USEFUL AND SUGGESTIVE. At a discussion by the Jamestown Farmers' Club in Western New York, several members stated that twenty pounds of hay per day would keep an average sized cow in fair condition.

SPRING FOR FOWLS.—The proper space for fowls in confinement is set down by Mr. Lewis Wright as half an acre to a flock of fifty, which should be in grass. Those desiring to breed poultry on a large scale can calculate from this basis why so many failures have attended experiments in this direction.

THE LAST MILK FROM THE UDDER.—Dr. Anderson, of Scotland, says he found by practical analysis, in one instance, that the last cup of milk drawn from the cow's udder contained sixteen times as much cream as the first one. This separation of cream from milk takes place in part in the udder of the cow, particularly if the cow is suffered to stand at rest for some time previous to milking.

ESSES FOR BREEDING.—In selecting eggs for hatching all disadvantages should be avoided as they will not hatch. The same hen will sometimes lay a very large egg, and another time a very small one. They will serve well to eat, but not for hatching. What is wanted are eggs of the average size and appearance peculiar to the variety from which you breed—nothing else.

BEST TIME TO CASTRATED ANIMALS.—Castrated almost any time with perfect safety. Many persons hold the opinion that cold weather is the most suitable time to castrate, and I agree with them. My experience and observation is, that the months of March and September are the most suitable times.
