HISTORIC MEXICAN BUILDINGS

Mexico is probably one of the most picturesque cities of Latin America. It does not have the size and modern magnificence of Buenos Ayres it is far older. The city contains a wealth of old architecture, but, like all big cities in a transition state, vandalism is doing all it can to destroy the ancient romantic atmosphere of the Spanish colonial buildings. In the last five years frightful gaps have been made in the lines of old houses; the re-erecting of so many of the colonial mansions entirely destroying the picturesque vista of the streets. It is not so common to see many of the old houses from the outside. The massive doors do not reveal the beautiful interior patios. One of the best

samples of old colonial architecture that visitors can see without molesting the inhabitants is the Wells Fargo Building situated at Marquette street. This building is magnificent and in excellent condition.

Another fine specimen of the old colonial architecture is situated in front of the Hotel Humboldt in less than 200 feet from the Wells Fargo Building. This house contains a magnificent coat of arms that would rejoice the heart of a local plate collector. So rare to the city that it would be difficult to find its equal in any other street.
