Landowner Who Signed Lease Is Informed that Activity is Scheduled for Apr. 1; Will Drill for Oil

#### Lease 7,000 Acres

A reliable source revealed this week that the Wenver Oil and Gas company of Grand Rapids, had leased the entire NE section of Sal-em township with the view of drill-ing for all. Activity is expected to start about Apr. 1.

Although confirmation to the immediate drilling activity has not come from the Weaver company, (neither hias the leasing been confirmed officially) one of the land owners who has signed the lease with the company, informed the press that the company wanted to get started this spring. get started this spring.

Some 7,000 acres, it is understood, are under lease to the company in the area where the Kehrl wildcatter (Sec. 2 NW, NW, NE) of 1937 developed into a gasser after drilling had gone beyond the 4,000 foot level. The gas was found in the Trenton formation. A slight show of oil was found slightly below the 2500 foot

No commercial outlet has been obtained for the gasser. The well was sunk by the McKinley On Company of Detroit C J Hammer of 2235 East Seven Mile road, was one of the promoters Orville Dudley lives on the Kehrl farm






#### Maine Builds a Double-Decker




