## THE OPERA HOUSE

The foundation completed. Its dimen-

sions and prospective uses.

How the building will be com-

pleted and quality of

material used.

The opera house foundation is now

about completed and looks exten-

sive enough for Barnum's Hippodrome.

With out doubt it is the largest piece

of masonry in the township of Plym-

outh.

The opera house, as according to

original plans and specifications will

be a cornered brick. That is to say,

it will be a heavy frame—2x8 stand-

ing for first story, and 2x6 balance

and sheathed up with inch boards

throughout. At this stage with ad-

dition of partition walls and gallery

frames, the building would hold any

possible weight. Its further comple-

tion in tier of siding, as would be

done with an ordinary frame building,

there will be a four inch wall of brick

around the entire frame. Every

fifth tier of which will be securely

anchored to the masonry. For this

alone nearly 100,000 brick will be

used. With the additional expense of

lathing, which is an entire brick

building might in a measure be ob-

viated, the cost will be about the same

as if it were all brick. The only rea-

son of putting up the building after

this plan is to secure strength. With

twelve inch brick walls a proper

safety for a gallery could not be at-

tained. Even though every brick

should fall to the ground the frame

of this structure would remain intact.

The basement, or in other words the

space in front part of cellar to the

depth of twenty-two feet, will be used

as a publication office for the North-

ville Record. The two cellar apart-

ments in the rear of this will be for

use of the two stores above—these ex-

ceed to a depth of forty-four feet.

In the rear of this there will be a cir-

cular capable of holding one hundred

and twenty-five barrels of water, a

very necessary matter in case of fire,

as well as for use of the building pro-

per.

The other work on the building

will begin the coming week and pro-

gress as rapidly as possible.

Mr. C. S. Elmer very generously

offers his services to the
