odor of water and also as a means of keeping the fire fighting ability of the city in check. Gallogly said. Valves and fire hydrants can sometimes become blocked with

sediment backup, he said. Despite the possibility of discoloration, Gallogly said residents won't need to boil their water before drinking it. He said simply running the cold water tap until the water runs clear will solve the

problem.

"We expect to receive some complaints regarding stained laundry. but there's nothing we can do short of informing the public so that they can run their cold water faucets and flush their lines before they do their laundry," Gallogly said.


