Cave-in traps two workers

Two workmen escaped serious injury Monday when an eight-foot bank of land collapsed while the pair attempted to attach a sewer line to the condominiums under construction on Griswold in Northville Township.

Jerome Czuj of Brighton was buried to his waist for about 15 minutes and Lowry Farino of Romulus was temporarily buried to his knees when the bank fell into the pit where the two were working.

Firefighters from the City of '

Northville and Northville Township worked along with construction workers at the scene to extricate Czuj Their efforts were hampered by other loose earth and the fear that additional land would collapse on the workers.

Faring was able to pull himself out almost immediately and began digging in an effort to free

"This is the edge of a gravel pit, and the land isn't very stable," explained Bob Hall of Gordon B Hall & Sons, the builder of the nine condominiums on the site.

Hall said that the cave-in was the first on the site and that all safety precautions were taken to prevent the event.

"We had a man watching the bank while the workers were digging," Hall said.

Czuj and Farino walked to M-Care Health Center. Kate Maddox confirmed that the two men were at M-Care, but said the facility could not give out any information regarding treatment or their condition

Truth in taxation appeal could net higher income

The Northville Township Board of Trustees will establish the township's millage rate during a special meeting at 7 30 pm tonight at township hall

The meeting is necessary because the township's SEV, or state equalized valuation, rose at a higher rate than did the consumer price index and, in order to achieve any benefits from the increased SEV, the hearing must be held before the higher rate can be charged

"The key point of the Truth in Taxation (law) is that absolutely no increase in property taxes can occur from one year to the next without an increase in millage regardless of any increase in SEV," explained Jim Graham, the township's financial

analyst, during a public hearing on truth in taxation Sept 10

Without the public hearing and the expected board approval, the township would actually receive fewer funds from taxes than it did

However, even if the trustees approve the additional funds and set the millage rate at the voter-approved 3.7 mills, the township will only be able to maintain its present level of services

Graham chose an actual parcel of Northville Township property to point out the effects of the Headlee Amendment and the Truth in Taxation on the township land

In his example, the 1982 SEV for the property resulted in a \$2,972 tax

bill of which \$229 went to the township and \$2,744 went to other tax ing units

In 1986, the same parcel's SEV was \$55,570 and tahe total tax bill was \$3.174 The township, however. received \$224 of that money, while the other taxing units including the public schools, Wayne County Schoolcraft College, the in termediatre school district and the special education tax, and the Huron Clinton Metropolitan Authority, received \$2,915

"What happened was that in 1986 the township received just 77 percent of the total tax bill, a \$5 decrease," Graham noted "In 1982. 8 3 percent of the total tax bill went to the township

Recreation makes bid for land

Officials representing the Northville Recreation Department last week asked the Department of Natural Resources to approve a \$120,000 grant from its land trust division to purchase Lapham Field

The land, which Charles and James Lapham have been renting to the recreation department at an annual fee of \$5, has been the site of numerous soccer games over the years However, John Anderson, recreation director, said it has been the aim of the department to purchase the fields

'There isn't a person who has participated in recreation who is unaware of the desperate need the department has for land of its own," Anderson said. "We (the recreation department) have been relying on the generosity of the community for Lapham Field, for Ford Field and for the county-owned land

Anderson said the department is seeking to purchase 27 5 acres of the Lapham property, located on Six Mile Road west of Beck Road.

Were the recreation department's

request granted, the local department still would have to come up with \$40,000 to meet the anticipated purchase price of the property, approximately \$160,000, Anderson said

Northville was not the only com munity making the request for state funds. The land trust fund board listened to nearly 100 proposals for \$87 million worth of projects The board has only \$14 million to distribute, Anderson said

Mary Beth Moss, Northville Township's community development assistant, said she thought the presentation by the local group went pretty well We were scheduled to make our presentation at 4 p m, and the commission had been hearing five-minute presentations all day They asked some pretty good questions," she said

Anderson said the request for land trust funds is not the only option open to the department, and that it intends to pursue other options while the land

trust group is deliberating. 'We intend to ask Wayne County for the (Plymouth) training center land (west of Sheldon Road) and we will be asking the city for Ford Field

if the Ford Motor Co ceases operations in Northville (see related story)," he said

Despite the optimism he expressed over the potential grant, Anderson said there are still two hurdles which must be met an agreement with the Laphams to sell the property and getting the matching funds from the community should the grant be ap-"We have had some discussions

with Mr Lapham, and he has shown that he is a friend to recreation, so I don't think there will be a problem with him selling the land," Anderson Charles Lapham agreed that he

had had informal discussions with Anderson and with some recreation commissioners, but that he was not ready to commit to selling the land

"I really don't want to tie up the land with an option, especially since the recreation department has no money with which to make an offer.' Lapham said.

up with the money and to make an of-

Police bust four in car theft try

Two adult males are in Northville Township police custody today and two juveniles have been released to the custody of their parents after all four were arrested Sept. 15.

The four, and three other people who were able to escape apprehension by officers from the township, the City of Northville, the City of Novi, the City of Farmington Hills, the Wayne County Sheriff's Department and K-9 units from the Michigan State Police and the Oakland County Sheriff's Department, were apprehended following a complaint to the township police department of a group of people atPark Place of Northville early Tuesday morning.

All seven suspects fled on foot, but officers were able to apprehend the four, who were transported to the township jail. Also discovered at the scene were

three cars which had been reported stolen from the City of Northville and from the Southfield/Lathrup Village

Township police have impounded two late-model General Motors vehicles and a Jeep Cherokee. .

Det. Michael Panagiotides, who is heading the police investigation, said Wednesday the department is attempting to ascertain the identity of they were apprehended, they were carrying no identification.

Panagiotides said he expects to present facts pertaining to the case to the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office and anticipate that appropriate charges will be filed.

He would not comment on what charges the department would request, nor would he speculate as to whether the individuals in custody had actually been involved in the thefts of the three impounded vehicles.

Panagiotides did say that none of the suspects is from the Northville/Novi area

Ford plans to keep Northville plant running through 1988

Although the contract between the Ford Motor Co and its UAW employees has been extended on a day-to-day basis, the life of the Ford plant in Northville has apparently been extended longer than that

Plant Manager William Sherrick said Friday he expects the plant to be in operation through 1988 His comment dispelled earlier rumors that the plant was shutting down its fuel tank construction and would close by the end of the year

"It would take them (the Ford Motor Co) 18 to 24 months to shut down this plant, and they have not given us any indication that they in tend to do that," Sherrick said

Currently there are 43 hourly and three salaried employees working in Northville and the plant produces 50,000 fuel tanks each month 'We have a tank coming off the

line every 11 seconds," Sherrick said The plant, which is one of Henry Ford I's original village industry plants constructed in 1919 and the only water wheel facility still functioning, originally made valves.

When Ford opted to outsource its valve-making operation in 1980, the plant shut down and the work force was reduced in 1982, the plant reopened with a new function, making metal fuel tanks

However, Ford has been using plastic fuel tanks in many of its latemodel vehicles and the plastic tanks, coupled with a further reduction in the work force, fueled speculation that the Ford plant might close for

Mayor Paul Vernon, in his annual state of the city address to the City Council last December, said he expected that plant would close, 'possibly at the end of the year '

Sherrick said it was his understan ding there had been some discussions between Ford Land Development Co and the city regarding a possible zoning change for the plant

'It was my understanding there had been some discussions, but the city was not interested in rezoning." Sherrick said

However, City Manager Steve Walters said he had had no recent discussions with anyone from the company.

House number rules introduced

Homeowners in the City of Northville may soon be required to use numerals - as opposed to script words - for identifying the addresses of buildings

The Northville City Council formally introduced an ordinance last week which would require easily iden tifiable numerals on all developed property in the city. The council will consider adopting the ordinance at its next meeting, Monday, Sept 21

An early version of the ordinance came before the council a few weeks ago for consideration, but was not formally introduced at that time. The proposed ordinance is based on a Northville Township ordinance

The new requirements are propos-

ed for easier identification of buildings by police officers, fire fighters, medical professionals, or others working for the public health and welfare

The ordinance, if adopted, would require three-inch or larger numerals, of a contrasting color. which are visible from the center of the road by a person traveling in either direction. If the building is not visible from the road, the number would have to be posted somewhere else that meets the requirements

All new buildings would be required to comply with the ordinance. and existing buildings would have to comply within 60 days of the date the requirements go into effect

identify the "owner, occupant lessee, or other person in control of any developed property" as responsi ble for meeting the requirements

The proposal would establish penalties of up to \$100 plus costs or up to 90 days in fail, or both, with each 10 days of noncompliance being a separate offense However, anyone cited for violation could escape any penalty if the Police Department or Building Department certifies that the person responsible has met the requirements

The City Council will be scheduled to consider adopting the ordinance Monday after a public hearing to listen to any opinions on the proposed





Seven Mile closes at tracks next week


Drivers who use Seven Mile Road just east of Northville Road will have to find an alternate route beginning



It all boils down to which the Water Resources Commission feels is more important, the people or the fish '

Northville rents buses for OLV to visit pope

The Northville Toyogship Board of Education has agreed to rent nine school buses to Our Lady of Victory to transport its members to the Pontiac Silverdome for the pope's visit

The church will be charged the full rate for bus rental, which includes mileage at 70 cents per mile per bus driver wages and pro-rated fringe benefits at \$16 per bus and mechanics wages at between \$10 and \$20 per bus

Burton Knighton, assistant superintendent for administrative services, said he estimated the cost to Our Lady of Victory to be between \$220 and \$260 per bus

The school board was asked to provide the buses by the church last spr ing. Knighton said, however the in itial contact was an informal one

"In the Spring of this year, the school district was approached by a representative from Our Lady of Vic tory parish requesting school bus transportation for a Sept 19 visit to the Detroit area by Pope John Paul At that time, I explained to him that we were not able to lease buses to organziations outside of the Northville Recreation Department and suggested that arrangements be made with John Anderson (director) of that department," Knighton wrote in a memo to the board

He said he assumed that the matter had been taken care of, and the church had made arrangements with the Recreation Department

Anderson said he had been contacted by a gentleman supposedly on a committee for the pope enquir ing about buses

I told him that if we were running a trip we would get buses from the school district. The last time I saw the man was at the August township board meeting " Anderson said

He added that there was never a formal request made of the recrea tion department to supply buses

Knighton said the school district received a call from Our Lady of Victory on Sept 1 wanting to know if everything had been arranged, and, kington said it was then that the church and the school district discovered that arrangments had not been completed and the church had no buses

In the meantime, Knighton pointed out the school district found out that the Attorney General's office had ruled that school districts could provide transportation for the papal visit, since the pope was a head of state and the visit was a historical event

"The local parish and/or the Archdiocese of Detroit will have to provide insurance coverage and hold harmless the Northvlle Public Schools from any lawsuits or damages resulting from the church's use of the buses," Knighton said

He added that the contract with the church would stipulate that all costs of providing the transportation would be borne by the church

Even though the idea generates laughs among many local officials, the Wayne County Association of Township Supervisors may ask state legislators to draft a bill which would split Wayne County into two separate

The idea surfaced at a recent association meeting Canton super visor James Poole, association secretary said he was directed to , , 'explore the possibilities' of break ing away
"I think that the idea for a separate

county is nothing more than an expression of the lack of cooperation some of the supervisors say they get from Wayne County " said County Commissioner Susan J Heintz R Northville Township, who was the township supervisor prior to being elected county commissioner

'I don't want to say it's necessarily political, but out here there are different politics (Northville and Plymouth township routinely vote Republican while Wayne County is classified as a Democratic stronghold) We also have some different concerns," said Georgina Northville Township super VISOR

Plymouth Township Supervisor Maurice Breen said the proposal has no chance of passing "It's a statement," he added "It's an expression of total frustration with the system We are serious to the point of asking gislators to get this before the egislature so that they know how we Seel about it

"It's an act of desperation " The township association directed Poole to review a possible split and eport back to the group. In addition To Northville Township, the associaon includes the townships of Plymouth, Redford, Canton, Sumpier, Van Buren, Huron, Grosse Ile

"The City of Detroit has a different approach to the solution of the problem than we see justified," Breen

This isn't the first time communities talked about seceding from Wayne County

Tom Brown, who was the state representative for Westland, Wayne. Canton Township and part of Plymouth Township from 1970-82, wrote a bill on the same subject in the late 1970s. It was to be a county of suburbia - all of western Wayne County outside the boundaries of Detroit

"I thought that very definitely there wasn't enough attention to the out-county communities," Brown said last week "And even in Lansing, the consideration for funds were overshadowed by Detroit

"I also had a problem because when you said Wayne County and you said Detroit, legislators considered them synonymous If they spent money on Detroit, that was Wayne

There were a "couple of public hearings" held on the issue, but "there were other issues that needed more attention" The bill was set aside and forgotten

Our Opinions Chicken or egg?

Which comes first, the chicken or the egg? It appears that as far as the Northville Recreation Department is concerned, they arrived at the same

The department has asked the Department of Natural Resources Land Trust Fund for a \$120,000 grant to purchase the land on Six Mile Road known as Lapham Field And there is no problem with that request For too long the recreation department has had to rely on the generosity of others for its athletic fields, and children have played under knowledge that at any time the land could be taken away

But some specifics of the grant request raise serious questions that need to be addressed in case the funding is approved. most notably whether the \$120,000 is enough to purchase the land and whether the community will be willing to reach into its own pockets for the matching \$40,000 which would be

Charles Lapham, speaking for himself and his brother, James, has said that he will consider the recreation department's request, but admits he has no idea how much the more than 27 acres are worth on the open market. He has said that he is unwilling to set a price until the land is appraised and he would not accept an option on the property until the department indicated it had some money.

While Lapham's sentiments are valid, the recreation department would appear awfully foolish should it receive its grant and then discover that Lapham's land is worth more than is in the coffers

And perhaps the department is counting its chickens before they hatch

in counting upon the city and the township to pay the rest of the money for the land

Certainly the community has shown its interest in recreation by supporting programs, but the township has informally discussed the possibility of a millage increase to meet its anticipated needs for fiscal 1988 An additional increase, even for a worthy cause, may be a bit too much

While it is commendable that the recreation department has put forth the effort for a state grant, it would have been a better effort had the department been able to provide the township and the city with facts and figures before it approached the state.

The application deadline for this year's Land Trust allocations may have precluded a thorough investigation and presentation. But rather than waiting for the directors of the fund to make a decision, the recreation commissioners would be well advised to perform as much as the background work as possible

That way, should the funding be approved, the recreation department will be ready to move on the land acquisition And even if the request is turned down, the department will be one step up on the competition for next

Questions, answers

For years, administrators, elected—agreed on the idea of a committee, but officials, and citizens have been asking questions about the Northville Public Library. Is it large enough? The community certainly needs expanded library facilities; that much might be a foregone conclusion to the committee members. But the answers to the other questions will require a lot of research, thought, and discussion. With a little luck, Northville might finally be close to achieving more adequate library facilities. We wish the committee well.

Is green worth it?

house this morning and went in search of the source Across the street there was a large truck with a hose attached A man wearing a mask over his face was spraying chemicals on the lawns The chemicals really stunk, but then so did the exhaust from the truck, so I did the logical thing $-\operatorname{I}$ closed my door and went back to reading the paper.

Then, what usually happens when I sit down and get comfortable and open the newspaper, happened. The dog wanted out She has that inbred instinct all dogs have that enables them to disturb you just at the point when you're most comfortable It's one of the most endearing parts about owning a pet

So I got up, put on my shoes and prepared to let the dog out. But then I remembered The grass around my house had been sprayed a few weeks earlier and the company responsible had seen to it that we were warned The notice said something innocuous like — keep all pets and children off the grass for a few days until the chemical has a chance to get deeper into the ground. For a good three days after the lawn was sprayed I could smell the chemicals whenever I walked on the grass I made sure that I carried Lizzie (my dog) to safe turf for the first two days, but on the third day the door opened and out bounced return to the wild I don't agree that grass

I smelled something foul outside the the dog so I gave up I figured the worst of the toxic had dissipated

> That was the first time I paid attention to the spraying issue I guess I was more alert that time because my dog had been pretty sick immediately prior to the spraying and the vet said it could have been some sort of toxic in her system. The vet had mentioned grass spraying and I had called the company for a list of the ingredients. The company was more than nice They supplied the ingredients and said that really, the stuff was safe unless ingested in large quantities over years They issued warnings because it is a chemical and could potentially cause some side effects immediately after it is sprayed When I read the ingredients to the vet, she agreed It wasn't the cause of Lizzie's illness

Despite that reassurance, I don't like the spraying I understand that in the quest for perfect lawns, chemical fertilizers are probably the highest form of the art I just think we've added yet another toxic to our environment and this one was added for a pretty shabby reason - to make your lawn greener

Beautiful carpet-like lawns surrounding plush suburban homes are the stuff dreams are made of, I know I'm not advocating a

should be allowed to grow, to flower and to burn at will - but isn't there some other way we can compromise on this? I know that if you have a neighbor with crummy grass and if you work hard on your own lawn it can be irritating to see the other guy's dandelions blowing across your carefully cultivated green - but after all it's just grass

Somewhere along the line we've lost our perspective I was talking to a man who lives on Walled Lake He said he knows people who own lakefront lots who have their lawns sprayed to encourage grass growth The spray, naturally, runs off into the lake, like everything else. These people then get all upset over the amount of weeds that grow in the lake and want to spray weed-killer in the lake to stop the growth encouraged by the

In the east when summer is at its hottest they often face a water shortage People are asked not to water their lawns. The year I lived in the east a lot of people cheated because they couldn't stand to have a brown lawn

As I walked the dog this morning I thought about it. There are a lot of ways we've polluted the world and much of it was done with the betterment of life in mind. But greener lawns? Somehow the end just doesn't justify the means.

'IRAs still hold investment advantages'

read over the past few months, the Individual Retirement Account (IRA) is not dead. A bit weaker, perhaps, but alive nonetheless ac cording to the Michigan Association orCPAs

Last year Congress took a giant step in an attempt to return the IRA to its original purpose - to provide a personal retirement income fund for lower to middle income Americans who often were not covered by pen sion plans at work. As a result, the Tax Reform Act of 1986 imposed new restrictio's on who is eligible to deduct IRA contributions and just how much may be deducted

But don't despair Even if you don't qualify for a deduction (and many people still do), you can still con tribute up to \$2,000 to an IRA and earn tax-deferred income Interest, dividends and capital gains continue to compound tax-free in an IRA until you begin to withdraw from your account You can use an IRA's tax ad vantage to the fullest by investing your entire deposit at the beginning of the year And, of course, the longer you contribute to an Individual Retirement Account, the greater the advantage of tax-sheltered earnings But keep in mind that the original value of the deduction and the value of the tax-deferred growth will become less valuable as lower tax rates are _hrased-in

With all the talk about the demise of the Individual Retirement Account, it's easy to lose sight of the fact that the deductibility of the IRA contribution is only one of the two important tax benefits an IRA offers Even under tax reform, many experts feel the IRA remains a good long-term investment

Money Management

you still qualify for an IRA deduction and how much you can deduct. The first "test" is whether you or your spouse is covered by a retirement plan at work and the second factor is your adjusted gross income If neither you nor your spouse is con sidered an active participant in a retirement plan at work for any part of the taxable year, the rules remain the same You can continue to con tribute and deduct up to the lesser of \$2,000 a year or 100 percent of com pensation (\$2,500 for a spousal IRA and \$4,000 if each spouse earns at least \$2,000 and makes the maximum \$2 000 contribution)

If you or your spouse is covered by a retirement plan, you may still contribute to an IRA, but the amount of your contribution that you may deduct depends on your adjusted gross income If you are single and your adjusted gross income is \$25,000 or less, you may continue to deduct up to the lesser of \$2,000 or 100 percent of compensation for an IRA, even if you are covered by a pension

Likewise, if you are married and your joint adjusted gross income is \$40,000 or less, you can continue to deduct up to \$4,000, if you both work and each earns at least \$2,000 Incidentally, your adjusted gross income must be figured before subtracting an IRA deposit

There is no deduction allowed for an IRA contribution if you are covered by a company plan and have an adjusted gross income of \$35,000

if married and filing jointly. This limit applies even if only one spouse is covered by a pension plan

Single taxpayers with adjusted gross incomes between \$25,000 and \$35,000 and married couples with adjusted gross incomes between \$40,000 and \$50,000, may partially deduct IRA contributions. The rule is that for every \$1,000 in income over the ceilings of \$25,000 or \$40,000 you lose \$200 in deductions. So if you're single and have an adjusted gross income of \$30,000 and make a \$2,000 IRA con tribution, \$1,000 worth of your IRA contribution may not be deducted

For those who cannot take the deduction, an IRA contribution may still make sense because of its potential for tax-deferred growth Active participants in employer-sponsored plans, who are not eligible to make deductible contributions, may make non-deductible contributions to an IRA The maximum allowable contribution to an IRA is the same for both non-deductible and deductible contributions Although you miss out on the deduction, you can still enjoy the benefit of tax-deferred earnings

Most of the old rules governing IRA withdrawals remain intact. Because IRA tax breaks are designed to encourage you to save for retirement. unless you are permanently disabled. any withdrawal of IRA money before age 591/2 is subject to a 10 percent penalty tax addition to the tax due As was previously the case, you must begin making withdrawals from you IRA no later that April 1 of the year

following the year in which you reach

If you suspect that the change in the rules for putting money into an IRA might affect the rules for taking it out, you're exactly right. The Tax Reform Act of 1986 complicates the way your IRA savings are taxed when you withdraw your money Before, all withdrawals from an IRA were taxed as ordinary income Clean and simple That remains the case for funds attributable to deduc tible contributions and all ac cumulated earnings, but non deductible contributions made after the Tax Reform Act of 1986 will not be taxed again

You do not have the option of first withdrawing the non-taxable money in your account based on the total of deductible contributions and all ac cumulated earnings. Each time you withdraw funds, a certain portion may be taxed and the rest may be tax free It is up to you to add up everything you have in your IRA and then determine what percentage of your withdrawal is taxable You'll need to keep track of what portion of your total contributions was deducti ble and what portion was not Depending on your contributions and earn ings, the percentage will change from year to year

While IRAs have increased the likelihood of a financially secure retirement for countless Americans, CPAs advise you to consider the deductibility, tax-deferred status and withdrawal retirements of Individual Retirement Accounts, as well as the possibility of alternate tax-deferred or tax-free investments that may give you a better or equivalent yield before making an investment deci-

Wise travelers abroad need not fear customs

Passing through customs when entering a foreign country or return ing to the United States need not be the dreaded task that many travelers fear, according to AAA Michigan

"Some countries are stricter than others, and a wise traveler plans pur chases and knows what is allowed to be brought into and out of the coun tries visited," said Diane Willard AAA Travel Agency director

For example, some nations prohibit travelers from entering or leav ing with certain amounts of curren cy products made of particular materials (such as ivory) or ar cheological or historical items Checking with the consulate of the country to be visited is advised

"Knowing what the US govern ment will allow into the country will save a lot of disappointment when returning home," Willard said

Going through customs can be as simple as an officer asking if you are bringing anything in or as complicated as a complete search of your belongings

Here are some suggestions to ease the process

Do not pack passports or other travel documents in luggage Carry them with you

If taking expensive lewelry or cameras out of the US, register them with the Customs office to avoid being charged duty upon return

Keep receipts in an envelope for purchases outside the U.S. especially expensive items Take along a lightweight tote bag and keep souvenirs together. It makes it easier when asked what is being brought into the country

Answer the customs official's questions courteously and concisely Even if meeting a connecting flight telling the official, "I have to catch a plane 'will not hurry the person examining belongings Plan for customs delays when booking con necting flights

Ignorance is no excuse Some foods and plants are not allowed into

Do not rely on advice from persons outside the Customs Service Unwittingly violating customs laws can lead to costly penalties. If in doubt about declaring an item, ask the customs inspector for assistance

Do not try to sneak anything by customs officials. They are trained to discover hidden merchandise

Carry all medicine in original containers from the pharmacy with the contents clearly marked

Travelers are allowed to bring in \$400 worth of articles duty free if abroad at least 48 hours. Those entering from the US Virgin Islands, American Samoa or Guam may bring in \$800 worth of goods duty-free

Duty fees must be paid in U S cur rency at the point of entry or the items must be surrendered to

The U.S. Customs Service has prepared "Know Before You Go," an informative pamphlet to alert travelers of what to expect at the customs areas Copies may be obtained at any AAA Travel Agency

Business failures on rise in Michigan'

Michigan business failures were up and new business starts were down in the first six months of 1987 according to an analysis by Dun & Bradstree D&B) Corp

But the outlook for the state is im proving because the weaker US dollar spurs exports

The overall trends in business starts and failures in Michigan are not unlike the patterns we're seeing in the U.S. as a whole," said Joseph W. Duncan, corporate economist and thief statistician of D&B, a large marketer of business information and services

'The critical difference for the future is that Michigan ranks among the top five states in total direct exports and there is no question that the state's manufacturing sector is steadily improving as exports pick up and competition from imports diminishes

Duncan cited a recent Dun's survey showing that more than 20 percent of U S exporting firms ex perienced an increase in shipments in the first quarter. Nearly 30 percent of those firms expected continued

'The state's key auto sector will be but one beneficiary of the improvement in the U.S. trade position," add ed Duncan

While the outlook appears to be

brightening D&B data on business starts and failures in Michigan show ed weakness in the first six months For the state as a whole

Business starts were down 93 percent to 4,037 from 4,451. The dip was attributable almost entirely to a decrease in starts in the retail and services sectors

(The largest increase in starts in Michigan occurred in the finance, in surance and real estate sector, up 25 percent to 310 from 248 Starts in Detroit were down 13 2 percent to 317 from 365 in the first half

Failures rose 16 percent to 988 from 852 spurred by strong increases in agriculture failures. Farm failures in Michigan rose 143 2 percent to 107 from 44 in the first half of

'The strong gains in agriculture failures, however, are largely attributable to the introduction of Chapter 12 into the bankruptcy code late last year "said Duncan "Essentially Chapter 12 gives farmers an opportunity to reorganize rather than liquidate, and many have taken ad

vantage of the new legislation

Michigan fai' res also rose significantly ii the services sector up 19 4 percent to 283 from 237 and in construction, up 26.1 percent to 111 from 88

First half failures in Detroit rose to 107 from 83, with the most significant gain in the retail trade, up to 29 from

For the first four months of 1987 building permit values in nine of Michigan's largest cities increased 15 8 percent to \$308 million from \$266 million in the same period a year

"The increases in Michigan and Detroit are in contrast to the US total which decreased 2.9 percent during the same period," said Dun can "Since building permits are issued prior to the start of actual con struction, building activity in the state's major cities should remain relatively strong for the next 6 to 18 months

Unemployment in Michigan averaged 8 5 percent for the last 12 months ending in May, the highest level in the east North Central states Ohio and Illinois both recorded 12month averages of 8 percent, while Indiana and Wisconsin reported average unemployment of 65 percent and 6 6 percent during the same

Existing home market earns 'mixed' reviews

The state's largest multiple listing service Metro MLS, gave mixed reviews to the local existing home market at the halfway point in 1987

"The average price of a single family home has exceeded \$80 000 a record level which is nearly 11 per cent higher than last year

'Our sales to-listing ratio is up about 4 percent," said Jerome A Delaney, Metro MLS president, "but with listings down nearly 16 percent, we have seen a 12 4 percent decrease in sales as compared to the first half of 1986 Condominum sales have also slipped, although new condo listings are up to 10 percent "The continued rise in prices has

met resistance from many buyers," Delaney said "Combined with the reduction in the available listing in ventory and a somewhat erratic mortgage market during the second quarter, there has been an understandable uncertainty among buyers With a continuing increase in the sales-to-listing ratio and

stabilization in the mortgage interest ratio we expect the second half of 1987 to be a more normal market than we have seen in quite some

The sales pace started to slow down about this time last year as we began to satisfy much of the demand built up during the recessionary period. We still sold more than 7,600

homes in the second half "If we can duplicate that per formance in 1987, we will have the fourth best year in our history and come close to duplicating last year's record dollar volume

'You have heard Realtors quoted from time to time as saying. 'Now is the time to buy a home 'Well, the second half of 1987 is no exception,' Delaney said Considering the possibility of higher interest rates and the likelihood of increased prices, either of these conditions substantiates the recommendations.

Maybe for backyard gardens, but not for garden keepers

ave you noticed? Autumn has definitely arrived

The roses of summer are gone, and even the hardiest of fall flowers are beginning to fade

While crimson apples hang heavily on the trees and pumpkins are turning golden on the vine, it won't be long before the last of the harvest is in and another growing

season has ended
Is it time to put away the hoe and rake, and hang up
your gardening gloves? Well, not quite yet. This year's
garden may be finished, but experienced gardeners say
your garden chores are not yet done.

Mary Bauer, master gardener and volunteer with the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service, says a little extra effort now will pay dividends if you want less work next spring and greater yields through next summer and fall

"Small gardens, well-planned and well-kept, will yield more than a large over-grown garden," she says, adding that fall clean-up is the first step toward a productive garden next season

Begin planning for next year by reviewing this year's garden With paper and pencil in hand, walk around your garden Take notes Which plants did well? Which varieties were most productive? Were insects a problem? Did disease attack your plants in mid-season?

Use your notes to plan ahead A change in plant selection, location or cultivation may be needed If a favorite plant seems to need more pampering than

If a favorite plant seems to need more pampering than you can afford to give it again next year, try a new variety Or, look for it at the farmers' market and turn your green thumb to other, more responsive plants

While walking around your garden, sketch plant locations. Home gardeners can benefit from using the farmers' practice of crop rotation. Bu changing the location of plant families in your garden, you can minimize depletion of nutrients from the soil and improve control of insects and plant disease

Tomatoes, peppers, egg plants and potatoes are in the same plant family Brussel sprouts, broccoli cabbage and cauliflower belong to another

Additionally, plan to relocate plants when soil-or-light conditions or watering-or-spacing could be improved by the change

"One of the most common problems in the spring is soggy soil," says Bauer "But it's a problem you can prevent with a little work in the fall "

Bauer suggests that now is an excellent time to construct raised beds, roto-till the garden and add needed sand, clay or peat to the soil.

Raised beds drain faster and dry earlier They are often used to grow seedlings for transplanting or early salad crops and other cool weather plants like peas, broccoli and cabbage Ground level soil is easily compacted while thawing in the spring by garden equipment and foot traffic, which delays planting

Roto-tilling in the fall, especially if the soil is left in large clumps over the winter, can help rid the garden of unwanted pests. Disease spores and insect eggs are exposed by roto-tilling to the effects of sun, air and freezing temperatures throughout the winter which can reduce their numbers.

Alternating freezing and thawing temperatures are effective in breaking up hard clay soils. Ground roto-tilled in the fall will be much easier to work in the spring

While plants are still gowing, and some will continue to grow into early November, use old bedspreads, sheets of plastic or layers of newspaper to insulate them when freezing temperatures are expected.

After all crops are harvested, clear out all vegetation and fallen fruit. Decaying plants left on the soil's surface provids a protected environment for insects and disease spores. Burn, bag or bury (at a depth of more than 12 inches), any plant debris. The trimmings from healthy, insect-free plants can be added to a compost pile to be recycled in the spring



From healthy plants in the garden, take 4 to 6-inch cuttings and root them in moist sand or vermiculite. Or divide old plants into several smaller ones and pot in a houseplant potting mix. Place plants in a sunny south window or uniter artificial light and water whenever the and templace hade

If you can't get cuttings from your herbs, you can try growing them from seed, Taylor noted. Many herbs are slow to germinate, however, and some are very susceptible to damping-off, a fungas disease of seedings.

Fall is prime time for trees, shrubs

Many home gardeners see fall as sort of second spring . . . a second chance to plant trees and shrubs in the landscape.

Most woody ornamentals, both evergreens and deciduous plants, can be planted this fall, according to Curt Peterson, Extension horticulture specialist at Michigan State University

Evergreens, both the broadleaf and narrowleaf types, should always be purchased as bailed-and-burlapped (B&B), bailed-and-potted (B&P) or container-grown plants Deciduous plants may be purchased in all of those ways, as well as dormant and, in the spring, bare-root—ie, with no soil on the roots

An advantage of buying bareroot plants is that you can handle a plant with a much larger root system (and may therefore be able to plant a much larger plant) if it doesn't have a ball of soil around its roots. Peterson said

The keys to success with fallplanted ornamentals are to plant them properly and protect them against winter injury

Balled plants need a hole 50 per-

cent wider than the soil ball. The hole should be just deep enough to put the plant at the same depth at which it had been growing

If there's a container around the root ball, remove it before setting the plant in the center of the hole with the burlap still around it. Cut all twine or wire supports, then peel the burlap off the top and sides of the soil ball and drop it into the bottom of the hole.

Trying to pull it out may injure plant roots, Peterson explained Replace subsoil removed from the hole, firming with the finger then water. When the water has drained

away, add the top soil
When you remove the container

from a container-grown plant, the root system should retain the shape of the container but not be tightly matted or pot-bound, with roots circling the bottom of the pot Before planting, separate the root system from the growing medium by grasping the roots and gently pulling them apart into a flattened and more natural shape. Set the plant in the center of a hole 50 percent bigger than the root mass and water to remove some of the pot ting mix from the root system Then add subsoil, gently working it around the roots and firming it with your fingers Water the subsoil to settle it and eliminate air pockets, then add topsoil

Do not put soil, especially finetextured mineral soil, over the top of the potting mix — it can prevent water from entry the root ball paterson advises against the

Peterson advises against the common practice of firming the soil around new plants with your feet. This tends to pack the soil, driving out the air and closing the openings between soil particles that would admit the oxygen and water that tree roots need to function.

Protecting plants against winter injury may be critical to their survival. Peterson said Newly-planted trees may need staking to prevent wind damage, and evergreens exposed to drying sun and wind need to be shielded to prevent damage to foliage Trees with smooth-barked trunks need to be wrapped to prevent sunscald and keep bark from splitting as it warms and cools Trunks shaded by small twigs, however, don't need wrapping





Minister oversees growth of facility, congregation

People in Middle Eastern clothing bustled between the well and the tents with pails of water as the odor of newly baked bread drifted through the busy community Brick makers shaped their bricks and other craftspeople labored

The scene, complete with lambs and goats, looked more like the Jerusalem marketplace in biblical days than a lawn and church parking lot which had changed roles for three days early this summer

The population included many children, because this was Vacation Bible School, First United Methodist Church of Northville style

According to long time church member Roselia Lee it was typical of the innovative programs that Pastor Eric S Hammar has encouraged since moving here four years ago

Over 200 children attended the Market Place experience, over half of them from other churches

"Eric is so dynamic, the kind of man who's not afraid to start new things," Lee added
Member Pat Eden, who with her

lay leader husband, Earl, has attended several annual church conferences on behalf of the church, agrees "It's like a large family," she said, "there's a place for everyone

Before came to Northville four years ago Hammar was a district superintendent for the Methodist church in the Saginaw Bay district He served in Farmington Hills from 1967 to 1977

Both he and his wife, Florence, are from Escanaba in northern Michigan, where he served churches for 15 years

Despite a penchant for Cornish pasties, for which his home town is famous. De pastor remains slim. His energetic walk and cheerful whistling make locating him easy in the complex of classrooms, offices and meeting rooms, which together with the sanctuary comprise the physical structure of the church



building," claimed administrative assistant Sharon Harper.

The church dates back to Aug 20. 1834, when the territory of Michigan was under the Ohio Conference The first meetings were held in private

homes, schoolhouses and barns From a manuscript by F R Beal, "Fifty Years History of the Northville Church," we learn, "There were no old white haired men and women here. The people were all young married folk all industriously striving to carve out homes for themselves and their posterity from this wilderness '

In March 1971 the congregation formed a procession through five inches of snow from the old church on the corner of Sheldon and Dunlap to the new church school and fellowship hall on Eight Mile and Taft Road

By 1976 funds were raised to build the new sanctuary which was first used Christmas Eve 1977

The congregation is now gaining about 150 members annually, due to a rapidly expanding population

Lee remembers the church when she and her husband came to Northville as newlyweds in 1930, she to teach in the high school English department and her husband, Leslie. as music director

'We arrived one Wednesday, and

we were in the church choir practice on Thursday "she reminisced

They took us right in and that was what we needed since we knew no one here That was during the depression and the church was having a hard time financially with only two or three hundred members '

Lee said that the women started a service league to help the families hardest hit in the depression Years later the service league merged with the Women's Society of Christian Service which later became the United Methodist Women

The group is still a vital part of the church, a creative fellowship which expands the concepts of mission through participation in global ministries of the church

Many of the church's new members are young families moving into Northville, Novi and South Lyon, but there are also many retired peo-

"Our retired people are a very active group," Hammar said "They meet weekly to get out the church newsletter and the offering envelopes

that are mailed out monthly "I told them once that their voluntary work is why we are doing better financially Our yearly budget is in access of \$300,000

The minister said he tries to avert the tendency of suburban people

becoming "parochial" One of the ways of doing this a strong educational program led by Director of Christian Education Jane

Berquist "Jane is trained as an educator and is taking training for diaconal ministry in Scarritt College in Nashville," Hammar explained


"We offer a weekday church school program every Wednesday for grades 4 through 12 It's called Youth Club and we have about 100 participants They receive instruction in the Bible, have choir rehearsal, recreation and dinner

"We take our confirmands into the inner city where they work and serve a meal to the homeless and the hungry down in the Cass Corridor.' "They see a black church worship

experience and are required to go to the Holocaust Museum and attend a Jewish worship service

"We had one of the first programs on AIDS in the community, to try to

'Tragically the Christian church has in many respects been an agent of fear, raising the consciousness of fear towards homosexuals

"The church deals with the total being, and recognizes that humans are sexual beings and that we have a responsibility of helping children and youth understand this

An important component of the church is its music program Stacey Becker is the music director. In addition to an adult choir there are a youth choir and two children's

Florence Hammar is in charge of the adult and youth handbell choirs

Becker and her husband, Gary, work to put on a spring musical with the junior and senior high students every year About 75 people are involved and they have performed in the states of New York, Ohio and In-

One small group of adults in the church meets monthly to see a movie which they then discuss in terms of Christianity

Mustangs edged, 7-0

Special team woes cost gridders

A specialty team gaffe was really the only thing that separated mighty North Farmington from Northville on the football field last Friday (Sept

That, in itself, is a positive sign for all Mustang fans, but the resulting touchdown gave the Raiders a hard fought 7-0 victory in a classic defensive struggle. The hard-working Mustangs have been very com-petitive against two highly-touted opponents so far this season, but the bottom line is an 0-2 mark That's something Northville Coach Darrel Schumacher wants to change soon

"I'm very proud of the kids because they have played very hard," he said "I really believe that sooner or later we'll turn the tide, we just have to convince ourselves we can win '

North Farmington - ranked by many as the pre-season favorite in the Western Lakes League - moved the ball against the Mustang defense but never did cash in The Raiders moved deep into Northville territory five times in the first half alone, but each time the Mustang defense tightened up North then missed a succession of field goals and fourth down conversions to come away empty-handed time and time again

The only score of the game came late in the third quarter when the Raiders' Vanoy Hill grabbed a Mustang punt and raced 57 yards for the touchdown The extra point made it 7-0 and that's the way it eventually

"It was a defensive battle the whole way," Schumacher said "In the first half, they were constantly in came up with the big play and they came away with nothing. We felt very fortunate to be that close '

In the first quarter, the Mustangs moved the ball down the field on its first possession of the game but stalled at the North Farmington 39 Schumacher elected to punt, but it was blocked. After moving inside the Northville 15, the Raiders attempted a 28-yard field goal, but it was wide

Later in the quarter, a short punt gave North the ball at the Mustang 31 and, after driving down to the six the Raiders failed on another short kick attempt. The same scenario unfolded early in the second quarter following a short punt and a nice return, but again the field goal missed the mark

Just before the half, North Farmington drove down to the Northville 21 and missed a fourth three-point try The first half ended a scoreless

They did a great job of defending what we were trying to do,' Schumacher said "We had lots of problems offensively and we were just thankful to be where we were at the half The Mustangs did put together a 52

yard drive late in the third quarter. going from their own nine to the Raider 39, but again the drive stalled With the score still deadlocked, Schumacher elected to punt and pin North deep in their own territory but Vanoy Hill took the short kick and didn't stop until he was in the end

The Mustangs did have a chance to tie it up with less than a minute remaining in the game, but that failed as well Northville's Sam Khashan made a jarring hit on a Raider to force a fumble with less than a minute left, and Scott Belliston

scoring position, but each time we recovered the ball at his own 45 Quarterback Greg Price hit receiver Ed Walsh for a 23-yard pass to move the Mustangs inside North Farmington's 25 with the clock ticking away Following an incomplete pass. the clock stopped with just seven seconds remaining, giving Northville one last play for the touchdown

Price spotted senior Derek Osborne in the corner of the end zone as time ran out, but he was unable to get his hands on the pass. It appeared to many that Osborne was interfered by the defender, but no call was made and the game ended

"Our special teams are our big problem right now," Schumacher said "Our regular punter, Chris Kuffner is recovering from a strained knee and we don't want him kicking yet The backups are doing their best, but we are still struggling

Defensively inside linebacker Mark Stephens had another outstanding game, pacing Northville with six solo stops and six assists Ed Walsh added five solos and four assists from his secondary spot. On the other side of the ball, the struggling Mustangs gained only 133 yards in total offense Top runner Mike Yard managed just seven vards in nine attempts while Price was only 7of-20 for 95 yards and a pair of interceptions

Next up for Northville is Western Division foe Livonia Churchill, featuring quarterback John Tracy who was an All Division selection a year ago

"They have their quarterback back and Churchill always seems to play us tough" Schumacher said 'We need a win badly to get some momentum. We need that first vic-

Dunwoodie to guide cross country team

Even if the Northville girls' cross country team fails to win a single dual meet in '87, it is already well ahead of last year's pace

Under first-year coach Ann Cook, the Mustangs failed to field a full team a year ago due to low numbers and injuries New coach Nick Dunwoodie has a young squad without much depth, but he currently has eight players on the roster — enough to field a full, competitive team.

Northville cagers win ugly at Novi

A slow starting offense continues to plague the Northville girls' cage team

The Mustangs have now played four games and have gotten off to a slow start all four times. The team has been outscored in first quarter action 47-15 That means Northville has been averaging under four points for each first quarter this year.

Thanks to a pair of successful comebacks, the Mustangs are now ready to enter the Western Lakes League portion of their schedule with a respectable 2-2 record. But who knows what the mark would be if it weren't for all those dreadful starts

In action last week, Coach Ed Kritch's troops split a pair of contests, beating Novi 31-24 on Sept 9 before falling to South Lyon 61-47 the next day in the finals of the Suzanne Smith Memorial Tournament

The Novi-Northville match-up was a tedious, lethargic affair featuring two teams that never really got untracked offensively. As the offenses stagnated and the defenses dominated, points became very hard to come by After one quarter of play, the Wildcats held on to a pathetic 4-2

"It was a real horrible start offensively for both teams," Kritch admitted "We didn't shoot the ball very well at all - we missed a lot of open shots Debbie Stevens missed four layups in the first quarter alone "

Things picked up a little bit in the second quarter, at least for Northville, and the Mustangs took a narrow 10-8 lead into the locker room at the half Obviously, it was still anybody's game

In the third, Northville converted some steals and turnovers into points

and finally broke things open. With Katie Brugman and Stevens scoring inside, Novi fell behind 22-15 with one quarter to play.

We finally figured out their zone defense and got the ball inside to Brugman and Stevens," Kritch explained. "They scored eight of our 12 in the third guarter.'

In the fourth, the Mustangs increased the lead to 11 at one point and coasted in with a seven-point triumph. The big key in the game was the way Northville managed to shut down Wildcat scoring machine Lisa McCarthy The senior guard, after scoring 31 just a few days before against North Farmington. was held to 11.







In the 9-10th grade race, the Mustangs placed fourth with 100 points, only eight behind the winners from Walled Lake Central The top runners for Northville included freshman Andy Haas and sophomore Jason Hoose Haas placed 12 overall with a 20 16 run while Hoose came in 18th overall

Tonight (Sept 17), the Mustangs (1-0) face the toughest challenge of the season as they host powerful Farmington at Cass Benton The Falcons lost a couple of top runners but are loaded with talent

'They should be in the top five in the state this season so we will be very hard pressed to stay with them," Gabrys said

Deer hunters to benefit from new laws

Michigan firearm deer hunters will benefit from liberalized hunting regulations this fall, as the Department of Natural Resourses (DNR) launches programs aimed at providing new op-portunities for hunters and solving crop and silviculture problems

The new hunting opportunities include 1 a limited bonus deer option, 2 more hunters' choice licenses available, 3 expanded areas open for hunters' choice, 4 more landowner limited hunting areas, 5 an extended season in Menominee County (in the Upper Peninsula), 6 and the availability of leftover hunters' choice licenses

And again this fall, hunters will be permitted to purchase a second buck license after the Sept 24 deadline for hunters' choice license applications

In the Upper Peninsula zone, a different bonus featrure is offered. In units 215 and 414, hunters with hunters' choice licenses must present an anterless deer to a DNR Field Office in order to

obtain an additional kill tag, valid for either a buck or anterless deer Unit 215 hunters will report to the city of Stephenson, Unit 414 to the city of

This year, an additional 38,190 hunters' choice licenses will be issued statewide, which allow hunters to take either a buck or a doe

Along with the additional hunters' choice licenses, expanded areas have been opened to hunters. There are 140 units open for anterless hunting, and increase of 17 percent compared to last year Those units are listed in the 1987 hunters' choice license application guide available at all license dealer locations and DNR offices

Unit 215, in the Upper Peninsula, will have an extended December 1-15 firearm deer season for those with hunters' choice licenses. That means any Unit 215 hunters' choice license holder may hunt from Nov 15 to Dec 15 in Unit 215

In units where high crop and silviculture damage is being experienced, hunters may obtain

unclaimed hunters' choice license by appearing at designated DNR offices Those units and offices are. Unit 215, beginning Nov 15, at the Stephenson Field Office (906) 753-6317, Units 137, 138 and 156, beginning November 1, at the Plainwell District Office (616) 685-6851, Units 147, 150 and 151, beginning Nov. 1, at the Jackson District Office (517) 784-3188, Unit 36, beginning Nov 1, Grand Rapids District Office (616) 456-5071)

The limited bonus deer option allows hunters who posses a regular hunter choice or landowner limited license to take an additional antierless deer in specified deer harvest units

Bonus units open to regular hunter choice license holders and landowner limited license holders are: 37, 47, 49, 50, 51, 52, 112, 139 and 155 Bonus units open to landowner limited license holders are. Units 79, 81, 99 and 102

A total of 38, 245 bonus anteriess only tags will be

DNR: 1987 Waterfowl season dates approved

Dates for the 1987 Michigan Waterfowl Season have been approved by federal authorities, according to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources

The state will again be divided into three hunting zones - north, middle and south - with boundaries unchanged from 1986.

The duck season will be 40 days long in each zone, the same as 1986

In the North and Middle Zones, the duck season is Oct 3 to Nov. 11

An important change from 1986 occurs in the South Zone where the duck season is split. The first 37 days will run from Oct 10 to Nov 15 and the last three days of the season will be Nov 27-29, following Thanksgiv-

The Canada goose hunting season will be much improved this year with a daily bag limit of two birds in most of the state

The North Zone season begins Sept. 26 and is 40 days long (two geese per day) except in Baraga, Houghton, Ontonagon and Marquette counties where it will continue for 20 days unless a 6,500-bird harvest quota is

reached first. The Middle Zone Canada goose season is 40 days (two geese per day), concurrent with the duck season - Oct 3 to Nov 11
