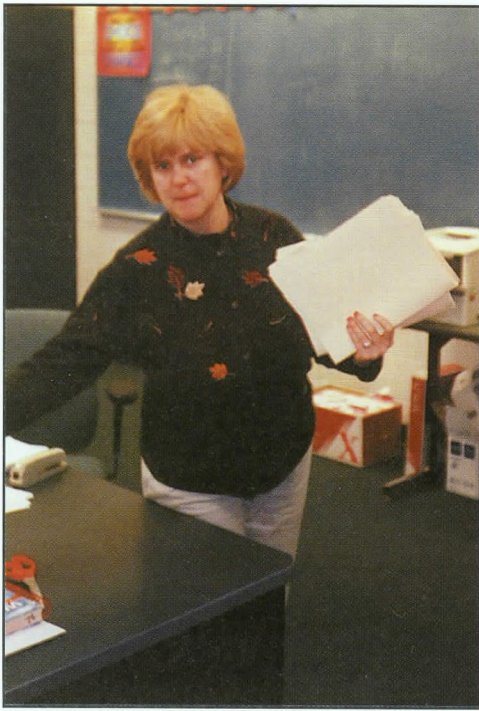

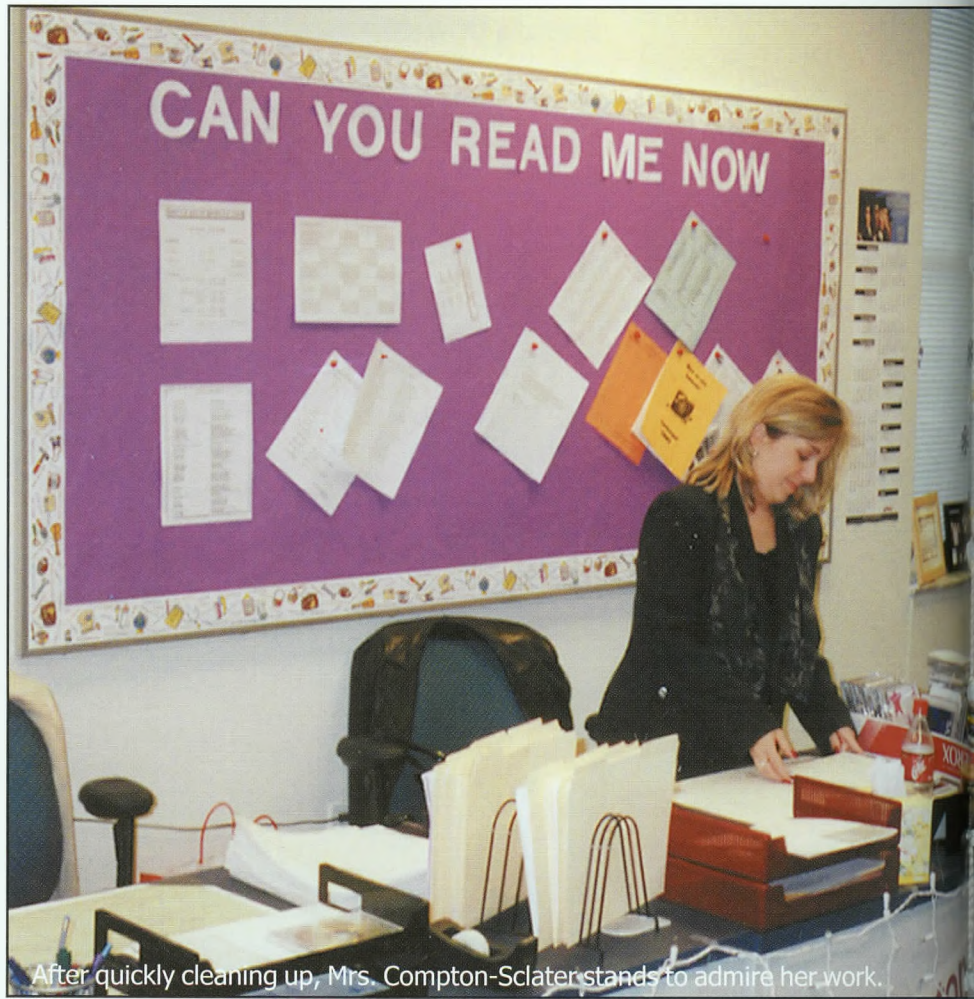

They are there to help us when the computer eats our files, they help us learn to type, they teach us how to understand economic market, and they help us to draw; they are the members of the Business and Technology Department.

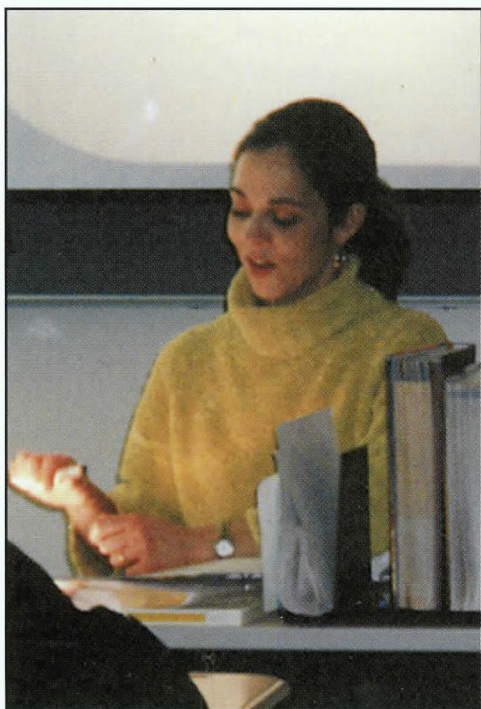
While in the technology department, students could do everything from learning to type with Word and making graphs on Excel, to designing graphics, making small program and learning to discover the Internet by making impressive web pages.

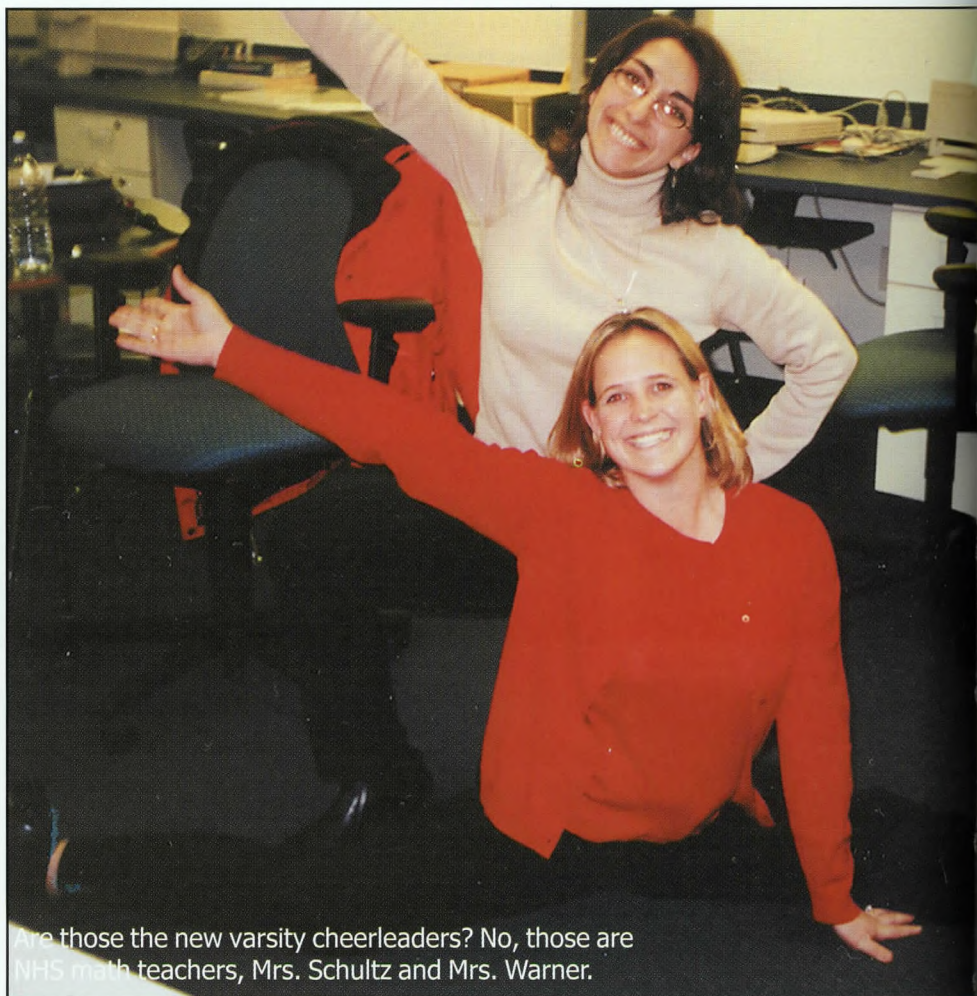

No math problem was too complex or too complicated this year's intellectual math department. With two new teachers hired into the department, all teachers worked together to solve this year's toughest problems. The two outstanding teachers were Traci Carulli and Ms. Laura Rummel. They were a big help in spreading out the students among the teachers for effective learning. 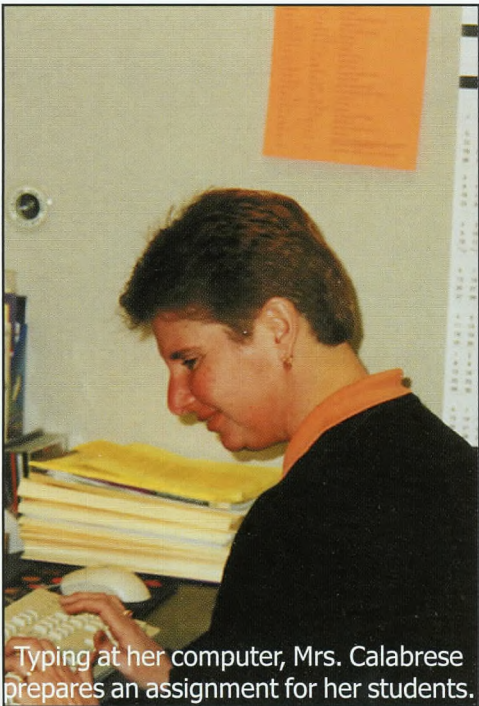
By offering a new statistics course, the teachers felt they were better preparing students for their future careers. Another strong aspect of the math department is the

AP courses offered. The entire class showed improvement throughout the course and ended the semester with a good understanding of what math will be like in college. This year there was a 93.5% passing rate.

In addition, our school also participated in the Michigan Mathematics Prize Competition. Each student that took the test was allowed one hundred minutes to complete it. Two outstanding performances were Daniel Remine and Daniel Hoffman. Another after school activity the department was involved in was the American Mathematics Competition, which was held in February. All who participated did well in this competition.

Based on the success of this year's math department, we hope to continue the success in the years to come. This will only be achieved by the active participation from the teachers and students, willing to learn and striving to succeed.

The Foreign Language Department teaches French, German and Spanish. This year, the department worked hard to improve the curriculum, and students may even see new courses in the next few years.

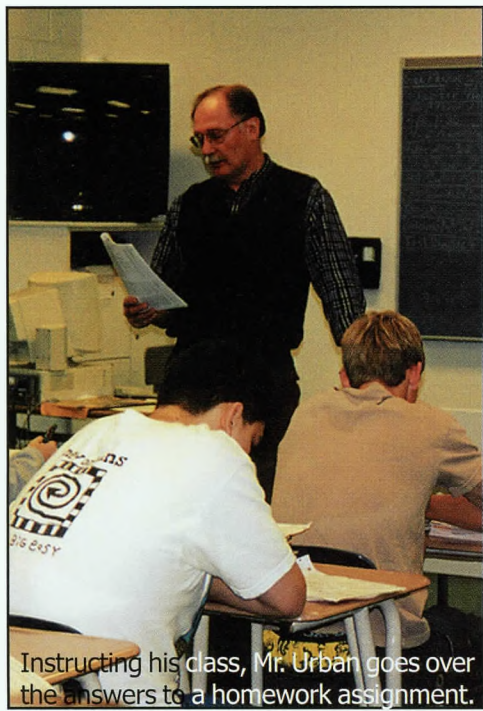

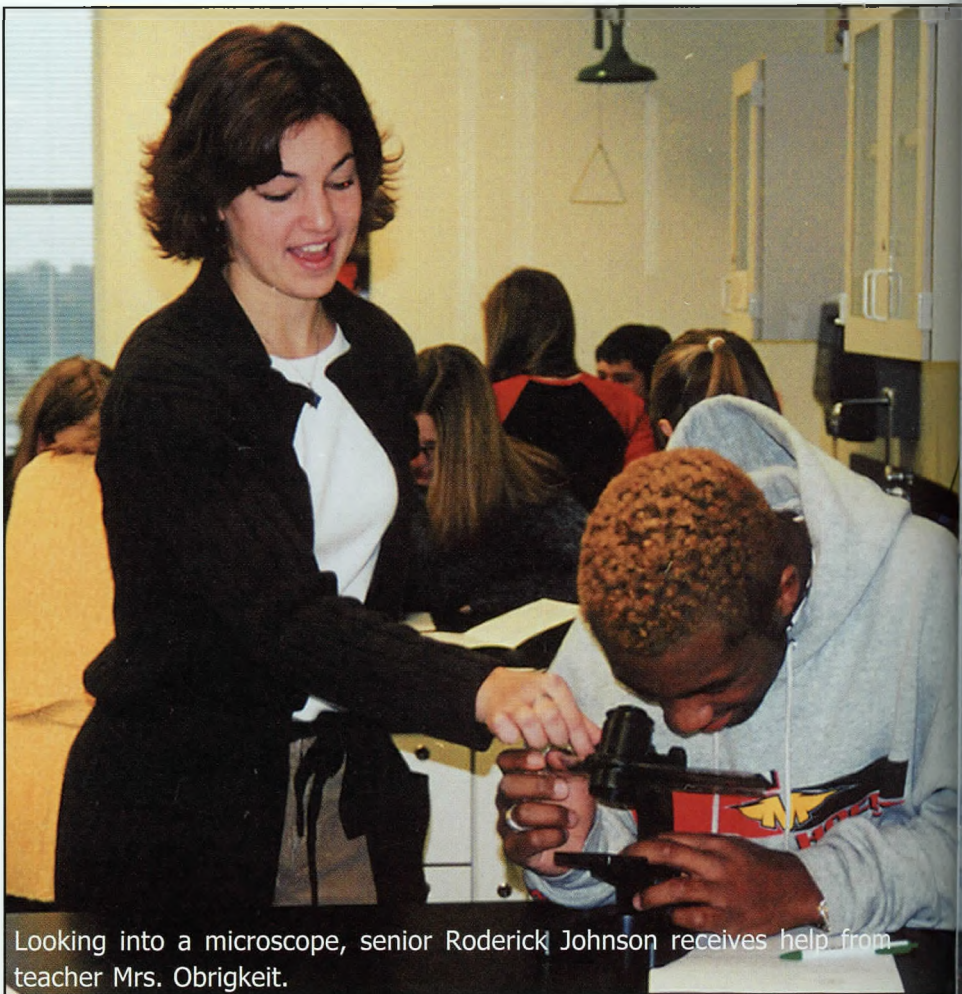

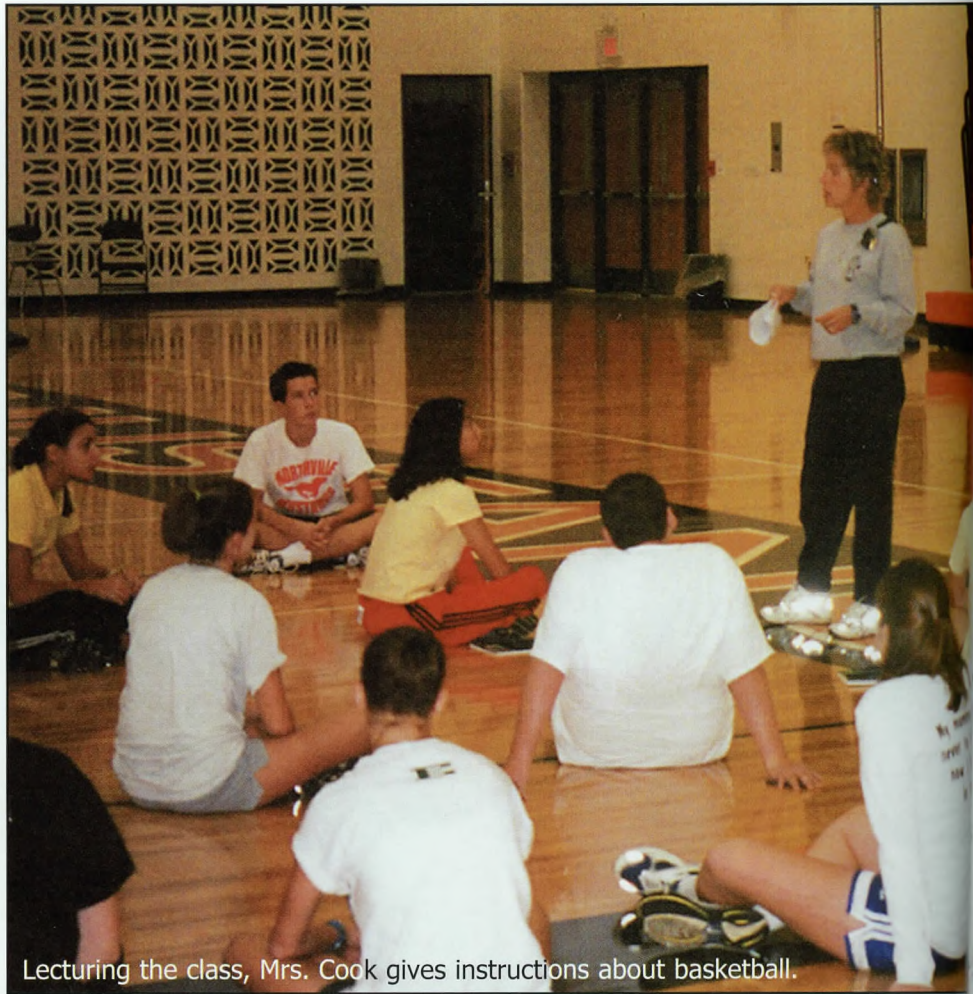

Running around the gym, playing sports, cooking food and learning to manage young children are all part of the physical education and life management classes.

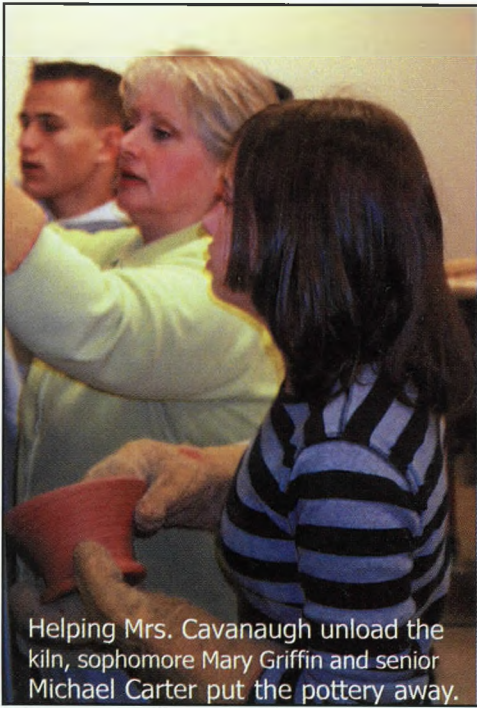

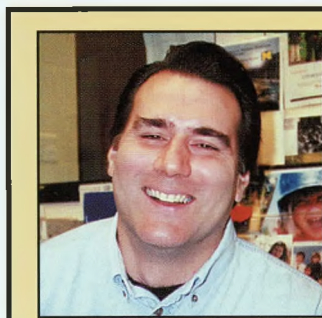
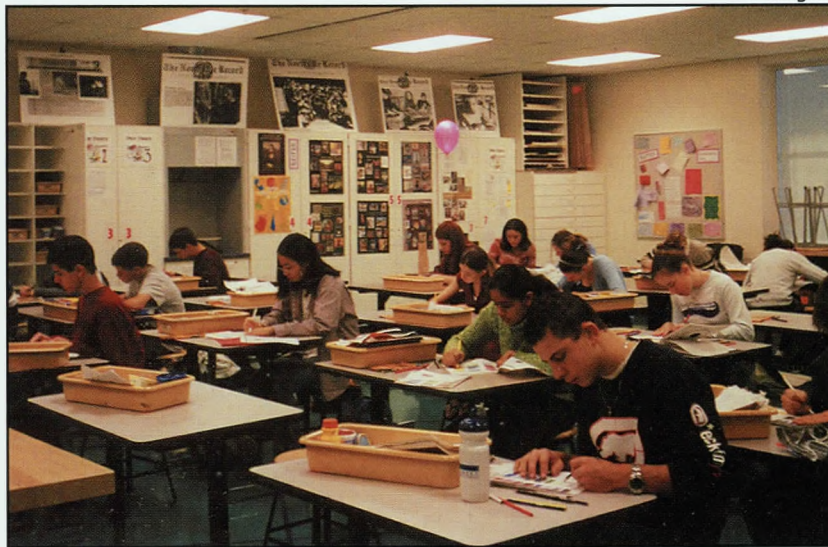

Every senior was busy in early fall, making important life decisions and applying to different schools. Though we were seniors, we kept

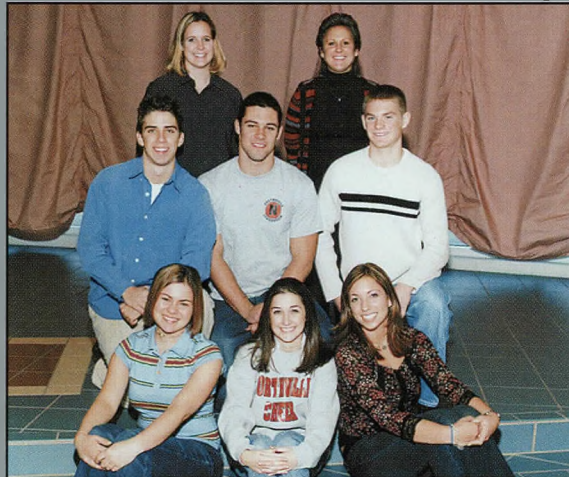
hard at work, ensuring a successful future.

The 2003 Palladium was desktop published using six IBM Aptiva computers. The program used is Adobe Pagemaker 7.0. The 266 page book was printed on 80# Bordeaux, except the endsheet which is Vibracolor White (VC-01) stock with Black and Orange (HJ165). The cover is a Custom Embossed cover on Vibratex Black (1075) base material with Brill Orange (#10) silkscreen on the front lid and spine, and Galaxy Embossing Grain (#11) around all elements. The cover board is 120 pt. Davey's Binder Board, with a Smyth Sewn binding, rounded and backed.

The 2003 Palladium used Tahoma as the primary typeface, printing the body copy in 12 pt., the captions in 10 pt., and the photo credits in 8 pt. Additional typefaces used in different sections included Bradley Hand ITC, Curlz MT, Elephant, Forte, Freestyle Script, Gill Sans Ultra Bold, Kristen ITC, and Papyrus.

All underclassmen panels were from Jostens National School Studios. Pictures were taken digitally and directly sent to the Herff Jones Plant. Team pictures were from Visual Sports Network. All graphics and layouts were created by staff graphic experts. Candid photos were taken by Prestige, students, faculty and staff. There were 265 pages of four-color process. Additional spot color added throughout the book included Scarlet (HJ200), Gold (HJ960), Ultra Blue (HJ542), and Silver (HJ970).

Subscription sales funded most of the publication cost. Circulation of the 2003 Palladium was 1600 books. The cost of each book was \$40.00. Additional monies were the result of business advertising. Ads ranged from \$50.00 to \$200.00.

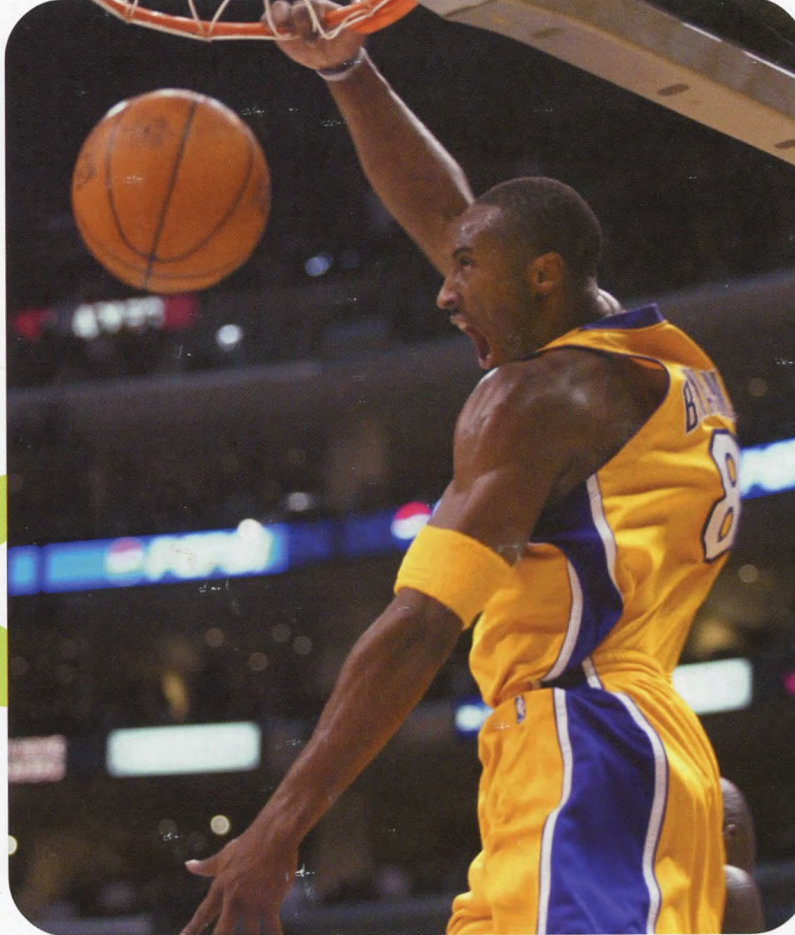

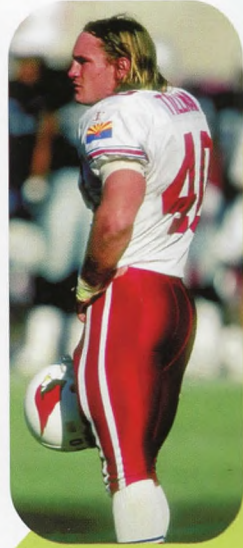

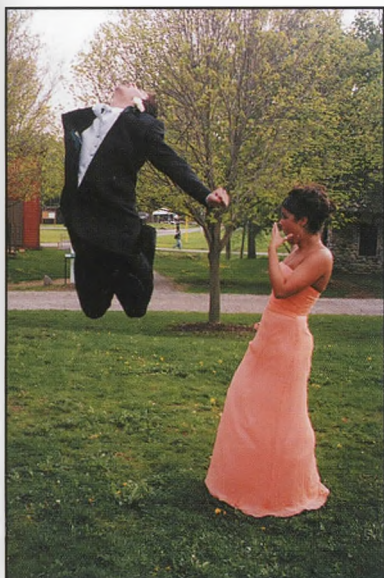

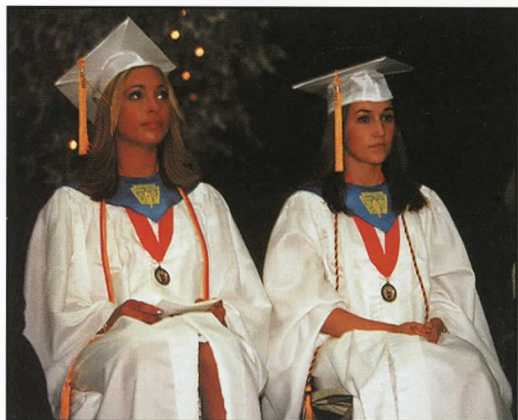

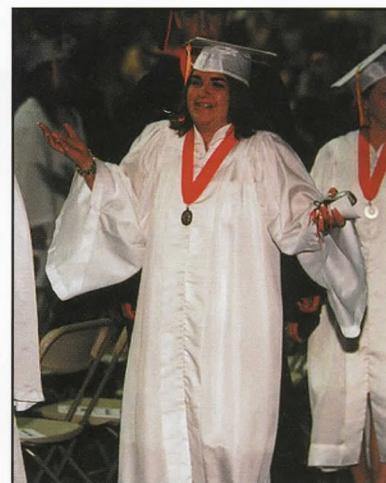

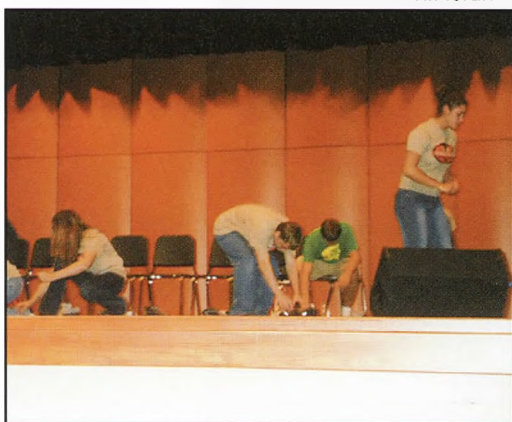

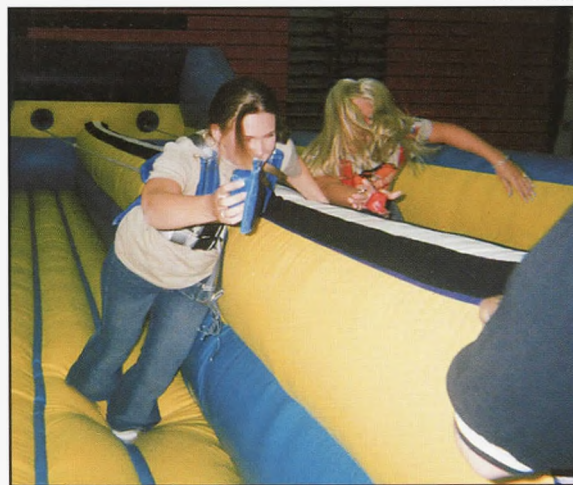

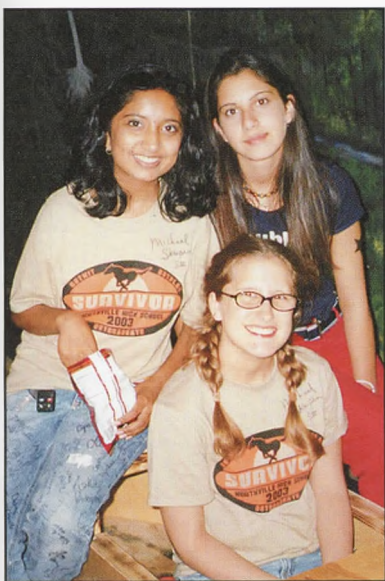

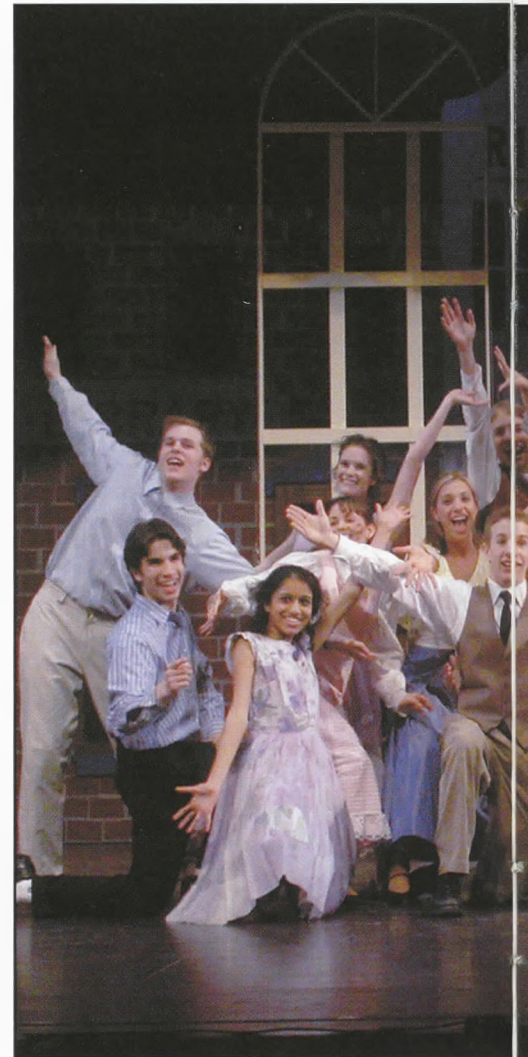
What do a traveling salesman, a librarian and River City, Iowa have in common? They were all a part of this year's spring musical "The Music Man."

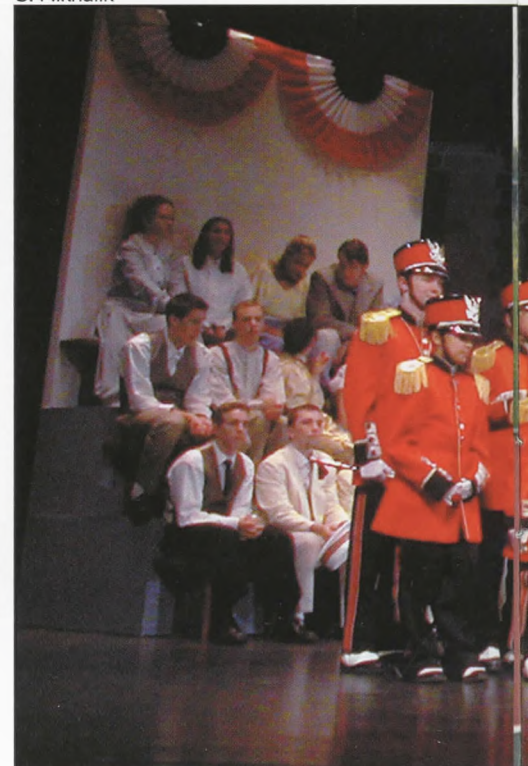

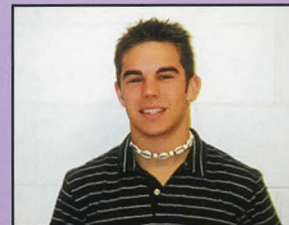

teams were stronger than ever this year, giving the rest of their league a run for their money.

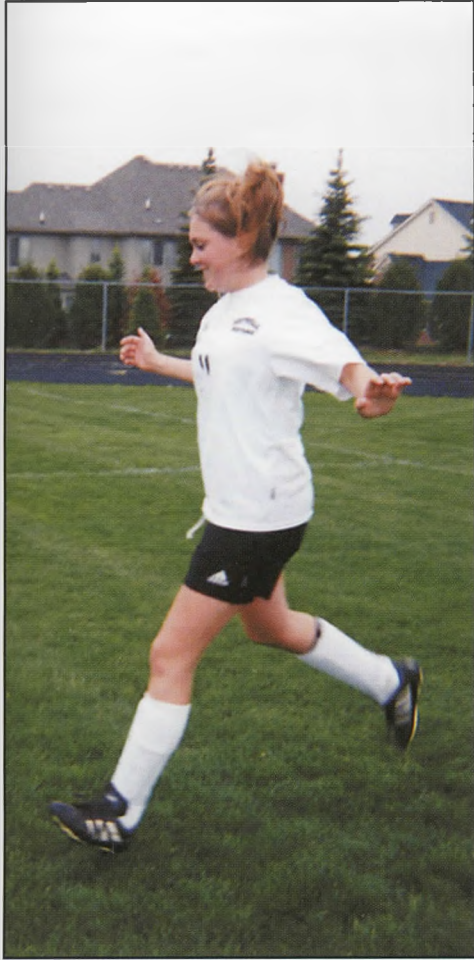

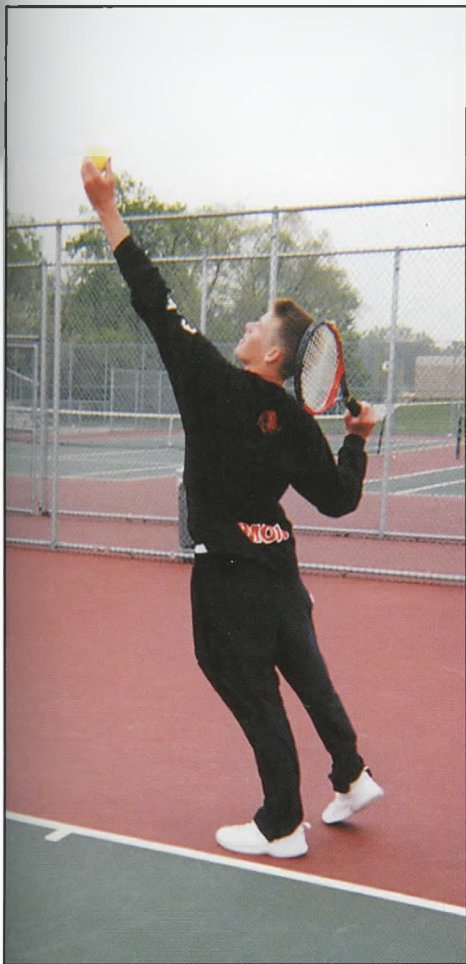
With tough competition through the season, the men's tennis team united as one to bring home the wins.

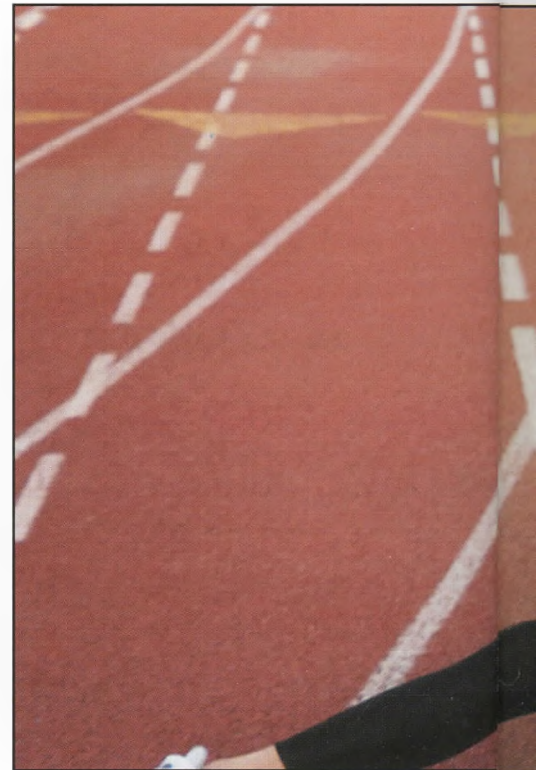
The men's track and field team's hard work was evident through its impressive season. The team achieved an overall record of six wins and one loss. The only defeat the team suffered was against a strong Canton team.

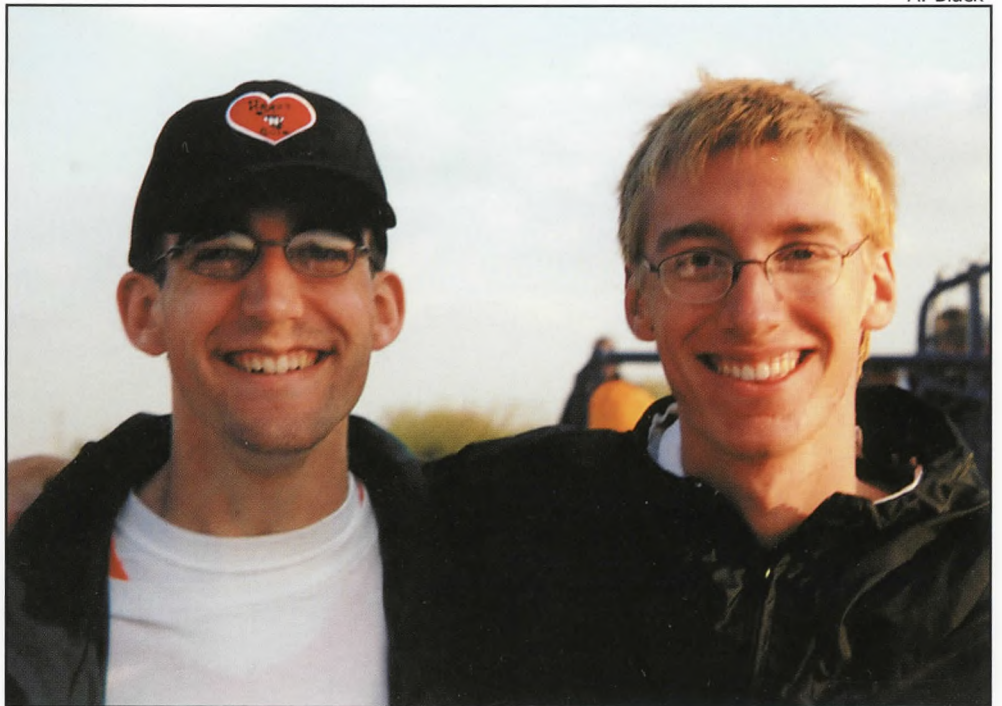

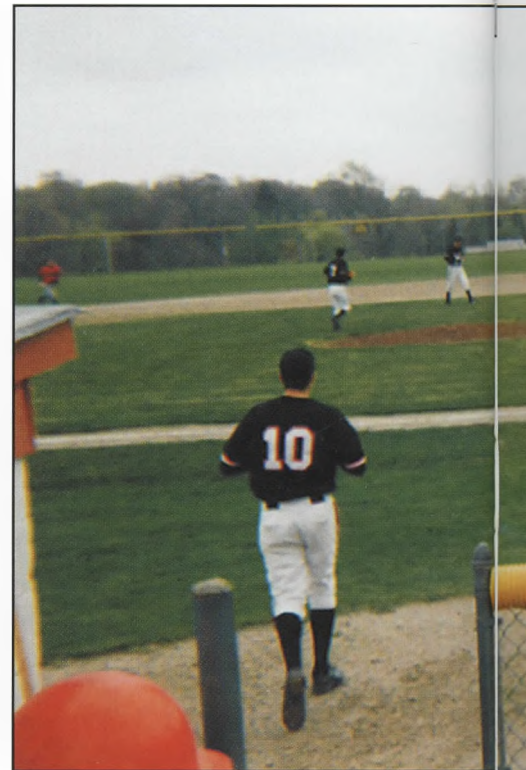

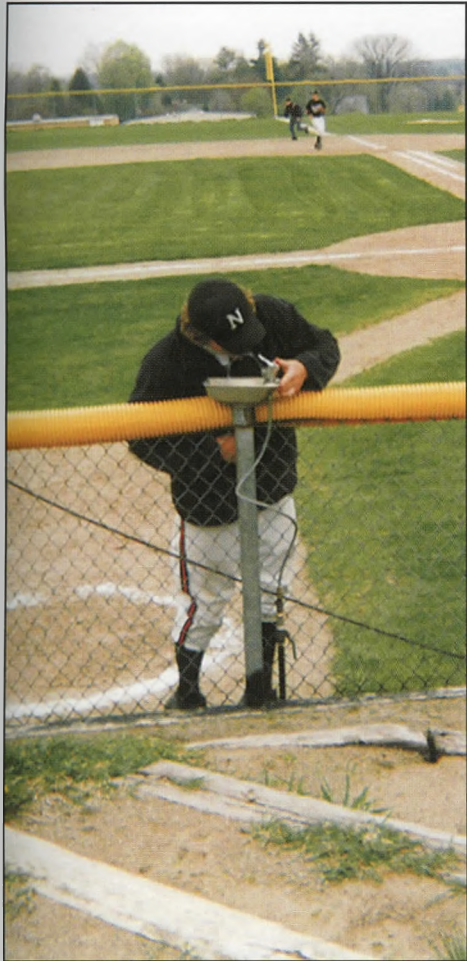
