





Some years ago one of the leading pharmacists of America, in connection with some official-work, undertook to ascertain, by an elaborate inquiry in representative cities of the country, what percentage of physicians' -pre scriptions contained a narcotic drug of some kind. Out of 100,000 repre sentative prescriptions, dispensed in drug stores in all parts of the United States, it was found that 70 per cent contained opium or some one of its preparations.

"Proprietaty medicines are almost invariably accompanied by the most detailed and specific directions for use, while the directions accompanying physicians' prescriptions are generally very brief and sometimes illegible. It is also true that but a moderate proportion of proprietary measures contain any poison or narcotic, and, when they do, it is generally in such small quantities or so protected by accompanying antidotes, as to carry with it no danger whatever."


