• New Type of School Election .... With the school referendum bringing out 560 qualified electors last Friday, perhaps the settlement of questions involved may again allow the school administration to move along on an ever keel.

Viewing in retrospect the lack of furor and usual cat and dog tactics of some annual school meetings, we are wondering why the election of our school board members could not be conducted in the same democratic manuer. Northville has had wounded feelings and clickish reactions to annual school meetings aplenty. These things do not help a community - quarrels are always destructive of something. We believe that there is much to be said in favor of the secret ballot, and open poll election of a school board, as opposed to the town meeting style now tolerated. 

SPEED AFFECTS SPRAY
An illustration of how speed afects the job of spraying an orchard is contained in the 1941 supplement to the Spraying Calendar. The Michigan State College bulletin is ssued every two years, but the single-page supplement prepared in alternate years is printed to offer timely information. In work of E J Rasmussen, Ray Hitsen and Don Cathon it was found that when the spray outfit progressed at a mile at hour speed, the mg passed 55 trees each minute where trees were spaced at 16 feet. When the speed was ammeased to 25 mules an hour, the same krees were splayed at the rate of 138 trees a minute. Use of the information is recommended to de-termine from the output of the spray rig whether sufficient noteriai is being sprayed out to give good coverage.
