YOUR ELECTRIC SERVANTS are built for long, hard use—and they won't shirk their responsibilities if you treat them kindly! But remember, they must last for the duration.

YOUR ELECTRIC IRON—Keep bottom of iron clean. Avoid ironing over zippers, snaps, hooks and eyes. Don't go away to answer the doorbell, telephone, etc. and leave the iron turned on—even for a minute. Keep the cord away from a hot iron. Be sure the iron is cold before putting it away. Be careful not to drop your iron.

YOUR TOASTER—Never dip a toaster in water. Don't jab at it with a fork to remove a piece of toast. Brush off crumbs with a cloth or soft brush. (Many toasters have a removable bottom plate for cleaning out collected crumbs.)

YOUR COFFEE MAKER—Keep inside of coffee maker clean. (Never permit left-over coffee to stand in the coffee maker.) Clean and rinse filter cloth thoroughly after using. Keep filter cloth in cold water between usings.

YOUR FOOD MIXER—Always remove beaters or attachments immediately after using. Wash with warm water, rinse and dry. Clean body of mixer with soap and water, being careful not to get water into the motor. Follow manufacturer's directions as to oiling, operation, etc.

YOUR WAFFLE IRON—Wipe off grids with a dry cloth after use. Use a stiff brush to remove any particles that stick. Never reach into the waffle iron with a damp cloth. Never put the waffle iron in water. The Detroit Edison Company.


### Walled Lake Brevities . . .







TO CONVEY POWER TO THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTHVILLE, MICHIGAN, TO OPERATE GAS MAINS, PIPES AND SERVICES ON, ALONG, ACROSS AND UNDER THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS, STREETS, ALLEYS, BRIDGES, AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES AND TO DO A LOCAL GAS BUSINESS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTHVILLE, WAYNE COUNTY, MICHIGAN, FOR A PERIOD OF THIRTY YEARS, AND REPEALING THE RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SAID TOWNSHIP, FEBRUARY 5, 1914, WHEREBY A FRANCHISE WAS GRANTED TO JOHN H. FIDLER AND CLARENCE A. FOX, THEIR SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS.

under the public highways streets, alleys, bridges, and other public places, and to do a local gas business in the Township of Northville, Wayne County, Michigan, for a period of thirty years.

SECTION 2. In consideration of the rights, power and authority hereby granted, all of which shall vest in the Grantee for a period of thirty (30) years, as aforesaid, said Grantee shall faithfully perform all obligations required by the terms hereof, and such performance, by the Grantee, shall be in lieu of all license fees, rentals, or charges of every name and nature, except property taxes, which the Township might otherwise levy and impose.

SECTION 3. No street, alley, bridge, highway or other public place shall be obstructed, longer than necessary, during the work of construction or repair, and shall be restored to the same order and condition as when said work was commenced. All of Grantee's pipes and mains shall be placed in the highways and other public places as not to unnecessarily interfere with the use thereof for highway purposes.

SECTION 4. Said Grantee shall at all times keep and save the Township free and harmless from all loss, costs and expense to which it may be subjected by reason of the construction and maintenance of the structures and equipment hereinauthorized in case any action is commenced against the Township on account of the permission herein given, said Grantee shall, upon demand, defend the Township and cover it free and harmless from all loss, cost and damage.

SECTION 5. The rights, power and authority herein granted, are not exclusive.

SECTION 6. Said Grantee shall from time to time extend its gas distribution system to and within said Township, and shall furnish gas to applicants residing therein whenever the amount of gas to be furnished thereby shall provide an adequate and reasonable return upon the cost of making such extensions and providing such service.

SECTION 7. Said Grantee shall be entitled to charge the inhabitants of said Township for gas furnished thereat, at rates which have been approved by the Michigan Public Service Commission, to which Commission the authority and jurisdiction to fix, regulate and alter gas rates and rules regulating service in said Township are hereby granted for the term of this franchise. Such rates and rules shall be subject to review and change at any time upon petition therefor being made by either said Township, acting by its Township Board, or by said Grantee.

SECTION 8. This ordinance, when accepted and ratified as herein provided, shall repeal the provisions of the resolution adopted by the Township Board of said Township of Northville, February 5, 1914, entitled "A Resolution relative to granting permission to lay, maintain, operate and use gas pipes, mains, conductors, and service pipes, and the selling of gas, in the public highways and private rights of way in the Township of Northville, Wayne County, Michigan," and the amendments, if any, so such resolution whereby a franchise was granted to John H. Fidler and Clarence A. Fox, their successors and assigns.
