



LANSING, - Mich .- Many of the ouildings in Michigan used for public purposes. including schools, hotels. churches, halls and theatres, are verstable fire-traps, declares John T. Wininip, state fire marshal, in his annual report to Gov Ferris.

Duling 1915 the number of buildmgs used for public purposes purned or partially destroyed by fire was 62, of which number 29 yere notels, 11 theatres, five charches, four courtbouses and two hospitals._

"If Michigan is to avoid disasters like-these which have recently occurred in the east and by which the lives of many women and children kave been sacrificed, a strict state building code must be enforced," declares Mr. Winship

This is true especially along the lines of the construction of schools, hotels hospitals, theattes, halls, and other buildings in which the public is allowed to congregate. Such buildings should be equipped with all nec essary exits and the escapes, should oe of fire resisting construction, the heating plants should be outside the building and all wiring be installed by practical electricians and approved by crty of state electrical inspectors."



GOLD MINE IN STREET

Chimney of Old Assay Office Provi Good Pay Dirt.

Gold mines have been promoted in Wall Street and that is as far as most of them get. But there is a real gold rine in full operation in the well known street. It is where the old United States assay office used to stand.
Little is left of the gld building—erected in 1823-but the toundation walls and perts of the old chimney of the room in which fullions of gold and silver coms were melted into gold and the contractors now tearing down the building have found that the dust and soot of the chimney and hasement rooms are valuable 'pay dirt," realsilver ingots

The chimrey still stands because gold producing dost, which when washed produces gold Thirt barrels of the pay duri have been collected and the dust has yielded \$2,000.
