### 3 Candidates Qualify for Nomination in School Board Election

Dr. Russell M. Atchison, Howard L. Atwood and C. M. Chase Are Qualified Candidates for Expired Terms of Dr. E. B. Cavell and Willard Ely; Deadline for Voters' Registration Is 8 p.m. Saturday, July 5

### School Election Is July 14

The Saturday deadline for filing of petitions by persons seeking election to the Northville board of education brought three candidates to the field for the two vacancies which occur with the expiration of the terms of Dr. E. B. Cavell and Willard Ely. The petition of one candidate failed to qualify legally for a place on the ballot because sufficient signatures on the petition were not duly registered according to law.

None of Dr. Cavell nor Mr. Atwood nor Mr. Chase has been nominated. Dr. Russell M. Atchison, of 132 Fairview, Howard L. Atwood, 123 High street; C. M. Chase of 125 South Clement road.


### Police Department Gives Warnings for Sane Fourth

### Board Registers 163 Men for Army Service

July Quota Is Set Tentatively for 48 Men; 8 Extras To Be Sent to Meet June Call

Board 61 registered 163 men Tuesday, July 1, when the second national registration was held throughout the United States.

This number included men who have reached the age of 21 years since last October. In reply to headquarters' inquiry as to the largest order number for an individual registrant, prior to midnight, June 30, Board 61 said the number was 2573.

Standing first in line to be registered Tuesday morning was Ned Franklin May of Plymouth.

The first registration call for Board 61 gave 3910 cards to work

EXEMPT MEN OVER 28  
Board 61 was notified Wednesday that it was to postpone for 30 days the induction of men who had reached the age of 28 years on or before July 1. This delay was to take place, pending final action on the bill.

Originally 3500 were registered; of this number 300 belonged in other districts. By the same token, the board received over 600 cards for boys belonging in this district who had registered elsewhere.

Of the 31 men sent in last week for army service four were rejected at the induction station. They were: John P. Leonard, Edward C. Riegel, Robert Edgar Moore and William J. Weisler. With these rejects and with the four men

Village Tax  
Rate Is Lower  
Than in 1940

50-Cent Decrease Comes with  
Figure Set at \$20.34 Per Thousand Assessed Valuation

The tax rate per thousand valuation for 1941 is \$20.34, 50 cents lower than in 1940 when the rate was \$20.84.

Making up the \$20.34 rate is the general fund at \$8.94 and the sinking fund at \$11.40.

The total assessed valuation for the village is \$2,553,850.00 as against \$2,605,250.00 in 1940.

Northville's village budget adopted by the council April 21, is \$53,600 to be spent on the tax rolls.

Taxes are payable at the Village Hall. The deadline for payment is Sept. 1.





### The Etiquette of THE FLAG

We all love Old Glory, but sometimes our manner of showing respect to our flag becomes careless. The following code of flag etiquette is taken from the U. S. Army regulations, and is reprinted here to help folks give the flag the respect that we all mean it to have.

Never raise the flag before sunrise and take it in at sunset. Never leave the flag out in rain or snow.

Do not wash the flag; it is not supposed to need it (but it can be dry cleaned if necessary). Use stripes, bunting and shields for decorations. Do not drape around pillars or platforms.

Do not allow a flag to become a repository of pictures and glass at a political meeting. The Holy Bible only should be placed on the flag at any time.

The church pennant, only in the Navy, can be raised above the flag.

At unveilings the flag should be raised; never dropped so that it will touch the ground.

On Memorial Day the flag is flown at half mast (or staff) from sunrise to noon and full staff from noon to sunset.

If a flag is flown at half staff during a funeral, it is raised to full staff at the conclusion of the ceremonies. As a preliminary to half masting the flag, it should be raised to the top of the staff and slowly lowered.

When hanging the flag over a street, the union, or field of stars, flies to north in east and west streets. The union flies to east in north and south streets.

When hanging the flag on a wall, or on the outside of a house, or on a porch, the union, or field of stars, should be in the upper left corner, as you face the flag.




