THANKSGIVING PROCLAMATION.

By the Governor of the State.

Grateful to the Almighty God, the author of our being, and the giver of every good and perfect gift, for the manifold blessings vouchsafed to us during the year, which is now drawing to a close. It is most and proper that we offer unto Him the sacrifices of praise and thanksgiving, for His continued mercies unto us, individually, and as a people. Let us remember that, while another year has passed away, no unusual mortality has befallen our people; abundant crops have been gathered; honest labor has found a compensating reward; the population of our State has increased; the material wealth of our citizens has been augmented; and general prosperity has been our happy lot.

Now, therefore, I, Henry P. Baldwin, Governor of the State of Michigan, do hereby appoint Thursday the twenty-fourth day of November next as a day of public and general Thanksgiving; and I invite the people of this commonwealth to devote the day designated to public recognition of these abundant mercies, and with devout hearts to supplicate the favor of Almighty God for the year upon which we are about to enter.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State, at Lansing, this twenty-fourth of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and of the Independence of the United States the ninety-fifth.

European War.

France has suffered another terrible blow by the capitulation of Metz, which took place on the 27th. By the surrender, the Prussians came into possession of 170,000 men, including 40,000 soldiers, 6,000 officers, and an immense amount of war material. A considerable sum of money is said to have been turned by the Prussians before the surrender, and that the Prussians compelled him to disclose his whereabouts. The large armies of France which, in the commencement of the war marched boldly forth in anticipation of victory, are now all dead, or prisoners.

The government is desirous for an armistice, and the prospect for one was favorable for a few days, but dispatches since announce the prospect unfavorable. This is to be regretted, for had an armistice been brought about, it is likely that peace would have followed and thus a step would have been put to farther bloodshed. The armistice was a failure on account, it is said, of the persistence of Bismarck in insisting on guarantees for a cession of territory.

Election.

As we view the strife existing between political papers in support of their respective candidates, we cannot but feel thankful that Fate has not fixed our journalistic life in such an unprofitable, and unthankful channel. What matter if an editor, or publisher does obtain a certain sum from the candidate he supports, or the party he represents, the ill-feeling produced in the aid of such candidate [every means is used to get their man elected, even to bringing out the private matters of the opposing candidates while life] must make him many and bitter enemies, and a publisher needs friends as well as other folks. Besides all this, such whole-sale slaughter on a man's character, must necessarily, be repulsive to a great many readers, who, having no interest in, or taste for partyism, will be of set and more substantial food for the intellect. Many good patrons are lost to a paper on that account. As for ourselves we are glad that Election is over and all this wrangling and strife at an end.

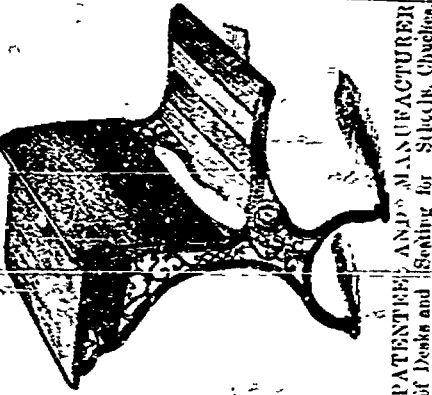

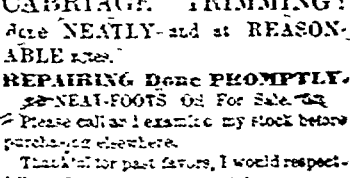
