1. Is the Community Center building now being used by the Northville School District? Yes, it is being used daily for

music and physical education classes for elementary and junior high school pupils. It is also used as a lunch room daily. The **Community Center building offers** the only place where assemblies, plays, etc. can be held on the Main Street campus.

The Community Center grounds have also been used as a faculty and bus parking area. The gasoline pump and storage tank for buses are also located in this area.

2. If available, does the School District plan on using the Community Center building in the future?

Yes, when the plans for the rehabilitation of the old high school for junior high use, were prepared it was assumed that the Community Center building would be available for use by junior high classes.

3. Does the Northville School District pay for the operation of the Community Center building now?

Yes, all operational costs are paid by the Northville School District. The only additional costs will be insurance and cost of lighting the parking lot-

4. Is money available for the purchase of the Community Center building?

Yes, when the 1956 Bond Issue was approved it contained a provision for the purchase of a site. The purchase of the Community Building and site will qualify as a site, if approved by the electorate, according to enabling legislation passed by the 1959 State Legislature.

5. Will the purchase of the Community Center raise my taxes? No, the money is available now. The additional cost for insurance and lighting will be absorbed in current operational

available for school purposes? The music, physical education and other programs will have to be eliminated or curtailed. Lunch room situation will be chaotic.

It will be necessary to take over elementary classrooms for junior high use. A new site for an elementary school will have to be procured and funds to build a new elementary school will have to be voted soon.

The new high school was built to house grades 10, 11 and 12. It is intended to house grades 7, 8 and 9 in the junior high school building as soon as enrollment

warrants If it is not possible to accommodate 9th grade pupils in the junior high school, the high school will have to be enlarged. An addition to the high school will cost much more than the purchase of the Community Center.

Parking area will have to be found for buses and faculty cars. 7. Can the Northville School District build a structure with the same area as the Commu-

nity Center building for \$145,-000? No - It would cost more than

\$300,000 to duplicate the Community Center building.

8. Would the School District make the Community building available for community use? Yes, it is not planned to change the policy for the use of the Community building by properly authorized community groups. 9. How was the sale price of

\$145,000 arrived at? The sale price was determined

by the amount of City general fund (tax revenue) money which went into the construction of the building. The remainder of the money came from Race Track revenue to the City (then the Village of Northville).

10. Why not continue present lease arrangement between school and city?

The present lease arrangement provides that the school will operate the building for \$1.00 per year. This arrangement does not provide the school with flexibility such as remodeling and construc-(Continued on Page 4)

It was aimed at alleviating a critical situation, in Michigan's Game and Fish Protection Fund.

S P E A K I N G for the Record

By Bill Sliger

For the past several weeks city and school officials have authored a series of articles admittedly written to gain public support for the proposed sale of the community building to the school district.

The idea of the school district purchasing the city-owned building was conceived, studied and presented by the school board and city council after numerous study sessions over the past three years

Now the elected officials of the two bodies are trying to convince the public that their plan is a good one.

Personally, I am ready to accept their recommendation and urge school district voters to vote "yes" at the polls Monday.

The very fact that 10 men representing separate but overlapping interests are in unanimous agreement provides heavy support for this conclusion Certainly, it outweighs opinions derived with less than the full benefit of all the facts that have been examined together by the council and school board

But even beyond this, I believe it offers a sensible answer to a knotty problem and, perhaps most important, represents the results of a genuine cooperative effort on the part of two governing bodies

Taxpayers may find it difficult (especially at tax-paying time) to recognize the deep consideration given by our elected bodies to the burden which the cost of government places upon each individual citizen.

It is, however, a constant and prime concern. The city council has, for example, kept its tax levy at a minimum because it knows that the school system has been undergoing a period when growing pupil population has required heavy building expenditures.

Similarly, the school board knows that pressing public improvements face the city and that a large percentage of their taxpayers are city taxpayers, too.

The community building sale is a plan conceived with the welfare of the entire school district in mind. Beyond being a practical arrangement, it should, in the long run, be the most economical for the taxpayer.







• I am convinced that we should capitalize on the apparent high interest in education in Northville by using this interest to realign our sights and standards, not necessarily to conform with our neighbors in Plymouth, Livonia, Farmington, etc., but to establish the values and the kind of schools we want for our boys and girls.




