# Boss chauffeurs him to last work day in limousine

Plenty of workers are honored by their employers when they retire, but few get the special attention Northville resident Jay C. Channell got Friday, August 1, at the completion of 52 years with Shedd's Foods.

Channell, of 19705 Hayes Court, stepped out his front door on his way to work that day to see a large limousine

with uniformed chauffeur behind the wheel.

"The neighbor down the street was out watering her flowers and lawn, and she yelled out at me 'What's going on Jay?'" Channell recalled. "I said, 'I don't know, but that's the president of my company out there.'" And the garden hose went straight up and her

mouth drooped open. It was quite a day."

Sure enough, Shedd's president Adam Schubel had rented a chauffeur's uniform and was there to take Channell to work.

Channell said having the president of the company take him into work was not as extravagant as it might seem

"We've been friends for years and years," he explained.

When they arrived at Shedd's Detroit plant, however, there was another surprise waiting.

"They had shut down the whole plant and all the employees were out front, waiting to say good morning," Channell said. "I thought, hey, this is what they

do for the president when he retires, not for me."

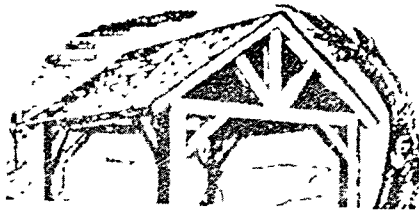
But the company thought Channell deserved every bit of the fanfare. He started working for Shedd's as "a kid just out of high school, running an elevator," 52 years ago, Channell said.

He attended night school at a number of Detroit universities, which "really

got to be a grind," he explained. Channell gathered enough education in this manner to help push his career along at Shedd's.

He worked his way up to stock clerk, then traffic manager for a single plant, and finally to overseeing the company's

# Race track bills worry city

### Special session called by mayor to study 5 plans

With five bills affecting horse racing pending in the state legislature, a concerned city council held a special meeting Monday to study their provisions.

Council, which had sent representatives to a June 30 meeting at Hazel Park attended by representatives of cities in which tracks are located, decided to participate in the next Hazel Park session August 19.

Mayor Paul Vernon, who had attended with City Attorney Philip Ogilvie, agreed to be at the next meeting.

At the request of council, the attorney reviewed each of the pending bills detailing how they differ from present legislation.

Senate bills Nos. 1152 and 1153, now referred to the committee on state and veterans' affairs, amend the present law and provide for operation of an off-track betting system.

Another Senate bill, No. 662, proposes to amend existing legislation to create a five-member commission to replace the single racing commissioner who now serves at the pleasure of the governor, Ogilvie told council.

The commission would be composed of one person from each of the two major political parties, one representative of the Horseman's Benevolent Protection Association, a representative of the Michigan Harness Association and a representative of the public at large selected by the governor to be chairperson.

The bill also provides for state acquisition of all thoroughbred tracks.

Senate Bill No. 963, known as the governor's bill as he favors it, Ogilvie said, creates an office of racing commissioner within the Department of Agriculture, increases maximum fines but leaves the maximum return to cities at \$800,000.

House Bill No. 4747, which already has passed the house and been referred to the senate, is a rewrite of the current racing law, Ogilvie detailed. It provides

# Brother, sister die in crash

The two youngest members of a Northville family were killed Friday, August 8 when their car was broadsided by a garbage truck traveling eastbound on Eight Mile at Randolph, city police reported.

A witness in a vehicle behind the victims' told police Marcia Collins, 17, and her brother Bradley, 15, made a complete stop at the stop sign on northbound Randolph at Eight Mile, then proceeded into the roadway.

Witnesses said the driver of the truck, Jerry McKee of Pontiac, blew his horn and tried to avoid a collision, but was unsuccessful.

The entangled vehicles came to a standstill just past the driveway of Joe's Pantry.

The youths were knocked

unconscious. And despite rescue attempts by Novi Ambulance medical technicians, both were pronounced dead on arrival at Botsford Hospital.

"I honestly don't think she ever saw the truck," said Police Corporal Gary Callendar, one of the officers at the scene. "It looks like the boy turned to look in the direction of the truck and was struck in the head by a structural beam which snapped at impact."

The victims were pinned in the vehicle for a short time and when they finally were removed the boy was "in full cardiac arrest," Callendar said.

He was taken immediately to Botsford.

His sister also was unconscious and in critical condition.

Novi Ambulance emergency medical technicians worked on the injured

woman at the scene, then rushed her to the hospital.

They were the two younger children of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond J. Collins of 21102 Stanstead in Northville Estates subdivision located near the intersection on Eight Mile.

Police records show 10 traffic accidents — of which at least three resulted in serious injuries to drivers — have occurred at the intersection of Eight Mile and Randolph since January 1.

A very similar collision involving a truck and a car occurred on March 28.

The car was stopped at the sign on northbound Randolph and the truck was eastbound on Eight Mile.

The driver of the car, who told police she didn't see the truck, suffered internal injuries.

# Rubber ball to shoot wiring underground

Remember when the elastic snapped in the trouser of your baseball uniform or the waistline of your skirt suddenly lost its gathers, Mom would "tunnel through" the placket with new elastic hitched to a safety pin?

In a much more sophisticated — but just as practical way — work crews in downtown Northville will be sending utility wires under ground shortly.

Employees of Nanmar Construction Company have been placing plastic tubes under streets and parking areas for the past week. Nanmar was low bidder for construction for

underground lines to replace utility wires and poles in the Mainstreet '78 renovation program with a bid of \$147,950.

"When complete, utility lines will be run through the tubes with a rubber ball carrying a string — to which the lines later will be tied and pulled through," explains Wayne Griffin, on-site liaison person from McNeely-Lincoln Company, which is in charge of the Mainstreet program.

Compressed air, he adds, will send the ball through the lines.

# Major errors found in township census

Township officials have compiled information showing inaccuracy in preliminary census figures and prompting the local census office to conduct a review of the count.

The preliminary count showed a population of 8,735 in Northville Township as opposed to 1970 count of 9,255. Township officials reacted swiftly, calling the preliminary count absurdly low in light of the extensive development in the community over the decade.

The township had established an estimated population of 15 to 16,000 residents, extrapolated from a 1976 special census that reported over 12,000 residents at that time.

Census operations for 1980 include a local review program that allows local units of government to state specific differences with the count.

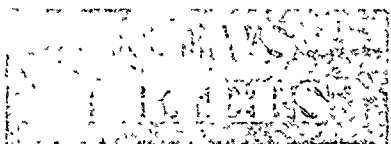
Within the 10-day time frame allowed, Supervisor Donald Thomson sent a letter to the local census bureau offices delineating differences discovered between the preliminary count and township tax rolls and utility permits.

These included: failure of the census to count residents of Northville State Hospital and Northville Residential Training Center; the exclusion of an entire census tract at the east edge of the township including Whisperwoods and extending just west of Bradner (some 4,000 people not counted) and differences in the number of dwelling units in portions of other tracts.

About 56 dwelling units recorded on the assessment records between Seven Mile and Six Mile and from Hines Drive back to a road just south of Six and Sheldon did not appear in the census report. Another 55 units in Grandview Acres also were missed, township records showed.

In all, two sheets describing variances between township records and census figures were sent to census workers July 25.

The Detroit area census office reports it sent a letter to the township Monday, telling the township that a review confirms that the areas in question were missed. All have been agreed to, the census worker said. Final figures will not be released until the end of the month, at the earliest.

## Village grant ok'd

Township planners' crash effort creating a new zoning class to accommodate the elderly village proposed for Wayne County Child Development Center grounds came to naught last week when county planners tabled the issue.

The new zoning class, RME (multiple residential- elderly), was approved by township planners August 2 after three meetings in five days.

The township pressed for completion of the RME ordinance amendment in time to have it considered by county planners August 6 and approved by the township board of trustees August 14 so that it would be part of the ordinance by the end of the month.

Robert Fitzpatrick, executive director of the Wayne County Economic Development Corporation (EDC) — the agency through which the elderly village would be developed — had

asked that the RME class be in place when he speaks to the Wayne County Board of Commissioners later this month.

Fitzpatrick said the zoning ordinance would indicate to the commissioners that the township was cooperating in the effort and increase the likelihood of the board transferring title of the land to the EDC.

But, the whole effort was predicated on approval of the RME proposal by the county planning commission at a special meeting last Wednesday. When it was tabled by that commission, the possibility of approving the zoning class was delayed one month.

Township planners, secure in their belief that the proposed ordinance would be approved, had already scheduled a public hearing August 26 to discuss the rezoning of the WCCDC land

Tom Rice, sponsor of the festival and owner of the Gitfiddler Music Store, said some people came to the festival from as far as 50 miles away.

Rice has been sponsoring the festival

since 1976 and has raised more than \$15,000 to help fight Huntington's.

Though the rain kept some people away, Rice said "everybody there had a really good time."

"I'm all ready to start working on next year's festival," he added.

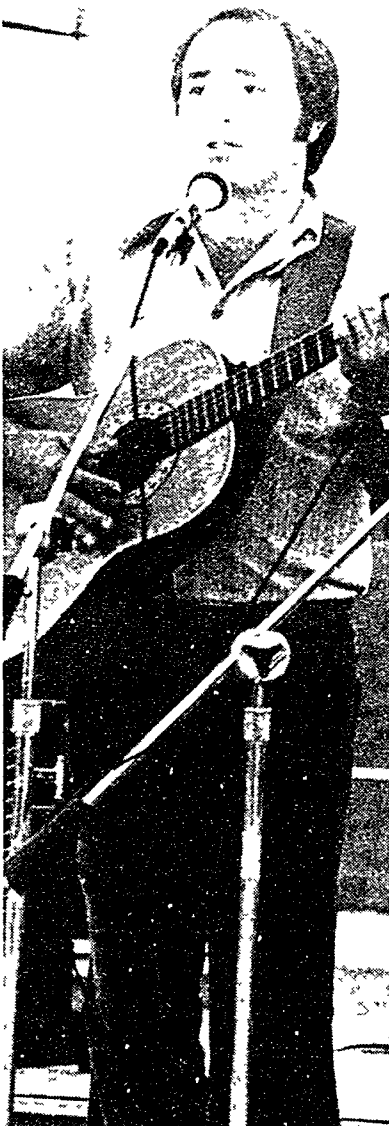

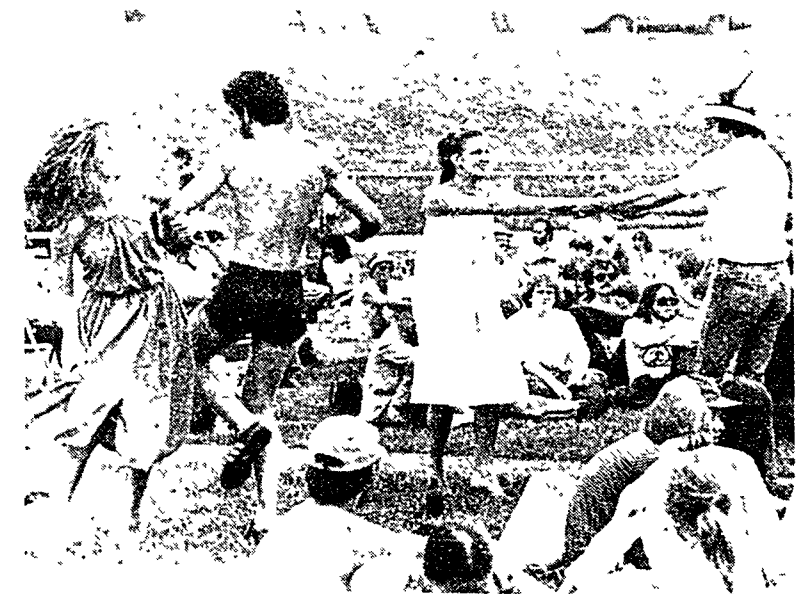

# Final township vote tally approved by canvassers

Canvassers have confirmed the results of the August 5 primary election in Northville Township. The outcomes remain the same although some vote tallies have changed from the figures initially reported Tuesday night.

Of the township's 8,076 registered voters, 2,185 turned up at the polls, giving a turnout of just over 27 percent. That figure is slightly better than the average turnout for previous primary elections, though lower than expected.

State-wide, the primary drew far fewer voters than had been expected. In the township, electors had an extra incentive to vote in the form of a primary race for township offices that was actually the deciding poll since all candidates are Republican.

Also drawing voter response was a township proposal for an added .5 mill property tax levy for fire services.

John MacDonald won the three-way race for supervisor handily. The attorney and former trustee garnered

700 votes to 381 for opponent and current trustee William Zapke and 371 for Schoolcraft political science instructor Larry VanderMolen.

MacDonald won in seven of the township's 10 precincts and took the absentee balloting (divided into three precincts). He had large margins in Precincts One, Three, Six and Ten and was the preference of absentee voters who gave him 164 votes to 83 for VanderMolen and 70 for Zapke. MacDonald won by narrower margins in Precincts Five, Eight and Nine, though his cushion was better than that earned by his opponents in the single precincts each won.

VanderMolen won Precinct Two with 67 votes to Zapke's 49 and MacDonald's 33. Zapke was the victor in Precinct Seven with 51 to MacDonald's 30 and VanderMolen's 26. MacDonald and Zapke tied with five votes each in the miniscule Precinct Four. VanderMolen had two votes there

The fire millage proposal passed by a slim two percentage points, or 42 votes out of 2,013. The vote was 1,029 approving to 987 opposing. The millage proposal was the only township ballot item changed significantly by canvassers. Early counts showed approval by 1,048-957.

Township voters returned Richard Henningsen to the treasurer's post he occupied two years ago by giving him 902 votes to incumbent treasurer Lee Holland's 477. Holland wrested the post from Henningsen in 1978, but this go-around Henningsen outpolled Holland in every precinct.

Susan Heintz, unopposed on the ballot for township clerk, received just over half the total votes cast with 1,102. Write-in votes for current clerk Clarice Sass, who withdrew her name from the ballot after qualifying, numbered three. Two write-in votes were cast for

Margaret Tegge.

Four trustees were selected from eight candidates. Top vote-getters were Richard Allen (849); current trustee James Nowka (773); C.J. Armstrong (623) and Thomas L.P. Cook (488).

Cook was elected to the fourth trustee post in a squeaker that saw E.F. Petersen, Jr. tally 484 votes and Leon T. Sylvestre 479. John Richard Johnson racked up 399 votes.

Allen simply steamed ahead to victory, placing first in eight precincts (including two of the three absentee precincts) and second in three others. Nowka placed first in the three precincts in which Allen was second.

Candidate Wesley Rogalski, who posted the lowest total of 389 votes, won his home Precinct Seven in the southeast corner of the township. Nowka was third and Allen fourth in that precinct.

The fire millage proposal, requested because state and federal funds previously used to operate the department are likely to be cut drastically, won approval in seven precincts while losing in six precincts. In most precincts the tally was close, with the proposal passing by a large margin only in Precinct Five.

Incumbent Constable James Schrot won re-election easily, posting 857 votes as the favorite candidate in any opposed race. Schrot was the top vote-

getter in 10 of the 13 precincts. The third absentee precinct cast six votes for constable evenly divided among the three candidates for two posts. Only Heintz, running alone on the ballot, collected more votes than did Schrot.

Joseph Lukomski outpolled Willard Gaul for the second constable post, 646-430. Lukomski won in Precinct 10 and Gaul in Precinct Nine. Gaul was second in Precinct Eight and the first absentee precinct. Lukomski was second to Schrot in all others.

## Township voters agree with others in county

Northville Township voters reflected the attitude of most Wayne County residents in the August 5 primary election, approving the County Home Rule proposal by a better than 2-1 margin.

Passage of the proposal creates a charter commission to reform the troubled county government.

Unofficial results show Northville Township electors approved the plan 1,261-487. Overall Wayne County returns list virtually the identical proportion.

On the same ballot on which voters approved county reform, they chose candidates for the charter commission. One Republican and one Democrat were chosen in each of the county's 27 districts to face off in a November election.

Township electors made the same choices as Livonia residents who share the county's 19th district. Democrat Marvin R. Stempien, attorney from Livonia and former Northville city attorney, outpolled Walter Schemanske, of Northville, 89 to 57 in the township. Stempien did as well throughout the district, posting a 1,231 to 483 victory overall.

On the Republican side, Ethelyn R. Banks was the township's choice over Francis Arbanas, 405 to 391. Banks, active in the League of Women Voters, posted 1,566 votes overall to retired Detroit police officer Arbanas' 1,297.

County commissioner for the 19th district, Republican Mary Dumas of Livonia, was unopposed in the primary, as was her November opponent Democrat Karl Lukens. Dumas gathered 1,119 township votes, Lukens 124.

In the party qualification portion of the ballot the Anderson Coalition (independent presidential candidate John Anderson) gathered 232 township votes — over 10 percent of the 2,185 votes cast overall and better than the seven or eight percent vote given county Democrats.

The township is predominately

Republican but preference for Republican voting in the township was expected even for those registered as independents or Democrats due to the concurrent election of township candidates, all Republicans now virtually assured of November election. The partisan nature of the primary did not allow voting for both township candidates and any other party. The Libertarian Party gained 10 votes and the Citizens Party (presidential candidate Barry Commoner) got eight votes. The Socialist Worker's Party did not receive any township votes.

State-wide, the Anderson Coalition was not the only "third party" to qualify for placement on the November ballot by receiving in excess of .3 percent of the total vote, but it was the favorite.

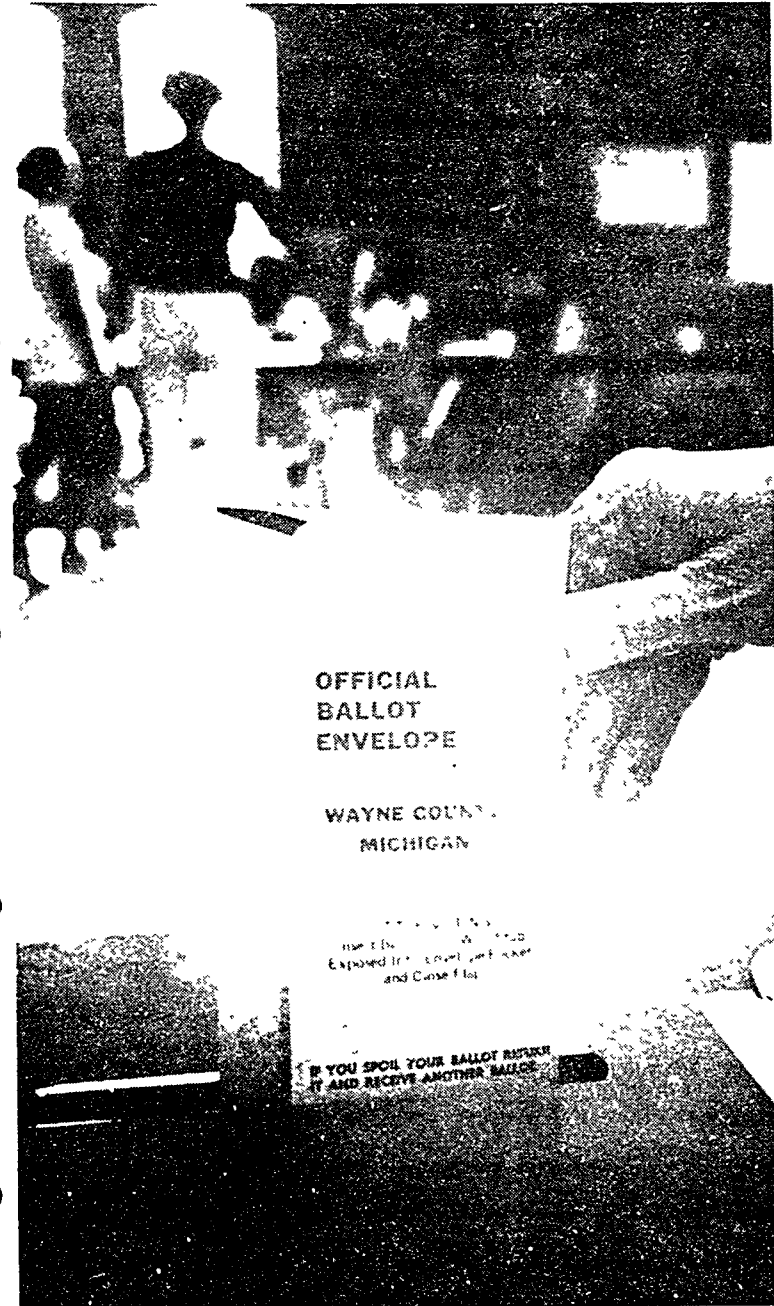
In the 2nd Congressional District Republican incumbent Carl Pursell simply walked away from challenger Helen Gotowka of Dearborn Heights. In the township Pursell garnered 1,236 votes to Gotowka's 120 — beating her 10-1. Early reports from Wayne County indicated a similar margin, with over 6,000 votes going to Pursell and over 550 to Gotowka. The district includes Northville, Livonia, Plymouth and parts of Monroe and Washtenaw Counties.

Democrat Kathleen O'Reilly, formerly a consumer lobbyist in Washington, was unopposed in the primary and will face Pursell in November.

The Democratic primary for state representative in the 35th District was a close election in the township, and one of the few in which township voters failed to pick the victor.

In the township, Livonia resident Barbara Sowers, former president of the Livonia Education Association, lost to Northville resident Ron Fisher, 76-71. But when the Livonia part of the district was figured in, Sowers prevailed over Fisher, 639-549.

**Mary Dumas named to federal committee**

total traffic operation nation-wide

"As general traffic manager, I was in charge of transportation for seven Shedd's plants," Channell explained. Later, when an association was struck with Beatrice Foods, he held sway over 12 traffic operations

He became an expert on traffic safety and was recognized as the area authority on U.S. Department of Transportation rules, regulations and philosophy

His job entailed a great deal of travel, Channell said, hinting that he may have let it intrude on his family life too much

"You've got to work at it," he said. "I was fortunate enough to have a devoted wife (Anna) who backed me up. She took care of things while I was gone. I would really like her to get some recognition, she had an awful lot to handle"

Channell has five children from his first marriage and two from his second. At the latest count, which he said is hard to keep up with, there were 28 grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

The 67-year-old said he tried to retire at 65, when he had put in 50 years, "but, they said 'no, we still need you around here.'"

He had already trained a young man to take his traffic management position when the company asked him to train a

young woman to take over his traffic safety expertise.

"So, I trained her," Channell recalled. "When you see a 67 year old man travelling around the country with a 21-year old woman, checking into motels and such, you really get some strange looks and comments"

While he was busy training people to take over for him, the company moved its mandatory retirement age up to 70

"I finally had to set a date, or they'd have had me working until I was 70," Channell said. Not that he bears the company any ill will.

"They're a great company," he said. "You wouldn't stay there that long if they weren't, would you?"

As his last day progressed and neared its end, more and more employees came by his office to say good bye, Channell said. When the day was done, he was taken to a restaurant to have dinner with all the officials of the company. Or, rather, that's what he was told

"When we got to the place, there was this big banquet hall just full of all the people who had just said good bye to me," Channell explained. "There were gifts piled up from all over and a really big meal. It was a great day."

His friend, President Shubel, will retire in March. "I don't know how they're going to be able to top what they did for me when he retires," Channell said. "They'll probably find some way."

to RME. That hearing has now been cancelled.

In a related development, a \$100,000 innovative project block grant has been approved for the proposed elderly village.

The special grant was okayed by the advisory council of the Wayne County Community Development Block Grant Program July 16 and Northville Township Supervisor Donald Thomson was notified in a memo dated July 23.

According to the memo, funding is contingent on the township's expressing its commitment to the project by rezoning the site to accommodate it, commitment within 90 days of grant approval from the Wayne County Board of Commissioners that the WCCDC land will be used for the village, and that any costs recovered after the land is developed be returned to the innovative projects program fund.

Township trustees are expected to discuss the block grant contract at their regular meeting Thursday.

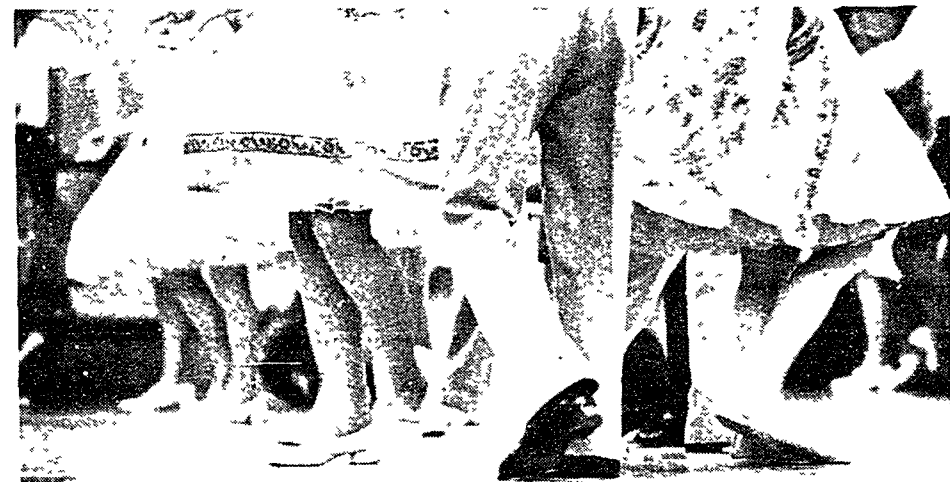

## Board approves project plans

The Michigan Legislature willing, Schoolcraft College officials hope their \$1.2 million culinary arts addition will be off the drawing board in October.

The seven-member board of trustees last week unanimously approved final plans for the one-story addition to the Waterman Campus Center and set September 10 for the opening of bids. The board plans to award contracts October 1.

The construction timetable, however, could be delayed if state legislators don't approve \$570,000 for the project next month. The state is funding half of the project.

"For me to sit here tonight and guarantee to you that on October 1 that project will be reinstated and ready to go, I can't do it," Schoolcraft President Nelson Grote told trustees last Wednesday.

"We could end up October 1 and not have an appropriations bill on the governor's desk."

The project is a scaled-down version of a two-story building scrapped due to repeated millage defeats. Grote said the college had to re-apply for state approval and funding when it revised the plan after the fourth millage defeat last summer.

Last year the legislature re-allocated \$50,000 due Schoolcraft, Grote said, pending completion of plans for the addition. College officials now are looking for most of that money to be reinstated. The state has approved \$100,000 for the addition.

Grote said, "There's not a single vote against the project" on the legislature's joint capital outlay committee.

He said the \$570,000 Schoolcraft needs is "minuscule compared to \$10 million and \$11 million projects for other (state) colleges and universities." Grote said spending cuts ordered twice by Governor William G. Milliken since the first of the year will not affect the Schoolcraft project.

The legislature will not convene until the second week of September. Grote says he's "cautiously optimistic" state funding will be approved by the end of next month.

The local share for the project — \$638,000 — is from an 11-year-old bond issue.

The 11,300 square foot addition to be built north of the Waterman Campus Center has a January 1982 target completion date. Actual construction cost, according to architect F. Gene Ralls of Livonia is an estimated \$887,000.

Kitchen and food service equipment will cost an estimated \$370,000. The addition will allow for a doubling of the Schoolcraft culinary arts enrollment. The 60 culinary arts students now enrolled prepare all the food for the college's food service and banquets.

On other state funding matters, Grote said, Schoolcraft can expect no more than a two percent increase in state aid for the 1980-81 academic year.

Under the budget which took effect July 1, college officials estimated a state appropriation of \$5.2 million, 2.7 percent more than received during the 1979-80 academic year.

"The least they will give us is a continuation appropriation," Grote said. "If the economy stabilizes, we might get a one to two percent increase."

## Eleven percent drop in gas tax revenues

Gas tax revenues for work on highways, roads and streets fell by 11 percent in the second quarter of 1980.

And that reduction is reflected in reduced revenues received by local municipalities, including Northville.

Diesel fuel tax revenues were off by 26 percent.

The state decline continued a trend from the previous quarter when gas tax revenues decreased 12 percent and diesel fuel sales 14.8 percent, the sharpest drop since World War II.

The gas tax yield for the April-June period fell from \$121,659,162 last year to \$108,250,362, a drop of \$13,408,800. Gasoline taxed fell by 11 million gallons to 983 million gallons.

Diesel revenues declined from \$8,300,498 to \$6,145,488. The decrease was the result of a drop in gallonage from 92,400,000 to 72,900,000 and the first effects of a reduction in the diesel fuel tax on trucks from nine to five cents a gallon. It was enacted this spring.

Northville's gas tax receipts for the second quarter of this year is off by \$1,664.

It's 1980 second quarter share of the revenues is \$24,803.

that the commissioner's salary, now set by the legislature, be "equal to the full salary of an Ingham County judge." It increases fines and requires that 85 percent of the track employees be residents of the state and registered voters.

It prohibits the commissioner from having any direct or indirect interest in racing or track management.

Most importantly to Northville, it increases maximum return to cities and townships to \$900,000 (\$800,000 plus \$100,000 for winter racing.)

It also prohibits any political subdivision from collecting an excise fee or license fee.

All bills, the attorney analyzed, give the racing commissioner more power. He said he feels this would be good.

While the proposed provision for off-track betting insures an added clear profit to the track, City Manager Steven

Walters pointed out that it provides nothing for the city or township in which the track is located.

While in the past tracks have been united on legislative action, Walters speculated that this may not be so on pending legislation. The \$800,000 return to communities with a track, now set by law, means much more to Northville and Hazel Park, he illustrated, than to Livonia, which has a total budget of \$19 million and might realize more from the use of track land as industrial property.

Council members felt that Senate Bill 662 would not be in the city's best interest.

Ogilvie was advised to contact Senate Robert Geake, a co-sponsor of Senate Bill 963, and Representative Jack Kirksey as well as Richard Fessler and Douglas Ross, representing the Oakland County portion of the city, to request the city be kept completely informed of meetings slated on the bills.

Griffin, a surveyor with McNeely-Lincoln, is on the scene as work progresses on the Mainstreet redevelopment. Headquarters is a trailer now parked in the Main Street lot behind Manufacturers Bank.

Traffic is being funneled into one lane while workmen continue inserting the tubing under streets in the Main, Center, Dunlap and Cady area. No major detours have been necessary. Griffin points out that Main Street construction was cleared for Saturday's sidewalk sale that went on without being disturbed by the project.

City Manager Steven Walters also praised Nanmar, pointing out the firm has been "doing a decent job of letting traffic flow through the downtown."

He expects the firm will continue through the month with its work and that Warren Contractors, low bidder for underground water and storm work at approximately \$165,000, will be starting shortly.

Tuesday morning the Downtown Development Association awarded base bid contracts to Barthel Contractors for formed concrete planters, sidewalks and decorative brickwork, Walters said, at a cost of approximately \$250,000. A contract for about the same amount also was awarded Detroit Concrete Products for curb and gutter and asphalt paving work. Crowe and Associates received the contract for masonry brick facing and screening work at about \$25,000 cost.

Walters said all were low bidders. He anticipated that Barthel also would begin work soon.

Only major contract not let is that for above ground electrical work, Walters added. Shaw Electric is low bidder, but which alternates will be used has not been decided. This bid includes street lighting. Other large cost, Walters said, will be about \$260,000 to Detroit Edison for placing its overhead wire underground.

Walters reported that base bid contracts have been close to the architect's original estimates but that the total costs may not permit additional work planned, at least not at present.

# Nurse presses for traffic light at Taft-Eight Mile

To the Editor:

My name is Dianna Clarke, occupation — nurse and a resident of Lexington Commons condominiums at Eight Mile and Taft roads. On Friday, August 8, 1980, I responded to automobile-truck accident at 1:45 p.m. which occurred at the intersection of Eight Mile and Taft roads.

Despite all possible medical intervention, provided by numerous medical personnel (myself, Novi Advance Life Support Ambulance, Northville City Police and the Botsford General Hospital emergency room), there are now two young adults who cannot plead to this community for a traffic light, which I feel could have possibly saved their lives and created a safer intersection.

I have lived at the above residency for the past three years, and during that time have witnessed numerous

accidents and assisted the victims of those accidents. Until this time, there have been no real serious accidents.

However, it only seemed to be a matter of time. Well, now the time has come, and once again the controversy of putting a traffic light at the Eight Mile-Taft intersection arises. I realize that such an installation will create a small inconvenience to some, but the idea of saving a life and/or preventing an accident appeals to me.

It is my understanding in talking with residents and employees in this general vicinity some of the reasons for not putting in a traffic light at the intersection were as follows: first, that the semi-trucks going eastbound on Eight Mile (approaching Northville High School) would not be able to climb the hill from a start position. I feel this is a

bunch of hooey in that maybe they would not be able to climb it fast, but they should be able to climb it.

Another reason, that the semis and cars going westbound, down the hill and around the bend, would not be able to stop for a light. These vehicles are now exceeding 50 miles an hour, when the speed limit is 40 mph. With the bend and the embankment, I am sure I would not be able to stop if a person or another vehicle pulled out in front of me.

The intersection is a dangerous one. Perhaps the one reason I can find for the opposition of the traffic light that appalls me the most is, when the last resolution came about to put up a light, the residents and association of Lexington Commons condos fought the resolution because they believed that too much traffic could be diverted

through the complex to get to Taft Road from eastbound Eight Mile and would make that much difference. Besides, it would not be any shorter to wait for the light.

In summation, I hope to pass and validate a successful petition

demonstrating the intelligent and recognizable need of a traffic light. Any support of The Northville Record and its readers will be welcomed.

# Light city primary cost \$6 a voter

Slightly more than one-sixth of the City of Northville's 3,696 registered voters went to the polls August 5 to pull levers for primary candidates, complete returns from the city's three precincts and from 64 absentee ballots show.

"That comes out to a cost of \$6 a voter," City Clerk Joan McAllister calculates.

Had more registered voters gone to the polls, the amount would have been less, she points out, as the election cost is a fixed one.

As no local candidates were on the ballot the vote was expected to be light.

Many of those voting, especially young people, announced to election workers that they were casting their ballots for the Anderson Coalition. Results proved this to be the case. In Oakland County Precinct II of the city almost 50 percent were voted for the Coalition.

Oakland County voters in the city supported the proposal for parks and recreation millage 94-72. The proposal passed county-wide 52,883 to 32,348.

In the Wayne County portion of the city the county home rule passed, as it did county-wide. City vote was 199-33.

Many county official races received few votes from township residents because only Democratic candidates had filed.

Local results of other county races include:

Incumbent Prosecuting Attorney William Cahalan logged 124 votes to

challenger Roman Karwowski's 18. A similar outcome prevailed county-wide. No Republicans are contesting this race so Democrat Cahalan will be unopposed in November.

In the Democratic race for county sheriff incumbent William Lucas received 146 votes. Challenger Wayne D. Lynn got 18.

The Republican primary for sheriff drew more township interest, and J. Vida got 434 votes to Jo Price's 393.

James R. Killeen, unopposed incumbent county clerk, picked up 139 township Democratic votes. There are no Republicans in the race.

The six Democrats vying for nomination to the county treasurer's seat had to divide the small township vote and none received as many as 50 votes here. Challenger George Hart picked up 43 votes, trailed by the 38 of

incumbent Raymond J. Wojtowicz and 37 for Z. Geraldine Szymanski. Stanley F. Rozycki garnered 17 votes here and Charles Lash and JoeDee Zajac received five and three respectively. No Republican candidates are seeking the treasurer post.

Forest E. Youngblood, incumbent register of deeds, gathered 100 votes while challengers Edward M. Opanowski and David J. Sobczak posted 24 and 21 respectively. No Republicans entered in this field.

Unopposed incumbent Democrat Charles N. Youngblood received 138 votes here. His Republican challenger for November, George H. Cully, also was unopposed and gathered 875 votes.

Incumbent County Auditor Richard T. Kelly took 98 township votes to challenger Darlene Olson's 43. No Republicans entered.

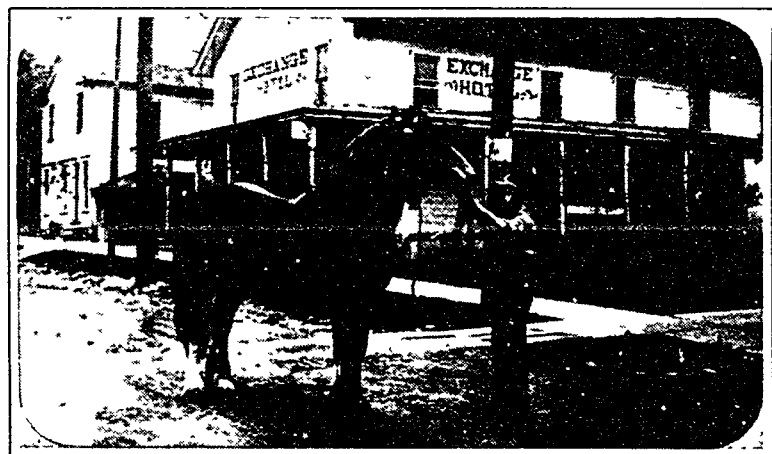

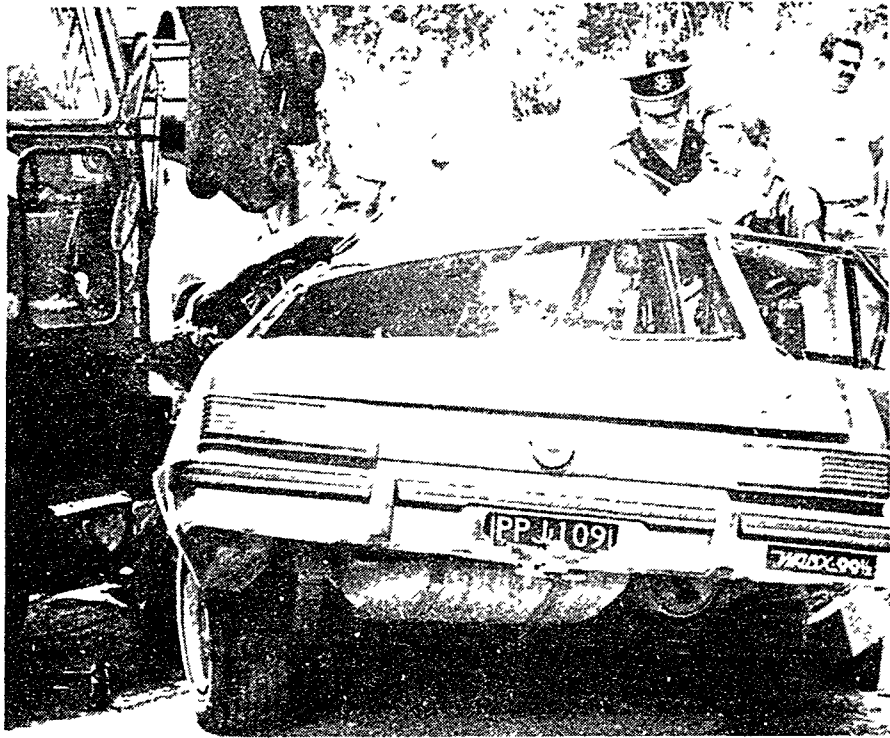

Community needs traffic control on Eight Mile Road

### Let's drain the swamp

One need not fix blame in the tragic traffic death of two young people last week to recognize that the intersection of Eight Mile-Taft-Randolph represents a serious hazard and that some kind of preventive measure is warranted immediately.

We are confident renewed local efforts to correct the situation will result in the wake of this tragedy, but there is, in our opinion, a larger problem that must be dealt with — probably at the state level.

Specifically, we refer to a local community's almost total lack of clout when it comes to traffic control on county roads passing through the community.

The notion of Big Brother that "we know what is best for you" persists not just here in Northville but in communities throughout the state. It fosters the overall reluctance of county and state agencies to attach any significance to a local community's traffic concerns and recommendations.

In their traffic overview, counties appear to be guided by but one major goal: moving traffic along a county road with the least interference possible. And traffic lights, signing and speed reductions are seen as obstacles to their overall traffic goal.

Thus, whenever the local community proposes anything that interferes with this goal it is either rejected out of hand or the county seems to procrastinate purposely in hopes that the community will forget what it set out to do.

For example, Eight Mile speed reductions, traffic signals and signing, in one place or another between Novi and Beck roads, have been proposed and argued by municipal officials, citizens and citizen groups perhaps a dozen times in the past decade. And each time a recommendation is brought to the county's attention, the matter is restudied and rejected or, after meaningless lip service, it often is pigeon-holed or so diluted that the initial objective is lost.

Case in point: Late last year and early this year, city and school

officials again tried (for the umpteenth time) to persuade the county to reduce the speed limit on Eight Mile, only to have the plea fall on deaf ears. As a conciliatory gesture, the county agreed to a pedestrian traffic signal at Taft and Eight Mile. That concession, however, has not yet produced a signal.

The county's method of operation reminds us of the admonition of a plaque that hangs on the publisher's wall, "When you are up to your butt in alligators, it is difficult to remember that your initial objective was to drain the swamp."

Thwarted in their efforts to persuade the county to install meaningful traffic controls on Eight Mile, local city and school officials last year were buoyed by a piece of proposed state legislation that seemed to give local communities more traffic control over county roads. But, alas, the legislation proved to be an empty stocking.

City officials, we are sure, will press for improvements at Eight and Taft and they'll probably plead again for reduced speeds on Eight Mile (even though they and we recognize that speed may not have been a factor in the most recent double fatality), but we also know the county will act at a snail's pace if at all. Therefore, it's time citizens — not just officials — start exerting their more persuasive pressure on both counties and the state legislature.

More specifically, we suggest citizens here demand that our legislators — State Senators R. Robert Geake and Doug Ross and State Representatives Richard Fessler and Jack Kirksey — write and press for the passage of legislation that gives a local community some legal authority over traffic control on county roads inside the community.

The "plunk" method of voting — voting for one or two candidates when multiple choices exist — can prove a valuable tool to the voter in an election. It is important that each person make the best and wisest choice when voting. I feel the "plunk" method aids the voter in two important ways.

First of all, it allows the voter to be sure his vote is cast for only the candidate of his choice. For example, if four candidates are running for two positions, and you want to be sure one specific individual is elected, you "plunk" vote for that individual only. If you were to vote for a second person, you could possibly cast the vote that would elect him over your candidate and accomplish the exact opposite of your original intention.

Also, many of today's non-partisan races call for the

election of three or four people out of a field of anywhere from four to 10 candidates. Unfortunately, many of today's voters cannot or do not take the time to familiarize themselves with all the candidates. Conversely, in some cases, only one or two of the field may be qualified in the eyes of the voter. In both cases, the "plunk" vote allows the voter to vote for only those candidates he has confidence in.

No voter should ever cast a vote only because the ballot allows him more than one choice. The "plunk" vote allows the voter to be sure his vote goes for the candidate of his choice and not for someone else he may feel is less qualified or unsure of.

If voters are going to be fair to their community, they will vote for everything on the ballot. Some will punch one name on the ballot (when several candidates are up for more than one seat) and won't punch for the others. If there are openings for four trustees (as there were in the primary), not to vote for four is not fair to the system. When the ballot calls for four seats to be filled, the voter should vote for all.

This did not happen in the August primary. Voting practices showed in this election that voters do plunk for their choices. It is apparent by looking at the vote cast for the clerk, who was unopposed. Just over half of the 2,185 who voted bothered to cast a clerk vote. About 27 percent of the township's 8,076 registered voters went to the polls at all. Because the primary in the township is 90 percent

sure of being the election, in effect about a quarter of the registered voters chose the township officers for the next four years.

If you are going to be fair to your community, especially in local issues, it is important to be informed. A lot of people don't realize that the primary is the vote for local candidates in a community such as ours (with only a Republican slate). It is important to be able to vote for every office.

It is important to be an aware voter — to be able as a good citizen "to punch" for every office open.

THE CITY OF NOVI ORDAINS:

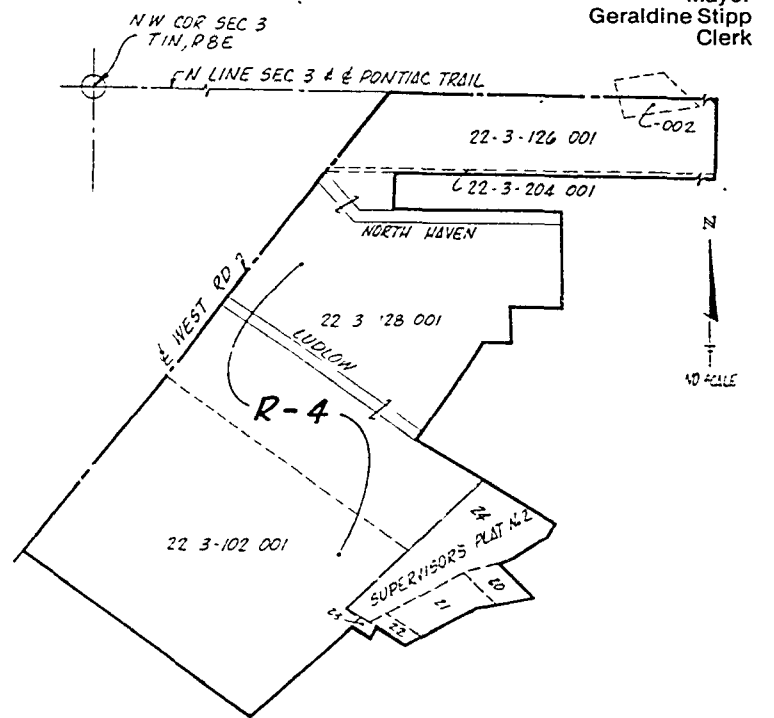

Motion by Councilwoman Ayers supported by Councilman Gardner to adopt a resolution similar to the City of Birmingham's opposing SB 2827 with the addition of the Michigan Municipal League information and copies be sent to our legislators, MML and surrounding communities.  
Motion Carried Unanimously.  
PLYMOUTH REACT: Communications from the Plymouth Area Reaction Team explaining their service to provide "Skywarn" to the community and asking the City if they would help to pay a share of the costs involved.  
The City Manager explained the standard signaling for tornadoes was under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Weather Bureau and this group is just providing visual sightings through their citizens band

radio.  
Motion by Councilman Gardner supported by Councilwoman Ayers to refer this to the Police Department for their recommendation.  
Motion Carried Unanimously.  
RIVER ROUGE WATERSHED COUNCIL: a. Membership: Motion by Councilwoman Ayers supported by Councilman Gardner to adopt a resolution to join the River Rouge Watershed Council.  
Motion Carried Unanimously.  
b. Studies: An update on the Watershed activities was included, no action was necessary.  
APPOINTMENTS. a. Delegate & Alternate, Huron Valley Wastewater Control System — Rate Review Committee: Motion by Councilwoman Ayers supported by Councilman Johnston to adopt a resolution appointing Councilman Gardner as delegate and the City Manager as alternate.  
Motion Carried Unanimously.  
b. City Boards: Action was tabled on this until the next meeting.  
CETA CONSORTIUM: Communication from Wayne County office of manpower re the rationale for Wayne County CETA's rejection of the application for consortium program agent by PIC on behalf of the out-Wayne County communities.  
The City Manager mentioned the four points of concern was in the agreement made with the other communities. It was his feeling the rejection was political. He asked if any of the Council members had any concerns they wanted to convey with the group.  
Mayor Vernon stated Council is unified in the belief that this is as valid now as before.

D D A E A S E M E N T AGREEMENTS: Several of the easements required by Detroit Edison for the underground utilities installation in the Downtown Development Project involve City owned property.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT: Letter from the Township Board extending the termination date of the Joint Building Department Agreement until July 31, 1980.

NORTHVILLE DOWNS STORM SEWER: Mr. Carlo and his architect Mr. Nelson have been discussing plans for the Downs to construct a storm sewer for their parking lot drainage problem this summer, and has a favorable price from a contractor.  
Mr. Carlo is prepared to cooperate with the City to allow us to connect our storm sewer with his when we are ready. He is willing to install storm sewer pipe of an adequate size to serve both his run-off and the City's storm sewer project, if the City will pay the difference in price between the pipe size he requires and the pipe size required with the City's storm sewer connection.  
If Council approves, the City will pay Northville Downs for the pipe size difference at this time, and will acquire an easement right to connect our storm sewer to his storm sewer when we are ready to do so in the future.  
The City Manager mentioned it would be a cost saving to the City.  
Discussion on the location of the sewer followed.  
Mayor Vernon mentioned the serious storm water problem the City has on Main Street and wants to take care of it.  
The City Manager commented that nothing is settled yet since Mr. Cole who owns a portion of the land at the Downs has to be contacted. He would bring in a much more detailed report for the next meeting.  
Mayor Vernon stated he would like to authorize the City Manager to proceed with the negotiations with the Northville Downs and Mr. Nelson.  
Meeting recessed at 9:45 p.m. and reconvened at 9:50 p.m.  
COMMUNICATIONS: a. Two resolutions, one from the City of Farmington & one from Plymouth Township re opposing any attempt to create a parallel and duplicative agency, to the Area-wide Water Quality Management Plan by the DNR and EPA.  
No action was taken.  
b. Northville Public Schools re American Red Cross meeting to set up accommodations in the event of a disaster at the Farm Nuclear Plant in Monroe.

Michigan. Concerns voiced were relevant to this as there had apparently been no contact with Livonia City or School District or Westland, City or School District which are larger and have more facilities. There would be further discussion on this.  
c. Resolution from the Township of West Bloomfield re local control and review of mechanical components, compliance with construction codes, and fire inspection prior to occupancy of adult foster homes.  
Motion by Councilwoman Ayers supported by Councilman Johnston to adopt a resolution in support of West Bloomfield's and send copies to our senators, representatives and surrounding communities.  
Motion Carried Unanimously.

No action was taken.  
e. Resolution from the City of Allen Park re urging the citizens to cast a no vote on the question of a Charter Commission in the August 5th Primary No Action was taken.  
f. HR 4747: Mayor Vernon asked Council to study thoroughly and bring back for the next meeting.  
g. B & B Asphalt: Notice from them stating they would start the Allen Terrace paving on Monday, however, they called and would start on Wednesday.  
h. City to WCRC re S. Main Improvement.  
i. The City Manager re the noise problem from Main Street School Refrigrator. The Building Inspector is looking into the problem.  
j. The Northville High School Student Congress are requesting permission to paint house numbers on curbs in the City as a Fund raiser.  
Motion by Councilwoman Ayers supported by Councilman Johnston to allow the Student Congress to paint the numbers on the curb subject to the same guidelines as last year.

Motion Carried Unanimously.  
k. Letter from Del & Ila Black, owners of Del's Shoes, re concern over the deterioration of the adjacent property, Little Joe's Bar. Their concern was not only over the appearance but also over the possible fire hazard. They noted that the roof of Little Joe's building overhangs their fire wall. They have waited for several years for the Bar to be relocated or replaced by a more compatible building.  
The City Manager has discussed relocating with Little Joe's and no resistance was indicated to relocating, also the owner of the bar agreed the building is not sound and could be condemned.  
Mayor Vernon mentioned the Health Department has cited the bar. He suggested writing a letter to the proprietor advising him that the City has received a letter from an individual and re turning it over to the DDA and let them pursue it. He mentioned if City Council took it upon themselves to follow through it would usurp the DDA. He suggested discussing this at the DDA meeting the next morning (7-22-80).  
l. Ceta funds in the amount of \$735.00 are being received by the City under Title II-D.  
m. The Township are placing the Court Costs owed the Township by the City on the August 14, 1980 Agenda and have asked the City Manager to attend.

# Board of Education revises student code of conduct

The Board of Education approved three revisions in the Student Code of Conduct at its regular meeting Monday.

The revisions are the result of recommendations made by school administrators and principals at a meeting held May 20 to discuss the code.

In the adoption of the code, the board stated that toward the end of the school year the board and school principals would meet to review any basic or operational concerns which may have become apparent through the use of the code.

The first revision, approved unanimously by the board, strikes the word "intentionally" from the prohibited act of "intentionally causing a false fire alarm."

In a memorandum from Superintendent Lawrence Nichols, it was stated that "principals felt that the use of the word intentionally limited

their discretion in dealing with what is, when it occurs, a very serious incident."

Another wording revision, which was given unanimous approval by the board, was made in the article describing the procedure for establishing a hearing in the event of a long term suspension or expulsion.

Under the current code, in the event that a student is suspended pending a hearing, the superintendent is required to appoint the hearing officer and provide for a hearing to take place within four school days following the initial suspension of the student.

Due to time constraints placed on both the administration and the student in the case of expulsion, the board revised the wording of "suspended pending" to read "permitted to remain in school" and changed the wording of "to take place within four school days"

to "must commence within four school days."

The final wording revision in the code approved by the board deals with the penalty for manufacture, sale or delivery of alcohol.

The present penalty for any of these three offenses calls for automatic expulsion.


As indicated in Nichols' memorandum, "Principals feel that they need to have somewhat more discretionary authority in dealing with delivery of alcohol."

The board approved a revision giving principals the authority to decide whether a student should be automatically expelled for the "manufacture, sale, delivery, possession or being under the influence of alcohol."

The board passed the revision 5-1, with Vice President Charles Peltz opposing the motion.

In other action, the board: — unanimously approved the acceptance of equipment which was in part a donation from the Adistra Corporation. The equipment, to be purchased for \$2,075, includes six sets of training telephones and all support equipment to be used in both the office clerical and merchandising programs at the high school; a complete temporary folding stage; and three IBM electronic typewriters.

## Work continues on renovation

The Old Village School Renovation Project is one step closer to completion since it has finally overcome one of its biggest obstacles — the state fire marshal ruling that the building did not comply with fire safety regulations.

Leonard Rezmierski, director of ISEP, informed the board of education Monday, that the state fire marshal is requiring two modifications to the building but has indicated that once the modifications are made the building should be ready for occupancy.

The fire marshal had originally ruled that the building could not be occupied since it did not comply with a state code requiring classrooms occupied by handicapped students to have an exterior exit.

However, in a meeting held in June between members of the state fire marshal's office and school representatives, the fire marshal agreed to reconsider the ruling.

The next step was an inspection of the building by the state fire marshal, Northville Fire Chief Jim Allen, school administrators and others.

The inspection was conducted July 25 and school administrators said at that time they felt the meeting was "very positive."

In a letter dated August 6, to Superintendent Lawrence Nichols, the chief of the State Fire Marshal Division listed modifications to be made to the building and stated that once the changes are made the "modifications will be acceptable to this office."

Modifications stated in the letter include the installation of an exit for a classroom on the lower level and a provision that a classroom on the second level will be approved for a maximum of nine non-ambulatory students without an outside exit contingent upon a ratio of one adult teacher/attendant to one handicapped student.

The board unanimously approved a fire alarm system for the school in an amount not to exceed \$6,500 and approved a security system not to exceed \$5,000.

However, the board has asked that plans for an exit for the lower level classroom as specified in the fire chief's letter be presented at the next meeting.

The Old Village School, formerly known as the Annex, has been remodeled with the intent that the Institutions Special Education Program (ISEP) would be housed there.

The renovation project has been funded by a \$1.2 million grant.

The original completion date of the project was June 1, 1980. However, due to unexpected strikes by electrical workers and carpenters, the building completion has been delayed.

The electrical strike was settled last week and school administrators are hoping that the ISEP staff will be able to return to the building September 3.

A final inspection will be made by the fire marshal before the building is occupied.

In the world of entertainment, it's known as "making the big time."

It's a time when young, aspiring performers gather up their tap shoes, sheet music, and resumes and head for the Big Apple. With determination and eagerness, these young entertainers "pound the pavement" hoping to find an audition—whether it's on Broadway, at the Shakespeare Theatre or with a small acting company.

For the young performer, it's a time to show their talent—the result of many years of voice lessons, ballet and acting classes.

For Jeff A. Lee, a 16-year-old Northville resident, the opportunity to make the big time is one awaited with eagerness and anticipation.

"As soon as I get out of high school, I want to go to New York, get an apartment ... and start working in theatre and stage productions," he said.

Jeff, who will begin his junior year this fall at Northville High School, has been performing for about seven years.

"When I first got interested, I started out in theatre guild plays," he explained, "I then auditioned for television plays."

One of Jeff's first auditions was for the lead role in the television series "Jerry in the Circus"—the story of a

runaway orphan who "adopts" a circus ringmaster and his wife.

The audition proved to be successful for Jeff—he won the role of Jerry in the 52-week series on ABC-TV.

Yet, his success didn't stop there. Since the early days of "Jerry in the Circus," Jeff has expanded into various aspects of the entertainment world and his resume reads like a Broadway playbill.

Throughout the past seven years, he has performed in three television productions; has done extensive modeling; recorded "Barney, The C.B. Reindeer," a single release; starred in two dinner theatre productions, 13 stage productions, six films, and various network and local commercials which range from Jiff Peanut Butter to Post Raisin Bran.

He also has had two major screen tests—one for the movie "Pete's Dragon," a Walt Disney production, and the other for the Warner Brothers movie "Alice."

Jeff said with the help of a personnel manager in New York and agents in Detroit, he keeps in tune with upcoming auditions and possible job opportunities.

"If something comes up, we just pick up and go," he explained.

In addition to flying to auditions around the country, being a student and taking drivers education, Jeff spends

the majority of his time in professional training.

His weeks are filled with vocal, dance, acting, piano and drum lessons. His dancing talents include jazz, tap, and ballet, as well as choreographing routines.

For the past several weeks, he has been preparing for his own production entitled "It's Showtime," a one-man musical variety show performed this past weekend on the Bob Lo boats.

For the show, Jeff performs song and dance routines, which he choreographed, from such musicals as "Cabaret" and "A Chorus Line."

Kirk Bingenheimer, 16, of 16610 Old Bedford, has been working with Jeff and has done all of the sound work for the production.

"I work with the equipment and the music to keep the show moving," Kirk said, "Jeff does the acting."

Jeff and Kirk will take "It's Showtime" on the road August 15 and 16, when they will perform at the center court in Twelve Oaks Mall.

The show is being performed in conjunction with the opening of the new movie "Smokey and the Bandit-Part II," which will open August 15 at the Movies at Twelve Oaks.

There will be two performances of "It's Showtime" on Friday at 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. Saturday's performances will be held at 1 and 3 p.m.

Following each performance, free passes to "Smokey and the Bandit Part II" will be given away to persons who can correctly answer Burt Reynolds trivia questions.

Arrangements for the performances were made by Jeff's brother Tim, assistant manager of the Twelve Oaks movie theatres and an advertising student at Michigan State University.

Tim said the show will be "a good promotional pitch for the movie" and will also give Jeff and Kirk some exposure.

There weren't any problems in arranging the show, he said, "especially when I told the mall manager that they would do it for free."

Jeff and Kirk said they hope the Twelve Oaks shows will lead to more job opportunities. Since forming the J and K Productions group, they have been eager to show off their act.

Jeff said anyone having a party who is looking for entertainment can give him a call at 349-5610, because he "wants the experience."

Jeff said experience is of vital importance in the entertainment field.

"You have to keep performing—to keep pushing yourself," he said.

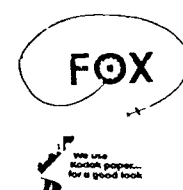
And with two years to go before venturing to Broadway, Jeff said he will continue to drop everything at a chance to earn more experience.

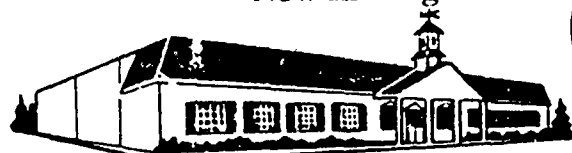

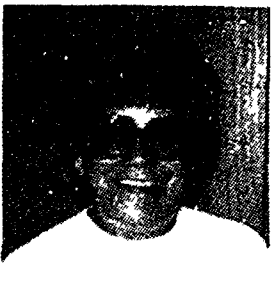

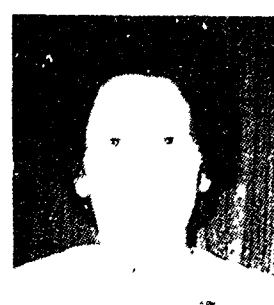

Taylor for his 1932 Chevrolet Club Coupe, a car with, perhaps, less of an aura about it but one which frequently drew the comment, father to son, that "My father (or "I") had one of those once. It was blue and..."

Among the cars not competing the crowd favorite had to be the 1954 Corvette Roadster owned by John Conder. The Northville man's copy of "America's only sports car" sat in splendor, red paint fairly shouting with the reflections of sun and cloud in its curves.

The car has won many an award in competition (see related story) and, although there were many Corvettes at the show, everyone knew which one was meant when asked if they had seen "the red Corvette."

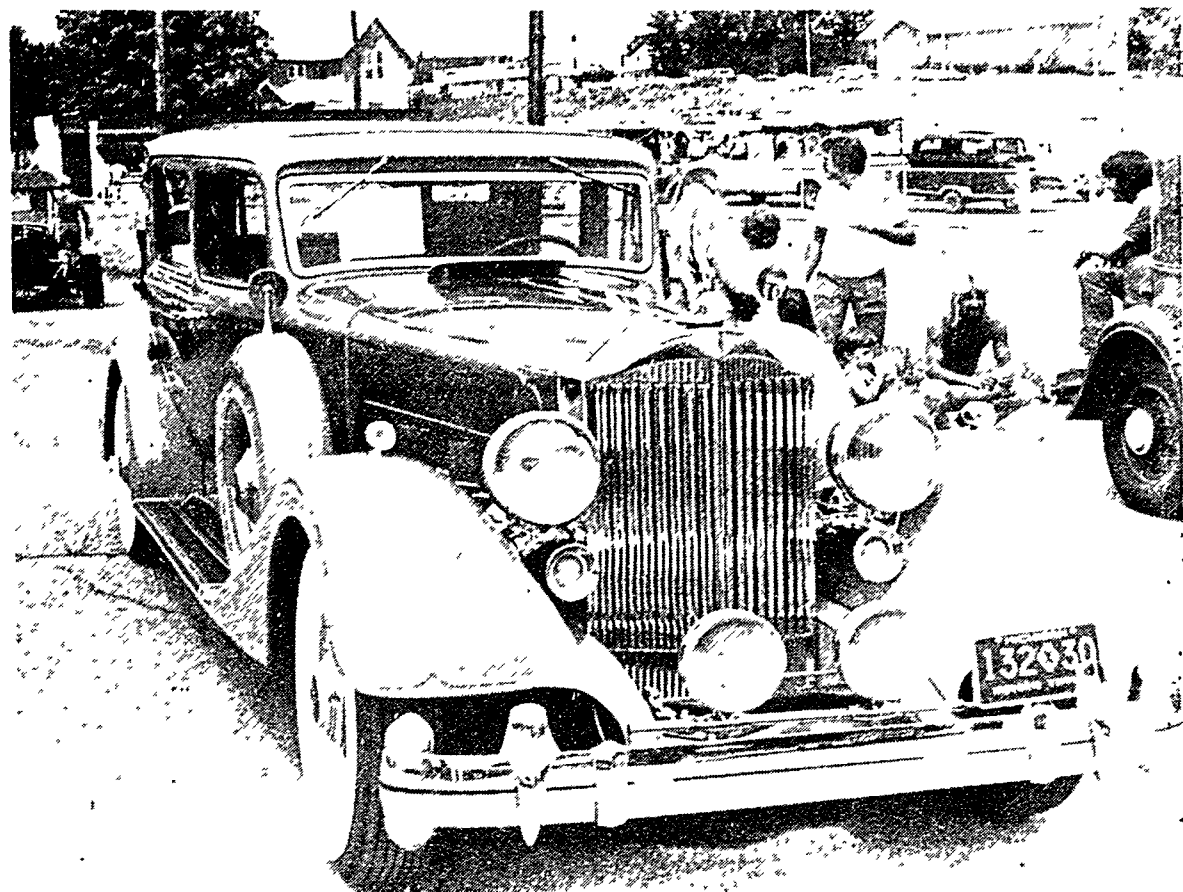
Some may have been confused to see the collection of 1960s products at an event billed as an "antique" car show, but owners of early Pontiac GTOs, Dodge Chargers and Ford Mustangs were quick to explain that their cars came from the last period before automotive design was heavily mandated from Washington.

A 1956 Studebaker Power Hawk displayed by R.T. Fisher of Dexter offered a surly reminder of how tough the competition can be in the auto industry. Studebaker folded in 1964, never having recovered from the automotive recession of the late 1950s.

Genuine antiques from companies that failed in earlier tough economic times were present in abundance. These included a 1925 Franklin, with aircooled engine, brought from Lansing by A.H. Kiebler and a 1923 Willys Knight displayed by Northville resident Bill McMillan. Both had wooden spoke wheels that fascinated children.

McMillan is one of the founders of the Northville Antique Car Club that began a few years ago when a handful of local owners decided to band together. The club now boasts 35 members drawn from the surrounding area and is open to all with an interest, regardless of car ownership.

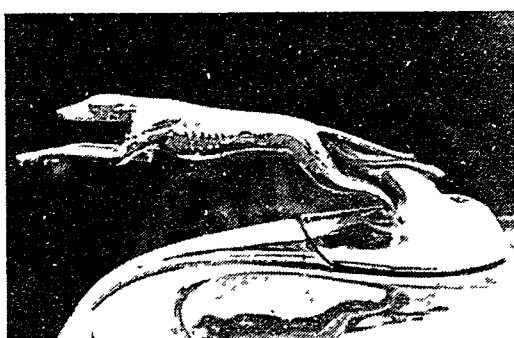
The club is affiliated as a local chapter of the Veteran Motor Car Club of America (VMCCA). It conducted a similar show last year that was rained out in the early afternoon.



Livonia's John Sullivan won first place for 1934 Packard V-12

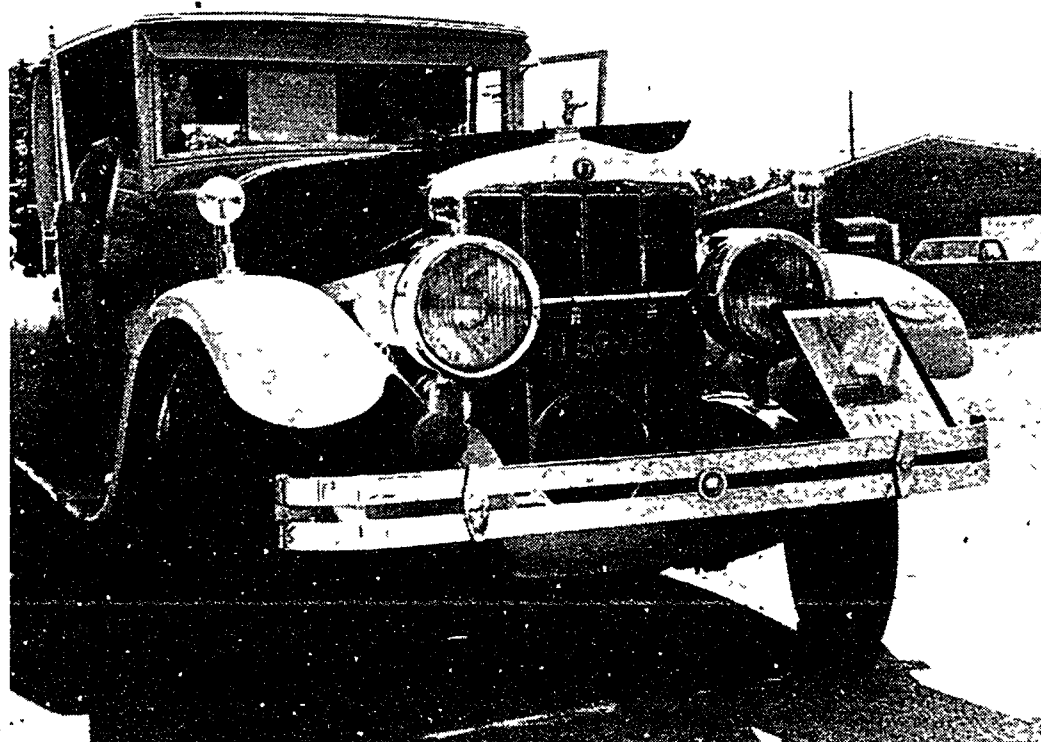

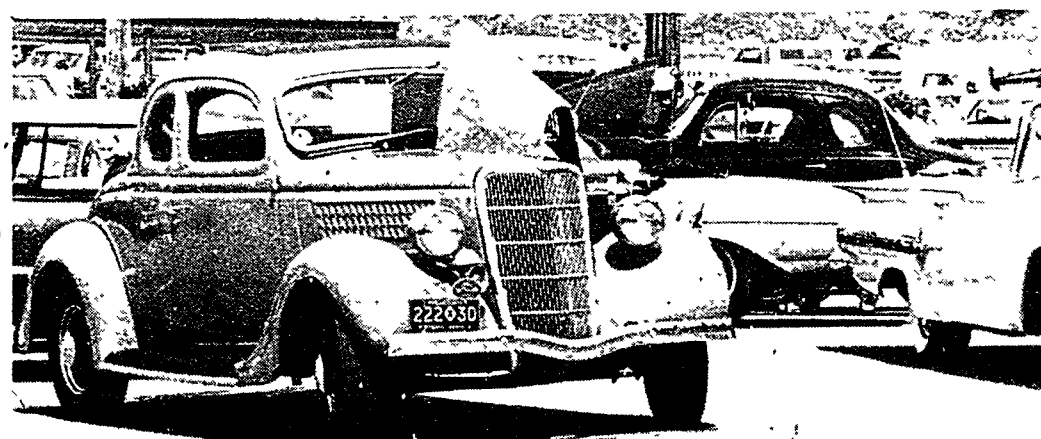


1934 Ford Coupe

# Town Hall Board of Awards distributes record sum

Several hundred dollars to buy socks and underwear for patients at Northville State Hospital and operating funds for the Northville-Novl FISH emergency help organization are among substantial donations to 24 area organizations being announced by Northville Town Hall Board of Awards.

A record sum of \$4,375 has been distributed to charity organizations in local communities that support the town hall series, board of awards chairman Frances Mattison announces.

An equal sum was presented to Our Lady's League of Our Lady of Victory Church which sponsors town hall. The board is continuing the established practice of dividing proceeds equally with area communities.

Mrs. Mattison points out that in its first year, 20 years ago, \$1,200 was distributed. As of this year, a total of \$63,670 has been distributed with \$31,785

going to Our Lady's League and a like amount to 51 organizations.

In announcing this year's awards, the committee points out that the donation to the Open Door Clothing Center at Northville State Hospital is for clothing not normally donated to the center and much-needed by patients.

A substantial donation also went to Northville Historical Society for restoration work at the one-room Wash-Oak School in Mill Race Historical Village.

This is the only structure still needing major renovation in the village located off Griswold at Main in Northville. When completed, the school will be used to illustrate for today's school children what it was like to attend school in the 19th century.

Mizpah Circle of the International Order of King's Daughters and Sons received a donation to assist with aid to the needy in the Northville community.

The circle annually provides Thanksgiving dinner baskets to those in need, as well as aiding the University of Michigan Children's Hospital and the elderly.

Both Novi and Northville Friends of the Library organizations were recipients of monies. Audio-visual aid materials for the children's section of the Novi Library were approved for a gift. The Northville grant will be used to purchase a conference table for the library meeting room.

Our Lady of Providence School at 16115 Beck received a donation to help furnish a room.

Northville Community Band has been given a gift to help develop a library and purchase music.

Michigan Association for Emotionally Disturbed Children, Hawthorn-Northville Chapter, was awarded a grant to purchase recreational equipment for Hawthorn

Center.

International Order of Alhambra in Northville received a donation toward its annual picnic for retarded children.

Northville Junior Entertainment Series was the recipient of cultural enrichment funds to be used for elementary and junior high students' programs.

Northville Cooperative Preschool was granted its request for funds to purchase a rocking chair.

Northville Community Recreation department was given an award to help renovate the community building.

South Lyon Area Youth Guidance received money for camperships for three youths.

# Co-op adds program for toddlers

Introducing children to the gourmet delight of pate or explaining to them the mysteries of a pirate ship, may seem slightly out of the ordinary for many schools. Yet at Northville's Cooperative Preschool, such activities all are a part of the learning process.

Northville Cooperative Preschool, one of the oldest in the Detroit area, currently is registering children 18 months to five years old, for their fall classes.

Four different programs are being offered to preschoolers with classes beginning September 10.

The Toddler Program, for children 18 months to 30 months old, is new for the fall. It is fully licensed by the Michigan Department of Social Services and is devoted to "growing closer as you untie the apron strings."

The Toddler Program is equipped with facilities for diaper changing. Rather than using bottles or pacifiers, children are taught to use paper and crayons, easel paints and dough.

Tuition fee for the Toddler Program is \$15 per month.

Another program, designed predominantly for 3-year-olds, is the Tuesday-Thursday group.

In the Tuesday-Thursday group craft participation is encouraged, but not required, as children's muscles may not be ready.

Group chats and songs are oriented to the 3-year-olds attention span. Socialization is stressed by learning to share.

The cost for the Tuesday-Thursday program is \$18.50 per month, and classes are offered Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9 a.m. to 11:20 a.m.

Though fall classes for this program currently are filled, interested persons may put their child's name on a waiting list.

The Monday-Wednesday-Friday group is designed for 4-year-olds who may be kindergarten bound.

Curriculum in the program is structured to interrelate science, art, songs, etc. Some testing is done to identify strengths and communicate the child's accomplishments to parents.

Membership currently is open for the fall. Tuition is \$23.50 per month and the course is offered Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9 a.m. to 11:20 a.m.

For parents who have doubts about sending their 5-year-old to

kindergarten, the NCP is offering the Enrichment Group.

The Enrichment Group is designed to meet the special needs of potential kindergartners whose fifth birthdays will fall before March 1, 1981.

Children are placed in a class size of 12 children under the direction of one teacher and two parents.

Children are taught skills in speech, listening and retaining directions, safety, and physical independence — such as the mastery of zippers, buckles, etc.

Group sharing time also is provided, to give children the opportunity for individual recognition.

Membership for the Enrichment Program is open for fall. Tuition cost is \$36.50 per month.

Judy Whitmore, vice president for the NCP, said Northville is the first area to offer four group programs.

She said the cooperative programs offer "a lot of free choice for kids."

"Preschool should emphasize social development," she said, "we're not all that concerned with academics."

Whitmore said the parents work approximately one and one-half days a

month alongside the teacher.

Groups usually are limited to 15 students with one teacher and two parents.

"When the parents are there, the rule is usually hard and fast," she explained. "It also gives the parents the opportunity to shape their child's learning atmosphere."

Whitmore said the preschool offers parents an alternative to sending their children to kindergarten — if they feel they aren't ready.

"By and large, most kids entering kindergarten have been in nursery school one way or another," she said. "We find that students with more nursery school are better off."

NCP is a member of the Greater Detroit Cooperative Nursery Council and the Michigan Council of Cooperative Nurseries.

NCP classes are taught at the Scout Recreation Building.

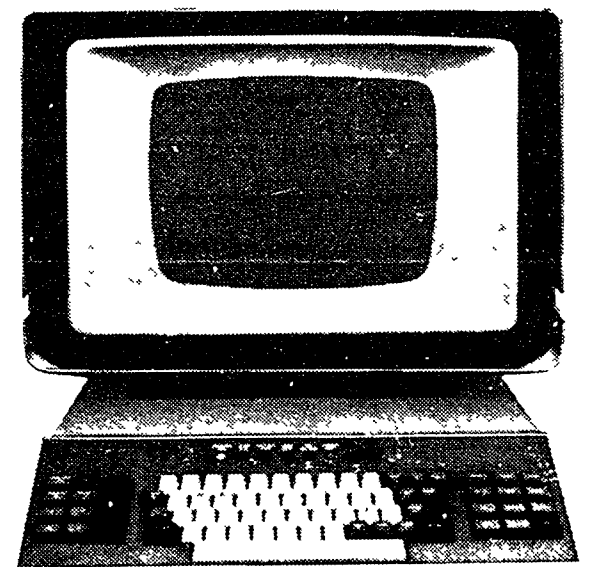

# Instead of fur, these paddlers seek fun

Canoeing, once a major means of transportation for pre-historic lake dwellers and American Indians, is now a recreational activity — one that has gained popularity as a result of the energy crunch and a renewed emphasis on enjoying the great outdoors.

Dug-out tree trunks and birchbark canoes have given way to crafts manufactured out of aluminum, fiberglass, laminated plastics, inflatable rubbers and, naturally, wood.

While fur-trading French voyageurs and native Americans occasionally may have paddled furiously to market

places with their goods, the pace of today's canoeists is more leisurely as they enjoy sightseeing, fishing, swimming and camping. For the more adventurous, there are the white water thrills of wilderness river rapids and, in this age of the runner, there is even a canoe marathon — a 240-mile trek down the AuSable River from Grayling to Oscoda.

Recreational canoeists may paddle down a river or stream for a few miles or they may journey from Lake Huron to Lake Michigan, a 480-mile trip up and down the Manistee and Au Sable rivers.

And, for those who can't afford a

canoe, there are a number of boat livery services that rent the crafts.

You don't have to travel far, either, to find a wilderness river. One of the best canoe trips in Michigan, say experts, is along the Huron River from either the Proud Lake State Recreation Area in the Milford-Wixom area or Ann Arbor.

More than 100-miles long, the Huron winds through Oakland, Livingston, Washtenaw, Wayne and Monroe counties before emptying into Lake Erie near South Rockwood.

A trip the whole distance could take from seven to 10 days, experts say. The Huron is a slow river, and there are a number of campsites and boat livery services along the way.

Some of the local liveries on the Huron include: Argo Park Canoe Livery at the foot of Long Shore Drive in Ann Arbor; ECO Sports Livery, 275 W. Liberty, Milford; Heavner's Canoe Rental, 2775 Garden Road, Milford; Hell Creek Ranch, 10820 Cedar Lake Road, Pinckney; and Skip's Huron River Canoe Livery, 3780 W. Delhi Road, Ann Arbor.

Also close by is the Clinton River. One seven-mile course begins at the Drayton Plains Nature Center, south of the Dixie Highway west of Pontiac, and follows the stream into Cass Lake to the boat ramp at state-owned Dodge Park Number Four.

A more treacherous trip down the

Clinton takes canoeists through Macomb County to Lake St. Clair, a 28-mile journey. High water in the springtime and logjams in the upper stretches of the river provide a little excitement for the advanced canoeing enthusiast.

A list of other canoe trails is available by writing to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) in Lansing for its "Canoeing in Michigan" guide. Other free publications are available from the Southeast Michigan Travel & Tourist Association, 350 American Center Building, 27777 Franklin Road, Southfield 48034, or the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority (HCMA), 3050 Penobscot Building, Detroit 48226. There is a 20-cents charge for postage for the HCMA maps.

The HCMA has overnight campsite facilities for canoeists at the Kensington, Hudson Mills and Lower Huron Metroparks. Canoe rental services are available at Hudson Mills and the Stony Creek Metropark. (Kensington is near Milford; Hudson Mills is northwest of Ann Arbor; Lower Huron is near Belleville; and Stony Creek is near Rochester.)

In addition, the HCMA offers an hour-long ride in a 34-foot voyageur canoe at the Metro Beach Metropark near Mt. Clemens. A replica of the Montreal model craft used by French fur traders, the voyageur canoe holds 20 persons and a licensed operator for the trip on Lake St. Clair.

For the more adventurous, there's the 34th annual AuSable River canoe marathon from Grayling to Oscoda next July. John Baker of Grayling claimed his third straight title in the event three weeks ago, taming the 240-mile course in a little less than 15 hours with his partner, Ron Williams of British Columbia, Canada, to take home a \$1,400 prize.

And two Lansing men — Verlen Kruger and Steven Landick — are in the midst of a 28,400-mile cross-continent trip in a canoe.

Although it isn't listed in vacation guides, there are canoeist-versus-fisherman battles from time to time on the AuSable, Manistee and other wilderness rivers in northern Michigan. The swarm of canoeists to Michigan rivers in recent years, in fact, has led to a call for regulation of the boating

activity on some waterways.

In addition to maps and information on rentals and camping, some basic gear you may want to take along, according to the DNR, could include light and compact clothing and equipment, especially if there are a number of portages on your route.

Many canoeists use lightweight gear designed for backpackers, says the DNR, except the packs should be removed from the metal frames. Old pros use heavy knapsacks with no exterior fittings or pockets, the state agency adds. In any case, the pack should be lined with waterproof plastic.

Lightweight tents, stoves and other accessories may be selected if a camping stop is planned, the DNR says.

Maps, camera equipment, first aid kits and billfolds and/or emergency funds should be sealed in heavy plastic bags with enough air or floatation to guard against capsizing or sinking — avoid using paper bags or cardboard boxes.

Foods should include energy-producing items that can be eaten cold in case of rain or a dunking that soaks cooking equipment, the DNR adds.

## Safety tips for canoeers

Now for a few safety tips from the DNR.

Life preservers should be worn or carried by each canoeist while on the river.

Pack the canoe properly to maintain the balance of the equipment load.

When climbing in or out of the craft, keep your weight along the center line to prevent tipping.

When portaging, lift the canoe out of the water instead of dragging it on shore.

Watch where you're going to avoid rocks, rapids and sand bars.

Don't attempt to run any river you're not confident you can handle.

If you tip over, hang on to your canoe — you'll have a better chance of reaching shore.

And, finally, never stand up in a canoe.

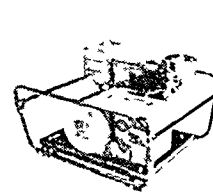

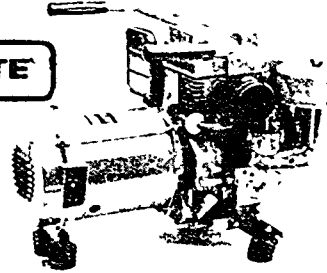

## Northville scouts discover the Canadian wilderness

Its the kind of trip many boys — and men — dream about

Canoeing down rapid-flowing rivers through wooded areas untouched by man.

Encountering — at a distance, of course — a bald eagle's nest, huge black bears and maybe even a wolf or two.

The only sign of the human species is the occasional whirring of a helicopter which can be heard circling above once each day.

But for Northville's Ron Hammell and his scout adventurers the trip offered many new sights and sounds.

"The wing span of the bald eagle we saw was no less than six feet," related Hammell. "I had some pictures of an active nest, but that role of film didn't turn out. But it was a great experience."

Hammell of 41365 Ladywood, his son Chris and 12 others began their 13-day boy scout adventure at the Charles L. Sommers National High Adventure Base in Northern Minnesota.

From there the group canoed and portaged some 135 miles through the Quetico Provincial Park in Canada.

The nine nights spent camping in Canada were not without problems. Hammell and crew could make no camp fires because of a fire ban due to the very dry conditions.

The campers did have a small Coleman stove which they used to cook some fish they caught, but the majority of their diet was dried, packaged food.

"We were planning and preparing for this trip for more than a year," Hammell said. "This is a lot more than just camping out a few days up north — in Michigan."

Hammell said there were many areas where the rock just under the surface of the water and along some portage trails was razor sharp.

A few adventurers suffered minor

injuries, but nothing very serious, he said

The weather also was on their side, according to Hammell

"We had very little rain and many beautiful days for canoeing. I wish others could see the great beauty which still exists up there"

The scouts did not see — or hear — any wolves on their journey, though the largest group of the breed, approximately 1,000 is reported to inhabit the lands in and around Quetico Provincial Park

"I really am suprised that we didn't at least hear a wolf howling during one of the nights," Hammell said.

The canoe trip through the Canadian wilderness is merely one of many such adventures Hammell's group has tackled.

Last July Hammell and a number of the scouts went sailing and scuba

diving in the Florida Keys

What's next?

Hammell and a number of scouts are planning a jaunt to the Matagamon National High Adventure Base in Maine next July where they will tour a mountain range which includes Maine's highest mountain Mount Katahdin

Three Northville boys, Erich Nowka, Ross Grover and Greg Ayers — all former scout high adventurers — are spending the summer at a third scout high adventure base, Philmont in New Mexico

Nowka works as a counselor, while Grover and Ayers are employed as rangers

They leave the camp with a group and remain with the campers a couple of days to get them settled, then return to camp for another group of adventurers.
