Rural School Children

To improve the library service to the rural school children in Wayne County, the Extension Dept. of the Wayne County Library will begin the direct loaning of books to an estimated 17, 000 pupils this month. Replacing a system of loaning classroom collections, which became obsolete with the growth of the rural schools, the Traveling Branch Library and the Bookmobile will make trips to 90 schools each fourth week.

This winter the boys and girls will be able to select their books from the hundreds of volumes carried on the mobile libraries, instead of from classroom collec tions of about 40 books which were exchanged only three or four times each year, according on East Seven Mile Road.
