STATE NEWS

MANY MICHIGAN BUILDINGS DECLARED FIRETRAPS

LANSING, Mich.—Many of the buildings in Michigan used for public purposes, including schools, hotels, churches, halls and theatres, are veritable fire-traps, declares John T. Winship, state fire marshal, in his annual report to Gov. Ferris.

During 1915 the number of buildings used for public purposes burned or partially destroyed by fire was 62, of which number 29 were hotels, 11 theatres, five churches, four court-houses and two hospitals.

"If Michigan is to avoid disasters like these which have recently occurred in the east and by which the lives of many women and children have been sacrificed, a strict state building code must be enforced," declares Mr. Winship.

This is true especially along the lines of the construction of schools, hotels, hospitals, theatres, halls, and other buildings in which the public is allowed to congregate. Such buildings should be equipped with all necessary exits and fire escapes, should be of fire-resisting construction, the heating plants should be outside the building and all wiring be installed by practical electricians and approved by city or state electrical inspectors.

HOLDS MORTGAGE PROBABLY ON HOUSE OF LANDLORD WHO CAN'T GET RENT

GOLD MINE IN STREET

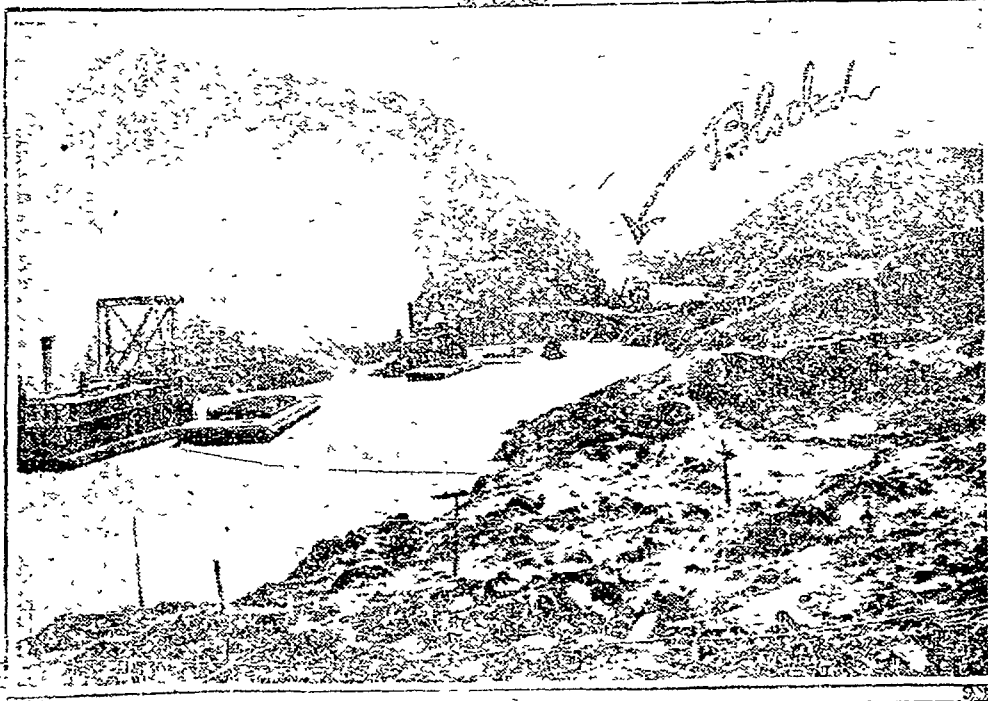

"At the University of Michigan, considering the freshman and sophomore classes, we should have to have four regiments," said Regent Beal.
