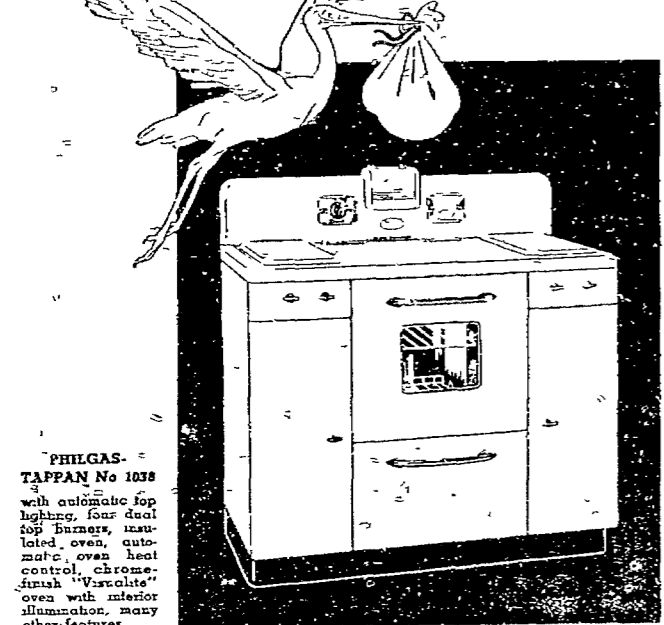

Our Lady of Victory Church. Since Christ's actions at the Last Supper ended with His words, "This do in remembrance of me" (Luke XXII, 19), the Catholic church has ever taken the reproduction of the Last Supper and its connotation with Christ's death for sinners as the official mode of worship. The slaying of Christ, the Lamb of God of the New Testament, on the altar of the Cross was His progression from the Old Testament worship in the slaying of a lamb in the Temple. Malachi had long before prophesied that "from the rising of the sun even unto the going down of the same my (i. e., the Lord's) name shall be great among the Gentiles; and in every place shall be offered unto my name a PURE OFFERING" (Malachi II, 11). St. Paul

adds: "For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do show the Lord's death till he come" (I Cor. XI, 26). This is the church's interpretation of the Mass. Two Masses each Sunday at 7:30 and 10 a. m. All parish ladies whether they belong to the Sodality or League of St. Anne, should attend the monthly meeting to be held next Tuesday evening, June 21, beginning with Benediction at 7 o'clock. The pastor will discuss the time and purposes of the vacation school to be held in July. We shall endeavor to have the Felician Sisters present to explain the important items.
