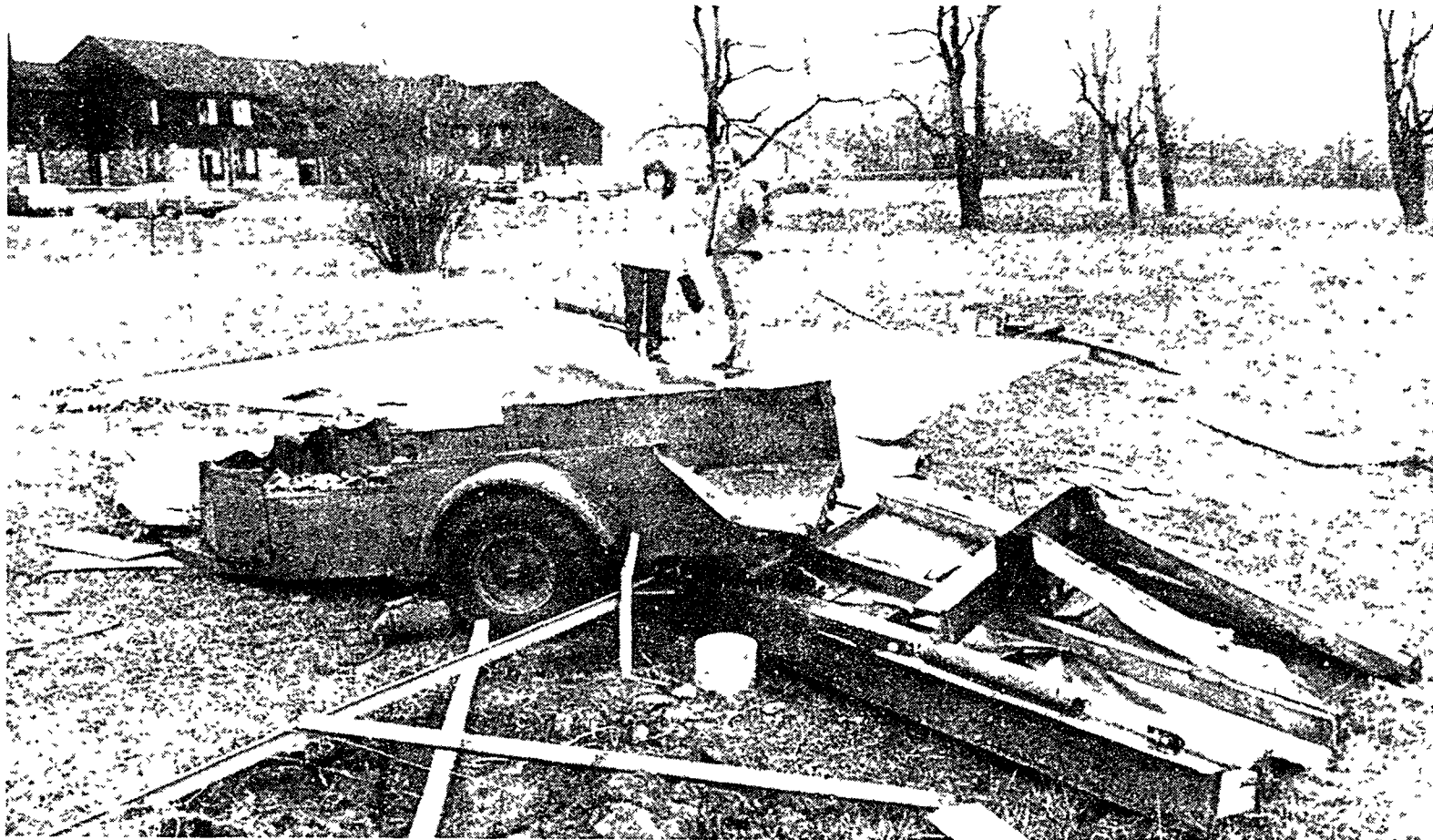

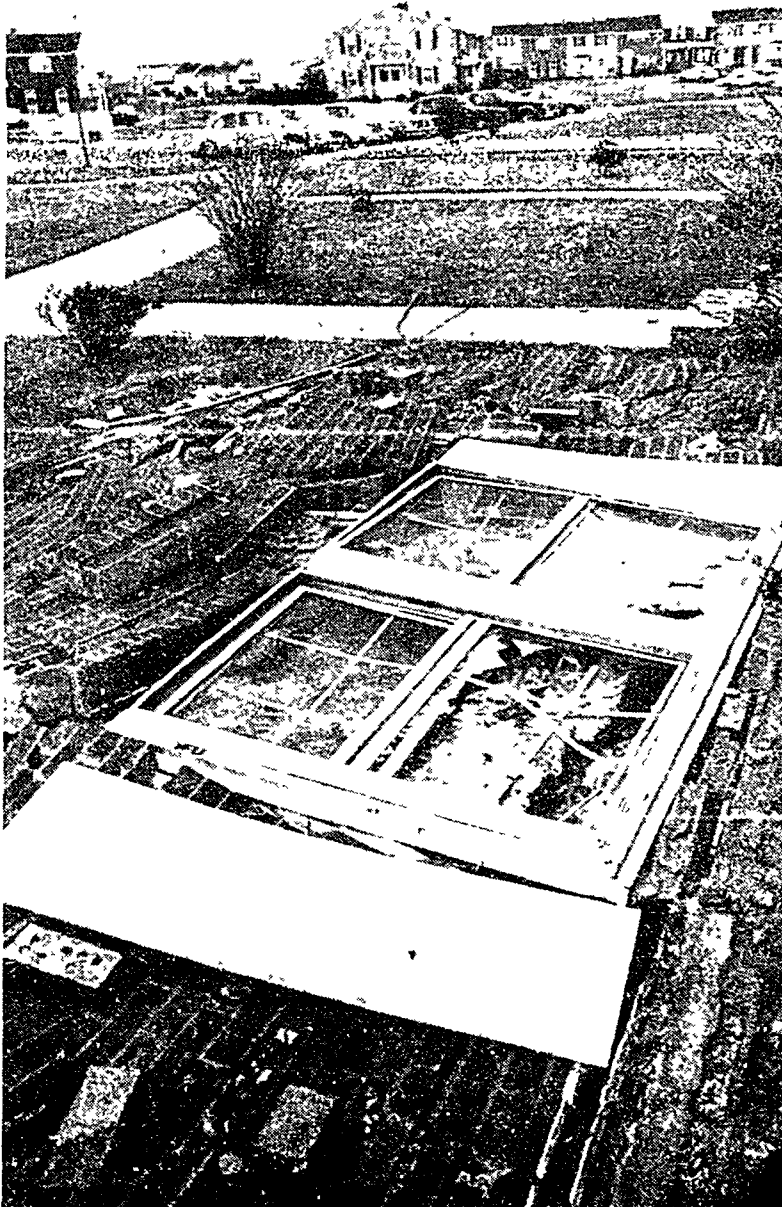

School budget's still an estimate

A \$9 million tentative budget to be used for determining Wayne County tax allocations was approved by the Northville Board of Education Monday night.

The report to the tax allocation board which will be made between May 1 and May 16 will determine how many mills of support Northville schools will get from Wayne County. The district has been getting about 8.9 mills in past years.

The allocation budget is not the same as the district's general operating budget which must be approved by October. But it is a starting place for the district, which undoubtedly will be making many revisions before a final budget is approved in the fall.

"This document bears little resemblance to the formal budget but it is a projection of our best estimates," said Superintendent Larry Nichols.

"This is a justification document, one of the first passes toward a budget," said Finance Director Harold Hines. "It will be changed as more data becomes available to us."

Though administrators are emphatic

that the figures used in the allocation budget are not final, they are the district's best guess at the moment.

The estimated expenditures in the allocation budget total \$9,305,392, a \$712,281 increase over last year. Most of the money, \$5,409,238, is slated for instruction. A total of \$2,254,002 is in the category of business services, which includes maintenance, transportation and operations and the business office.

The district spent \$7,994,487 in 1978-79 and \$8,593,111 in 1979-80.

The district knows even less about what its actual revenues will be.

The district's tentative figure for local tax revenues to be collected is \$8,148,767, plus \$1,156,625 from other sources. It hopes for \$758,500 in state revenue, \$111,045 in federal revenue and about \$287,000 from miscellaneous revenues and transfers.

However, the district still does not know the school district's state equalized value of the property here and probably won't know until May. It does not know how much the state will guarantee per pupil, or even what federal funds will be available.

In addition, the district still does not know what millage it will be allowed to levy this year because of the Headlee tax limitation amendment. Last year the district levied 35.02 mills while in 1978 it levied 35.40 mills.

The district is predicting there will be 66 fewer students next year, for an enrollment of 3,783. The number of full-time equivalency teachers will drop only slightly this year, from 185.3 to 181 (last year teacher numbers dropped dramatically, from 206.5 to 185.3).

Teacher's salaries will rise next year, according to the three-year contract ratified last September.

Under 1979-80 contract, teachers with bachelors' degrees are paid between \$12,277 and \$21,277 and teachers with masters' degrees get between \$13,523 and \$25,301.

Next year teachers' salaries will rise to \$13,351 to \$23,155 for bachelors' degrees and \$14,706 to \$27,515 for masters' degrees.

Three sought in store theft

City police are searching for two black men and a black woman in connection with the robbery April 8 of Noder's Jewelry at the corner of Main and Center in downtown Northville.

The three, one carrying a hand-gun, entered the store at approximately 5 p.m. and forced owner Ray Noder — who was alone — into the restroom at the back of the store, police said.

After locking the restroom, the trio ransacked the store — taking cash and various rings, necklaces and other assorted jewelry — and fled from the store, police said.

The owner told police he thought he recognized one of the men as being in the store previously, but he could not be sure.

Though the value of the merchandise taken is not yet known, police said it very likely is several thousand dollars.

Police believe the thieves took advantage of the confusion caused by a severe storm which hit Northville the afternoon of the robbery.

A heavy rain was falling and strong winds blowing when the three escaped and, apparently, no one saw them leave, police said.

A front display window of the store was broken into approximately six months ago, but the thief was apprehended shortly after the burglary.

Six to study manager concept

Should Northville Township hire a professional manager?

A six-member committee named by the board last week will present its answer to the township board next month in the form of a written report. Trustees then must decide if they agree.

If they opt to hire a manager they would be required to adopt a resolution creating the manager and listing his duties and responsibilities.

The committee, consisting of the four members of the township Wage and Salary Review Commission plus two other citizens — Larry Vandermolin of 41848 Ladywood and Gerald Spencer of 42790 Steepleview — was asked by the board to study the concept of a professional manager form of government and to submit a report no later than May 20.

Genetic secrets unraveled

The elusive puzzles of how genes work are being solved but the medical and social implications of such research are just being realized, Geneticist Kazuo Mayeda, Ph.D., told an audience at Schoolcraft College Monday.

"Here is one devastating case," he said. "A 25-year-old woman's brother died of muscular dystrophy when he was 15. Now she is pregnant and does not want to have a child with the same disease. But she knows the disease can be inherited."

"She goes through hospital tests to determine the sex of the baby. A baby girl will be normal. But if it is a boy, there is a 50 percent chance he will have

MD. The test results return: it's a boy. What does she do? We leave it up to her," Mayeda said.

"It is a devastating thing. She saw what happened to her brother. Yet there is a 50 percent chance her male child will be normal. Most of the time in these cases she will terminate the pregnancy because she is so scared."

"It is frustrating for us because so far, we haven't been able to come up with a test to detect MD while the fetus is still in the uterus," Mayeda said.

The door to genetics knowledge has opened wide in the last 10 years so that it is now possible to identify some, though not all, genetic defects in fetuses by the process of "amniocentesis," in which samples of fetal cells are collected and analyzed.

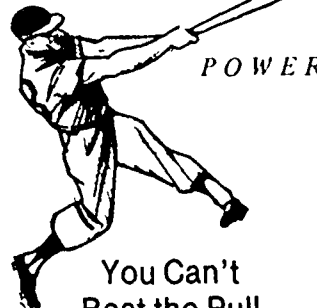
Though muscular dystrophy cannot be detected by this method, diseases such as Down's Syndrome, Turner's Syndrome, sometimes sickle cell anemia and Klinefelter's Syndrome can be determined from analyzing genetic information from the fetus.

"But there is a problem with amniocentesis," Mayeda said. "We might be able to find out what is wrong but we cannot cure what is abnormal in the fetus. There is no way. In genetic counseling we leave it up to the couple. They have the option of having an abortion or having the child."

As a genetic counselor for the Mott Children's Hospital in Detroit and professor of biology at Wayne State, genetic mysteries since 1961.

Hits township home, garage

Tornado leaves trail of debris

Gerry Dodds was standing at the door of her office at Innsbruck apartments April 8 when she saw Gary Pooley's garage fly off its foundation and crash into the woods.

"I was standing right at this door and I saw that garage just lift right off the ground and fly away," the Innsbruck apartment manager said last Wednesday, obviously still shaken at the previous day's ordeal. "The huge trees just snapped like matchsticks. And my car was shaking just like a giant rattling a leaf, like it was about to take off."

Mrs. Dobbs was an eyewitness to the tornado-like squall that swept through Northville township in a dull yellow flash last week. Though the storm lasted only about five minutes (from 5:10 to 5:15 p.m.) it caused severe damage to three homes here.

"The rain was coming down in a sheet, then suddenly it was going up. It wasn't a funnel cloud, it was just the wind," she said. "The sky was dark and the water was going up into the air like a wave. I was shaking all over and was worried about the building. When I turned and looked out the back window, there was our building superintendent walking toward me with not so much as a hair out of place on his head, that's how localized the wind was."

"I never saw anything like it in my life, and I've lived in Michigan for 20 years."

Gary Pooley was talking on the telephone in the kitchen at his home at 42625 Seven Mile when he looked out the back window and saw his garage being blown away.

Clyde Hocker, 42675 Seven Mile, watched as the wind blew open his doors and tore off part of the roof.

And seconds later Ted Hoffman, 19540 Mann Court in Highland Lakes, heard a noise as bricks and windows slid off the entire west side of his condominium.

All three said insurance will cover the damage but last Wednesday morning the families were just trying to put their homes in some sort of order. They seemed still in shock from the from the inclement Tuesday night storm.

That night Gary Pooley, a landscaper, had just returned from work. He and a friend were in the house when the tornado hit.

"I was standing right here in the kitchen talking on the telephone when I saw it," Pooley recollected. "I asked my buddy if there were any tornado warnings and he said no. That's when I saw the trees blow away."

Pooley tried to reach the basement but could not open the outside door to get there.

"I said, let's get the hell out of here. We tried to get to the basement but we couldn't get out. The whole house was shaking like it was going to blow away. Power lines were crackling and I thought the house would burn down. The wind knocked everything around."

All Pooley could do was huddle on the floor as the southeasterly wind picked up and destroyed the trees and second garage in the back yard.

The wind broke his kitchen and bedroom windows and blew glass, wood and debris through the house.

"It happened so fast. It must have been over in 10 seconds," Pooley said.

Pooley's neighbor to the north Clyde Hocker said his son was taking a shower when the tornado hit.

"Everything went real still and quiet, and I was teasing my wife about a tornado when it came," he said. "She took three of the kids to the basement and I ran upstairs to get our son. He said he could feel the bathtub shaking. I grabbed him and took him downstairs though he didn't have any clothes on. But by the time we got down there it was over."

The tempest blew five giant evergreens over and ripped shingles

from the Hocker's roof, leaving parts of the Pooley's garage strewn across their yard, a good block away.

That damage done, the storm skipped its way across to the north of Seven Mile, striking again at the home of Todd Hoffman in Highland Lakes.

The Hoffmans usually have a strong wind coming off Swan Harbour Lake but they knew something more serious was up when their front doors blew open.

"We were listening to music when the doors blew open," Hoffman said. I look-

Seniors will stay until bitter end

Northville High School's Class of 1981 members better be prepared to attend school until the bitter end because it's not likely they will get out of school early next June.

The Northville Board of Education is proposing a policy which would change the calendar year so all students would leave school the same day, starting next year.

"The student calendar year for students in Grade 12 will be identical to that of all high school students," the proposed policy reads. "Commencement exercises for graduating seniors will be on or later than the last official class day for students."

The policy got its first reading Monday night, written by the policy committee in response to the chagrin of teachers and administrators who say they disrupt the last days of class for seniors.

Seniors have always gotten out early in previous years, much to the chagrin of teachers and administrators who say they disrupt the last days of class for the other students.

This year's seniors may be the last to get out of class early. They will be out on June 12 while underclassmen will attend school until June 18.

Administrative guidelines which would accompany the new policy order that commencement dates and all related graduation activity dates be submitted by October 1 of each school year.

The guidelines further specify that high school staff, administrators and selected students would review the program dates, graduation would take place at the Northville High School athletic field unless otherwise requested by the administration, and all students participating in graduation would be required to wear caps and gowns.

ed around and my windows were gone. The windows blew out and the brick slid off the side of the house. We are just trying to clean up and inventory the damage."

By Wednesday morning the damaged side of the Hoffman's house was boarded up but several gawkers were driving by to look at the storm's work.

All three said they felt fortunate that nobody was hurt and that their homes were basically intact.

"I don't know how that tornado got around here without knocking down the

house," Pooley said, looking at the huge spruce trees strewn around his back and front yards and at the cement foundation where the garage had been.

About 200 yards north of the foundation the men found one of the metal garage doors wrapped around a tree like a tin can.

Hocker looked at the mess laying only yards away from his house and dug his hands in his pockets against the grey, cold.

"We were just lucky it wasn't worse," he said.

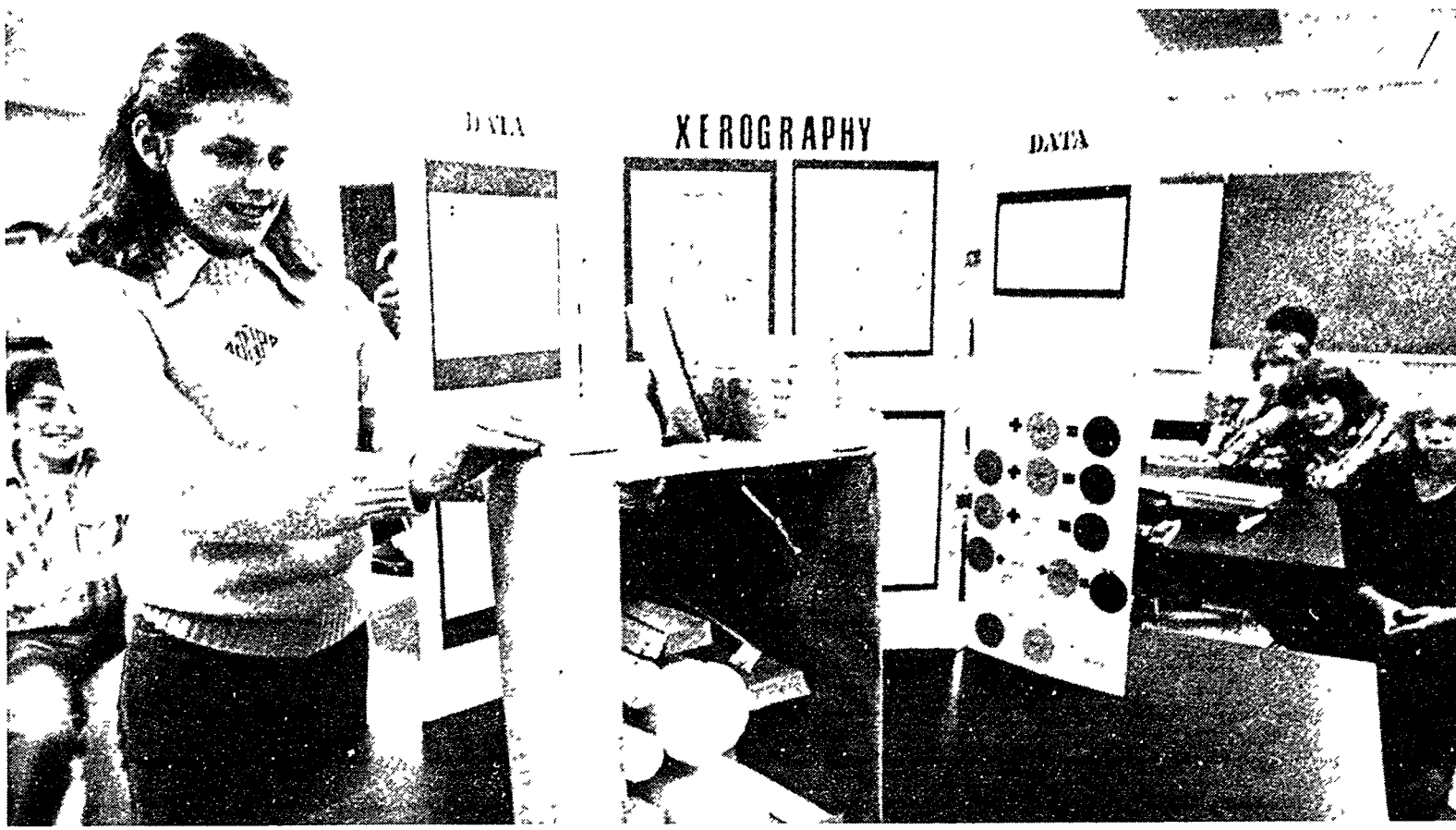

Twelve teachers granted tenure

Twelve teachers were granted tenure and one teacher's contract was not renewed by the Northville Board of Education Monday night.

John Campbell, a teacher at Cooke

Junior High with a degree in special education and social studies, will have tenure effective September 5, 1980.

Sandra Craig, a music teacher at Silver Springs and Moraine Elemen-

tary schools, will have tenure effective October 8.

William Dicks, a physical education and science teacher at Cooke Junior High, will have tenure September 5. Gary Gandolphi, band teacher at Meads Mill Junior High, will have tenure effective September 14.

Patricia Dow, special education teacher at Bryant school, will have tenure as of October 30. Ellen Billig Diamond, special education teacher at Bryant school, will have tenure effective September 20.

Julie Goebel, special education teacher at Moraine Elementary, will have tenure as of September 5, as will special education teacher Henrietta Hilberath from Taft school.

Kathleen Linn, special education teacher at Bryant, will have tenure effective September 5, as will Gregory Seewald, special education teacher at Burger school.

Celia Williams, special education teacher at Bryant, will have tenure on July 13 and Leslie Wilkinson, special education teacher at Burger, will have tenure as of July 10.

Probationary Meads Mill teacher Douglas Zielman was not granted tenure with the school district and his contract will not be renewed for the 1980-81 school year, the board voted.

Board Vice-President Marge Sliger criticized administrators for not conducting more widely spaced evaluations of teachers in the fall and spring.

Many teachers were evaluated twice within two months by their building principals. Director of Administrative Services Burton Knighton said that the evaluation process is being reviewed by committees and will be changed starting next fall.

"I still don't see any sense in evaluating a teacher then re-evaluating them two months later. It is of no use. I have talked for three years and only now can I make a point, when tenure recommendations come up."

Sliger voted no to the teacher's tenure, saying her vote was "no reflection on teaching performances."

Knighton said by the time the evaluation-revision committee began meeting last fall, this year's evaluation times already had been set up.

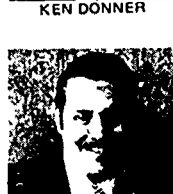

Horse racing equipment stolen

City police are investigating a number of thefts last week of horse racing equipment from the Northville Downs barn area.

A wooden chest containing racing leg caps, helmets, blinders, horse blankets and other racing equipment was reported stolen April 9, police said.

The items are valued at \$650.

A fifth wheel saddle, Goodyear tire and a steel wheel also were taken from the rear bed of a 1976 Ford pickup parked in the Downs barn area near River St., police said.

The vehicle had been parked there since December, police said.

More than 30 windows were vandaliz-

ed at Anger Manufacturing, 777 Baseline, April 12, city police reported. The office window at the north end of the building, six windows located on the west end and 27 small windows at the north end all were damaged or destroyed by a pellet gun or small rocks, police said.

A color television worth approximately \$130 was reported stolen from the cosmetic counter at Perry Drugs, 42401 Seven Mile, township police said. The last of a number of televisions on sale was taken sometime between March 24 and 31, police said.

The burglars left the television's box on the shelf, police said.

Association seeks Taft-8 Mile light

Lexington Condo Homes Association has voiced its opposition to the planned traffic signal at the Taft-Eight Mile intersection.

In a letter to Northville City Council, with copies to other agencies, the association representing homeowners in the subdivision northwest of the intersection cited three reasons for its opposition. They are:

1. Lexington Boulevard North is a private road that currently is used by many drivers to cut off the intersection. With installation of a signal the traffic will multiply considerably and increase the accident frequency on a winding residential street.

2. Very few children cross at the intersection. Instead they use Lexington Boulevard North, then cut through the condo property to Taft. Children won't walk to the light when they can cut the walking distance in half

by using the shortcut. 3. The signal will create a hazard. Driving east or west on Eight Mile will force motorists to break coming down the hills, which can be especially dangerous when the pavement is wet.

As a safety alternative, the association proposed reduction of the speed limit on Eight Mile from 40 to 30 mph.

In response to the objections, city officials noted that the planned signal will be actuated only during those periods when children are walking to and from school.

Furthermore, they pointed out that the city has tried repeatedly, without success, to persuade county and state police officials to reduce limits on Eight Mile.

In fact, they added, the planned traffic signal resulted when the county and state police refused to consider a speed limit reduction but agreed that the signal might be an acceptable alternative.

Planners told to vote

Abstentions by Northville City Planning members are limited under an ordinance amendment approved by city council.

Specifically, the amendment provides that "each member shall vote when a vote is required,

except when a member requests to abstain from voting and gives a reason therefor.

"The right to abstain must be approved by a majority of the other commission members in attendance."

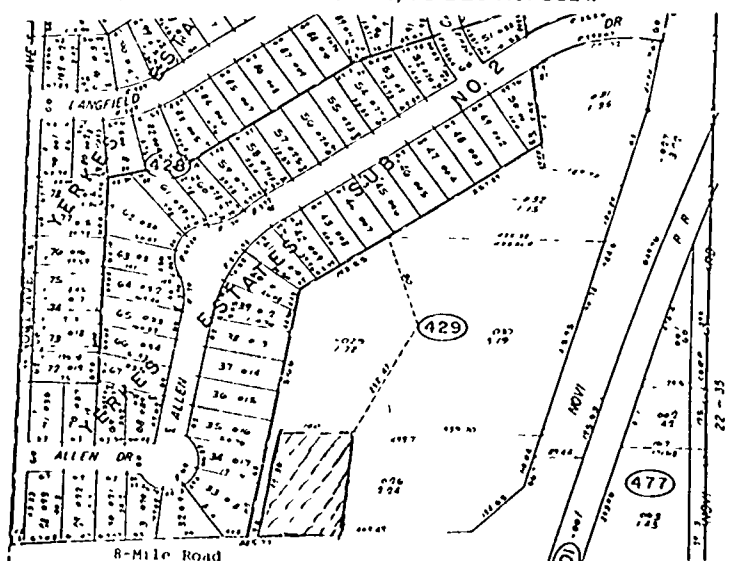

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTHVILLE ESTABLISHING THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTHVILLE MECHANICAL CODE, ADOPTING BY REFERENCE THE BUILDING OFFICIALS AND CODE ADMINISTRATORS INTERNATIONAL INC., BASIC MECHANICAL CODE, THIRD EDITION, COPYRIGHTED 1978 AND KNOWN AS "THE BOCA BASIC MECHANICAL CODE/1978" FOR THE PURPOSE OF REGULATING AND CONTROLLING THE DESIGN, INSTALLATION, MAINTENANCE, ALTERATION AND INSPECTION OF MECHANICAL SYSTEMS; INCLUDING HEATING SYSTEMS; VENTILATING SYSTEMS; COOLING SYSTEMS; STEAM AND HOT WATER HEATING SYSTEMS; WATER HEATERS; PROCESS PIPING; BOILERS AND PRESSURE VESSELS; APPLIANCES UTILIZING GAS, LIQUID OR SOLID FUEL; CHIMNEYS AND VENTS; MECHANICAL REFRIGERATION SYSTEMS; FIREPLACES; BARBECUES, INCINERATORS; CREMATORIES; FIRE SUPPRESSION SYSTEMS AND AIR POLLUTION SYSTEMS AS THEREIN DEFINED AND PROVIDING FOR THE ADMINISTRATION THEREOF AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Township of Northville ordains:

Part I. Pursuant to the Michigan State Construction Code Act of 1972 as amended, being SS125.1501 et. seq., Michigan Compiled Laws, The Building Officials and Code Administrators International Inc., Basic Mechanical Code, Third Edition, Copyrighted 1978 and known as "The BOCA Basic Mechanical Code/1978" is hereby adopted by reference and all provisions thereof are deemed incorporated herein by reference, save and except such portions as are hereinafter deleted, modified, supplemented or amended by Part V below.

Part II. This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited, amended and supplemented as the Mechanical Code Ordinance.

Part III. The purpose of this ordinance shall be to establish a Mechanical Code for the Township of Northville.

Part IV. A complete printed copy of the BOCA Basic Mechanical Code/1978 shall be kept in the office of the clerk of the Township of Northville and shall be available for public use and inspection at the office of said clerk during regular business hours.

Part V. The BOCA Basic Mechanical Code/1978 shall be, and hereby is, modified, amended or supplemented by the following deletions, modifications, amendments and supplements as denominated by the appropriate section and decimal codifications set forth in the BOCA Basic Mechanical Code/1978, and as so modified, amended or supplemented the BOCA Basic Mechanical Code/1978 shall be, and hereby is, affirmed and adopted to read, INTER ALIA, as follows:

A. Section M-201.0 of the code is amended to read as follows:

(1) The following defined terms, appearing in Section M-201.0 of this code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) "Air for combustion": The amount of air required for safe and proper and combustion at the altitude of the Township of Northville.

(b) "Department": The Building Department of the Township of Northville is responsible for the enforcement of this code.

(c) "Fire Department": The fire department of Township of Northville.

(d) "Gas": An aeriform fluid having neither independent shape nor volume, which has weight, occupies space, tends to expand indefinitely, and which can be changed to a liquid or a solid state only by increasing pressure with decreased or controlled temperature or by decreasing temperature with increased or controlled pressure. The word shall include natural, manufactured, mixed gas or liquefied petroleum products with BTU content based on the altitude of the Township of Northville.

(e) "Rating Input": The amount of gas fuel in BTUs per hour that can be safely burned in an appliance at the altitude of the Township of Northville.

(2) Table M-502, inspection fee schedule shall read as follows: Inspection fees and fees for mechanical work shall be those designated in Ordinance 27 of the Township of Northville, and subject to such amendments, additions or deletions as may be made from time to time by resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Township of Northville.

(3) M-904.1 "General": In addition to the other requirements of this code, the following shall govern the construction of crematories. For purposes of this code, a crematory shall include any device used to incinerate human bodies for which burial permits are required by either the State of Michigan or the Township of Northville. Pathological incinerators shall be treated as commercial incinerators.

(4) M-1117.1 "General": Any person found guilty of violating any provision of these regulations or any lawful order or notice from the Department pertaining to these regulations, shall be subject to the fines or penalties as prescribed by this section. Whenever, in any section of this code, or any section, rule or regulation promulgated hereunder, the performances of any act is required, prohibited or declared to be unlawful, and definite fine or penalty is not provided for a violation thereof, any person, firm or corporation, who shall be convicted of the violation of any such section shall, for each offense be fined the sum of not more than \$500 or imprisoned for not more than 90 days or both such fine and such imprisonment plus costs of prosecution. Each day's violation shall constitute a separate offense. The suspension or revocation of any license, certificate, permit or other privilege, conferred by this jurisdiction shall not be regarded as a penalty for the purpose of this code.

Part VI. This ordinance shall be effective and in force from and after 30 days after publication, being May 16, 1980.

Part VII. This ordinance was adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Township of Northville, Wayne County, Michigan at its regular meeting duly called and held on April 10, 1980 and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by law.

NHS fire alarm set to operate

"There must be a better way," a Gillis electrician sighed as he installed a new \$12,000 fire alarm system at Northville High School last week.

The electrician was bemoaning the fact that within a few months or weeks after a company installs a school fire alarm the students usually find some way to foil it.

"This is a good system but it's not going to be foolproof," he said.

At any rate, for the first time in three years NHS now has a legal, five-zoned fire alarm system.

Gillis installed the system last week while students were on Easter break.

The new system splits the building into five zones. Several pull sta-

tions are spaced around the building. When an alarm is pulled, a control panel in the office lights up to show which zone is affected.

The district also has asked Gillis to give an estimate on what it would cost to install several "double acting" pull stations in remote areas of the building, in which an initial motion would set

off lights in the office and the second motion would set off the alarm. Gillis electricians said this type of alarm would cut down on vandalism.

Still, district administrators are crossing their fingers and hope peer pressure will keep the fire alarm system operating at NHS. Gillis gives a one year warranty on the project.

ISEP gets grant for 230-day study

The Northville school district has won a \$50,000 state grant along with the Wayne County Intermediate School District to study whether a 230-day school year is the best length for severely mentally retarded students.

Leonard Resmierski, director of the Institutions' Special Education Program (ISEP) in Northville, has not been satisfied that this arbitrary length of time is optimum for students, staff or parents.

"There are many questions left to be answered as we do not have credible research that substantiates... (230 hours)... as being most effective," Resmierski said. "Certainly, we have identified it as 'a long haul' for all involved in the program."

Regular K-12 students attend school 180 days per year with a summer vacation. But the state demands that mentally retarded students in programs like ISEP attend school almost year-round, from September through August.

Resmierski and Dorothy Billings of the Wayne County Intermediate School District will conduct the study using the 837 severely multiply impaired and mentally impaired students in the intermediate district.

The two will study the relationship between the length of the school year and how well students retain what they learn, testing them in September 1980, January 1981, June 1981 and August 1981.

Resmierski hopes the study will answer the question of what would happen to students if the program were reduced to 180 days and whether severely multiply impaired and severely mentally impaired students are as much in need of periodic vacations as regular students are.

It also will test what the impact would be on parents or agencies if the program were reduced to 180 days and whether students will forget what they've learned all year if they have a summer vacation.

The study will be completed in December, 1981. What they reveal, it is already known that the 230-day school year is rough on teachers, who often are transferred within the department to avoid "burnout" from the intense job of working with the severely retarded.

Citizens ask park designation for this wooded corner

Why all of the fuss?

If residents of that section of Northville calling itself Cabbagetown went away puzzled by city council's reaction to their request last week, it's understandable. Others in the audience and one or two council members also were mystified.

The residents asked council to formally designate city-owned property at the corner of Base Line and Carpenter as park land. They did so, they explained, to insure its continued use as a neighborhood park or open space where their children can play.

Property formally designated as a park cannot be sold by the city unless the voters of the city approve the sale. Without the park designation, it may be sold simply by a vote of the five member council.

Council's failure to understand the residents' motive for the request bothers us almost as much as its reasoning for needlessly antagonizing the neighborhood.

It's been used for park or open space for the past 10 years, so why the sudden request for dedication? council wondered. Why, indeed.

One good reason might be that council itself gave residents the idea by discussing the value of park dedication in connection with proposed rezoning near Eight Mile-Novi Road. Another reason, perhaps the salient one, is that a year or so ago council seriously considered selling the Base Line-Carpenter land.

Interestingly, the mayor, himself, lent fresh credence to a sale possibility by suggesting last week that it is a valuable piece of land that could be dealt by the city as a tax curbing measure.

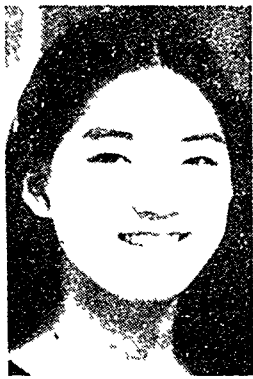
So there's plenty of motive for the residents' request.

Which brings us to the park question, itself. The wooded Base Line-Carpenter land was purchased nearly 10 years ago by the city, upon the recommendation of a citizens parks and recreation committee, "as a means of preserving natural areas to be enjoyed by residents and to forestall future development for housing."

It was not the intent of council at the time, nor should it have been, to buy the half-acre site (for \$18,000) for future sale and profit (it reportedly has a value now of between \$40-50,000). Council member Carolann Ayers was correct in suggesting that the city ought not purchase properties for speculation — but citizens wonder now, in the wake of last week's discussion, if the present council is of the same mind.

If council has no intention of selling the land, why all of the fuss? Why needlessly antagonize or worry citizens who made what we believe was a reasonable and legitimate request?

Finally, if council intends to make the Cabbagetown neighborhood park a pawn in its budget deliberations, it should play chess with other city properties as well.

man for a short period of time. A family without a mother has a more difficult time. There will be many young women drafted that will not be married of course, but if we are to have equal rights, married women will have to serve also.

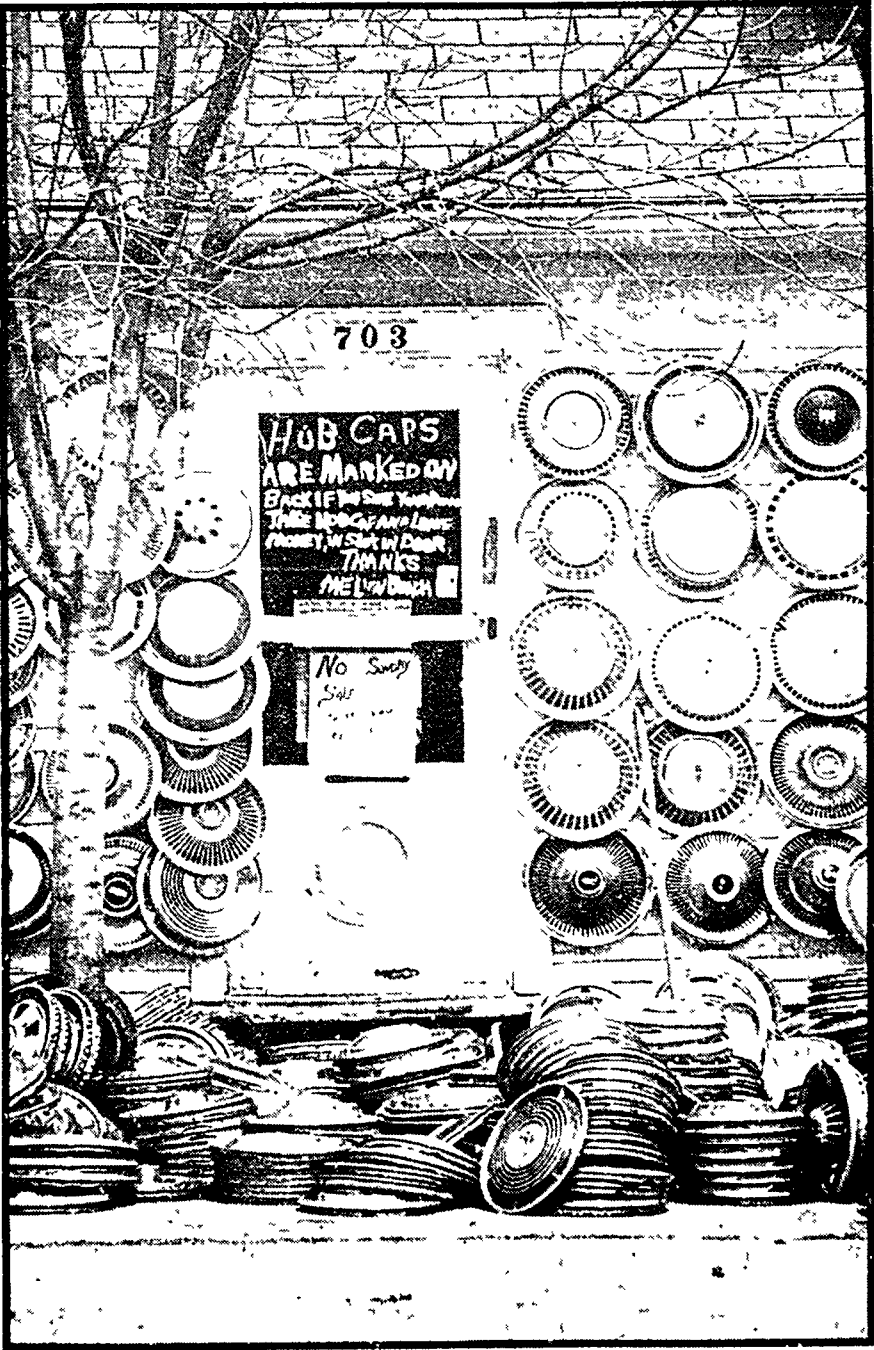
The thing I resent the most is that those strongly fighting for equal rights are not the ones who will be drafted.

JACK W. HOFFMAN'S COLUMN



"I'll bring a platter of kreppels," said my mother.

"But you can't do that, mom; it's an elegant hotel and they don't permit that sort of thing," I explained as we discussed the national convention of Germans from Russia to be held in Dearborn's Hyatt Regency Hotel July 10-15.

"I don't believe it," she said. "All those Germans and not a single kreppel?"

My answer was shattering. There will be no potlucking.

All of which has me a little worried as Michigan prepares to host this national ethnic historical society whose members insist on smearing their genealogy on slices of ryebread.

Their penchant for eating, passed from one generation to another, probably was triggered in Russia where half of a pioneering German population starved to death and much of the remainder lived on Siberian prison diets before fleeing to the United States.

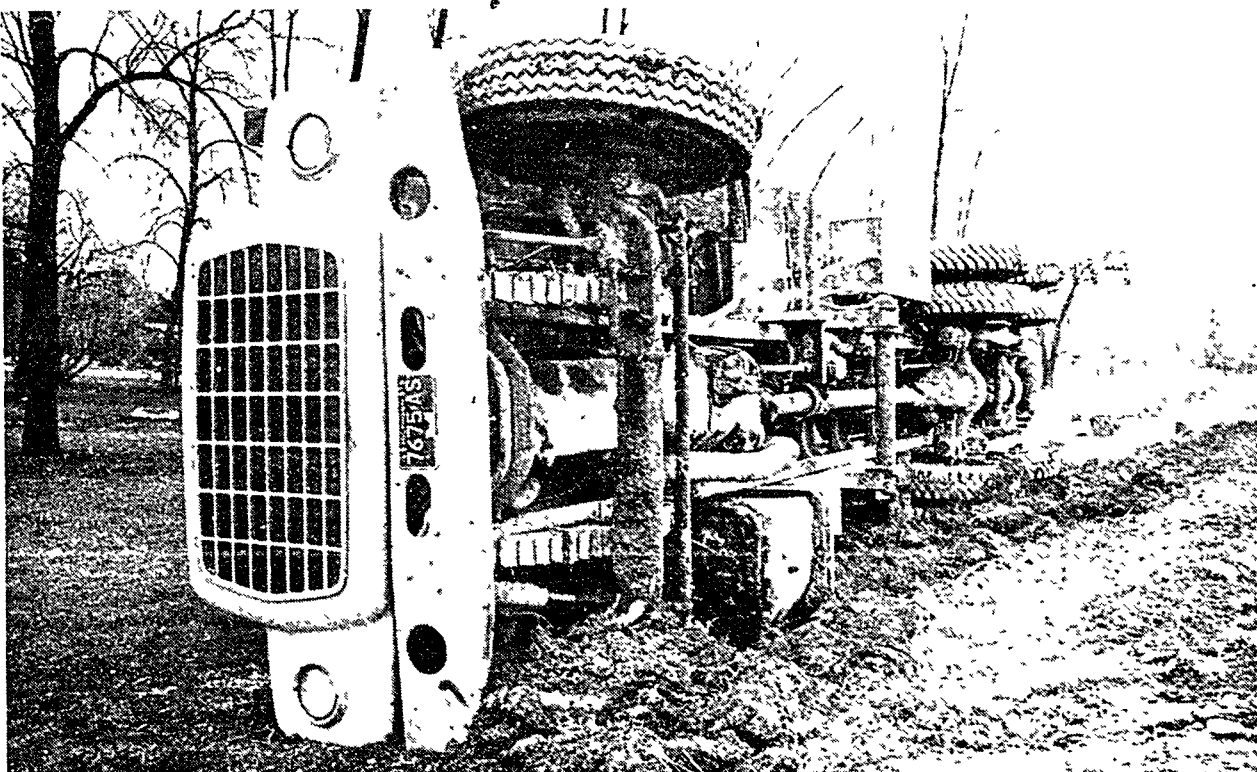

wage and salary commission, and the three other members — Robert Prom, John R. Martin and Richard Allen — were scheduled to meet with the two new members Monday.

(Former member Susan Heintz in January was appointed to the fill the board of trustee post vacated by David Mitchell, who was transferred to California).

Henningson said Monday's session would be an introductory meeting at which goals and objectives of the committee would be discussed.

"The four original members have had some discussion of the professional manager concept," he said. "And we will share what we have learned thus far with the new members."

"Though we don't have much time, I think we can put together some materials which will be helpful to the board," he said. "We will give the board every piece of information we can get our hands on."

In a recommendation presented to the board in November, 1979, the Wage and Salary Review Commission suggested a manager (under a charter system) be paid between \$28,500 and \$32,000, the "going rate at the present time for a community the size, growing potential and population of Northville Township."

Henningson said the committee hopes to be more specific in its suggestions in its upcoming report.

Trustees have been searching for a way to streamline township operations and remove some of the politics for quite some time.

Some members feel that a professional manager may be the answer.

Frank Jones, manager of Saginaw Township, related his experiences to the board recently and the majority of the township trustees expressed great interest.

Township Supervisor Donald Thomson, a proponent of hiring a professional manager, has announced he will not seek reelection this fall.

He and other members of the board would like to decide the issue sometime in May, to give potential candidates for all township elected posts a fair idea of what they will be getting into.

Nominating petitions for the August election must be filed by June 3.

Jones told township trustees that in Saginaw Township the supervisor, clerk and treasurer — all parttime employees — spend very little time in the township offices.

Should the Northville Township Board of Trustees choose to hire a professional manager, they also may choose to reduce the positions of clerk and supervisor to parttime, as the treasurer's post currently operates.

Genetics finds scary

He believes that experimentation with Nobel Laureate sperm banks and human cloning are not viable genetics projects.

"Students keep asking me, 'are we ready to clone?' The question really should be, 'do we need to clone?'" Mayeda said.

"Maybe the technology has arrived but the question is: does society feel it is desirable? Nobel Laureate sperm does not guarantee a child with a high IQ. You would have to go back to the laureate's parents, who are most likely of normal intelligence, and have them create exactly the same genetic combination."

Genetic diseases can occur through an inherited genetic defect or by a gene mutation, Mayeda said.

Down's syndrome, in which the severely mentally retarded victims have an extra chromosome, is associated with the mother's age during pregnancy, Mayeda said. Other diseases strike only males, others only females, and others skip generations.

Mayeda, sounding like a detective of the human body, talked about "fascinating cases" he and his staff have encountered in chasing the identities of the 46 chromosomes in each person that contain hereditary information.

"Until the mid-1960s we thought humans had 48 chromosomes," Mayeda said. "But new techni-

ques in microscopy increased our accuracy." He said geneticists are finally able to cut apart and study DNA, the basic building blocks of life.

It is a physician's responsibility to tell potential parents if there may be a genetic defect, Mayeda said. Yet geneticists still have a lot of detective work to do before they unlock many elusive genetic secrets.

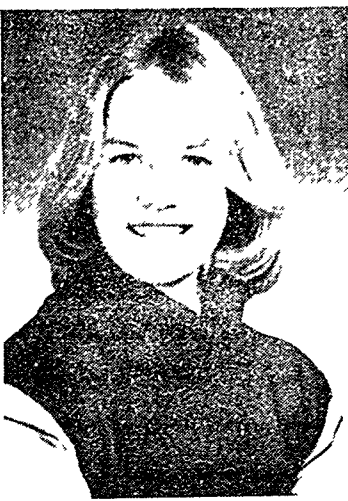

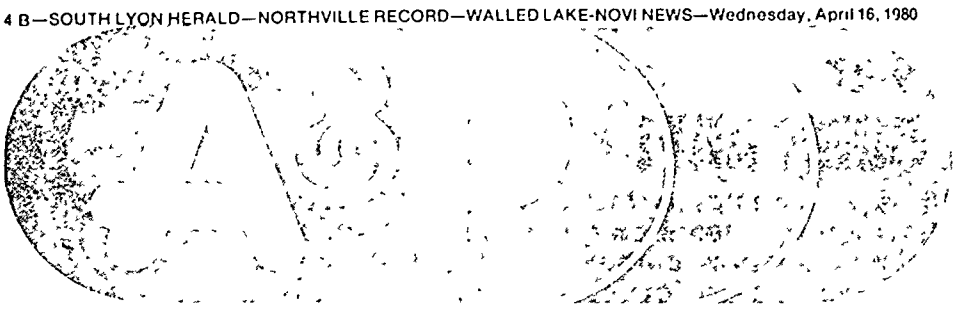

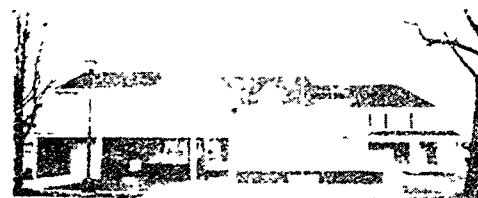

Fledgling churches grow in schools

During the week the noises of children at play rebound across school gymnasiums. But every Sunday it is the sound of worship — Bible pages rattling, prayers and voices lifted in hymns — that you will hear there.

For those congregations which gather in four of Novi's six school buildings, it is a challenge to dispell the school atmosphere and instill an atmosphere of worship.

But the congregations put up with the minor inconveniences of carting in song books and bulletin boards each week because they know the closeness which comes from sharing new beginnings, and they recognize the promise of a building of their own someday will be a reality.

Pastor Richard Henderson and members of Faith Community United Presbyterian are closer to that reality than other congregations. He holds services each week in Village Oaks Elementary where his congregation has been meeting since 1976.

Faith Community began with a membership half of whom were Novi residents attending the Northville Presbyterian Church. The other half had no original church home, Henderson said.

Since then a membership of 200 adults has been built up.

Besides services in the combination gymnasium and cafeteria, the church also uses six classrooms for Sunday School.

Meeting in a school probably is most difficult for the person attending a service for the first time, Henderson said.

"It is different for them at first. They can't help but notice the basketball hoops at each end of the room. People who come here the first time think the congregation doesn't sing very loud because the gymnasium is built to absorb sounds.

"But after a few weeks it becomes 'our church' and they don't notice blackboards and the kick balls in the rafters," Henderson said.

For many of Henderson's parishioners, attending Faith Community is their first involvement with a formal church, and meeting in the school creates a spirit of adventure, the spirit of making something out of nothing which comes with starting a new church, Henderson says.

"We have tremendous involvement and a greater commitment than an established church with a building," he said.

But there are continuous identity problems and little inconveniences.

So the congregation is anxious for a building of its own. Groundbreaking for the church on Ten Mile across from the new police department is planned for April. Plans call for Faith Community to spend one more year in the school before holding its first service in the new building on Easter Sunday 1981.

Identification is a problem shared by all four churches which meet in the schools. Probably, the church with the most severe problem is the Church of the Nazarene led by Reverend William Bowen.

Identification problems are forcing his congregation to seek temporary quarters in a building outside the schools.

"When you tell people you're meeting in a school they kind of back off," Bowen said. "We're trying to get a building this summer so we can have a full program with Wednesday and Friday meetings."

Although they have been meeting for nearly 18 months at Middle School South the Church of the Nazarene has only 13 members. "You just can't get people to come to the school," Bowen said.

For a number of Bowen's flock starting up a church is nothing new. "In our congregation we have a group of people who like to start new churches. One couple helped start one in Brighton. They like to start new works. It takes special people to organize a new church, find property and see a building constructed. They have to be willing to pay the price."

He recognizes it takes time to build a congregation and build sufficient enough membership to be fiscally viable.

Bowen said getting financing for a church building depends on the size of the membership. "Banks will lend a church \$1,000 for every 10 members since the strength of paying them back depends on the number of members. It takes a lot of time to get financing together," he said.

The Church of the Nazarene is a holiness church, Bowen explained. A branch of the Wesleyan Church, with a doctrine which is nearly the same, the church preaches a life of sanctifications filled with the holy spirit and a life of holiness as the Bible describes it.

Many of Bowen's members are middle aged and older.

"We welcome anyone who is interested. We have an open door church," Bowen said.

In the Novi Woods cafeteria Pastor Thomas Scherger conducts services each week for Freedom Lutheran Church and reports it is "quite suitable."

"It's not as bare or stark as a gymnasium, so there is not as much of a school atmosphere to dispell. We bring in banners and an altar to do what we can to make it worshipful," said Scherger.

But he went on to say there is more than simply making the school take on a church atmosphere.

"Part of the fact that our congregation is willing to meet in the school is that they accept it is not going to be as worshipful as a church," Scherger said.

Originally, Freedom Lutheran was started by a group who attended a Lutheran church in Farmington. However, 75 percent of the members are now from Novi, Scherger reports. During the three years they have been meeting in Novi Woods, attendance has grown until now nearly 100 people attend regularly.

Being without a building to call their own is regarded by Scherger's congregation as a temporary inconvenience.

"We've discussed just how urgent it is to get a building. It's a high priority, but we have a feeling the church is the people. It's not quite as formal or organized as our own building would be, but we're willing to put up with it."

Freedom Lutheran has taken the first step toward its own building with the purchase of property at Ten Mile and Wixom Road.

Scherger says his group is predominantly younger families. "Most of them are relatively new to the community and have a wide variety of religious backgrounds. The traditional Lutheran really is in the minority," Scherger said.

He indicated the church is grateful for the opportunity to rent school facilities for their weekly services, noting jokingly that the only problem has been when the custodian didn't show up and they were locked out.

His church has dealt with the inevitable identity problem through posting signs, advertising, mailing flyers and visitations, Scherger said.

Reverend Barry Jones of Oakland Baptist Church which meets in Orchard Hills describes his congregation as "strictly brand new — we started from scratch."

Attendance hovers near the 80s, but in recent weeks attendance hit an all time high of 96. Oakland Baptist has been meeting since June 1978.

There are advantages to meeting in the schools, Jones notes. Plenty of room for Sunday School classes and the fact that chairs and a piano are provided are among them.

Meeting in a school also is "preferable to a store front operation," Jones said.

But meeting in a school carries a stigma of not being "established." While that is a hindrance, Jones has found that once people actually attend services at the school it doesn't bother them.

"Once they've been here it isn't a problem. They still get a feeling of belonging and permanence," Jones said.

Meeting in the school probably contributes to the relaxed atmosphere of Jones' services, he admitted. "Our atmosphere is casual. It's very friendly and open."

Basically, Oakland Baptist Church is a young one made up of those who "are interested in something new," as Jones put it. However, as the congregation has grown so has the number of older families.

Now the congregation has a large enough cross section of ages that everyone feels comfortable, Jones said. His congregation also draws from a number of communities besides Novi, including Northville, South Lyon, Farmington, Commerce Township, Walled Lake and Northville.

Older churches in the metropolitan area have been helpful when the young church needed it, Jones reported. His congregation borrows facilities for baptismal services when necessary.

Word of mouth advertisement has been largely responsible for the growth of the church, Jones said.

"When you're excited about something you talk about it. I do a lot of visitations on Saturdays too, meeting people and telling them we exist. That's been our best type of communication since we don't have visibility in terms of a building.

"It's a real challenge and it's very rewarding. I hope we can continue to grow."

Growth is definitely in the plans as the group is in the process of purchasing approximately six acres of property on Ten Mile west of Beck Road.

Construction of the church still is in the information gathering stages, Jones reported.

"We really feel that to get off the ground we are going to have to depend upon God to provide or this could take a long period of time," Jones said. "We're being realistic. It's going to be difficult with the current trends in property values. But He has brought us this far."

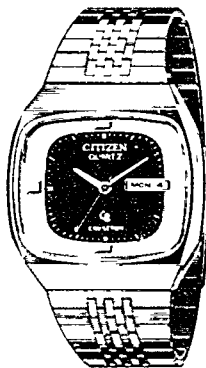

"The annual meeting is a good chance to see the league in action," she says, stressing that the meeting is open to prospective members who should call Mary Ellen McKercher, 455-4539, to make reservations.

Mrs. White notes that the 1980 presidential elections will put special emphasis on the voters' service arm of the League of Women Voters on a national level.

Locally, she says, the league will be sponsoring candidate nights, publishing voters' guides and registering voters.

Jackie Westbay of Canton, retiring voters' service co-chairman, has just released the 1980 edition of the league's "They Represent You" pamphlet. This free brochure is a comprehensive list of all state, local and county officials.

Mrs. White adds that local program items are a less familiar aspect of league work.

"We can take a position on an issue only after we have completed a careful study and have reached a consensus of our membership," she explains. "This year we are interested particularly in studying intergovernmental relations in Michigan. We also will research whether a Wayne County executive, which we favor in concept, should be elected or appointed."

Candidates for office to be elected at the meeting are Michele Howard, second vice-president, and Ruth Vogler,

treasurer, both of Canton.

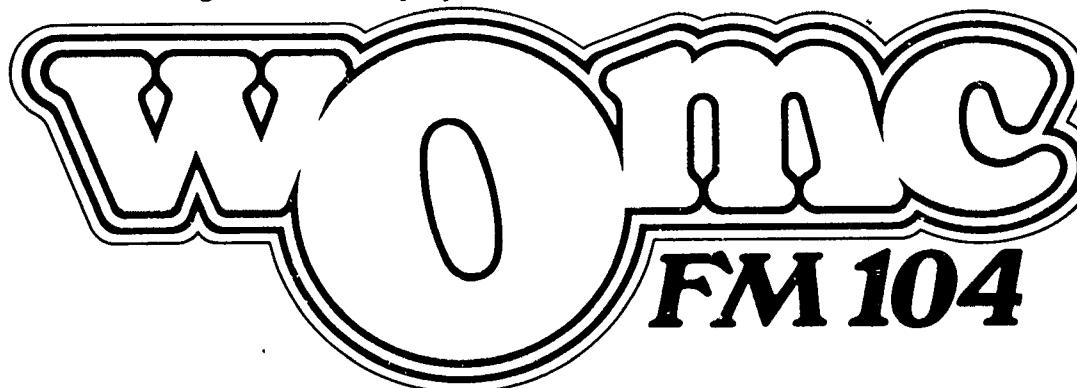

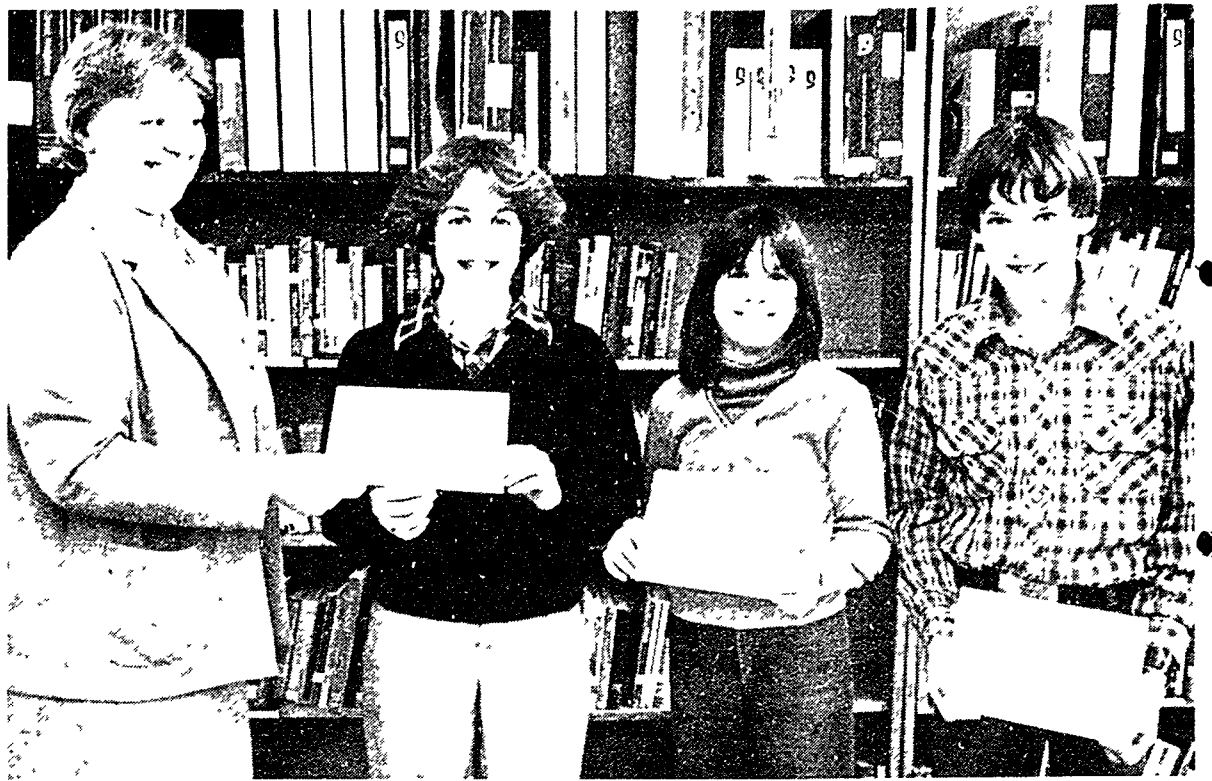

Symphony, choir concert

'Passion' to be given

Plymouth Symphony is joining with Schoolcraft Community Choir in its final subscription concert this season to present the first performance of a major choral work at 4 p.m. Sunday, April 20, at Plymouth-Salem High School.

Commissioned by Schoolcraft College, the work is entitled "Passion" and is based on the Gospel according to St. Matthew.

It was composed by Robert Jones, a Detroit and Schoolcraft faculty member, specifically for the two performing groups.

For the premiere performance Marilyn Jones will be guest conductor with Carolyn Grimes, soprano, Phillip Mooney, tenor, and Carroll Strickland, bass. Brian Murphy is to be the narrator.

Although the new work is reported to be filled with surprises and 20th century expression, the work is considered reminiscent of its predecessors in many respects. J. S. Bach generally is credited with the culmination of this form.

In these compositions the chorus takes either the part of the mob or that of a commentator on the passing events of the drama.

The commentaries are inserted between scripture passages and take the form of poems written by the composer's wife, Anne Jones. She is an experienced writer and journalist.

Her contributions, the symphony announces, add to the uniqueness of the work in highlighting the role and feelings of women in the drama.

Accompanying the words of Jesus is the string section in what is said to be "almost a halo effect," and of the narrator by the keyboard.

Bob Jones, an instructor at Schoolcraft since 1969, is a prolific composer and writes for diverse groups,

ranging from organ and electronic tape to works for chorus.

It is by coincidence that the choir director also is named Jones. Dr. Jones currently is choral director at Cass Tech High School. She has been on the faculty of Western and Wayne State universities.

She has performed frequently with the symphony. Her husband also is a musician and was professional music copyist for the original work.

For this premiere performance professional soloists have been engaged.

Soprano Grimes has been soloist with the symphony and with the Detroit Symphony and Kenneth Jewell Chorale.

Tenor Mooney currently is a principal tenor with the Michigan Lyric Opera Company and with the Cathedral Church of St. Paul in Detroit.

Carroll Strickland, who will sing the role of Jesus, has been active with the Lyric Opera company and in the Detroit Institute Brunch with Bach series.

Narrator Murphy is an English professor at Oakland University and holds a doctorate degree from the University of London. He will read the part of Pontius Pilate.

The Schoolcraft choir in its 15th year is composed of 60 singers.

Tickets will be available at the door or at Plymouth Book World or Heide's Flowers in advance. They are \$4 for adults, \$2 for senior citizens and college students. Students through 12th grade are admitted free.

A Girl Scout troop will provide baby sitting service for preschoolers.

The concert is made possible with the support of the State of Michigan through a grant from the Michigan Council for the Arts and from Schoolcraft College.

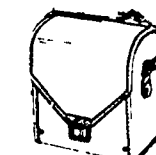

Depressed? Your 'emotional survival' is the key

Everybody gets depressed at one time or another.

We all have moments when life appears to be dealing us a bad hand. The circumstances vary: dissatisfaction with one's job, distress over the state of the world, or the sudden realization that your mother-in-law is running out of money and knows you have an empty bedroom.

Actually, those who must endure these periodic emotional slumps should consider themselves fortunate. Because there are countless millions of others whose depressions are a painful, permanent part of their existence.

Mary Ellen Pastorek, director of information, education and media relations for the Mental Health Association in Michigan (MHAM), and Tom DeLoach, information officer for the Department of Mental Health in Lansing, can testify to that. Ms. Pastorek says there are an estimated 15-30 million people in this country who suffer from severe emotional depression. And even more startling is the fact that only two percent of these individuals get help for the problem, she adds.

"There seems to be a stigma attached to depression," Ms. Pastorek says. "People seem to think there's something seriously wrong with themselves mentally if they look for answers to this problem."

"But people have to realize that they're not alone," she notes. "The best thing someone can

do is seek help...we need to continue to educate people and let them know that mentally ill people aren't all in shackles and strait jackets."

The first step toward getting help for an emotional problem — like getting help for anything else — is admitting that a problem exists. But how does one know if he or she does indeed have an emotional disorder?

DeLoach says that there are 10 warning signals that can give a pretty good idea whether help should be sought in connection with depression. They include the following:

- a general feeling of hopelessness and despair;
- an inability to concentrate;
- a substantial change in physical activity (eating either more or less, insomnia are examples);
- loss of self-esteem;
- withdrawal from people or activities;
- hypersensitivity;
- misdirected anger;
- guilt feelings;
- dependency on people or substances;
- suicide threats or attempts.

Unfortunately, the latter symptom results in death all too often. Michigan's Vital Statistics Office at the Department of Public Health reports that 824 suicides were recorded in Michigan from January through September of 1979. A whopping 1,132 went into the books during 1978.

Suicides are most prevalent in white males between the ages of 30 and 45, says Ms.

Pastorek. According to her information, 85 percent of all Michigan

suicides fall in that category.

"Those deaths are at-

tributed to achievement orientation," comments the MHAM media

representative.

"Especially in the business world. These people grow unhappy over their lack of success or achievement and apparently feel that things won't get better."

DeLoach, however, addresses the problem of depression from a different perspective.

"What clinical people are finding is a difference between a biological depression and that low, moody feeling," he reports. "Psychiatry is trying to develop laboratory tests that will be able to make that distinction."

"By biological depression, I mean actual, measurable changes in body chemistry," DeLoach continues. "There are a lot of cases where you can tell what is wrong with someone due to biological factors. Sometimes those affected need more vitamin C or potassium in their system, or whatever. Right now scientists are trying to identify biochemical patterns that are indicative of severe depression."

At any rate, whether an emotional problem is due to one or several factors, DeLoach concludes that action should be taken as soon as possible to remedy the situation.

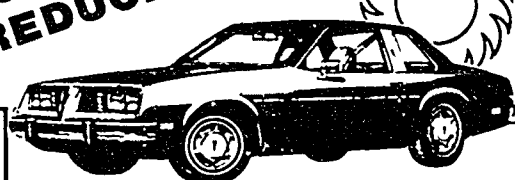

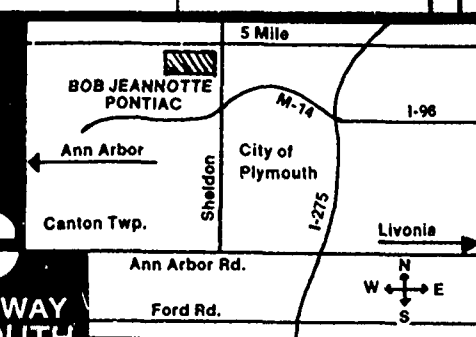

Clark Couyoumjian turned in a :24.5 in the 200 meters (220 yards).

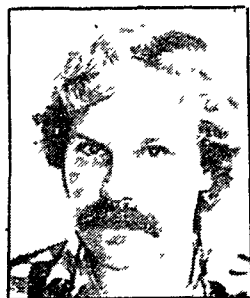
Weber and Mike Kramer ran in the same heat in the 400 meter run. Their times were slow, as were everyone's in the 14 heat event.

Can the girl tracksters repeat 1979?

Last season was a dream come true for Northville girls track coach Bob Prom.

At the beginning of the campaign he seriously thought he would finish the year without a win.

But his charges fooled him.

Some proven vets like Anne Dayton, Michelle Hayes, Audrey Harrison and Lissa Carter played much better than even Prom had hoped.

Others, like Chris Spigarelli, Anita Sledz, and Kathy McMillan flowered like beautiful roses and took many firsts as well as contributing to new school records.

This year it is much the same for Prom.

He doesn't know if he will win a single meet.

The state has no plans to construct additional prison facilities — specifically where the men's barracks of the Detroit House of Correction are located. That's the word Wayne

County officials have learned in their communication with the state corrections department.

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners had urged the state, by resolution, to construct a new prison at DeHoCo because of Detroit's decision to close the facility and sell the property on Five Mile in Plymouth Township.

The facility presently houses some 450 "short-time" prisoners.

The resolution, submitted by William G. Suzore (D-Lincoln Park), asked the department of correc-

tions to construct an inmate facility in Southeastern Michigan...with rented space made available to the county to hold "overflow" from the Wayne County Jail.

In his letter to the county, Perry M. Johnson, director of the Michigan Department of Corrections, revealed that two locations in this part of the state are being considered — Rockwood, which does not have legislative approval, and the former women's division at DeHoCo.

The latter is located in

Northville Township. Johnson advised the county that the women's division facility is now being renovated to provide beds for 350 prisoners.

The refurbishing project will cost approximately \$3.8 million and includes replacement of electrical and plumbing systems and installation of a new heating system, he said.

"The facility will be temporary," Johnson told the county, "until the new regional prison can be built on the same parcel."

**Kratz takes
Jackson job**

Novi School Superintendent Gerald Kratz has accepted a position as superintendent of the Jackson County Intermediate School District.

He has requested that he be released from his Novi contract effective June 30.

Emotions ran high during the announcement to the board, with Kratz openly wiping tears from his eyes and board members and residents offering praise for his work in the community during the past eight years.

Kratz called the decision to leave Novi and accept the Jackson post "the most difficult of my professional career."

Kratz, who lives with his family in Brookland Farms subdivision, reportedly has been offered a four-year contract with starting pay of \$46,300 to accept the Jackson position. He also will receive use of an automobile under the terms of the contract.

Former board member Ray Warren, who served when Kratz was hired, praised the superintendent for a "tremendous job," citing the construction of several schools and development of sound educational programs.

Warren also told the board that the selection process becomes more difficult as the interviews of prospective superintendents proceed. "When you get down to the final five or six candidates they all look good," he said.

The school board voted unanimously to accept the resignation and to release Kratz from his three-year contract.

Search for a replacement already has begun in hopes that a new superintendent can be on board shortly after July 1.
