## Older landfill to get new leak safeguard

Tests have concluded that the Arbor Hills Landfill is the main source of contaminated soil in the area, leading to a plan to try controlling the problem with a new underground wall.

Contaminated soil discovered around the landfill on Napier Road between Five and Six Mile has been an issue for several years.

Although the contamination is not considered dangerous, the situation resulted in consent judgments among Northville Township, the state Department of Natural Resources

and Browning-Ferris Industries (BFI), which owns the landfill and an old cow pasture across Napier where contamination was found.

As part of the judgments, BFI must conduct regular tests of soil and groundwater under the supervision of the DNR. Early tests in 1984 and 1986 did not determine the main

cause of contamination, but narrowed the possibilities to brine, cattle feeding and the landfill.

"Recent information, however, from the pump test reflects that the landfill is the primary source of contamination," DNR Environmental Engineer Synthia Noble said recently.

"Although contamination of the ground water has occurred, there is no health threat because the water is moving up gradient and does not involve primary drinking water," Noble said. Federal standards for primary drinking water may only be enforced in Michigan for public water supplies.

The issue returned to focus in an informational meeting conducted at the Salem Township Hall Aug. 31. DNR staff members, a BFI representative and approximately 50 citizens came to the meeting.

A project BFI began in 1986 to

## Student numbers increase

Northville is a growing community and the most recent evidence of this growth is the sudden upswing in enrollment in the Northville schools.

Northville has seen the addition of 199 new children to the school system from one year ago, according to figures released to the Northville Board of Education last Monday.

The majority of the increase can be seen at the elementary school level, with 158 new students entering. There were an additional 28 students enrolled in the middle school with 13 new students added to the high school. These are students not accounted for by the district last year.

In September of 1987 a total of 3,439 students were enrolled in the Northville schools. These figures do not include special education students. As of Sept. 9, 1988, there were 3,638 students enrolled in all grades of the school system. The district had projected a Sept. 1988 total enrollment of 3,548 and was off by 90 students.

In anticipation of the additional students, particularly on the elementary level, additional staffing was added this year. Last June the board authorized the addition of a kindergarten teacher and a first grade teacher for Ahlman. A third grade teacher and a gifted teacher was added at Silver Springs for the fall. In August the district saw that additional staffing would be needed and added two more teachers to the Ahlman roster.

The district now has five additional elementary teachers over last year to handle an additional 158 students. Two elementary physical education/health instructors were also added to the staff because of the changes being implemented to the elementary school day.

The board did not add teachers to the middle school or to the high school. According to Assistant Superintendent Burton Knighton, the high school was overstaffed slightly during the last school year and ac-

## Rules for upkeep progress

A proposed set of rules for property maintenance in the city went to the city attorney last week for review.

City Manager Steve Walters has drafted a proposed Property Maintenance Ordinance which would, if adopted, set up requirements for upkeep of structures and landscaping in the city. In a meeting Tuesday, Sept. 6, council members agreed to send the proposal to the attorney for review, but raised some questions about how specific the ordinance ought to be.

Much of the ordinance is based on the principle of maintaining in a "workmanlike manner." The draft would define this as "construction, maintenance and repair with a reasonable degree of skill and knowledge; i.e., the manner which a reasonably prudent person would expect or require from a person who was hired to perform such services."

The draft contains a clause which states the enforcement officer would interpret the ordinance "reasonably" so that minor varia-

tions not endangering health or safety and not materially affecting appearance would not be ordinance violations.

Walters and members of the City Council talked a little about how specific such an ordinance should be in making definite requirements and restrictions. Walters said that in many communities with property maintenance ordinances, the rules seemed tailored to specifically prohibit whatever items had been a problem in that community. If an ordinance tried to compile a list of all cases, it would be almost impossible, Walters said.

The council also discussed the question of enforcing the ordinance. Specifically, the council members pondered if enforcement should only be pursued when there is a complaint — which might mean unequal treatment of similar cases — or if the city should aggressively pursue enforcement of all provisions, which might require more workers.

"I have a problem with over-

restricting some things," Mayor Pro Tem Carolann Ayers commented.

The council sent the ordinance on for the attorney's review, agreeing to hold off discussing specific provisions until the next meeting, scheduled for 8 p.m. Monday, Sept. 19.

Some of the specific restrictions in the latest draft include:

- Grass would not be allowed to grow higher than four inches.

- Furniture, toys and recreation equipment would not be allowed to be placed in the front yard when not in use.

- Firewood stacks would only be allowed in rear yards and raised at least 12 inches above the ground.

- Dog pens and runs would not be allowed in front yards, have to be at least 10 feet from neighboring properties or have an obscuring fence, and have to be odor free.

- No structure could be painted with designs or patterns, except murals would be allowed in commercial areas if approved by the Planning Commission or Historic District Commission.

## Land trade OK'd

A land swap necessary to the latest Main Center development plan was informally approved by the Northville City Council last week.

The council agreed in principle to trade a 10 foot strip of land in the Cady Street right-of-way for a similar strip along Main Street from the Singh Development Company. Singh is behind the new plan to develop the block on the east side of Center from Main to Cady with a combination apartment / retail / restaurant building.

The latest Singh plan shows the building set back 10 feet from its allowed Main Street frontage, making room for a small plaza with a few trees. The city would own that strip, but Singh would develop the plaza.

In recommending the trade, City Manager Steve Walters told the council Tuesday, Sept. 6 that the move may require Cady Street to be moved a little bit south. City officials have discussed a possible shift of Cady in the past while talking over the future of the immediate area and its parking needs.

The council agreed to the trade in principle, leaving Walters to work out the legal details before formally approving the switch.

The week before, the city Planning Commission gave preliminary approval to the Singh plan with the building set back 10 feet. The proposal was scheduled for consideration of final approval at the Planning Commission meeting Tuesday.

## Postal hours change

Post Office spokesman Lee Ward said Saturday hours were put back in because the budget savings had been accomplished.

"Savings that were made in other areas of processing were sufficient to restore the Saturday service," Ward said.

## Higher speed likely for Eight Mile

Although officials on several levels are looking into traffic control measures for the area of Eight Mile Road near Center Street, the most likely action may be a higher speed limit.

Spurred by concerns of safety for school students near the corner, officials in the City of Northville, the Northville School District, Wayne County and the Michigan State Police are in various stages of looking at the situation. But some officials have said that suggested action — like a lower speed limit — would not really improve any problems.

A new sign on northbound Center mandating "Right turn must yield to pedestrians" went up last week after approval from the Northville City Council. That requirement is law on

any corner, but Police Chief Rod Cannon said the sign would emphasize the point.

Earlier this year, the School Board and City Council asked county officials to lower the speed on Eight Mile near Center from 40 miles per hour to 30. Irma Clark, an information services manager for Wayne County, said Tuesday that although no date has been set, a meeting is pending between Wayne County, Oakland County and the Michigan State Police on the request.

According to a memo from Cannon to the City Council, a Wayne County Road Commission official inspected the area recently and concluded that a higher — not lower — speed limit might be in order.

That conclusion comes from a state standard that a reasonable speed limit is one with which 85 percent of the drivers comply, which may not be the case on that stretch of Eight Mile. Cannon said the police regularly see speeds in the 70s at the western city limit.

Clark noted that the speed limit

west of Taft is 45 and is 55 west of that.

"To go from one speed limit to another is very difficult," she said. "People are travelling at that set speed ... It's unrealistic to believe that lowering the speed limit to 30 will have any impact. However, I'm not going to say this won't happen."

The latest requests for action have come from Judith McIntyre, who lives on the corner. She has written the School Board and City Council with several suggestions for action at the corner, and the council last week referred her letter to City Manager Steve Walters for a response.

McIntyre's suggestions include putting flashers on the school warning signs, making certain two crossing guards are there, building a second pedestrian bridge at the corner for Amerman students, installing an overhead school warning sign, increasing police patrols, and restoring "no right turn on red."

According to Cannon's memo, the Wayne County inspection rejected the idea of restoring a "no right turn

on red" from Center to Eight Mile because it would add to traffic congestion.

However, on Cannon's recommendation, the City Council Tuesday, Sept. 6 did vote to designate the corner as "right turn must yield to pedestrians."

Clark said any work which would extend into the road right-of-way — such as a new bridge or overhead sign — would require county approval.

She also said road officials "really don't feel putting some flashers around that particular sign would be of any benefit at all." However, the schools or city could submit such a request for consideration, she said.

McIntyre commented, "I remember many, many near misses. It seems to me it ought to be a preventive measure rather than a reactive measure after the fact."

At last week's council meeting, Council Member John Buckland said he has probably heard more residents concerned about speeds on Eight Mile than on any other issue.

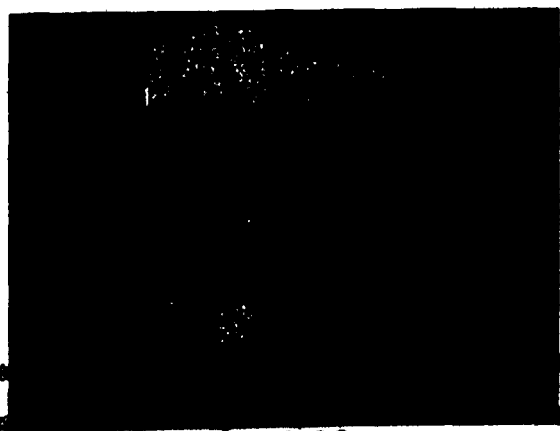

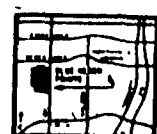

## Driver escapes injury in accident at Eight Mile Road

An accident in which a car hit an electrical wire and left the ground at Randolph and Eight Mile did not result in any injuries for the driver, a city police report said.

A driver going south on Taft Road was trying to cross Eight Mile onto Randolph Street at 9:10 p.m. Friday when she swerved to avoid a car on Eight Mile and lost control of her car, the report said.

The car hit a curb and crossed 40 feet of grass before catching on a Detroit Edison wire and going airborne. The car hit a fence around a dumpster at the Northville Green apartments and landed on its side, the report said.

The driver was not injured. A police officer and another driver witnessed the accident, and the driver was estimated to be going about 30 or 35 miles per hour at the time. No tickets were issued.

## Township officials answer questions about police millage hike

Henningsen said economics has had a lot to do with the board's decision to hold a millage increase question in 1988 rather than in 1983, when the police department began running at a deficit.

"We feel we can sell a project better now, than in 1981, because of the economic situation. Things were very tough in 1981," he added.

According to the 1988 Northville Township State Equalized Valuation (SEV), Graham said the police department will receive \$563,000 for 1988 and would get an additional \$557,000 with a two-mill increase.

Henningsen said since he became

treasurer in 1978, he has tried to run the township like a business, "because this is a business."

"We need to get the police millage in line with their operating costs, which would allow the police department to go on and be a good operation for the next decade," he added.

Graham noted the last police millage, which was passed in 1981, was renewed in 1986 for the identical 2.2 mills. One mill is equal to one dollar of tax per \$1,000 of assessed value. For a resident whose housing assessment is \$50,000 a two-mill increase would translate into a \$100 tax hike.

Trustee Richard Allen said some thought went into raising the millage

rate in 1986, but he added the board is resigned to maintaining the lowest tax rate as long as possible.

"We don't want to ask Northville residents for more money until we're really desperate," he added.

Allen said the police deficit has simply grown too much for the fund balance to cover it. He noted the board may not be able to vote a police deficit next year.

In addition, Allen said the board prefers to place a millage question on a general election ballot, rather than holding a special election. He said the township would have to pay for a special election, while it can place a millage question on a general election ballot without cost to the

township.

"We try and shy away from special elections because they are costly," Allen said.

Township Police Chief Ken Hardesty said he thinks the police department would have to make cuts in the near future, if a proposal of some sort is not passed.

"We need the millage increase because the population is not big enough to support the police department (at the current millage rate), and we cannot continue drawing

from the general fund," Hardesty added.

In a report to the board on the police millage, Graham indicated "a

partial assumption in the scenario is that the police budget increases must be limited to 10 percent per year, 1990-92."

Hardesty said if township voters were to approve a millage increase, he would run the department on the allocated money within the 10 percent increase guidelines.

In addition to the police millage, the Northville Recreation Department will have a .9-mill question on November ballot. Township officials said in order to pass the police millage, they will have to go out and

make an attempt to sell it and sell it well.

"This is critical and I think we'll

have to spend the bucks necessary to get the message out," Henningsen said. "I think people look for good police and fire protection and I hope these are two services they will support."

Henningsen said non-township funds would be used to campaign for the millage. He added the fundraising group will probably be known as the Citizens Committee in Support of the Police Millage.

"Police and fire protection are the number one and two things that people want in this community," Henningsen said. "We need to explain and address the needs of the police department to sustain current operations," Henningsen added.

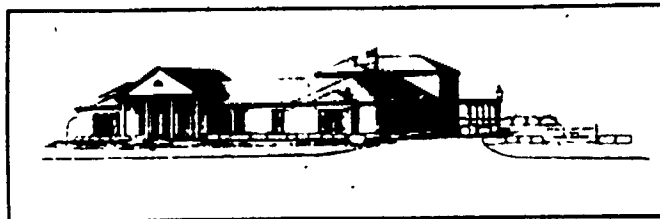

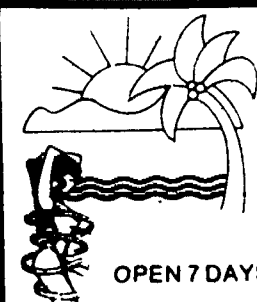

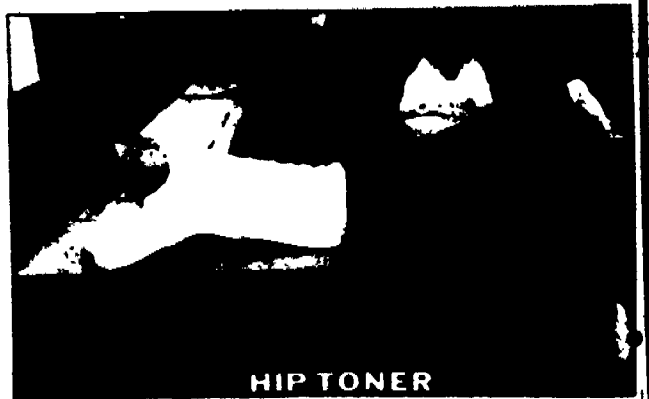

# School board eyes residents' input

The Northville Board of Education is going to be asking for input from the residents of the township and city in the near future. Board members voted unanimously on three goals for the 1988-89 school year, one of which is the development of a strategic planning process which will make heavy use of citizen committees and citizen input.

At the Sept. 12 board meeting, board members agreed on the following three goals:

• **EFFECTIVE USE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES** — the purpose of this goal is to take steps to alleviate the overcrowding that has occurred this year, particularly at Amerman Elementary School. Enrollment increases have seen a jump in elementary age children in the district, and the board voted to decide on a solution to help the crowded condition of schools by Jan. 1989, with implementation of the solution by Sept. 1989. Public hearings will be held on any board suggestions prior to any action.

• **IMPROVE FUND BALANCE** — Accounting practices call for a fund balance of five-10 percent. The Northville school district budget currently has a fund balance of a fraction of one percent. This goal would be to create a fund balance of one percent by June 1989 and building to a minimum balance of five percent by June of 1992. School Superintendent George Bell told the board that this was a realistic target for the district.

• **INITIATE STRATEGIC PLAN-**

**NING PROCESS** — During the fall of this year the board will embark on a formal process of strategic planning for the future. This will be done in much the same way that a five year plan was produced in 1982 which included such major changes as renovation of the high school and changing to a middle school system.

The process will involve the appointment of a facilitator who will be trained to lead brainstorming sessions between board members, citizens and staff members. From the sessions a mission statement will be drafted that will concisely indicate the beliefs and objectives of the school district.

Bell said that the objective of this sort of public brainstorming is to determine what the strengths and weaknesses of the district are, while formulating objectives and a plan of action.

"This is a chance to have the community involved in the district again," Bell said. "We are going to want a maximum of citizen input. We need a focal point for the future... the opportunity for citizens to be a part of it is the key."

Parameters and priorities will be set up following this work and a long range strategic plan will then be developed, Bell said.

Bell said that the process will not be finished within the current school year, but plans call for the appointment of a facilitator this fall, with training of that appointment to follow.

The goals were passed by the board unanimously.

# Protective wall coming to landfill

remove the leachate — liquid which in this case has percolated through the refuse — proved to be inadequate in confining the contaminants.

BFI now plans to install a wall made of slurry — a cement-like mixture — to confine the contamination. The slurry wall is a solution, but "it's a compromise system which is not as good built after the fact as before," BFI District Manager Dan Nelson said.

To install the wall, a trench is dug into which topsoils, clay and slurry are added. The slurry prevents the leachate from caving in. The trench is then back-filled with a mixture of soils, clays, sands and bentonite to create a wall impervious to moisture. When installed, the width of the slurry wall will be three feet, the length 4,800 feet and the depth a minimum of 15 feet to a maximum of 90 feet, Nelson said.

The slurry wall addresses the immediate problem and is expected to prevent further leakage. The con-

tamination — which moves east and directly impacts Northville Township — continues in a southeast direction. Contamination already detected should dissipate through natural occurrences, DNR geologist Barbara Velort said.

BFI and DNR officials are confident the slurry wall will resolve the problem. Citizens at the meeting raised concerns about future contamination resulting from refuse that is allowed in the landfill.

Noble said the landfill is a Type II landfill, which allows BFI to accept general refuse, commercial and industrial refuse, construction demolition, ash or incineration of sludge and residential refuse.

Karl Geirman, spokesperson for the group Citizens for S.A.L.E.M. (Salem Area Local Environmental Management), expressed great concern about sludge. Other citizens in attendance expressed agreement.

Noble said that unless a prior agreement existed forbidding the dumping of sludge at the landfill, no legal action could be taken to bar

BFI's acceptance of sludge.

Nelson reassured citizens that BFI plans to continue observing its employees for exposure to contaminants and that the monitoring wells are active.

The contaminants found on the Napier Road pasture were varied. Aquifer tests performed on the groundwater at the pasture site found elevated levels of inorganic compounds of cadmium, conducti-

ty and chloride. The tests also detected organic compounds of bromoform; methylene chloride; toluene; one, one-dichloroethylene; t-one, two-dichloroethylene; and ethyl benzene. Specific problems have included:

• The highest levels of contaminants monitored at a well on the pasture site revealed inorganic compounds of cadmium, a metal, at 140 micrograms per liter.

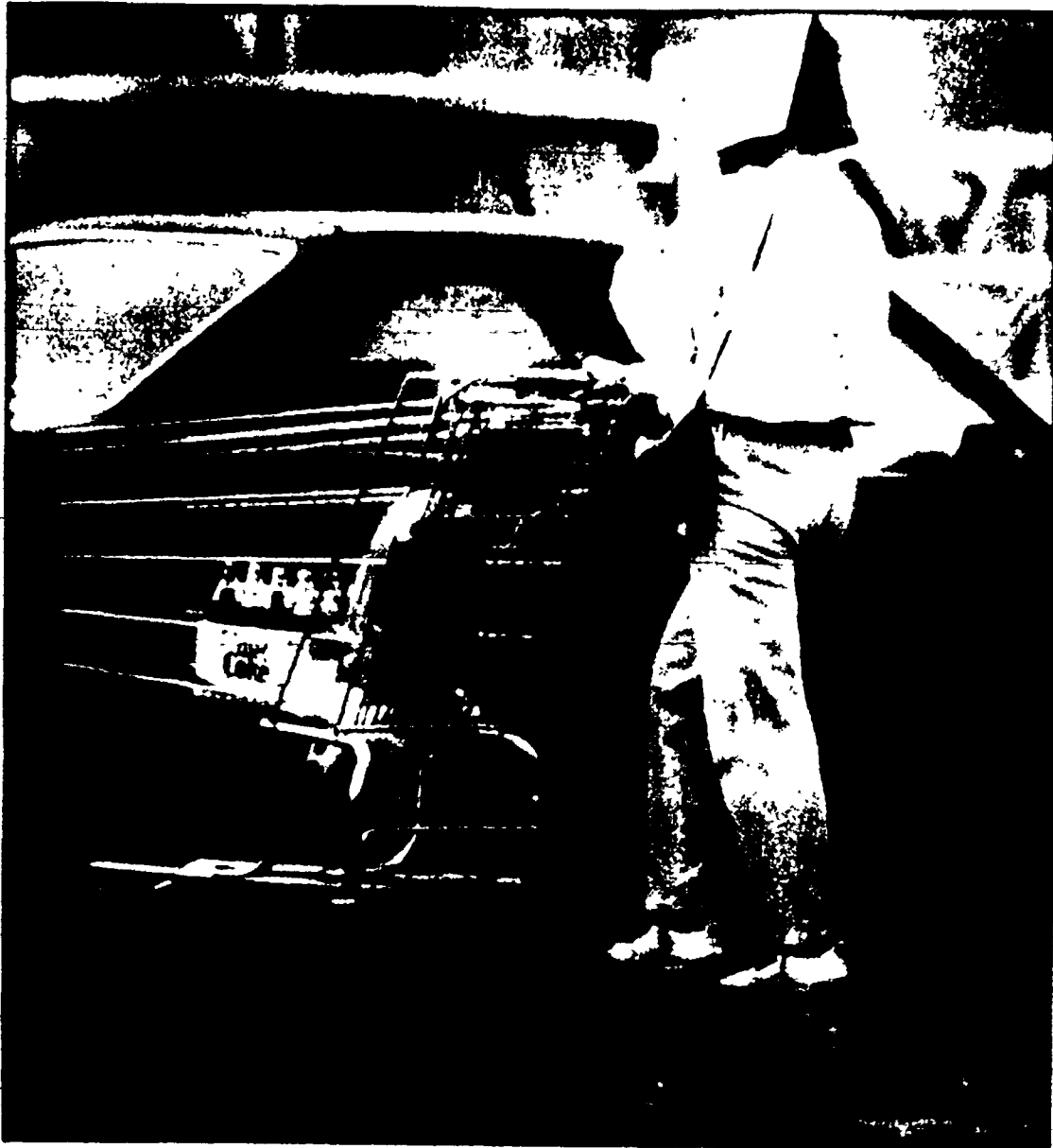

## Lawsuit against store settled

A lawsuit against a local party store stemming from a 1985 auto accident has been resolved, according to court records and the plaintiff's attorney.

A lawsuit filed by former Northville resident Thomas Gribbell against the Liquor Shoppe Inc. on Main Street is now listed as "Status Final" in Wayne County Circuit Court.

The suit — asking \$3 million in damages — had alleged that the store sold liquor to a minor, who then allegedly gave some alcohol to Gribbell. That caused Gribbell to run his car head-on into another vehicle, causing him "severe and permanent head and brain injuries," the suit charged. The Liquor Shoppe denied the charges against it.

The last action shown on the circuit

court docket is a motion for summary disposition filed and then later dismissed by Mary Ellen Darin, listed in court records as the Liquor Shoppe's attorney. That dismissal is dated July 29.

"It's been resolved," Richard Burlingame, Gribbell's attorney, said by phone Tuesday. "That's all I'm at liberty to say."

Darin could not be reached for comment, and the Liquor Shoppe declined to comment.

Wayne County Circuit Court Judge John Murphy, the latest judge assigned to the case, never heard any motions on it, a clerk in his office said. A mediation hearing had been scheduled for Jan. 3, 1989.

The suit was filed Dec. 30, 1986, in Oakland County Circuit Court. It was later moved to Wayne County.

In documents filed with the court,

Gribbell claimed the Liquor Shoppe sold two cases of beer and a fifth of whiskey to a 17-year-old Northville girl, who bought the alcohol with some of Gribbell's money. According to the suit, Gribbell, who was 18 at the time, got drunk on the alcohol and crossed the center line at Oakley Park and Benstein roads in Commerce Township, hitting another vehicle. The documents also say Gribbell is permanently injured as a result of the crash, lessening his earning capacity and possibly shortening his life expectancy.

Documents filed for the Liquor Shoppe denied the charges. Their documents said in part that even following Gribbell's argument, he contributed to his own intoxication by using his money for the alcohol, thereby precluding any right to action.

## Owner of Player's Choice loses appeal of ordinance

Following the advice of Township Police Chief Ken Hardesty, the Northville Township board denied a request by a local resident to have restrictions on his business lifted.

Tony Haddad, manager of Player's Choice One Family Fun Center on Seven Mile Road, said the provisions of Township Ordinance No. 75 have had a large negative impact on his business. The board voted unanimously at last week's meeting not to amend the ordinance for Haddad.

"This is an economic matter and they're (the township board) hurting me," Haddad said. "I run a clean game room and they're not giving me the time of day."

"I live in Northville and work in the community and I am being restrained, and I don't think that it's fair," he added.

Player's Choice is a combination arcade/pizza restaurant. Among the provisions of Ordinance 75 is the stipulation that if a business has one or more video games it cannot open before noon, must close at midnight and cannot hire anyone under 18 years of age.

The board postponed action on the issue at its Aug. 12 meeting to give trustees more time to consider the issue. Before tabling the matter, Trustee Richard Allen said he did not see a problem allowing Player's Choice to open at 11 a.m. or to hire anyone under 18.

After denying Haddad's request,

township officials said there was room for negotiation on the issue, but added they were annoyed with the conduct of Haddad and his attorney Stephen Taylor.

"Mr. Haddad's integrity wasn't as clean and outstanding as it first appeared," Allen said. "We're not in the business of writing ordinances for a single business. We're not here to please Mr. Haddad, but for the benefit of the township."

Prior to voting on Haddad's request, Hardesty recommended that the board deny the ordinance change.

"There have been problems at Mr. Haddad's establishment in the past and there will be more in the future (if the ordinance request is approved)," Hardesty said.

"I see no reason for kids to be out playing in the arcade after these hours (of Ordinance 75)," he added. "I encourage him (Haddad) to be a successful businessman in the community, within the limitations which are good for the community and their youth."

Hardesty said even though it is not Haddad's fault, youthful loitering both in and out of Player's Choice continues to be a problem. He also said Haddad has had a problem adhering to certain provisions of Ordinance 75, including registering his video games.

"I'm not restricting his business," Hardesty said. "I am defending the good order of the community and keeping the peace at night. I don't think people want carousing in the Highland Lakes Mall after mid-

night."

Trustee Donald Williams said he can compromise on the hours of the food area of Player's Choice, but "on the arcade I'm restricted as to what the ordinance states."

Ordinance 75 was written and adopted in 1981. Township Treasurer Richard Henningsen said he wrote the ordinance and added he thinks it still applies today.

"This ordinance may not cover Haddad's establishment (pizza restaurant/arcade) but we don't want to change our laws to fit his business," Henningsen said. "Furthermore, the board decided to follow the recommendation of the police chief and I feel that Mr. Haddad did not demonstrate the hardship was sufficient enough to amend the ordinance."

Haddad has said he plans to take the matter to court. "I don't see why I can't open or close any time I want to," he said. "I don't want to antagonize the board, but I feel they're taking away my potential earnings."

Township Attorney Ernest Emsad said in most court cases the percentage of revenue from the pizza restaurant and the arcade will be looked at in determining how the ordinance impacts the business.

Haddad refused to state the percentage of business done by the food and gaming portions of his establishment.

Haddad's lawyer, Stephen Taylor was unavailable for comment. Haddad said he would not comment further on the matter.

## Northville school enrollment rises

tually has been reduced by 1.2 staff positions for the 1988-89 year.

The board also received a report showing the class sizes for each grade level at each school. The fifth grades at each elementary school seem to be the hardest hit by the increases in enrollment. Bell told the board that the district aims for a 28:1 student/teacher ratio in classes, but has had to exceed that slightly in some cases.

A fifth grade class at Silver Springs has 35 students in it. To compensate for the addition, Bell said two aides have been hired to give teachers

more 1:1 time with the students. He noted that the district feels that it is much more important to keep smaller class sizes in the early elementary grades and slightly higher sizes in the upper elementary grades.

Using state guidelines which count every support person in the schools, Bell said the Northville classes have an overall ratio of 18:1. But using the Northville criteria, which Bell said counts only classroom teachers — no support staff, the overall ratio in the district is 22:1.

Amerman is feeling the pinch of the additional students the most, board members were told. Although Amerman is the largest school in

terms of total number of children attending, it has the smallest class size ratio, according to Bell.

A parent attending the board meeting commented on the cramped conditions of the special education class at Amerman. Linda Clark said she was concerned that with up to five children attending half day sessions in a small classroom at Amerman, the children were not being allowed enough space in which to be active.

Bell explained that due to the sudden rise in the Amerman enrollment the classroom had to be used, but that the possibility of some spillover of the class into the library for time during the day was being looked into.

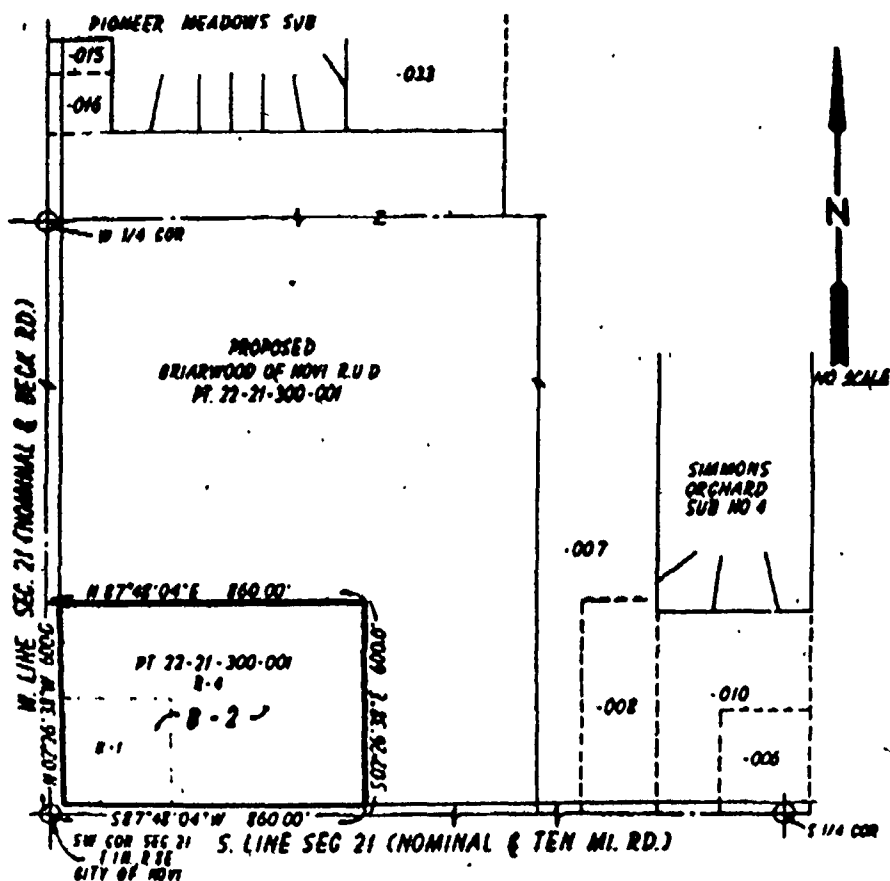

## Township fire department expands

It was a big week for the Northville Township Fire Department. You could tell by the big grin on Chief Robert Toms face as he proudly showed off the two new pumper trucks outside of the Township hall.

But there was more news. Toms will be joined by another full-time firefighter in October, when the Assistant Fire Chief Rick Rosselle comes on board. This is the first time the Northville Township fire department has had more than one full-time person on its personnel rolls. Rosselle is ranked currently as assistant chief in the department, but has been working as a paid-on-call volunteer.

The two new pumper trucks pulled into the township last week and will be put to good use, Toms said. The township paid \$178,000 for the two, a savings of \$45,000 because they were not custom-cab trucks such as many fire departments use, Toms said.

The pumps did come with many features that Toms said he is confident will make Northville a better fire fighting squad. In particular, the two trucks are outfitted with deck guns, swivelling "guns" that can project up to 1,000 gallons of water at a

fire almost immediately after the truck pulls up. These guns can also be detached from the trucks themselves and used as portable units, allowing fire fighting troops to be freed up — allowing a curtain of water to be sprayed preventing fire from spreading, or allowing firefighters to stay clear of toxic chemicals while still applying water on the area.

The pumper trucks themselves came equipped with automatic transmission, air brakes, turbo-charged engines, and all the necessary equipment, Toms said.

The trucks were ordered over a year ago, and the department has been anxiously awaiting their arrival, the chief said. Toms said the fire department now has six pumps, two for each fire station, but that the real reason for ordering the two trucks was the age of the pumps in service in the township.

"We spent a lot of money on maintenance on the other rigs," Toms said referring to three pumps dating back to 1968, 1969, and 1970. "You begin to worry when they get to that age," Toms said, noting that they are fine for backup purposes but newer trucks were needed for the frontline firefighting

duties.

The new trucks are equipped with color-coded mechanisms which will aid in speed and cut down on mistakes with firefighters, he noted. The pumps can be spraying water on a fire within 60 seconds after coming to a stop, Toms said.

Rosselle, the newest full-time addition to the department has been with the Township squad for 11 years, Toms said. "He graduated from high school and within a month he was working on the department," Toms said he is extremely happy that Rosselle has been hired as second in command of the township department. Rosselle will take over the \$27,000/year position the beginning of October.

Toms said he specifically asked the Township Board to put into the current budget money to hire an assistant chief, citing the increased building and fire activity in the township. "In my first year here, in 1977, there were 35 fires. In the last two months we've had 90 runs — really in the last 10 weeks," Toms said.

"We've grown, with all the stuff they're building, we really have 27 firemen protecting 16,000 people, 4-5,000 dwellings, plus all the site plan

reviews, building inspections and paperwork. I just need help," he said.

Rosselle's primary duties will be as a fire inspector, a growing area of need for the township as buildings and site plans continue to come in. In addition Rosselle will fight fires, fill in for the chief during sickness leaves and vacation days, (something Rosselle has been doing already, Toms said) making out fire reports,

## Drill end asked

Responding to concerns by a group of residents about oil drilling in the community, the Northville Township Board unanimously passed a resolution asking for a moratorium on oil drilling in residential areas, last Thursday.

Township Supervisor Georgina Goss said the moratorium resolution was sent to the Michigan Township Association (MTA), State Senator Robert Geake (R-Northville), and State Representative Gerald Law (R-Plymouth).

"The optimal effect of the resolution would be for a moratorium to be placed on residential oil well drilling until new legislation can be looked at which would give local governments and officials more control over oil drilling," Goss said.

In addition to the moratorium, the board also approved of sending a strong letter to the supervisor of wells in the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR), expressing their disapproval of oil well drilling in residential areas.

"I am adamantly against oil well drilling because I don't believe there should be oil wells in residential areas," Goss said. "I feel oil wells pose a threat to the health and safety of residents and it may have a bearing on home valuations, but I'm not sure about that, although I have seen studies which suggest it."

Goss added that the resolutions are just a statement of what the township board would like to see with respect to oil drilling in residential areas. She said the resolutions will be sent to other township governments asking for their support. The Northville Preservation Association (NPA), which is made up of residents from the Grandview Acres and Meadowbrook subdivisions, spoke to the board about the information they have accumulated on oil and gas drilling.

Members of the NPA have been approached by Elenco Land Services Inc., to sell the mineral rights to their land. Pangborn Exploration Com-

pany-hired Elenco to seek oil leases from 106 property owners on 120 acres in the two Northville Township subdivisions.

The company was seeking the rights to explore for oil or natural gas on the property. The subdivisions are located on the north side of Seven Mile Road, directly across from Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital. Pangborn has stopped seeking leases for the time being.

"The township board invited us to appear because we have talked to them previously about oil and gas drilling," said NPA member Zo Chisnell.

"We've been collecting information on the problem inherent in our neighborhood and they were (the board) interested in hearing it," Chisnell added.

"We are very concerned there is no local control of oil drilling and what control there is, is being challenged in the courts," she said.

Chisnell said the NPA is an umbrella for the non-profit group formed for the purposes of circulating petitions and fundraising.

Township Deputy Clerk Eunice Switzler said Chisnell wanted to come before the board and inquire if there was any support for her group.

In a letter to all township board members, Township Attorney Ernest Essad said the Township Zoning Act, MCLA 125.271 provides that "a township board shall not regulate or control the drilling, completion or operation of oil or gas wells.... This jurisdiction relative to wells shall be vested exclusively in the supervisor of wells of this state."

Essad added that because the township may not regulate oil and gas leases, "we provided and you adopted Ordinance 89, the Oil and Gas Operations Ordinance which required all buildings and structures with exception to the oil well heads to obtain a building permit."

Chisnell said she was aware of the township board's limitations, but the NPA "wanted to summarize what has been found about oil drilling and tell the board about what we'd like to see happen."

## Board enacts rules

For the first time since its adoption in 1986, the Northville Township Board recently passed a resolution enforcing its property maintenance ordinance against four local residents.

The board passed resolutions against John Wheeler, Tony Baus, Leon Bonner, and Don Bisdorf, giving them each 30 days to attend to their various violations.

Township Planning Director Carol Henry said the violations were issued because of a big concern for public safety, with respect to crime and unsafe physical building characteristics.

"The ordinance is designed to address major structural problems rather than minor building problems," she added.

None of the residents found in violation of the property maintenance ordinance were available for comment. Henry said only Bisdorf has begun to comply with the ordinance.

Township Attorney Ernest Essad said violators of the ordinance who choose not to comply could be taken to either district or circuit court by the township.

Essad said an equitable action

would be pursued by taking the matter to circuit court, whereas a misdemeanor violation would be sought if the township took the case to district court.

He added that the township could also attempt a combination of circuit and district court proceedings. "Circuit courts have broader powers in interpretation of law, while district courts offer faster results."

Essad said until he meets with the individuals in violation of the ordinance or has given them an opportunity to discuss the matter "the township will not seek any court action."

Township Building Official Mick Kruszewski said he has dealt with a lot of court situations involving a property maintenance ordinance and added the ordinance has covered buildings which are not structurally sound.

Kruszewski said the ordinance is especially effective when there is a danger or threat from the property. He added if a structure is abandoned and unsafe, young children could get in and someone could get killed.

"This ordinance is designed to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public," Kruszewski said, adding from his experience, the property maintenance ordinance has held up in court.

## City looking for new road project

After learning that rebuilding the Eight Mile / Novi Road intersection would cost much more than first thought, Northville city officials are looking for a road improvement project to complete with \$11,985 in Oakland County money.

The city had applied to use Oakland County money to redesign and rebuild the Eight Mile / Novi Road intersection late last year. About \$25,000 was available through two different Oakland programs: the tri-party agreement, where the city,

county and county road commission pay equal shares for road projects; and a one-time refund of a surplus from the county's 1986 budget.

But the detailed planning showed that the project would cost more than \$200,000 — well over the amount of money immediately available. And the county is now asking the city to find another project on which to use its surplus money of almost \$12,000.

City Manager Steve Walters said last week that more detailed engineering of the idea showed more work was necessary than first hoped.

To really improve the intersection and get enough room around the curve above Eight Mile, the road would need to cut into the hill or the Ingersol Creek, Walters said.

The deadline to commit to a project is Dec. 11, according to a letter from the Oakland County Road Commission.

At the City Council meeting Tuesday, council members agreed to discuss the county money at their next meeting, when the city's traffic study is also scheduled for discussion. Earlier this year the city's con-

sultants completed a study including a set of recommended traffic improvements.

The next council meeting is scheduled for 8 p.m. Monday, Sept. 19.

Oakland County surplus money is part of a \$5 million allocation for road improvements. At the end of 1986 the county had a \$6.3 million budget surplus, and the county board of commissioners allocated the \$5 million as a road refund out of that surplus.

# Recreation budget eyed

The Northville Community Recreation Department has submitted a balanced budget of \$461,225 for consideration by township and city officials.

The budget is similar to the 1988 budget, although there are several increases — including general park development and salaries — proposed over this year's projected spending of \$423,438.

The Northville Community Recreation Department is a shared service of the township and city governments, similar to the Northville Public Library and the Senior Citizens Advisory Council. As such, both the Township Board and the City Council must approve the recreation budget, which has already been approved by the Recreation Commission.

The shared services budgets and the township's general fund budget run from Jan. 1 to Dec. 31, so the Township Board considers the recreation budget as part of its regular budget deliberations. The City Council only reviews it for any problems in the fall, and formally adopts the budget during its budget consideration in the spring.

The 1989 budget plans for revenues and expenditures of \$461,225 overall, but some elements are self-supporting within that total. The units of the recreation budget are administration, fields and parks, senior citizens activities, recreation programs and the community center.

A large chunk of the recreation department budget comes from contributions from the township and city general funds. The figure is determined by a formula based on total assessed value of land. Next year's township contribution is budgeted at \$100,225, and the city contribution is planned for \$63,275.

The administration section of the budget is planned to rise from \$127,200 this year to \$135,300 next year. This is due largely to an increase in full-time salaries from \$50,800 to \$55,800.

Under fields and parks, costs are planned to drop from \$44,875 to \$42,200. This is due to a one-time truck purchase this year, but that large drop in spending is offset by some rising costs and projected \$7,000 spending for general park development not in the budget this year.

A memo from Recreation Director John Anderson notes that this section of the budget will change if city and township voters approve a 9 mill request to develop the Northville Community Park site on Beck Road. The proposal is scheduled to be on the November election ballot.

The senior citizens activity budget is adopted separately, and is funded with grants. This section is planned for \$61,025 in 1989. The projected 1988 totals for senior citizens are \$68,017 in revenues and \$57,290 in expenditures. The difference in expected costs is due to increases of a few hundred dollars in several line items.

The recreation program and community center sections in the recreation budget are self-supporting. The recreation program budget is planned for \$148,700 in 1989, up from \$121,173 in estimated total expenditures this year. Somewhat higher costs are planned for all the sports within the recreation programs section. Each activity is planned to be self-supporting through fees.

The community center section of the budget is also self-supporting.

## Dial-A-Ride OK'd

Northville Township seniors will be able to continue receiving door-to-door transportation within a six-community area, following township board approval of the Dial-A-Ride program last Thursday.

Township Manager Steve Brock said the Dial-A-Ride Program is run in lieu of connector bus service that would be provided through the Southeast Michigan Transit Authority (SEMTA).

Brock said Northville Township is allocated transit credits from SEMTA, which in dollar terms works out to \$9,704.

With this money, Northville Township has entered into the Dial-A-Ride Program, which also includes Northville City, Farmington, Farmington Hills, Plymouth, and Livonia. Senior Center Coordinator Carl Peters said beginning Nov. 1 the senior transit program will expand to include more cab transport companies.

At present, the Dial-A-Ride Program contracts with only Northwest Cab Co. Starting Nov. 1, seniors will be able to use Northwest Transport, ABC Cab, and Star Cab in Plymouth. "If seniors don't like the service they're getting this will allow them to try another cab service," Peters said. "There were problems when service was limited to one company because people could not change. By opening the market, we're hoping the competition will result in better service."

Peters said the method of using the

Dial-A-Ride Program will remain the same. Seniors wanting to use the program first must call one of the three eligible cab companies. Then they can ride to any one of the six participating communities.

After reaching their destination, each senior is entitled to receive a credit of \$3.10 per ride. Anything over \$3.10 would be paid by the rider. If the amount is below \$3.10, the rider pays \$90.

Peters said between April 1 and Aug. 31, 198 riders from Northville Township took part in the program.

"The Dial-A-Ride Program is important because SEMTA does not provide us (Northville Township) with connector buses and the recreation department has a bus for seniors that does not run a taxi service," he said.

Peters noted the riding program gives seniors the independence to get around for shopping, going to the doctor and so forth. "Even if only one person uses the service per year it is beneficial."

Brock said the program "provides a perhaps otherwise unavailable means of transportation for these individuals and at an affordable cost."

Township Supervisor Georgina Goss agreed with Brock, and said she believes seniors in Northville Township and throughout the six community region all benefit from the program.

Peters said any money left over from the Dial-A-Ride Program will be shared with other communities which may not have enough funds to support their portion of the program.

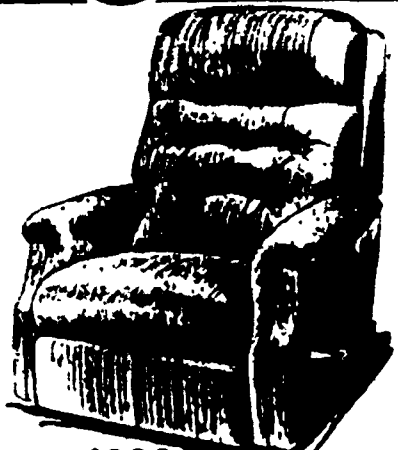

# Novi wants study of Eight Mile

NOVI — The City of Novi will attempt to initiate a new study of Eight Mile Road, in an effort to determine current problems and get a clue as to what might be done to keep it fixed in the future.

Novi Community Development Director James Wahl said the city plans to approach Northville Township and Northville City of Officials, as well as the Oakland County

and Wayne County road commissions "within the next week or two."

Novi also hopes to involve elected state officials.

The decision to study the road comes on the heels of a new Oakland County Road Commission priority listing which basically eliminated the road from consideration. Novi had earmarked potential funds from the \$25 vehicle registration fee question

for Eight Mile Road improvements.

Oakland County voters will decide that question Nov. 8. Funds from the vehicle registration fee basically go back into the local municipalities.

A recent road commission memo re-programmed most of the funds and eliminated Eight Mile from consideration. Cities are able to choose most of the priority items, unless the

road commission recommends a different alternative.

Wahl said the study will take a look at conditions of Eight Mile Road, and improvement possibilities. It is also expected to study what impact new or planned development might have on the roadway.

It is also expected to study traffic incidents on the strip, Wahl said.

We obtain our LEIN service through CLEMIS and it is unknown at this point how the new user fee will impact on us.

Mayor Johnson instructed Chief Cannon to continue voicing our displeasure of the LEIN charge and ban with CLEMIS and other communities to oppose the fee. He asked the City Manager to send a letter to the Governor with a copy to CLEMIS.

Chief Cannon stated that the City has not had a problem over the years with uncovered trucks or spilling of loads. Their major concern is loose gravel. He has discussed this with the City Attorney and it is his recommendation that the State law be enforced under our local ordinance Section 8-123, making it a misdemeanor for violating the State law.

Mayor Johnson agreed with the City Attorney's recommendation that any violations be handled through the City Ordinance Section 8-123.

The regular meeting of the Northville City Council was called to order in the Council Room by Mayor Johnson at 8:00 p.m.

### 1. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

#### 2. ROLL CALL:

Present: Ayers, Buckland, Folino, Johnson, Mittman. Absent: None. Also Present: Burns, Hopp, Walters, Warner and Bob Needham.

### 3. APPROVAL OF COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES:

The minutes of the regular meeting of July 18, 1988, were approved as corrected.

### 4. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA & APPROVAL OF THE CONSENT AGENDA:

Moved, supported, carried, to adopt the agenda as amended and the Consent Agenda A, through F.

### 5. CITIZEN COMMENTS:

Larry Mink, Lexington Condos, noted the condition of Taft Road and asked for direction and for a contact at the County to request road repair. City Manager Walters stated that Taft is a City Major Street. It is part of the City Wide Repair Program and hopefully repair will be complete this season.

Mr. Mink asked how they will control traffic from cutting through the Condos, and also, noted a concern with the speed of the vehicles on Eight Mile Road west of Taft. Mayor Johnson stated that the City will step up police patrol in that area.

A concern was also voiced as to the condition of the Post Office, overgrown weeds, unpainted surfaces and general unkempt grounds. Mayor Johnson stated the City will look into the matter.

Fred Nickrand, 963 Whitegate, Abbey Knoll Association, Chairman of the Architectural Review Committee, stated that their subdivision has the following two areas of concern they wish to bring before Council:

1. Incomplete fencing surrounding a pool in the neighborhood which the City approved and allowed to be filled with water. He noted the pool is a safety hazard for small children. He asked why the City approved the filling of the pool.

2. City approval of a pool site that is not allowed by Abbey Knoll Association Bylaws. He noted that the homeowner had signed an agreement that allowed placement of the pool in an area permitted by the Association Bylaws, however, when the applicant applied with the City, he changed the location of the pool within Ordinance requirements, not within Bylaws, and was granted a permit to construct. Why did the City approve the permit?

Manager Walters stated that the City is not legally in the position to enforce bylaws. The City must approve a permit if the applicant meets the requirements of the State and local ordinance.

Mayor Johnson stated it would be the responsibility of the association to enforce the bylaws.

### 6. LEXINGTON CONDOMINIUM'S POND:

Mayor Johnson referred the Lexington Condominium's Pond study to the City Manager and asked him to prepare a detailed report for Council. He also asked that a copy of the report be forwarded to Mr. Hans.

### 6a. SIDEWALK REPLACEMENT:

Moved, supported, carried, to approve the contract for sidewalk repair recommendation as outlined by the City Manager's correspondence for the amount of \$2,000.00.

### 6b. NORTH LEXINGTON COMMUNITY CENTER:

Mayor Johnson stated that at this time Council will accept the recommendation of the City Manager and refer the item back to study with a detailed report to be returned to the Council.

He noted Director Anderson will be presenting the final details. In an upcoming Council meeting, he also noted that the deadline for placing the millage issue on the ballot is hearing and action will be needed by the first meeting in September.

### 9. ALLEN TERRACE: AGE LIMIT FOR OCCUPANCY:

Moved, supported, carried, to maintain the current minimum age limit of 62 years.

### 10. PLANNING COMMISSION: BED & BREAKFAST ORDINANCE:

Moved, supported, carried, to accept the recommendation of the Planning Commission and call a public hearing for Monday, August 15, 1988, at 8:00 p.m. in the Council Room of the Municipal Building to consider the amendment to Title 4, Chapter 12, "Zoning Ordinance" of the City Code by adding Section 18.17 of the Zoning Ordinance, Bed & Breakfast Accommodations and Section 22.2 Definitions - Subsection 11a. Bed and Breakfast Accommodations.

### 11. COUNCIL COMMENTS:

Mayor Protem Ayers noted that she feels that Agenda Item 5, Citizen's Comments should be limited. She noted the Agenda as it is currently prepared allows citizens who walk in and have lengthy discussion to take precedent over the citizens who have made an effort to contact the City and request to be placed on the agenda.

Mayor Johnson stated there should be a 5 minute time limit with discussions, discussions which require additional time should be placed on the agenda.

Councilman Mittman suggested that agenda items 4 and 5 be switched to allow for the placement of citizen's comments as agenda items.

Councilman Buckland noted that he is concerned with the speed of the traffic on west Eight Mile Road. Manager Walters stated he will notify the Police Department to increase their patrol of that area.

Councilman Buckland also voiced a concern with uncovered trucks traveling through the City and asked if the Council should consider an amendment to the ordinances to cover them. Manager Walters stated that it might be wise to adopt an ordinance as a local ordinance generates funds for the municipality.

Councilman Folino questioned the status of the bill which would place a fee on municipalities who use the LEIN system. He noted he has noticed several residents moving their lawn clippings into the street and that the Council needs to consider who they wish to appoint as delegate to the MML Convention. He also questioned if candidates are notified when election signs are found and removed from City rights-of-way.

City Manager Walters stated candidates are informed that election signs are not allowed on rights-of-way.

City Manager Walters noted that the Water Distribution Report and the Budget Review that were placed on the table are for discussion at the next regular meeting. He also noted a budget analysis will be prepared for that meeting as well.

There being no further business to come before City Council, Mayor Johnson adjourned the regular meeting of the Northville City Council at 8:35 p.m.

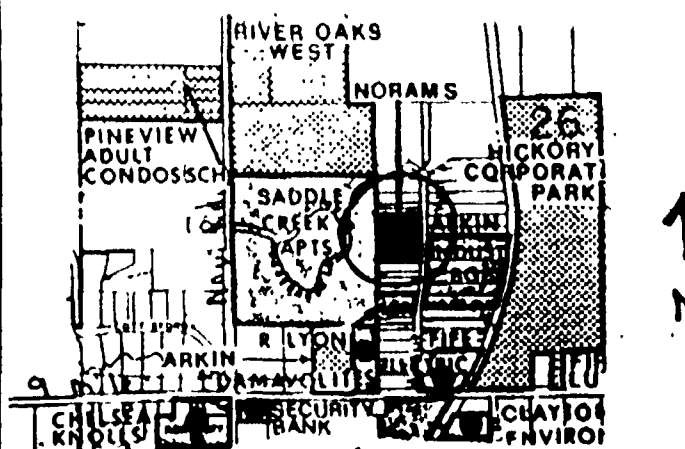

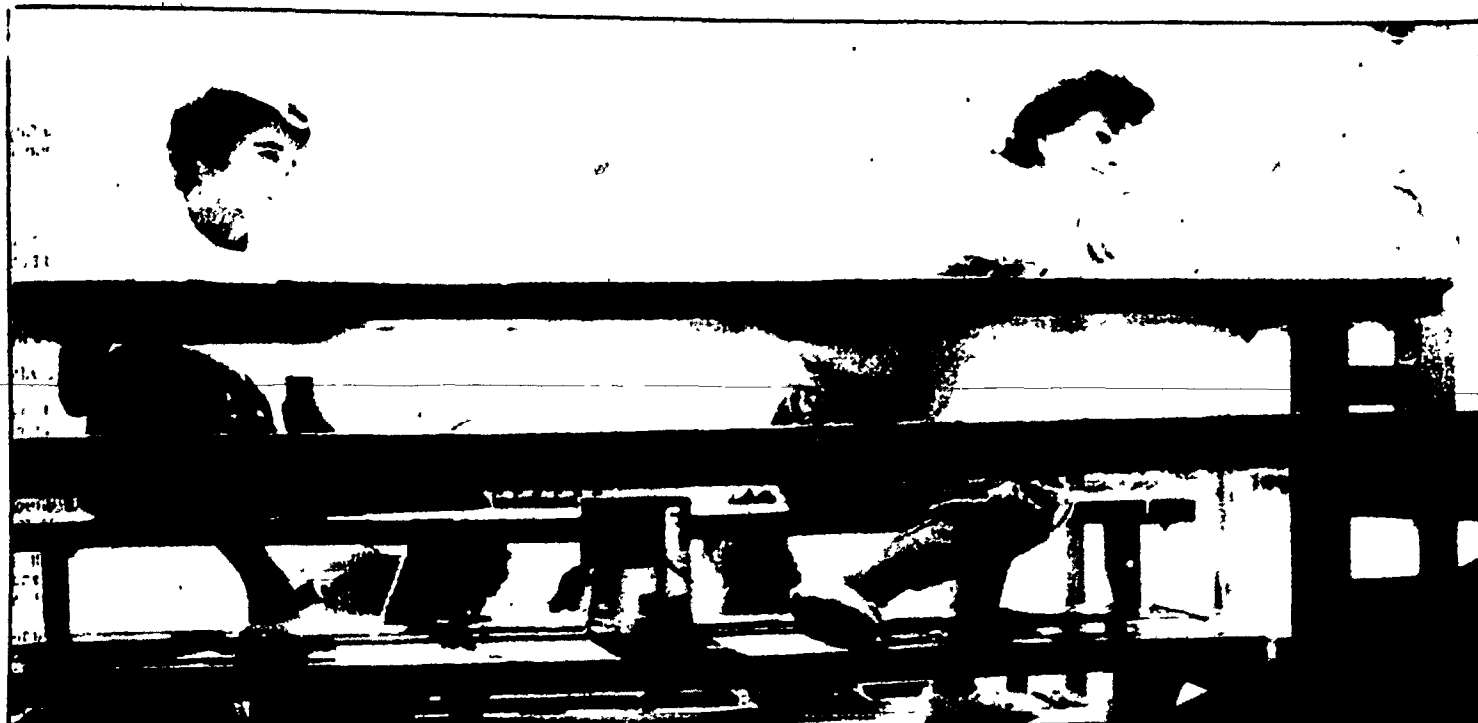

## Trucks banned on southern part of Taft Road

Residents along Taft Road probably will not be getting an earth berm to reduce traffic noise, but through trucks are no longer allowed on the southern part of the street.

The Northville City Council last week voted to prohibit through trucks on Taft from Eight Mile Road to the city limit about a half mile north. Through trucks were already prohibited from the Northville/Novi border up to 10 Mile Road under a City of Novi ordinance.

About 12 area residents were at the Northville City Council meeting Tuesday, Sept. 6, to hear the council discussion of their request for a berm to block traffic noise. After hearing city officials' conclusion that there is not enough room available to build an effective berm, some of the residents

agreed that a berm is not a workable idea.

"From a practical standpoint, there is somewhat of a limited space for a berm within the right-of-way," City Manager Steve Walters said at the meeting.

A report from city engineers McNeely & Lincoln Associates concludes that the available space would only allow a berm between two feet and three and a third feet tall, which would not decrease noise or block the line of sight.

Residents agreed that the berm did not sound feasible, but asked the city to consider other action like trees, bushes, a wall or some combination. The council directed Walters to investigate the possibilities.

Council member Paul Folino sug-

gested that a reconstruction and repaving planned for the road might also help reduce the noise.

Mayor Pro Tem Carolann Ayres added that the city would probably

not spend a whole lot of money on any other noise control project, and they should therefore consider the legalities of having private citizens pay for work on public land.

## Council OKs study

A committee of Northville officials Monday recommended firms to conduct three studies to look at the city's future — and the present planning consultants got the nod for two of them.

The committee will recommend that Ayres, Lewis, Norris and May — the firm hired earlier this year as city planning consultants — be hired to conduct an update of the city Master Plan and a detailed look at the future of the "Cady Street Corridor." Quinn Evans, an architectural firm specializing in restoration, will be recommended to study possible future uses of the closing Northville Ford Plant.

Although the committee is only recommending firms to Northville City Council, four of the five council members were present at the committee meeting and did not object to the consensus choices of firms.

The three studies are expected to be completed with money available through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program.

Northville was approved to use past years' grant, money for the studies, however, bids came in at prices higher than estimated in the grant. City officials have discussed using some of this year's CDBG money — recently approved to install an elevator at City Hall — to make up the difference, but this would require a specially called public hearing and a reapproval from Wayne County.

To update the city Master Plan — a general consideration of purpose, land use and the like — the city received three bids. The Ayres, Lewis bid was the lowest at \$23,567, and several officials at the meeting said it was just as good as or better than the other bids.

Seven firms bid on the study to con-

sider possible future uses of the Northville Ford Plant, which is planned to close at the end of the year. The Quinn Evans bid was third lowest of the seven, but some of the officials felt that their experience in renovating older buildings — including the old Wayne County building and several structures in Washington, D.C. — was a strong advantage. The Quinn Evans bid is for \$18,000.

Ayres, Lewis also had the low bid for the Cady corridor study, at \$18,283. This study is supposed to consider future development along Cady near the present downtown, with consideration of immediately surrounding areas. A second phase of the study will consider possible alternate uses of the Northville Downs race track land if the track should ever close.

Monday's meeting, at which city officials reached consensus on their recommendations to the council, was originally set up as a meeting of a set committee to which other officials were invited. For consideration of the proposals, Mayor Chris Johnson expanded the City Council's interview committee — consisting of Johnson and John Buckland — to include Planning Commission Chairperson Dick Wilhelm and Downtown Development Authority member Bill Sliger.

But Council Member Paul Folino last week objected to the process, saying the council should have had a say in how the proposals were reviewed. After Folino's objections, the meeting was changed to a special session of the City Council. Folino and Council Member Jerry Mittman attended, as did two other members of the Planning Commission, Chris Gazlay and Kathleen Otton.

### Goal setting by school board is a good idea

The Northville Board of Education recently passed three goals and objectives for the 1988-89 school year. The board is to be commended for a fine job, both on the goal-setting process itself, and on the priorities on which they have chosen to concentrate in the coming year.

Goal setting is a necessary and positive activity. For corporations, individuals and boards and councils the action of sitting down and analyzing the progress and direction made in the last year, and clearly defining the progress needed in the coming year, is essential to keep on track.

The third goal is a particularly welcome one. The district will be conducting what sounds to be a thorough process of "strategic planning". The goal is to survey the community, the staff and the board to determine a mission statement — or fundamental statement of purpose for the district, and then to set a priority list for the future, perhaps a five-year plan like the one set in 1982.

Getting active community participation is the key to this goal, Superintendent George Bell told the board. Residents will be encouraged to attend the sessions where a facilitator will help all involved reach a consensus on the strengths and weaknesses of the district. Citizen groups will be used extensively as this planning process progresses. This is a terrific way in which the district can communicate with the community, and for the parents and taxpayers of the communities in the district to make known their feelings about the school system.

An element of responsibility rests with the citizens of the community to use this opportunity to get involved. Too often it is easy to talk of the problems without becoming a part of the solution.

This will be a chance for Northville residents to become a part of the future of the schools and is a welcome goal for the board and the community.

### AutumnFest is a nice way to welcome fall

A special event is coming to Northville this weekend. The eighth annual AutumnFest will include the second annual showing of Art Market, a juried fine art show taking place in the Main Street park, by the bandshell.

Autumn in Northville is indeed good cause for celebration. While each season has its backers, autumn is certain to be a top favorite of just about anyone. The beauty of the trees as they change color in and around Hines Park draw people to the township as fall progresses. Cars full of weekend tourists have already begun to cruise into the downtown area for pleasant shopping weather. Trips to the cider mills, both in town and in the township, will keep traffic steady throughout this season.

AutumnFest is a tradition in this town. And the addition of the fine arts fair is a welcome one. Northville, long known as a center for fine antique fairs, arts and crafts fairs and sidewalk sales, is now host to a fair of a different sort — a juried fine arts exhibition. There is certainly room for

such a show.

The Northville Arts Commission is to be commended for its vision and follow-through in bringing such an event to town. The commission, spurred on by the dream of Phelps Hines, chairman, thought that the historic downtown area of Northville would be an ideal site for a well-done fine arts exhibition. Last year's Art Market drew 20 artists to the area for a two-day show, and this year the Market will feature the work of 26 artists for an expanded three-day show.

Art Market, like the other Art Commission sponsored events, music in the bandshell all summer long and the recently published book of Northville poems, "Town One South" — is something of which this community and its citizens can be proud. And one in which all members should participate.

Here's hoping the weekend will be a glorious, fall one, rich in color, seasonable weather — and fine art. What a glorious combination.

# Pressure on daughter worries mother

This is another in a continuing series of columns written for the Record by Mary Ellen King, Director of Northville Youth Assistance.

Last week I received the following letter from a mother which I would like to share with Northville Record readers.

Dear Mary Ellen:

Your column in the paper has been very interesting and informative. I was wondering if you could help me with a problem I have been having with my 15 year old daughter. Throughout the summer she has been spending an unusual amount of time with her 17 year old boyfriend. Her only interest is this boy. I am afraid this boy is pressuring her into having sex. What can I say to her?

Dear Mom:

Number one, encourage your daughter to talk to you or someone else she trusts. Assure her that you will not condemn or ridicule her and that you had the same feelings when you were a

teenager.

Secondly, help her to look at the reasons why she would have sex with this boy. Would she have sex to:

1. Prove to herself or someone else that she is a woman;
2. Rebel against you;
3. Hold on to the boyfriend because she doesn't think the relationship will survive unless she has sex;
4. Be accepted by others who give the impression that everyone is "doing it".

If she has sex for any of these reasons, she will be disappointed later and serious consequences may result.

In talking to your daughter, help her understand and prepare for all the consequences of having sex. How is she going to feel about herself afterwards? Will she feel guilty and have regrets?

Remind her of the possibility of unwanted pregnancy. An unwanted pregnancy or unplanned pregnancy may force her to change her future plans. Also, she should be aware of the

possibility of contracting a sexually transmitted disease. Sexually transmitted diseases are a very serious problem and left untreated can cause an inability to have children or result in blindness or even death.

Having sex before a person is emotionally and physically ready can leave permanent emotional scars.

Finally, let your daughter know that if she is not ready or if she just doesn't feel it's right for her — to say "NO!" The choice is hers and should not be based on pressure from peers or her boyfriend. Having sex is a very serious matter for teenagers and should be handled very delicately and with a great deal of compassion and empathy by parents.

Encourage dialogue. If she needs someone else to talk to she is welcome to call Northville Youth Assistance (NYA) at 344-1618.

Parents are encouraged to call or write NYA with problems or concerns about their children.

## One lane of bridge to reopen

The Beal Avenue bridge will probably not be fixed for another year, but city officials plan to reopen it for one-lane traffic before the horse racing season opens next month.

The bridge, on Beal at River, leads to the eastern Northville Downs entrance. It has been closed for several weeks because of decay in the structure.

"We know what to do about it... but the funding is the question, because it's a \$70,000 or \$80,000 item," City Manager Steve Walters said at the City Council meeting Tuesday, Sept. 6.

Specifically, bridge repair is estimated at \$70,000. A temporary bridge for one year is estimated to cost \$78,000.

City officials believe the project may qualify for bridge repair grant money, but a memo from city engineers McNeely & Lincoln Associates says such money will not be available for a year or two.

"Ironically, in a sense, emergency bridge funds are available in about 12 months," Walters said. Non-emergency funds might be available in about two years.

Temporarily, McNeely & Lincoln recommended using just the south lane of the bridge as a one-lane bridge, since the north lane is the only part in poor shape. In addition, the engineers recommended limiting the bridge to vehicles under 6,000 pounds.

At the council meeting, Walters suggested adopting the recommendation, and monitoring the situation during the first few days of the racing season at Northville Downs. The bridge could be restricted to incoming traffic only during the early evening, and to outgoing traffic only before the end of an evening's racing.

Walters said keeping the bridge closed completely would probably cause more problems than it would solve.

The council also directed Walters to apply for bridge repair grants as soon as possible.

conducting training sessions, attending mutual aid meetings and other duties.

## Sportsmen flock to area gun store for information and the latest techniques

Hunter's Run sits amidst the toy stores, clothing outlets and restaurants in the West Oaks II shopping center.

It's neither a restaurant nor a hardware store, and it doesn't sell sturdy outdoor clothing. Hunter's Run specializes in firearms sales and training. That's right, guns.

Why would anyone in the safe City of Novi need a gun? According to store owner Kevin Gasiewski, the majority of his customers are not looking for protection.

"Most of the people who come in are competitive shooters or hunters," he said.

So far, business has been good and continues to increase every month. Some customers come from as far away as Brighton. Hunter's Run also has quite a few regular customers.

"My customers just seem to find me," said Gasiewski.

Since the majority of the store's customers already own at least one hand gun, Hunter's Run also

specializes in program development. Upon customer request, Gasiewski will develop a shooting program with a focus on competitive improvement. Program development is available for public or private organizations.

"It's like a lesson plan for shooting," Gasiewski said.

Many of the would-be customers who walk through the front doors of Hunter's Run are looking for advice on how to improve their competitive shooting scores.

"They come in asking what to do or what they can use, and we do our best to try to help them," Gasiewski said.

The store's increasing popularity is due in part to its seriously competitive atmosphere. Hunter's Run employees include two part-time salespeople who are involved in law enforcement, although one is retired. Both are, according to Gasiewski, knowledgeable about all types of guns. The expertise of the store's employees, he believes, is an advantage over larger, more general, sporting goods stores.

"Those of us who work here are all shooters. We can communicate with

our customers on a different level," he said.

In accordance with state and federal laws, Hunter's Run customers must have a license to own a gun before making any purchases. Gasiewski also has a license from the federal government which enables him to sell firearms. The license requires a federal background investigation and many forms and applications.

According to Gasiewski, owning and managing a store like Hunter's Run requires more paper work than usual.

"It's not too much more work because I keep right up on it," he said.

Gasiewski, a veteran firearms specialist, has been involved in law enforcement for 14 years and has been a competitive shooter for 10 years. He is also a graduate from the Smith and Wesson Academy and has participated in the National Shooting Championships.

Hunter's Run is open Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m.

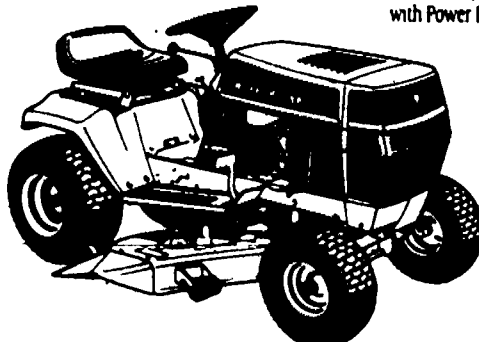

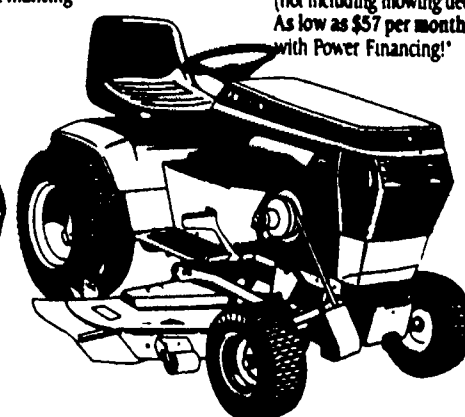

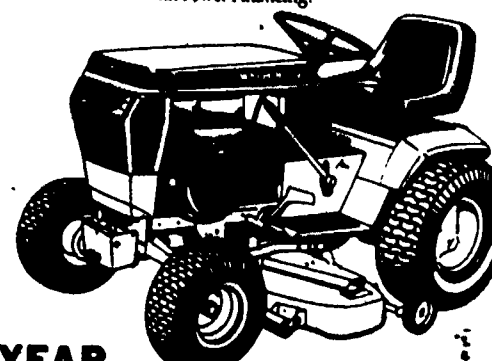

# Home improvements have financial effects on homeowners

In normally quiet suburbs, the sound of buzz saws and hammers mingles with that of lawn mowers. This clamor is the telltale sign of homeowners who realize the value of home improvements.

Add a porch, install a fireplace or landscape your property and you may end up with a more valuable home.

According to the Michigan Association of CPAs, you should carefully review your payment options before you hammer a single nail or interview a single contractor.

If you need to borrow in order to pay for your home improvements, your best choice is probably a home equity loan, a second mortgage or refinancing. Depending on various factors, you may be able to deduct the interest on loans secured by your first or second home. On the other hand, if you pay for home improvements with your credit card or

a personal loan, you can deduct only 40 percent of interest paid in 1988, 20 percent in 1989, 10 percent in 1990 and none thereafter.

On a more positive note, any capital improvement you make — regardless of the method of payment — increases the cost basis of your residence and decreases your taxable profit when you sell your home. Note that capital improvements are not the same as repair or maintenance activities, such as painting walls or fixing a broken window pane. To qualify as a capital improvement, a project must add to the property's value, prolong its life or adapt it to a new use. Repairs just maintain the home in acceptable con-

dition

To substantiate your home-improvement expenses, keep a file of canceled checks, credit card bills, contractor invoices, receipts for materials, before and after photographs and loan agreements. Don't forget to document the small, do-it-yourself projects, such as installing a new mailbox, paving your driveway or hooking up an automatic garage-door opener.

Once you decide on a source of funding, and the amount of money you can afford to spend, focus on the various remodeling projects under consideration. Which home improvements would yield the greatest return on your investment? What

projects can you manage on your own and which require a contractor?

When it comes to remodeling, in dividuality has its drawbacks. To one homeowner, a hot tub built into the back porch may be the height of luxury, while to another such a set-up may seem outlandish. If your only concern is creating a home in which you can happily live the rest of your life, by all means, improve your home in whatever way you choose. But if you are concerned about resale value, remember that conformity can pay off when it comes time to sell.

Projects that elevate your property value well above the neighborhood's norm, for example, are not likely to recover remodeling costs. A six-bedroom house in a community of starter homes is simply out of place — and usually hard to sell.

On the other hand, you would do

well to bring your house up to par by adding on a second garage in an area dominated by two-garage homes. As a general rule, don't expect to sell your house for more than 20 percent above the average in your area. So if you buy a \$90,000 home in a \$100,000 neighborhood, CPAs advise you to spend no more than \$30,000 in home improvement costs.

Over the years, certain improvements have consistently provided the best cost recovery. Update your kitchen by adding more cabinets or more counter space and you will often recover the amount spent on the renovation.

Other enhancements that generally return 50 to 100 percent of their cost include a second bathroom, skylights and expanded closet space. If you don't already have one, a fireplace, particularly a new energy-efficient model, may be one of the best investments you can make. And

don't forget that other energy-conservation measures, such as installing storm windows or insulating your attic, can lower your fuel costs and deliver a return on your investments even if you don't sell.

Now you are ready to decide on who should do the job. Obviously, a lot will depend on your own skills, financial priorities, the nature of the improvement and the amount of time you have available for the project. If you choose the "do-it-yourself" approach, the savings can be considerable. But if you cringe at the thought of plunging a sledge hammer through your bedroom wall, hire a contractor.

Always obtain written estimates from several contractors. Choose two or three, then check with their past customers and with the Better Business Bureau. You may even con-

# Stay-at-homes demand more customized equipment

Americans are spending more time at home and, as a result, home buyers are seeking a greater number of amenities in new homes, according to a nationally-known real estate sales, design and marketing consultant.

Among the features buyers want are additional storage space, kitchen suites, rather than four-walled kitchens, larger rooms, center-island kitchen arrangements, built-in appliances, master bedroom suites, walk-in closets, media walls in the family room, security systems and quality wood floors.

Today's home buyer wants more amenities as standard offerings, not options, said Kristelle Petersen, president of Petersen Communications, a Dallas-based public relations and advertising firm.

A former editor for Better Homes and Gardens and real estate editor

for the Dallas Times Herald, Petersen conducted a recent seminar for the Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan.

"In the home building industry, demographic and sociologic trends are critically important," noted Herbert Lawson, BASM president. "Kristelle Petersen is extremely well-qualified to discuss them."

"We know that changing lifestyles are affecting the market," he said. "People seem to be rediscovering the home as the center of their lives. This often means they will want more features in their homes."

Petersen, who follows real estate trends closely and speaks throughout the country, cited surveys by Newsweek magazine and Professional Builder magazine that reported Americans are spending more time at home.

"This trend translates into a

desire for more amenities in the home," she pointed out. "Features such as home offices, saunas, fitness rooms, central vacuum systems and home entertainment centers are gaining in popularity."

The real estate marketing consultant advised builders to keep those trends in mind when designing and marketing new homes.

"Today's home should be built for comfort, not for speed," she said. "The trend is for amenities like fireplaces, bookcases, in-home spas — things traditionally considered options — to become standard."

Referring to the survey taken by Professional Builder, she said 64 percent of Detroit-area respondents were looking for larger homes with more amenities in better locations. And 48 percent had \$10,000 to \$30,000 available for a down payment. Security, privacy and lifestyle were

among the main reasons given for seeking a new home.

Demand for entry-level homes is softening across the country, according to Petersen, with the majority of buyers looking to trade up. This is largely because baby boomers are becoming well-established in middle age, and there are 5.9 million fewer teenagers than there were a decade ago.

However, many empty nesters are seeking smaller dwelling places that require less time for upkeep. And while baby boomers represent the highest proportion of potential home buyers, people over 55 tend to be more financially secure.

Effective merchandising is becoming more important than ever, Petersen believes.

"In its highest form, home merchandising might be referred to as the seduction of the buyer," she told

seminar attendees. "You want the buyer to aspire to the lifestyle and amenities that your homes offer."

The "curb appeal" of a home is an important factor in attracting prospective buyers, she said, noting that half the people who stop at model homes do so on impulse as they are driving by. Architecture, landscaping, colors and location all have a bearing on curb appeal.

"Once a person steps inside a model home, you have 11 to 15 seconds to attract and hold their attention," Petersen explained. "That's one reason it is so critically important to identify your target

market and know what they are likely to be looking for in a home."

She encouraged builders to do their own market research.

"At the very least, she emphasized, 'sales staffs should be using prospect cards to track where buyers are coming from and for referrals.'"

Sales personnel need to be more skilled than ever, she said, not only in relating how the special feature of a particular home would fit with the buyer's lifestyle, but also in making clear the investment advantages of owning a home in today's uncertain economy.

fact the banks with whom the contractors do business.

Review a sample contract and note what a contractor does and does not agree to do. Who is responsible for clean-up after the work is completed? Is there an additional charge for this service? The contract also should spell out who pays for materials and other related costs. For example, while it may be the contractor's responsibility to obtain building permits for the project, the homeowner usually pays the fees. In any case make sure that the permit is obtained — otherwise, you can be liable for the penalty. Since any construction job can run into cost over-

runs, make sure the contract specifies that any sizeable increase in expenses must first receive your approval.

Before signing the contract, ask the construction company to obtain a certificate of insurance that names you as co-insured for damage or injury. Also, check that the contractors are covered by worker's compensation.

Once you are satisfied with the contract, set up a payment schedule with the contractor. Early payments should allow a company enough money to buy materials and pay workers and subcontractors — but withhold the balance of the fee to use as leverage against completion of the

job. Since full payment to the contractor does not prevent suppliers or subcontractors from filing liens against your property, never release the final payment until you have proof of that the contractor has paid all

parties involved in the project.

Finally, CPAs advise you to carefully weigh all the financial consequences of remodeling before entering into an agreement with a contractor.

## Profits may make hobby into business as IRS checks into small home activity

If you have a small home business, such as selling rare coins or carpentry, the 1986 Tax Reform Act has changed the treatment of losses from your activity depending on whether you operate a "business" or a "hobby."

The Internal Revenue Service presumes that your activity is a business with a "profit motive" and all losses are deductible if you can show a profit in at least three out of five years.

Before the 1986 Tax Reform Act went into effect, you only had to show a profit in two out of five years, but starting in 1987, you must show a profit in three of every five years if you want the IRS to believe you have a

profit motive.

If you had your business in 1983, 1984 and 1985, and you showed profits in only two of those years, you cannot rely on the presumption to claim a loss from it in 1987 because it will be impossible to satisfy the "three out of five" rule.

Even if you have not shown a profit in any of the five years, you may still be able to deduct your losses if you can prove to the IRS that you have a "profit motive." The IRS looks at several factors to determine this:

- Your history of income or losses in the business
- Your expertise in operating the business — can you ever break even?
- Your past successes or failures

in operating other businesses.

□ How much time you actually devote to the business.

□ Are you keeping proper records?

□ Can you make money in the business?

□ How much in income and losses have you had to date?

If the test determines you have a profit motive, you are entitled to deduct all of your losses from the business venture.

However, if you don't try very hard to sell your product and your "business" suffers losses each year, the IRS considers your business a hobby.

The tax law considers this type of loss a "hobby loss" and puts restric-

tions on claiming it.

For example, Matt occasionally collects rare coins. One day he bought a \$2,000 coin collection from Debra, thinking he could sell it for a profit. He ended up selling it for \$1,500, and was distraught by the \$500 loss and the IRS' ruling that would not allow him to claim the loss.

The IRS disallowed it because Matt did not actively try to make a profitable business out of coin collecting, and the IRS therefore declared it a "hobby loss."

Under the "hobby loss" tax law, you can only claim deductions from your hobby up to the amount of the income you make from the hobby — and nothing more.

This top-level networking process includes the continuing exposure to creative leadership ideas — including the potential of applying military planning to corporate strategy.

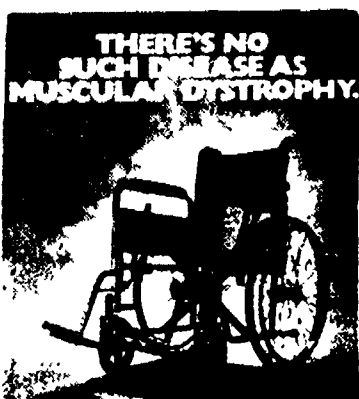

# BE PICKY ABOUT APPLES

You don't even have to know much about apples to have a good time plucking them off the tree. That's the message from local orchard operators who are gearing up for the beginning of the "U-pick" apple season.

Apple cider is also brewing. Pumpkins, grapes and other fruit from the vines are making their last growth spurt of the season.

Some of the major apple varieties — McIntosh, Spartans, and some Red Delicious — will be ready for harvest as early as this weekend. Other varieties kick in later in the fall.

For a lot of people, apple picking is a last great way to get outdoors before the snow flies, besides being a reasonably priced family entertainment value.

Bushels are running in the neighborhood of \$10 at most local orchards. That represents as much as a half-hour or so of picking, or as little as ten minutes.

"It's good fun for everybody," said Linda Erwin, of Erwin Farms in South Lyon. "It's something they can take their time with. There's no rush. Our phones are starting to ring

we have a lot of people who come back every year. And they are ready to go this year."

Orchard operators are also gearing up elsewhere.

"It's working out pretty well at this point," said Chris Guest of the Seven Lakes Vineyard in Holly. "The crop looks good."

The drought has posed the biggest question for the 1988 picking season. Simply put, little water means smaller apples. Sizes are varying throughout the county.

It's also doubtful that the late rains will have much of an effect on harvests.

"We still have a very good crop, though it's smaller than it has been in the past," said Mary Wilson an agent with the Michigan State University Cooperative Extension Service.

"The size is a little bit smaller, though it varies from area to area. Indications are that quality really hasn't suffered though," Wilson added.

Another challenge is insurance, which has indeed driven some orchards out of the U-Pick business. Orchard owners hope relatively new state laws will help to spur the trade.

"Unless you are very negligent... unless you do something very dangerous, you can't get in trouble," Erwin said.

Some orchards have done away with ladders. Erwin's has gone entirely to "dwarf" trees — no higher than six feet — for their U-Pick crowds. Erwin's also makes available red raspberries and pumpkins.

The Seven Lakes Vineyard has expanded into a variety of different areas over the years. U-Pick grapes, grape juices, and wines are available at the facility. The vineyard has long been a haven for home winemakers.

Both facilities make fresh apples available for people who aren't really excited about picking their own.

The Plymouth Orchard is already harvesting some Red Delicious apples. Spartans and other varieties are scheduled to be ripe for picking in the next several weeks.

Northville's Foreman's Orchard no longer offers U-Pick, but still does a brisk over-the-counter trade, besides offering the seasonal cider fare.

Parmenter Cider Mill in Northville has been up and going for the past several weeks.

Parmenter's is located at 714 Baseline. Foreman's is located at 5050 Seven Mile in Northville.

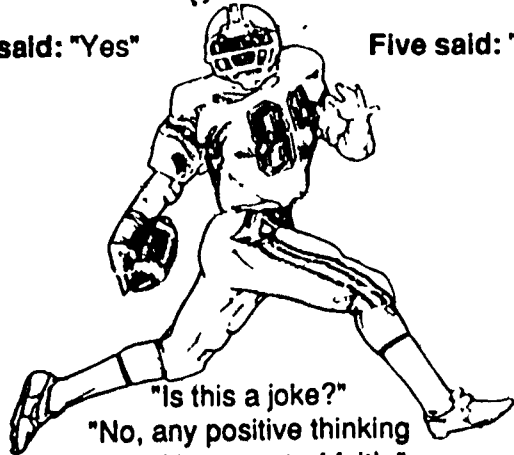

## Casterline launches red ribbon campaigns

"If you find your child is involved in substance abuse, it's too late," Roxanne Casterline, spokesperson for the Northville Action Council said. "You've lost your child."

In order to forestall this, she and 24 other parents, grandparents, and concerned citizens meet monthly to discuss ways to educate the community.

One way they have decided is to stage Red Ribbon campaigns. Just as several years ago yellow ribbons were displayed to symbolize our country's goal to free the Iran hostages, red ribbons have been displayed in communities since drug traffickers executed DEA Agent Enrique Camarena in Mexico in 1985.

Last March the Northville Action Council had a Red Ribbon Campaign during PTA Drug Awareness Week. Red ribbons fluttered on trees and lamp posts, and mer-

chants displayed them in store windows.

In June, Casterline attended a meeting in Detroit "to organize the Michigan component of the first national Red Ribbon Campaign to be held the week of Oct. 23-30." The national program, sponsored by the National Federation of Parents for Drug Free Youth, "is designed to establish a parent/community network in every Michigan community to support drug-free lifestyles," Casterline said.

This will be more than just displaying red ribbons, Casterline said. Plans are being worked out, the PTAs in conjunction with the Northville Action Council, to bring drug awareness to children from kindergarten through high school.

"We'll provide a list of things," she said, "for teachers to choose from and work into their class schedules. And at football halftime on Oct. 28 we'll have a celebrity sports person come talk," she said.

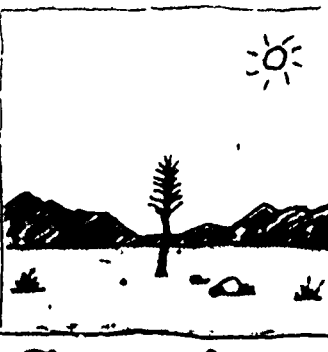

## Local stores feature hands-on fun

A relatively new breed of hands-on stores have taken root, bringing with them a unique way for shoppers to make their purchases.

"The Sharper Image" and "Ingenuities," both located on the Twelve Oaks mall, aren't promising to turn the retail world on its ear. But they do offer an alternative that is unique and refreshing to the stern "look-but-don't-touch" approach employed in other stores.

The Sharper Image, which moved onto the mall in April, encourages its customers to push the levers, ring the bells, and basically have fun in trying out the wide variety of products it makes available on the sales floor.

They offer a wide line of upscale products, but wince at the "yuppie" label.

"It's a fitness, health, and electronic store," said senior sales associate John Nikolas.

It's also very difficult to identify. There's mini-pool tables and small electronic pinball machines in one end of the store, juke boxes, rowing machines, electronic keyboards, and massagers in the other.

New products are introduced at the pace of ten per month.

So far, it's worked just fine in Novi, according to Nikolas.

"Everything must be in working order and if it isn't, it's replaced," said Nikolas. "Sometimes, when we aren't able to get to the customer right away, they can pick it up and check it out. The products sell themselves."

That means electronic keyboards and exercise equipment is plugged in for shoppers to try out. Smaller toys have working batteries in them.

Game parts, like pool cues and ping pong balls are made, available by Sharper Image staff.

The company started ten years ago with a watch and runner's magazine. Since then, they have expanded into 52 different stores, including an outlet in Japan. They plan to open a West German store soon.

Every Tuesday at 12:30 p.m., products that may have been slightly worn on the sales floor are auctioned off. Products usually going for \$100 could start off as low as \$20 on the auction days, Nikolas.

Ingenuities also encourages the same type of hands-on approach with its line of products.

"The whole store is designed for everything to be picked up and played with," said store manager Paul Schneider. "They are able to pick up ... they are able to see the

quality right away."

The emphasis is equally hard to define. The store carries a wide variety of unique electronic devices — wall clocks, massagers, and a variety of office furnishings. There are quite a few "adult toys" to be found at the store, but not really of the racy or naughty variety. The store features quite a bit of family-oriented products.

The most recent unique item is a real-looking mechanical trophy fish. It sits still until a monitor detects a noise. Then the tail flops back and forth.

Neon phones in pink or blue are also the rage.

"Those are some of our biggest sellers right now," Schneider said.

Ingenuities has been on the Twelve Oaks mall for slightly over a 1½ years. There are currently 17 stores nationwide.

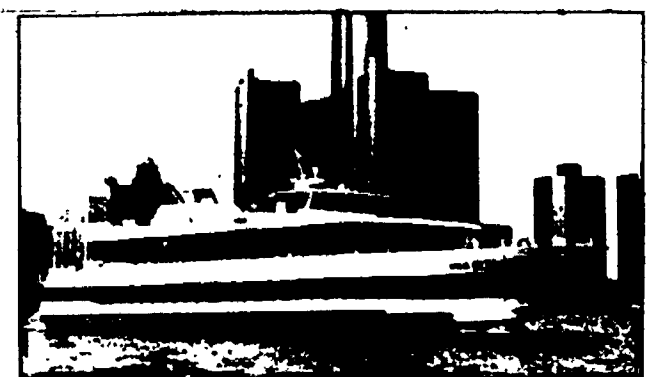

## Milford plans tour of local historic buildings

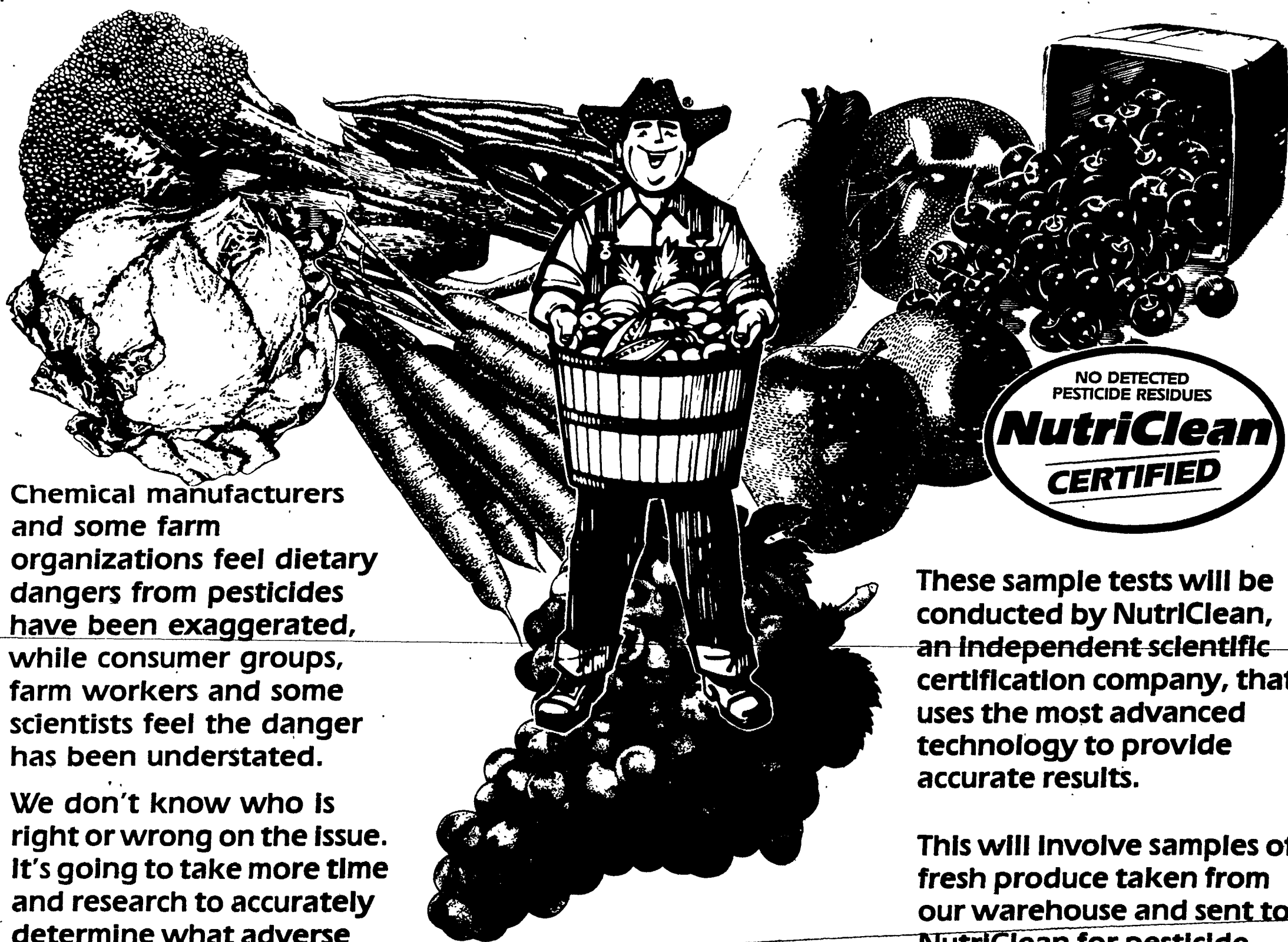

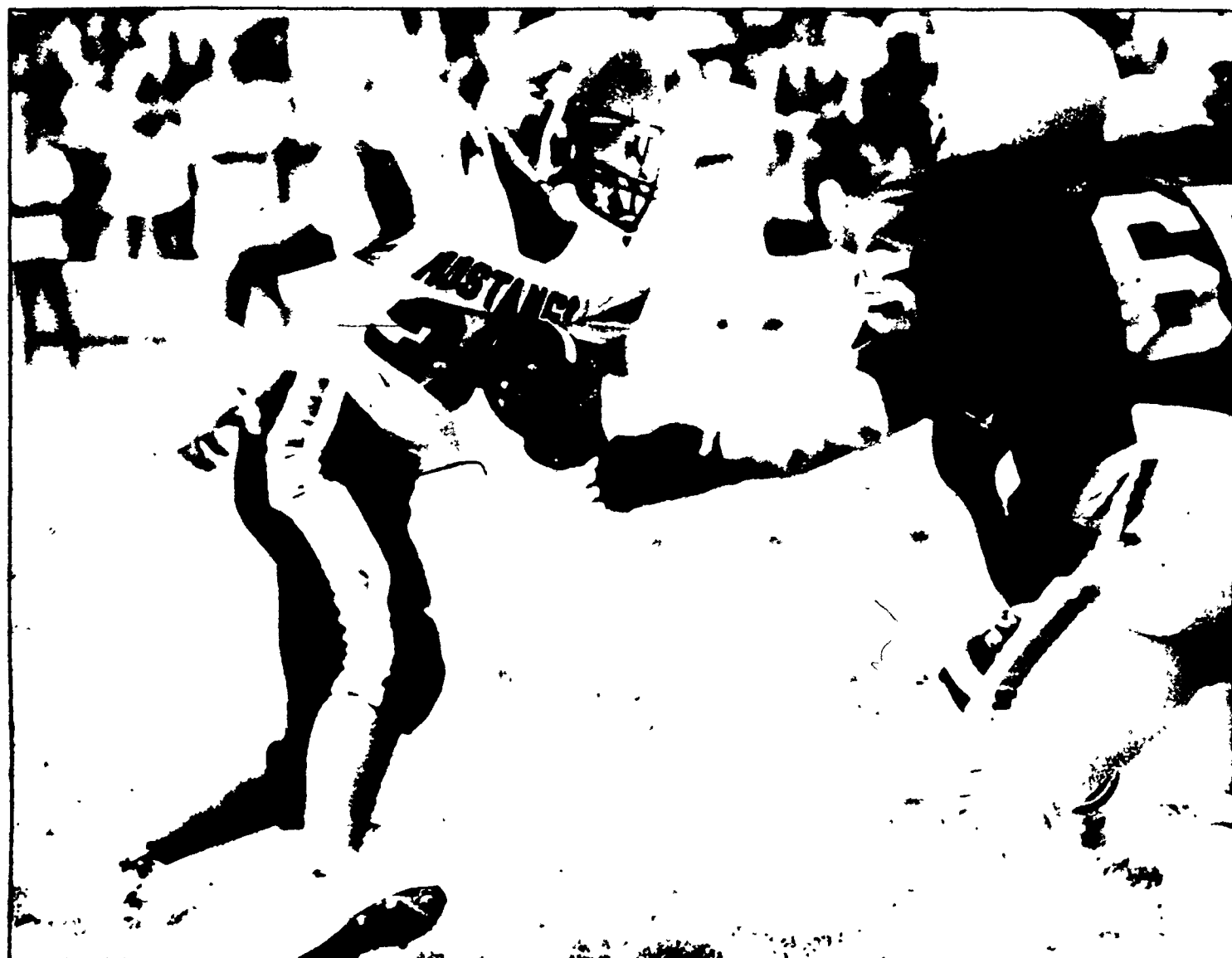

# Mustangs botch PAT, fall to Raiders 10-9

An old bugaboo — special team play — came back to haunt the Northville gridders, and this time it may have cost the squad a victory.

A blocked extra point conversion, with about five minutes left to play, proved to be the difference last Saturday afternoon (Sept. 10) as North Farmington escaped with a 10-9 win over the Mustangs. The loss evened Northville's record to 1-1 (0-1 in the WLAA).

Ironically, a long field goal in the waning minutes against Brighton in the opener a week earlier won it for the Mustangs, but extra point difficulties still abound. Northville has scored two touchdowns so far this season, but have yet to complete a successful point after attempt.

"It was a heck of a high school game," Mustang Coach Darrel Schumacher said. "Like (North Farmington coach) Jim O'Leary said at the end of the game, it was a shame somebody had to lose. I thought we outplayed them other than the special teams. And when you do that and still lose, that's discouraging."

Just like the week before, Northville marched down the field, inside the Raider 20 yard line on an early possession, but failed to come away with any points. Kicker Chris Kuffner came on for a field goal but a bad snap forced the holder to bobble the ball and an ideal scoring chance was botched.

"It was a missed chance that we should have capitalized on," Schumacher said. "Our kids realized after that that we could move the ball, so we gained some confidence there, but it was disappointing to come away empty handed."

The Mustangs put together another long drive just before halftime, and this time it resulted in a field goal and a 3-0 lead. Northville took the ball at their own 25 and bulldozed down to the North Farmington seven

before stalling. A key 30-yard pass from quarterback Greg Price to Jeff Wesley set up the 24-yard kick by Kuffner.

"It was a nice long drive and it was time consuming but we pattered at the end," Schumacher pointed out. "We were really hoping to punch it in and go up by a touchdown."

The Raiders took advantage of another special team gaffe early in the third quarter by returning a punt 40 yards, down to the Northville 20. Several plays later, North quarterback Mike Filipovich scored the touchdown from six yards out.

The Raiders made it 10-3 in the fourth quarter with a 26-yard field goal by Zlam Cumula, that was set up by a 60-yard pass play from Filipovich to tailback Joe Sturtz. But the Mustangs weren't done yet as they strung together another drive and capped it off with an eight-yard scoring run up the middle by fullback Mike Karfis with 5:50 remaining.

"That made the score 10-9 and if we get the extra point, we still had over five minutes to get the ball back and try to win it," Schumacher said. "And if it went to overtime, I felt confident we could win it there. I felt we were in control at that point."

But it just didn't happen. North's outside linebacker Rob Zino broke through the line and blocked the attempt by Kuffner.

"I can't really pick out any one area that was the problem on the kick, it was a lot of players not doing the job," Schumacher said.

Northville did get the ball back with about 2:50 remaining, and actually moved the ball into field goal range, but a holding penalty pushed them back and Price threw an interception on the next play to end the suspense. Sam Khashan had a clutch 24-yard run and tight end Sean Starkweather caught an eight-yard

# Golfers crush Salem, edge Lions to remain unbeaten

The Northville golfers increased their unbeaten string to five last week with a pair of dual meet victories.

And even though both matches ended in a win and both came at Salem Hills Golf Course, they were as different as night and day. In a 201-227 triumph over Plymouth Salem on Sept. 6, the Mustangs dominated things. But two days later, Northville struggled before nipping South Lyon 252-255.

The undisputed star in the Salem match — and probably the season so far — was senior James Nordbeck, who blistered Salem Hills with a one-under-par 35. He was the medalist on the day with his third straight performance at Salem without going over par.

"Nordbeck had a tremendous round," Mustang Coach

Don Morgan said. "I thought he was capable of playing this well last year but he didn't do it. But he's worked real hard on his game this summer and it's starting to really pay off. Under par in nine holes is super for anyone."

Kevin Telepo followed Nordbeck with a 39, Chris Lemmon was third (40) followed by Mike Crichton (43), Dave McKee (44) and Jason Schuerman (44).

"We played very well," Morgan said. "I think we're capable of shooting around 200 or under as a team and that's what we are averaging. I can't be disappointed with the performance."

The narrow win over South Lyon was actually much closer than three strokes. Over the top five scorers for each team were counted, there was a 207 deadlock. But when the sixth scores were added, Northville pulled out

the win.

"It ended up as a tie through five guys, but we took the match with the lowest sixth man," Morgan said. "That's why we have a sixth man, to break ties like this."

Lemmon took team medalist honors with a 39, but he was three strokes off the pace set by the Lions Chris Walters, who shot a 36. For Walters, it was five strokes better than his average. The rest of the Mustang scoring included Nordbeck's 40, Telepo's 42, Crichton's 42, McKee's 44 and John Schriever's ever-important 45.

"Schriever's 45 beat South Lyon's 48," Morgan explained. "Our scorers were higher than they have been, so maybe we let down a little bit. South Lyon isn't in our league and maybe we got caught looking ahead a little."

"Some of these things happen, you just have to expect

them. We were fortunate to win, but we did win, so I wasn't disappointed in that aspect of it."

The Mustangs (5-0 overall) took on WLAA Western Division foe Livonia Churchill on Sept. 14 (after Record deadline) and will clash with Plymouth-Canton tomorrow (Sept. 16). How Northville performs in these two could set the tone for the rest of the season.

Morgan is waiting for Telepo to really start coming on strong. The senior was seventh at the state meet last year but has been the Mustangs second or third scorer so far this season.

"Kevin seems to do real well when it's an 18-hole competition," Morgan said. "He's such a competitor, he doesn't like to be second or third on the team, so I have a feeling he's going to start improving his scores soon."

# Northville cagers clobber Pinckney

With the program's best start ever, expectations for the girls basketball season in Northville have been rising with every game.

The Mustangs made it three in a row on Sept. 8 with an overwhelming show of strength. The locals trounced Pinckney 56-30 and now head into the WLAA portion of the schedule with a lot of momentum, and a much improved reputation in basketball circles.

Northville has never had much of a girls basketball tradition, but coach Ed Kritch is making his own tradition now. The Mustangs are going for their third straight winning season, and the '88 edition appears to be the best ever. Rookie Pinckney coach Matt Seidl — who doubles as the sports editor for the South Lyon Herald and the Milford Times — can attest to the team's strength.

The lead grew to 42-16 after three, but both teams scored 14 in the final eight minutes to keep things respectable. Debbie Stevens and Karen Baird continued their dominance, and are developing into the best 1-2 punch around. Despite being double-teamed most of the game, Stevens scored 10 in the first half and ended with 16 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. Baird led the way with 22 points and added six steals.

In the first three games of the season, Stevens and Baird have combined for 121 points between them — that's an average of over 40 per game.

"Needless to say, those two have really started off the season very well," Kritch said. "They've been outstanding."

"(Pinckney) double-teamed Debbie to try and prevent her from getting the ball, but she still had a fine game, and that impressed me. Her 16 points were very underrated."

The Mustangs open the conference portion of their schedule tonight (Sept. 15) as they host Walled Lake Central. Kritch knows the Vikings will be a tough challenge, and he is worried about their aggressiveness.

"Central has a nice program and they always come into a game very aggressive," he said. "It's always one of the most physical games of the year for us. I'd like to see my girls play with that kind of aggressiveness."

"But I can't complain with how it's been going. It's been a fantastic start and I just hope we can keep it going. Hey, we like this not losing stuff."

## MHSAA says no to coaching box

The National Federation of State High School Associations voted in March to allow individual states to experiment with a six-foot "coaching box" in basketball, providing a change from the current bench decorum rule that stipulates a coach must coach from a seat on the bench. The Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) Council voted not to experiment with the coaching box in Michigan.

"The vote of the Council was a sound one," MHSAA Director Jack Roberts said. "We have spent three years educating our coaches and spectators that the bench decorum rule is in the best interest of the game, and to experiment with change would only confuse people. The rule has proven that coaches can coach from the bench, and has prevented them from being cheerleaders of dissent."

**PLAYER CONDUCT RULE PASSED FOR GOLF:** At the MHSAA golf

finals, a player conducting himself or herself in an unsportsmanlike manner could be disqualified on the first offense if the rules committee for that site so determines.

**SOCCER CO-CHAMPIONS MAY BE DECLARED:** If two teams play to a tie in the championship game of the boys' or girls' soccer state finals, co-champions will be named effective in 1989-90.

The current system has two ten-minute overtime periods which are played to completion if a tie exists at the end of regulation play. If a tie exists after two ten-minute sessions, then up to two five-minute sudden death periods are played.

Then, if a game is still tied, the two teams would participate in a shootout. Under the new system, co-champions would be declared at the end of the sudden death periods — therefore eliminating the shootout.

**SCHOOLS MUST BE REPRESENTED AT RULES MEETINGS:** The Council confirmed the current policy that head coaches must attend MHSAA rules meeting for their sport for the current year, and that if a coach is not appointed, an administrator or designee from the school must attend. Effective with the 1988-89 school year, penalties are to be levied against schools for failure to conform to the policy.

**MHSAA HOTLINE:** The MHSAA Hotline number (517) 332-2321 is designed to address current situations within the Association, and to provide timely updates on MHSAA-sponsored tournaments. The system is interactive, so questions not answered after listening to the entire program can be left on a message tape. Price was 8-of-20 for 98 yards and one interception. Defensively, middle linebacker Todd Daniels led the team in tackles and according to Schumacher "was all over the place." Outside linebackers Mike Hale and Kuffner also had a fine game as they shut out North's outside run.

"We believed heading in that we had to force them to throw the ball and I credit our kids because I think they did an excellent job against the rush," he said. "We controlled them. The only play that really hurt our defense was that 60-yard pass. But it

was the special teams that really ate us up."

The Mustangs third straight road game is slated for this Saturday (Sept. 17) at 1 p.m. against Farmington Harrison — the top-ranked Class B squad in the state. It will be Northville's first WLAA Western Division clash, and the team will be a heavy underdog, but Schumacher isn't conceding a thing. Last season, Harrison barely scraped by the Mustangs 14-6.

"I know (Harrison's) been worried about us since last year," he said. "They've scouted us a lot this year. If we come to play and do an outstanding job as a team, we have every chance in the world. But we can't do it as individuals — we have to pull together as a unit if we want to have a chance."

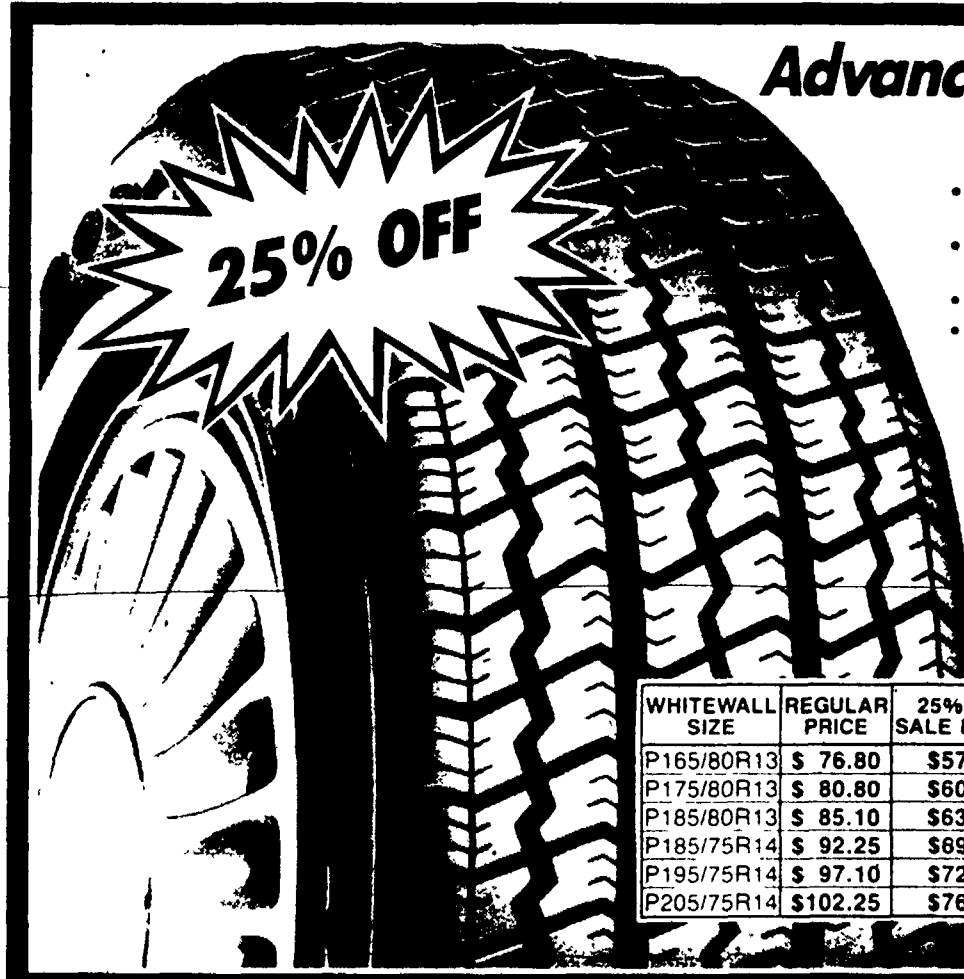

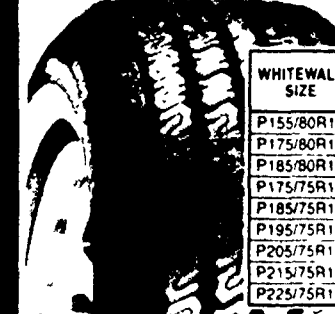

# Runners grab 17th at Bloomfield Invite

When members of the junior varsity are outperforming the varsity, some quick changes are probably in order.

That's the case for coach Ed Gabrys and the Northville boys cross country squad. The Mustangs didn't live up to Gabrys' expectations at the West Bloomfield Invite last weekend (Sept. 10) at Marshbank Park, and the main culprit was the tail end of the Northville varsity line-up.

In fact, two rookie runners who ran in the J.V. race for the Mustangs would have actually placed among the top-seven if they had run with the varsity.

As it was, Northville placed 17th out of 20 teams with 406 points, over 300 points behind first-place Holly Fellow WLAA opponents Farmington and North Farmington were also on hand, and they placed third and seventh respectively.

Sophomore Andy Haas finished first among his teammates for the second straight race, and appears to be the team's top runner this season. Haas placed 49th overall (out of about 140 runners) with a personal

best time of 18:12. He was followed by senior Jay Griffith, who improved his time at Marshbanks by almost a minute. His time of 18:37 was good for 66th overall.

The rest of the Mustang finishers included Jason Hoose (84th, 19:22), Mike Connerly (99th, 19:43), Mike Mathes (108th, 20:30), Carl Legel (116th, 20:46) and John Okasinski (122nd, 21:47).

Steve Coon and Jon Meek of the J.V. would have been among the top five if they had run in the varsity race. Coon's time of 19:27 would have been fourth and Meek's 19:45 would have been sixth, just 90 seconds off the pace set by Haas.

"It was the first time Coon and Meek had ever run a cross country race and they showed a lot of promise even though they have a lot to learn," Gabrys said. "Both of them are going to be good, so that aspect was encouraging."

The Mustangs open their dual meet season today (Sept. 15) against the defending WLAA champs from Farmington. Gabrys knows it will be a tough meet, but he is looking for positives to build on.

"Farmington is always tough," he said. "They have a good chance to repeat as conference champs, so we'll just do the best we can and try to move our pack up together."





It was Northville's first shutout of the young season, and it came at the expense of a program that's only been in existence for three seasons.

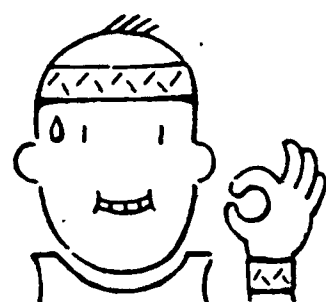

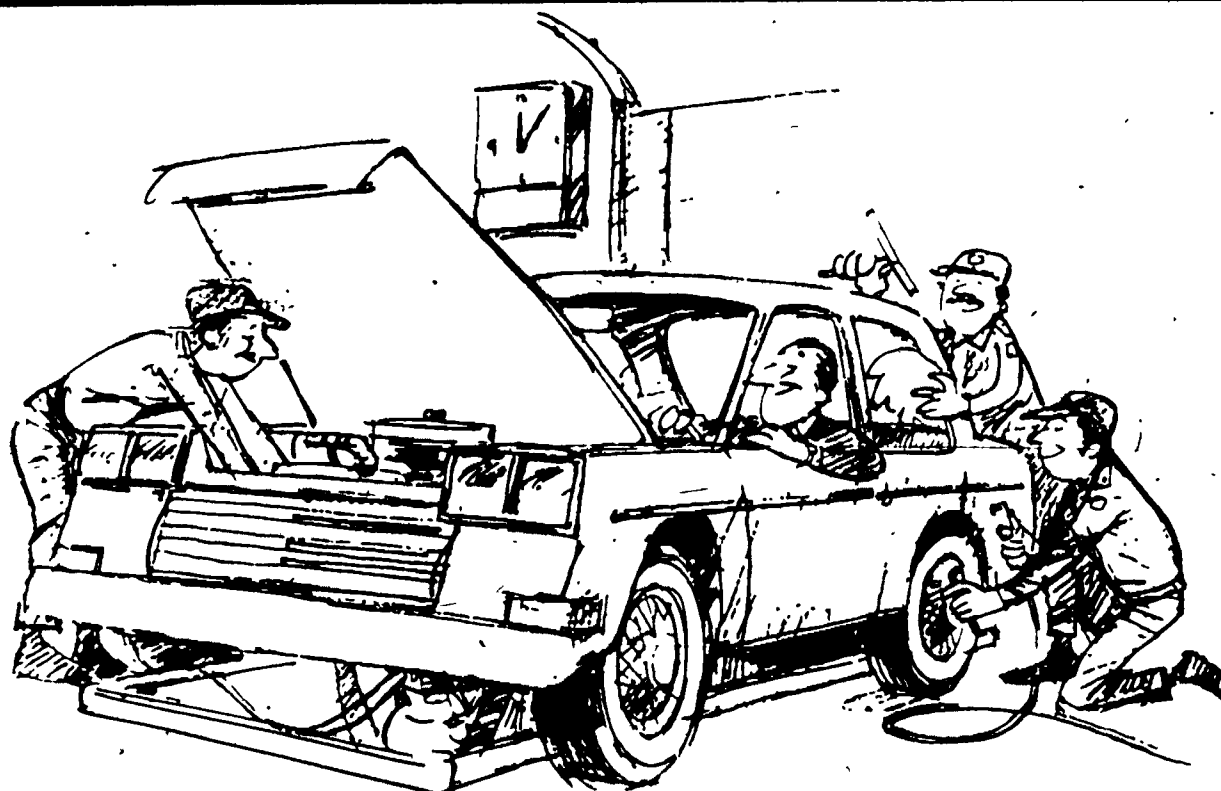

Horton 32, works at Long's Plumbing in Northville and Henderson, 26, is a Northville resident. While both said they enjoyed the competition, they did admit to working a bit to finish. Horton finished in five hours and 45 minutes and placed 365th out of 700-plus entrants. Henderson finished in five hours and 53 minutes and said she had no idea in what place, "I finished, that's all I know."

Horton and Henderson are training partners all year round, running each morning separately, but getting together most afternoons to ride in Hines Park. Then there's swimming in the evening. The regimen is tough but they both said they enjoy the training and laugh a lot during their trials together.

Horton is married and has two children and the hours he puts in training are definitely beyond the comprehension of most couch potatoes. He's up every morning at about four to five miles and eight miles, then to work by seven for a 10 hour day. After work it's a trip to Hines park for a bike ride of a minimum of 25 miles or so. If he can squeeze it in, he'll spend the evening swimming as well.

Henderson is married and leads the same type of life. She's up at about four for a run of four-nine miles, leaving the afternoons for longer runs, biking and swimming. She works at EDS in Southfield and always works more than 40 hours a week. The two easily destroy the myth about the only people who exercise being those who stay home all day.

They both plan on participating in the Endurathon again next year, and are currently concentrating their training on getting ready for the upcoming Detroit marathon. Throughout the year the two compete in triathlons. The Endurathon is really a specialized triathlon.

Working out isn't new for either of

the athletes. Horton has been a consistent jogger for years, and Henderson was a tennis player in college who began running to stay in shape for that sport.

"I read about triathlons and I wanted to see if I could do it," she said. The Endurathon was twice the distance she normally competes at and so was a bigger challenge. "It was tough," she said. The day was a rainy one and that made the bike race particularly hard, Henderson said. She had a nasty spill at one point but managed to finish the race. "The hardest part was getting back to where I felt okay," she said.

"Triathlons are really growing in popularity," Henderson said. She has qualified for the Nationals in

triathlons for the short distances, which are a one mile swim, 10K run and a 26 mile bike race.

The brother/sister partnership finds that training together keeps them going. "It's good to have a partner, particularly when you're on the bike," Horton said. "When you're riding by yourself the tendency is to cruise along... but with somebody beside you the incentive is there to pick up the pace."

Both athletes find the swimming portion of the triathlon to be the hardest. "The easiest part? Being on the land, I hate the water," Henderson said laughing. "I'm just not a swimmer," Horton agreed.

Both find that mixing the three sports of the triathlon, the swimming, biking and running, seems to

keep them from feeling the sore muscles that can often be the aftereffect of a race. "After Muncie, neither of us was sore," Henderson said. But when she ran 20 miles in preparation for the Detroit marathon, she really felt it the next morning. "Mixing the three events is easier on the muscles," she said.

Both have found that exercising as much as they do has some side benefits. They never have to worry about what they eat, and both remain relatively healthy because they understand exactly what their bodies need in terms of food, water and rest.

When asked if the grueling schedule and the hard work and sweat were really worth it, both grinned and said in unison "I think so." Just a walk in the park, really.

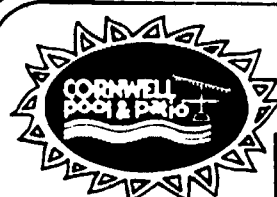

## Fitness Tips

## Hearing fundamental to early development

Hearing is fundamental to the development of speech and language in early childhood. Children enter an explosive phase of language development between 16 and 24 months of age. A hearing deficiency in a child can interfere with development of these skills. Fortunately, most hearing losses are transient and exist for only a few weeks to several months.

These losses are caused by middle ear infections (otitis media), or collections of fluid in the middle ear. This is common in children; about 70

percent of children under three years of age will have one or more episodes of otitis media. Other rarer causes of hearing loss are damage to hearing nerves, hereditary conditions and very premature infants.

Screening for hearing loss is essential for early detection. The earlier the loss is discovered, the better chance for successful treatment. Hearing can be tested at any age if necessary, but routine hearing exams can be done after three years of age.

It is recommended that hearing be assessed and language skills

monitored in children with frequent bouts of otitis media or persistent middle ear fluid.

Routine screening exams for children are generally done in preschool, kindergarten and first grade. Approximately five percent of elementary school-aged children do not pass the initial hearing test. Since some hearing losses may be attributed to infections, children failing the exam should be re-tested several weeks later. The test consists of wearing ear phones and listening to selected pure tones.

Any suspected hearing losses or

language delay should be brought to attention of the pediatrician. The most important point to remember is if your child is developing normally, routine screening is all that is necessary.

# Northville's Autumnfest '88 promises fun for festivalgoers

Northville welcomes the eighth annual AutumnFest to the streets of downtown this Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

This year's festival will include the highly respected Northville Art Market, with over 26 juried artists exhibiting near the Northville bandshell on all three days of the festival.

Planners for this year's festival have made sure that adults and children will have plenty of activities open to them throughout the weekend. Once again downtown merchants have teamed up with community volunteers to put together the festival.

Friday afternoon will see the artists booths open up, with exhibits and sales beginning at noon and running until 6 p.m. The evening's entertainment in the bandshell will be provided by Tom Rice and Friends beginning at 5 p.m. and running until 8 p.m. Rice is the owner of the Giltfiddler Music Store in Northville. All entertainment during the Autumnfest is provided free of charge.

This booth will provide free face painting for children and hair and nail art courtesy of Margo's of Northville.

Saturday will also see artists demonstrating their crafts throughout the day. In addition, the Northville Arts Commission will have its own booth — "Really Bad, but Fast Portraits". # Cider mill now open

The AutumnFest in Northville originally began eight years ago in response to the overwhelming number of people who came to Northville during the fall. Northville's colorful trees and the lure of its cider mills drew people from all over the metro-area on sunny fall afternoons.

This year should be no exception and the two Northville cider mills are already open for those fancying a cold glass of cider or the tempting taste of a cider mill doughnut.

Northville boasts two of the 101 mills in lower Michigan that press ripe apples into cider.

Parmenter Cider Mill is located at 714 Baseline, which may be reached by turning east off of Center Street south of Eight Mile. It is open daily from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.

In addition to cider and doughnuts, visitors may purchase caramel apples, hot dogs and kielbasa on the weekends. Many school groups and senior citizen groups visit the cider mill during the fall months.

Foreman Orchards are located west of town at 50050 W. Seven Mile Road. Hours are 9 a.m.-6 p.m. daily except Sunday when hours are 9 a.m.-7 p.m.

Visitors may purchase apples and pears as well as cider and doughnuts. This year owner Ralph Foreman will be bringing his cider, caramel apples and doughnuts to sell during the weekend of AutumnFest.

(Definitely stop by and take a look at his book.) The complex varied flavors of Catalan cooking will open your eyes to the truly amazing variety of Spanish foods.

Paella is one of Spain's most wonderful, peasant dishes. Yet the American version of paella is one of those things you feel like you're supposed to be impressed with but almost never are. Why? Because the paella served in most American restaurants is all "flash", with none of the "substance" which makes real paella so great. "American paella" - a fancy expensive crown of seafood sitting on a flavorless bed of yellow Uncle Ben's rice is absolutely NOT what paella is all about.

The two most important parts of a true paella are the rice and the saffron. To make a real paella, and more importantly a good paella, you have to use real, short grain Spanish rice, and real top quality saffron. If you substitute Uncle Ben's rice and either a low grade saffron (which more than likely isn't saffron but marigold or turmeric) you can add all the fancy ingredients you want, but the end result will be NOT be paella. What you will have is "boiled yellow rice with seafood".

There are hundreds of paella recipes in Spain today - every one has their version of the "best". The original paella came from the area around Valencia (not surprisingly, Spain's major rice growing area) and to its two primary ingredients - rice and saffron - were added only snails, eels, and green beans. Today "Paella Valenciana" adds chicken and green peas to the original version and drops the eels. There are also vegetable paellas, seafood paellas, rabbit paellas ... the list is endless. But as writer Peter Feibleman puts it, "... the true answer to what really goes into a Levantine paella is usually rice, saffron, and whatever happens to be fresh and cheap at the market".

The bottom line on Paella: Start with real Spanish rice and the finest saffron, add just about anything else that's good and follow any basic recipe for paella (see Penelope Casas' Food and Wines of Spain), and you can make a truly delicious paella right at home.

"Like many great dishes, paella is a poor man's food that has become the rich man's treat." ..... "It is said that if you ask 100 average male Spaniards what really goes into a paella you will get 100 different answers; but if you ask 100 Levantines, you will get 300 answers, each man giving one for himself, one for his grandmother and one for his wife."

### Spain's "Liquid Salad"

Gazpacho, as it is made in Spain, is certainly one of the best cold soups you'll find anywhere in the world. But the gazpacho that most Americans know - made up of big chunks of vegetables - neither looks nor tastes like gazpacho in Spain. Like paella, there are hundreds of versions of gazpacho. But the basic original Andalusian recipe calls for little more than ripe tomatoes, white bread, olive oil, wine vinegar and garlic, all of which are pureed into a beautifully smooth red liquid. Some recipes call for the addition of cucumbers or peppers, and garnishes range from croutons to all sorts of diced vegetables. But no matter what's in it, gazpacho is always smooth textured. Served very cold it's the perfect starter for a summer meal.

Andalucia is one of Europe's poorest regions, so it's not surprising that gazpacho, it's best-known dish, is poor man's food. The name goes back to Roman times; *caspia* means "remains" and *acho* is derogatory. This chilled soup, thickened with bread and flavoured with tomatoes, garlic, peppers, cucumber, olive oil and wine vinegar, has been adopted by the whole of Spain as a liquid salad."

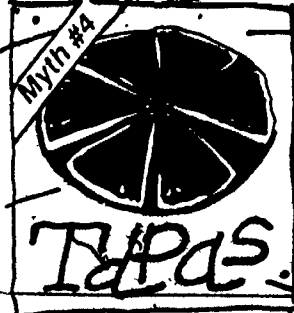


### The consummate Spanish sausage

Since many Americans typically, mistakenly assume that Spanish food and Mexican food are similar, it's no surprise that many assume that Spanish chorizo and Mexican chorizo are one and the same. They aren't. The Mexican version is a fresh, spicy hot, sausage. Spanish chorizo is a cured, ready to eat sausage (more like a salami) made from coarsely cut pork, seasoned with lots of paprika and garlic. Very flavorful, but definitely not at all "hot".

The Spanish use chorizo for just about everything. Cut into thick slices and eaten as is for snacks or a simple tapa (chorizo is thought by many to have been the original tapa), chopped and added to soups, stews, paellas, casseroles or tortillas (in Spain a tortilla is an omelette, not something to wrap around refried beans). Some like their chorizo younger and softer, others prefer it hung and dried like a hard salami. Regardless, chorizo is one of the most essential and delicious parts of eating and cooking in Spain.

### The world's greatest bar food

To a Spaniard, the term "tapas bar" would seem an unnecessary redundancy. In Spain all bars, by definition, serve tapas. In some bars you'll find little more than the basics - chorizo, "Jamon Serrano", Manchego, some olives or almonds. But in the best bars you will be greeted by an array of "tapas" dishes spread out the length of the bar. Just about anything can be a tapa - simple or complex, hot or cold, spicy or mild, meat, vegetables, cheese or seafood. The selection changes depending on the region you're in and the preferences of the chef. Penelope Casas' book *Tapas* gives recipes for over 100 dishes but even this is only a fraction of the items you'll find in Madrid on any given night. You simply sit at the bar and order up small plates of any item you wish to sample.

Since anyone in Spain rarely eats dinner until after 10.00 pm, tapas serve to help get hungry Spaniards through the early evening hours. Here in North America, tapas are a great way to entertain. Tapas parties are a tasty and interesting change of pace. You'll also find that many tapas dishes are easily transformed into the

main dish of a meal simply by increasing the portion size. As you get to know more about tapas, you get to know more about the Spaniards - both their lifestyle and their eating habits.

Four years ago if I mentioned "tapas bars" to an acquaintance I consistently provoked a puzzled and sometimes frightened expression. "Why would a nice guy like you want to go to a 'topless bar'?" was the inevitable reply. Today with "tapas bars" springing up across the country and having been written about in dozens of articles and books you might be forgiven for thinking that tapas were some new ultra modern craze. They aren't. Tapas have been an everyday affair in Spain for decades. No one is 100% sure where or how tapas originated. The generally accepted theory seems to be that tapas developed first in Andalusia where slices of chorizo or Jamon Serrano were served "gratis" on top of each glass of sherry (Andalusia is sherry country) to keep the flies out. The verb "tapas" means "to cover", hence the term tapas. Try tapas for yourself.



### The most unique spice in the world

Everything about saffron lends itself to mystery and myth. Bought by royalty round the world for prices which make it the world's most expensive spice...harvested only one week out of the year, and then only early in the morning...sold in tiny glass jars filled with thin red gold filaments...it looks unlike any other spice in the world. It's no wonder that for most Americans the thought of buying (let alone using) saffron is more than a little intimidating.

At Zingerman's we've discovered that buying and using saffron is nowhere near as overwhelming as some people would have you believe. Despite all the misinformation which is circulated about saffron, the "facts of saffron" are pretty straight forward.

#### A) Saffron is not as expensive as you think

Nobody's saying that saffron is cheap mind you. It is after all the most expensive spice in the world, checking in at about \$2000/lb. But do you know how long it would take you to use a pound of saffron? Well you could prepare paella for six people once a week for about 30 years before you'd have to start looking for your next pound!

**A 1/4 gram vial of saffron can season a dinner for 6-8 people for under \$2.00. An affordable luxury for most of us..**

#### B) Saffron is not that hard to use

To season a dish, sauce or soup with saffron you need to do one of three simple things: Steep the saffron in hot liquid (water or oil) to release the flavor. "Toast" your saffron lightly in a pan or in the oven. Then crush or crumble the threads.

Or easiest of all Use powdered saffron! Ready to use right from its foil packet. Nothing could be easier.

#### C) Finding good saffron is not as hard as it used to be

Over the centuries saffron buyers have frequently fallen prey to disreputable merchants substituting all sorts of things for authentic saffron. But buying good saffron today is a lot easier for all of us thanks to Fernando Morillo. Fernando's saffron, packed under his Celemin Label, is always 100% pure Mancha quality saffron - never adulterated, never treated. It has a beautiful deep red color and unique aromatic flavor. Buy Celemin Saffron and guarantee yourself saffron as it ought to be.



### The True Story

To most Americans sherry is a sweet parlor aperitif consumed primarily by little old English grandmothers. Forget that concept. Nothing could be further from the truth. Hardly any of the sherry you'll find in Spain is sweet. And very little of it is consumed by little old ladies.

The most widely consumed and to many people the best sherry in Spain is Fino. Fino has an extremely dry, nutty flavor and is very light in color. Fino, which is always served very cold, is about as popular in Spanish bars as draft beer is here in the States. You need only try a cold glass of good Fino one time to realize that Harvey's Bristol Creme is not what sherry drinking is all about.

Amontillado Sherry is a touch sweeter and richer than Fino. Like Fino it is drunk as an aperitif. Oloroso is the richest and darkest member of the sherry family and is consumed primarily after the meal. The sweet cream sherries which are so popular in England and America are produced primarily for export. If you see them in Spain its usually in bars frequented by tourists.

We can't sell you any sherry at Zingerman's. But good sherry is such an integral part of Spanish eating that we couldn't pass up the chance to set the record straight. Take home a bit of Manchego or San Simon, some of Zingerman's roasted Spanish Almonds and enjoy them with a cold glass of Fino. Your image of Sherry will be changed forever.



### try this salad!

Serves 2

Having eaten it regularly for the last two or three years I will wholeheartedly vouch for this salad.

- leaf lettuce - torn into bite, size pieces
- 1 ripe tomato - cut into 1" cubes
- 1/4# San Simon cheese - cut into 1/2" cubes
- 1/8 # Zingerman's Spanish almonds - coarsely chopped
- 2Bastani Spanish pimentones (roasted peppers) - coarsely chopped
- Lerida extra virgin olive oil
- sherry vinegar
- freshly ground black pepper

Fill individual salad bowls with the lettuce. Add tomatoes, then the San Simon, the almonds and the pimentones. If you like, add a few olives too (but absolutely not the ones from the can). Dress with olive oil and sherry vinegar and black pepper to taste.

Be sure to have some good bread on hand to soak up any leftover oil and vinegar.

### Los Quesos de España

At Zingerman's we've been talking about, eating and enjoying Spanish cheeses for half a dozen years now. And with each passing year we win over more and more converts to what we think are some of Europe's best and most unique cheeses. From Manchego, the most famous of Spanish cheeses, to more obscure local specialties like Mahon and San Simon, traditional Spanish cheeses are nearly all extremely flavorful. Traditional methods of production, the frequent use of sheep's and goat's milk in much of the country, the varied tastes and terrains of the many regions of Spain all have helped to maintain high levels of quality and flavor in Spain's traditional cheeses. They have also kept the cost of Spanish cheese relatively high -- Spanish cheeses are costly even in Spain itself. But because Spanish cheeses are so full of flavor and character a little bit goes a long way. Treat yourself to a bit of Manchego, a little San Simon or a wedge of Idiazabal -- no matter which you try you'll be startled at how unique and delicious it is. At least ask for a taste -- you'll be glad you did.

Manchego is to Spaniards what cheddar is to us -- the first thing that comes to mind when one thinks of cheese. As with cheddar -- there is no one single Manchego -- each Spaniard prefers their Manchego at a particular age. Some like it younger when it is softer in texture and milder in flavor. Others prefer "Manchego Viejo" aged for over a year to bring out the full sharp, tangy flavor, clearly different than any of the world's other great cheeses. And like Americans and their cheddars, Spaniards eat Manchego in just about every imaginable way -- in sandwiches, in casseroles, at bars (as a tapa of course), after dinner.

Manchego must, by law, be made exclusively from the milk of Manchega sheep, and it must be made within the borders of La Mancha in central Spain. The rind of each wheel is pressed to give the cheese its characteristic "woven" surface. Manchego has a fantastic full flavor, the sheep's milk giving a distinctive salty tang. Slice it off the wedge and enjoy it as it is. Cook with it. Or serve it after dinner, as the Spaniards do, with slices of "Membrillo" (the traditional "preserve" made from quince.) The salty tang of the cheese contrasts amazingly well with the sweetness of the membrillo. If you've never tried Manchego, now's the time to go for it.

Smoked for hours over birchwood, San Simon has a beautiful smooth chestnut colored rind. Cut into it and you'll find a semi-firm golden paste with an incredible, rich smokey flavor. Magnifico!

## Glossary

**corned beef** - a salted beef, as often sold to a good delectation and 2 Zingerman's is among the best. Corned beef is made from a brisket of beef, salted and packed in a brine. The term "corned" is derived from the fact that the salt is in the form of coarse grains or "corns".

**pastrami** - a traditional Jewish delicacy, made from beef or pork, salted and smoked. It is often served on a sandwich.

**smoked meat** - a variety of meats, including brisket, pastrami, and corned beef, that have been smoked for flavor.

**is it kosher or is it Lox?** - when you're testing your palate, remember that Lox is salmon which is kosher, while a hot pastrami is not. Lox is a delicacy made from salmon, salted and smoked. It is often served on a sandwich.

**Swiss cheese** - a variety of cheeses, including Emmentaler, Gruyere, and Swiss cheese, that are made in Switzerland.

**Russian dressing** - a dressing made from mayonnaise, sour cream, and horseradish. It is often used on sandwiches.

**Breads** - one of our most popular items, we have a variety of breads, including rye, pumpernickel, and challah.

**Rye bread** - Zingerman's rye bread is made from rye flour and is a staple of our sandwiches.

**Pumpernickel** - a dense, dark bread made from rye flour. It is often used for sandwiches.

**Challah** - a traditional Jewish bread, braided and often topped with eggs. It is often served with soup.

**Boudin's Sourdough** - a sourdough bread made from rye flour. It is often used for sandwiches.

**Bagels** - a traditional Jewish bread, often served with cream cheese.

**Mustard** - Zingerman's mustard is made from mustard seeds and is a staple of our sandwiches.

**Pickled Peppers** - a variety of pickled peppers, including jalapenos and serranos. They are often used as a condiment.

**Pickles** - a variety of pickles, including dill pickles and bread and butter pickles. They are often served with sandwiches.

**Lattes** - a traditional Jewish dessert, made from potatoes and apples. It is often served with a dollop of cream.
