## Costs rise in budget

It's time for Northville city officials to figure out the budget for the year, and they will have some work to do to make ends meet.

In a memo to the City Council dated April 4, City Manager Steve Walters reported that to keep the same level of services during the year, the city's general fund expenses will be \$118,200 over the expected revenues.

The gap is caused by a combination of several factors, Walters explains in the memo. Specifically:

- The 1988 initial tax base is \$117.6 million, a 22.6 percent increase over the 1987 base. About half the increase is due to new construction and half is due to higher property values and assessments, the memo reads.

- Under the Headlee tax limitation amendment to the state constitution, the tax money which the city would otherwise get from the higher assessments cannot be collected. That is, the city must lower its tax rate so that it will get the same dollar amount in property taxes — adjusted for inflation — as if assessments had stayed even.

According to Walters's figures, this means the city's operating tax rate must go from 13.58 mills to 12.42 mills for 1988.

- However, the Headlee limitation only affects half of the increase in tax base; the increase due to new construction is not covered by the Headlee amendment. The increase in tax base from new construction is about \$149,000, and that is money the city can use.

- The rest of the general fund revenues — including rebates from

## Assessments: Lakes rate levels off

The Northville Township Board of Review has completed its work for this year, but even before the board met for the first time, there were some questions about the increase in assessments throughout the township.

Four subdivisions, all with at least partial frontage on Six Mile Road, have different rates of increase for their taxes ranging from the minimum 3 percent increase for Lakes of Northville, to 15 percent for Maple Hills.

The assessment for Dun Rovin, formerly a golf course but approved for single family attached and detached homes under the township's Planned Residential Unit Development ordinance, was changed based on a change of use and increased to \$4 million after the Board of Review appeal.

Russ Fogg, board chairman, said the three-member body reviewed about 160 properties and changed quite a few because of inequities.

"There were very few changes because of errors by the assessors," Fogg said.

The township's part-time assessors had made their determinations; however, Supervisor Georgina Goss exercised her authority as the township's chief assessing officer to change some of the assessments, including Maple Hills and Lakes of Northville from the rates presented to the township by the assessors.

Once Goss exercised her option, Lakes of Northville's tax rate was decreased while Northville Colony Estates remained the same.

Residents of Maple Hills, which is still under construction, got one of the highest percentages of increase.

Fogg said there were a number of

appeals from Maple Hill residents, but few changes were made by the board.

"Most of the purchase agreements supported the assessment," Fogg said. "If there was one thing that was glaring in the board's opinion, it was that the multiplier has gotten so high in Northville that a number of people who found themselves having difficulties and who could have appealed the new rates on a hardship, refused to do so. And, since they refused and the supporting documentation did not allow us to change the rates for any other reason, our hands were tied."

Fogg said that the entire board made about 10 visits to homes where the owners were appealing the assessment and that individual board of review members made a number of solo visits to properties.


Goss also defended her changes and the lack of increase to Lakes of Northville, which was platted in October 1978, but was recently completed.

"For the past two years, Lakes of Northville has had major increases in their assessment and was brought up to pretty much true cash value," she said.

As for Maple Hills, which was first platted in July 1986, for the first phase of construction and in January 1987, for the second phase, Goss said that new homes, once occupied, "almost always have a major increase in assessment."

"I can understand their (Maple Hills residents) complaints but I worked with the assessors and I did what I think was right," Goss said.

Northville Colony, located on the south side of Six Mile Road, with four phases thus far fully developed and a fifth phase pending before the board of trustees, received a 7 percent in-



crease in tax rate in addition to the 3 percent across the board rise.

The first phase of Northville Colony Estates, one of the least expensive subdivisions in the township, was platted in 1986. Phase 4 was platted in 1986.

"I think what this pointed out was the need for someone — a full-time assessor — to do nothing every day except run out to properties and see what they are selling for."

"Of course, I'm being sarcastic, but I truly believe that the selling price of homes in Northville is continuing to increase and that the increase is leading to rises in assessments. People are willing to

pay the price to live here," Goss said.

In addition to Maple Hills, residents in Quail Ridge and the condominiums in Highland Lakes also received 15 percent increases in their tax rates.

Park Gardens residents, who recently hooked up to water and sewers, received a 2 percent increase, as did the residents of single-family homes in Highland Lakes.

Residents of a number of older, smaller subdivisions with small lots and few homes, also saw virtually no increase in their tax rate beyond the 3 percent.

Among those subdivisions are Meadowbrook Estates, Northville Gardens and Fordview.

## Council OKs revised raises

A somewhat-revised set of recommended raises for city administrators passed the City Council Monday night with little comment from council members.

City Manager Steve Walters proposed raises for most of the city's full-time administrators — excluding himself — last month, but the council members did not act on the proposals. Three of the five members of the council questioned some aspects of the proposals, including equal salaries for the police chief and department of public works superintendent; and a 10 percent increase for the building inspector, whose position was created less than two years ago.

The figures approved by the council Monday were lower for two of the seven positions under consideration, for the building inspector and the DPW foreman. However, a note on the proposal asks that additional raises of 2 percent for the building inspector and 4 percent for the DPW foreman be considered effective this July 1, above any other general administrative raises.

The council approved equal salaries for the DPW superintendent — the head of the department — and for the police chief, of \$43,514. At the earlier meeting, Walters stressed the DPW superintendent's importance to the city, and the fact that in Northville the post carries more responsibilities than in some other communities.

When the issue came up at Monday's meeting, Mayor Chris Johnson mentioned that Walters had changed his original proposal. "At this time it would be appropriate to move on the revised recommendation," he said.

In moving to approve the proposal, council member Paul Folino said, "My concerns from our previous

meeting have been taken care of in this revision."

The administrators last received raises effective July 1, 1986, except the building inspector, who was hired in September 1986, and the housing director, who got a 3 percent raise last year. One other administrator, the finance director, was hired last October and Walters did not specifically recommend a raise for her at this time.

The approved raises range from a 3 percent increase for the housing director to a 10.1 percent hike for the DPW foreman.

After approving the other raises, the council also gave a 6.2 percent raise to Walters. Johnson recommended the increase, which will give Walters a salary of \$53,200.

## Matinee race handle stems Downs' drop

Northville Downs ended its 1988 season Saturday, finishing the year with some good news and some bad news.

The track saw lower attendance and handle figures than last season for its evening meets, but higher figures for its matinees, Sue Hall of the Downs said. And even the drop in evening activity does not bother track officials too much.

The track ran 79 evening programs this season, compared to 81 last year. One meet was snowed out, and the track officials decided not to run races on Easter Sunday, even though the state had allocated that date to the Downs.

The total attendance for the season — which ran from January 1 to April 2 — was 200,460, Hall said. Average attendance for the evening meets was 2,537.

The total evening marimutuel handle — amount of money bet — was \$40,357,524, Hall said. The average evening handle was \$510,855.

The figures represent a 12.2 percent drop in average admission and a 6.5 percent drop in average handle compared to last year.

"Our evening was down quite a lot. The matinees were up, which helped balance it out," Hall said.

The track ran 12 matinees this season, compared to 14 last year. Total matinee attendance was 30,450, for an average of 2,538.

The total matinee handle was \$5,449,707. Average handle was \$454,142.

Those averages are about a 9.2 average increase in handle and an 8.7 percent increase in admission for matinees over last year, Hall said.

One major change at the track this year was the elimination of Tuesday races in favor of Sunday races.

"I certainly think that Sundays are better than Tuesdays. Tuesday is a very quiet day," Downs Recording Secretary Margaret Zayti said.

The longer races are held on Sunday, the more people will get used to it and turn out more, Zayti added.

Sunday races will continue next season, but the post time will probably change to 7:30 p.m., Zayti said. The post time is 7:30 on most nights, but was 6 p.m. on Sundays this season. That time has not really worked out, she said.

## Armed robber strikes state office manager

The manager of the Secretary of State office in Northville was robbed at gunpoint April 4 and the perpetrators escaped with an undetermined amount of cash.

According to Capt. Philip Presnell of the township police department the manager of the office was entering his car at the rear of the Northville Plaza Mall on Seven Mile Road when a blue "Mustang-type" vehicle pulled up behind the manager's car and a white male

suspect approached the manager and said, "Give me the bag."

The manager told officers Michael Wildt and Lawrence Demeter he asked the suspect, "what bag?" at which time the robber pulled out a long-barreled, chrome handgun and struck the manager in the stomach with the gun.

The manager, who does not live in Northville, said the suspect then told him to lay on the ground, took the bag

containing the day's receipts and the manager's car keys and fled in the Mustang-type car.

The manager's car keys were recovered near the scene of the robbery.

The suspect vehicle is described as a blue, early 1980s, two-door model. The manager said he did not get a look at the license plate.

The perpetrator is described as a white male, about 25 years old, with dark-colored hair. He was wearing

boots with pointed toes, possibly cowboy boots, said Presnell, who is heading the investigation.

A second suspect, the driver of the blue Mustang, was described as dark complected. Presnell said the man who was robbed did not know whether the driver was a male or a female.

Police are continuing their investigation, with assistance from the Michigan State Police.

## Community survey helps Jaycees plan programs for coming year

The Northville Jaycees have sent out survey forms to the group's members and to people in the community as part of the annual planning process for the group.

The Jaycee year begins May 1, so this is the time the group sets tentative plans for its activities in the year ahead, Northville Jaycees President Teresa Folino said.

businesses, and officials of the city and the township, she said. The forms are more specific this year, she added.

"We're here to service the community, and we need to know what the community wants and needs," Folino said.

The Northville Jaycees sponsor community activities like the Fourth of July celebration and the Easter Egg Hunt. Membership in the Jaycees is open to people ages 21 to 40. The Northville Jaycees meet at 8 p.m. the fourth Wednesday of each month at the Northville city hall, 215 W. Main.

## NEWS BRIEFS

**CULTURED COUNCIL** — The Northville City Council took a break from its usual mundane discussions Monday night to get some culture.

By Tuesday, an additional 50,000 3-centers were on hand and Cates said he expected to have a full supply of 1-cent and 2-cent stamps by today.



### Goodbye to the barns

The St. Lawrence Barns, off the corner of Seven Mile and Sheldon roads, looked a little bit deserted Monday after Northville Downs finished its season Saturday. But this time the horses left for good. Work has already begun on the demolition of the barns, in

preparation for a new condominium development planned for the site. The Selective Group development company is planning to put up 96 condo units in 28 buildings.

## Government leaders face up to Headlee

Although the final figures are not in, officials with Northville Township and the Northville Board of Education are convinced that the Headlee Tax Limitation Amendment will come into play this year.

What school superintendent George Bell and township supervisor Georgina Goss have not yet determined is whether they will recommend to the voters an override of Headlee.

When the percentage increase in State Equalized Valuation is higher

than the Consumer Price Index, the Headlee Amendment comes into effect leaving the governmental unit with three choices: reduce the amount of money it can receive to below the level of the CPI, this year 3.7 percent; after a truth in taxation hearing, allow a tax increase equal to the CPI; or ask the voters to override Headlee.

Last June, Northville school district electors supported an override while the township board went through the hearing process and ac-

cepted a small percentage of increase.

"We got double-crossed with the CPI at 3.7 percent, again inordinately influenced by the price of oil," said Bell. "I hesitate to speculate on where we are or what we will do this year, and I won't know exactly where we stand until April 29."

Assessments in the area served by the schools rose an average of 9 percent.

"It will be up to the board of trustees, but at this time, I think we

probably will roll back taxes," said Goss. "I can't see us accepting Headlee or going for an override. I think that if there is a tax increase, and that's what an override would be, the people should vote on it right from the start."

Goss said she estimates the township could receive upwards of \$75,000 with a successful override. "But that's only an estimate. We really don't know exact figures until we have a chance to study the tax rolls."

# Employee witnesses car theft from Meijer's parking lot

A Meijer's employee watched on March 31 while two white males broke into and stole a 1987 Chevrolet Silverado worth more than \$17,000.

The witness said that a customer had called his attention to two white males breaking the windows out of the truck parked in the Meijer's lot at about 1:45 p.m. and the witness said he watched the two men drive the truck from the lot.

The owner of the vehicle, a Livonia man, told township police that the truck was paid for and had a full tank of gas at the time of the theft.

He noted that there was a tool box with assorted tools in the truck, as well as folding chairs valued at \$80.

Also taken with the vehicle was a radar detector, a citizen's band radio, and an air compressor.

The vehicle was entered as stolen into the law enforcement information network, but to date there has been no report of the truck being found.

**LARCENIES CLEARED** — Seven larcenies reported on one night in

December are considered solved after three local juveniles confessed to the crimes, according to Northville city police.

The incidents — five thefts from vehicles and two from garages — all took place in the area north of Eight Mile Road near Taft Road the night of Dec. 23 and 24. Items stolen included briefcases with personal items, a purse, a garage door opener, cassette tapes, beer, loose change and miscellaneous sales items.

Police said the three suspects — two 15 year olds and a 14 year old — admitted to committing all seven crimes. The three have been petitioned to Oakland County Juvenile Court to determine any further proceedings.

The three youths are also suspects in some incidents in Novi, police said. Northville police remind residents to keep tabs on anything left in a car or garage in case of a break-in.

**MAN INJURED, CHARGED** — A Farmington man was injured March

7 while reportedly trespassing on the site of the Wayne County Child Development Center.

Officer Charles Cole said in his report that he was dispatched to the center to find the 18-year-old man unconscious and lying on the sidewalk.

CEMS also checked the victim, who regained consciousness during the examination, and told the paramedics that he had taken some unknown drug.

The police officer also noticed the odor of intoxicants from the man, and when police questioned him, the victim said he did not know how he hurt himself.

Before being transported to St. Mary Hospital, the man was ticketed for trespassing.



## Firefighters in city get pay increases

The firefighters in the City of Northville got raises Monday night.

In a memo to the City Council recommending the increases, City Manager Steve Walters wrote, "The fire department is one of our most important ones, and the most cost-effective operation we have in comparison to many other communities. The entire payroll cost for the Northville City Fire Department (\$31,328 in 1986-87) is less than the cost of one full-time fireman."

"As you know, the firemen are on call 24 hours per day, seven days per week, and receive no compensation for this availability, unless a fire actually occurs," the memo reads.

The City Council approved raises from \$11 to \$12 per hour for fire and mutual aid calls, from \$10 to \$11 for

the first two hours of Thursday night training meetings, and from \$5 to \$6 for additional hours of training meetings.

In addition, the department officers received increases in their annual pay. The chief's pay went from \$3,200 to \$4,000, the captain's, from \$1,200 to \$1,800, the lieutenant's, from \$900 to \$1,200; and the sergeant's, from \$600 to \$900.

"While the increases for the fire officers are high in percentage terms, I feel that the amounts being recommended are very reasonable in dollar terms, and the small base amounts, which we are paying for this service should be increased to better reflect the value of the service being rendered," the memo reads.

The raises passed the council 5-0.

# Search for new Township administrator continues

The Northville Township Board of Trustees March 31 went with the known, rather than the unknown, in selecting a building and zoning administrator.

Jerry DeBrincat, a landscape architect who since 1970 has been employed by Vilcan-Lemon, the township's planning consultants, was offered the position of building and zoning administrator, however, 24 hours after accepting the post, DeBrincat turned it down.

"I did have a change of heart and, after quite a long discussion with the board, I chose to remain here," he said.

After learning of DeBrincat's decision, Supervisor Georgina Goss on Tuesday polled the members of the Board of Trustees and on Wednesday Township Manager Steve Brock offered the job to the board's second

choice, Carol Henry, an employee of Wayne County.

"She asked for a day to consider the offer and we gave her that," Brock said.

DeBrincat was unanimously selected from a field of 18 candidates at a special meeting of the township board. Clerk Thomas L.P. Cook was absent.

Brock explained that the position was advertised in three periodicals and 18 responses were received by the March 1 cutoff date.

From there, Brock explained, the committee narrowed the field to seven candidates invited for personal interviews with the selection committee comprised of Brock, Trustees Richard Allen and Thomas Handyside, and Treasurer Richard Henningsen.

Two finalists, DeBrincat and Henry, were tested by Plante Moran, and from that list, the board made its

choice. "Continuity to me is a big thing," noted Allen, who sits on the planning commission and was DeBrincat's strongest supporter. "I remember when I first started on the planning commission, (deputy clerk) Eunice (Switzer) was there and we could ask her about what had happened in the past and she knew. Then she left, and we floundered for a while.

"With the wetlands/woodlands ordinance being developed, to have someone in house with a landscape architecture background would be a plus," he said.

DeBrincat has a bachelor's degree in landscape architecture from Michigan State University and has attended planning commission meetings on several occasions, particularly when a question of landscaping has arisen.

He also has provided the planning commission with written comments,

as part of the Vilcan-Lemon review, on projects submitted for development in the township.

DeBrincat said he hoped the relationship between the township and its planning consultants would not be affected by his decision not to accept a township job.

"I was very disappointed with Mr. DeBrincat's decision," said Goss. "I think he would have been very happy at the township."

DeBrincat said Wednesday he wanted to apologize for any inconvenience he may have caused the

township.

"My discussion with the firm was very personal, and, as late as early (Tuesday) afternoon, I was ready to come to work. I certainly did not intend to use this job as any kind of lever," he said.

Although the search committee made no recommendation at the meeting in which DeBrincat was selected, Henningsen, who chaired the body, said that any of three candidates would have been excellent.

"I just want you to know that we had one candidate who really did his

homework. He drove through the community, studied our zoning ordinances and master plan and really prepared. He isn't the right person for the job, but I have never had a candidate so prepared for an interview," Henningsen said.

"Are you satisfied with the candidates?" questioned Jim Nowka. "We got a real cross section of people," Henningsen replied.

None of the trustees were willing to reopen the search, however, Goss indicated that if the board's second choice turns down the position, the trustees may have no other choice.

## Budget will need belt tightening

state taxes, state and federal grants, the sale of city services, and court fines — are expected to decline slightly, the memo reads.

Costs of the expenditures covered by the general fund have gone up \$255,500 to keep the current level of service, Walters estimates. The general fund includes police, fire and public works services; the city's share of library and community recreation programs; and general city administration.

In summary, the expected revenues for the year are \$3,004,800, but expenses are estimated at \$3,123,000, creating the \$118,200 gap.

In the memo, Walters said he will submit a plan to eliminate the gap for City Council consideration.

"As the auditors mentioned during their presentation of the 1986-87 audit (at a recent council meeting), the city's cash-flow position will be very restricted in the next year or two, and will require very close monitoring to meet our obligations. It will be important in this regard to try to liquidate some of the assets which have tied up city cash balances during the next fiscal year," the memo reads.

The memo also mentions that the Public Improvements Fund — which includes major building projects like the bandshell or buying property — is

tied up in commitments. "There were several capital improvements proposals from city departments which are not included in the proposed 1988-89 city budget because of lack of funds, but which are needed and should be considered further in capital improvements planning," the memo reads.

At a meeting Monday night, the council scheduled special sessions to study the budget for Monday, April 25; Tuesday, April 26; and Monday, May 2. The city's charter requires the council to adopt the city budget by the third Monday in May.

The city's fiscal year runs from July 1 to June 30.

## Residents seek nicer entrance

A four foot tree is supposed to be planted between the street and the sidewalk of every home in the Abbey Knoll Estates subdivision — at a cost of \$250 per tree.

The homeowners think they can find a better use for the money.

Most of the houses currently inhabited in the subdivision — north of Eight Mile and west of Taft — are represented on a petition asking the city council to return the money to the subdivision association to dress up the entrance to the development.

In a presentation to the Northville City Council Monday night, Melanie Colaianne explained that the builders in the development paid the city \$250 per tree for the city to plant a four-foot tree at each lot, or two trees on corner lots. But most of the people who live in the subdivision would rather see the money used to improve other landscaping aspects, she said.

"We have general... consensus on the fact that the entrance to the sub-

division is not adequate," Colaianne said. The entrance is not well lit and the aesthetics of what's there are not fitting, she said.

The association already has received bids and had some preliminary drawings done on an entrance design.

The association would also like to improve the cul-de-sacs within the subdivision, she added. Trees within the subdivision could be assured by adding a clause to the landscape plans in which Abbey Knoll homeowners are required to participate, she said.


The project will cost about \$42,000,

Colaianne said, of which the association has about one-fourth now available.

Colaianne said the association and the city have the same basic goal for Abbey Knoll Estates: "to enhance the subdivision, beautify the subdivision, and make not only the community proud but the homeowners that live in the subdivision proud."

The council referred the association request to the city administration for a recommendation.

"We would want to get started on it right away so we could have some plans in place in very early spring," Colaianne said.







# Kepner's schools' choicest

Eight years ago, Kay Kepner moved to Northville from Dearborn primarily because of the open schools, but also because of the small town atmosphere.

She hadn't been a resident for four months before the open school concept disappeared but Kepner dived right into the school district as a volunteer and this year is the Distinguished Guest at the PTA Founders' Day dinner.

The dinner will begin at 6 p.m. April 20 with a punch reception at the high school, followed by supper in the cafeteria. Tickets, at \$10 per person, are available from any school building.

Kepner has co-chaired the citizens committee on the Northville High School renovation, was a member of the committee defining quality education, worked on science fairs, was a PTA president and helped develop the Junior Great Books program for the schools.

In between times, she drove her three children to music lessons and athletic events, all taking about 8-10 hours a week, she said.

That's if you don't count the weekend that I went to seven different performances for one child," she said.

Difficulty of the task at hand has never deterred Kepner from her volunteer efforts, nor has it stopped her three children, Ron, Charles or Karen, from their involvement in the Northville Public Schools.

"In some ways, particularly when it comes to music, the more difficult the better," says Kepner. Ron, a senior at the University of Michigan,

plays the bassoon and is majoring in engineering and performance. Charles, who plays the oboe, is a student at Michigan Tech and Karen, a sophomore at Northville High School, plays the French horn.

"Ron will use his engineering degree before he uses his music degree. He wants to eat," Kepner says fondly.

In addition to their music, the Kepner clan also loves to ski and to sail. Thursday, Kay was preparing for a ski trip to Colorado. "We have to get the trips in around school," she admitted. "In two years, (when Karen graduates) I'm looking forward to having a bit more time."

Although when an extra hand was needed, Kepner has usually volunteered to help, she says there are some areas where she does draw the line.

"I don't chaperone dances," she says, and then adds a disclaimer, "unless there is absolutely no one else."

She admits that she has chaperoned at least one dance, and maybe after Karen does graduate, she may still be involved in the school district, leaving less time for the things she enjoys, working with fibers.

She is an accomplished seamstress, weaver and quilter.

She also promotes the Northville Public Schools, almost on a full-time basis.

"I think that now Northville students are getting a good education and have good textbooks. That hasn't always been the case. When I first got involved in the schools, the textbooks were outdated," she recalls.

And, when Kepner moved to Northville, instrumental music was not flourishing.

"They had eliminated it because of the budget and even though instrumental music has been reinstated, it still isn't as strong as other areas," she said.

Kepner knows firsthand the problems of no music program and outdated texts. That was what lured her back to volunteering.

"When we first moved here, I wanted to take some time off from involvement with the schools," she said, adding that she had been very active in Dearborn.

"But that vacation didn't last very long. It started out slowly, but within a year, I was very involved in the schools," she said. At one time, she was involved in three different schools and still was serving on district-wide committees.

"My favorite thing is curriculum, especially science, math and the arts."

Kepner pronounces the new kindergarten-grade 12 science curriculum as "just wonderful" but notes there still is a need for improvement in the arts.

She would like to see a 7-hour day at the high school so that students can specialize in a subject area and still meet graduation requirements, but she would not like to see the bills currently pending in the state legislature become law.

"The problem with the tax bill is that it will not help Northville. All it will do is send our tax money to another district," she said.

Nor would she like to see a statewide core curriculum. "Northville already has a core curriculum. It doesn't need another one."

But the schools have only one Kay Kepner. And that is unfortunate.

# NRPH delays request for reaccreditation visit

"We get our highest census in the summer and then it tapers off around Christmas and the winter. Then it picks up again in the late spring and early summer," Brown said.



# Pursell gives Rotarians a lesson on federal budget deficit

U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell went out on a limb Tuesday afternoon and predicted that Lamar Alexander, the Republican governor of Tennessee, will be George Bush's running mate during the November election.

But that was not the main message Pursell gave members of the Northville Rotary. Pursell, as he does at every speaking opportunity, discussed the budget deficit, calling the interest on the national debt "dishonest, irresponsible and something that should not be allowed to be passed on to our children and grandchildren."

"I was so concerned (about the deficit) that I led a task force in 1985

to try and get a budget that would be balanced by 1991 without a tax increase," the veteran legislator said.

"The Republicans liked it so much that they took some of it for their budget plan, the Democrats liked parts of it so much that they adopted it as part of their plan. What happened is that the Republicans and Carl Pursell lost and the Democrats won," he said.

Pursell said the sense of Congress is that the deficit may approach \$170 million for Fiscal 1988, down slightly from the anticipated \$173 million deficit for Fiscal 1987.

"The math is simple. We had expenditures of more than \$1.02 trillion and revenues of \$842 million in 1987. Although revenues are expected to

increase to \$898 billion, expenditures are also expected to go up to \$1.06 trillion. Even though that puts the deficit at \$157 million, people think it will be higher than that," he said.

"The thing that hits me the hardest is that the interest on the national debt, \$151 billion a year, is 14 percent of the entire budget."

Pursell said that entitlement programs such as Social Security, Medicare, Medicaid and educational programs like the Pell Grants, make up 44 percent of the budget and defense spending makes up 26 percent of it.

Although the original Gramm Rudman Hollings plan would have eliminated the budget deficit by 1991, Pursell said that already there had been "slippage."

"The president and Congress thought that we couldn't reduce spending that quickly and under the new Gramm Rudman Hollings plan, it will be 1993 before the budget is balanced."

Pursell said despite the gloom and doom prediction of the budget, the economy looked pretty good.

"I was with (Secretary of the Treasury) Jim Baker recently and he's pretty positive and upbeat about the economy. He's also going to be doing a fund-raiser for me in Ann Arbor."

Democrats Dean Baker and Lana Pollock, both of Ann Arbor, will be squaring off in the August primary for the right to challenge Pursell in November.

On the international front, Pursell called the upcoming Senate ratification vote of the INF treaty "the most historical arms reduction pact in history."

But, he noted, the next step would be the new strategic arms reduction talks that will be dealing with the big missiles, the ICBMs and their placement.

On Central America, Pursell said that he did not know how long the 60-day cease fire signed between the Sandinistas and Contras would last.

"I guess that's up to Ortega and the people there," he said.

"What we need is a unilateral voice to articulate our message. We have that with Canada, our largest trading partner. We debate acid rain and we have the International Joint Commis-

sion (on the Great Lakes). But we don't have that dialogue with our southern neighbors."

"It's time to build a long-term relationship with them," Pursell said.

But he also noted the impediments to such a dialogue. "The drug war is such a horrible all-encompassing thing that it is difficult to build the dialogue. I have suggested that we use the military, but (Secretary of Defense Frank) Carlucci says no," Pursell said.

Pursell called on Middle East leaders to overcome their self-interests in favor of "the courage of statesmanship."

"The possibility of peace there does not look too appropriate. It (the situation) is a time bomb that needs to be defused."



# Horse stable at Maybury opens again

For a couple of years now, the signs have been telling people that the stable at Maybury State Park was closed.

Tuesday, the signs came down. For the first time since 1985, the horse stable at the state park is open to let people of different abilities enjoy supervised horseback riding on the park's 12 miles of marked trails. And the man running the stable expects the stable to be pretty active.

"I would say this is one of the most popular state riding facilities. It's one of the busiest," said Ron Gordon.

the concessionaire who is running the stable this year.

Gordon is opening the riding season with 20 horses, and is allowed to increase his stable up to 50 as business picks up. Riding stables usually do not become busy until late May, he said.

The charge to ride at the Maybury stable is \$10 per hour, plus park admission, which is \$2 for a day or \$10 for a full year. A permit is good for any state park.

Gordon said just about anyone can go out to the stable and ride, even if they have never been on a horse before. Instead of an age restriction, the Maybury stable will have a

minimum height for riders — but even that is a little flexible, he said.


"Everybody gets a pre-ride instruction and they're put on a horse to their capability," Gordon said. "As far as I'm concerned, every rider that a rider takes in my stable is as lesson."

This is Gordon's first year at Maybury, but in the past he has run stables in the Brighton and Pontiac Lake state recreation areas. Most of the state park stables closed in 1985 because liability insurance became difficult to find, Gordon said, but this year it has become available again. The stable will be open from 9 a.m.

to dusk every day except Monday. Gordon plans to offer special programs like group rates, horse-drawn hayrides, and a girl scout program to earn horse badges.

"Good riding horses are hard to find," Gordon said, and he and his employees are working to make sure Maybury has good ones. The stable emphasizes two things for riders: safety, while making sure people enjoy the ride. "We're out there to make things safe, and make sure people have a good time."

The Maybury stable is off the Back Road entrance to the park (just below Eight Mile). For more information, call the stable at 347-1088.





## Drugs can beat potential

Potential. Never underestimate your own potential. Don't second guess your chance to be anything or anyone you want. And, don't underestimate the power of drugs to cheat you out of the opportunities you have coming.

If you're using drugs now, stop. If you're not, don't start. Give yourself a chance to find all the wonderful things you can do and be. Potential has no limits unless you put them there.

Says Ian MacDonald, M.D., director of White House Policy for Drug Abuse: "Drug use is a progressive and dangerous societal problem. Those parents who re-

main ambivalent or silent, or who choose debate at the expense of action, do little for the millions of American youngsters who are in deep trouble with alcohol or other drugs.

"The burden is on those who claim experimentation is expected, moderation is possible, and responsible use is acceptable. The burden of proof should not fall on those who disagree and believe that all adolescent drug use is abuse.

Insistence that drug free adolescence is a desirable and possible goal provides the most consistent and potentially effective framework on which to focus prevention, intervention and treatment efforts.

In facing the upcoming days, weeks and months, it is important to remember that we as parents and adults bear the responsibility

for what happens to our children. Learning how to parent begins when you are a child.

Here are some helpful things parents can do.

Educate yourself about drugs and alcohol including cigarettes and their addictive properties.

Photocopy a piece of educational material and share it with a friend.

Be your child's first educator about drugs and alcohol at a young age.

Make time in your daily schedule to spend quality time with your child (at a recent conference co-sponsored by West Bloomfield Schools and West Bloomfield Families In Action, a statement was made that on an average parents and families spend 12 minutes per day of quality sharing time together.)





However, members of the church were not as reticent. On Saturday, more than 150 church members and others affiliated with the school attended an informational meeting at the First United Methodist Church.

Discussions on the recently completed renovation of the church, of the school budget and the dismissal of the two women, and of pastoral leadership were held.

However, much of the discussion centered on the dismissals.

"I can't understand why this happened," said Mary Lou Nejman. "I mean, there was no warning. I think Mrs. Thompson was doing a super job."

Not everyone shared Nejman's enthusiasm. "From what I understand, the principal has not been supportive of the efforts of the church when it comes to spending money. About \$40,000 in the sanctuary renovation fund was going to be used for the school, but she wanted more," said a member of the church council, who declined to be identified.







# 325 respond to program of amnesty at Omnicom

March was a month of confessions for 325 Omnicom Cablevision viewers.

That's how many subscribers called the cable company to turn themselves in during a one-month amnesty program, said Frederick Collman, general manager for the cable company.

Cable company amnesty programs are growing in popularity.

"We're trying to let people know in the industry that there's property rights" on cable television, said Steve Smith, executive director, Michigan Cable Television Association.

"It lets people have a chance to do the right thing," Smith said. "There are a group of people out there selling illegal converter boxes."

Omnicom bookkeeping snafus were responsible for some of the free viewing and in other cases scofflaws admitted deliberate pirating.

After they turned themselves in, one-third said they wanted to pay the difference in the future and continue the service, Collman said.

Starting Monday (today) crews will be on the street and auditing equipment," Collman said. "We

don't want to be the big bad nasty cable TV company. These people are our customers."

HBO, the Movie Channel and Cinemax are the channels most often pirated, Collman said.

The crews' findings will be compared with Omnicom's books to ensure the channels viewed also are billed.

When they find discrepancies, an Omnicom sales representative will call and say: "It looks like you're getting HBO and not paying for it, how would you like to keep it?" Collman said.

For those who don't want to pay for the extra channels, Omnicom will install devices to block the viewing.

"Then we'll go back and check it again probably in four to six weeks," Collman said. "And, if they're getting it again without paying then this person is stealing from me and there's no question about it."

"We're not going to say that we're going to take legal action in all cases," Collman said.

State and federal laws prohibit viewing cable channels without paying for the service. In Canton there also is an ordinance.





### Legislators must pursue full revenue from track

In the 1988-89 Northville city budget, the city administration and city council are looking at having to come up with a way to reconcile a gap between expected revenues and expenses of almost \$120,000.

It's going to be difficult. The Headlee amendment to the state constitution is going to force a rollback in the city's millage rate, and we hope the officials don't have to resort to asking the voters to override that requirement.

In view of the budget gap, it might seem tempting to criticize the raises just awarded to city administrators. However, these raises are deserved, and all of them together will only total about \$18,400 a year — still leaving a gap of \$100,000 even without the raises.

Short of holding a car wash or selling candy door-to-door, there probably aren't too many new sources of revenue the city can explore. The direction to look, it seems, is toward making cuts in the budget to make up for the revenue shortfall.

That is a shame. We don't want to see the city's level of services drop, but that may be what happens, since there isn't a whole lot of fat in the city's operations.

But there may be one alternative well worth pursuing — not new revenue exactly, but an increase in an existing revenue source. Specifically, we think it's time to launch a major effort to increase the city's return from state taxes on Northville Downs.

The state taxes race tracks, and twenty percent of that tax money is

supposed to come back to the municipality where the track operates, up to a maximum return of \$900,000 for a track with races during the winter.

The problem is that Northville — and Livonia and Hazel Park and everywhere else that has a track — never get all that they're supposed to get. Over the past few years, Northville's 20 percent figure has been above the \$900,000 cap, so the city should have received that full amount.

But the State of Michigan works on a tight budget, and when the legislature has approved its annual appropriation, Northville has lately received only around \$750,000. The actual share amounts have risen each year recently, but not by much. Not by enough.

This year, the 20 percent figure is going to be very close to the \$900,000 cap. The city — wisely, considering recent history — has tentatively budgeted to actually receive only \$750,000.

It seems so simple. A \$120,000 shortfall in revenues, and \$150,000 that the city deserves and isn't getting.

Clearly, resolution of this issue is up to the entire state legislature, but we'd really like to see the city's legislators — Senators R. Robert Geake and Jack Faxon, and Representatives Gerald Law and Willis Bullard — make a major push in the next state budget for track communities to get the money they deserve. It won't help during this year's city budget sessions, but the money would certainly come in handy in the future.

### Employment rejection can't affect relationship

Larry DeBrincat's decision to stay with Vilican-Lemon, Northville Township's planning consulting firm, rather than to accept a new job as the township's zoning and building administrator could lead to hard feelings between the township board and the consultants and that would be unfortunate.

We hope that there are no residual hard feelings and that the needs of the township are addressed maturely and professionally.

One of the reasons DeBrincat was the Board of Trustees' first choice was because of his familiarity with the issues soon to be confronting the planning commission, most notably a woodlands/wetlands ordinance.

Through the years Vilican-Lemon has performed admirably for the township, providing expertise in writing ordinances, helping with

master plans and updates to the plan, and to define legally the parameters of various zoning districts.

It is never easy to accept that a prospective employee prefers a current position, especially after a new job has been offered and accepted.

DeBrincat said that his reasons for staying with Vilican-Lemon, and the discussions leading to that decision, are very personal. But what will not be personal will be the continuing relationship between the consultants and the township.

Hopefully Vilican-Lemon and Northville Township will respect DeBrincat's decision and continue to work together to benefit the township and its residents. No one likes to be spurned, but it was a professional decision on everyone's part and the relationship between the two should continue to be professional.

## Twister of fate

I think the Novi tornado last year made us all more aware of the potential destruction that can be left behind following a tornado.

The funnel that hit Novi's Chateau Estates last summer just happened to come on Father's Day. Last Sunday — Easter Sunday — another tornado hit the area. It didn't get much attention because it touched down only briefly, didn't cause much damage and didn't take any lives. How fortunate.

The official report was that it touched down anywhere from 6:19 to 6:32 p.m. on Pontiac Trail just west of Wixom and destroyed a barn. A second touchdown was reported on South Wixom Road. Just like many of the Chateau Estates residents on Father's Day last year, I was visiting relatives for the holiday. Since my wife and I live in Wixom near Pontiac Trail, we were a little concerned.

The reports weren't bad like they were a year ago so we weren't real worried, but I couldn't help but flash back to the Novi tornado. After several nervous jokes, we left for home a couple hours later and when we arrived, everything looked the same.

We weren't expecting the worst but we were relieved nonetheless to find everything exactly the way we left it. It wasn't exactly a real traumatic episode, but it was an uncomfortable feeling. I can't imagine what the Chateau Estates people went through, waiting to get admittance to the park, a year ago. It had to have been a terrible sinking feeling in the pit of the stomach. Especially for the ones that still had loved ones unaccounted for.

It makes you wonder about this area. I'm sure

it's just a coincidence but tornados seem to be attracted to the Northville- Novi-Wixom area lately. I suppose two in 10 months time isn't enough to be considered a trend, but it's still unsettling. And both happened on a Sunday holiday at sites not more than five or six miles apart.

I think the first time I can remember being frightened at the thought of a tornado was as a kid. I remember watching "The Wizard of Oz" and seeing Dorothy and Toto being whisked in the air by one. The twister moved toward the house and Dorothy was caught in the middle of it — I thought the whole thing was quite realistic and frightening. Of course, the scariest part of the movie was the Wicked Witch of the West, but the tornado was a solid second.

I remember hearing stories of an uncle and some friends who stood on their porches and watched a tornado move through Grand Rapids many years ago while their wives pleaded with them to come to their senses and seek shelter. At the time, I thought that was kind of cool. They said it sounded like a freight train.

I was always interested in seeing film of tornados, probably because they aren't very common. It's a terrible force that strikes without much warning — the type of mysterious quirk in mother nature that is curious to most people.

For years, I maintained that I would like to see an actual tornado some day — from a distance of course. But after the events of the past 10 months, I can honestly say that silly notion is gone. The closest I ever want to be is the distance from my favorite chair to the T.V. screen.

I feel the citizens of Northville should know the history of the Thomson Field and the circumstances as to why it was closed.

The Thomson Field was built in memory of our late father, Arthur M. Thomson, with completion in time for the 1972 softball season. We spent in excess of \$100,000 and made it one of the finest fields in Wayne County. We leased it to the Recreation for \$1.00 per year, in return they were to keep the building, field, fences and grounds in good repair and secure the gates when not in attendance. The cooperation was good the first couple of years and then as directors changed, so did the cooperation. Repeated calls and letters through the years as to the conditions at the

field were ignored. The deterioration of the field became more apparent each year. By 1982, the conditions were so bad, even the restroom facilities were unusable and a member of the family was having to secure the gates at night. Only due to a plea from Mayor Vernon did we consent to the use of the field in 1984.

We donated the lights, poles, interior fencing and bleachers to the Recreation for use at a new field which was to be started in 1983 on the 30 some acres the Recreation purchased from the State for \$1.00 (Beck between 5 & 6 Mile). To this day, nothing has been done to make those acres usable, yet I read in the Northville Record that the Recreation Department has applied to the State for some \$130,000 to purchase more land. Wouldn't that same money be better used to improve land they already have and build the softball diamonds that were planned in 1983?





# Novi firm stresses energy-efficient homes

Remember the days of the oil embargo, when lines of automobiles lined up for gasoline and government officials proclaimed the need to develop alternate energy sources?

In those days, one of the potential sources of energy deemed most attractive was the sun — solar energy. And even though the days of the oil embargo have passed and Americans are no longer as concerned with developing alternate energy sources, the concept of solar energy to provide power to houses remains strong.

In fact, there's a company called Integral Works which is busy developing solar homes right in Novi. Dean Unick of Novi and Bill Gourlay of Detroit met as self-employed carpenters. They began their partnership in 1983 when they found that they worked well together and shared the same goal — to build quality homes.

The Novi-based business offers super-insulated, energy-efficient housing. Its homes give function and beauty at the lowest possible cost.

"We offer value integrated design," said Unick, who uses his own home as the model. "We build high quality homes."

"A house has got to do more than keep the rain off your back. It doesn't have to be expensive to achieve energy efficiency. A house should work for a living, help heat and cool itself."

They don't use gadgetry or solar collectors to build in solar features for their homes. Careful placement

of windows and use of insulation does most of the work.

Our concept is to spend truly necessary dollars on quality materials for better structure. We use careful engineering for better function," explained Gourlay.

"We spend more money up front in the structure itself, so you can spend less on energy and maintenance later on."

"There's instant payback on utility bills. In the long run you're saving money. In reality, it's true."

Their standard home is a two-story, 24-by-32 foot contemporary Cape Cod, with a walk-out basement. The average cost is \$97,600.00 including a 20-by-20 foot two-car garage and hillside lot. They're currently building houses in Shawood Heights subdivision in Novi.

The standard passive solar features include the use of triple glazed stationary windows for bay windows and skylights. Double-pane Anderson windows with high performance coatings are used in the operable windows.

They put Fiberglass insulation to work with a solid 10 inches in the walls and 12 inches in the ceilings.

Wood, instead of cement, foundations are used for further insulation. The entire basement floor sits on a 2-inch thick Styrofoam base to keep it warmer and drier than most basements.

Another custom feature standard to the homes are hand-built European-style cupboards. They are self-closing with no visible seams and

# 'Home equity loans have downside, too'

Home is not just where the heart lies. For many people, home is where their credit line starts.

Each year, homeowners tap trillions of dollars in loans based on the equity in their homes. The 1986 Tax Reform Act (TRA), which gradually phases out deductions for interest paid on consumer debt while preserving those for interest paid on home equity loans, has only made these loans more appealing.

Deceptively attractive and relatively easy to obtain, equity loans have a downside that many consumers ignore: they put at risk what is probably the average consumer's most valuable asset — his or her home.

As part of National Consumers Week, the Michigan Association of CPAs advises anyone considering an equity loan to find out how this type of loan works and what effect it may have on the value of your home.

In simplified terms, a home equity loan transforms your home into a super credit card. You never have to leave home without the value of your home tucked into your wallet in the form of a check or a credit card.

A type of second mortgage, home equity loans enable you to open credit lines based on the equity in your home (the market value of a house minus the amount owed on it). Once the credit line is established, you can continually tap into the account by simply writing a check or using a special credit card — or you can withdraw the entire amount at once.

With home equity loans acquired after Oct. 13, 1987, you can deduct all interest on loans up to \$1 million if the funds are used to construct, purchase or improve a principal or second residence. If you do not use the funds for any of these purposes, you can still deduct interest on amounts not exceeding the differences between

the amount of your acquisition in indebtedness and your home's current fair market value — up to a limit of \$100,000.

For example, if the fair market value of your home is \$150,000 and you currently owe \$80,000 on the original mortgage, you can deduct interest on a home equity loan of up to \$70,000. Suppose the fair market value of your home is \$150,000 and you only owe \$30,000 on the original mortgage. You may be able to get an equity loan of \$120,000, but the interest on the amount exceeding \$100,000 will be only partially deductible in 1988.

While the law caps the amount of interest deductible on home equity loans, it doesn't impose restrictions on the way you use the funds.

Add to the lure of tax-deductible interest the fact that some home equity loans offer 30-year terms and low interest rates, and you begin to get a sense of how seductive equity loans can be to taxpayers facing a total phase out of all consumer interest deductions by 1991.

To individuals dazed by tax reform, home equity loans seem to be the fastest, safest way to obtain an interest-deductible credit line for all consumer purchases — from the purchase of a car to flying the family to Hawaii.

What consumers must remember, however, is that a home equity loan is, in fact, a mortgage. Each withdrawal from an equity loan increases the amount of obligation held against your home. In addition, applying for a home equity loan entails application and closing fees. Many

lenders also charge up front fees in the form of "points."

Depending on the funds use, the points may be fully or partially deductible — or they may have to be amortized over the life of the loan. Some institutions also reserve the right to call the loan if you sell your house. What that means is that the bank suddenly has control over the decisions you make regarding your property.

Does it really make sense to take out the equivalent of a 30-year second mortgage and put your house on the line to purchase a \$12,000 car that you may sell in five years? If you plan to use the funds to consolidate credit card debt, will you really cut up your credit cards and use only cash for future purchases? These are some of the questions you must ask before deciding to apply for a home equity loan.

Examine your own spending habits carefully. Are you an impulse shopper? Do your credit card bills keep growing despite your intentions to cut them down?

Your credit card habits are a good indicator of how you may handle your home equity credit line. If the flexibility of a large credit line would tempt you to spend money you don't really have, think again about whether the loan is necessary.

If you are afraid you will exploit your credit line but still need to take out a home equity loan, ask your lending institution to limit withdrawals to \$100 to \$500 per check — or consider a traditional second mortgage to pay for that one big-ticket item.

If you have a large mortgage, excessively high credit card bills, auto

loans or other debt, examine your financial situation carefully before taking out a home equity loan. Consider the possibility of unexpected events. If you lost your job, could you keep up with loan payments or would you have to default — and perhaps lose your home?

Another way to determine your ability to shoulder an equity loan is by asking your lender to review your financial record and advise you accordingly. For example, if your debt payments total more than 35 percent of your income before taxes, the lender may suggest that you not take out the loan.

If you decide that a home equity loan is right for you, make sure you pick the right lending institution. Find out if the bank protects you against rising interest rates or lets you lock in a desirable rate. Compare your lender's fee with that of other institutions — high annual fees and other costs can outweigh the tax advantages of the home equity loan, especially if you are only borrowing a small amount.

Read the small print and check to see if your lender charges an inactivity fee or a penalty for prepayment. Finally, check the laws in your state. Laws affecting home equity loans vary from state to state and are currently in a state of flux. For instance, Texas prohibits home equity loans.

Equity loans can be a good way to raise cash, but remember, you are putting your home at risk. Cases of homeowners overextending themselves, then suffering foreclosure to satisfy their lenders, are not uncommon.

CPAs advise you to study all your options before making any decisions and get independent advice to help you decide if a loan is safely within your means.

concealed hinges which gives a clean, simple look when used in the bathrooms and kitchens.

## Get ready — tax deadline looms ahead

When the April 15 income tax filing date comes around, America's 100 million taxpayers will have spent at least two billion hours preparing for and making out their state and federal tax returns, according to a University of Michigan economist.

Figuring an average cost in time and professional tax assistance fees of approximately \$275 per household, the bill to taxpayers for complying with the tax laws this year adds up to as much as \$27 billion.

Joel B. Slemrod, director of the U-M School of Business Administration's Office of Tax Policy Research, who compiled the cost-of-compliance figures, said this year's costs may be even higher because people will need more time to learn the new rules of the Tax Reform Act of 1986.

"There is already some evidence that people are slower in filing their returns this year," said Slemrod, associate professor of business economics and of economics. "That is an indication that people either are psychologically put off by the new forms or are finding filling them out more difficult than usual."

In his research, conducted on a group of Minnesota residents who filed 1982 state and federal income tax returns, Slemrod found that on the

average it takes a taxpayer 21.7 hours per year to complete his taxes.

Filing out the form is a relatively minor part of the exercise, he said. Two-thirds of the time is devoted to record-keeping, one-tenth to research and one-fifth to filling in the blanks on the form.

Slemrod calculated that the value of the time spent on compliance was \$231 per household. He added another \$44 as an average cost of additional expenses such as having an accountant or agency prepare the return. About half of all households hire professionals to prepare their tax forms, he said, including 25 percent of those who file the simplified 1040A returns and 5 percent of those filing the 1040EZ form.

Compliance is most expensive for those who are self-employed. They spend an additional average 35 hours and an extra \$69 getting their forms in order because their records are more complicated.

Slemrod's research also showed that the lowest income class has relatively high compliance costs, proportionate to their income, as does the highest income class. Slemrod said this may not be a true picture of the low-income taxpaying population, but may reflect the fact that some of the households surveyed were self-employed and only temporarily earning low incomes in the depressed farm economy of 1982.

The American tax system is based more on self-assessment than tax systems in most other countries, Slemrod said. For example, the Japanese and British system of withholding taxes from wage and salary income is so finely tuned that the average individual may file a tax return only once every few years.

"In my view, the government could make the tax system simpler for Americans," he said. "But it is not always clear that simpler is better. We live in a world of complicated economic activity, and for a tax system to be fair and effective, there must be a certain amount of complication."

Methods for making the tax process simpler are not necessarily better, he explained, because they may sacrifice other desirable qualities. For example, a flat tax or a value-added tax is not as effective at taxing those in the higher income brackets, he said.

The tax reform legislation did simplify the tax process in three ways, Slemrod said. It dropped six million low-income individuals off the tax rolls by increasing the standard deduction and personal exemption. It lessened incentives for people to devise methods to lower their taxable income by lowering the tax rates. And by raising the standard deduction and eliminating some deductions, it reduced by several million the number of people who will itemize deductions.

On the other hand, Slemrod noted, the tax reform created new complications. Deductions for interest paid, especially on home equity loans, are now very complicated. The deduction allowed for an IRA contribution is no longer a standard figure, but contingent on several other things. Also, the alternative minimum tax will affect many more taxpayers than before.

"The new rate structure really isn't simplification," he said. "Whether there are two rates or 15, it only takes seconds to go to the tax tables and find the amount you owe. The hard part is getting to the taxable income."

## Class offers tips with wardrobes

Be critical of your own appearance, don't look at yourself only from the waist up, turn around in front of the mirror and see yourself coming and going, advised Gloria Check, known to television audiences as "The Wardrobe Mistress."

Check, who teaches women how to plan their clothing for maximum use and attractiveness, offered shopping and dressing tips to approximately 50 area residents last week at an "Essential Accessories" workshop at Novi Meadows School.

The workshop was sponsored by the Cooperative Extension Service of Michigan State University and the Michigan Institute of Laundering and Dry Cleaning Inc.

Home economists Elaine Glasser of Oakland County and Phyllis Cooper of Livingston County were also on hand to offer suggestions on how to care for leather, suede and vinyl, jewelry and scarves. The use of scarves and jewelry to brighten and alter the appearance of various outfits was also demonstrated.

Check, who describes herself as a "Shopaholic" — for which there is no known cure, — told her attentive audience to "zero in exactly (on what you need when you go shopping). You must be prepared for what you need to buy."

She recommended going through that "closet full of clothes with nothing to wear" to see which articles go together and what is essential to complete an outfit. Then, shop with list in hand.

"Shop the European way," Check suggested. "Less is more there. They pay more for each article, but they make each piece work and function more. Buy the very best you can afford."

Those on a limited budget were advised to put the majority of their clothing money in dressing from the waist up as that is the part most people focus on when they talk to you.

The least expensive way to update a wardrobe is in accessories and Check recommended shopping in resale shops for scarves, belts and jewelry. Accessories attract creativity, she added.

Shopping at the resale stores can be rewarding, especially in terms of jewelry and scarves, according to Check. She suggested searching out the popular earrings of 30-40 years ago — cluster pearls and aurora borealis — as well as large deco pins. All are back in vogue, she added.

Spring trends? Check noted that skirt lengths have fashion "in a quandary" and almost any length is okay.

"If you have a good figure and bad legs, wear a longer skirt length. Some things look better shorter," Check commented. "For the office, wear skirts over the knee so that they provide comfort while sitting."

Check also advised women that the higher the skirt hemline, the higher the shoe heel should be and, conversely, the longer the skirt, the lower the heel.

For a nice, unwrinkled look in hose, Check said she wears light support panty hose. "There's no bagging, they feel wonderful and they come in all colors."

"If you're wearing a winter white suit, keep the color going. Wear pale hose and light shoes. No dark hose with light shoes. And, by the way, winter white is good all year round."

Full leg as well as the popular narrow leg pants are in this spring, according to Check. "When you shorten pants, wear a medium heel and have the bottom of the pant leg come just

## Jewelry care reflects on overall look

An important part of any wardrobe is the accent on jewelry. The right brooch, necklace or bracelet can make or break an outfit.

And the wrong care can spoil the appearance of the nicest jewelry, even fine silver, gold and gems.

Since jewelry can get dirty either from wearing or from storing, Phyllis Cooper, Oakland County Cooperative Extension home economist, recommends using a commercial cleaner available at a jewelry store.

Or you can make your own cleaner with care. Hot water and soap and/or toothpaste can be used to polish silver.

Silver won't tarnish if constantly in use, but when it is not, tarnish inhibitors work well, Cooper said.

Liquid cleaners for dipping silver are harsh and should not be used for jewelry, she warned.

To make a cleaner for other kinds of jewelry, use one part ammonia to an equal part water and add a drop or two of dish detergent. This is better than using toothpaste, but toothpaste is better than nothing, Cooper advised.

Gold can be damaged by harsh cleaning chemicals. If they are hard on your hands, they are hard on gold, Cooper said. Chlorine will darken gold and only repolishing the gold will restore the color, so remove your rings when cleaning.

Mercury sticks to gold and deteriorates it, Cooper cautioned, adding that gold does not tarnish, corrode or rust as other metals do.

Diamonds and some other gemstones attract grease and hold it. The greasy film will dull diamonds. It is wise to have a jeweler check diamond ring settings twice a year.

Cooper noted, to be sure they have not loosened.

She also advised having jewelry that has fine gemstones cleaned professionally in case of loose setting.

Do not immerse costume jewelry in cleaner, since glue is often used to set the stones. The cleaner may soften the glue and loosen the stones.

Pearls and any other jewelry strung on string should not be immersed in water or cleaners because the string will rot from the moisture. Wipe each piece with a soft cloth.

If the string is loosening and there is space between the pearls or other stones, they should be restrung.

To the top of the heel. That way the pants will be the right length whether you wear a high or low heel with them.

To tie your wardrobe together, buy pants in basic colors that you like, then create an outfit by topping your blouse with a coordinated cardigan, jacket or vest. "Always think 'out fit,'" Check admonished her audience, "but don't button your sweater or jacket."

The Wardrobe Mistress also demonstrated with Glasser and Cooper how to dress up an office suit

for an evening out on the town. A winter white camisole top, flecked with gold, replaced Glasser's fuchsia blouse with her winter white suit.

Large gold earrings, with bracelet and broach-type pin and a gold lame purse added to the overall evening effect.

When it comes to brooches or silk-flower accents, wear them on the shoulder rather than the lapel or neckline, Check said. "The big shoulder pads make it easy to pin them on."

"And, if you don't have shoulder pads go out and buy some," she admonished.

Cooper's basic black suit was

enhanced for evening with a black sequined blouse, red and black earrings and a red flower on the shoulder. Check added a small sparkling, black cocktail hat with short veil and a small purse for the final touches.

She also recommended patent shoes and purses for spring, but said they can now be worn all year since they no longer "peel."

Check said it is not necessary to exactly match shoes and purses since they are not worn next to each other. The idea is to have them coordinate with the outfit.

Have a cotton or part cotton sweater that "grows?" Check recommends washing it in cold water in the

washer on the slow cycle. Place in in the dryer with a large dry towel and a fabric softener sheet. Don't dry it completely, but do get some of the moisture out.

Take it out of the dryer while still damp and finish drying it flat. This will help the garment return to its original shape, Check said. She added that, although she ordinarily recommends drycleaning most fabrics, it does not work well with stretched-out cotton sweaters.

Check concluded her talk with the comment, "I love shoes and purses best. You can gain five pounds and they still fit."

## Scarves tie-in

Tired of wearing your scarf tied in the traditional bow or square knot?

This year anything goes with scarves. Wear a large scarf folded in a triangle over the shoulder of a dress with a simple neckline so that the triangle drapes attractively over your sleeve. Tuck the ends through your belt.

A really pretty effect can be achieved with a good-sized oblong scarf and a small rubber band. Place the scarf loosely around your neck as you would when wearing a coat.

At about your bustline, grasp the center edge of each long side and pull a small piece through the rubber band. Wrap the rubber band until it is reasonably tight and then pull out the ends until they appear to make a bow effect at the neckline.

This produces a splashy, full scarf look that can be used to fill in an open neckline or may be worn over the top of a high-necked blouse or sweater. This look is guaranteed to draw compliments all day and lots of questions on how you achieved it.

The appearance can be altered by

how far up or down you start the rubber band and how much scarf you pull through it.

Large square scarves are in this year because of their versatility and the dramatic effects they can be used to achieve.

Find the approximate center on the wrong side of a large square scarf. Gather up a small piece of the scarf center and slip a smallish rubber band around the gathered up portion. Wrap the rubber band until it is reasonably tight.

Flip the scarf back to the right side and hold it in a triangular shape. You now have an attractively gathered area in the center. Place the gathered area below your chin and knot the ends behind your neck.

The look of the gathered area can be changed by how much or how little of the scarf you pull through the rubber band and how tight you wrap it.

If the front pointed ends of the scarf seem a little long, pick them up and tuck them under, securing them with a decorative pin on the outside or a small safety pin on the under side. This gives a softer, dressier look to the scarf arrangement.

### Garment care

It pays to give your wardrobe the care it deserves and needs.

The following suggestions were developed by the Michigan Institute of Laundering and Dry Cleaning, Inc. in Lansing.

**Do...Do...Do...**

□ save the hang tags that come with garments you buy. Show them to your dry cleaner for his guidance and be sure to take note of the instructions that have to do with home care.

□ brush clothes regularly and thoroughly.

□ dry rain-soaked or damp garments thoroughly in a cool, well-ventilated place before hanging in the closet.

□ do have garments cleaned regularly since nominal accumulation of perspiration, grease, grit and dust particles impair the attractiveness and longevity of any apparel.

□ dry wet leather shoes in a low-heat location.

□ send stained garments to the dry cleaner immediately. Exposure to air, heat and light sets stains and can make removal impossible.

□ point out any stains to the dry cleaner when dropping off a garment.

### Don't...Don't...Don't...

□ press a garment if it is stained. The heat will set the stain and may make it impossible to remove.

□ use untested home stain removers or club soda. They can aggravate the condition or cause permanent damage.

□ use an underarm deodorant without using a shield to protect the garment from the deodorant. Allow deodorant to dry before dressing.

□ wear decorative pins on knit garments. If the garment is snagged, use a crochet hook to pull the loop through to the underside to avoid further damage.

□ wear a garment you value when using a cold-wave solution or getting a permanent. Such solutions cause fabric discoloration.

□ store garments at home without first having them cleaned and mothproofed before storage. Be sure the storage bags, boxes or cedar chests used for storage are kept in a dry place that is not excessively warm.

□ use nail-polish remover to remove nail-polish stains on garments. You may damage the dye, or the remover can create a hole in an acetate fabric.

## Silk takes extra care and caution to clean

The very word "silk" conjures up a picture of luxury from the expensive look of a lovely gown to the soft folds of an exquisite scarf.

Discovered in China more than 4,000 years ago, silk has been prized for excellence ever since.

Smooth and lustrous, silk is still a strong and elastic fiber that is fairly resistant to wrinkling. It's comfortable to wear because it is absorbent and dries rapidly.

Silk also releases soil readily and accepts dyes and prints easily. Adap-

table to a variety of weaves, it can be used in sheer or heavily textured fabrics.

However, silk is a "dry-clean only" material. It is fabric not affected by dry-cleaning solvents, but some of the dyes used on silk may bleed or fade in water, according to the International Fabricare Institute.

Sizing may also be used by the manufacturer to add body. This sizing may dissolve, if washed and the result will be a limp rag-type quality.

## 'Me and My Girl' offers a return to musical comedy

In a sophisticated time when the long-running musical theater hits are based on T. S. Eliot's poetry or the life of Eva Peron, it might seem a little odd that great success is coming from the revival of a 1930s, pun-filled British musical about a cockney lad and his true love.

Or maybe not so odd. Because critics in Detroit and across the country are praising "Me and My Girl" — playing at the Fisher Theatre through April 24 — for its warm return to the values that made the show so popular in its day.

The touring company of "Me and My Girl" stars Tim Curry as Bill Snibson, a lower class English man who suddenly inherits a title and estate. The plot provides countless opportunities for puns, sight gags and everything else that characterized the happy-ending, mindless musical comedy of the 1930s.

Audiences enjoy the performance of Curry — a versatile actor who was Frank N. Furter in "The Rocky Horror Picture Show" — as well as those of the rest of the cast.

But the main reason "Me and My Girl" played in London for four years a half-century ago — and the main reason it was chosen for a revival in the late 1980s — is the music. Noel Gay, a popular British composer, wrote the music for the show, including "The Lambeth Walk," which became a very popular ballroom novelty dance. Combined with the lyrics of L. Arthur Rose and Douglas Furber, the score stands up well.

Noel Gay's son, Richard Armitage, decided to mount a revival of "Me and My Girl." He discovered no script for the show had survived the decades, and two songs were lost as well.

The story of how Armitage pieced

the show back together from a rehearsal script found in a museum

an amateur version the authors did in the 1950s, and the memories of fans of the original production. One of the missing songs was located under an incorrect title, and another discovered on a recording in a box Armitage found in his house.

After some rewriting and streamlining, the show made it — in 1984 — to the Haymarket and Adelphi theaters in London, and it is still playing in the latter. The show made its American debut in 1986 in Los Angeles and opened on Broadway later that year.

And now, in 1988 — over 50 years after audiences in London's West End first saw "Me and My Girl" — Detroiters have the chance to see it for the first time.

"Me and My Girl" will be performed Tuesday through Saturday evenings at 8 p.m. with matinees on Saturday and Sunday at 2 p.m. Sunday evening shows are at 7:30 p.m.

Ticket prices range from \$20 to \$37.50 and can be purchased at the Fisher Theatre box office, all TicketMaster outlets, or by phone at 423-6666. For additional ticket information call 872-1000.

# Large turnout for tracksters

With the largest turnout in Northville girl's track history and a solid group of returning standouts, Mustang Coach Mike Webb can hardly wait for the 1988 track season.

Northville officially opens the campaign on April 12 in a double-dual meet against South Lyon and Walled Lake Central. Webb believes the Mustangs can improve on last season's 3-5 overall record, but things couldn't get much worse in conference action because Northville placed 12 in the 12-team WAAA Meet.

"I'm pleased with the turnout," he said. "This is probably the biggest turnout we've ever had. Usually we have about 30 girls but this year we have 40. That's exciting in itself."

The list of seniors who have graduated off last year's team isn't very long, but it features several standouts. Distance specialist Anne Griffith is gone, so is runner Karen Stinson, hurdler Kris Marrone and field event standouts like Roxanne Serkalian and Julie Trausch. If the team is to improve, Webb needs to find quality replacements in these areas.

"We should definitely improve on our record of a year ago," Webb said. "The depth we have and the talent we have coming back indicates to me that we should do better. I would like to set a goal of being above .500 but I want to be careful not to set our goals too high. I'm not sure about how strong the other teams in our league are but I'm certain we can win more than one meet in the WAAA like we did last year."

Northville appears to be strong in the sprint events, especially with the return of school record-holder Christy Lenaghan, the senior sprinter — a four-year varsity veteran — holds the record in the 100-meter dash and is also expected to excel in the 200 and in the 400 and 800 relay races. The rest of the sprinters include junior Krista Schwartz, who is currently the team's fastest in the 200, senior Wendy Davis, sophomore Maria Wen and two promising freshmen — Kendra Huard and Leslie DeKoker.

"Huard's already running times that some of our upperclassmen are running," Webb said. "She's one of the best freshmen I've seen. And I don't think we've really seen all the speed Schwartz has because she's had all the injuries."

Robin McDuffie (Sr.) and Erin Holmberg (Sr.) will lead the way in the 400 and distance runners like Jennifer Goshorn (Sr.) and Katie

Brugman (Sr.) will handle much of the load in the 800. McDuffie will probably anchor the mile relay with Holmberg, Goshorn and Dawn Leland (Jr.) also in the picture.

"We'll take our share of wins in the mile relay but it will be very hard to replace Karen Stinson," Webb pointed out. "She was one of the strongest runners I've seen in years."

In addition to Goshorn and Brugman, the rest of the distance corps includes Jean Riney (Sr.), Lisa Brown (So.) and promising sophomore Kelly Frederick. Brugman and Brown are the top milers, Goshorn and Brown are slated for action in the two mile and Frederick will team with Riney, Brugman and Goshorn in the two mile relay.

"I think we'll be effective in the distance runs," Webb said. "We have some good kids in that area."

The hurdles is an area of concern for Webb. Junior Lee Bills is the team's top prospect in the 100 highs and Leland is the best bet in the 300 lows, but senior Ann Coseo is pushing both. Schwartz returns, as the number one long jumper — so if she can stay healthy, it should be a strong area. Schwartz, who placed fourth in the league meet last spring, will be backed up by senior Cathy Page.

The remaining three field events are big question marks right now. The high jump has never been a particularly strong event for Northville and it probably won't be in '88.

Freshman Shannon Price — who topped 4'-6" as an eighth grader — looks to be the top performer, but after that it's wide open. The discus could be a big problem and the shot put isn't in much better shape. Brugman will give both events a try, Connie Barnett (Jr.) is penciled in as a candidate in the discus and Lee Bills will help out in the shot put.

"We lost a lot in some of the field events," Webb said. "I'm concerned



about the high jump and the shot put and I think the discus is an area we'll be real weak in."

On March 19, Webb took a partial team to compete in the Eastern Michigan Indoor Track Invitational, and he was impressed with some of

the youngsters and newcomers.

"We got a good look at the younger people like Kendra Huard and Kelly Frederick, so it was a success," he said. "Looking at some of the newcomers, we do have some talent."

## Novi's Kinsman directs the U-D athletic department

Not many people realize that a Novi man is running a local Division I college athletic program, but it's true.

University of Detroit Athletic Director Brad Kinsman, 40, lives on Meadowbrook Road with his wife Georgene and daughters Jennifer, 6, and Stephanie, 3. They've called Novi home for 10 years and as the Kinsman family's grown, so too has the city. Kinsman's headed the Titan athletic department for nearly seven years, but has been at U-D as an instructor and coach for 17. Needless to say, he loves both Novi and U-D.

"We've been in Novi for quite a while and we're delighted with it," he said. "We think it's a great place to raise a family. The only disadvantage is how quickly it's growing. When we moved here 10 years ago, it was perfect. Now it's a little busier than we thought it might be, but it's still a great place to live."

Kinsman came to U-D after receiving his B.S. in 1969 from St. Francis Xavier University — where he lettered in hockey, soccer and track — and his M.A. from the University of Minnesota in 1971.

"I came to U-D to teach a couple of courses in Kinesiology and Exercise Physiology," Kinsman recalled. "A couple years later, I took on the golf coaching responsibilities and then I got more involved with athletic administration."

When U-D sought out a new athletic director in the winter of 1982, Kinsman was the search committee's first choice. He still coaches the golf team — after 11 seasons — and is still having great successes. As a matter of fact, the Titan linksters won the Midwestern City Conference crown this season.

A quick glance at local media coverage the past few weeks will give you an idea just how busy Kinsman has been. In that span, Kinsman filled the U-D head basketball coach vacancy and was the Tournament Director for the tremendously successful NCAA Midwest Regional Basketball Tournament at the Silverdome last weekend. In addition, U-D

staged its biggest fund raising function ever last week by toasting former Titan basketball coach/now television analyst Dick Vitale to raise money for the athletic program.

"The last couple of weeks have been very tiring, but very fun," Kinsman said. "We knew all this was coming — it's not like we just started preparing. The regional tournament has been a year and a half project."

"It went very well — I was pleased. It was a lot of work but you get pumped up for these types of things and I've been running on adrenalin for quite a while."

U-D is in the running as the host school for the 1993 NCAA Final Four Tournament, and the Regional's success certainly bodes well for that eventually happening. Kinsman will be going to this year's Final Four site in Kansas City this weekend to further lobby on behalf of Detroit, and he is optimistic.

"The decision whether the NCAA will entertain an offer by the Detroit delegation to host the Final Four may be made this weekend in Kansas City," Kinsman reported. "They have already formally accepted our bid and now it's a question whether they will invite us to give our presentation in Colorado Springs this summer. We feel if we are invited, we have an outstanding chance to land the Final Four."

When Kinsman named University of Arizona Assistant Coach Ricky Birdsong the Titan's new basketball coach several weeks ago, the decision was hailed by experts all across the country, but was criticized by the coaches of the Detroit Public School League (PSL). Top PSL coaches like Cooley's Ben Kelso and Perry Watson were interviewed but passed over, and they didn't like it.

"We expected the cold reception from the PSL coaches," Kinsman admitted. "In fact, we would have been surprised if that didn't happen, just by the way the comments were going before hand."

"It's something we have no control over so we don't worry about it."

Kinsman believes that once the coaches get to know Birdsong, the problem will end.

"One of Ricky's greatest strengths is the fact that he's a personable guy with high morals," Kinsman said. "He's got the best interests of the kids at heart and I don't know how they couldn't support him once they get to know him."

Recent problems with the basketball program have been well documented, but progress has been made rapidly in numerous areas at U-D during Kinsman's tenure. The athletic department's overall facilities have been constantly upgraded, adding the likes of a new baseball scoreboard, sound system, auxiliary field and sprinkling system in the James K. Campbell Athletic

Complex, a new baseball locker room, Nautilus weight training equipment in the sports medicine facilities and a new sound system and playing floor at Calihan Hall.

"When I took over, we had 10 intercollegiate sports and now we're up to 15 and all of them are growing in terms of quality and quantity," Kinsman pointed out. "Our basketball program has fallen on some hard times but I think that is about to change. Unfortunately, basketball seems to be the only one that gets the exposure, but our other teams are doing very well. We've won four conference championships this year."

Kinsman's job is much more than

scheduling events and hiring and firing coaches. The athletic department isn't a very big one at U-D, so he routinely does everything from raising funds to public relations to producing radio and television commercials.

"It's not a standardized situation like at U-M or MSU, where you have five or six departments," he said. "We have just one department but I'll tell you what — we certainly don't get bored."

The main thrust for the athletic department, according to Kinsman, is to concentrate on the basketball program and get it turned around.

"We obviously have a lot of work to

do in that area but we have an increased commitment from the school to fund some critical areas," Kinsman said. "That 0-14 start the basketball team had was really a blessing in disguise. It got the attention of some people who needed it directed at our athletics. Now we're very optimistic."

Kinsman, who was raised in the Canadian Province of Nova Scotia, plans to stay at U-D and Novi for many many years.

"With two young kids, we think it's a big plus to be in Novi," he said. "We've only heard great things about the school district. We really like it here."

Briningstool sheds negative stereotypes

The stereotype of the college athlete is taking a new shape, and a 1987 Northville High School graduate is a perfect example.

Tony Briningstool, 19, graduated from Northville High School with a 3.5 grade point average and is now a freshman at Michigan State University. He plays football for the MSU Spartans and manages to uphold his academic standards. Briningstool, like all other athletes, had to face increasing academic pressure in high school.

"It used to be that if you were athletic you could get into college somehow," Briningstool said. "It's not like that anymore."

The National Collegiate Athletic Association passed Proposition 48 in 1987 to set minimum academic requirements for college-bound athletes.

The NCAA regulation requires high

school athletes to earn at least a 2.0 grade point average in their English, math, science, history and social science classes, score a 15 on their ACT and a 720 on their SAT college entrance exams.

Briningstool said he believes Northville High School prepared him well, although he wishes he had taken humanities in high school to provide a background for MSU's required humanities classes.

The football program at MSU also encourages athletes to balance football with their studies.

At 3 p.m. Monday through Thursday MSU football players gather to watch films, practice and eat at the team dinner. Then the players attend a mandatory two-hour study session.

During the study hours, math, English and science tutors are in the room to assist the players. A player requiring help in a particular class may request a special tutor as well.

The players must maintain a 2.0

cumulative grade point average to be eligible to practice with the team and play in games.

Briningstool believes his relatively fixed football schedule has helped his studies because it provided a set time for both football and homework.

Briningstool's success was apparent on his fall term report card where his grades averaged to a 3.5.

An important person in any aspiring athlete's career is the high school athletic director, who acts as a liaison between college recruiters and athletes.

Northville High School's athletic director and former football coach, Dennis Colligan, believes the emphasis on the high school athlete's grades has increased in the past couple of years. He said grades became especially important after the NCAA passed Proposition 48.

This shift toward better-educated athletes has added pressure to athletic directors to explain how im-

portant grades are to high school students early in the students' careers.

"The hardest thing about it is that we have to stress to 10th and 11th grade athletes, before we're even sure if they are college prospects, that grades will be the thing that hurts them the most," Colligan said.

Briningstool is one of the new breed of athletes whose main concern is getting an education. Since only a select number of players can make a career out of professional sports, college athletes must prepare for their future after graduation.

Briningstool, a pre-med student, wants to attend Wayne State University Medical School and then open a private medical practice. If he has the chance to play professional football he wants to attend medical school during the off-season.

Until graduation, Briningstool will follow his own advice to all athletes, "Study!"

## Siefken on solid ground with studies

The grass is not greener on the other side of the fence for a 1985 graduate of Northville High School majoring in turfgrass management at Michigan State University.

Mike Siefken, 21, of Woodbend Drive has one of the most unique majors on campus. He wants to be a golf course superintendent. Siefken is one of about 24 students in the four-year turf grass management program at MSU.

You may think that tiny elves are responsible for those perfect looking golf courses with cushion greens, but in reality golf course management takes a lot of knowledge and work. Turf grass management majors

must take classes in botany chemistry, and horticulture. Siefken said that he has already learned about different grasses, where they are easiest to grow, how to take care of them and when optimal times are to water.

A job as greenskeeper during the summers of 1986 and 1987 at Meadowbrook Country Club in Northville inspired Siefken to change from business management at Eastern Michigan to turf-grass management at MSU.

"I decided that I wanted to be outside," Siefken said. "I didn't want to just be sitting behind a desk."

While working at the country club he learned about the job of golf course superintendent from wal-

ching his employer.

"I observed it can be a high pressure job," said Siefken. "Ever thing can look fine and the next day there can be a disease on the grass."

Added pressure can come from hard to please golfers who do not realize that changes take time, Siefken said.

The responsibilities under supervision of a golf-course superintendent include mainly pesticide and herbicide applications, irrigation and mowing, Siefken said. Usually all of this must be accomplished within a strict budget.

Golf course superintendents are in high demand. According to Dr. Kenyon Payne, a coordinator of the program at MSU, turf-grass manage-

ment majors never have trouble finding a job. Their biggest problem is deciding where to go.

"There's always going to be a demand for them because there are always going to be people who want to golf," Siefken said.

MSU offers a two-year program and four-year program in turf grass management. The two-year program requires previous experience on a golf course. Students in the four-year program are offered more flexibility in job selection when they graduate.

Students graduating from the program usually start at \$20,000 but professionals can make more than \$55,000.

For Siefken, finding his major was a hole-in-one.

## We all need proper 'Life Balance'

For Joan Mackneish, it's knitting. For others it might be leading a Cub Scout Pack, coaching a little league baseball team, playing racquetball or working with a community service organization.

The point is — everyone needs something.

Mackneish is president of Life Balance Company, a Novi-based corporation which specializes in consulting and training in wellness and related human resource development programs.

And the reason she enjoys knitting is that it represents a distinct change from the profession which occupies the majority of her waking hours.

"My work as a therapist involves a great deal of mental concentration," she said. "When I get away from work, I like to do something physical and something which doesn't take a great deal of thought. That's why I enjoy knitting."

"I have to count stitches, but it doesn't really require a great deal of thinking. Plus, I have a finished product — a sweater, for example — when I'm done. When you counsel people as a profession, you don't always get to see a 'finished product.'"

Constructive leisure-time management is a field of special interest for Mackneish. In fact, she recently spoke on the subject at a symposium entitled "Health Objectives for the Year 2000" at Wayne State University. The focus of her presentation was leisure-time management as a basic health enhancing activity.

Noting that \$77 billion a year is spent on stress-related illnesses and absenteeism, Mackneish believes in prevention and health promotion activities.

"A lot of people suffer from what I call the 'poop and recoup' syndrome," she said. "They go home pooped from work and spend the rest of their time recouping so they can get ready to return to work the next day."

"That's not a healthy lifestyle,"

she added. "There are people who have adequate work skills, but inadequate leisure skills. For a healthy, balanced lifestyle, you need both."

Mackneish said people can become more effective and more fulfilled by learning to use leisure positively. The positive aspects of leisure, although difficult to measure effectively, are the rewards achieved by activities which enhance physical and emotional fitness, stimulate a positive socialization process and promote a well-adjusted personality.

She believes leisure-time management skills are so important to a well-balanced lifestyle that she has proposed that basic lifelong leisure skill training should be required subject in the schools, just like drivers education.

She also suggests that development of leisure skills can become critical to a sense of well-being and life fulfillment. "Let's say you're 40 to 50 years old and really don't like your job, but have reached a point where what you'd really like to do pays \$10,000 per year and you're making \$40,000 per year," she said.

"Realistically, you can't afford to do what you'd like to do, but you can develop leisure-time activities which will provide a sense of fulfillment."

And where do people learn leisure-time skills? Mackneish said the skills taught in Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts can be excellent sources of leisure-time skill training. Another excellent source is sports.

"You can't play baseball all your life, but you can be involved in some aspect of sports — as a spectator, or coaching a little league team."

As a general rule, Mackneish suggests people identify leisure-time activities by looking at what they do in their careers and then bring balance to their lives by doing something quite different in their leisure time.

For example, a person who has a very uncreative job might want to consider taking up photography or painting. A person with a job which requires a lot of thinking might want to develop a hobby which requires

very little creativity. A person who is stuck behind a desk might want to take up a physical activity.

An executive who makes decisions all day long might want to join a community service club, taking on a role where he can be "one of the guys" — a worker instead of a leader.

Mackneish also cautions moderation in leisure-time activities. "Whatever you do, it should be unstructured and spontaneous," she said. "It must not be so structured that it becomes addictive. If that

happens, it defeats the purpose. "And whatever you do, it should not come between yourself and your significant others. A person who takes up golf and makes his spouse a 'golf widow' is in violation of that basic rule."

Selecting leisure-time activities carefully is an important element in physical, mental and emotional health, said Mackneish. "People need to do things in their leisure time which will restore a balance to their lives."

### Fitness Tips

## Aerobics limits risk for cardiovascular disease

Throughout April we are going to be focusing on safety guidelines for women who exercise. These guidelines will focus on three components of an exercise program — aerobic exercise, strengthening exercises and stretching exercises. The guidelines are primarily designed to meet the needs of an average woman and, therefore, may not be appropriate to every female depending on her overall health and level of skill.

This week's article is on aerobic exercise. This type of exercise has a beneficial effect on risk factors for cardiovascular disease. It also increases a person's ability to run or exercise for long periods of time and provides a reserve of energy for emergencies.

Aerobic exercise is any peripheral activity that forces the body to increase its oxygen use on a minute-by-minute basis for a sustained period of 12 to 15 minutes or more. Aerobic fitness can be maintained by participating in aerobic activity for 15-60 minutes three to five days a week at your target heart rate, which is 60-75 percent of your maximum heart rate. Your maximum heart rate is the

fastest your heart can beat. A quick way to determine your maximum heart rate is to subtract your age from 220. Then take 60 and 75 percent of that to determine your target heart rate. When beginning an exercise program, your heart rate should stay within the target numbers, but as you progress you can exercise up to 90 percent of your maximum rate — if you wish. The level of intensity, frequency and duration of exercise will depend on your goals and conditioning.

The most popular forms of aerobic exercise are walking, swimming, bicycling, running/jogging and aerobic dance.

**Walking:** Most healthy women can walk for long periods of time without becoming fatigued. Because of this, most healthy women won't improve their aerobic fitness by walking on level ground at a comfortable pace. To obtain aerobic fitness it is important to increase your speed, walk up and down hills or walk while carrying a weight. This is an inexpensive form of exercise and only requires comfortable clothing and a suitable pair of shoes. It can be readily integrated into daily schedules and provides an opportunity for socialization. Mechanical stresses on the body are

also minimal so injuries are uncommon.

**Swimming:** This utilizes both the upper and lower body. It is an excellent form of aerobic exercise and can also increase strength in some muscle groups. Because the body is supported by the water, injuries are relatively uncommon. Swimming, however, does require accessibility to a pool and knowing how to swim.

**Bicycling:** Bicycling can be an aerobic activity if the cyclist maintains an adequate pace for a sufficient period of time. Biking primarily uses the muscles of the lower body. It also enables you to enjoy a social interaction and provides a change in scenery to prevent monotony.

**Running/Jogging:** Continuous use of the large muscles in the legs makes running/jogging an excellent aerobic activity. It also provides you with the ability to individualize your pace and, therefore, is suitable for a wide range of fitness levels. It is convenient, inexpensive and also provides opportunities for social interaction. It can, however, be stressful to some of the body's joints.

**Aerobic Dance:** Consistent movement of both arms and legs provides a workout that can reach extremely high intensity levels. This form of

aerobic activity is especially popular among women. Popular music enhances group dynamics and masks the discomfort of strenuous training. It's typically done inside in a well-controlled environment. In general, there are no mandatory certified procedures for instructors, so it is a good idea to check into your instructor's background before you begin a program.

These are just a few examples of aerobic activity. The most important thing is to find one or a combination that you enjoy and will persist with to maintain your aerobic fitness. Next week we'll discuss some of the injuries specific to aerobic exercise and guidelines for an aerobic program.
