

the French, throwing flowers, waving and cheering their heads off. When we got to the house where we were to stay we had to fix some wires to get lights. One of our grounds was covered with all old man and it took me exactly half hour to get it from him. A small pond of water here and there. Now that the censorship is into his hands, and looks for better lives a little I can tell what we were and what I was doing. I have been in Frankfurt. Finally, I got one of the boys who speaks Czech to explain to the old boy. Why was I in a town called Chittino. Everyone speak English; it sure just in Czechoslovakia a little body am I kidding? Just call me mine point Slosser. Just seen the people as we rode thru think I have only 70 miles to the town. They were just like us. But at the present time
