



G. I. Students Eligible for Subsistence Loans

Veterans attending Michigan colleges this fall who are faced with a sixty day delay in obtain ing federal subsistence checks from the Veterans Administration may obtain a Student Subsistence Loan from the State Office of Veterars' Affairs, Late-

ing.

These loans are made solely for the purpose of providing the veteran with subsistence during the period between his enrollment and the date of the receipt of his first federal subsistence

Eligibility for such loans confined to veterans, who, at the time of induction, were bona fide residents of this state and who are now engaged in a course of instruction at a school located in the state of Michigan.

The amount of the loan will not exceed \$65.00 for a single yeteran, or \$90.00 for a married veteran.

Student Subsistence should be initiated and cleared through the veterans counselor at the school. In cases where the school does not have this service the veteran should make application for the lean-at the nearest community counseling center, or write to the State Office of Veterans' Affairs, 411 West Michigan Lansing, Michigan,
