COMPULSORY EDUCATION.

At the recent session of our legislature a law was passed, the provisions of which require the attendance at public schools of every child between the ages of eight and fourteen years in the State, for at least twelve weeks in the year. The law is to take effect on the first Monday of September, 1871. No child is to be exempted from this act, except excused by a School Board on account of bodily or mental infirmities, or being taught at home in some branches as it is taught in primary schools, or already versed in those studies.

In the execution of this law each school Director or President of a School Board in the State, must cause a notice to be posted in the most public places or published in one newspaper in the township, for three weeks during the month of August each year. Parents and guardians, failing to comply with this act will be presented; the fine to be collected by the director in the name of the district, and paid to the assessor. Any director or president neglecting to prosecute, unless the party in fault shall have been excused by the school Board, shall himself be prosecuted in the name of the assessor of such district.

In the establishing of this law, our legislature acted in a manner that to any sensible minded person, must seem proper and just.

Ignorance and crime go hand in hand, and where the former predominates, respectability and the requisite principles for an enlightened and moral community are not to be found. Search the criminal calendar of to-day and it will be even that, with but few exceptions, criminals are utterly devoid of the first rudiments of education, either through the total disregard of the facilities offered in their youth, or what is more generally the case, the negligence of parents and guardians in the discharge of such duties.

It will be argued by some that persons of education may be found in the criminal class. This is no doubt the case. Freer (old) has its black sheep, every picture its dark shade, but when an educated person enters the ranks of wickedness, it is a disgrace to understanding the enormity of the offence, and can be easily brought back to a life of usefulness than one, who, from childhood up, has had no knowledge of right from wrong.

A free school system has properly been instituted, and taxes levied in support of such measure, and the people defraying such expense, naturally enough expect that, in sustaining a project designed to enlighten the youth, and thus essentially aid in the welfare of the country, there should also be some return for their money, and the only way in which it can be accomplished is by compulsory education.
