## Schools seek to comply with asbestos ruling

The good news is that the Northville Public Schools are in better financial shape than a lot of districts in terms of eliminating asbestos from its schools.

The bad news is that the federally mandated asbestos removal and screening procedure could cost the district as much as \$250,000.

"I really don't think it will cost that much," said Burton Knighton, the district's assistant superintendent for administrative services, noting that preliminary contacts with testing firms have indicated a cost of between 12 and 20 cents per square foot plus an additional \$600 per test.

The district already has spent \$94,000 to comply with the Asbestos

School Hazard Detection Act of 1980, which required a visual inspection of all school buildings to detect any friable (airborne) asbestos that may have been present in the school buildings.

The new act, passed in 1986, requires more stringent attention to asbestos, which, between 1950-1975, was one of the most common components of building materials.

The new regulations which take effect October 12, 1988, require school districts to assess and respond to potential asbestos problems in their buildings.

Under the stringent guidelines, with which each school district must comply, school buildings must be inspected by an accredited inspector and, following that on-site look,

each local school district must develop an asbestos management plan and submit the plan to the state governor.

Knighton told the Board of Education March 14 that he has contacted "four companies, with whom the district has dealt in the past and asked them for proposals on the inspection, based on information provided by Thrun, Maatsch and Nordberg, P.C., the legal firm handling a class action suit on this issue."

Northville is one of more than 300 schools participating in the class action suit.

"We are getting letters from three or four companies a day, which have sprung up out of nowhere, offering to proceed with the testing for our district," Knighton

"On some of those leaflets, the ink isn't dry," chimed in George Bell, superintendent of schools.

Bell said that he had attended a seminar with a man from a medium-sized school district in Illinois.

"He estimated that it would cost his district about \$250,000 to comply with the EPA rules," Bell said.

Knighton noted that because of Northville's participation in a class action suit, the asbestos samples must be taken in a particular way.

A spokesperson for the legal firm noted that 11 representative plaintiffs will go into trial prior to the hearing of the class action suit. That trial is expected to take place in mid-1989, after the EPA's deadline for im-

## City launches push to clear cemetery title

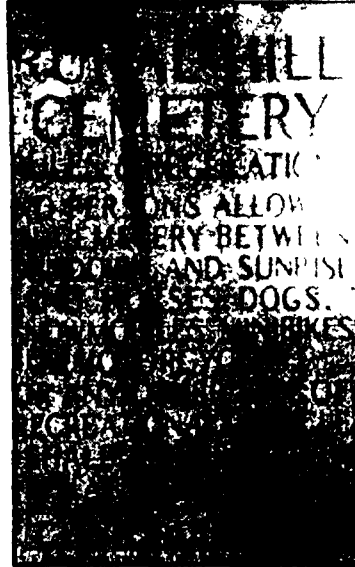
The City of Northville has gone to court in an effort to get clear title to all of the Rural Hill Cemetery.

The city filed suit in Wayne County Circuit Court to quiet title to the southern part of the cemetery — about 22 acres lying just outside the city limits, in Northville Township. As part of the suit, the city is publishing an advertisement looking for board members of the old Rural Hill Cemetery Association, the governing body which gave the cemetery to the old Village of Northville and dissolved itself over 40 years ago.

The city has owned and operated the cemetery for decades, but recent research showed that the part of the cemetery inside the township was never officially transferred to the city, and is therefore still technically owned by the Rural Hill Cemetery Association — which has not existed since 1947.

According to Northville City Manager Steve Walters, the resolution which dissolved the cemetery association clearly transferred all the association's assets to the city. However, since the cemetery lies in two different governmental jurisdictions, the deed transfer required separate legal descriptions of the two parts. Walters said

that the part of the cemetery



within the city was included in that action.

"The township part is still technically recorded under the name of the board of trustees of the Rural Hill Cemetery Association," Walters said. And, as a result, the city has in effect been selling plots of land it does not own.

However, Walters and John Kelly

## Trustees OK license transfer

Although the township board gave its approval March 10 for the transfer of the liquor license at the Dun Rovin golf course to a group representing the new owners of the property, it was adamant that once the first person moves onto the site, the license will go into escrow.

Chris Davies, who manages the golf course and the bar, said during the regularly scheduled board of trustees meeting he intended to begin serving alcohol March 13, the official opening day of the golf course. Davies also requested approval of a temporary sign on Six Mile Road and another on Haggerty

Road which would indicate the golf course was open for play.

Davies told the board it was the intent of the project developers, Real Estate Interests Inc., to keep as much of the golf course in play as possible as they began construction of about 650 single family attached and detached homes on the site.

REI has received township approval to build their residential community under terms of a planned residential unit development.

"We had about 20 golfers lined up today (March 10) trying to get in and ready to play golf," Davies told the board. She noted that the clubhouse

would be serving alcohol and bar food as long as the course remained open.

"Once you have residents moving into the condominiums or the homes, you intend to close down the clubhouse," questioned Clerk Thomas Cook

"I think that is our intention," Davies responded. "Once the complex is developed, I think the intent is to place the liquor license in escrow and not have the clubhouse open as a bar."

Treasurer Richard Henningsen suggested that the question of the liquor license be tabled, pending a review by the township attorney; however, Trustee Richard Allen noted that if the course were to be open by the weekend, unless action were taken that night, there would be a month's lapse before the prospective new holders of the license would be able to serve alcohol.

"I'd much rather give preliminary approval tonight, pending the review by the attorney and a signed statement that once the first person moves onto the site, the license then go into escrow," Allen said.

The rest of the board agreed with him and voted accordingly.

The board also agreed with Allen when he suggested that any sign for the golf course on Haggerty Road be limited to two square feet and the sign on Six Mile be limited to eight square feet.

## Post office computer eases work

If the counter at the Northville Post Office starts looking a little like the Starship Enterprise in the next few weeks, don't be alarmed.

A new computer terminal, screens and printer — already at the post office, and ready to go into operation within the next few weeks — are nothing more complicated than a new way to provide information for customers.

Tim Cooper, who is working on implementing the system in Northville, said the new equipment is basically a computer hooked up to a postal scale.

With a few keystrokes, postal workers will be able to look up all the options available to send any given piece of mail, and find out how much each one would cost, Cooper explained. The information will be displayed on two screens, one for the postal worker and one for the customer.

Once a customer chooses an option, the machine's small printer will generate a receipt.

"This is going to eliminate all manual looking up of rates and fees," Cooper said. "It will make things a lot easier for everybody."

All post offices with three windows more will be getting similar equipment, Cooper said.

# NEWS BRIEFS

**EASTER SEAL COLLECTION** — Members of Northville Rotary will be taking canister collections throughout the downtown from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Friday and Saturday for the Easter Seal Society. This is the second year club members have volunteered to aid the charity.

**DIRECTOR HONORED** — Leonard Rezmierski, executive director, special education services for the Northville Public Schools is the 1988 recipient of the Beekman award.

Rezmierski is the first local director to win the award in the 15-year history of the honor. He was chosen March 10 by the 400 members of the Michigan Association Administrators of Special Education, the Michigan Association of Intermediate Special Education Administrators and the Special Education Supervisors of Michigan.

**MEMBERSHIP CHANGE** — The city council last week approved a change in the membership of the city's historic district commission.

In a unanimous vote March 7, the council changed the ordinance creating the commission so that only one member of the city council is required to be on the commission. Previously, both the mayor and another council member were required; now, one or the other is required.

**NEW RECEPTIONIST** — Peggy Jurzec has joined the staff at township hall. Jurzec, of Livonia, is a clerk typist and will be answering township phone lines weekdays, beginning at noon.

Maureen Osiecki, who previously held the position, is the township's block grant coordinator.

**PURSELL PROFILE** — Carl D. Pursell, Michigan congressman from the second district and Republican party whip, will be featured on Cable News Network's "Profiles in Congress" segment next Wednesday. A regular CNN feature, Profiles focuses on leaders from the 100th session of Congress. About two minutes in length, the Pursell segment will be aired four times March 23 and once, between 1:30-2:30 a.m., March 24.

Pursell is a senior member of the influential House Appropriations Committee.

**LEARNING JOB** — Carol Miller has been appointed second alternate to the township Zoning Board of Appeals. Miller will be in the audience during board meetings, at least for the near future, and will fill in if two people are absent. The appointment was approved March 10 by the township trustees.

**ROUGE RESCUE** — Rouge Rescue '88 is scheduled to be held June 4 and the township and city have targeted the Johnson Drain to receive special attention.

In the past, the city has concentrated on Fish Hatchery Park while the township has concentrated its workers at Waterford Bend.

# Awareness is key to tornado safety

It is difficult to think about tornadoes when there is snow on the ground, but tornadoes in Michigan can occur at almost any time.

"Michigan is one of the worst states in the country in terms of tornadoes," said Northville Township Police Lt. Gary Batloff, director of the township's emergency preparedness program. "Thus far, we've been lucky in that we haven't recently had a confirmed tornado sighting. But I think it's only a matter of time."

That's why Batloff is stressing awareness as the best means to be safe during tornado season, which annually runs from April-July.

Most tornadoes occur in Michigan between 3-7 p.m., when the temperature is between 70 and 75

degrees, come from the southwest and travel between 20-40 miles per hour, Batloff explained.

"But they can and do occur at any time. One of the main difficulties is making people aware that when they hear a siren, especially during inclement weather, they should turn on the television or a radio and listen."

"I think that people have just gotten used to the sirens and have begun to ignore them," he said.

While the township does not have its own siren system, Batloff said that sirens from Oakland County carry through the northern portion of the township, from the City of Northville and Plymouth Township to the west and from Farmington and Livonia to the east.

"While Michigan is noted as one of the states where tornadoes do occur and in large number compared to its population, there have been only 21 confirmed sightings in Wayne County between 1950 and 1986. In Oakland County, 24 confirmed tornadoes were sighted in the same time period. A Father's Day tornado in 1967 touched down at the Chateau Estates Mobile Home Park and claimed the life of Michael Muscatello, while doing an estimated \$1.7 million worth of damage."

While the damage tornadoes can do when they touch down in a populated area has not changed much, the ways to react to them have, Batloff said.

He noted that in the late 1950s, people believed that the best place to be

during a tornado is in the southwest corner of a building.

"The safest place to be is in a basement, away from windows and especially away from outside walls. If you don't have a basement, then get to the lowest level and in a closet. Two of the least safe places to be are in your car or in a mobile home. They (trailers and cars) afford almost no protection and can be picked up and tossed around like a bullet," Batloff explained.

He noted that a little bit of preparation can possibly save a life or a person from injury.

"I can't stress enough that if you hear a siren, know what it means and act accordingly. A tornado is nothing to fool around with," Batloff said.

# MAGS may leave Northville Square

The Michigan Association of Gift Salesmen (MAGS) may move out of its Northville Square location when its lease expires next year, the group's president said Tuesday.

Karl Gansler, president of MAGS, said the group — an organization of gift wholesalers which sponsors shows for retailers — faces a choice which may depend on the intent of the building's owners.

"Our first option is if the landlords decide to renew the lease. We are receiving no communication from them. It is putting us in a bind, because we're not sure what they want to do," Gansler said.

The group's other option is to build its own building, he added.

"We're really in a period of nervousness, not knowing where we're going," Gansler said. "It's not a comfortable time for the organization."

Gansler said the MAGS lease, from the private investors' group Northville Square Associates, expires in December, 1989. He said he has called and written to one of the associates but, as of Tuesday, had gotten no response.

That really isn't much time, Gansler said, because if the group does decide to build its own facility, it would have to begin pretty soon.

If MAGS does decide to move into its own building, it would probably want something in the same general area, in the I-275 corridor.

"I certainly hope we don't have to move. We enjoy very much being where we're at, the small-

town atmosphere of the City of Northville. Our people can feel very comfortable walking around the streets," Gansler said.

At a meeting of the city's downtown development authority Tuesday morning, City Manager Steve Walters commented that to lose MAGS from the Northville Square building might hurt other retail development downtown, because that space would become available for less effort than it would take to develop or redevelop some other site.

The Northville Square building is on the southeast corner of Main and Wing streets downtown. The building began life as a small retail mall, but closed in 1976 and reopened a few months later as the MAGS headquarters.

# Boards of Review:

The board of review to hear appeals of property assessments in the City of Northville is scheduled to begin meeting next Tuesday.

The board's schedule is:

• Tuesday, March 15: 1-5 p.m. and 6:30-10 p.m.

• Thursday, March 24: 1-5 p.m. and 6:30-10 p.m.

• Tuesday, March 29: 9 a.m.-noon and 1:30-5 p.m.

Appointments are required, and

may be made by calling the city tax office at 349-1300.

Officials recommend that anyone appearing before the board of review come prepared with plenty of documentation showing that an assessment is too high compared to sale prices of similar houses in the area.

An assessment should be half the market value of a piece of property

Township residents will have some extra time to appeal their tax assessments.

Because official notices were not mailed until late last week, the township board of review will continue its meetings March 21 and schedule additional sessions if needed beyond that date.

The board, the official body that hears petitions for a change in assessments, met March 14-March 16, one week after it was originally scheduled.

State law requires 10 days between

notice of assessment change and the final meeting of the Board of Review.

Township assessments rose an average of 12 percent this year, with some areas receiving a 3 percent increase and other properties receiving a 15 percent increase.

Two projects, Blue Heron Pointe and Country Club Estates of Northville, which have had site plan approval but have no residences actually constructed, had their assessments sizeably increased. They previously were zoned as non-residential properties.

# Township ready to oppose any try at annexation

If and when the city gets clear title to the part of Rural Hill Cemetery which lies in Northville Township, a fight may follow over annexation of the land by the city.

City Manager Steve Walters said Tuesday that once the title question is answered, he will recommend that the city council start annexation proceedings on the land. Meanwhile, Northville Township officials are preparing to block any such effort before the state boundary commission.

Currently, Rural Hill Cemetery lies across the city/township boundary just west of the St. Lawrence Barns land. About 22 acres of the cemetery are within the township.

The main point in favor of annexing that parcel by the city is police jurisdiction, Walters said. The recent rediscovery that the cemetery is largely in the township was due in part to city police answering a call in the township part of the cemetery, Walters said. If the city does not annex the 22 acres, similar problems could arise again, he said. The only access to the township part of the cemetery is through the city.

"It's logical for the city council to look at and consider (annexation), because the jurisdiction part is dumb," Walters said. "It just doesn't make sense to have it that way. The reason we'd do it isn't for empire building of the city."

However, if the city does apply to the boundary commission to annex the land, Northville Township officials will probably oppose the move, Township Supervisor Georgina Goss said.

Township officials are concerned that in addition to the loss of the cemetery land, an annexation of that land could lead to additional annexation in order to straighten out bound-

daries.

In a letter to Goss, Township Attorney Ernest Essad Jr. said the city's claim to owning the land is strong, but that the township could fight annexation at the state level.

"While I understand that this concerns the (township) board greatly, I believe that any attempt at annexation of the cemetery by the city would best be fought at the state boundary commission rather than in the Wayne County Circuit Court," the letter reads in part.

Essad also offered other suggestions. One is a suit or threat of a suit charging the city with poor maintenance of the cemetery.

"This may best be a matter of negotiation between the city and township as opposed to a legal fight in which the township must be the aggressor. I do believe, however, that in threatening the exercise of the township's rights with respect to the way the cemetery is being maintained and perhaps finding a few active plot owners which are concerned as to the condition of the cemetery, we may effectuate your goals without the specter of litigation," the letter reads.

Essad also suggested that the township consider allowing the annexation of the cemetery land in exchange for an agreement with the city to forbid further annexation for 25 years or longer. Another option is the creation of a joint cemetery association between the city and the township.

However, Walters said any consideration of annexation will come only after the title question is resolved. "There really isn't a relationship (between quieting title and annexing), but on the other hand there is a logical order of events," he said.

— the attorney handling the case for the city — both said Tuesday they do not expect any trouble resolving the issue in court. Of the old cemetery association's five board members, the city tracked down three — and all three are now dead, Walters said.

The city could not trace the other

two, and so the circuit court judge is requiring the city advertise for any remaining members of the association in three consecutive editions of The Record. This is the third week.

Once the publication is finished and plenty of time has passed for anyone to respond, Kelly said, the city will file for a court date. At that time, the title to the 22 acres could be cleared to the city, he said.

## Janigian looks for the fun in teaching

Jan Janigian says he loves teaching at the middle school/junior high level.

"The elementary students are too young and the high school students are a little too serious," he explains. "Middle school students are just right."

The Wayne County Intermediate School District thinks Janigian is just right, too. It has chosen him as its representative middle school level teacher for the Post/Newsweek-WDIV Teacher of the Year competition.

As a youngster, Janigian didn't sit and dream all day about math or about teaching. He wasn't sure what he wanted to be when he became an adult.

In fact, it wasn't until he was a

math major at the University of Michigan that he discovered a joint love, teaching and math.

He has pursued both at Meads Mill Middle School and, although he says he is a low-key person, once he is in the classroom, that all changes.

"Math is fun and I want the students to realize it," Janigian said. "I also want them to learn the basics — the adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing."

Janigian has been teaching eighth grade math at all levels — lower, intermediate and the advanced, concepts class — at Meads Mill since 1984.

Prior to that he taught seventh, eighth- and ninth-grade math at Cooke Junior High School in Northville, and at Bryant and Emerson junior highs in Livonia.

He says that there is no difference

in his approach to teaching, no matter what level. "There has to be some fun in it."

Janigian has imparted both fun and knowledge not only to the more mathematically-gifted youngsters in his concepts class, but also in the more basic math classes as well.

"I guess they wanted to see my face," Janigian said when he learned of the award from principal Jeff Radwanski. The letter noted that Janigian was one of 12 teachers in Michigan — three from the Wayne County Intermediate School District service area — to win the award, which carries a \$2,000 cash prize.

"I was pretty excited," Janigian admitted. "But I really am a low-key individual so it didn't take long to recover and get back to teaching."

Janigian's approach of putting his students first is part of what prop-

ted his administration to nominate him for the award.

"They told me that they were going to do it and gave me the nominating papers so I could look them over. I made them take out some of the stuff, because it didn't sound like me. I was almost embarrassed."

"I'm appreciative of the award, but there are an awful lot of Northville teachers, including the ones in my team, who I think are as deserving," Janigian said.

But former students and even those who never were taught by Janigian say otherwise. It is not unusual, Janigian says, for former students to come back as 10th-, 11th- or 12th-graders and just say, "hello."

"That really makes me feel good," Janigian says.

It also makes him feel good when a

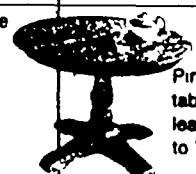

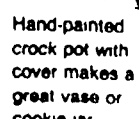

# Police charge two with breaking into cars

Several car stereos, radar detectors and other items believed stolen from cars in Northville and Novi were recovered by Northville police last week, leading to breaking and entering charges against two suspects.

Stanley Koitek, 20, of Dearborn and Jerome Lamparski, 19, of Detroit were arraigned in 35th District Court by Northville police March 9 on two counts of breaking and entering an automobile.

Both men stood mute on the charges. They were released on payment of \$500 bond each.

Northville city police are currently seeking owners for some items found

in a car with the two men.

The two men also are suspects in five larceny from vehicle incidents which occurred in Novi during the night of March 7-8, said Capt. Richard Faulkner. Items reported stolen from vehicles in the Country Place Condominiums and the Sadlecreek Apartments reportedly were recovered by Northville police in the vehicle driven by Koitek and Lamparski.

Faulkner said Novi police may lodge charges against the two suspects for the Novi incidents pending additional information.

The existing charges stem from a report to Northville police early

March 8 of two men breaking into a car in the parking lot of the Northville Green Apartments at Randolph Street and Eight Mile.

When police got to the apartments, they stopped Koitek and Lamparski, who were about to leave in a car, a city police report said. According to the report, the police saw two open beer cans in the car and arrested the two on an alcohol violation.

A Northville Green resident told police that a tool box, a pair of jumper cables and a case full of cassette tapes — all in the suspects' car — belonged to him. His name was on an item in the tool box and he identified the tapes by title and artist, the

police report said.

Another resident of the complex identified four cassettes found in the suspects' car.

The car also contained several car stereos, radar detectors and other items, police said. Three radar detectors, two car stereos, a cassette case, a car phone antenna and a hand calculator were all later identified as items reported stolen from cars in Novi that night, the police report said.

Other items found in the car and impounded by Northville police include three more radar detectors, two car stereo cassette players, one

graphic equalizer, one microcassette recorder with a tape in it, two more car phone antennas, numerous harmonicas, cassette tapes, a racquetball racket, an inside rear-view mirror, two flashlights, an umbrella, ski goggles, a ski jacket, cables, power cords, tools and radio knobs.

Northville police request anyone in the area who suffered a larcency from a vehicle the night of March 7-8 to contact the police department at 349-1280.

A preliminary examination for the pair is scheduled at the 35th District Court before Judge John MacDonald at 9 a.m. Friday.

# Over \$1,000 taken in break-in at Silver Springs

A Silver Springs apartment was burglarized March 9 and more than \$1,000 in cash and merchandise was taken.

The apartment tenant told township police that she had left her residence about 5 p.m. and when she returned at 9 p.m. she discovered the break-in.

Missing were four pairs of gloves, an Xacto knife set, four bottles of wine, about \$106 in change, house and vehicle keys and assorted jewelry.

Entry to the apartment was gained by breaking an east bedroom win-

dow, the police report said.

The complainant noted that every room in the apartment had been searched and that the missing items were taken from the bedroom, kitchen and living and dining room.

Investigating officers discovered a glove which they theorize belonged to the person responsible for breaking and entering the apartment and were able to obtain a partial fingerprint at the scene.

They have no suspects in the incident.

**STOLEN CAR RECOVERED** — Anonymous calls to the Northville police department led to the arrest of two youths on suspicion of receiving and concealing stolen property last week.

An inventory at McDonald Ford on Seven Mile March 7 showed that a 1988 Ford Mustang worth \$13,500 was missing from the dealership, a city police report said. The car had last been noted as part of the lot's inventory on Feb. 29.

On March 9, the Northville city police department got several anonymous phone calls saying that a student at Farmington Harrison High School was driving a car stolen from the McDonald Ford. The Northville police notified Farmington Hills police, who recovered the car and took two youths — one 17, one 16 — into custody.

The license plate on the car was reported stolen in Novi March 6. Farmington Hills police are prosecuting the case on a charge of receiving and concealing stolen property.

The subject is scheduled to appear in 35th District Court at 9 a.m. April 14 to answer the charges.

**TEEN FACES CHARGES** — A Livonia teen-ager is facing charges stemming from the discovery March 12 of open intoxicants in his vehicle. Township officer Jeffrey Larente

wrote in his report that while he was patrolling the parking lot of a local fast-food restaurant, he noticed a group of young people surrounding the car. Larente wrote that when the group entered the restaurant, he noticed an open bottle of beer by the car's front tire, and that he observed the teen-ager pick up the beer when he returned from the restaurant, enter the car and drive off.

Larente initiated a traffic stop and observed an open bottle of beer on the front floorboard of the car and another open bottle of beer in the rear seat of the car.

Larente issued the car's driver violations for transporting open intoxicants and, after completing a LEIN check and discovering that the youth's license had been suspended, a violation for driving with a suspended license.

Bailey said he reported the incident to police, but hoped the reward might help locate the trailer. He announced the reward in a phone call to The Record on Monday.

The reward is \$500 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the camper's thief or thieves, plus the return of the camper. Bailey said anyone with information may contact him at 525-1111 during working hours, he said.

Bailey was born and raised in the community and is a 1969 graduate of Northville High School.

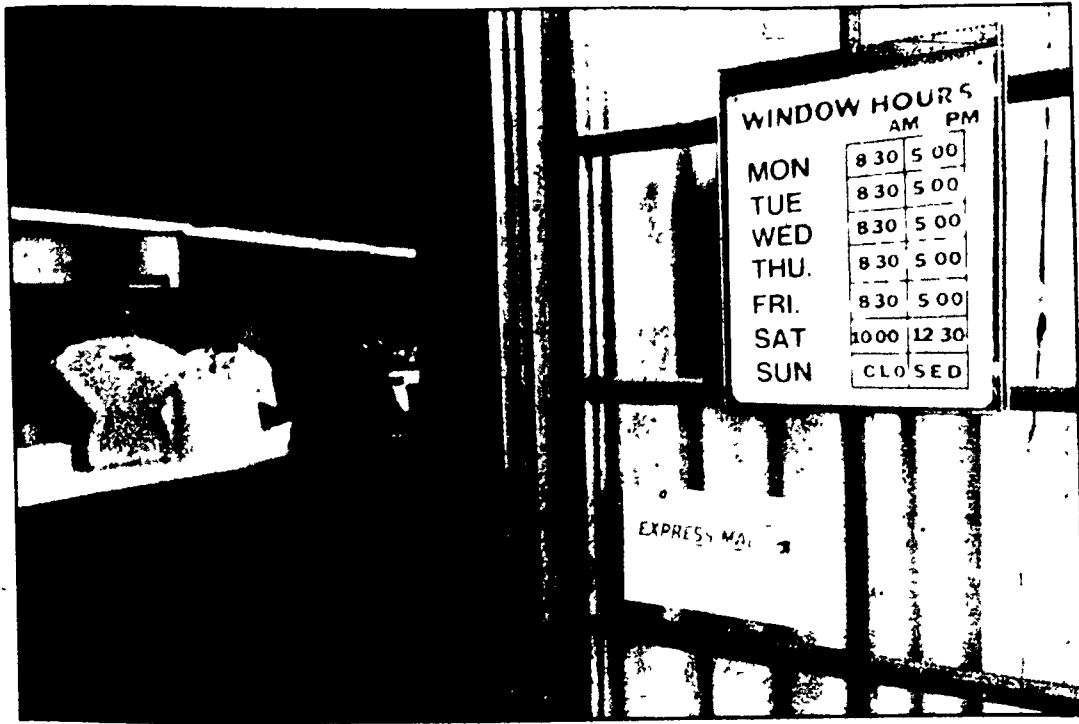

## Post office adjusts to shorter hours

While postal customers in many Detroit area communities are adjusting to life without Saturday window service at the post office, Saturday means almost business as usual in Northville.

Although window hours at the Northville Post Office have been shortened throughout the week, the post office is still open Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Northville Postmaster Wallace Cates said that each individual postmaster had to find ways to cut costs in each office as part of a national budget trimming. While many post offices in the area elected to eliminate Saturday window hours, Cates didn't think that was the best idea.

"I looked at our community and it seemed to me (the people) would be very upset if we closed on Saturday. A lot of people work during the week, and Saturday is the only opportunity for them to come into the post office," Cates said.

So, Cates decided to cut his budget by closing the counter at 5 p.m. weekdays instead of 6 p.m. The post office did very little business during that last hour anyway, he said.

Since the change has been in effect for a few weeks, Cates said the public has responded well. "We haven't had any complaints that I'm aware of," he said. "Right now there's been very little response."

The Detroit division of the post office operates with a \$550 million budget, which must be cut to help balance the budget at the federal level, Detroit division postmaster John M. Horne said.

Saturday closings in the area are by themselves expected to save the district \$600,000 Horne said. "Other cuts will come by not filling vacant positions, fewer hours for part-time flexible employees, cutting down on travel and training costs and not updating computerized equipment," Horne added. "No layoffs are anticipated."

Stamp prices are expected to rise from 22 cents to 25 cents next month.

Horne said the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1987 requires the U.S. Postal Service to reduce operational spending nationally by \$160 million this year, and \$270 million next year.

"We were given the cut and told we can't raise rates or borrow money," Horne said. "This is over and above the forthcoming rate increase expected in April."

Even in post offices which have eliminated retail service on Saturday, it will remain a normal processing day for inside postal workers, Horne said.

"We are asking the public to understand the cuts were mandated by law. As a consequence, this is our response to it," he said.

"We know that some people may be inconvenienced by the changed hours, but we hope they will also understand our difficult position," he added.

## Township waits on grant decision

Northville Township's anticipated \$72,000 in community development block grant funds will not be allocated right away.

The township board of trustees March 10 tabled approval of the funding proposals pending a ruling from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services about the eligibility of the purchase of a new fire truck for block grant funding.

At a public hearing prior to the regularly scheduled meeting, Maureen Osiecki recommended that \$20,000 be allocated to the water and sewer department, earmarked for qualified residents' payments for special assessments, that \$17,775 be targeted to senior citizen programs

— \$9,775 for bus service, and \$4,000 allocations to the telephone reassurance program and the senior citizens' newsletter, and \$725 for the homeshare program which matches the elderly with affordable housing.

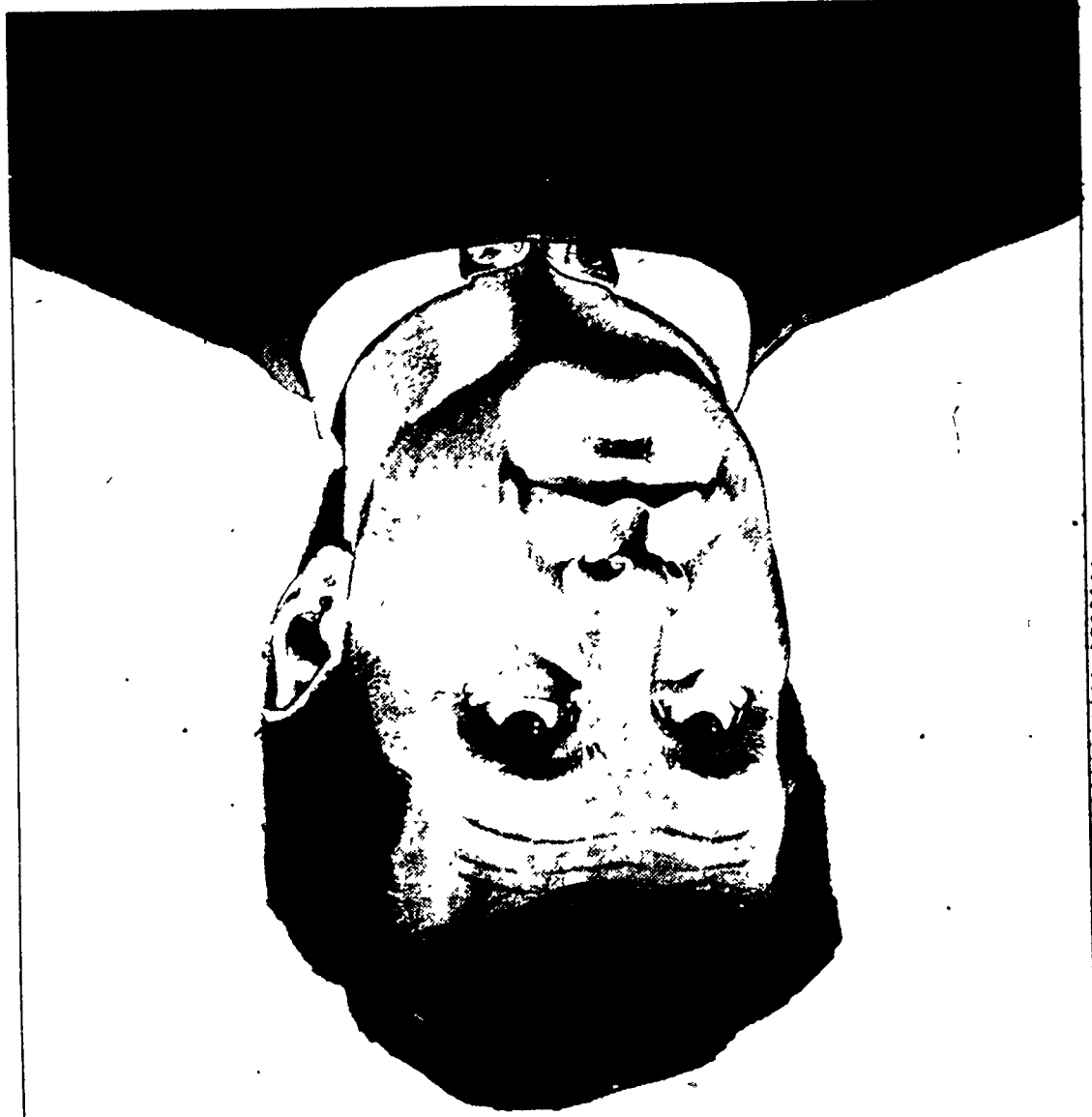
Also earmarked is \$10,000 for housing rehabilitation, \$15,000 for planning commission projects, including work to write a wetlands/woodlands ordinance and \$5,800 for the new fire truck.

Chief Robert Toms told the board that he would like to purchase a used ladder truck for \$35,000. The cost of the truck would be spread out over three years and be totally paid for with block grant funds.

"We have the chance to upgrade our fire equipment at nominal cost. Thirty-five thousand is a lot of money, but a new ladder truck is \$400,000. This truck was owned by Ypsilanti and has only 9,000 miles on it. In terms of fire trucks, it's practically new," Toms said.

He noted that the township could sell its existing ladder truck and receive \$10,000 from another community for the equipment.

Osiecki said she would check with Wayne County officials this week about the requirements to cover the fire truck purchase, but anticipated there would be no problem with the block grant appropriation.

# Trustees fit funds to firefighters' plan

Firefighters in Northville Township will be getting physical education equipment at the new west end fire station, but Fire Chief Robert Toms said other township employees will be able to use the gear.

The township board March 10 approved giving the firefighters \$850 in matching funds to purchase the equipment, but not all the trustees were in favor of the purchase.

In fact, Supervisor Georgina Goss cast the deciding ballot.

"I don't have any problem with the concept of fitness equipment, but if we approve the money for the firefighters, do we then have to approve the same expenditure for the police and for the other township employees," asked Thomas Handyside, one of three trustees who

voted against the measure.

Also casting "no" votes were treasurer Richard Henningsen and trustee Donald B. Williams.

Toms said that other township employees were welcome to use the equipment, under the supervision of the firefighters. "I don't think it's a good idea just to leave the door open for anyone," he said.

The firefighters had collected \$850 on their own to purchase the equipment, and Toms said the additional money from the township would allow the firefighters to purchase better quality equipment.

"If the township board approves the matching funds, the equipment will become the property of the township," Toms said.

He added that having the equipment will be an attraction for the

firefighters, giving them another reason to come to the fire hall.

"I think that since we have volunteers, having the physical fitness equipment at the fire station would provide another reason for firefighters to be at the fire station, rather than outside the township," Toms said.

# Townships OK \$150,000 for sewer

Northville Township has joined Plymouth and Canton townships in approving an additional \$50,000 for the Western Townships Utility Authority.

The additional expenditure brings to \$120,000 per community the amount spent to date for the authority, which was created to explore sending sewerage flows to Ypsilanti.

The Michigan Water Resources Commission in February approved expansion of the Ypsilanti Community Utility Authority plant to handle the anticipated extra flows from the three townships, however, design of the pipes is still pending.

The money thus far approved is to cover preliminary engineering and legal fees thus far accumulated by

the authority, which is in the process of finalizing a contract with YCUA.

"We promised that before we spent a great deal of money, we would make sure that the project would be approved," said Robert Law, secretary and legal counsel to WTUA. "We have done that, but now we have an approved project and we can begin designing the project."

"It took us three cracks at the Water Resources Commission but they finally approved the project," Law said, adding that the main problem with approval from the commission regarded designing a project that would have a positive impact on Belleville Lake.

"As planned, not only Belleville Lake, but the Rouge River will

benefit," Law said.

Trustee Thomas Handyside praised the efforts of WTUA officials, including Supervisor Georgina Goss.

"A lot of people, and Georgina was in the forefront, spent a lot of time on this project," Handyside said.

He requested that the proposal be sent to the township water and sewer commission for its review and support.

"Back when we were messing around with super sewer, a heck of a lot of money went down the drain. That didn't happen with this project," he noted.

WTUA officials expect the Water Resources Commission to issue abatement orders for the project at its April meeting.

# Legg vows to continue fight at national GOP convention

Although U.S. Rep. Jack Kemp, Michael Legg's personal choice to win the Republican nomination for president of the United States, withdrew his candidacy, Legg said last week he intends to pursue his challenge to be seated at the national party convention in New Orleans.

Legg and 20 other delegates pledged to Kemp, 43 pledged to Pat Robertson and 13 who support George Bush were chosen by a convention held in Grand Rapids Jan. 29-30.

A separate slate of delegates, with the majority favoring Bush, was selected at the same time.

Legg said he intends to pursue his challenge and to ask that the delegation of which he is a part be seated on the convention floor.

Legg also has been chosen vice chairman of the delegation at a meeting in Livonia on March 5. Harry Vervser, 12th District Republican chairman, was chosen chairman of the delegation. Legg chairs the 2nd District Republicans.

Legg is officially to present the delegation's case for recognition to the national convention's credentials committee and to the Republican National Committee.

"It's a four-step process," Legg explained, adding that he intends to pursue the matter to the convention floor if necessary.

Noting that the delegates on March 5 passed a resolution pledging that the delegates would remain neutral if their favored candidates dropped out of the race prior to the national con-

vention, Legg said he would remain uncommitted going into the August gathering.

"It is possible that I will end up supporting George Bush. I've always liked him," Legg said.

Legg was a leader in an alternate state convention which was seated during the first night of the state gathering. However, the delegation lost its attempt to be seated during the regularly scheduled convention on Saturday.

# Cost of memorial goes up

Even though ground has yet to be broken for the project, the cost of a memorial to two former township employees has gone up.

Township trustees on March 10 unanimously approved an additional expenditure of \$64, bringing the total cost to the project to \$1,644.72.

The increased cost does not include memorial plaques or installation of the plaques which will memorialize former township manager Bruno

Schacchitti and Lorraine O'Neil, who worked part-time in the treasurer's office.

The memorial garden, to be constructed at the handicapped entrance to township hall, includes a variety of green and flowering plants as well as the plaques placed on boulders in front of the plantings.

Will Gertz, a member of the township beautification commission, is in charge of the project.

# 'Information' may cost residents

A four-property special assessment district, designed to provide sewer service to Stoneleigh/Smock roads, was dissolved by the township board of trustees March 10.

The request that the district be dissolved came from the property owners, who noted in a letter to the board that they were more interested in exploring the potential costs of the project than in actually asking that the district be created.

A number of the trustees expressed some reservations about withdrawing the project, especially after

noting that the township had expended \$2,000 in engineering fees.

"There must be a way to provide information to property owners before we go through an entire project," said Supervisor Georgina Goss. "This is not the first time this year that we have received a petition to create a special assessment district and then have the petitioners withdraw the request."

Thomas Handyside, the board's newest member and the chairperson of the Water and Sewer Commission noted that it would be possible for a

request to the commission to result in a rough estimate of costs before a lot of work had been completed.

"I think that would be logical and I think we can work something out," he said.

Clerk Thomas Cook questioned whether there should be a way to recoup some of the costs the township spends in creating a water or sewer district when the petitioners bow out once the district is created.

"It costs us money every time we create a district and we just can't afford to do that," Cook said.

2.) Membership of Commission: "... The Historic District Commission shall include the Mayor (or) member of City Council, at least two (2) members from a list of citizens submitted by a duly organized and existing preservation society or societies, and an architect duly registered in this state, if the person resides in the City and is available for appointment. Any remaining position shall be filled by interested and qualified residents."

Section 2. This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after enactment thereof and after publication thereof.

# Tree limbs plus power line equals Northville blackout

"It was an explosion. It all blew up."

That's how Mark Manghini described what happened in the vicinity of Allen and Novi roads last Friday when moving tree limbs hit a power line at about 4:26 p.m., cutting off electricity to more than 1,400 Detroit Edison customers.

Included in the blackout were Northville Downs, Moraine, Amerman, Cooke and Northville High schools, the entire downtown and the Michigan Association of Gift Salesmen building, Northville Square.

Power was restored to most customers by 6:13 p.m. said Bobb

Vergells, a Detroit Edison spokesman. An additional five customers were back on line by 7:30 p.m., but about 40 customers were without electricity until 2 a.m. Saturday, he said.

"From what we have been able to determine, tree limbs hit a wire in Allen/Novi Road area, burning the wire and stopping the electricity."

"There was a very large tree that needed to be cut down before we could fully restore power," Vergells added.

While Edison was able to provide the official information on what happened last week, homeowners in the area had their own reactions and concerns.

"It seems like it (power outages) always happen in this area," said Hank Gualdoni. "I was in the living room and I saw a flash, then I felt a vibration and I looked outside. The lines were down."

Scotty Martin-Dunn said she had been at the Community Federal Credit Union in Northville when the lights went out.

"I got my money, and headed home. As I got closer to my house, I saw the fire trucks turn down my street. Then, when I got really close, I saw them in front of my house. I just parked my car and ran," she said.

The downed wires were in Martin-Dunn's backyard.



## Board of education spot to open

Two four-year terms on the Northville Board of Education are scheduled to be contested June 13, when the district holds its annual school election.

Douglas Whitaker, who was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Christopher Johnson, announced that he will not run again. Whitaker had served 10 years on the board prior to his appointment.

Johnson resigned after being elected mayor of the City of Northville. Board President David Llewellyn

currently holds the other seat that will be decided at the June election.

Petitions from candidates seeking election are due in the Board of Education offices at 4 p.m. April 11, said John Street, the district's director of business and finance.

# Oakland residents may get new vehicle fee

# Obituary

Oakland County Commissioner John Calandro had good news and bad news for all Oakland County residents recently.

Calandro attended a city council meeting in Novi and spoke briefly about the possibility that exists for cities within the county to receive more county funds for the purposes of local road improvements.

These new funds would be attached

to a new fee, however. A fee that all vehicle owners in Oakland County would be required to pay.

Calandro explained that the recent transportation package passed by the state legislature allowed one local option for the purpose of raising funds for road improvements — the vehicle registration fee.

The money would come from a \$25 vehicle registration fee for each vehi-

cle registered in Oakland County. The Road Commission projects that the fee would raise \$18.5 million each year for the county, Calandro said.

Cities and villages would share in the money in relation to the funding formula already in place. Calandro estimated that the Novi could gain as much as \$250,000 a year under that formula.

The Oakland County Road Com-

mission has asked the Board of Commissioners to put the question to the voters in either the August or November elections. "There is no question it will be allowed to be placed on the ballot," Calandro said.

The debate now is over which election month. He asked the Novi city council to vote on a preference for either the August or November elections. He also asked them to consider

either a resolution of support for the fee or a resolution against the idea.

The council voted unanimously to send to the Board of Commissioners a resolution stating they were in favor of the fee being placed on the November 1988 ballot.

Calandro said he had a real problem asking the taxpayers for more money but added he did not know where the money would come from.

## Scholarships offered at Henry Ford college

Henry Ford Community College is accepting applications for scholarships to be awarded on the basis of academic achievement.

The scholarships, for the 1988-1989 fall semester, cover tuition and fees and some are targeted for students accepted into the college's honors program. Other awards are funded through the college's merit scholarship program. There also are eight privately endowed grants which range from \$500-\$1,000 annually.

To be eligible for the honors program awards, students should have scored in the 90th percentile on the ACT or SAT and must have at least a 3.0 grade point average for their high school work.

The merit scholarship program offers grants to students with a 3.0 grade point average, a 70th percentile ranking on the SAT and a minimum score of 22 on the ACT.

Students who have been out of high school for eight years or longer must take a competitive examination on the Henry Ford campus as well as meet with the merit scholarship director to be considered for that grant.

Students currently enrolled at Henry Ford must have completed at least one semester prior to applying, must have compiled a 3.5 grade point average and be interviewed by the merit scholarship director.

student, who has been having trouble in grasping math, finally understands what Janigian is doing.

"I had that happen just yesterday," he said. "I had a student who I knew was having difficulty. All of a sudden, she just got this big smile on her face. She understood what I was talking about."

Janigian also understands the importance of learning the basics before going on to new ideas and procedures, which is why he often is

reluctant to allow his students to use the calculators.

"I think, once a student understands the basic principals and can do the work, there is no problem with him or her using the crutch of a calculator. In fact, in my concepts class, I gave them a problem which they had to use it. But it can't be used in place of learning to add, subtract, multiply and divide, and that includes fractions and decimals," he said.

He also has some strong ideas

about parents helping their youngsters.

"My emphasis is that the kids show their work, and sometimes that's difficult when I'm teaching one method and the parents or older brothers or sisters have learned a different way of doing things."

"If a student is having problems, I want him to come to me first. But I do appreciate it when parents help. In fact, every week I try to give my kids a puzzle that encourages getting parents into the solution act."

### Find reasonable end to cemetery fight

We don't know exactly what it is about Rural Hill Cemetery, but the place seems to be a real sore point in relations between the city and the township.

The smoldering bad feelings over the cemetery lately have flared up again. This time, the fuel is an effort by the city to get a clear title to all of the cemetery — and, more importantly, an annexation attempt which likely will follow.

The cemetery sits partly in the city and partly in the township. This is the root of the problem. When the old Rural Hill Cemetery Association gave the cemetery to the city, it neglected to transfer formally the land in the township — even though, from the minutes of the association's meetings, it is very clear that was what the association members meant to do.

Technically, the association — which no longer exists — still owns a large part of the cemetery. The city has gone to court to clear up this title problem, and it shouldn't be any trouble. Not only did the association intend to transfer the land, the city thought it had — and has therefore been taking care of the land (and selling plots in it) for decades.

Once the city gets clear title, however, the council will probably consider annexing the part of land in the township. And that has township officials worried.

They shouldn't be. Although we dislike the general idea of one governmental unit claiming land from another, this petition would make sense. The city will own the land; it has cared for it, and most importantly, the only way to get to it is through the city. Therefore, if any police or fire emergency occurs, the city can get there a lot quicker than the township.

But we hope it doesn't come to that. In a letter, Township Attorney Ernest Essad Jr. briefly tossed out an idea we have advocated before: creation of a joint cemetery association between the city and the township.

This idea should be taken seriously. The recreation department and the library have shown that these shared services work very well in Northville. And the creation of a joint association to administer Rural Hill would solve all kinds of problems by (presumably) ending the rate dispute, easing the cost/maintenance burden on the city, and making sure that the best interests of the cemetery — not politics — determine where the city/township border should be. And if the border remains where it is, a joint association could easily set up some plan to include the entire cemetery in the city police department's jurisdiction.

Both city and township officials like to talk about cooperation as the prevailing attitude between their governments. We'd like to see them put that ideal into action.

### Board's generosity raises serious questions

Northville Township's volunteer firefighters have just received an \$850 gift from the board of trustees — matching money to purchase better quality fitness equipment.

There will be no opposition in this corner to firefighters, or anyone else for that matter, desiring to get and stay in shape. But there is a problem with the township spending the money for the project.

As Trustee Thomas Handyside pointed out, the board's approval for the equipment could be opening the door for additional requests by interested parties, including the water and sewer department personnel and township employees. What is good for one group is certainly valid for others.

In requesting the additional money, Fire Chief Robert Toms pointed out that fitness equipment could serve as a draw for the firefighters, all of whom are volunteers. Toms said that if the firefighters were working out in the township, they would be on hand for a fire.

Thus far, however, there have been no recorded complaints of firefighters not being on the scene of a fire. So, Tom's argument may sound good, but he has failed to provide documentation to back up his claim.

Toms told the board that if they approved matching the money the firefighters had collected, the equipment would be owned by the township, but would be under control of the fire department.

That's all well and good, but if the equipment is installed at the west end fire station, a building not currently in use, firefighters would have to unlock the building for others to use the equipment and, if no firefighter were available, no one could work out.

At a time when other, perhaps more universally beneficial projects and programs have been curtailed because of a general belt-tightening by the township officials, this expenditure seems ill advised.

### Spring is overdue

There have been signs around town that spring will be delayed this year.

Instead of crocuses popping their cute little heads up to greet war weather, they are still buried under the white stuff that hasn't had enough of a push to leave.

The thought of spring being postponed, for however short a time, is

enough to wish that the Tigers stay in Florida until May. And, given the way they are playing during spring training, that might not be such a bad idea. They can come home when they start winning consistently.

According to our calendars, Spring officially begins on Sunday. The groundhog didn't see his shadow, so the season was supposed to start early. We're ready.

## Don't move it

Today, for anyone with even a wee bit of Irish blood, it's St. Patrick's Day and a time for celebrating. For me, it's the one-month anniversary of a rear-end collision that has left me with a still unrepaired car and a headache.

There's also a lesson that I think others can learn from in my "incident." I'm calling it that because I'm well aware that to police departments who regularly have to deal with major accidents this is very minor.

However, to me the damage to my first new car in five years was far from minor. (My previous two cars, lasting four and five years, respectively, were traded in without a dent.) The incident occurred on Beck Road as I stopped at Twelve Mile before turning left to access the I-96. A pickup truck had been following me closely along Beck where I had my new "toy," the speed control mechanism, on because it is too easy to exceed the 40 mph.

I do not know whether the young man was unaware that Twelve Mile is not a yield situation but a stop, (which the officer who took the report was aware of.) At any rate, I stopped as there were two eastbound vehicles approaching and another coming westbound on Twelve. The young man says he stopped, but the insurance investigator and body shop employees say I had a real hit. The damage amounts to almost \$1,000 and includes a dented trunk and fender as well as rear lights and shocks.

Getting the parts has caused the delay. I'm amazed that Chrysler doesn't have parts available for a car I've had less than a year and, if there's anyone out there in

Chryslerland who can expedite them, I'd be very grateful.

But the reason I'm detailing my woes is to warn others not to do as I did. After the collision, the driver of the pickup phoned from his vehicle to the Novi Police Department and, he said, was told it would be some time before a car could be dispatched. It was suggested that, if the vehicles could be driven, we could make the report at the police station. This we did. The driver of the pickup was searching for his registration in his vehicle after making the initial report and the officer taking it told me there was no need to wait. That was my second mistake.

When I returned the next day to obtain the report for insurance purposes, I found no ticket had been issued. The officer since explained that "It was an accident, not an intentional act." It was a dry day — but I might have felt better if the driver had skidded on ice. Later in talking to the traffic bureau detective I became very aware that one should never leave the scene. Let the police inspect the damage and see where the cars are located.

Better yet, Novi officer Ralph Fluhart says, it may be possible there will be a witness. Sometimes, he explains, a witness will not bother to report what happened to police unless the police are on the scene.

While I feel the other driver was traveling too closely behind me and should have been ticketed for not having his vehicle under control, I do feel the Novi police have been polite if lenient.

Now, if I could only get Chrysler to make replacement parts, I could again be proud of my almost new car.

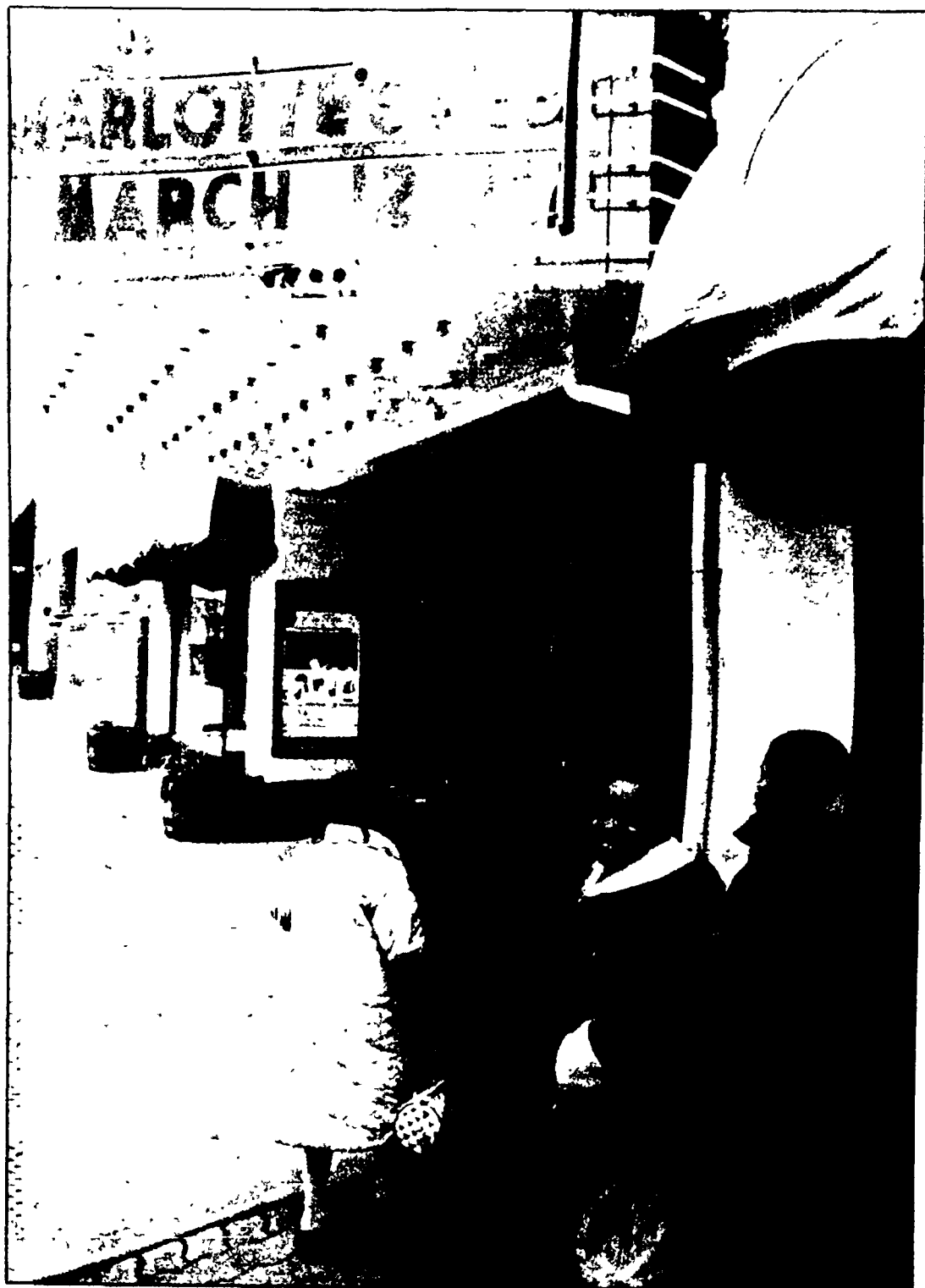

## Youth, counselor forge bond that goes beyond counseling

This is another in a continuing series of columns written for The Record by Mary Ellen King, director of the Northville Youth Assistance Program.

The people most affected by the Northville Youth Assistance Program are the youths who are involved in the program. I recently spoke with one youngster, I'll call her Sue, about her feelings toward the program and how the program is benefiting her.

Sue is 14 years old and has been meeting with her volunteer, whom I'll call Brenda, for about six months. Their relationship has developed from a counselor/student type relationship to an actual friendship. Sue says that talking to Brenda is "like talking to an older friend you can trust".

"She is kind of like a mom but you don't always feel comfortable telling your mom everything that you can tell someone else."

The NYA program tries to pair youths and volunteers who have something in common. This method of matching makes it easier for both the volunteer and

the youth to feel comfortable with each other. When the youth and the volunteer share common interests, it is easier for them to find things to do during their weekly meetings.

For example, Sue and Brenda find time between classes and school for going together to the mall, out to lunch, to the park and even horse-back riding. At these meetings Brenda listens to what is going on in Sue's life and helps Sue make decisions that are best for her.

Sue says that she likes talking to Brenda, as opposed to a counselor or parent, because Brenda doesn't try to make decisions for her. Rather, Brenda helps Sue make decisions for herself. She helped Sue establish goals such as improving her grades and eliminating alcohol use.

Brenda "is older and has already been through what I'm going through now," Sue says.

Sue thinks that the NYA program has been really worth while for her. She thinks that many teenagers in Northville can benefit from the program since it operates on a more personal level

than most other programs. Sue even urged some of her own friends to find out about the program.

Sue said she feels that volunteers can especially help kids who are depressed, have drug problems, or who have problems relating to their parents. The volunteers can also help reinforce the idea that youths don't have to succumb to negative influences of their friends.

Sue describes Brenda as "someone I can confide in and tell things that I don't even tell friends my own age."

"We call each other between our weekly meetings just to say, 'hi.'"

Sue hopes to stay friends with Brenda after she is no longer officially in the NYA program. Overall, she says the program has really worked for her. She feels that she has gained much from it, and that many other kids like her can as well.

plementation of its latest ruling regarding asbestos.

Bell said he intended to write U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell in support of a pair of bills aimed at delaying implementation of the EPA rules.

"I don't think we can eliminate the rule, but we can delay its implementation," Bell said, noting that one bill currently pending in Congress would delay implementation about a year and a second would delay it for 18 months.

John Street, director of business and finance for the district, said that no money has been allocated in this year's budget for the asbestos program.

Nor would he estimate the actual cost to the district.

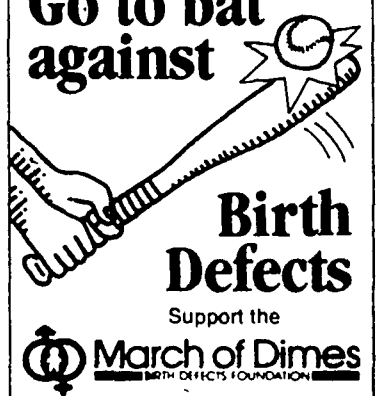
"We'll probably have to wait and see what the bids come in at," he said.

The bids are expected to be received on Friday.

"One of the big problems with this program is liability insurance," Knighton said. "In talking with representatives of one company with which we have worked, I found out that their liability is more than \$100,000 annually."

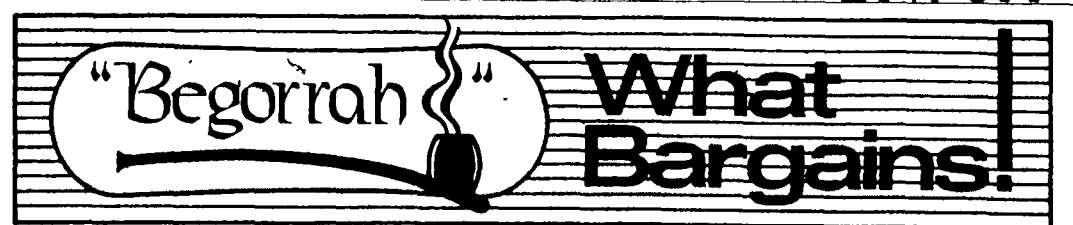

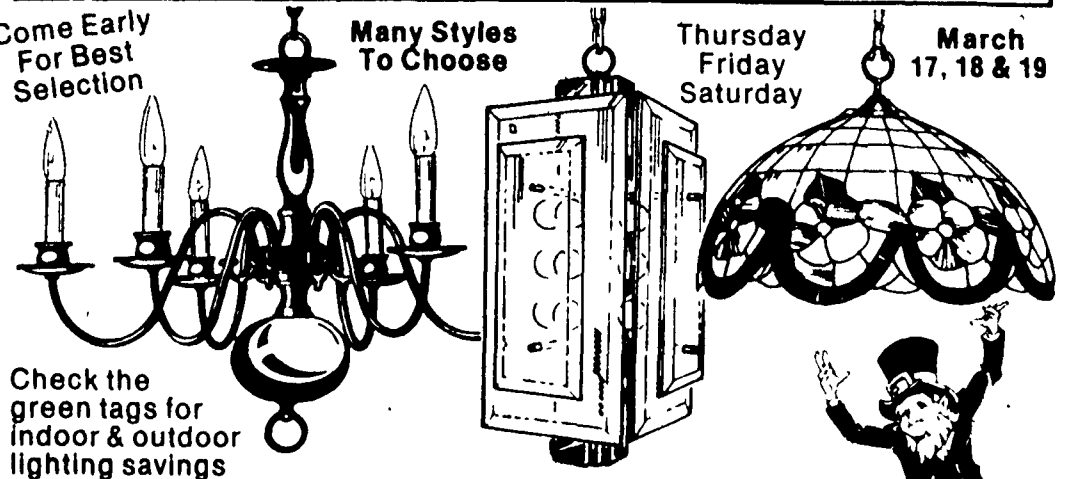

## Century-old chain keeps up-to-date with new stores

The Dancer's Fashions chain is over a century old, but that hasn't stopped the business from keeping up with what's new.

The Dancer's store in South Lyon, celebrating 33 years in its own right, moved from the Central Business District to Brookdale Square Shopping Mall at 22245 Pontiac Trail this past November. The move was made to expand and modernize the business.

"We have the look of a mall store now," said store manager Linda Martin.

"We have a lot more to offer the customer. Our competition is the malls, either Twelve Oaks or Briarwood. We are another alternative to a mall because we have the quality range of a mall store, but on a smaller scale. Customers can stop and shop. They don't have to walk for miles all over the mall."

There is still a very new look about the place. The appearance is neat and uncluttered, and the merchandise is well-displayed in the spacious store, which is 33 percent larger than its predecessor.

Dancer's line of clothes for infants and toddlers, boys and girls, and men and women has also been expanded. Older women (senior citizens) can now take advantage of brands such as Co-Co-Knits and Fire Islander.

Milford area shoppers are familiar with the Dancer's chain as well. The store in Milford Village at 435 N. Main has been open more than 10 years and is scheduled to undergo some remodeling and expansion work within the next six months. The company is currently working to make the appearance of the stores more uniform.

All 29 Dancer's stores — from Port Huron to Jackson to Napoleon, Ohio — were remodeled in 1987. That's certainly a far cry from the original Dancer's, which opened in Stockbridge, Mich., in 1884 as a general store dabbling in notions, buttons and fabric. Professional buyers out of New York now supply the store's merchandise.

One thing has remained consistent since that time, however, and that is family ownership. W.J. Dancer opened the first store. Winston Dancer is

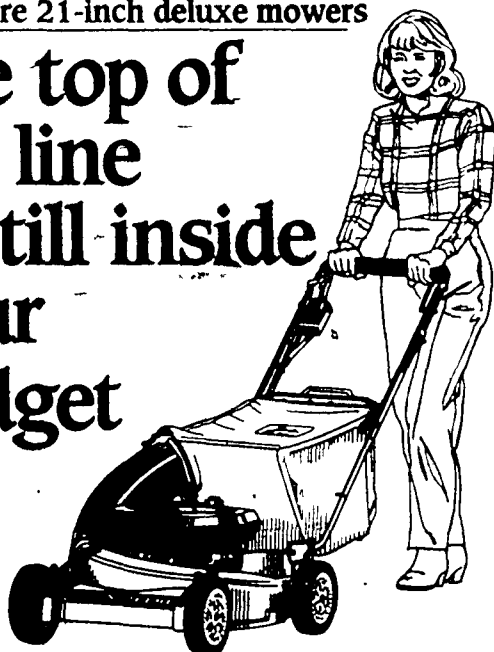

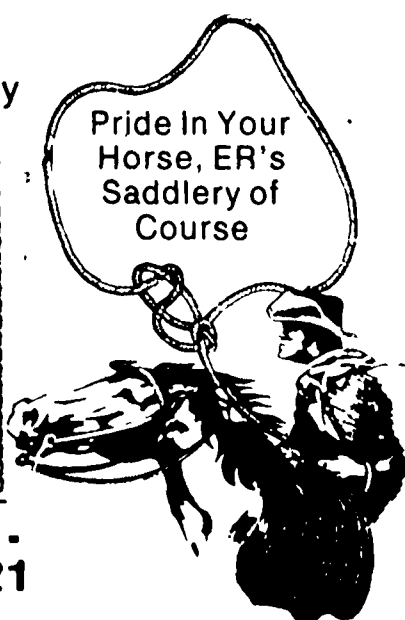

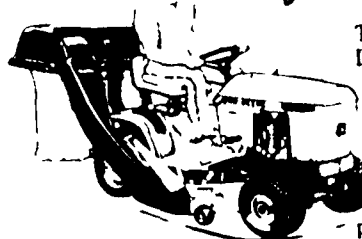

# Supermarket chains faced with personnel shortages in future

Recent contract settlements and the continuing decline of chain grocery stores in the Detroit metropolitan area may result in personnel shortages in the future, according to Ray Schorejs, Division Director for Supermarket and Sales for Roth Young of Detroit.

Roth Young, whose Michigan office is in Southfield, is the country's largest personnel agency recruiting for supermarkets.

"This industry used to be very attractive," said Schorejs. "Good potential for higher wages and promotions, and a good benefit package attracted a lot of people to the grocery industry, but that just isn't the case anymore."

According to Schorejs, working for a grocery store has become very unattractive because wages at entry level positions have decreased and benefit packages are no longer as complete as they used to be. And, for the individual looking for advancement, the opportunities are scarce.

"In the 1970s we had over 400 chain stores in the five-county area," he said. "Today, there are only about 190 chain stores and that means a lot less management positions available and much less room for advancement."

A recent wage and salary survey conducted by Roth Young Personnel Service, Inc., a coast-to-coast recruitment leader in food, retail, hospitality and health, shows that salary levels in the grocery industry are remaining pretty stagnant or decreasing.

"Starting salaries for many hourly positions are lower than they were in the 1970s," said Schorejs. "A meat wrapper used to be in at about \$7.75 an hour and could expect to work his or her way up to meat manager in two or three years. Today, that person starts at \$4.40 to 5.50 an hour and it takes much longer to work up to that higher salary level."

And because of the decreased number of positions, Schorejs added, many people won't have the opportunity to advance.

With the decrease of the larger chain stores, the independents have grown in number over the past few years, but they still can't offer the salary levels found at the bigger chains and their numbers aren't enough to make a real difference.

"The wages at the independents are substantially

lower than the larger chains," said Schorejs. "So, even though there are some employment opportunities there, it still doesn't help the industry's poor image."

Attracting new people to the industry is only half the problem.

"The rate of turnover in this industry has become a real problem," Schorejs said. "Right now most grocery stores in the metro-Detroit area are experiencing a tremendous turnover, and to a lesser extent, cashier shortage because they just can't keep people. And it's only going to get worse during the holiday season."

Although some of the chains have increased earnings for certain management positions, it isn't enough incentive to attract new people into the industry.

"Even if you get to a management position, the incentives for staying are low," said Schorejs. "You work very long hours and there's not much potential for advancement at this level because Detroit has lost most of its corporate headquarters."

Several chains used to be headquartered in Detroit, said Sam Skeegan, president of Roth Young Personnel of Detroit. "When we opened our Michigan office in 1970, Wrigley's Great Scott, Chatham and Borman all had their headquarters here. Now, only Farmer Jacks is left."

Consequently, Skeegan said, the corporate positions just aren't here anymore and the ones that remain offer much lower salaries than they did eight years ago.

"The corporate positions, like Grocery Director or Produce Director, which could pay \$70-\$90,000, do not exist like they once did," he said.

Schorejs said that although a serious shortage of personnel at the management level has not occurred yet, the recent buy-out option could easily result in this problem in the future.

"We still don't know what the overall affect of the buyouts will be," he said. "But a lot of people are choosing that option and as people leave the industry, who is going to replace them? Working for a grocery store is not attractive anymore and the industry is not attracting new people. The shortages that we're seeing at the bagger level may spread to the management positions in the next few years."

presently chairman of the board of the chain.

He's more than just a figurehead, too, as he's developed the "Winston Line" of slacks, dress shirts and ties for men. Winston's sons, Doug and Dennis, are president and treasurer, respectively. The company's headquarters are in Mason, Mich.

A former hairdresser, Martin worked in the area for five years. She's worked at Dancer's more than two years and assumed her role as manager last June.

Her husband's family owns Martin's Hardware, a long-standing and well-known business in the South

Lyon area. Martin works under district manager Mary Curry of the Howell store. Her assistant manager is Pam Cook.

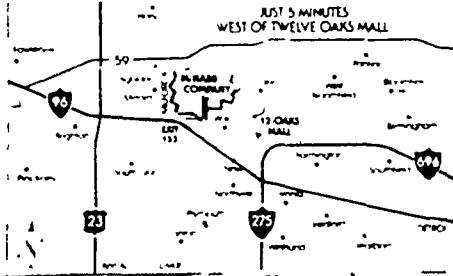

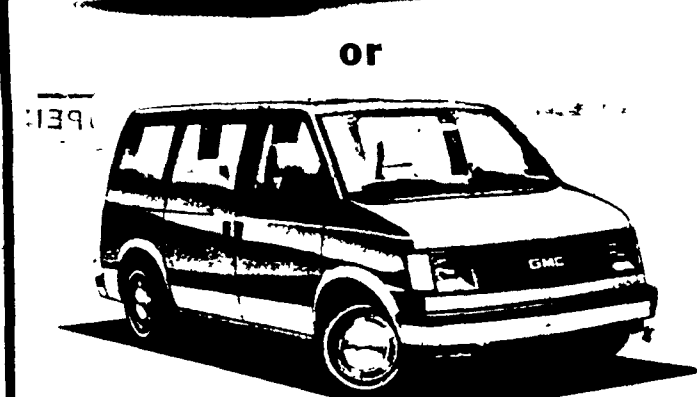

## Living a log cabin lifestyle

They call it a lifestyle. The log cabin lifestyle. To Susan and Carlos Ruiz of Novi, it's more like a dream come true. The twosome has been planning, saving and waiting for eight long years for the right time and place to build their own log house.

The Ruizes and their daughter Angela, 2, moved from their first home in Allen Park to the Rocky Mountain log house that sits on a wooded 2.35 acre lot just west of Beck Road on Nine Mile in Novi.

"We met in school, said let's get married and build a log house and eight years later we did it," Susan said, explaining the commitment the couple felt toward the project. Commitment was needed as the couple did much of the work on the house themselves. "In October 1986 we bought the lot and in May of 1987 we started chopping down trees," Carlos explained. Carlos was the one who cleared the site for the garage and house, with Susan helping out. It took three weeks to get the site cleared. The trees were cleared only enough to tuck in the house. Carlos was bound by the same woodlands ordinance that binds any construction in Novi, and when visitors stand on the Ruizes' back porch and gaze across the "lawn," what they see are trees and more trees.

"We didn't want to take any more trees than we had to," Susan said. The house is surrounded by oaks, maples and some ash trees.

Don't think this was something the Ruizes were prepared for — Carlos is a psychologist and Susan is a social worker — not exactly the training

necessary to become first-class lumberjacks and house builders. "When I first started I didn't know how to use a chain saw," Carlos said smiling. "The first time I used it, it got stuck. A neighbor came and helped me out."

Learning by doing has become the family motto. Carlos was on site during the entire construction process and worked right along with the crews. The Ruizes feel that they know their house inside out. It took four months for the actual construction of the log house.

The period of time it took before the house was habitable was "extremely trying," Susan noted. The couple had

moved from their home into a one bedroom apartment and were juggling jobs, baby care and house building. "We do not regret it. We cried a lot, but it was worth it. I'm glad we did it — I almost think we'd do it again," Susan said.

"This is heaven to me. To look out my windows and see what I see — it's like living up north," she said. The couple said they enjoy the quiet and wooded feeling their house and site afford them, but love the fact that they are so close to work and play areas. "It's the best of both worlds," Susan said.

Log homes are made from kits. Each log home company markets various

floor designs and building methods. The Ruizes chose a Rocky Mountain Log Home. According to Carlos, not one green tree was used to make the logs for the house. "Not one live tree was cut down," he said. All the lumber came from dead wood, due to fire or "bugs eating the bark off of a tree," he said.

What makes dead wood so important to a log home is that the wood is completely dried out before it is used for construction. A log which is not totally dry will twist after construction as the moisture leaves.

The logs are stacked and spiked with 12 inch spikes every three feet. There is some settling due to the enormous weight of the logs, but no twisting, Carlos said. Each log is attached to the one beneath it with a compound made of five ingredients plus an insulating foam and a metal sheath that fits in a groove drilled into the logs.

"This house is permanent," Susan said. "It's a fantasy of mine to have a house that I could pass down to my children — that would be there for my grandchildren."

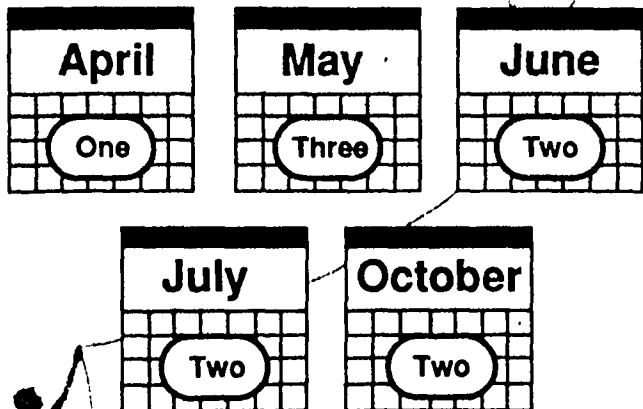
"A log home like this, with today's protectant and sealer on it, will be here in 300 years," Carlos said.

When it comes to decorating the interior of a log home one thing takes priority, the natural beauty of the logs which make up almost all of the wall space and ceiling. Huge wooden beams stretch across the ceilings in all rooms, and wooden windows and doors complete the picture. "Wood is much more interesting than dry wall," Susan said.

The Ruiz home is 1,700 square feet and has three bedrooms and two-and-a-half baths.

## It's four o'clock — time for tea

In the middle of a Thursday afternoon, local residents will have a chance to take a spot of tea, English-style.

Ruth Simmons, who spent three years living in England, brought her expertise and English teapots to Northville on March 10, giving hints in brewing and serving tea properly to the 18 women attending the inaugural tea at Edwards Caterers, 116 E. Dunlap.

Edwards provided the tea sandwiches and delectable edibles which usually accompany tea in England, but for many Americans, learning to brew tea can be an experience.

"In England, about the only place they don't serve tea is in the pubs, and there you get coffee," Simmons explained. "Even the queen serves tea, and she makes hers just as I'm going to explain today."

Simmons noted that there are two main types of tea — fragrant teas, such as Earl Grey, and strong teas, such as English breakfast. And there is a proper way of serving each.

"For the strong teas, you place one teaspoon of tea per person and one for the pot into your teapot, add water that has come to a steady boil and then steep the tea 3 to 5 minutes.

"For the aromatic teas, you add one teaspoon of tea to your water. And they are both served with milk. For the more aromatic tea, lemon also is used," she said.

Although Simmons said "high tea" is primarily

a working class event, her experiences have revealed that almost everyone has tea about 4 p.m.

"With high tea, you usually include some meat and a more substantial meal, but tea is often served with sandwiches or scones and some other sweets," she said.

Simmons brought her own teapot, similar to those used in England. "The difference in my pot is that once the water boils, the pot automatically shuts off and the boiling stops. That way, you don't lose oxygen from the water, and the oxygen, interacting with the tea leaves, is what gives the different teas their distinguishing taste."

Also, Simmons noted, in England, they use tea leaves, rather than bags, which necessitates the person pouring to strain the tea between the pot and the individual tea cups.

"The main thing to remember about serving tea is that the pots and tea service don't have to be elegant. It can be just nice," she said, noting that she often uses ironstone pots instead of English bone china in her own home.

Even so, she says, she still has the teapot itself, an extra pot of hot water (in case the tea is too strong), a strainer to keep tea leaves from floating in the individual cups, and a number of tea cozies large enough to fit over the pot in which the tea is steeping but small enough to keep the tea warm.

As for the types of tea, Simmons said people actually have tea boxes in which they store their different teas.

## Sesquicentennial poetry book generates statewide attention

"Town One South," a book of original poems about Northville commissioned as a local sesquicentennial project, is now in process of publication and should go on sale soon, possibly in April, Northville Arts Commission publicity director Jackie Murray reports.

Northville poet Kathleen Ripley Leo has been commissioned by the Northville Arts Commission to write the book of poems. The project, Murray notes, is considered one of Michigan's most exciting sesquicentennial projects and is receiving statewide recognition.

The current issue of "The Michigan Connection," a publication of the Michigan Council for the Humanities, showcases Michigan writers in "Literary Michigan," a special edition of the publication featuring Michigan writers and their accomplishments, including Leo.

In reviewing contemporary Michigan poetry, Herb Scott, professor of English, Western Michigan University, dedicates a good bit of print, Murray points out, to Northville's Fine Arts Series I Project.

"One Town South"

He commented, "Kathleen Ripley Leo has been commissioned by the Northville Arts Commission to write a book of poems about Northville. This latter is certainly one of Michigan's most exciting sesquicentennial projects."

"The parts of the manuscript I've seen indicate the book will be of interest far beyond the reach of Northville."

The review includes the poem, "Ovenshire"

*I was a funeral director, drying the tears of those left behind, doing the duties and the comforts*

*driving the wagon to Rural Hill and Cady Street That was my downfall,*

*the other horses coming up behind*

*and passing us and I blame my horse,*

*her proud spirit and gray hide*

*She caught the racing fever each time*

*and we'd speed down the streets casket bouncing, bereaved in*

shock

*The fairground became a race track,*

*I see, about time, too*

"The Northville Arts Commission is indeed excited about the literary attention our project has generated and we expect the sale of the book to be a great success," Murray says.

"One Town South" is now in process of publication. It is planned that the 72-page bound edition will be available in late April.

Cost is \$8 plus tax (\$8.32). Books can be ordered now through Northville City Hall Call 349-1300 and ask Bev Dennis to reserve a copy.

The project has been made possible by the generosity of the community, Murray explains. Funding has been by grants, private and corporate donations.

The poems have been illustrated by Northville artist Allen Berlinski.

## Baptist Church schedules Jews for Jesus speaker

"What do the Jewish Passover and Jesus' Last Supper have in common?"

The Rev. Stephen Sparks, pastor of First Baptist Church of Northville, reports that David Brickner, staff evangelist with Jews for Jesus, will answer that question as he presents "Christ in the Passover" at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, March 22, at the church, located at 217 N. Wing.

The purpose of the "Christ in the Passover" presentation, Sparks says, is to enhance the Christian understanding of the New Testament by showing the Jewish background for the Communion celebration. Ancient and modern Jewish customs will be discussed and described with an emphasis on the aspect of redemption.

A table will be set with traditional Jewish Passover items, including representative foods which will be explained, but not eaten.

Sparks notes that members of the Jews for Jesus group have given this demonstration in more than a thousand different churches. It originally was written in 1956 by Moishe Rosen, founder and executive director of Jews for Jesus. It was abstracted from the writings of the late Rabbi Leopold Cohn, who came to faith in Jesus in 1894 and died in 1936.

Dr. Rosen, Sparks says, contends that some of the most important elements of Christian doctrine, such as the Trinity, the principle of substitutionary atonement and salvation through a personal relationship with the Messiah, are implied in the Seder (Passover feast) as observed by Orthodox Jews.

Sparks explains that Jews for

Jesus, an evangelistic agency, is best known for its creative methods and materials. Its literature, called "broadside," deals with contemporary themes ranging from nuclear disarmament to home computers.

Those attending the special program at the church will have an opportunity also to examine some of the literature published by Jews for Jesus. The program is open to the general public and Brickner will answer questions.

# Stirring words of Churchill evoked by town hall speaker

When James C. Humes strolls to a podium to talk about Sir Winston L. S. Churchill, his audiences soon begin to feel they are listening to the British statesman.

After he told his Northville Town Hall audience that people think Churchill was a born leader and natural speaker, Humes noted that "nothing could be farther from the truth."

"Churchill never attended a university — because he couldn't get in. The first time he spoke in the House of Commons, he fainted for fear."

As he told of the little boy Churchill away at school and missing his nanny, Humes — who resembles the former British prime minister in girth — lisped in first person. "I had no nanny and no poetry."

"This little boy would memorize poetry to recite himself to sleep," Humes recounted, mentioning that Jennie Churchill, his American mother, never picked the boy up for Christmas holidays. It was his nanny's picture that was placed on his desk.

"His father had only one conversation with his son. It was when he was playing with his toy soldiers. He asked if Winston would like to be a soldier. The boy said yes," Humes related.

Humes said that, for a young man like Churchill, there were only three careers open — the law, the clergy or the military. Winston's father, Lord Randolph Churchill (1849-95), declared that Winston was "too stupid for the law and too noisy for the clergy."

In addition, Humes relates, "The only communication he ever got from his father was a card enclosed with a pocket watch. It read, 'For a second rate performance, a second hand watch.'"

Still, Winston treasured the watch, Hume said, and when he dropped it in a small lake, arranged to have a canal dug and the water diverted by the military until he could retrieve it. By this time, Winston had decided he wanted to be a politician but had no money. He decided he would write a book to raise the funds.

In India on Christmas holiday Winston went to Afghanistan into "a scene like a Wild West movie," Humes continued.

Humes was a Churchill without a cigar as he relayed Churchill's comment, "There's nothing more exhilarating than to be shot at without results."

Churchill also volunteered in the Sudan where he rode in his first cavalry charge — and the last one in history — against whirling dervishes

with sharp swords.

Churchill then wrote a book of his adventures — and quit the army to become an international war correspondent in the Boer War.

"He returned to find himself a hero and wrote two more books," Humes said.

With the proceeds from his books, he had enough money to stand for Parliament, taking his seat in the House of Commons in Queen Victoria's Parliament.

"He tried to imitate his father and grew a mustache, but his sandy red hair was unequal to the task," Humes noted.

In working on an overhaul of the navy, Churchill was in Glasgow for a ship christening when a representative of the Women's Christian Temperance Union chided him about christening the ship with champagne.

Churchill defended the practice, saying, "She has her first sip of wine and proceeds on water ever after."

In 1931, on a speaking tour in Alberta, Can., a waitress offered Churchill a drink which was accepted. A clergyman then noted, "I would rather commit adultery than take a drink."

Humes related that Churchill quickly called back the waitress, "Come back, Lassie, I didn't know I was being offered a choice."

Humes offered many other familiar and not-so-familiar Churchill comments, including an encounter in Piccadilly with George Bernard Shaw. Offering two tickets to his new play to Churchill, the playwright said, "Bring a friend — if you have one."

Churchill replied he was busy opening night but would like to attend the second night — "if there is one."

But Churchill's most memorable words were after the Germans rolled into Poland in 1939. He was not an appeaser like Chamberlain who was lauded as "achieving peace in our time."

"You did us a dishonor, we shall have war," Humes recalled Churchill vehemently declaring.

The foreign office was pleading that a surrender be negotiated when British troops were cut off at Dunkirk, Humes reported, as the British prayed for a miracle to bring the troops back.

That miracle came in the shape of the fog. Under its cover fishermen in their dories brought the soldiers back, one by one and two by two.

It was then Churchill said: "We shall fight in the beaches, we shall fight in the landing grounds, we shall fight in the streets and in the fields, in the hills..."

At this point, Humes said, Churchill

stopped and cried for a full minute before continuing, "We shall never surrender."

The House of Commons rose to its feet at the speech. And when the BBC version reached America, Franklin D. Roosevelt told Harry Hopkins, "Britain will never surrender. It's not like putting money down a rathole in France."

In addition, Humes said, the Germans delayed landing in Dover in the belief that "behind every farmer was a pitchfork."

"Because one man made himself master of the English language, he saved the land," commented Humes.

As the Royal Air Force Spitfires shot down the German planes Churchill watched red buttons being placed on the map at the strategic command headquarters and observed, "Never has so much been owed by so many to so few."

Continuing his account of the statesman's mastery of words, Humes recalled that the demarcation line on the map (between Western Europe and the Russian zone of influence) extended from Poland to the Balkans. Churchill looked and gravely said, "The iron curtain has descended across Europe."

The words, Humes said, galvanized the free world into action.

But, when Churchill once was asked about what was his greatest speech, he replied:

"It was in a gazebo in a rainstorm in 1907 when I asked Clementine for her hand. It must have been my greatest because she accepted."

Humes, a lawyer by profession who has been a presidential speechwriter and advisor to such presidents as Nixon and Ford, told those attending the celebrity luncheon afterward at the Sheraton Oaks that he has been married to a lawyer for 31 years and they are parents of two daughters. One is a lawyer and the other a student at Wellesley where she has had two Shakespearean roles this past year.

Humes said his father, a judge, died when he was eight years old. His mother was a school teacher. When he was offered a scholarship to a school in England, she had urged him to take it.

It was at that time he was invited to the home of a classmate where the queen was entertained. He found himself dancing with the then-26 year old queen.

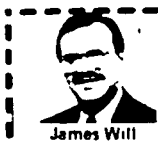
Most recently, Hume said, he had been a consultant for candidate George Bush.

When he met Churchill, he was introduced as "a young man who wants to go into government." Churchill's advice: "Study history."

Granger's childhood was spent in Hollywood's movie colony. As a child she appeared in Son of Lasse, Abbott and Costello in Hollywood, The Fuller Brush Man and others. She attended Mills College and graduated

from the University of Pennsylvania.

She has worked in radio, television and public relations. Her articles have been published in Redbook, Family Circle, Cosmopolitan and The New York Times.

Currently, she is the on-air entertainment critic for WICC Connecticut and WMCA New York.

Phil Marcus Esser will be the March 9, 1989, speaker. It has been said that, if Detroit has a Mr. Cabaret, it is singer-director-composer Phil Marcus Esser. After more than 20 years of performing, Esser has become Metro Detroit's busiest and most versatile producer of musical entertainment.

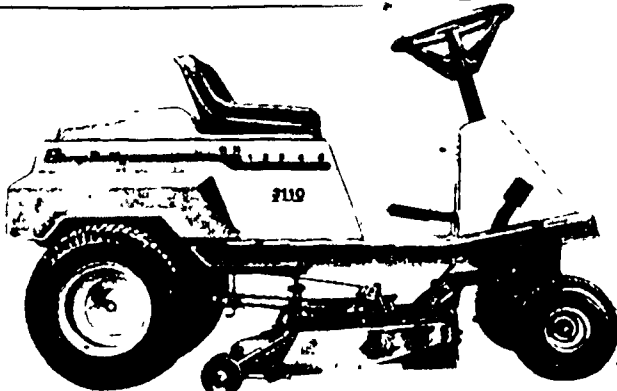

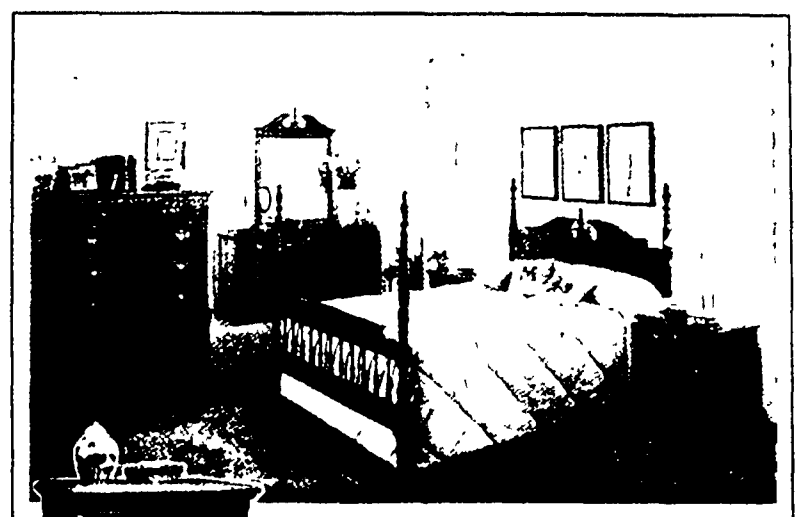

## New performing arts theater opens

An old movie theater — in suburban Livonia, no less — might seem like an odd place to find people like Wayne Newton, Patti Page, and the Temptations. But all of them — as well as Donald O'Connor and Debbie Reynolds, Jack Jones and Bobby Vinton — have scheduled appearances at the Omni Star Performing Arts Theater on Plymouth Road.

Formerly the Mai Kai Movie House, the theater recently received a complete makeover with the installation of new carpet, new seat covers and a remodeled lobby. Teamed with its new appearance, the movie house now has a new function — serving as a showcase for performing artists.

Kathryn VanSickle, director of public relations for the theater, explained that when the movie house was constructed in 1962, the owners had plans to eventually convert it into a performing arts theater so a lot of "extras" were built in.

Those extras included an orchestra pit, a deep stage and wings on either side of the theater where pin rails are used to hook up scenery. With everything already in place, the movie house just needed some polish and remodeling before the conversion to a performing arts theater took place.

VanSickle said the movie house's transformation into a theater will attract top-notch performers to the area throughout the year. For example, during the theater's grand opening on Feb. 25, Wayne Newton took the stage.

So far, the theater has been well-received, evident by Newton's sold-out performance a week before his act, according to VanSickle.

"The great thing about the theater is that no matter where you sit, there is a really good view," VanSickle said. "The back row is only 100 feet from the stage, so you can see from anywhere in the theater. People who visited it when it was a movie house would be surprised by the changes."

Bookings for summer entertainment are taking place now and will

continue throughout the winter, VanSickle said.

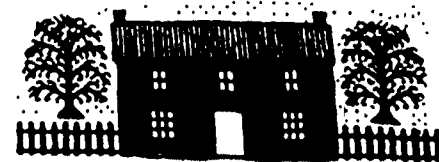

## Lutes examines 4-17 campaign

Looking back on the 1987-88 Northville basketball campaign isn't a very pleasant thing to do. The campaign was marred by numerous mishaps, mistakes, and failures — and the end result was a very disappointing 4-17 overall record.

Perhaps the season will be best remembered because of the coaching change. Omar Harrison, Mustang mentor for three seasons, stepped down from his post in the middle of the campaign for personal reasons and former Northville coach Tim Lutes took over on an interim basis. Needless to say, it was a very difficult situation for everyone involved.

"I wasn't aware, two weeks before I took over, that there were any problems that coach Harrison needed to deal with that would force him out of coaching this season," Lutes said. "I had been divorced from the basketball program for three years and hadn't seen these kids play since they were in seventh and eighth grade — so I didn't even know their names or their skill levels. It was a difficult situation."

Just about the time Lutes took over, a rash of injuries hit the team. Ron McDonald missed five games, Jeff Terwin missed two with a bad back and Chris House missed a game and was bothered in several others by the flu. Because all three were starters, it made the depth situation even worse than it was to begin with.

"Some people were upset that suddenly so many juniors were playing instead of seniors but a lot of those changes were forced on us," Lutes said. One of the highlights of the season came just after Lutes took over in mid-January. The Mustangs were struggling at 0-8 when they hosted Livonia Franklin on Jan. 22. The lowly Patriots took a commanding 30-15 lead at halftime and it appeared Northville had hit rock-bottom. But in the second half, the Mustangs staged a dramatic come-from-behind victory in overtime, to notch the first win of the season.

"That incredible win over Franklin was one of the highlights, no doubt about it," Lutes said. "The other was

probably the win over North Farmington."

On Feb. 9, Northville put together its best effort of the season to beat North, and the win helped spur the Mustangs onto three wins in the next six games. The fact that North Farmington went on to win the WLAA Tournament several weeks later was a tribute to the accomplishment.

"North Farmington lost to us and then they went on to win six in a row and eventually the conference tournament," Lutes said. "That was definitely a good win for us, mainly because (the players) took heed to my preaching that our defensive and rebounding efforts were more important than scoring a lot of points."

"During February, we had a span where we played pretty well. In addition to the three wins, we had two other games during that span that were good efforts against very good teams — Canton and Harrison. We were playing at or above our talent level, so even though we lost, I was pleased with it."

Unfortunately, the bad outnumbered the good for the season as a whole. The Mustangs were very inconsistent, and often times the team just didn't show up to play mentally as well as physically. It was a problem that Harrison and Lutes both had to deal with.

"It's something I'm not used to as a coach," Lutes said. "Coach Harrison struggled with it and so did I. For some reason, it was very difficult to get the kids to play together as a team — to get them to think unselfishly and for the team rather than their individual statistics. We had trouble finding players to accept their roles — especially off the bench."

The 1987-88 Mustangs weren't a close-knit group of players, and Lutes believes it had a lot to do with these problems. In addition, it was a team that was weak fundamentally and a team that didn't have outstanding talent.

"The kids had a strange attitude as a team," Lutes pointed out. "They didn't get along well with each other. I saw some in-fighting and a certain lack of team unity and it was

## Newton, Devyak compete at state meet

Underclassmen Eric Newton and Ron Devyak represented the Northville swim program at the MHSAA Class A State Meet in Ypsilanti last weekend, and even though neither came close to advancing to the finals (top 12), both will probably get another chance next season.

Mustang Coach Mark Heiden believes that Newton, just a freshman, will see many more state meets in his high school career. He was Northville's top individual all season and became the team's lone swimmer to make it to the state meet when he reached a qualifying cutoff in the 200-yard IM at the WLAA Conference Meet on Feb. 27.

In the preliminaries on March 11, Newton was a little overmatched among the state's best and ended up placing 28th overall out of 30 competitors in the 200 IM in a time of 2:05.07. Novi's Jon Cohen ended up taking first place in the event in the finals the following day.

"Eric's time was a little slower than his conference meet time, but that didn't surprise me," Heiden said. "He was fully tapered for the conference meet, but it's hard to maintain that for two weeks. It was a good effort and swim by Eric, considering he's just a freshman and was at his first state meet."

Diver Rob Devyak was the second Mustang qualifier. The junior advanced to Ypsilanti by placing among the top 12 at the MHSAA Class A Diving Regional on March 9 in Farmington.

At the regionals, Devyak placed eighth overall with a point total of 359.9 in 11 dives. Despite the high finish, the point total was still 27 points behind Devyak's second-place effort at the WLAA Meet.

"Rob was real consistent," Heiden said. "He went in, and did what he needed to do. He had confidence in himself and dove with confidence."

That's what a diver needs to do at this level."

Freshman Larry Osiecki also competed in the regional, but placed 17th after the first round and missed the cut by just three points.

"It was unfortunate for Larry because he dove very well," Heiden said.

At the state meet, Devyak ended up placing 20th out of 30 competitors. His five-dive total was 169.2.

"His first four dives were real good, but he had trouble on his fifth one," Heiden reported. "I was impressed with his attitude, though, considering he's never been in a meet like this. Overall, I was pleased with his performance."

Ann Arbor Huron ended up taking the team title with 136 points. Neighboring Novi placed eighth as a team with 47.

"I thought it was real good experience for both Rob and Eric," Heiden said. "They are both very anxious to get back to the state meet next year."

## Unlucky gymnasts place 12th at MHSAA Regional

No matter how you look at it, Northville didn't have much luck at the MHSAA Team Gymnastics Regional on March 12 in Hillsdale.

Junior star Wendy Beach missed her parallel bar mount for the first time this season. Lee LaChance tripped on the end of the floor exercise mat, Robyn Chatman had her vault effort tarnished when the approach mat came loose as she prepared for her launch. None of these things had ever happened before.

As a result, the Mustangs failed to top the 120-point mark for the first time in several weeks and had to settle for a 12th place finish. Northville's 119.85 was far behind the scores of WLAA rivals Plymouth Canton (132.05) and Plymouth Salem (128.2), but that was expected. But the Mustangs also finished in the shadow of Westland John Glenn (124.3) and Saline (120.35) — two teams Northville beat during the dual meet season.

"I was a little disappointed in our score," Mustang Coach Michelle Charniga said. "We had a couple bad mistakes that have never happened before. Some of it was nerves and some of it was unavoidable."

Northville began the meet with a fine team score of 31.10 in the vault. Beach led the team with an 8.35 —

which was good for 21st place overall among 80-plus competitors — Yvonne Beebe was next (8.1), followed by LaChance (8.05) and Robyn Chatman (6.6).

In the parallel bars, Beach was again the team's top scorer with an 8.05 — despite the missed mount. She ended up placing 11th overall, but would have been third — if it weren't for the early mishap. Beebe (7.45), LaChance (6.65) and Kathy Abraham (6.15) rounded out the Mustang competitors.

"After her fall, Wendy executed the rest of her routine beautifully, but the damage was done," Charniga said. "If her mount was clean, she'd have scored an 8.55."

"As a team, I know we can pull a lot better scores than we did. It wasn't a good event for us."

The situation only got worse in the balance beam. Beach fell four times in her routine and scored a season-low 7.1. Beebe led the team with a 7.65, LaChance (7.6) and Karen Pyle (6.65) followed as the team notched a low 27.00 in the event.

"As usual, it was a tough event for us," Charniga said. "Yvonne and Lee is OK but I don't know what happened to Wendy."

Beach then rebounded to give her best performance of the day in the

floor exercise. Her score of 8.5 was good for 10th place, but it was also her last chance to qualify for the state meet.

"I thought it was a great routine," Charniga pointed out. "To be 10th out of 81 isn't bad at all, but she was disappointed she didn't make it to the state meet. I kept telling her that there is always next year."

The rest of the Northville competitors in the floor exercise were Chatman (7.45), Beebe (7.35) and LaChance (7.15). In the all-around competition, Beach missed out on a top-six finish by just 1.5 points, but did lead the team with a 32.00 total. Beebe was second on the team (30.55) and LaChance third (29.5).

"It could have went better for us, but that's the way it is," Charniga explained. "The great gymnasts are at their best all of the time and that's what you need at a meet like this. There was a lot of pressure, but there was also a lot at the league meet and I thought there we handled that very well."

"Nobody qualified for the state meet and that was disappointing. I kind of expected Wendy to be there but her score in the balance beam hurt her chances for the all-around and her fall in the bars cost her too."

Jackson County Western took the team honors with a 137.5 points.

In late January and early February, Northville started to put it all together and reeled off three straight wins — all three coming against division foes. From there the squad won at a .500 clip the rest of the way, and sported good efforts at the Howell Invite, the WLA Meet and the MHSAA District Tournament. The Mustangs were one win away from advancing to the semifinals of the conference meet and beat a good South Lyon team in the districts before falling to number-one ranked Ladywood in the semis.

"If things would have gone a little different — especially early in the season — we could have easily been 8-2 in our division instead of 5-5," Osborn said.

Seniors Katie Brugman, Denise Akroush and Jeanine LaPrad provided the leadership and the skills, while underclassmen like Debbie Stevens and Nancy Belding chipped in along the front row to make Northville a respected team in the area.

Brugman ended up being the area's premier setter, but her value went a lot further than that. Osborn called her "a coach on the floor" and continually raved about her all season. Although it wasn't revealed during the campaign, Brugman competed all year with a bad back.

"She'd go to the chiropractor maybe two or three times a week to get her back straightened out," Osborn pointed out. "And she only missed one practice all season long. It was a very gutsy effort. I could tell

when it was bothering her but she never complained and played hard all the time.

"Usually, a setter either makes or breaks an offense and Katie did a great job for us. She's not a powerful hitter, but she's a smart hitter."

If Brugman was the Mustangs' back row expert, Akroush was the front-row counterpart. When Akroush got hot, she was unstoppable. In the win over South Lyon, Akroush registered an amazing 15 service aces.

"Denise was a one-person wrecking crew against South Lyon," Osborn said. "She was always very consistent as a server, and once she got used to playing in the back row, she was successful there too. I asked her to rotate all the way around in

our 5-1 system and she had some problems adjusting to it. But eventually, she came on a did a heck of a job."

Osborn is optimistic about his team next season. Junior regulars Becky Bajorek, Jill Connell, Stevens and Belding will all be back to form a good nucleus of returnees.

"Those four juniors have played an awful lot, so hopefully, we'll be a better team," he said. "I'm optimistic."

Osborn credits much of the team's improvement to volleyball camps many of his players attended in the off-season. Brugman went to Butler's Setters Camp and came back one of the area's best.

"I want our returning girls to go to volleyball camp and I want my setters to go to Butler's," he acknowledged. "The setting camp really helped Katie."

something we struggled with for the whole year.

"This team was weaker fundamentally than our teams of the past — we didn't pass or shoot the ball well and we didn't have great foot-speed. Put all those together, with our inability to play well together, and you have a major problem."

"You can overcome some of these things if you work like crazy — but we didn't do that all the time. We had a bunch of real quiet, nice kids on the team, but they weren't the kind to yell and scream and get each other fired up."

The team's top individual was 6-foot-5 junior center Chris House. He led the team in scoring (13.5 per game) and rebounding (7.5), but was

the team's only consistent performer. Eventually, opponents started to double-team House and employ sagging zone defenses on him, and it hampered his output late in the campaign.

"Chris was definitely our 'Mr. Inside' but we didn't have a consistent perimeter player to compliment him," Lutes said. "Chris is a good shooter but he needs to work on his

positioning around the basket. He's got work to do but he'll definitely be a key player next year."

With House, and other juniors like Heath Myers, Greg Price, Dave McKee and Mike Karlis returning, it ought to be a much better season next year. According to Lutes, Harrison will be back as coach with the task of turning around a program that's gone 12-30 the past two seasons.

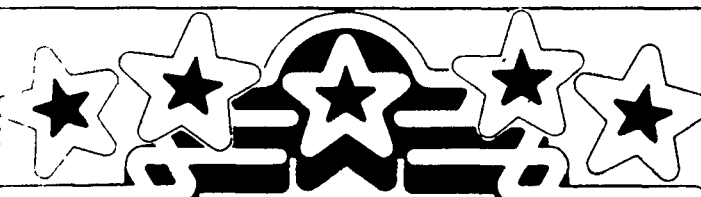

## Local student takes train to Olympics

Jeff Higgins is a fan of athletic competition and is also a rail buff. So when he jumped on a train several weeks ago and headed to Calgary, Alberta, to experience the Winter Olympics first hand, it was guaranteed to be an ideal vacation.

And the experience definitely didn't disappoint the 17-year old Northville High School senior — it was a trip he'll never forget.

Higgins, who is a member of the Mustang varsity swim team, left school and swimming behind for a week and a half to see the games and the sights. The Saddledome, the Corral, the Olympic Plaza — he saw it all. He also experienced what just about every other spectator in Calgary had to endure — canceled and postponed events.

The idea to make the trip to Calgary first entered Higgins' mind back in December. He has relatives who live in Calgary and when they offered to help him with tickets and accommodations, it was just a matter of time — about a month — before the plans became firm.

"My mother was raised in Calgary and we still have relatives there, so

that gave me the idea," Higgins explained. "They sent me some information on the Olympics and I decided it was an ideal chance to do it."

Higgins left Northville on Feb. 13, the day the Olympics officially started, and arrived via rail two days later. Although the winter games were the big attraction, Higgins enjoyed the train ride as well.

"The train had a sleeping car and made a lot of stops along the way," he pointed out. "I'm a rail fan, so it was fun — that's why I chose to take the train rather than drive."

Tickets for certain events were purchased ahead of time for Higgins by his uncle. The first two were ski jumping and the women's downhill skiing at Mount Nakiska, but both were eventually postponed due to high winds.

"For the downhill, we actually went out to the hill, sat down and watched a few skiers come down before they canceled it," Higgins said. "They sent us home and later there was a bit of a mix-up because they didn't announce right away when the downhill would be run again — I never did get back to see it."

"It was a little disappointing, but a lot of it couldn't be helped."

The first event Higgins saw in Calgary came in hockey. On Feb. 19, he watched from the Saddledome as Team USA polished off Norway, 6-3 in fourth-round action. He was also a spectator at the two-man bobsled event as well as the rescheduled ski jump competition.

"The ticket prices weren't that bad," he said. "The hockey tickets were about the same price we'd pay for an NHL game, but getting them

was sometimes a problem because of the great demand. I was lucky because my uncle got them through the company he works for."

The train ride back to Michigan took two days. He arrived in Northville on Feb. 23 with a lot of stories and experiences — not to mention a collection of Olympic pins, which was the current rage in Calgary.

"Calgary is actually a small-friendly town," he explained. "With the Olympics and all the tourists there, it was very fun and an enjoyable place to be. There was always something going on and the people were very friendly."

"I really enjoyed it — I would probably do it again if I ever had the chance."

For all the expectations prior to the trip, Higgins was surprised to find that the Olympics are organized and run just about the way he envisioned. And even though there weren't any great surprises or shocks, he had nothing but compliments for the host city and its people.

"It was interesting how they let the spectators roam around freely, like at the bobsled and skiing venues," Higgins said.

## 'Heavy metal' gyms unconventional

Under normal circumstances, Ron Love would be hard to overlook.

He's not particularly tall; just massive. Huge arms and chest. Huge, muscular legs, apparent even under his sweatpants. Rippling delts and pecs and lats and quads.

Ron Love is a professional body builder. One of the best in the world. Right up there with the likes of Lee Haney, the reigning Mr. Olympia.

But these are not normal circumstances. Sure, Ron Love would stand out in any crowd. But on a Thursday afternoon at the Powerhouse Gym in Farmington Hills last week, Love is only one of several huge, powerful men with massive arms and chests and legs standing around the front desk and talking about lifting weights.

The Farmington Hills Powerhouse gym is representative of a special type of facility which are known popularly as "heavy metal" gyms.

And if you're conjuring up the image of a Vic Tanny's or a more conventional gym, forget it. "Heavy metal" gyms are an entirely different breed of cat.

"It's the atmosphere... the seriousness and dedication of the people who come here that make 'heavy metal' gyms different than the others," said Jill Amsel, who owns the Powerhouse franchise for the Farmington Hills facility along with her husband Larry.

"People who use this gym come here to work out," added Mike Merfert, manager of the Farmington Hills facility and another fellow with huge rippling muscles busting out from under this cut-off sweatshirt.

"You'll find the same types of people in our gym as you'll find in any other gym," he continued. "We get businessmen, doctors and lawyers — people of all kinds. The difference is that they're serious about physical fitness and getting in shape. They're

here to work out; not for socialization."

"This isn't a fashion show," added Amsel. "The people who come here are here to workout. The girls who use this facility don't wear glitzy clothes and make-up. Nobody comes here to see who they can pick up."

The Farmington Hills Powerhouse has been in business approximately four years. Amsel and her husband purchased it approximately seven months ago, and business has been so

good they are planning to move to larger quarters in Hunters Square at the end of April or early May.

"We've got 3,100 square feet here and we'll have 9,600 square feet in the new gym," said Amsel. "We're adding tanning facilities and a sauna room along with an aerobics room."

"We simply need more room," she added. "At night, it gets really crowded in here. A lot of people want to work out in our facilities. We get new members almost every day."

Besides the dedication of the members, what makes a heavy metal gym different than more commercial operations?

Merfert said the biggest difference is the equipment. "You just won't find Nautilus-type machines in a heavy metal gym," he said. "We have a few machines, but they're all free weight machines. Everything else is free weights."

"All our barbells and dumb bells are black. We don't have any chrome equipment or neon lights. Everything is real basic; just what you need to workout with."

The problem with Nautilus-type machines, said Merfert, a former world-ranked kick boxer, is that they do not produce the same type of results that can be achieved with free weights. "If you want results, you have to use free weights," he said. "It's awfully tough to build on a Nautilus."

Amsel and Merfert emphasized that it's not necessary to look like Ron Love or Velma Buckles (a Wall-ed Lake woman who works out at the Powerhouse and recently joined the Women's Professional Body Building Tour) to join a heavy metal gym.

"Everybody here knows you have to start somewhere," said Amsel. "You should have seen me when I started. After my fourth child, I was walking through a mall when I saw a woman who looked like I wanted to look. It turned out to be Velma Buckles. I asked her how she did it, and she gave me a couple of passes to this place. I signed up and three months later my husband and I bought it."

"Everybody here is very supportive," she continued. "Everyone has to start somewhere; everyone knows what it's like to be starting out. As a result, they're always willing to offer help and advice to people who decide to do something about improving their physical fitness and the way they look."

## Fitness Tips

## Good nutrition can enhance training program

Spring stimulates us to exercise and participate in athletic events. Training and proper diet are important to optimize athletic performance. Diet supplies the body with the needed fuel sources, and training helps to improve the body's utilization of fuel.

The following is information on nutrition and upcoming events for the athlete.

While good nutrition can't replace a sound training program in preparing you for an event, it certainly can enhance your efforts and help to assure that you perform well.

Carbohydrates are the ideal energy fuel for the body. Carbohydrates are stored in the muscles

and liver as glycogen. To maximize glycogen storage (and thus maximize endurance) it is suggested that athletes eat a diet containing approximately 60-70 percent carbohydrates.

There are two types of carbohydrates — simple and complex. Simple carbohydrates are found in sugar, fruits and lactose. Complex carbohydrates should comprise the largest portion of the athlete's diet. Foods rich in complex carbohydrates include vegetables, cereals, breads, grains, beans, potatoes, and pasta.

Protein has a minor role as an energy source during exercise; however, it is needed to build, maintain and repair tissue. The athlete's diet should contain approximately 15 percent protein. Most people can obtain this quota by eating 4-5 ounces of

lean meat a day.

Fats, although needed in the diet in small amounts, are not thought to enhance performance. Fat intake may be anywhere from 15-25 percent of the athlete's training diet.

Although many racers skip breakfast before a race, the best thing to eat before a race is a moderate meal containing mostly complex carbohydrates. This should be eaten about three hours prior to running so it may mean rising extra early. The ultimate goal is to minimize the amount of food in your stomach while you exercise. You need the blood flowing to your muscles, not to your stomach to digest a big meal. Carbohydrates digest more quickly than fats and protein.

The most important supplement during an event is water. In events lasting more than 90 minutes, a carbohydrate snack may enhance endurance.

Once the race is over, enjoy yourself! Eat what you like, but remember the guidelines for your training diet. After an event you've depleted your muscles of glycogen and you need carbohydrates to replenish them.

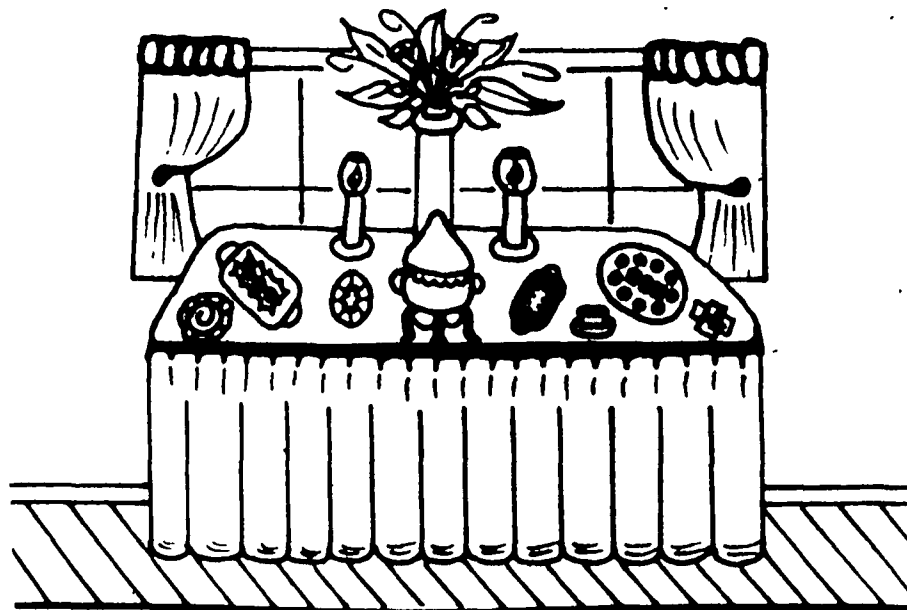

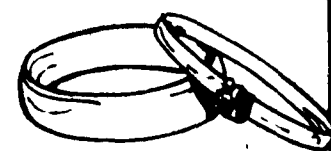

# Yuppies show love with diamonds

Gone are the days of modest plans and modest rings; today's couples are wearing engagement rings that are meant to be noticed by all

Go ahead. Flash that half-carat rock like it's the Hope diamond. Showing off is acceptable — even expected — when you're the bride-to-be with a sparkling, spanking-new diamond engagement ring on your third finger.

There's nothing understated about the grand-style, full-blown weddings couples are planning this year. So naturally, today's engagement ring — official symbol of the approaching event — is of the meant-to-be-noticed variety ... a contrast from the modest bands or even ringless mode of the late '60s and early '70s.

The bigger, the better, seems to be the trend among marrying Yuppies, with the national average about 38 points for an engagement ring, according to the American Diamond Industry Association.

The number of brides receiving diamond engagement rings, and the size and price of the rings, has increased steadily

over the past six years, according to the ADIA, probably because today's couples are older when they marry for the first time, and have more money to spend for a larger, quality diamond.

About 75 percent of brides receive diamond engagement rings, with grooms spending an average of \$952 per ring. Half- and full-carat diamond rings are not uncommon, especially among older engaged couples and second marriages.

Today's engagement ring usually is a show-stopping superior solitaire, as opposed to yesterday's styles designed with numerous smaller stones. If there are more diamonds in a bride's engagement ring, they likely will flank the center diamond with small round baguettes or emerald-shaped channel-set diamonds that will weigh in at more than a full carat.

In place of the interlocking wedding bands, many brides are choosing anniversary rings — those simple bands studded with diamonds in pave or channel settings.

More grooms, too, are jumping on the "band" wagon.

While brides-to-be have been receiving engagement or betrothal diamonds since 1477, when Archduke Maximilian of Austria proposed to Mary of Burgundy with a diamond ring, men have waited several centuries for their rings. Double-ring ceremonies didn't really catch on until World War II, when newlywed U.S.

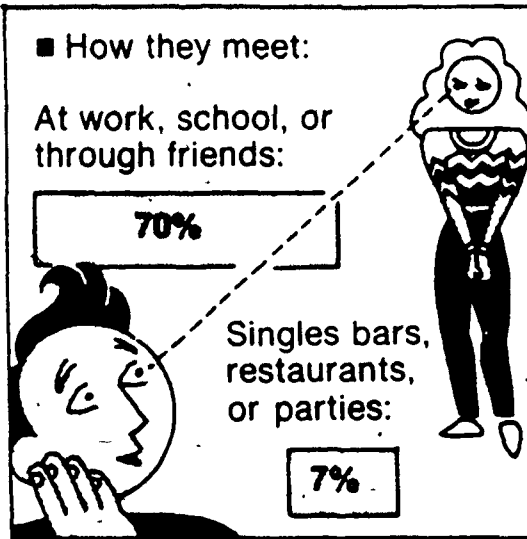

man presented a woman with a diamond he'd selected and purchased, but that's a rarity now. Couples of the '80s usually pick their rings together.

For first time shoppers, ring hunting can be an adventure. There's a jungle of settings and stones to explore and dozens of decisions to make, all with price tags attached. Following is a checklist of considerations for newly engaged couples:

**Diamonds:** When buying a diamond, ask the jeweler to explain the four "Cs." The price of a diamond is equally dependent on these four factors: its shape or cut, color, weight or carat, and degree of perfection or clarity, according to the ADIA.

□ The cut, or shape of the diamond (round, oval, emerald, heart, marquise, pear) is a matter of personal taste. A fully cut diamond has 58 facets, which, when properly proportioned, will maximize the "fire" in the stone. Round stones traditionally are the most popular.

□ The larger the size, or carat weight, the rarer the stone and therefore, the greater in value. A carat is roughly equivalent to one-fifth of a gram.

□ The size, number and location of imperfections in a stone determines its clarity grade. A diamond with fewer flaws is rarer and therefore more valuable.

□ Color simply describes the hue of a particular stone. Diamonds come in a variety of colors ranging from colorless (blue-white) to deep yellows. Shades of pink and deep blue are extremely rare.

soldiers wanted a remembrance of their brides to take into the service with them, according to Bride's magazine.

The simple gold band is the preferred choice among the 88 percent of grooms who receive wedding bands, according to the Gold Information Center. But, some couples are selecting matching bands with inlaid diamonds (the woman's wedding ring dictates the style). Two-tone designs are popular with today's grooms, as are surfaces that are carved, sculptured, woven, sandblasted or etched.

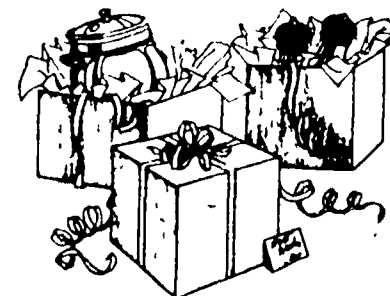

# Got those wedding plan blues?

**Planning a wedding is enough to keep everyone a bachelor. But a consultant can take away the burden and get the marriage going on a good note**

**If a wedding reception is the biggest party you'll ever throw for yourself, go ahead and make it a dandy.**

But be aware of your limitations—it starts expensive and can get as lavish as you like.

The easiest thing, if not the least expensive, is to hire a wedding consultant. He or she will handle all the arrangements for you — hiring a chef, ordering the cake, setting up and cleaning up — and that is an invaluable service at such a hectic time.

Consultants charge according to the size of the wedding, just as the individual services do.

Verna Somerville, a wedding consultant who operates a business called Memory Makers from her Brighton home, has planned weddings for famous and not-so famous Michiganders, including tax limitor Richard Headlee's daughters and Tigers baseball player Mickey Stanley's daughters.

Somerville has plenty of good ideas for wedding receptions. Her main advice to brides is to "be original."

"I try to tell the girls to make their wedding different," Somerville said. "Make one thing their own that people will come away and talk about."

The first thing you'll need to think about is where you'll want to have the reception. Rental halls are available for around \$500 and more in almost any area, but they become booked up quickly as summer approaches. Most recommend scheduling a year in advance of the wedding.

What you'll need is enough space for tables and chairs to accommodate however many people you've invited, a dance floor if you wish, and a kitchen.

**Some places provide a caterer and chef,**

**and include it in the price of rental, but others do not. You'll need to check with the individual facility to be sure.**

**Don't forget to ask how many people the hall can accommodate, what services the hall provides, if there is a security deposit and if you can get it back should you need to cancel. Ask if you can get a price break by providing your own caterer.**

Next, you'll need to turn your attention to food, of course, and booze, if you're so inclined.

If you expect 150-200 people, you could count on spending about \$400 for beer, wine and liquor, if you plan to serve it.

**For a champagne toast, you should**

figure about one to two cases for 100 people and you can get a case of Andre for about \$35 or spend \$75 on a single bottle of Dom Perignon.

"Food is anything the bride wants," Somerville said, and she knows a good party when she sees one.

"I know some brides like finger sandwiches, but I like to feed the guests," she said. "I'd rather have a dinner."

She likes to set up a punch in the middle of the receiving line so guests don't have to go thirsty while waiting. At the end of the line she suggested a salad buffet.

"I like to have my weddings punctual and very fast," she said. "The party is for

**after they eat."**

Caterers charge by the plate, and depending what you want and how you want it served, it can cost from \$6.50 to \$50 per person.

Some specialize in exotic foods and services. Gourmet caterers such as B & B Catering of South Lyon will put their servers in costume and hand-carve meat individually.

"It depends on whether they want linen or disposable plates," said certified chef R.H. Benson of B & B, who has been in the business for 30 years. "China and silver

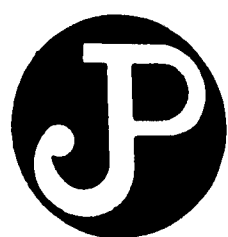

always add up."

A place like the Marion House in Howell will serve your guests and provide the hall in a package of around \$20 to \$30 per person or more.

Sharon Weaver of Sharon's Catering in Brighton, who calls her service medium-priced, also does her own baking, cooking and serving, but charges in the \$8 range. She offers menus of two or four meats with choice of potato, salad, vegetable and dessert.

When seeking a caterer, ask how many types of meat will be served, what will be included or not included, whether appetizers are included, if it will be a buffet or family-style dinner and who will do the serving and cleaning up.

Let your caterer know 10 days in advance the expected number of guests on your final list.

Wedding cake is probably the centerpiece of the reception, and shouldn't be taken lightly. A professional baker can make a cake in any flavor you like, whether it be nut, fruit or German chocolate. Allow about six weeks advance to order a good one.

Bakers also charge by the person and depending on the type of batter, whether the cake contains nuts, size of the cakes and type of decoration, it can run an average of \$95 or more for 100 people. That doesn't include a decorative foun-

tain, which is another \$50 more, at least.

The next consideration after food is entertainment. A live band is always nice, if you know one you like. Most are unionized and can be found through a musicians referral service or the Federation of Musicians in Ann Arbor.

A live band usually charges anywhere from \$500 to \$1,000 and up, so a less expensive choice might be a disc jockey. DJs also have the advantage when it comes to choosing the particular music you wish to hear.

Stax-O-Wax, which claims to be the oldest in the business and advertises "from the wild to the mild," charges an average of \$350 for a wedding reception and requires about four to six months' advance notice.

For an additional fee, the Brighton-based service also offers an optional light show with mirror ball, fog and bubble machine.

Carl VanBuren, owner of Stax-O-Wax, said his usual six-hour set includes a standard light show to create an atmosphere with colored spotlights. He doesn't take breaks and he'll make announcements for you, such as the toast and bride's dance.

If the reception is in a place that does not allow dancing, as some churches do not, Somerville suggested entertainment which includes special speakers, slides of the couple growing up or perhaps a relative singing or playing a musical instrument.

## Floral arrangements lend romance, charm

Flowers can give your wedding day the perfect touch but any planning needs to start with the bride's bouquet and go from there

By Kay Fahey

Elegant, charming, but above all romantic, flowers are an important element in any wedding. But with hundreds of flowers to choose from, and with the multitude of possible combinations, making a decision may at first seem overwhelming.

A few guidelines can make that decision easier. It is usually best to begin with the bridal bouquet, which should complement the bride's gown.

A full, rounded bouquet of white sweetheart roses and stephanotis — the traditional wedding flower — would be appropriate for a traditional wedding dress, whereas a linear spray of calla lilies would look better with a less traditional gown.

Bouquets for the maids of honor should complement the bridal bouquet and the maids' gowns. Florists emphasize that while it is not necessary to have the flowers be the same color as the gowns, it is important the colors do not clash. Many times they will recommend complementary colors, such as pink flowers with blue gowns.

Flowers for the rest of the wedding party should continue the theme established by the bridal party bouquets. Mothers of the bride and groom usually wear a shoulder corsage of the same flowers which are in the bride's bouquet, or more traditional flowers such as orchids.

Florist in South Lyon, emphasizes that mothers' corsages should contain the same flowers, although not necessarily the same colors. This simple step can prevent hurtful feelings.

Gentlemen in the wedding party usually wear a simple boutonniere which complements the girls' bouquets. A single rose or carnation is a popular choice.

Florists recommend decorations for the church and the reception also continue the floral theme. The type of flower and the colors should be coordinated with the bridal bouquet. Often, florists will make an altar piece which can be transferred to the reception hall and used to decorate the bride's table.

Once the general style and color of flowers is decided, budget determines the type and quantity of flowers to be used.

"Many florists will accommodate almost any budget. Everyone should have something nice," said Bischof, adding that \$200 is the average cost of wedding flowers for customers of Bakman Florist, 22452 Pontiac Trail.

This figure is based on three attendants for the bride and does not include decorating the reception hall.

She said most of Bakman's customers do not order flowers for the reception. "People around here aren't inclined to put on a big, formal show," owner Brian Bak agreed.

In contrast, Mary Schraffenberger, owner of Florals by Steven, 102 N. Lafayette, South Lyon, said the average wedding cost for their customers, with respect to flowers, ranges between \$700 and \$1,000. This figure does include decorating for the reception, and assumes there will be four bridal attendants.

Meanwhile, owners of two Milford area florist shops said the average cost for their customers is between \$500-\$600.

Janet Beaty, owner of Beaty's Florist and Greenhouses Inc. in Hartland Township, said a beautiful wedding can be done with the following budget: \$100 for boutonnieres and corsages, \$200 for the bride and three to four attendants, \$100 to decorate the church and \$100 for the reception. Beaty's Florist is located at 13790 W. Highland Road.

Carol Toy, co-owner of Adrienne's

Florist, 546 N. Main, Milford Village, said her wedding party customers pay an average of \$600. The price includes six attendants to the bride and decorations in the reception hall.

Contrary to popular belief, fresh flowers are not necessarily less expensive than silk, and silk flowers provide the added benefit of remaining beautiful long after the wedding day.

Many florists will rearrange a silk wedding bouquet so it may serve as a centerpiece. Florists recommend silk flowers, especially when the wedding day will be hot and the flowers must look good for several hours. In addition, they favor silk flowers at holiday times, when fresh flowers are in short supply and more expensive.

In spite of these advantages, there is a trend away from silk toward fresh flowers. Roses appear to be the favorite choice, but miniature carnations, alstroemeria, and freesia are also popular.

Larger bouquets are gaining popularity, especially those using pearls and tulle netting to complement the flowers. Florists indicate European designs for bouquets are increasingly featured at seminars and in style books.

These bouquets are often more linear than rounded, and many are less formal than traditional arrangements. "They look like freshly picked flowers brought in from the garden," said Toy.

Ideas for bouquets may be found in the style books at a florist, and looking through the books can provide information about types of flowers and their arrangement.

However, it may be best to avoid too rigid an idea of the "right" bouquet. Since flowers are very perishable, there is always the chance that the exact one ordered may not be in good condition, or even available.

In addition, floral designers appreciate having a little flexibility. "Sometimes if you could just add that little something to an arrangement, it would make it extra special," said Sue Ray, designer for Beaty's Florist.

In order to ensure the best results, florists urge prospective brides to bring fabric swatches from the bridal gown and attendants' dresses so that shades of color can be matched.

A general idea of the style of the gowns is also important. Expect to spend approximately one hour with the florist for the consultation. Brides are urged to reserve the wedding date with their florist anywhere from one to three months in advance.

Florists also suggest brides avoid planning the wedding for a holiday when florists (and others) are very busy. Flowers will be more expensive then and harder to obtain.

The type of flower chosen is an important variable in the overall cost. Orchids, roses, and calla lilies are among the most expensive, while seasonal flowers are usually the least expensive.

Scented flowers, such as gardenias, can add a special touch to a wedding, but florists urge restraint in their use.

# Group predicts spring-like exhibit

Detroit's Department of Parks and Recreation thinks its garden exhibit in this year's Builders Home, Flower and Furniture Show will be its most ambitious yet. That's saying a lot because Parks and Recreation has been a participant in the show for close to 45 years.

The Builders show will be held March 19-27 at Cobo Hall.

"It will really look, feel and smell like spring at our exhibit," said Paul Hynes, superintendent of the Forestry and Landscapes Division of the city's Parks and Rec Department.

The garden will consist of 14, 25-foot-high blue spruce trees, which reach to the ceiling of the exhibit hall.

The trees were donated by Detroit residents who found them too large for their property.

There will be over 500 azaleas, rhododendrons, tulips, hyacinths and daffodils in the garden, along with more than 200 flowering shrubs all of which have been forced to bloom early at the Parks and Recreation's greenhouses on Belle Isle.

The highlight of the garden will be a large 2,500-square-foot pond filled with

35,000 gallons of water. The pond will be 2 feet deep.

In the center of the pond will be a 20-foot-high, copper fountain, sculptured into a stylized-tree form. The fountain will have jets, which will spray water in several directions.

"It will feel like spring near our exhibit because of the constant water evaporation of the fountain. The evaporation will put water into the air, making it feel just like a cool spring breeze," Hynes added.

Three thousand feet of timber will

be cut from dead and diseased trees removed from city properties, for use in the construction of the pool retaining walls, ramps and decks. The timber will be cut at the department's saw mill on Belle Isle.

Six thousand yards of sand will be used to create a base for the landscape.

Thirty cubic yards of concrete will go into construction of the pond — that's roughly enough concrete to form the curbs and sidewalks of two very long city blocks.

## Area florists put artistic talents on display

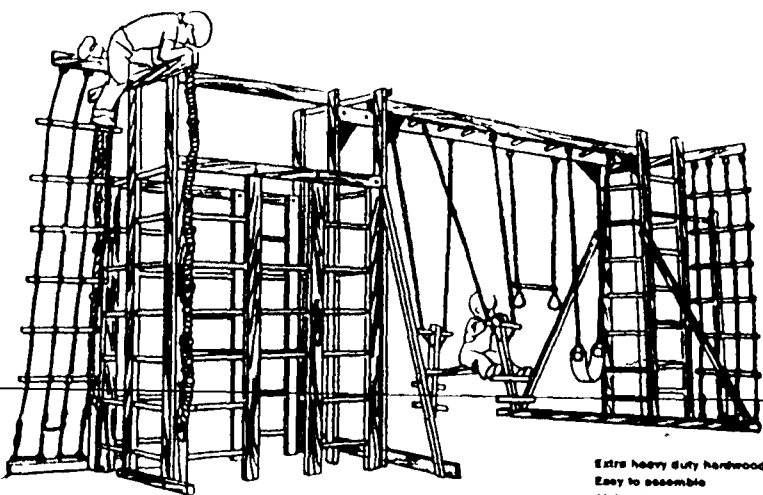
To show their appreciation, the March of Dimes will give each voter a helium filled balloon and will hold a daily random drawing for a free FTD

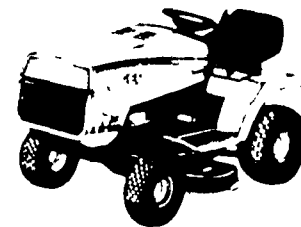

**T**HE BUILDERS Home Flower and Furniture Show will open its doors at Cobo Hall for the 70th time March 19-27.

Here you'll be able to see the first blossoms of spring, smell the chocolate aroma of fresh fudge, be fascinated by the baker's demonstrations of the home products, register to win a variety of prizes, vote for your dream home — and almost hear the pounding of the carpenter's nails as you view idea after idea for home renovations.

Sponsors of the show is the 1,500-member Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan, who host the show each spring as a public service.

This year's show features six "real" manufactured homes on display by Keating Community Homes, Inc., of Bloomfield Hills; Heckaman Homes of Napanee, Indiana; and Darling Manufactured Homes of Novi.

The show attracts approximately 600,000 visitors.

This is the largest home show in the nation, according to officials. It boasts

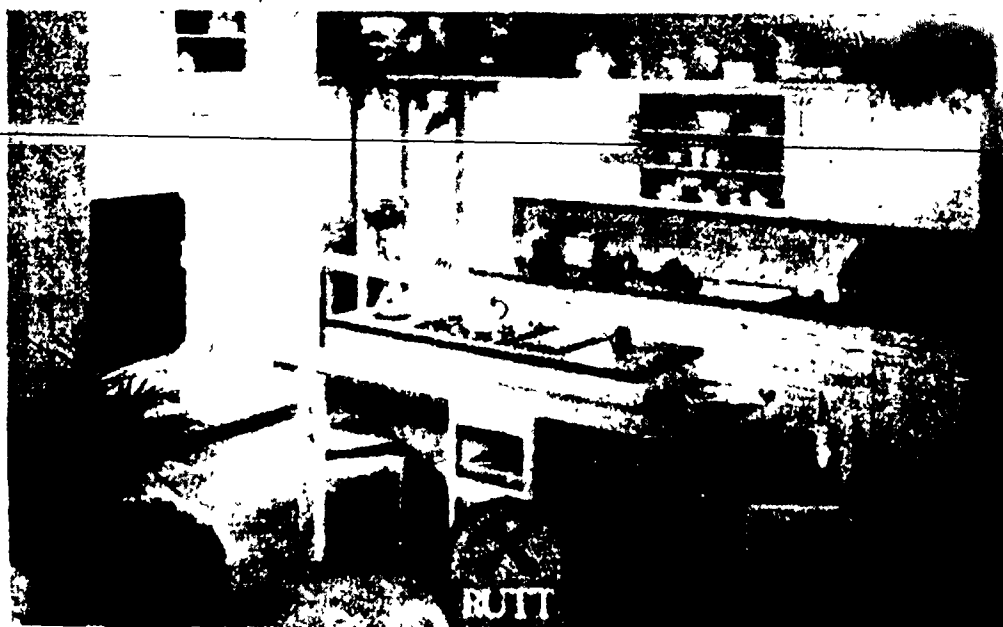

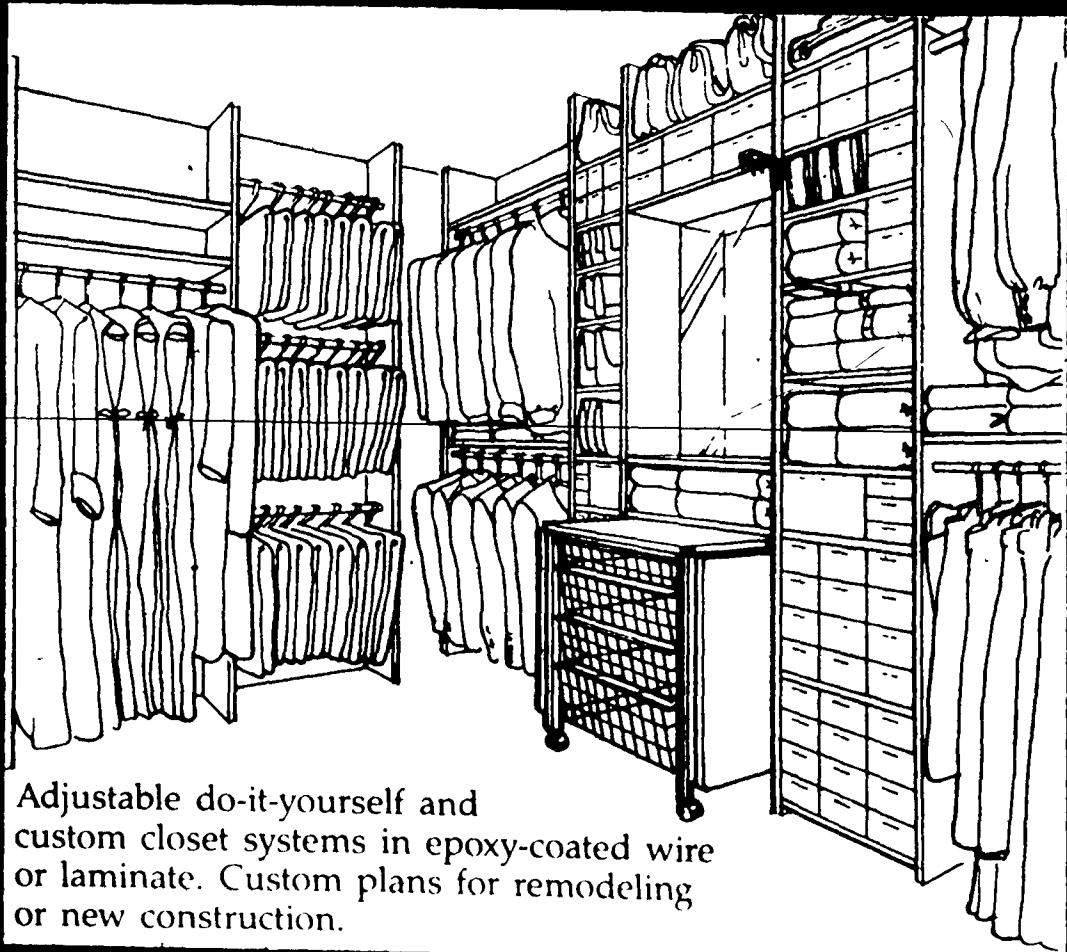

# Sponsor serves needs of builder, buyer

The Builders Home Flower and Furniture Show is annually held as a public service of the Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan. Irvin H. Yackness serves as the association's executive vice president and general counsel.

"The Spring Show" — as it has come to be known over its 70 consecutive years — is the largest of its kind in America, attracting nearly 500,000 visitors.

The first Show was held in 1918 at the Detroit Convention Hall on Woodward Avenue.

In 1961, the Builders Home Show was the first local show at the Cobo

Hall, following the successful National Automobile Show.

The Flower Show merged with the Home Show in 1962.

The show has been well received and supported in the Metropolitan Detroit area, generating millions of dollars of business each year.

The Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan, BASM, is one of the first such associations in the United States. It was founded in 1926 as the Builders Association of Metropolitan Detroit (BAMD), but the area designation was eventually changed to describe more accurately the portion of the state served.

THE ASSOCIATION WAS originally conceived to be the voice of both the home buyer and the home builders. It has, indeed, served that function with distinction, and is today one of the most prestigious builder groups in America.

This Detroit based body was a major participant in the organizing of the National Association of Home Builders in the early 1940s and was, on its own, responsible for the formation of the Michigan Association of Home Builders later in the decade.

Past BASM presidents Harry Durbin and Rodney Lockwood both served as presidents of the national organization.

BASM's record of accomplishments in promoting the political, economic, and social environment conducive to the construction, sales and rental of good housing is long and impressive.

It includes working with governmental bodies to create fair and effective laws that regulate the building in-

dustry; providing financing for the construction of community facilities including school classrooms and water and sewer interceptors without which development would not have been possible; and development of HOW, the industry insurance program that protects home buyers.

THE APARTMENT ASSOCIATION of Michigan was founded in 1972. The primary objective of the organization has been to establish the principle that apartments are residential units and should be treated as such by utilities and governmental agencies rather than as commercial structures.

AAM has successfully won many battles on this score since its founding. It represents the industry before the Public Service Commission and is the only industry group to maintain a legislative representative and lobbyist on the state level.

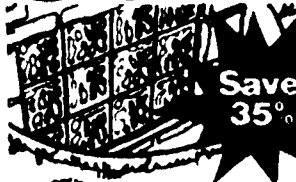

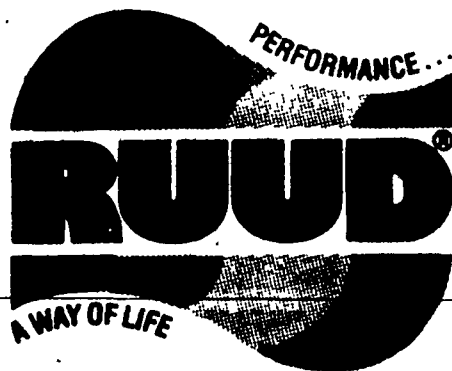
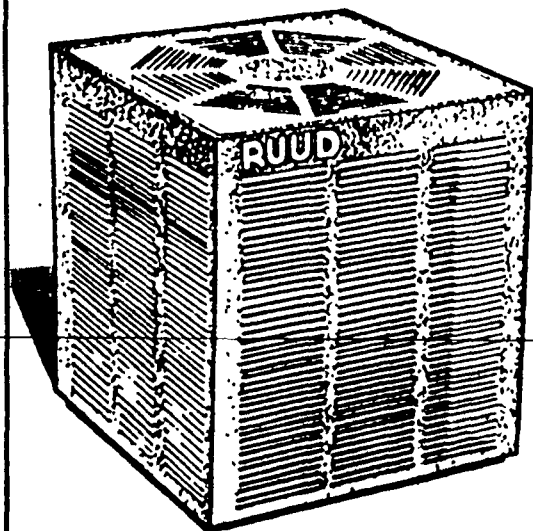

## Arts, crafts abound at Builders Show

Officials for the Builders Home Flowers Show claim the show offers everything for the home, which could just mean a new quilt for your bed.

The show, in Cobo Hall March 19-27, will boast a large arts and crafts section which features many working artisans.

As you stroll through the area, you'll find many popular arts and crafts items, including stained glass sun catchers, painted tinware and trunks, educational toys, pretty punches, hand-made rugs, oil paintings, baskets, silk plants and jewelry, cameo needlepunch, glass etching, bowmaster, personalized license plates, teddy bears, sculptured burlap and doll houses.

Featured prominently will be machine-made quilts — more than 100 of them.

They are the products of Dian Smith and her students from the Dian's Quilt Shop in Plymouth.

Many of the quilts will be for sale — others with more elaborate designs are merely for display.

LAST YEAR SMITH made a queen-sized "Log Cabin" quilt at the show which was raffled off to raise \$3,200 for the Ronald McDonald Houses in Detroit and Ann Arbor.

"Normally, it only takes me 24

hours to complete such a quilt," said Smith. "So I had to stretch my time across the show's nine days to complete it on the final day.

"One of my male students later bragged he could have beat me making the quilt. So I took the challenge on and this year we are racing.

"But instead of making one queen-size quilt, we will both try to complete three different lap-size, or what we call 'people-size' quilts," she said.

Her challenger is Ken Taddia, of Westland, who is an accountant for the Ford Motor Co.. Taddia is an accomplished craftsman who four years ago made his daughter's wedding dress.

SMITH SAID SHE WILL make Amish Courthouse Stair, Three Patch and Applique Heart and Chimney Sweep quilts. Taddia is to make a Log Cabin Pin Wheel, Amish Shadows and Double Irish Chains.

The Ronald McDonald is the cornerstone program of the Ronald McDonald Children's Charities, established in 1984 in memory of Ray Kroc, founder of McDonald's Corp. The houses provide temporary housing for parents of children being treated at either Children's Hospital, Detroit or C. S. Mott Children's Hospital on the University of Michigan campus, Ann Arbor.

## Ornamental grasses offer landscaping alternative

Maybe you've seen them along stretches of I-75 and thought they were just overgrown brush, or worse, weeds.

What appears to be tall grass is instead a new trend in landscaping called ornamental grasses.

They come in a variety of shapes and sizes and have exotic names such as "Blue Wild Rye," "Silver Banner Grass," "Tufted Hair Grass," and "Birds Foot Sedge."

Lake County Nursery of Ohio will exhibit a garden filled with a variety of ornamental grasses at the 70th Annual Builders Home, Flower and Furniture Show, March 19-27 in Cobo Hall.

This will be the first time ornamental grasses will appear in the show, according to its landscape architect, James C. Scott of James C. Scott Associates of Bloomfield Hills.

Scott, known affectionately as "Mother Nature," has been in charge of the builder's show's gardens for 26 years.

He says ornamental grasses are part of a naturalistic trend that is currently experiencing a resurgence among landscape architects.

"We're moving away from the manicured look in lawns, with hedges looking like soldiers in perfect order and more to the trend of being in harmony with nature," he said.

"These new gardens have an extra benefit," he added, "they are easy to maintain, too."

So if you pass a garden at the builder's show and see tall grass and ground covering waving in the breeze, you're experiencing the beauty of landscaping's newest trend, ornamental grasses.



# Buyers undaunted by Wall St. collapse

In the wake of recent events on Wall Street, analysts have been scouring the economy for any and every indication of how consumers are responding.

Consumer spending, after all, accounts for two-thirds of the Gross National Product, and the stock market crash reduced the nation's wealth, at a minimum, by \$600 billion. In the aftermath, conclusive evidence about the disposition of the buying public has not come easily.

But if housing is any indication, Black Monday, perverse as it sounds, may actually have done some good.

Prospective home buyers who went to sleep before Oct. 19 and have just awakened will find a significant decline in mortgage interest rates. On the eve of the crash, fixed-rate mortgages were at their highest point, rising above 12 percent. Today they are in the 10½ to 10¾ percent range.

That's enough to reduce the monthly payment for principal and interest on a \$90,000 mortgage by more than \$100. The income needed to qualify for this loan at 10½ percent has dropped from more than \$46,000 to \$41,700.

Before the crash, our industry was increasingly concerned about rising interest rates. Conceivably, rates

headed into the 13 percent range in 1988. At that level we would expect to see a drop-off in housing sales, especially in a marketplace that is increasingly dominated by trade-up buyers who can afford to be more discretionary about the timing of their purchases.

**SINCE INTEREST RATES** first began to rise last spring, we have seen a resurgence in adjustable rate mortgages, which have been bargain priced, with initial rates as much as three percentage points lower than the going cost of fixed-rate loans. Even lower-priced ARMS, however, would not have had enough magic to prevent some drop in sales had interest rates continued to rise.

The pre-collapse economic scenario did not look encouraging for housing. While the post-collapse outlook may be less than ideal, it is nevertheless an improvement.

Afraid of repeating the mistakes of the crash of 1929, the Federal Reserve Board has moved quickly to pump liquidity into the economy. Housing and other interest-sensitive industries have benefited.

Interest rates may still trend up-

ward later in 1988, but if they do we now estimate that they are liable to be about one percentage point lower than they would have been otherwise.

Conversely, the stock market crash has slowed somewhat the pace of the economy, alleviating inflationary pressures that some analysts believed were brewing. Housing prices have moderated in some of our hottest markets. We expect to see especially good housing values in 1988.

The alarm sounded on Wall Street has also focused attention on the budget deficits. It was years ago that the National Association of Home Builders started its campaign against America's ticking deficit time bomb.

With the stock market putting Washington on notice that the bomb was about ready to go off, we have since seen a redoubling of efforts in both the Congress and the White House to turn the corner on this problem once and for all. Deficit reduction is pivotal if we want our economy to perform in the future as effectively as it has in the past. It now looks hopeful that a lasting solution will be deferred no longer.

has also served to emphasize the enduring investment value of owning a home and the tax advantages of home ownership. American consumers have always preferred safe investments with good track records. Housing is one of those investments, and as a result, many Americans have most of their wealth invested in the homes in which they live.

Buying a home gives families a chance to leverage buying power, shelter their incomes from taxes and save for the future.

Compare two identical families, each with two working adults and a small child, a \$40,000 income and \$10,000 down and taking out a \$90,000 mortgage at 10½ percent interests. The other family continues to rent a \$700 a month apartment and purchases a \$10,000 Treasury Bill, with a yield of 5¾ percent compounded quarterly.

Assuming that family incomes and the values of homes and rents rise five percent a year and inflation increases at four percent, at the end of the first year the home owning family pays \$1,343 less in federal taxes and the value of their home increases by \$5,000

# Flowers tricked into thinking it's spring

This year more than 3,000 pots of flowers and 500 Michigan grown trees and shrubs are being forced to bloom by tricking them into thinking it's Spring.

This elaborate and highly technical con-job is done so the plants and trees are ready to make their debut at the 70th Annual Builders Home, Flower and Furniture Show, March 19-27, at Cobo Hall.

Fooling Mother Nature is no small feat and it's done under the supervision of James C. Scott, landscape architect, who designs and oversees construction of the many gardens seen at the Builders Show.

Scott has supervised this project for 26 years and he lovingly describes how the flower and trees are forced to bloom early.

"In the fall, Carl Krause of Auburn Oaks Nursery picks the stock with the best buds. The buds are allowed to stay dormant until February, then we wake them up early," he said.

"Flowers and plants are taken from darkly shaded rooms where they've lain dormant, and placed in greenhouses with lots of sunlight or artificial light if the weather is overcast."

"Each day landscapers turn up the

heat a little in the greenhouses, so it's just like spring, sunny and warmer every day, so naturally the flowers bloom.

"Getting the plants from this artificial springlike environment to Cobo

Hall is a real feat because, remember, it's still winter outside — there might even be snow on the ground.

"The greenhouse workers drape the forced plants and quickly place them in heated vans where they are immedi-

ately taken to Cobo Hall.

"Once there, they are used in the elaborate gardens the Builder Show is famous for, covering an area the size of six football fields.

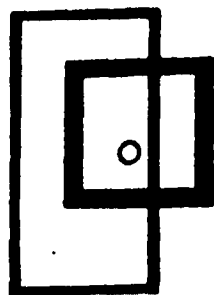

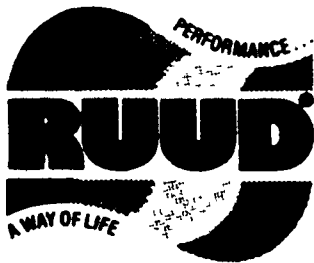

compared to a \$569 gain in the cash value of the renter household's T-bill.

At the end of 10 years, the home owner has paid \$15,347 less in federal taxes; and his home has appreciated to \$163,000.

Were he to sell the home and buy another more expensive residence, his gain would be tax deferred. The cash value of the T-bill would be \$17,874 at the end of the 10 years and would be taxable.

NOBODY KNOWS FOR sure what the stock market crash's final impact on housing will be. For now, builders surveyed report that conditions are holding up remarkably well. This early finding would suggest that consumers are behaving according to the actual conditions of the marketplace, which are favorable for home buyers, rather than out of some undefined sense of foreboding over what has happened on Wall Street.



# Ryba's fudge brings sweet success

The Builders Home, Flower and Furniture show, which celebrates its 70th anniversary this year, will honor many of its veteran exhibitors who return year after year with a plaque.

The exhibitor with the greatest seniority has been collecting similar plaques for the past couple years from other organization.

He is Harry Ryba, owner of the fa-

mous Mackinac Fudge company.

Each year Ryba brings his portable marble slab and kettle to the Builders Show where he makes and sells about 7,000 pounds of fudge.

Ryba started his business in 1936 at a small carmelcorn shop on the corner of East Chalmers and Jefferson in Detroit.

He had been a salesman for Fair-

mont Creamery and had sold the shops previous owner, Harold Coil, fresh butter.

"COIL SMASHED his knee caps riding his high wheeler bike and sold the business," said Ryba "and that was the beginning.

"Things weren't always good," he said.

"During the war, there was rationing, and I was only open a day or two because I couldn't get enough stamps to purchase sufficient amounts of sugar or butter," he said.

"Back then, fudge wasn't much of a business. You dumped all the ingredients in to a pan, then you beat it, nothing like we make it today.

"I learned how to make fudge from a man called Gary Murdick, who came down from Mackinac Island. He wanted to make fudge in the City of Detroit. So he moved his equipment in, which included the marble slabs," said Ryba.

Their association was later ended, and Ryba started making fudge on marble slabs.

"They tore my store down for parking in 1946," said Ryba, "So I moved to Mack and Chalmers.

"In 1947 I exhibited at the Michigan State Fair — I celebrated my 40th Anniversary there last year and they gave me an award for being their oldest exhibitor," he smiled.

"And at about the same time, I started going to a variety of shows all over including what used to be two separate shows held at Fair Grounds, the Flower Show and the Home Show.

"By 1959, I was well established," said Ryba. "I was selling fudge at fairs in Cleveland, Wisconsin, Illinois, Okla-

homa, Texas, and Michigan fairs including the Ionia, Centerville, Hillsdale, and Calhoun county fairs.

"Over the years, I developed my own recipes — for each batch or 14 pounds of fudge it takes 9 pounds of sugar, 1 pound of chocolate, 2 pounds of corn sugar, ½ to 1 pound of butter broken up, 2 quarts of heavy cream and 1 pound of pecans.

"It's the cooking that makes the difference whether the batch is going to come out or not. Sometimes just a ½ a degree in the temperature will ruin it," he said.

While Ryba's fudge was always known as Mackinac Island fudge, it wasn't until 1959 that he made fudge there.

"I tried to get a store there from 1947 to 1959," he said. "I had already copyrighted the name, so it seemed right that I should have a store there. May's, Murdick and Selma were all making fudge there long before I arrived.

"But when I opened, we made fudge making into a real performance for all to watch — and they did. That's when I got legit," said Ryba.

"In 1960, I opened my second store on the Island. Business was so good, I opened a third store in between the first two," he smiled.

"I still have completion on the island," said Ryba, "But people know my fudge is the creamiest there."

Ryba didn't stop buying property on the island with the stores.

He also owns two hotels which anchor the east and west side of the town — the Island House and the Lakeview — as well as a ferry line, a boat dock and a mini mall.

# 'Good year for developers' — BASM head

Herbert Lawson, president of Herbert Lawson Inc., Southfield, and president of the Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan (BASM) predicts 1988 will be an excellent year for residential developers.

Lawson predicts that 1988 will be "an excellent year with steady growth for the industry. The indicators say the interest rates will level off, so we shouldn't see any of the ups and

downs we've experienced in recent years," he said.

"Not being so strictly tied to the auto industry here in Michigan has helped. There is more diversification now, thanks in part of Doug Ross's efforts to attract large retailers and other non-automotive industries in Michigan," he added.

Lawson's company is primarily known for its condominiums, as well as

land development — mostly in Oakland County, while it also has two projects underway on the east side — Villa Grande in Clinton Township and Shoreview Place in Chesterfield Township.

Its Oakland County projects include Fairways on the Lake in West Bloomfield, Franklin Hills of Bloomfield, Fox Pointe in West Bloomfield, and Walnut Hills on Walnut Lake, also West Bloomfield.

Lawson, an accountant, and his wife, Carol, a bookkeeper, whose father — Morris J. Dickstein — was a custom home builder, founded their firm some 20 years ago when they went looking for their first home.

"We were looking for a home in Southfield, and we found some houses that had been abandoned by a builder," said Lawson.

"So we went to Carol's brother, Dennis Dickstein (BASM president in 1987) who was already involved in the residential home business and asked him to look at the houses.

"THE REST is history," he added. Mrs. Lawson serves the firm as the

executive vice president. Each applies their complementary skills to their building and development company.

Mrs. Lawson handles the marketing, sales and designing; Lawson manages the business and financial aspects and they share the responsibilities of supervising construction at each development.

Lawson said lifestyles have changed and developers are working to meet the new demands in the market.

"With both spouses working, condos are very attractive due to their care-free, low maintenance living style," he said.

"But they retain the equity buildup of home ownership, so condos now have a certain appeal. And of course, there is the tax advantage of owning a condominium," he added.

"Today's condo market is shared by young professionals at one end and the empty-nester/two-home owners at the other. In either case, the condo owner doesn't have time to maintain the exterior of their home, and condo living gives them that advantage, a home that is taken care of for them," said Lawson.

# HOW now to avoid future troubles

Home Owners Warranty (HOW), the nation's largest new home warranty and insurance program, recently warned home buyers not to rush into settlement before carefully inspecting their new homes.

"As winter winds subside and you start thinking about purchasing that new home you've been waiting for, remember to take your time. Do a serious 'walk-through' and inspect your

new home before going to settlement," said HOW president Jeff Bragg.

"A pre-settlement walk-through will help ensure that your new home is everything promised. It is an opportunity to question the builder about such things as warranties, how to operate the furnace and care of the kitchen floor. This is the time to ask whether your windows and doors work properly and to check and see if there are places

that the painter missed," Bragg added.

Bragg offers another recommendation: "The most efficient way to handle a walk-through is to use a checklist. If your builder doesn't provide one, you and he or she should sit down and make a list of all items that need repair and specify the date when the repairs will be completed."

Home Owners Warranty offers the "New Home Inspection Checklist" as a guideline.

"With over 30,000 components in a new home, it may be impossible to determine all potential problems before a sale. However, a walk-through allows buyers to work with their builders to correct most common errors before they move into a new home. Builders will be helpful in correcting any problems because they value their reputations for quality construction," Bragg said.

In addition to the warranty and insurance coverage, HOW builders also offer home buyers an added sense of security. To qualify for the HOW programs, all builders are screened for quality construction, financial stability and customer service.

To become HOW-approved, they must agree to abide by HOW's stand-

ards of quality construction and to enroll all the homes they build in the program.

According to HOW builder William Detty, president of Detty-Anderson Inc. of McLean, Va., many post-settlement problems can be avoided by proper instruction and explanation prior to the sale.

"During a walk-through, the builder can show you how to use the garbage disposer or the garage door. He or she can also take the time to point out exactly what is covered by the precession plan. That way, there will be no surprises for the buyer or the builder later on."

"We do a pre-settlement walk-through on each home we sell," said Detty, a HOW builder since 1977. "It's an important part of our effort to deliver a quality product. In fact, walk-through can even help eliminate problems before they occur."

Bragg advises home buyers to ask their builder about the warranty protection offered on his or her home. If it is HOW protection, buyers can be sure their home is covered with two-year insured warranty plus an additional eight years of builder insurance against major structural defects in the house.
