THE foundations of the personal character of our national life are seriously threatened by ugly features of the present time. There is abounding evidence of an ALARMING INCREASE IN CRIME of every sort, but particularly of the kind that undermines honesty, chastity and respect for law. There is a growing infidelity to financial trust and consequently a visible loss of confidence of man in his fellow men. Defalcations continue and multiply in disheartening succession. The proportion of divorces to marriages is astonishing and SICKENING. Disintegration, decadence and often destruction of the family and lowering of the home ideal go on increasingly.

But most disheartening and startling of all is the lawless spirit in towns and cities, where have grown up crowds of hoodlums, where there is an increasing population who break out into reckless violence at times of strikes and lockouts. Of the same nature are the worse than brutal exhibitions in defiance of all authority and decency in the lynchings and hideous burnings. THAT DISHONOR HUMAN NATURE ITSELF.

Density of population, economic conditions, public opinion, family, administration of justice, the police department, the luxury, superficiality and materialism of our life; the get rich quick craze—an immense factor—are SOME of crime's causes, complex and diverse.

One of the most potent, most ubiquitous, most constantly operative causes is the vast volume of CRIMINAL SUGGESTION flowing in upon the public mind through various means, but especially through the public press.

AN AMERICAN ARTIST.

By A. Abbey: Who is Painting King Edward's Coronation Picture.

Edwin A. Abbey, the famous artist who is just now working on the portrait of King Edward of England for the coronation picture, is a native of Philadelphia. He was born in 1862, and is now thirty-four years of age. He is a member of the Royal Academy of Arts, and has won many honors for his work. He is a very successful portrait painter, and has painted many of the most famous people of the day.

rebus, which appeared in 1866, when he was only fourteen years old. When he was sixteen he worked in a wood engraver's shop, going thence to the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts, and at the age of nineteen he became a member of the staff of the Harpers in New York.

For nearly a quarter of a century Mr. Abbey has lived abroad. He first went to Europe in 1874, returning to this country in 1881. The following

year he again crossed the ocean and has since made England his home. The most notable work of Mr. Abbey in this country is his series of paintings on the "Quest of the Holy Grail" for the Boston Public Library. This work consists of a number of panels measuring in all 190 feet in length and which took eleven years of labor to complete. They were finished in 1902. His work was done in his great studio at 11, Bedford near Oxford.

Up to the time that he was commissioned to paint the coronation picture Mr. Abbey had not been presented to King Edward. When he was summoned before the king so that he could be officially informed that he had received the much coveted honor, about all his mystery was at an end. The mere announcement of his selection was that "my chemistry will attend to the details." Since then however artist and king have become pretty good friends.

Mrs. Abbey is an American, born in the Isle of Wight where her parents were traveling, and she and Mr. Abbey first met when, as Miss Mary Mead she was touring Europe. She is a daughter of the late Frederick Mead of New York and is a graduate of Vassar college. Mr. Abbey is distinctly American in her tastes.
