## The National Policy.

In our reflections and comment concerning the wonderful production of wealth on the farms of the United States during the year just closed, reaching totals never touched before in the history of civilization, it is well to keep in mind that much of the value of the product of the farm is derived from the ability of the American consumer to pay good prices. Ninety eight per cent of the products of American farms are sold to the farmer's American neighbors and fellow citizens, and his interest in their continued ability to buy is almost as great as in his own ability to produce. When there is work in the mill and in the factory and down in the mine at better wages than are paid in any other country the products of the American farm can be sold at profitable prices. The interests of all the producers of our country are allied, and all are united or should be in the preservation of a national policy which has materially assisted in making all this prosperity possible.

## The Farmers and Good Roads.

Hon. George B. Horton must have been simply talking for effect at the good roads convention at Jackson when he asserted that the farmers are opposed to the good roads movement because they don't want the highways suitably improved for the use of automobiles. It would certainly be a bad look out for Michigan if her farming class were capable of retarding progress by holding such foolish ideas as the one indicated and Mr. Horton gives the intelligence of the farmers a very poor compliment, to say the least. The manner in which automobilism is too often conducted might give a little color to such a statement, but over against the undeniable fact that the highways have been allowed to be made a dangerous nuisance in many instances on country as well as city thoroughfares is the other fact that many of the prosperous and progressive farmers all over the country are themselves using the vehicles in question. An illustration, out of the half dozen automobiles owned in this vicinity, two of three are the property of farmers. The bicycle was the pioneer cause of the great road improvement that has taken place within the past decade or two, the rural mail delivery system and the automobile are carrying on the good work, and the next generation of horses won't be afraid of the whiz wagons either. A special course in their training will render them immune to autos, and also electric cars, another necessary "nuisance".

Either the law or the tax commission is at fault. Some claim one, and some say the other. We suspect a little of both. There is a remedy. If it can be found, the governor will not be slow to apply it.

If the council, or some one else of sufficient influence, could induce the D. P. & N. to run their cars into Northville so as to connect with the Detroit United it would be a great accommodation to the public.

The tax commission may well exclaim in the words of a certain lamented philosopher "We've done our damndest".

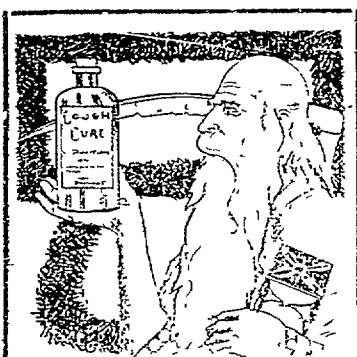

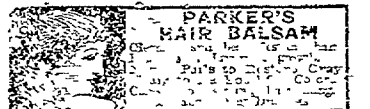
