JAMES K. LOWDEN

Died at His Home-Here-Tuesday _ Afternoon.

Another of Northville's well-known and respected citizens, James K Lowden, was called from his earthly home Tucsday, December 12th, at the

age of nearly sixty-nine years Mr. Lowden was born in Livingston county, New York, February 26, 1831, came with his parants to Michigan when he was twelve years old and was married to Catherine Himman in 1856 He became a resi dent of this village in 1860.

As a Union veteran Mr. Lowden had an exceptional war record. In August 1862 he enlisted in Troop D. 5th Michigan cavalry, afterward under command of Gen. Alger. He saw a good deal of active service having been in four of the-great battles o the war and in twenty-seven other engagements, besides being under fire on many more occasions. He was wounted and taken prisoner at the battle of Travillan Station, Va, and was at Andersonville, Savannah and Millen prisons for five months He was discharged in 1865

At the time of his death he was president of the 5th Michigan Cavalry Association, and was also serving his second term as mistice of the peace. He had been for many years a member of the Northylle Baptist or its own, having recently pur church and had served the organization in various capacities. Of his family of a wife, five daughters and a son, three members—Henry Lowden, Lowden-are still living, ali residents of this village. The funeral services will be held at the home this Friday afternoon his pastor, Rev J. J Thelps, officiating


