Frank. Clark, supervisor of Novi Township says: "I do not think there is any question in the mind of anyone acquainted with conditions of the immediate need for room and added facilities.

The present plan was prepared by the Weifare and Buildings and Grounds committees and presented to the Ways and Means committee for plans to finance.

Two plans were proposed One to issue bonds payable over a period of five years, the other to spread 2 mills (\$200 per thousand) for two years and binld on a cash basis.

The Ways and Means Committee were unanimous for the two mill or pay as you go, plan and presented that plan to the Board round figures, \$285,000 00; and last year it had jumped to \$375,-

At present there are in the Infirmary 273 beds for all purposes, and in view of the fact that part of the building which was originally planned to accommodate 25 beds, has been täken over for administrative purposes the present building is overcrowded by 173 beds. Many occasions have arisen when there was no bed available for a person brought to the Infirmary, either for home care or hospitalization
