MYSTERY IN HER DEATH

MARTHA NEWMAN DIED IN DE TROIT HOSPITAL

MADE CONTRADICTORY STATE-MENTS AS TO HER ILLNESS.

PROSECUTING ATTORNEY WILL INVESTIGATE CIRCUMSTANCES.

Defroit, Mich., Aug 19-Last night at \$.20 o'clock Martha Newman of Munger, Mich., a village of 150 inhabitants eight miles below Bay City, died Bt Grace hospital under such distressing circumstances that Prosecutor Hunt ordered Coroner-Toepel to make an investigation of the case. The girl who is 23 years of age, was brought to, the hospital about 5 p. m. Prosecutor Hunt took her ante-mortem statement. which he declined to make public. For a short time the young woman raliced, then her life slowly ebbed away.
