



GRANDPA OF THE CABLE TRAIN - Possibly you've seen modern tractor-drawn cable trains burying Long Distance telephone cable across 'the Michigan countryside. Back in 1882, two pioneer telephone men hitched a locomotive to a farmer's plow, turned a deep furrow five miles in length and "planted" an assortment of wires to determine the effect of soil conditions on them. From this early experiment came facts helpful in developing modern underground cable!

If you are a Democrat, are you ashamed of it? Or, do you apologize because you vote Re-publican? That seems to be the bîg issue in current legislative debates on the advisability of eliminating the secret primary. This is the system of pumary voting now used in Michigan that does not require electors to declare party affiliation.

· Democrats, who were largely responsible for imitiating the secret primary in 1937; feel that pressure against Democrats is too great in the small towns" to make it wise to return to the old system where voters must reveal their party in order to vote. Many Republicans, on the other hand, are saying that the present system is destroying party responsibility and ultimately will lead to "destruction of the two party system."

Repeal of the two-year-old lobbyist-registration act is being considered. This is the law that was fathered by former Gover-nor Sigler as part of his better government program: Rep. Howard R Carrol (R. Mt. Clemens); who has introduced a repeal bill says that, "The law is not being enforced to centrol real lobbyists. All it does is discourage people from using their constitutional right to talk to their representatives." At present, 246 lobbyists are registered.
