Contemptible gasoline thieves took almost the last quart that Hoyt Woodman had in his car one night last week.

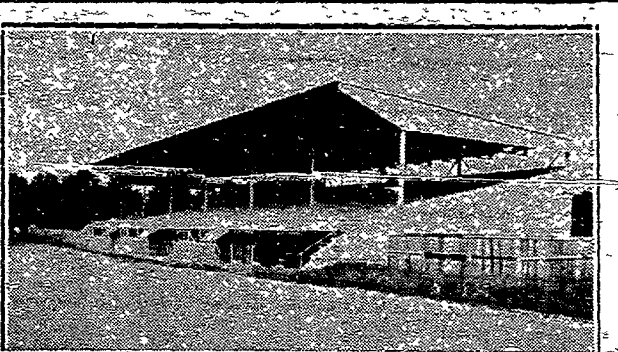
TWILIGHT WINNER DECIDED TONIGHT
