## Schools facing tighter budget

New board of education officers and trustees Christopher Johnson and Jean Hansen were presented with their first problem immediately following Monday night's election.

Director of Business and Finance John Street told the body that the general fund is facing difficulty with expenses exceeding revenue by \$215,000 — 1.5 percent of the general fund budget.

"There were three areas where there were significant variances that contributed to the problem. Energy costs were much higher than anticipated; fringe benefits were higher and transportation costs, particularly for athletics and field trips, were also higher," Street said.

Dr. George Bell, superintendent, told the board that the most current revision of the budget was completed in January and apologized to the body for supplying the current information so late.

"I am concerned that this matter comes so late in the year and I have instructed Mr. Street we will hold quarterly budget subcommittee meetings," Bell said.

Street pointed out that the expenditures exceeded revenues across the board with few exceptions. The high school fund was \$14,838 under budget; the gifted program was \$4,322 under budget; pupil services was under by \$1,422, and library by \$1,996.

The shortfall can be made up by a contribution from the district's fund balance, however, as Hansen pointed out, "we will be left with about

\$40,000 in that account and if we are forced to hire an additional teacher, we will be in serious difficulty.

Bell noted that the current budget includes funds to hire five additional teachers, however, he said, "we really won't know how many teachers will be added to staff until we see the whites of the eyes of the students."

"I have asked PTAs to talk to their neighbors in areas where new homes are being built. I am in contact with the Welcome Wagon people, but until that first day of school, we just won't know what the population is," he said.

## Trustees not PRUDish in giving approvals

While township residents expressed reservations about plans to build 144 condominiums on Beck Road near Seven Mile, the Board of Trustees gave unanimous approval to the developers of Blue Heron Pointe at the southeast quadrant of Seven Mile and Beck roads to proceed with their plans for a planned residential unit development.

Surprisingly, it was the board itself which expressed reservations for another PRUD, Dun Rovin at Six Mile and Haggerty, approving the development 4-3, although no one in the public made a negative comment about the proposal.

Developers for both projects hope to present plans to the planning commission in the near future.

"We have met with the neighbors (of the Thomson gravel pit) and tried to respond to their concerns," said land planner Robert Leighton. But the responses were not all the

neighbors could want.

John Ashton, an attorney representing the Thomson family, pointed out that while the family was in favor of the concept for Blue Heron Pointe, it had some very serious concerns about the actuality of the project.

"We have \$460,000 on deposit with the township, as well as a plan to develop single-family, detached homes on the 371 acres to the south and west of this project," Ashton said. "We have no plans to develop a

PRUD. And, if you are asking us to sanction a PRUD for this site, we have no problem. But if we are here to approve a preliminary site plan for this project, then there is a problem, since the buildings are set back on 40 feet and the ordinance clearly requires a 150-foot setback."

Matt Modrack, community development director countered that the township attorney had reviewed the PRUD option and had looked at the plans for Blue Heron Pointe.

Mark Thomas, an attorney representing two other neighbors, noted that his concern was the connector road planned for the development.

"The road comes, at some points, within 30-40 feet of my clients' home and they are definitely concerned with the noise, traffic and automobile lights which this road will generate," Thomas said.

"The PRUD is inconsistent with other densities as required in the district," noted Jerry Malone, who lives on Seven Mile Road. "I see no attempt to build single-family homes on this property and I see no reason why they can't be built."

Developers for the project have noted that they plan to reclaim part of the gravel pit and eventually to use it as a lake, complete with a small marina on the site.

Also included in the plans for Blue Heron Pointe are recreational opportunities — a walking/jogging trail, play fields and a boardwalk ex-

tending into a protected wetland.

Walt Coponen, project architect, pointed out that the 140 condominium homes will be designed to provide equal emphasis on the front, side and rear-yard faces of the cluster homes, which will range from 1,900 square feet to 2,300 square feet.

The trustees, in approving the plan, noted that the OK depended upon widening the road to provide additional parking within the development; approval from the water and sewer commission; a stormwater system maintenance agreement and approval from the township attorney.

The Dun Rovin developers did not have as easy a time getting their project approved.

Trustee Jim Nowka, in no uncertain terms, said he was opposed to approval since the Dun Rovin Golf Course which currently exists on the site, would be reduced to a nine-hole executive course and be made a

## County EDC, developers at odds over winding up elderly project

It will take some time before what is left of the partnership that formed Northville Elderly Development signs off on the acreage on Sheldon Road.

At least that's the assessment offered by Gregory Pitoniak, chairman of Wayne County Economic Development Corp., and Michael Kahm, who was once involved in the ill-fated project.

Under terms of the lease with the EDC, Northville Elderly Development was to have begun construction of 168 units by April, or lose its 99-year option on the property.

But after a much-heralded groundbreaking ceremony, the project never got off the ground and now, sources say, the partnership is seeking the return of the money it has spent to get the project going before signing off.

Wayne County contends the developers are owed nothing, and could owe the county money, since no work was actually done.

"As it stands now, the developer has not acknowledged the termination," Pitoniak said, adding that EDC attorneys had sent a letter in late May requesting the signoff.

The issue is further complicated by Wayne County including the 100-acre parcel with more than 928 acres it is in the process of selling.

"As far as we are concerned, the bottom line is that the county believes Northville Elderly Development has failed to perform as it is required to do by contract," Pitoniak said.

Kahm, with Singh Development, an original partner in the project, said his firm pulled out of the project late last

year; however, it was his understanding that the current partners were seeking about \$35,000 plus the cost of liability insurance.

"We carried insurance once the original contract with the EDC was signed until now," Kahm said.

Aside from the financial interests, the county and the remaining partners have pointed fingers at each other, accusing each other of making it impossible for the project to continue.

Kahm said there had been an understanding that Northville Township would amend its zoning ordinance to create an elderly zone on the property, and would allow part of the property to be developed for multiple, non-elderly housing.

Pitoniak said Wayne County had no control over the actions of individual townships and made no such promise.

The Northville Township Planning Commission recently approved language for elderly housing districts, noting at the time that there had been few requests for such a district aside from the project planned by Northville Elderly Development.

None of the proposals studied by the commission included mixed elderly and non-elderly usage.

## NRPH acreage to be sold?

Approximately 25 acres of state-owned land on Seven Mile Road near Haggerty may be put up for sale if township and Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital officials are correct.

However, the Michigan Department of Mental Health, which owns the hospital and its land, has denied the possibility of such a sale.

"As far as I have been able to determine, there are no plans to change the use of the land or to put it up for sale," said Lawrence VanDeSande, a mental health department spokesperson.

VanDeSande said that were the

property to be sold, the director of the department would have to declare it surplus land and an act of the Legislature would be needed to set a fair-market value or price for the land. The Legislature has adjourned for the summer so no action could be taken until fall, VanDeSande said.

Northville Township Supervisor Georgina Goss and Dr. Walter Brown, director of the hospital, both confirm that discussions about the possible sale have been held and are continuing.

"There have been very, very preliminary discussions," Goss said. "I know that our attorney has talked

with Mr. (Thomas) Watkins (director of the department of mental health) and there is a very good possibility the land will be sold."

She added that any sale would be contingent on legislative approval and that state Rep. Gerry Law's office was involved in the discussions. Law is a Republican from Plymouth.

Brown said Tuesday it was his understanding that discussions about the potential sale were proceeding. "I have heard nothing in the past week or so about it, though," he said.

Watkins was on vacation and unavailable for comment. Law's office said the representative was out of the state for five weeks.

## Jury generously gives \$145,000

A \$145,000 jury award last week was the largest monetary award ever given in 35th District Court Judge John MacDonald's courtroom.

The award was surprising to some because the case was remanded to District Court after a Wayne County Circuit Court mediation team deemed the claim was not worth more than \$10,000.

Wayne County Circuit Court handles civil cases where the amount

of damages requested is \$10,000 or more.

"To me it was a gross miscarriage of justice," said Fred W. Gerow, the defendant's attorney.

The plaintiff, Judy Whitmire of Northville, a horse trainer at Northville Downs, sued Norman Cohen, another trainer, for allegedly striking her with a vehicle in 1984.

Her attorney, Michael Rex, said

she injured her back and can no longer train. She was 42 at the time of the incident.

Gerow referred to Whitmire's injury as a muscle problem.

The three men and three women on the jury deliberated about five hours July 9 and July 10 before reaching their decision.

Gerow said he was preparing possible actions, including asking for a new trial in appealing the verdict.

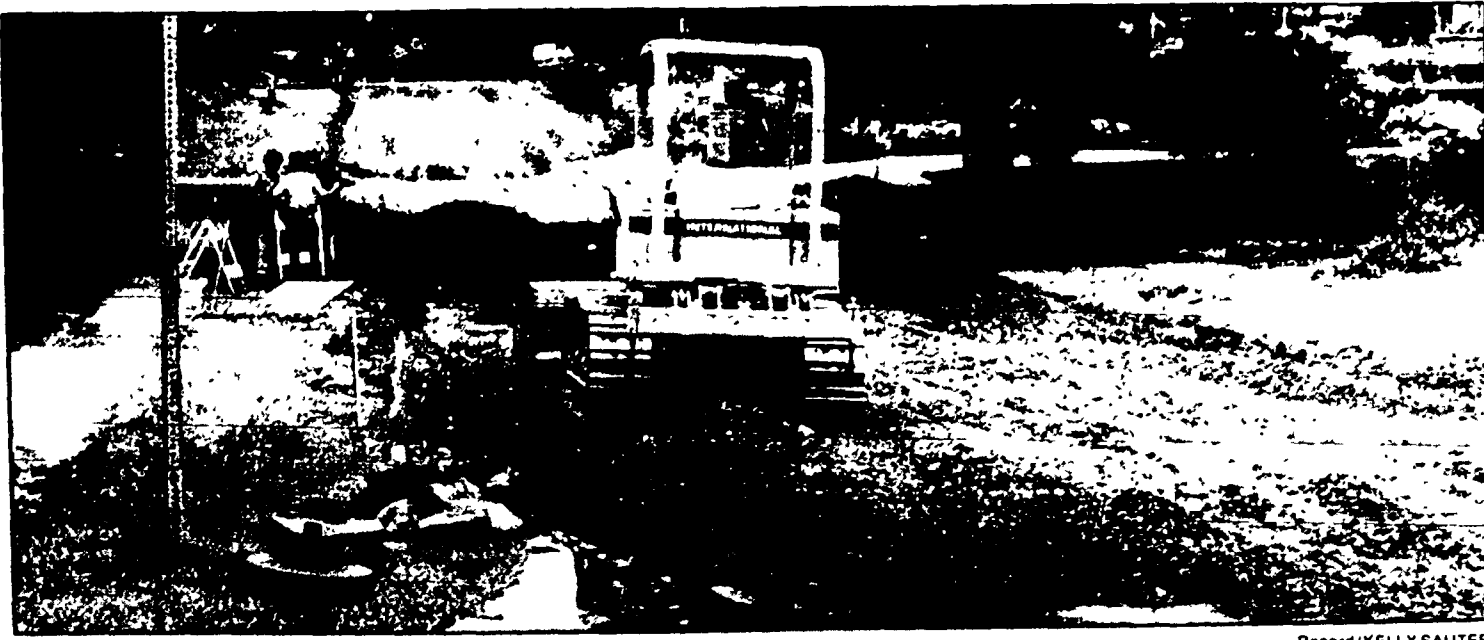

## Work rolls ahead on city road repair

Beginning next week, The Northville Record will publish a map showing the location of street repair and reconstruction scheduled in the city for the following week.

With the cooperation and efforts of city engineers McNeely and Lincoln Associates, Inc., the paper will publish a map of the city with streets marked where construction is expected to take place in the week ahead. This may help area drivers make their way around the city more efficiently by avoiding areas which may be impassable due to construction.

This week's map shows sections of streets in the city which are sched-

ed to be part of the repair program, but because of various reasons are not expected to be worked on until next spring. These streets include Taft Road from Eight Mile north to the city limits, Center Street from Baseline Road to Dunlap Street and from East Main Street to Edward Hines Drive, and Rural Hill Drive.

City engineer Jack McNeely announced these streets to the City Council last week.

In addition, McNeely identified several other streets which were scheduled for this year, but drainage problems may force a postponement until next year.

## Record to begin series of maps showing where repairs scheduled

Streets in the City of Northville are continuing to be torn up lately as the city's street repair program approved by voters last year shifts into high gear, with construction scheduled to continue throughout the summer and into next spring before all the planned repaving is completed.

"All the routine stuff will be done this year," City Manager Steven Walters said. "So far, it seems to be going relatively smoothly, with fairly little inconvenience to residents."

Walters said that, in most cases,

the streets being repaired are never completely closed to residents, or are closed only a very short time. Residents are notified by mail shortly before work is to begin on their street, Walters added.

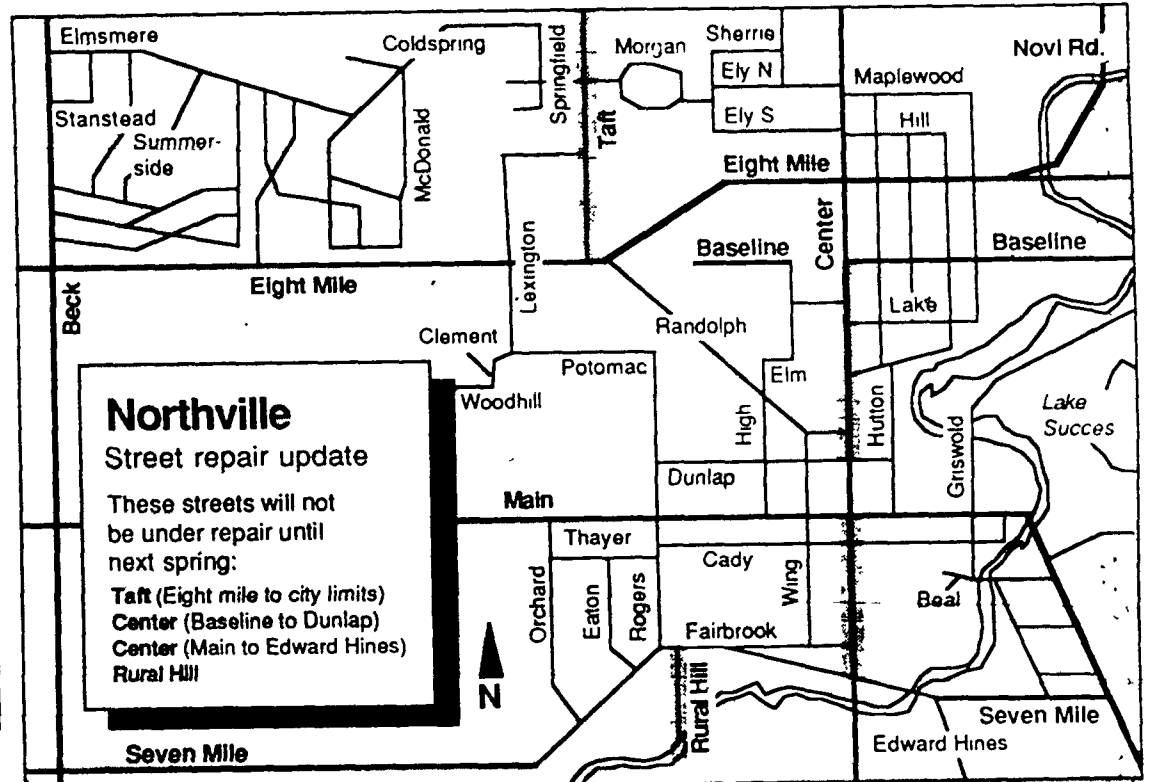
Work on the streets can include tearing up the existing pavement first. Then a new base layer is laid down, other repairs are made, and a finish layer is set.

Walters estimated that about three-quarters of the street pavement in the city will be affected by

the project.

The repair program is being funded through a \$3 million bond issue which voters in the city approved June 24, 1986. The sale of the municipal bonds will be paid off with a 2-mill property tax over the next 10 years.

Since some streets in the city had been repaired through the use of special assessment districts, a part of the money raised through those assessments has been refunded to property owners, depending on how long ago a street was repaired.

# Game of 'Chicken' claims Novi High School grid star

The death of Joel Benjamin Finzel, 18, is sending shock waves around Novi High School.

A star football player who graduated from Novi High School just a little more than a month ago, Finzel was killed after being struck by a freight train at the Nine Mile C&O crossing early Saturday morning, July 11.

Police reports indicated that Finzel and a friend had been playing "chicken" on the railroad tracks when the accident occurred. The name of the friend was withheld by police

"The kids are all shook up," said Beverly Cook, secretary to Novi High School Principal Robert Youngberg. "He had a lot of friends. He was a nice, personable kid—a very nice boy."

Many friends and classmates attended visitation at the Harry J. Will Funeral Home in Livonia Monday night. Cook said the funeral home was "absolutely packed" with people who came by to pay final respects

The funeral service was held Tuesday at 11 a.m. at St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in Walled Lake. Interment followed at Glen Eden Cemetery in Livonia

Cook said students were visibly shaken by the death of their classmate. "High school boys in particular have a tough time showing

their emotions openly," she said. "But the scene at the funeral home was filled with emotion."

"Some of the boys seemed dazed because they just couldn't believe it, others just broke down."

"It's really sad. What a waste. He was such a nice boy."

Meanwhile, rumors regarding the circumstances of Finzel's death are running rampant through the community

According to official police reports, Finzel died approximately an hour after being struck by a southbound freight train at the C&O railroad crossing between Novi and Meadowbrook roads. The accident occurred at approximately 3:25 a.m. on July 11.

Responding officers arrived at the scene to find the last two cars of the train blocking the crossing. Train employees told officers the injured employee (Finzel) was lying on the ground near the front of the train.

Police found Finzel's 1982 Ford Courier pickup truck facing in a southeast direction in the cul-de-sac on Roethel Drive, south of the Nine Mile crossing. They also found 20 empty cans of Meister Brau beer and three empty cans of Budweiser beer at the scene as well as a broken styrofoam cooler.

Officers noted in their report that it "appeared a party had taken place in

the area." Novi Police Captain Richard Faulkner declined comment on the condition of either Finzel or his friend, saying he would not know if the youths had been intoxicated until he receives official lab reports.

Finzel's unidentified friend told investigating officers that they had been playing "chicken" with the train when the accident occurred. "The train was traveling faster than we thought," he told officers.

Reports said Finzel was suffering from head injuries but was still conscious and able to talk at the scene. He was carried on a backboard down the rocky grade and through a swampy area to a waiting ambulance.

The ambulance arrived at Boltsford General Hospital in Farmington Hills at 4:12 a.m. Finzel was pronounced dead by the attending physician at 4:34 a.m., according to police reports.

A spokesperson at the Oakland County Medical Examiner's office said he died of multiple injuries.

The second youth told police he was uninjured and was driven home by officers.

The son of George and Ruth Finzel of Penton Rise Court, Finzel is survived by his parents and three sisters — Melissa Turner, Renee Zagoroli and Kristen Finzel.

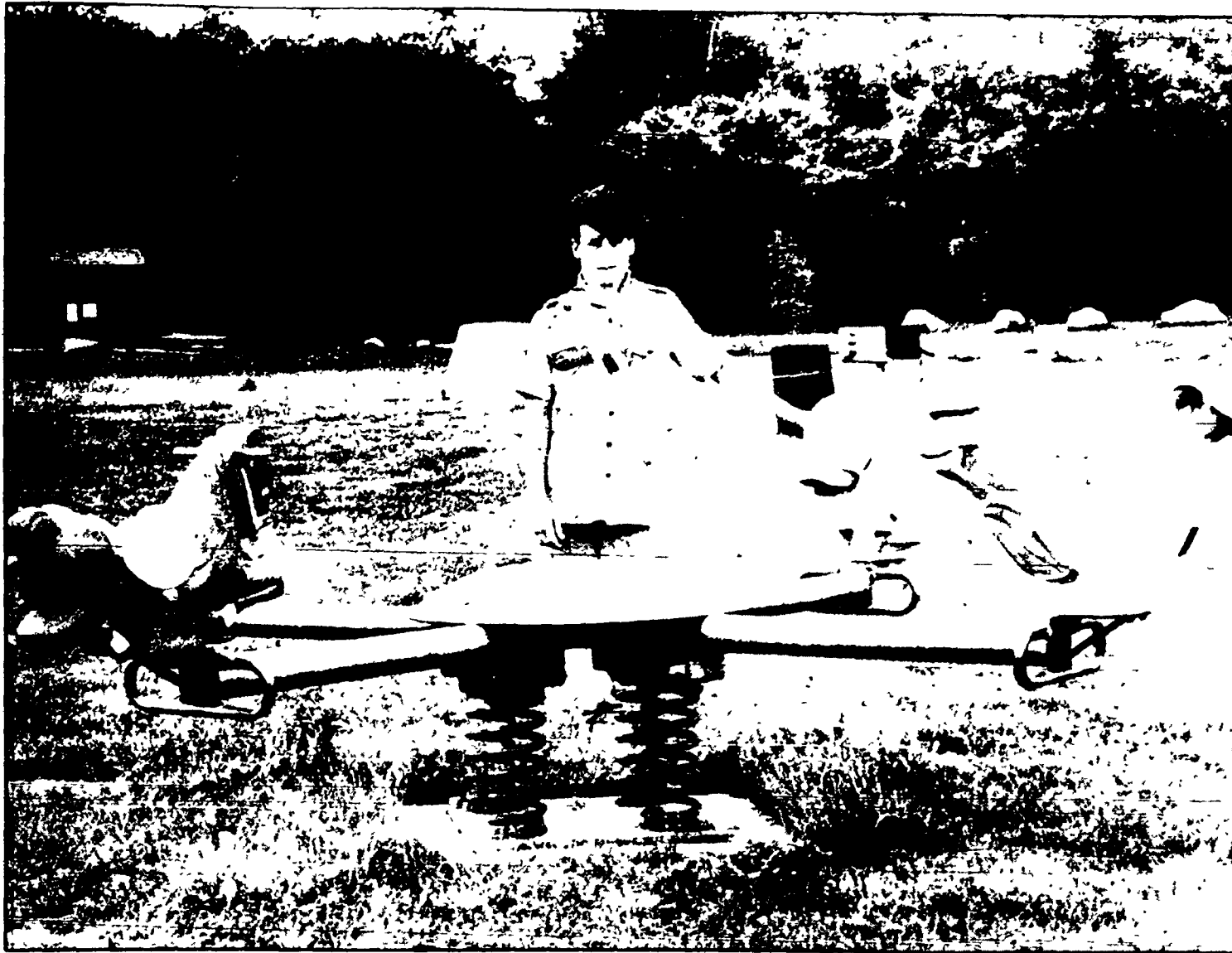

# Maybury projects earn Eagle Scout for local student

Maybury State Park is sporting several new facilities — three pieces of playground equipment and a new 3/4 mile, cross country ski trail — thanks to the efforts of new Eagle Scout Craig Larsen.

Larsen, a member of Boy Scouts of America troop 755 at the First Presbyterian Church of Northville led by Scoutmaster Jim Lapham, received the Eagle Scout honor last month. He said the award capped off years of participation in scouting which all led up to the Eagle.

Larsen, 16, spent close to 250 hours working on his project at Maybury, which was only one of the requirements to earn the award. Larsen also had to progress through the other ranks of scouting, earning at least 21 merit badges and holding leadership positions in the troop.

"Just trying to get Eagle keeps you going," Larsen said. But becoming an Eagle Scout is something less than one percent of Boy Scouts actually do.

Troop 755 has had its share of Eagles, though. Since 1931, the troop has had 51 Eagle Scouts, including Larsen's stepbrothers, Cam and Char Ramsey.

Larsen joined the scouts — troop 1534 — in 1982, when he lived in Plymouth. "My brother was in the scouts and he liked it a lot, so I thought I'd give it a try," he said.

He steadily moved through up through the different scouting grades, from Tenderfoot to Second Class, First Class, Star and Life. Along the way he has earned 24 different merit badges, in subjects as varied as landscape architecture, weather, emergency preparedness, fish and wildlife management, and sports.

He has also held many different leadership positions in the troop including quartermaster, assistant

patrol leader, patrol leader, librarian, and chaplain's aide.

But the toughest, most involved part of earning the Eagle rank is the service project, which requires at least 200 hours of work. Larsen investigated possible projects at a church and at Mill Race Village before he went to Maybury. "I remembered a couple years ago people did a project out there. I figured there was something they would need done," he said.

There was. The park supplied a list of projects which he could consider, and Larsen chose to tackle the playground equipment and the ski trail.

Beginning last October, Larsen began planning the project. His father helped out and most of the troop got involved in the actual work, all under Larsen's supervision. The state department of natural resources funded the projects.

Installing the playground equipment involved digging holes and pouring cement to hold the structures in place. The ski trail was staked out for the scouts, who then cut the 10-foot wide trail themselves.

Larsen, a member of Northville High School Class of '89, was officially presented with his Eagle Scout award June 8 at a Court of Honor.

Among those in attendance at the ceremony were his mother and stepfather, Nancy and Shelby Powers, his brothers, Michael and Brian, sister, Lori, stepbrothers, Char and Cam Ramsey, his father and stepmother, Tom and Diane Larsen.

He has received congratulatory letters or resolutions from many different dignitaries including President Ronald Reagan; U.S. Representative William Broomfield; Neil Armstrong, himself an Eagle Scout; Governor James Blanchard; state senator Robert Geake and state representative Willis Bullard, and the City of Northville.

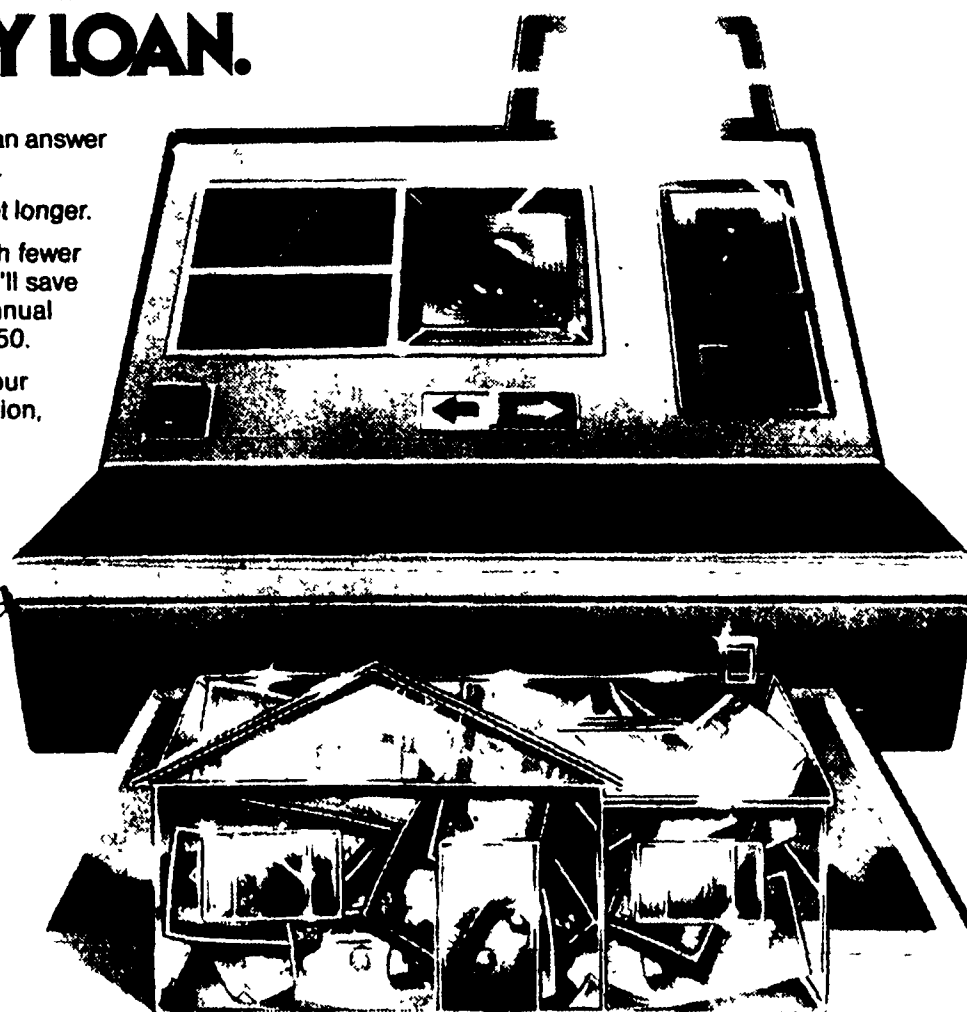

## Local officers express reactions to the killing of three Inkster police

Police officers realize it could have happened to any one of them.

This time, it was three Inkster police officers who, while routinely serving a felony bad check warrant, were fatally shot.

The repercussions from that Thursday incident, go beyond the confines of the Inkster city limits and spread to Northville, Plymouth, Van Buren and Novi.

"I don't think there is a police officer who hasn't discussed what happened," said Northville Township police chief Kenneth Hardesty. "I know our officers haven't talked about anything else today."

Three of the four people charged in the slaying were arraigned Saturday before in a Wayne County court before 35th District Court Judge James Garber.

But the link between one of the slain officers, Clay Hoover, and the Western Wayne County Special Operations Team is very strong. Cpl Gregory Laurain, the third in command of the area SOT, counted Hoover among his special friends.

"Me and Clay, we ran around together. We worked out together and we served together in the Van Buren Police Department," Laurain said. He noted that Hoover had been a part-time officer in Van Buren, but wanted to become a full-time officer and perhaps join a special operations team.

"That's why he left Van Buren. There was a full-time job open in Inkster and Clay went for it," Laurain said.

Laurain noted that it was difficult for him not to be at the Inkster motel where Hoover and two other officers met their deaths.

"I remember listening to the scanner and wondering whether our team would be called to give assistance. I knew that the FBI and the state police were there, but that's what our team was trained for, too," Laurain said.

Even though Laurain said he was saddened by Hoover's death, he said he considered the operation by the special operations teams on the site a success.

"From all the information we and the teams had, the officers were alive and well. The goal then was to make sure the incident ended without harm to the principals. The main goal of a special operations team is to defuse a situation and to preserve life. From what we hear, the officers on the scene did just that."

Laurain said that in some ways, the deaths reminded officers to be a little more aware, a little more alert. "It's a terrible way to learn, but this incident proves two things: policemen are not indestructible and any incident, no matter how routine, can quickly turn," Laurain said.

"You always have to expect the unexpected and be prepared for it. You know, if Clay were here, he'd be the first one to shrug his shoulders and go on with his duties. That's what made him a special person."

## DDA sees early ideas for new deck

Members of the Northville Downtown Development Authority got their first look at design possibilities for a new Cady Street parking deck Tuesday morning.

Although the four designs presented to the DDA are only preliminary suggestions, they had several elements in common. The DDA did not take a vote Tuesday, but requested copies of the various designs for further consideration.

City Manager Steve Walters emphasized that all of the design suggestions are only preliminary at this point. Architect Richard Rich explained that different elements of the designs were interchangeable.

In general, Rich's preliminary drawings show the deck extending from Mary Alexander Court south across Cady Street to a new, relocated Cady just north of Northville Downs. The drawings show the deck set back from Center Street to allow for some type of park and/or

retail development, as well as new retail development on the south side of Mary Alexander Court off Center. Rich said that, if something like the

drawings was eventually built, the only side from which the public would really see a "parking deck" would be the east end, which could

have a green belt in front of it. The preliminary drawings show a 2-level deck with an internal ramp and "light cores" to provide plenty of natural lighting, Rich explained. The larger size of a new deck could allow room for well over 500 cars, he said. "Almost all the schemes we're showing you could have a level added in the future," he said. "One more floor would bring you a thousand cars in a very low profile structure. And you don't have to add a whole floor." Walters said that one advantage to a relocated Cady Street would be that the Cady/Center intersection would be "moved down to the point where the sight distance is good... There are a lot of things that are interesting to think about, in terms of traffic flow especially."

The DDA members agreed to study the preliminary drawings and to continue discussions on a new deck next month.

## MDOT launches new Haggerty studies

The Michigan Department of Transportation is studying the possibility of making Haggerty Road a state trunkline.

At least, that is one of the options being considered as MDOT officials begin two separate studies to try to address congestion and the north-south freeway access in the Haggerty Road corridor, confirmed state Sen. Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills.

Faxon is a member of the Senate Transportation Appropriations Subcommittee.

"I have secured commitments for the Haggerty Road corridor and I am

confident that the department fully intends to carry out its program," Faxon said.

MDOT officials have met with the federal highway department, which would help finance improvements of the road, to discuss the state's two-pronged approach to improving the thoroughfare, said James Pitz, MDOT director.

The first study will focus on providing a connector from I-96/I-696/I-275 to Haggerty north of 12 Mile. Officials hope that will relieve congestion and provide new access to the

freeway system, Pitz wrote Faxon. A second study will help determine the best location for a new state trunkline between I-96/I-696/I-275 and M-59, Pitz added.

MDOT has formed two committees, one to deal with the technical aspects of the changes and the other with policy matters. The department will take the data and intends to begin construction on the road connector by 1989. But issues such as financing for local road improvements and the environmental effects of the planned programs

could affect the targeted construction date.

The state will not have the final say, Faxon pointed out. Once the state develops improvement plans, the federal highway department will review them.

"The state has to sell all of this," Faxon said.

If the state plans gain federal sanction, the Haggerty Road project would be financed with a 90 percent-10 percent grant, with the federal government paying the majority, Faxon said.

# Robert Fritz strives to fight blindness with weaving skill

Overcoming a handicap is no easy task. But for Robert Fritz, who became blind three years ago, it's something he had to do.

"I was angry when I couldn't do things that were easy for most people," he said. "I did a lot of sitting around and moping."

But then something clicked. He got tired of sitting around. He wanted to get out and get back into circulation again.

"Sooner or later you realize you can sit around and live a real dull life or you can do something exciting," he said. He opted for the exciting life, and that's exactly the kind of life he lives.

Fritz, a 1964 graduate of Northville High School, recently has returned home after completing three weeks of training at the Michigan Rehabilitation Center for the Blind in Kalamazoo.

At the Center, he learned how to cope with blindness and the complications he has experienced as a result. Individualized programs emphasized daily living skills such as personal care, cooking, housekeeping, communications, industrial arts and independent travel. This prepared him to live independently.

The Center also offers various training programs, of which Fritz chose weaving. With this new-found skill, he is making plans to open a weaving studio in his home on Ten Mile which will feature woven items for the home and office.

"I picked weaving because I wanted to stay in the arts," he explained. "I can be really artistic with yarn, using a variety of colors and patterns."

His artistic inclination stems from his past love — photography. Before the blindness set in, Fritz was a photographer for Powell Studios in Detroit. He did a great deal of nature work, photographing swans, flowers, trees, etc. He also photographed models. "Now that was something I really enjoyed," he said with a smile.

A photograph of Aspen trees he shot in Colorado is presented on the cover of "Using and Displaying Your Pictures" by David M. Kirkman. The same work, collectively with several flower photos, won an award from Kodak and the Professional Photographers of America.

"I hope to take pictures again — within the year," said Fritz. "All I really need to do is get a camera that focuses automatically. I can compose a picture. I just can't focus."

Fritz suffers from diabetic retinopathy and has gone through four laser treatments on each eye, two surgeries on the right eye and one surgery on the left. Through his left eye, he can make out some colors and shapes, depending on the lighting.

Neuropathy, which is the deadening of nerve endings, has also afflicted Fritz. It affects his feet, and after a kidney operation, it affected his hands also. Now, however, he has full use of his hands.

"I didn't want all this to get the best of me," said Fritz. "I wanted to be productive."

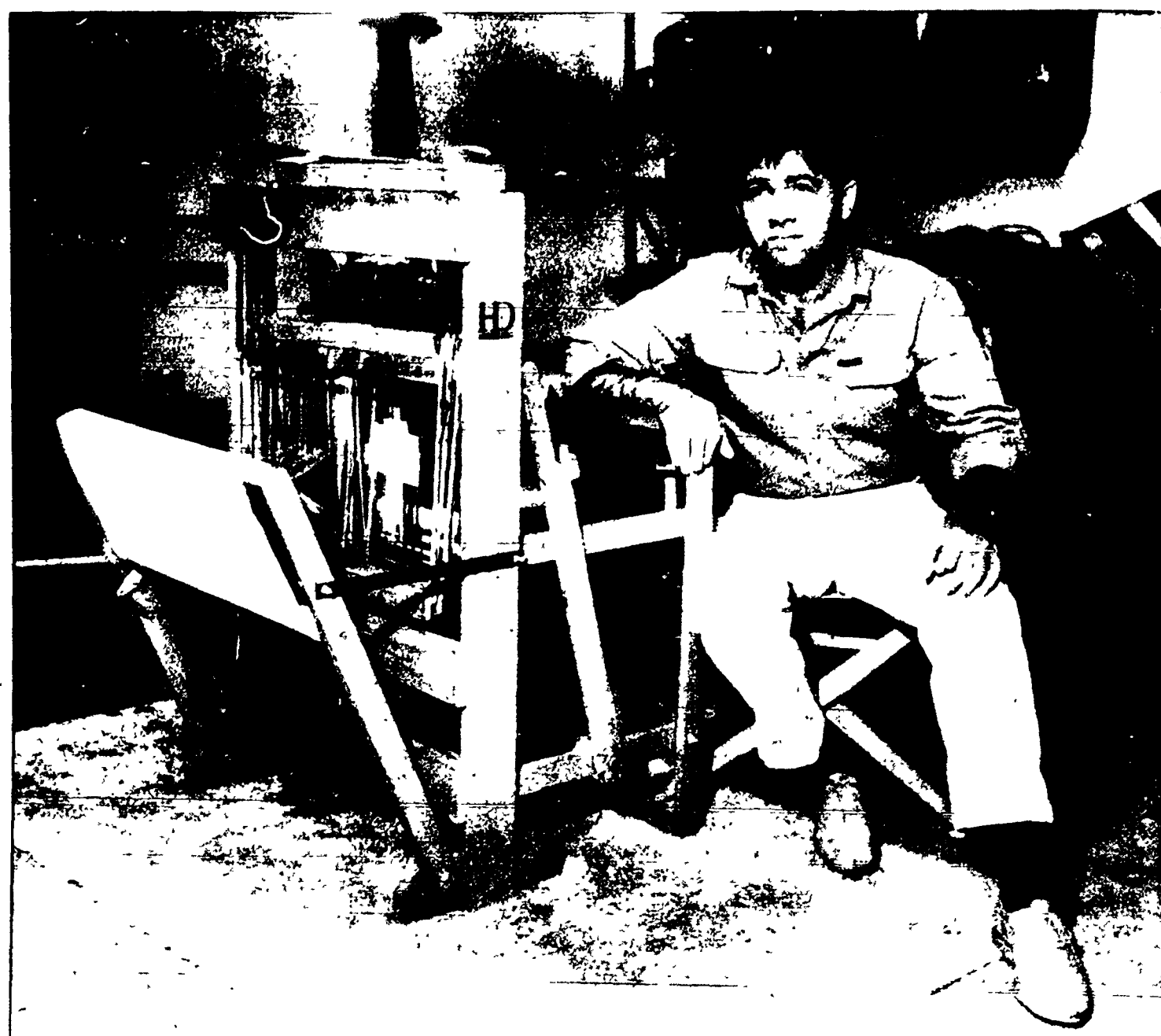
And he is. Walking at the mall and exercising on a stationary bike and a rowing machine are some of the activities that keep him going.

Fritz also busies himself by subscribing to several magazines — "Newsweek," "Money" and "National Geographic." Because he cannot read them, he receives the magazines on records, which helps him keep up on the news.

Fritz also takes out talking books. "Mostly detective mysteries," he said.

He does other "reading" too, but not just for leisure. He is taking two correspondence classes, English Braille I and Selling Techniques, through Hadley School for the Blind. He plans to take more classes and hopes to learn to speak French.

"Once my weaving business comes through, I'll be really busy with that," he said. He is currently in the

process of waiting for the Michigan Commission for the Blind through the Michigan Department of Labor to put the okay on his weaving business. "They are trying to decide whether to rent or buy a loom for me," he explained. "They are also going to purchase glasses with a permanently attached scope to use for detailed weaving work."

As he impatiently waits for the approvals to come through, he remains active in the profession. He is a member of the Michigan League of

Handweavers and has joined the Michigan Handweavers Guild.

With his weaving skills, he will produce clothing, wall hangings, placemats, rugs, shawls, scarves and blankets. "I'll probably see what I like best and then go from there," he

said. Striving to offer whatever he can to others and living a fulfilling life despite his handicap are high on Fritz's list of priorities. Through his numerous activities and weaving talent he is doing just that.

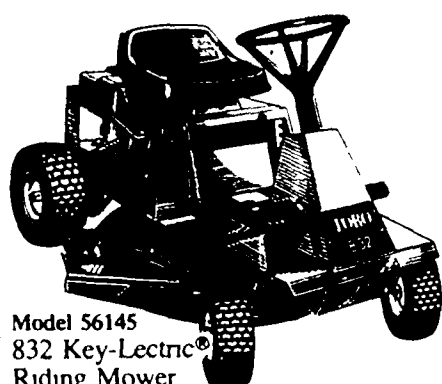

# Officials still hope for Supersewer

While much of the attention in the Northville community has focused on the Ypsilanti Community Utility Authority, state and county officials have not given up on constructing the North Huron Valley/Rouge Valley sewer system.

Only now, since the project was bypassed for federal financial assistance for the 1987 fiscal year, county officials are working to determine an equitable funding formula for the municipalities still remaining in the plan.

"Basically, not too much has happened since we brought the amended facilities plan to a public hearing in Livonia," explained Richard Hinshon, an engineer with Wade-Trim, the company designing the sewer plan.

And the Department of Natural Resources, which must review the proposal to determine whether it meets state and federal requirements, has not even begun to review the project.

Instead, explained Roy Schramack, DNR Detroit district area water quality supervisor, said the DNR has not yet begun to review the plan, since the department is concentrating on the projects which are being funded for this fiscal year.

"The rush just isn't necessary," Schramack said. "It's more important that we review the projects that are being funded and get those going."

Hinshon said that Wayne County

has made it very clear it wants the sewer project which currently includes Novi, the City of Northville, the City of Plymouth, Livonia, Westland, Wayne, Garden City, Inkster, Redford Township and portions of Van Buren Township, and Dearborn Heights, to be ready to go for the next funding year.

"The next logical step is for Wayne County to develop a funding plan and then asked the communities to sign a consent agreement for charges," Hinshon said.

Hinshon noted that there currently are "about a dozen funding plans" being put forward, but he had no idea which one or combination of plans the county might support.

It just depends on them. But so

meone is going to pay for this project, and the project is definitely going to be put to the communities," he said.

Hinshon said county officials have been meeting informally with a number of communities to try to determine which of the proposals they would support.

At the public hearing, Livonia officials indicated they were less than pleased with their financial allocation with Mayor Pro-Tem Robert McCann telling county officials he "was not masochistic enough to put this before the (Livonia city) council."

Hinshon said it was possible the county could have a funding plan in place as early as next month, but certainly by the end of the year.

## Planners consider changes to sign rules

The Northville City Planning Commission last week began a review of the city's ordinance regulating business signs, with a view to eventually recommending some changes in the ordinance to the City Council.

Before beginning the review, city Planning Consultant Ronald Nino told the commission "Everybody thinks there's a standard out there (for sign requirements). There isn't a standard. I must have 50 different ordinances in my office. Every city has its own bias."

"There are some things about your ordinance that I think need to be

thought about," he added.

The commission took no formal action on the sign ordinance, but began general discussion on Nino's suggestions. Specific points in Nino's recommendation included:

- Stricter requirements for maintenance of subdivision entrance signs.
- Stricter requirements for ground pole signs, including a reduction of the maximum size from 300 to 100 square feet reduction of maximum height from 35 to 20 feet, and possible new setback requirement.
- Reduction in the amount of area

allowed for wall signs.

- Reduction in the total sign area allowed on a site, from 500 to 300 square feet or less.
- Reduction in the allowed size of temporary signs, from 300 square feet to 32 square feet.
- A new provision to provide for eventual elimination of nonconforming signs, by requiring conformity when nonconforming signs are replaced. It would allow nonconforming signs to continue as they presently appear, providing they are maintained.

Nino explained that his recommendations are not far off what has actually happened in the city. "The sign ordinance goes back a long ways, and you don't want to create a whole lot of nonconforming uses," he said.

The members of the Planning Commission did not vote on any of the recommendations, but discussed the various points Nino made. The members of the commission generally expressed agreement with the recommendations, but asked Nino to return at a future meeting with an explanation of some of the provisions in Livonia's sign ordinance.

public course

"This defeats the entire purpose of open space in a PRUD, to leave a public golf course. It destroys the intent of the ordinance. It is short sighted, wrong and I think it's a mistake," he added

The Dun Rovin PRUD includes 688 attached single-family homes and an additional 35 detached homes. The project is modeled after Burroughs Farms, a much larger development in the Brighton area. Larry Garon, vice president of Real Estate Interests Inc., told the public

Garon said Real Estate Interests intends to include a redesigned clubhouse, tennis courts and a swimming pool in the first phase of the project's development, but did not give any indication of when the developers plan to begin work on the project

Supervisor Georgina Goss said she had serious concerns about the density of Dun Rovin, particularly when she looked at a preliminary plan. "When I look at this drawing, I see a community of garages," she said

"I have concerns about the density of the plan," echoed Trustee Richard Allen, who is the board's liaison to the planning commission. "I know that I would be more comfortable were the project to have a density of 6.0 dwelling units per acre instead of the 5.4 in this plan."

Garon said REI would be willing to make changes, within reason, but told Nowka that it was at the direction of the planning commission that the golf course remain public

"We are willing to do whatever the board requests," Garon said, noting that the developers had already revised plans at the planning commission's direction

That offer was not enough for the board, however. An early motion of fered by Allen suggested that Dun Rovin's developers return to the board which would schedule another public hearing for the project

## Company asks owners to keep dogs confined

Consumers Power Company is asking customers to help meter readers by keeping the family pet safe, secure and as far away from the meter as possible.

E. L. Doss, the utility company's Metro Region manager, said it was encouraging that only 31 dog bites occurred out of 2 million residences visited each month by meter readers in 1986.

"Our customers are to be commended for taking responsibility for keeping their pets confined on their property," he said. Doss added, however, that even one dog bite is too many from the perspective of a meter reader. A serious injury can result in hospitalization and many months of continued visits to the doctor.

So far in 1987, 15 Consumers Power Company meter readers have suffered dog bites or other dog-related injuries while making scheduled rounds.

Doss reminds utility customers they are legally responsible for their pets' actions and reimbursement to the company for the full cost of the benefits paid to an injured employee should a dog-bite incident occur. Also, an injured employee can in-

itiate a civil complaint in court against a dog owner for damages.

As a reminder to the Metro Region's 630,000 natural gas customers, the following is a list of four things that a utility customer with a dog at home can do to prevent injuries to meter readers.

□ Be aware of where your dog is whenever a utility employee is on the premises.

□ Keep your dog restrained and, if possible, away from the employee.

□ If you must leave your dog outside, make sure the dog is secure and does not prevent utility employees from gaining access to your premises.

□ No matter how "friendly" you feel your dog is, never tie the dog near a gas or electric meter.

Consumers Power Company's meter readers will provide customers upon request a brochure outlining dog-owning customer's responsibilities to utility employees.

Consumers Power Company, the principal subsidiary of CMS Energy Corporation, is Michigan's largest utility serving almost six million of the state's nine million residents in 67 of the 68 Lower Peninsula counties.

## Bullard sponsors dangerous animal bill

A court could order the destruction of an animal and its owner would be charged with involuntary manslaughter if the animal's attack causes the death of another individual under legislation introduced by State Representative Willis "Bill" Bullard Jr.

Bullard (R-Highland) represents the State House 60th District which includes the Oakland County portion of the City of Northville.

Bullard's Dangerous Animal Bill has been introduced in the State House of Representatives as an alternative to the Pit Bull Dog Bill (SB-269) sponsored by State Senator Joseph Mack (D-Ironwood).

Bullard said Mack's legislation deals with pit bull dogs, while his own bill is not breed-specific.

bulls," said Bullard. "My legislation addresses the problem of all dangerous animals, including dogs, which attack or bite a person without provocation and cause more than superficial injury."

Under the bill, a district court judge or magistrate could also order the destruction of an animal if it

make a second unprovoked attack.

After an animal attacks a person for the first time, a district court judge could order the owner to take reasonable steps to confine the animal and avoid a second attack. In addition, the court shall order the owner to have an identification number tattooed on the upper inner

right rear thigh of the animal by means of indelible or permanent ink.

The measure is designed to assist in identifying an animal which has more than one incident of unprovoked attacks.

The owner of a dangerous animal who kills a person would be guilty of involuntary manslaughter. Owners of animals which cause serious injury may be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by up to 90 days in jail and a maximum fine of \$500.

Similar penalties may be assessed upon the owner for allowing a dangerous animal to run at large.

The bill has the support of the United Kennel Club, the American Kennel Club, the National American Pit Bull Terrier Club, the Endangered Breed Association and the American Dog Owners Association.

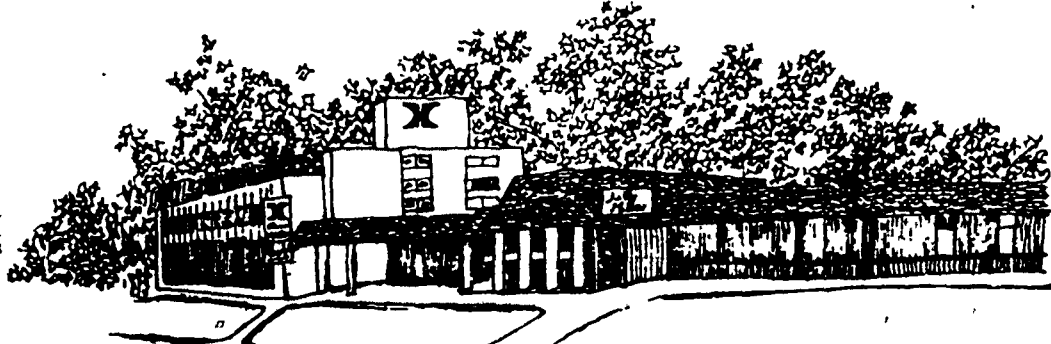

### Trustees too hasty

The Northville Township Board of Trustees had the opportunity last Thursday to listen to the residents of the township regarding two planned residential unit developments. And, surprisingly, once the townspeople had had their say, the board voted its conscience anyway.

Much of the comments from residents surrounded the PRUD earmarked for Beck Road and Seven Mile, around the Thomson gravel pit. But that PRUD, presented by Beck Road Associates, passed the board's tests unanimously.

There was virtual silence surrounding a proposal put forth by Real Estate Interests Inc. for a PRUD on Haggerty near Six Mile Road, yet that proposal squeaked past the board by one vote.

To be sure, many of the comments about Blue Heron Pointe on Beck Road were not about the plan itself, but about the inconvenience it would cause neighboring residents. Under the PRUD option, the board was obligated to hear the comments of the public, but not necessarily to take those criticisms or positive comments into consideration in making its determination.

What is distressing is that the board did not stick to its guns in acting upon the Dun Rovin proposal. An original resolution offered by Trustee Richard Allen asked that the Dun Rovin developers bring a more detailed plan for development back to a second public hearing.

Allen asked that the new plan include wider streets, less density for the development and a new plan for elevations.

However, the developer of the project begged, pleaded and implored the board not to take that action, but instead to give approval to the basic plan. In return, the developer promised, he would make the necessary changes.

The Dun Rovin developers have a history of gaining approval for their project without completing the work necessary for that approval.

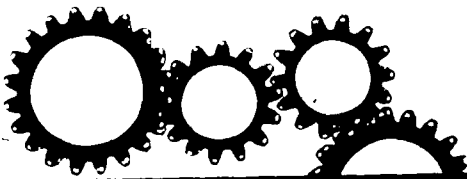
That is not to say that Real Estate Interests Inc. have not fulfilled their part of the bargain. Each time they have been given conditional approval, they have come back to the body granting that approval with all required changes in place.

## Deck is promising

City officials recently were presented with some design suggestions for a new, expanded downtown parking deck to replace the decaying and unpopular facility between Cady Street and Mary Alexander Court.

The city understandably is reluctant to "go public" with the different design options at this early stage. But judging from the preliminary plans shown to the Downtown Development Authority Tuesday morning, the city doesn't need to worry. Architect Richard Rich is clearly on the right track.

The design options all show a parking

But this time there was a difference. For one thing, the rush for approval was not needed. No construction on the project can begin until sewers are installed, and, given the current condition of the township's sewer allotment and capacity, that approval should not come anytime soon.

Another difference is that under the PRUD option, only one official public hearing, the one called by the Board of Trustees, is required. That hearing is over. The public officially remained silent on the plan. But the board was not silent.

The series of conditions imposed by the board for approval of the project are valid. It could not have been a surprise to the Dun Rovin developers the township officials wanted fewer homes than the almost 700 scheduled to be built in Dun Rovin.

Nor should it have been a surprise that streets should be built wide enough to allow emergency vehicles access to the site.

And certainly there was no surprise when the board asked for new elevations to avoid the appearance of row housing.

There is no doubt that Real Estate Interests will come back to the township planning commission with the changes in place. They have done their homework in the past and have passed every examination.

No blame can be attached to Real Estate Interests for the approval. The developers got what they wanted. But serious questioning can be put to the trustees: if the project does not satisfy your requirements or meet the needs of the residents, why not borrow a page from your own planning commission and table it until it does.

The township planners did not grant approval for expanding the Gas & Go station at Six Mile and Haggerty until the commission was satisfied the plans for the station were complete. It is not out of the question for the trustees to do the same.

deck which really doesn't "look like a parking deck," at least as far as can be told from the drawings. The deck will combine with retail space, greenery, and possibly even a restaurant to fit in well downtown. And an attractive, well-lit appearance should ensure its use.

We hope that, while the project is in the planning stage, consideration will be given to incorporating covered space for a farmers' market in the design.

Parking decks are not usually terribly exciting projects, but this one could be. We're anxious to see the final result.

Faxon introduces bill to protect car buyers

A consumer protection bill introduced by State Senator Jack Faxon (D-Farmington Hills) will fill a major gap in Michigan's consumer protection laws.  
Under present law, a person who buys a new car or a dealer-demonstrator model from a dealership has almost no protection if that car was severely damaged prior to sale. Other than to avoid bad customer relations, the dealer has virtually no incentive to inform a prospective purchaser that a car has been damaged.  
Faxon said his bill requires a new car dealer to fully inform a customer about all damage the dealer knows or should know about, if the damage amounts to \$500 or more.  
"I heard about a case where a dealer-demonstrator was hit by two police cars involved in a high-speed chase. The city's insurance company paid for the repairs, and the car was sold as new. It wasn't until the unfortunate owners confronted the dealership about the severe problems with fit, finish, rattles, missing parts, bad brakes and bent wheel rims that they admitted the source of the damage," Faxon said.  
"The owners had no relevant recourse except to swallow their pride and take the car back to the dealership whenever a new problem was discovered."  
Under the bill, if a car is being sold

as new or as a demonstrator model, the dealer must provide the customer with written notice of all repairs made to the vehicle. The notice must indicate the area of damage, cost of repair and a description of each major part repaired or replaced.  
If the dealer fails to fully inform the customer, the car can be returned for a full refund. If the customer must go to court to enforce the law, he would also be entitled to money damages or \$250, whichever is greater, plus attorney fees.  
"We require truth in advertising and truth in packaging. All we are asking for in this bill is truth in car sales for cars sold as new or as demonstrators," Faxon concluded.

Murphy argues against upping gas tax

WASHINGTON — Oakland County's chances of passing a local fuel tax would be killed if Congress raises the federal gas tax to reduce its deficit, County Executive Daniel T. Murphy told a panel in Washington recently.  
"I am proposing to the Michigan legislature that Oakland be able to impose its own gas tax," said Murphy, adding that the voter-approved tax would raise \$6.5 million for every penny per gallon.  
"Oakland County's legislation is dead," said Murphy in remarks

prepared for the House Ways and Means Committee. He pleaded with the powerful tax-writing panel not to approve a federal gas tax hike.  
Murphy said Oakland County voters would accept an increase in a gas tax, but not if it is on top of a major federal increase that isn't even used for transportation purposes.  
Speaking on behalf of the National Association of Counties, Murphy said 27 state legislatures considered raising their own fuel taxes for roads last year and 13 states allow counties to levy a local-option tax.

Although Oakland County has a little more than 10 percent of Michigan's population, it has attracted fully half the new construction and half the new jobs during the 1980s, and Murphy said it is badly in need of transportation facilities to accommodate the boom.  
He also rapped the federal government for a "situation where \$14 million sits in the highway and mass transit trust funds — unspent — while needs of our roads, bridges and transit systems go unmet."  
He outlined four arguments

against a federal fuel tax increase for non-transportation purposes:  
□ "It would undermine the concept of a user-based fee trust fund."  
□ "It would threaten a traditional source of revenue for state and local governments."  
□ "It would also hit low income and working class families the hardest."  
□ "It would unfairly burden the citizens of our western counties who must travel greater distances for work, business and basic services."

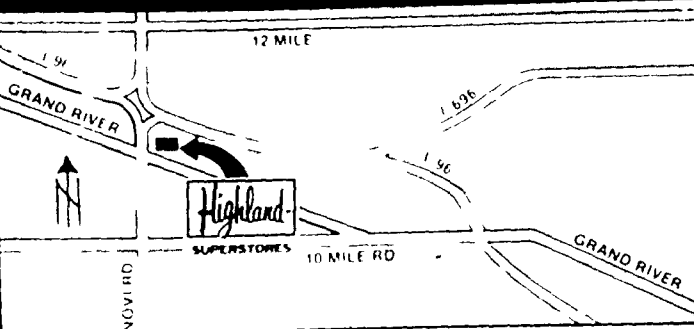

## Highland company helps handicapped obtain jobs

For persons who are mentally or physically impaired, the working world can be especially challenging.

Many routine tasks, like mowing a lawn or doing the dishes, are not to be taken too lightly for those who are less fortunate. The problems they confront are many and include a society which often shuns them for being different.

Freedom Work Opportunities in Highland Township offers mentally impaired adults — who in the program range between the ages of 16 and 70 — the chance for employment in the community.

Approximately 70 trainees are included in the non-profit program subsidized by the Michigan Department of Mental Health and the Macomb Oakland Regional Center. The program has been in existence about four years and is continually monitored.

"Our goal is to teach them and let them become productive workers," emphasized Harry Weeks, director of Freedom Work Opportunities.

"Many of the persons in the program do real well in their jobs. For the most part, they are dependable and well appreciated."

Weeks has a special interest in mentally impaired individuals. His 22-year-old son, Steve, is mentally impaired and a trainee in the program. Steve works at Elias Brothers Big Boy Restaurant in Milford bussing tables.

"There's a real ambition about them," said Big Boy manager Jim Goike, referring to the handicapped workers the restaurant has often employed throughout the past 11 years.

"They do the best they can because it means more to them than an average job. It's a unique feeling to see them grow," Goike added.

Freedom Work Opportunities specializes in lawn service, snow removal and janitorial service in surrounding communities. The persons who serve as trainees in the program earn wages for their work and are referred to Weeks by social workers.

Weeks said Freedom Work Opportunities also has trainees stationed at the Milford Baking Co. and Klancy's Restaurant in Milford. In addition, the program recently branched out to begin doing some assembly work for Spiral Industries out of Milford.

Upon starting a job at a business establishment, members of Freedom Work Opportunities are assigned a job coach, who helps train them for their new position. A staff of 19 assists Weeks in executing the program and working with the trainees.

"Everything we do is on positive reinforcement. If they have an interest in a certain field we can teach them," Weeks explained.

But there is still more to the program. Located off Milford Road about two miles north of M-59, Freedom Work Opportunities makes durable furniture which is used in group homes. The trainees in the program help make the furniture under close supervision.

A former heavy equipment operator for 20 years, Weeks has had a long affiliation with the Michigan Special Olympics. When the recession hit Michigan a few years back, Weeks began doing lawn work in the area. He subsequently hired a few mentally impaired workers, which eventually led to the formation of Freedom Work Opportunities.

"We strive to be success oriented. We make sure the workers start at a small task and are successful at it before going on to a larger task," explained Weeks.

His wife, Beverly, works with him on the job and last year was voted "Volunteer of the Year" for the Oakland County Special Olympics.

"This is our life now. This has been another world for us. I'm even doing public speaking now," Weeks chuckled.

Weeks works closely with the handicapped workers, which is the major reason he does not want the program to grow too much beyond its current level. When he walks through the shop area, the workers can be seen giving him friendly smiles and handshakes.

"The wife and I were talking about this recently. We want to keep it this size to keep it personal. If we were to get too much larger, I'm afraid we'd lose that personal contact."

"We would like to do a lot of good for a few rather than a little good for a lot," Weeks said.

Weeks emphasized that it is important to treat workers the same as he would treat anyone else. He thinks the program is a winner for a number of reasons.

"This program instills a lot of pride in them. It teaches them to be successful. If they can make money, it's a good package."

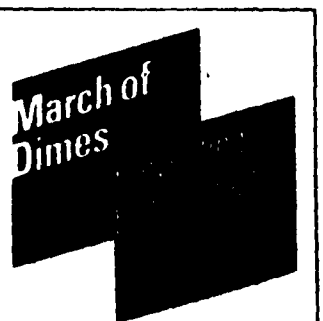

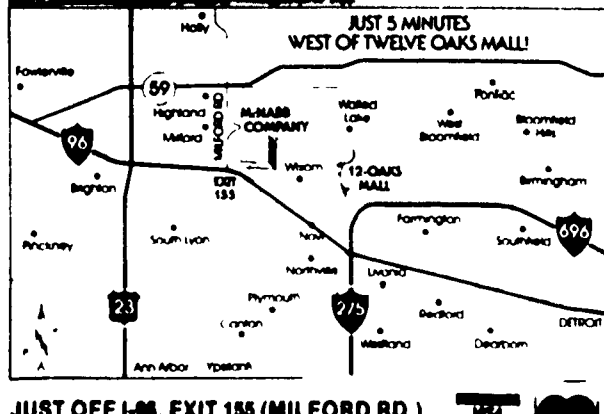

# Organization key to good recordkeeping

Suppose, for some reason, you needed to know how much you paid to have your kitchen remodeled. Are you the type of person who could walk to the right closet, open the box marked "1984" and pull the contract out of the envelope marked "Home Improvements?"

Or would you find yourself first rummaging through the unmarked files in your desk, then checking the box where you stuff paid bills before finally remembering that you were using the contract as a bookmark in that murder mystery you never finished?

Keeping good records doesn't have to be time consuming, and you don't have to save every check you ever wrote "just in case." The Michigan Association of CPAs says the key to efficient recordkeeping is knowing what to keep, where to keep it and for how long. The following is a summary of some of the important areas of recordkeeping.

□ **Family Personal Records:** Including birth certificates, marriage certificates, divorce papers and separation agreements, citizenship or naturalization papers, passports, social security cards and military service records. These items should be kept indefinitely.

□ **Insurance Policies:** Including life, disability, mortgage, automobile, homeowners or tenant insurance policies. It's a good idea to hold on to policies for a few years after they are cancelled in case you have to prove your coverage in the event a delayed claim is filed against you.

□ **Tax Records:** Not only the tax returns themselves, but supporting

documents must also be retained. Under normal circumstances, the Internal Revenue Service can go back three years for auditing purposes. But the IRS has six years to challenge a return if they have reason to believe a taxpayer has failed to report more than 25 percent of the income stated on the return. CPAs advise you to keep for six years, all documents that support tax deductions or are related to your tax return, including cancelled checks.

□ **Investment and Bank Records:** Including stock and bond certificates, buy and sell orders, statements, cancelled checks and the like. Again, any of these items that support income, expenses or deductions on your income tax return should be retained for six years to be on the safe side. Other bank statements and cancelled checks should be kept for a year or until you're sure that you won't need them to prove you've paid a bill.

□ **Record of Debts:** Including first and second mortgages, equity, personal and auto loan agreements. Keep a record of paid-off loans for a number of years as proof of payment.

□ **Property Record:** Including deeds, title papers and surveys. Property records should be kept indefinitely. You should keep a copy of the title of ownership for your car, boat or other property for six years after you sell it.

□ **Home Improvements:** Keep

records, receipts or contracts for the cost of all home improvements. These costs increase your home's cost basis and can reduce the capital gains tax when you sell.

□ **Employee Benefits and Retirement Plans:** Booklets explaining medical coverage and other benefits and records on pension and profit-sharing plans should be kept as long as you have benefits due.

□ **Family Health Records:** Includes immunization information, dates and details of operations and hospitalizations. This information should be kept indefinitely, and your children's records should be given to them when they are grown.

□ **Will:** You should have your lawyer keep the original of your will, while you keep a copy at home. Clearly indicate on the copy where the original may be found. If you should make a new will, be sure the old one and all copies are destroyed.

By now you're probably wondering just where you're going to put all these papers. Papers that are very valuable or difficult to replace, such as birth and marriage certificates, property deeds and titles and stock and bond certificates belong in a safe deposit box.

A safe deposit box is, without question, the most secure place to keep important papers and small valuables. Most banks rent safe deposit boxes on an annual basis and

if used to store income-producing property, such as bonds or stock certificates, the rental fees may provide you with a tax deduction. It's a good idea to make a list of the contents of your box and keep it at home along with copies of the documents in your box.

In many states, a safe deposit box is sealed upon the death of the owner. If this is the case, don't put your will or life insurance policy in your safe deposit box. To check on the law in your state, ask your banker or attorney.

If, for some reason, you cannot rent a safe deposit box, a fireproof strongbox is probably the next best thing. Be sure to purchase a box that is fire resistant.

The papers you keep at home can be divided between current records and inactive records. A filing cabinet, inexpensive cardboard file box or accordion file would work fine as a storage vehicle for current documents. This is the place you should keep recently paid bills, bank statements, insurance policies, credit card information and the like.

An inactive file can hold older papers, such as old insurance policies, back tax returns and cancelled bank books that are seldom referred to. You can label this box with its contents and store it away on a shelf somewhere.

# Bright outlook ahead for Michigan tourism

Tourism in Southeast Michigan is alive and very, very well.

A survey of 65 businesses and organizations involved in the tourism industry shows an overwhelming optimism which translates into more jobs and a variety of expansions and improvements.

A total of 54 percent of those polled have added personnel, and more than 76 percent are making substantial improvements, expansions or repairs for the coming season.

More than 86 percent expect an excellent tourist season with estimates of growth varying from two to more than 50 percent.

Sid Baker, president of the Travel & Tourism Association of Southeast Michigan, says the survey is graphic proof of the increasing economic benefits tourism brings to the region.

"Both directly and indirectly," he said, "tourism brings new money and jobs into a region. This is continuing demonstration of the necessity to strengthen and support efforts to

successfully promote this important industry."

The statistics are even more emphatic when restricted only to those organizations classified as attractions (as opposed to accommodations, dining, shopping, tours, etc.).

Sixty-eight percent of responding attractions said they were hiring additional personnel for the 1987 season and 86 percent are making major renovations or expansions this year. In addition, 71 percent said they were adding additional special events and 89 percent said they were working with others in their community to promote tourism.

Baker pointed out that community fairs and festivals are very popular and definitely help local economies, as do special events at the area attractions.

"Every indicator in our survey points to unguarded optimism in the tourism sector," said Baker. "Our association is pleased to be a part of this exciting growth industry."
