She was recognized by Detroit media several times for her record attendance at Detroit Tigers' opening day games. She attended every opening day for the past 67 years, missing only in 1941, while giving birth to her son Bill.

An avid Tigers fan, she listened to every game on the radio throughout the season. She often recalled sitting in the stands and watching Tigers' greats such as Ty Cobb, Charlie Gehringer and Hank Greenberg.

Born and raised in Detroit, she met her husband while both were employed at the Michigan Inspection Bureau. The couple married in 1923, settled in Detroit, and were wed for 67 years. Her husband preceded her in death last July.
