## Rose Walters' salary

While the Northville City Council recently approved a general 6-percent increase in administrative salaries, one notable position was left off the list.

The recommended salary for City Manager Steven Walters, a member of the three-person personnel committee that recommends salary adjustments, will be decided by council members Carolann Ayers and Jerry Mittman.

Ayers and Mittman expect to present a proposed city manager salary at the council's May 22 meeting. But city officials had said when Walters was recently considering a position as Plymouth city manager, that the manager was due for a raise.

The Northville manager had been asking Plymouth for a salary "considerably in excess of" \$60,000, according to Plymouth City Mayor Dennis Billa. Walters said then that Northville officials were prepared to offer him a "competitive" salary to have him stay.

Walters now earns a base salary of \$55,578 and an additional \$800 yearly in longevity pay.

## City sets salary levels

The Northville City Council agreed Monday night to a tentative administrative salary schedule for the 1989-1990 fiscal year, though the agreement was not unanimous.

The salaries were proposed by the city's personnel committee, made up of council members Carolann Ayers and Jerry Mittman, and City Manager Steven Walters.

Under the proposal, administrative positions in the public works, building and clerk's departments would receive a general 6-percent increase in their salaries. The deputy city clerk, Tonni Burns, would receive a 10-percent raise, to \$25,542, in acknowledgement of her recent certification as a municipal clerk.

The main point of contention in the salary structure was the proposal that the city's public works superintendent, Ted Mapes, would receive a 9-percent salary increase. The raise is in acknowledgement of Mapes' "unique role and responsibilities," Walters wrote in a report to the council on the proposal.

The public works foreman would receive an 8-percent raise "to continue to adjust to comparable salaries," he wrote.

The superintendent's salary would be raised to \$48,670 by the proposal, and the foreman's salary to \$31,200.

Walters explained that in other communities, the public works superintendent is often lower on the

## Police officer layoff still topic of discussion

Northville City officials continue to debate the impact of a proposed layoff of a patrol officer from the city's police department.

The layoff is one of several moves planned to balance the city's budget in the wake of a sharp increase in refuse collection costs.

"I understand that austerity programs are required, but I have a problem with laying off a police officer over refuse expense," said Police Chief Rod Cannon.

"The uncertainty has an impact on morale," he said.

In his April 26 report to the council on the proposed layoff, Cannon said current staffing levels are within the normal range for police departments in the region.

Cannon also pointed out that the police staff at Northville Downs during the racing season is only 7-8 officers per night. That number has been reduced from 15 in the past six years, he said.

If the department's budget had to be cut, Cannon urged the council to consider a summer layoff only, rather

than the layoff of a year-round officer. He also suggested a central dispatch operation with Northville Township to further reduce costs.

City Manager Steven Walters suggested an integrated patrolling system with the township, to avoid having the racetrack service take the brunt of police budget cuts.

"It's really an unsettled point; it's not set in granite," said Cannon after the council's decision. "We'll be getting back together."

Cannon and Walters said the police department had also agreed to explore ways to reduce the department's overtime budget by about \$20,000. That figure is 20 percent of the department's estimated \$100,000 overtime budget for the 1989-1990 fiscal year. "We agreed to go back and look at it and see if

there's any way to reduce it," the police chief said.

But, he added, "to live within the body of the (police union) contract requires a certain amount of overtime."

"What we're really looking for is casual overtime, something that can be cut closer to the bone," he said. While court time and sick leave are unpredictable and therefore hard to estimate, leaves such as vacation time can be scheduled to avoid unnecessary overtime costs.

According to Walters, the city has no set plan for addressing the potential shortage of police officers for the 1990-1991 racing season.

"We've got six months to plan that, and that's the plan, to figure something out and deal with it accordingly," he said.

In the short run, until October, it's not really a problem. We're somewhat overstaffed for the summer period."

In explaining the layoff, Walters pointed out the police department is the city's largest single expenditure. The department represented 35 percent of the city's general fund expenditures in 1989. "It's more practical to cut a small part of a large item than to cut half or almost all of a small item," he said.

The police cuts were only recommended after the city studied several potential budget cuts, Walters added. "That was studied internally in terms of where the least real impact on the taxpayer would occur," he said.

"It's a political judgement by the administration and the council that the taxpayers as a group will be best served by that adjustment, and will

## Haller says voters prefer city library

The former Northville Township resident who donated a 72-acre, \$3-million parcel to the township as a construction site for a public library said Tuesday that the library should remain in the city.

Frieda Haller, in a telephone interview from her home in Sun City West, Ariz., said the defeat of a May 1 township library millage request indicated that residents of the community want a city-based library.

"I think the big issue is that the people wanted the library in the city and not in the township," she said of the nearly 2-1 vote against the library proposal. "As far as I know, they are dealing with the Ford building right now."

Haller said she felt the library plan and letter of intent she signed Sept. 25 with the township was "a closed issue."

"I think the contract will be null and void," she said. "The library on that property depended on a vote and it was turned down."

Haller cited the proposed building's size and location as reasons that the millage request fell. She also said she had no plans to alter the size of the building in an attempt to make it acceptable to the community.

"It (44,800-square-foot) was just the right size," she said. "I didn't just pick that size out of nowhere. I saw the Bloomfield Township library."

"I'm awfully sorry about the vote."

When asked if the property might be donated to the township for purposes other than a library, Haller responded: "If they don't need it for a library, they don't need it for recreation."

But Haller wavered when asked if the township might have an opportunity to gain title to her land.

"I don't have to make my mind up right now," she said. "It (land) goes to me. Nothing really changes, but it goes back to me."

"It all depends on how everything works out," she added. "This has (caused) a lot of turmoil."

Haller said the 72-acre parcel remained in her name, despite the intent letter.

"I still pay the taxes," she said. "I'm still getting the tax bills."

According to township tax records, the December tax bills for the two adjoining parcels that constitute Haller's donation were sent to the township, as per the guidelines of the September intent letter.

As of Tuesday, the bills — one of \$5,831.42, the other \$2,598.24 — had not been paid, according to tax records.

Haller said she was not aware of possible township plans to place the library question on the Aug. 7 primary ballot.

"As I said, the contract is null and void. I don't promise anything (now)," she said. "I don't know what is going to happen next."

## Board may seek new library vote

Despite a nearly 2-1 defeat at the polls May 1, the Northville Township Board of Trustees may make another attempt to gain voter approval of the Haller library millage request.

Trustee James Nowka said Tuesday that he will support a move to place the issue on the Aug. 7 primary ballot during the board's meeting this evening.

"I think people looked at this as a tax issue and not as an issue of the location or size of the building," Nowka said. "We didn't respond to Jeff Hampton (of the anti-Haller library Citizens For a Better Northville) and I think the people took out a lot of frustrations at the polls."

"I still feel we should go back to the voters one more time before we say

it's a done deal," he said.

To place the issue on the Aug. 7 primary ballot, wording would have to be approved by 4 p.m. May 15. The Board would have to act on the matter this evening or schedule another meeting before that date.

Nowka said he felt township voters rejected the Haller proposal because of frustration over assessment increases and the recent income tax deadline.

"The opposition focused on the most meaningful thing (money) to people at that time," he said. "Maybe we picked a bad time for the election. I think it would have passed any other time."

Nowka said his opinions were personal and did not necessarily reflect the feeling of the board.

## Treasurer post open for primary

A recent change in election laws will require township Treasurer Betty Lennox to run for her post in the August primary.

Lennox, a Republican who was appointed to the treasurer position Dec. 1, must gather petitions by 4 p.m. May 15 and face Republican challengers in the Aug. 7 primary.

Township Clerk Tom Cook said it was discovered May 4 that Lennox was obligated to run for the part-time position she obtained after former Treasurer Richard Henningsen resigned to take the township manager job.

"I sent (Deputy Clerk Eunice Switzer and Registrations Official Jeri Moak) to a state elections seminar in Dearborn last Friday," Cook said. "They found out about a change in the law that meant the treasurer would have to run in the general election."

Cook said state law now dictates that an official appointed to an elected position must run in the general election if the election

is at least 182 days after the appointment.

"We have never had to use this before," Cook said. "We wanted to get the word out."

Cook said anyone wishing to run in the August primary must obtain the valid signatures of at least 52 registered township voters by 4 p.m. May 15. The maximum number of signatures the township will accept is 205, Cook said.

Lennox said she learned about the new election guideline Monday.

"I'm going to get my petition filled out," she said. "It's the legal thing to do."

Jeff Hampton, of Citizens For a Better Northville, the group that worked to defeat the May 1 library millage proposal sponsored by the township, said his group would not promote a candidate for the treasurer position.

Hampton ruled himself out as a treasurer candidate.

"Absolutely not," he said, when asked if he was interested in the job. "I like what I'm doing too much here."

**HEINTZ TO RUN AGAIN** — Wayne County Commissioner Susan J. Heintz (R-Northville) has announced that she will run for a third term on the Board of Commissioners.

Heintz serves as vice-chairperson on the 15-member commission, and serves on the Committee on Roads, Airports and Public Services. She is a former clerk and supervisor of Northville Township and resides with her family in the township.

"I have been proud to serve the people of my district for the last four years as their representative in Wayne County government and as vice-chair, serving all of the people of Wayne County. So much has been accomplished, yet there is much, much more to be done," Heintz said.

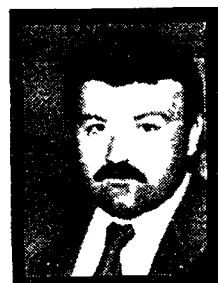

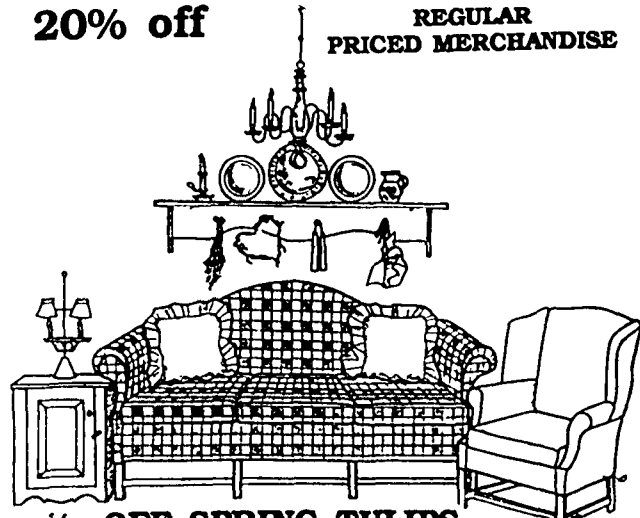

Car insurance relief pondered for some

Car owners with bad driving and accident records may save a few dollars under a House-passed bill awaiting state Senate action.

House Bill 4159 would exclude so-called "comprehensive" coverage (theft, vandalism and glass breakage) from "merit" ratings (accidents and moving violations) by auto insurers.

"If your car was vandalized, we want to make sure you're not surcharged," said an aide to the

sponsor, Rep. Mary Brown, D-Kalamazoo.

The aide testified last week before the Senate Commerce Committee. Sen. William Faust, D-Westland, voted with the majority to report out the bill, S-0.

The bill was welcomed by Sen. Michael O'Brien, D-Detroit, who said, "Having lost two windshields to trucks, I'm told all I gotta do is get one more comprehensive claim and I'm canceled."

A spokesperson for the Michigan Insurance Bureau said insurers would be unable to cancel policies because of comprehensive claims, although they could charge the car owner a higher deductible.

The bill is on the Senate calendar this week. If adopted, it would become law in April 1991, allowing small insurers time to change their forms.

# Candidates apply for police post

The vacant chief of police position in Northville Township has attracted 18 candidates as a May 25 application deadline nears.

Township Manager Richard Henningsen said last week that advertisements were placed in newspapers and publications across the state May 1 in a search for a successor to former chief Kenneth Hardesty.

Henningsen said advertisements will run until May 14 in Traverse City, Grand Rapids, Kalamazoo and Detroit newspapers; police periodicals; the Michigan Townships Association magazine; and through the Michigan Employment Security Commission and National Association for the Advancement of Colored People publications.

Job qualifications include a bachelor's degree requirement with preference for a master's degree in criminal justice or a related field. Also required is a "minimum eight years with progressively responsible experience in law enforcement or criminal justice system, with strong management abilities . . ."

The salary range for the position is listed at \$42-\$52,000, based upon experience and qualifications, Henningsen said.

Henningsen said he will receive direction on the police chief interviewing and hiring process at tonight's Board of Trustees meeting.

"The Board has to tell me what to do, but the idea may be to get learned individuals — retired police chiefs — to sit as an interviewing and consult-

ing panel," he said.

Henningsen said the board also may decide to use a consulting firm to help locate a police chief.

"It's up to them," he said. "They will give me the direction."

The Board has set a July 1 hiring date for a new chief.

Hardesty resigned his post Dec. 7 after an investigation by the township attorney alleged that he had improperly sold a township weapon.

Captain Philip Presnell has served as acting chief since Hardesty's departure.

Presnell said Monday that he had not decided if he wanted to apply for the police chief position.

"Yes, I'm interested, (but) there are a lot of things to keep in perspective," he said. "I'm considering all my options."

Henningsen said the new police chief would most likely work under a one-year contract but did not rule out the potential for a longer agreement.

"I suppose they could work something else out, if the Board wanted to go in that direction," he said.

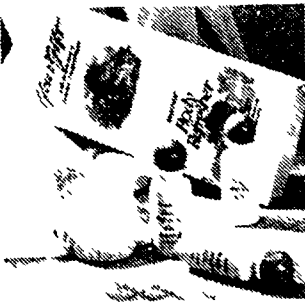

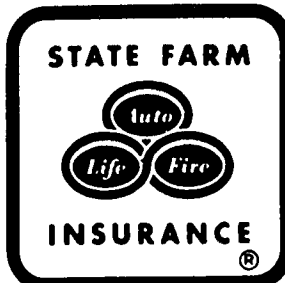

## Seven Mile mall may reopen soon

Roofing repairs may allow a local mall to reopen for business, according to a township official.

Repairs to portions of the Northville Plaza Mall on Seven Mile, east of Northville Road, have progressed rapidly since the mall was ordered closed March 9 by Wayne County Circuit Court, said township Chief Building Official Mick Kruszewski.

"The last I saw, everything was looking good," Kruszewski said Monday. "The contractor is doing a good job."

Portions of the mall were closed in March because of a lack of maintenance, Kruszewski said. He noted that Christopher Redding, the owner of the mall, was ticketed on 10 occasions because of faulty roofs and other maintenance problems.

After the March closure, Redding was given until May 9 to repair items listed by the township.

Redding did not respond Tuesday to a request for comment on the maintenance project at Northville Plaza Mall.

Kruszewski said the contractor,

J.D. Chandler Roofing of Detroit, should be able to meet that deadline.

"They're working pretty fast and are almost done now," he said.

But the repairs have not occurred without incident. On May 1, the township fire department responded to a call that part of the mall's roof had collapsed.

According to Kruszewski, a bit of overzealousness on the part of the contractor caused the May 1 problems.

"They were working without a permit," he said. "They were up there on that rusted, leaking roof and they started ripping things up. Things were falling in the (Martinizing) cleaners."

For failing to obtain a building permit, the township billed the contractor twice the normal \$156 permit amount.

The repair work will be thoroughly inspected before the court order is lifted, Kruszewski said.

"I'll see how the roof deck is and see that it is done properly," he said. "They took out some gas lines ... and we'll see that everything is put back together by the final inspection."

## Police continue kidnap probe

Township police findings on an alleged kidnapping case involving a 1-year-old child have been sent to the Wayne County Prosecutor's office for review, according to a police official.

Acting Police Chief Philip Presnell said Tuesday that the prosecutor has requested a meeting between township Det. Fred Yankee and Christopher Roberts, 22, who has alleged that two gunmen abducted his daughter Brittany from him outside the Northville Township condominium of his aunt April 15.

"The prosecutor wants to set up a meeting between the detective and the complainant" to help determine if there is a case, Presnell said.

The meeting should take place in a "week or so, when they get everybody together," he added.

Roberts told police that two gunmen kidnapped his daughter the evening of April 15. Roberts, a Macomb County resident, was separated from his wife at the time, and had forcibly taken the child from her mother during an altercation at a Sterling Heights shopping mall March 29.

Roberts said he and the child

stayed with friends and relatives until the alleged April 15 kidnapping.

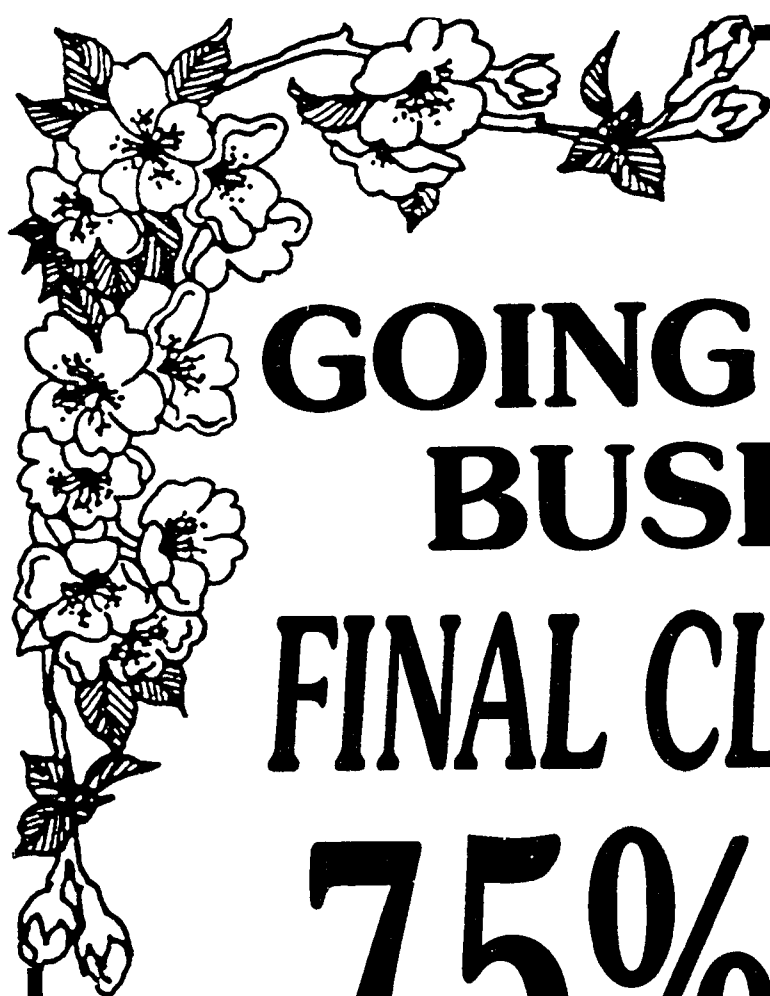
Roberts also alleged that his wife's father, Doug Allor of Utica, accompanied the gunmen at the time of the incident.

Allor later denied Roberts' charges and said Roberts willingly gave the child over to two men who were serving him show cause papers which originated from a custody battle between the parents of the child.

Brittany Roberts was located with her mother by township police the day after the alleged abduction. The two reportedly were in hiding at an undisclosed Shelby Township location.

Presnell said Roberts has not dropped charges against the men. If the prosecutor determines that the charges are legitimate, those involved with the abduction may face kidnapping, assault and commission of a felony with a handgun charges, he said.

Yankee said last week that the two men who allegedly accompanied Allor to pick up Brittany had not been identified.

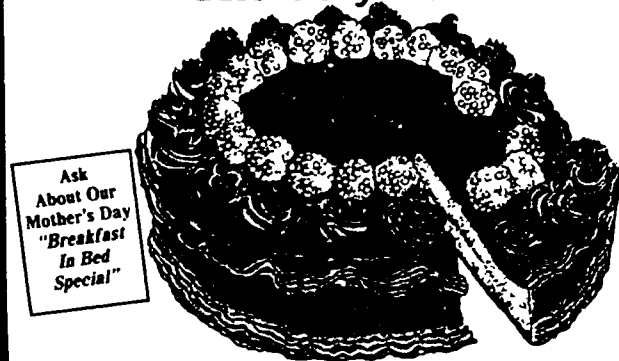

## Council agrees to six-percent hike in some salaries

administrative chain of command than in Northville. "The public works superintendent is in many cases a person supervised by another department head," he said.

In Novi, for example, the superintendent is overseen by a public services director, and in other communities the superintendent is given direction by an engineering office.

"In our case it's somewhat the reverse, where Ted is supervising the city engineering office," Walters said. Mapes is often involved in planning and general management decisions, he said.

The city's police chief and captain would receive a 5-percent salary increase under the proposal, which is in line with the city's recent settlement with the Command Officers Association. The increase would raise their salaries to \$47,840 and \$43,430 respectively.

In justifying the increase of only 5 percent for the police, the committee noted the department had recently received a better retirement package, after the police unions agreed to drop a cost of living adjustment (COLA) system.

"This makes the City's benefit package more in line with those of other area local governments, most of which have a better retirement system than our current one, and also no longer have COLA provisions," the report read. "From the City's stand-

point, the retirement system is a stronger incentive for retaining employees than is the COLA formula."

"It's a significant improvement with real compensation to the people involved," Walters said.

"With their allowances, the salary is actually higher," said Mayor Chris Johnson.

But Council Member Paul Follino disagreed with the proposed salary structure, particularly the fact that the police positions received a smaller increase than public works positions.

In making its recommendations, the personnel committee surveyed salaries of similar positions in other area municipalities.

This salary review is actually for the 1989-1990 fiscal year, and is proposed to be retroactive to July 1, 1989. Administrative salaries were last adjusted July 1, 1988.

"The issue in timing is union negotiations," Walters explained. "We didn't settle with the last police group until January."

The city has typically postponed decisions on other salaries when labor negotiations are protracted, he said.

"That probably won't be the case next year," Walters said. The city has already begun negotiating with several unions, and police contracts will not need to be renewed for several years.

"This is as late as it's ever been, though it's been this late before," Walters said.

## Source of creek pollution found

Officials at the state Department of Natural Resources (DNR) believe they have found the culprit in a recent contamination of Randolph Drain that left the creek reeking of chlorine and littered with dead and dying fish.

But because the contamination was done accidentally, no charges are expected to be filed in the case.

According to Margaret Fields, a field inspector for the state DNR, the culprit in this case is the Northville Swim Club at 646 Baseline Road. Fields examined the site and found "environmental evidence that indicates that the discharge came from a stormwater pipe to which the swim club pool is connected."

"The contractor they use is in the habit of discharging into the storm sewers, which is no problem as long as the water does not contain chlorine or other additives or detergents," she said. But the water in this case did apparently contain chlorine.

Fields said she had talked with swim club officials, who were unaware the drainage had caused any damage. "They were unaware of the impact they were having, so no enforcement action is planned on being taken at this time," Fields said.

"I view this as an accidental discharge."

Swim club officials could not be reached for comment by press time.

The field inspector described the contamination and fish kill as relatively minor in one way. "It's not minor in terms of the environmental impact," she explained. "It's minor in the sense that it's not an ongoing (problem). It's one that was not done with the intent of harming the environment, and one that we can correct."

Fields said her department would notify both the swim club and Northville High School to advise them of the proper way to empty such pool water. The high school was not involved in last week's contamination.

Fields said that creeks and waterways are often contaminated by

homeowners in the fall, when they drain their pools. Pools should not be emptied into storm drains or surface waters unless the water in the pool no longer tests positive for chlorine, she said.

The contamination was first noticed late Saturday, April 26 by six-year-old Emily Ott of Randolph Street. Her father, city firefighter Stephen Ott, reported the damage to city police that evening.

Ott and City Police Capt. James Petres observed a chlorine odor coming from the creek but were unable to locate the source at that time. "The odor seemed to dissipate the further upstream we got," Ott had said.

Petres had found a pool at the club drained and drainage hoses leading from the pool when he inspected the area Tuesday, May 2. The pool is not connected to the sanitary sewer system, Petres said, but instead dumps directly into a storm drain which runs into Randolph Creek. "Under certain conditions it's allowed," he said of the drainage system. But the water that is typically drained into the creek is free from chemicals.

"At this point, it looks like we found it," Petres said last week while the investigation was still underway. "Hopefully it won't happen any more."

# Local educator honored for her work with school

Dolly McMaster, Northville Public Schools assistant superintendent for Instructional Services, has been selected as a Science and Technology Quest Honor Roll recipient.

McMaster was one of 30 state educators to receive the Michigan Technology Council's award at an April 27 ceremony in Ann Arbor.

"It's a very nice honor," she said Monday. "As I sat there and listened to the people involved . . . I thought This is bigger than all of us."

The Science and Technology Quest brings Michigan business peo-

ple and educators together in efforts to make math, science and technology more exciting for students, according to the Michigan Technology Council (MTC).

McMaster said she accepted the award on behalf of Bell, Parker, and the teachers in the school district.

"The day-to-day, nitty gritty performance of the teachers — elementary teachers in particular — is just outstanding," McMaster said. "They

# South Lyon mayor considers county post

South Lyon Mayor Jeffrey Potter is considering running for the 24th District county commissioner seat that will soon be vacated by John Calandro, R-Now.

If he decides to run and wins the spot, Potter, who was elected as mayor last November, could leave his mayoral post in January — 10 months before his current two-year term expires.

Potter last week mailed out nearly 70 letters to South Lyon City Council members, local officials, supporters and homeowners seeking their input on whether he should run for the open office.

"The responses back from the people (who received the letters) have been highly favorable and they are encouraging me to run for the position," Potter said. "I'm not going to run headfirst into a buzz saw. I want to make sure I'd be supported and have a chance to win if I do run."

So far only Kay Schmid, of Novi, has filed for candidacy for the position. All candidates must file for candidacy on or before Tuesday, May 15.

Schmid is a Republican; Potter would run as a Democrat.

The 24th District includes the City of Novi, Novi Township, part of the City of Northville, South Lyon, and Lyon Township.

Calandro has served as 24th District county commissioner since 1981 and has opted not to seek reelection for the spot. His two-year term expires Dec. 31.

In a prepared statement sent to each community in his district, Calandro said he is leaving his position because of family, personal and job-related reasons.

Potter said he was urged by several unnamed constituents to run for the county position. Plus, he saw that there was an opportunity to win in the election.

"So far Kay Schmid is the only person who is an actual candidate. She'll run unopposed if no one else runs for the office," Potter said. "It's not often that a county seat is uncontested in an election."

"Here's a situation where I can run and have a chance of winning. But the question I have to ask myself is: Can I run now and stand a chance of winning, or should I wait and stand little chance of winning?" Potter continued.

In the letter sent out, Potter explained: "If I do not run, it is likely to be won by a Novi area resident, who would be difficult to challenge in subsequent elections."

During the upcoming election, slated for Nov. 6, Potter believes he would have a good chance of winning.

"The person who I'd be running

against (Schmid) apparently doesn't have much experience. Her only connection with politics is through Republican committees," he said.

Schmid, a Republican, has served as chairperson of the Michigan Week Festivities Committee for the City of Novi, and as treasurer of the Novi Civic Center Planning Committee.

She started as a Republican precinct delegate from 1977-78 and is a founding member and vice president of the Republican Women of West Oakland.

In January 1989, Schmid was elected as one of four people in the state to sit on the Michigan Republican State Committee. She also has been elected to and served as Novi city director, and southwest area director.

Potter believes his experience outweighs Schmid's, despite being the city's mayor for only six months and a

council member for two years.

Besides being mayor, Potter is a Michigan Municipal League delegate, the South Lyon representative for Southeastern Michigan Council of Governments and the local representative for Community Economic Development Advisory Council, a division of SEMCOG.

Potter said his fellow council members are in support of him running for the post. He does not believe, however, that he would become a lame-duck mayor if he chooses to run for the office.

"Not at all would I become a lame-duck mayor. I have a highly supportive council and I would continue to be a highly effective mayor if I choose to run for the office," Potter explained.

Potter, in his letter, cited his job responsibility at Ford Motor Co. as one reason he'd like to become a county

commissioner.

"I am happy to serve as your mayor and believe we are making real progress toward the goals outlined in my campaign. My effectiveness is somewhat limited by the fact that the pay for this position — about \$500 per year — limits the amount of time I can take off my job for public service," he wrote in the letter.

"The position of county commissioner would pay about half of my present salary (currently, a commissioner's yearly salary is \$19,198), enabling me to go to part-time status on my job and devote two to three days a week to working on problems in our area. It would increase my effectiveness in growth and planning areas, regional transportation, grant availability, landfill siting and waste issues and other areas. It would also help to build a bridge of common interest to the township and provide

much better access to the overall political system," he concluded.

By becoming the 24th District Oakland County commissioner, Potter said he could be a great asset to the City of South Lyon and Lyon Township.

"I would no longer be mayor of South Lyon, but I'd be the county representative for South Lyon and Lyon Township as well as for the other communities in the district. By becoming commissioner, it would actually enhance my service to the city," Potter explained.

Council Member Keith Wells said there is much merit to Potter's consideration of a county commissioner seat.

"I definitely have support for him. He's doing a doggone good job as

mayor and we need some representation at the county level. I think Jeff's the man to do it," Wells said.

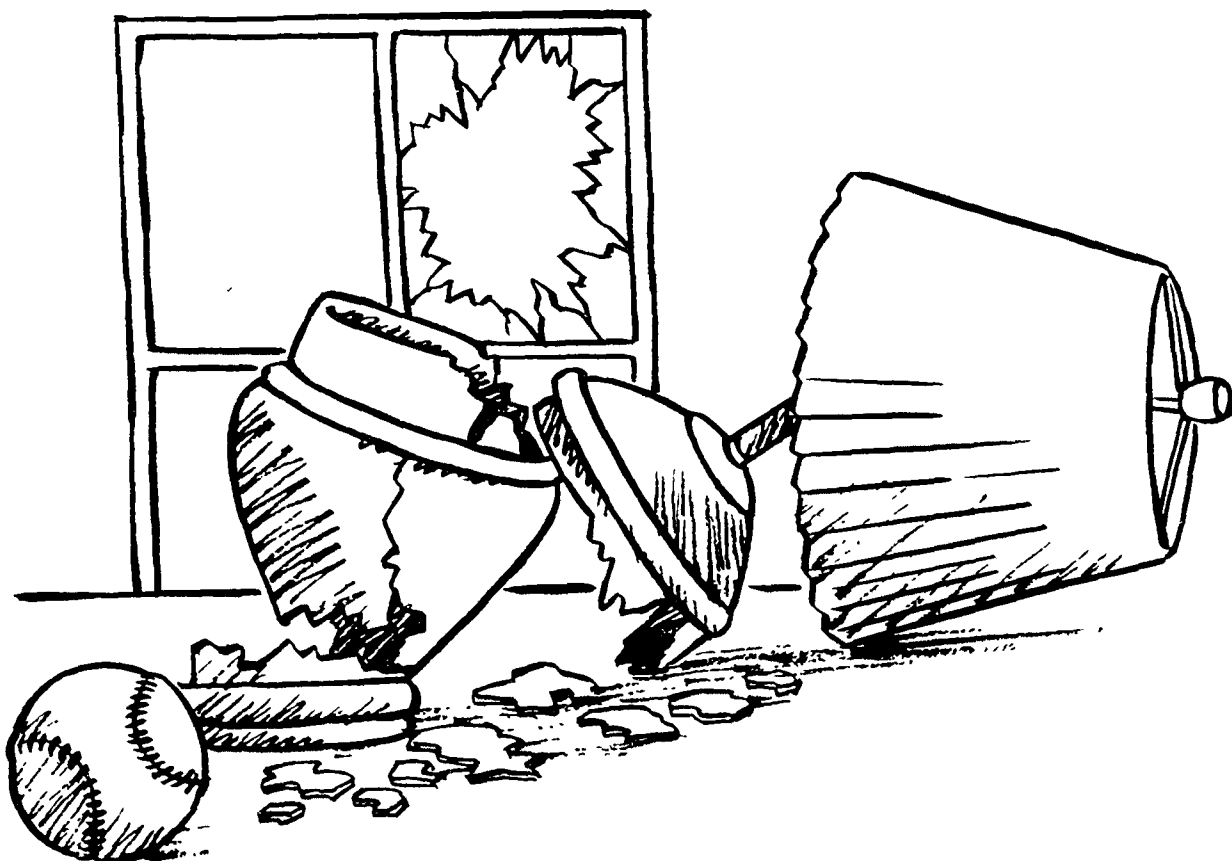
"I'd call us (South Lyon) the forgotten town of Oakland County. I think Jeff can do something about that image. He would be beneficial to all of us and he'd be all for one, one for all," Wells continued.

Council Member Eileen Isotalo also had words of support for Potter and said he could be an effective leader as commissioner.

"I feel he has a lot of energy to bring to the county commissioner's position. He's well-suited for public office and excels in public relations," Isotalo said. "He has innovative ideas with problems that need to be addressed. I'm sure he'd run an effective campaign for county commissioner."

be least impacted by the loss of that service," he said.

"For example, we can't cut refuse collection 10 percent. How can we go around and collect 90 percent of what's set out?"

Other departments that were examined for potential cuts were fire and public works. Walters described the fire department as a "bare-bones volunteer operation," and said much of the public works budget is paid for by street repair and other bonds.

Walters said there is no legal minimum staffing level for the track, other than the union agreement that at least three regular officers be stationed there. According to pari-mutuel racing law, the city is merely required to provide "adequate public safety and other public services for the protection of property and persons at or near the racetrack."

"It really isn't fair for us to cut the police at the track," Walters admitted. "It doesn't mean, though, that we're going to cut back on police patrolling. Hopefully, we'll maintain the service level staffing that we have."

Walters said the city would consider "operating economies" like shared dispatching services with the township to reduce costs.

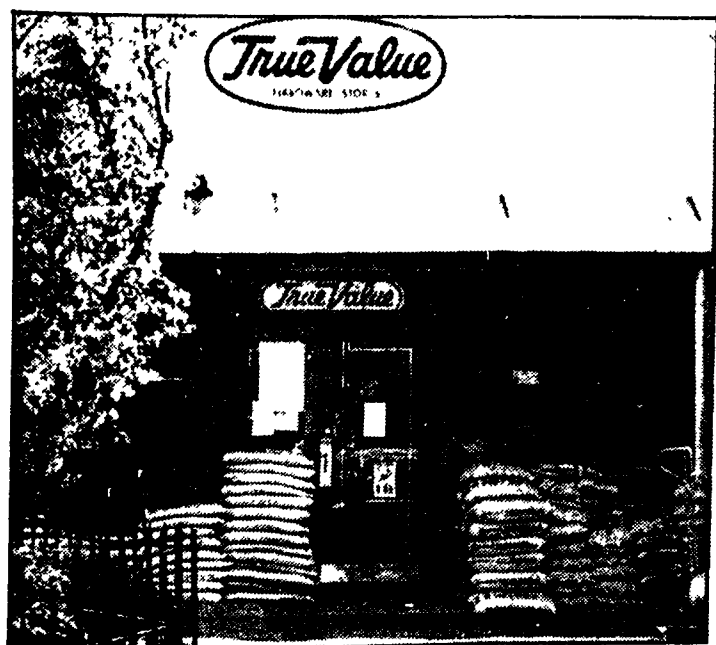

# Ordinance violation haunts city

A violation of the city's zoning ordinance by a local business last year has returned to haunt city officials.

If the city and the owners of Black's Hardware cannot come to an agreement, the outside display of goods behind their East Main Street store may bring store owners Robert and Donna Black and Northville City officials together in court.

Charles Altman, the city's ordinance enforcement officer, first observed the hardware store's outside display of goods including wheelbarrows and lawn mowers April 4 this year. He stopped at the store and notified Black that the display was in violation of the city's zoning ordinances. On April 9, Altman found the items on a flatbed trailer, with price tags in-

dicating they were for sale.

Altman issued Black a citation for the violation.

"This memo is to update a problem that seems to be starting all over again," he wrote the council on April 11.

"I believe we're taking the position that we're going to let it go through the court system," said building inspector Joseph Attard last week. "Mr. Altman's position is that we should get a decision from the court one way or another. That way we'll know who's right and who's wrong."

Said Altman, simply, "We just wait until they set a court date and we go."

City attorney James Kohl said he has signed a request for a complaint and warrant on the case, and the request was scheduled to be delivered to Robert Black by city police. "A

ticket was issued and then the court requested that I sign a complaint and warrant, and that was done," he said. "We've taken the steps necessary to bring it to court."

Black could not be reached for comment on the case, and did not return a call from the Northville Record by press time.

Last year, Black had requested permission to display bags of materials like potting soil, water softeners and ice melters, and wheeled goods, after a run-in with city officials. He

was granted permission to display bagged goods for a four-month period last year. But that permission has not been renewed.

But despite a show of support by members of the business community, Black's request to display wheeled goods was denied.

Section Nine of the city's zoning ordinances specifies that "sidewalk sales, outside display of merchandise is prohibited except under conditions of special approval by the City Council."

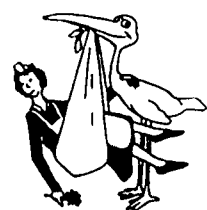

# Suspected Corvette theft boss to face charges

A man suspected to be the head of a classic Corvette theft ring was apprehended April 26 by the Southwest Oakland County Auto Theft Unit based in Novi.

Robert Michael Kelly, 29, was arraigned in 52nd District Court on auto-theft-related charges stemming

from two Milford incidents and is suspected of nine other classic Corvette thefts in southwest Oakland County.

"We think Kelly is at the top of the theft ring, and he may have ties with large organized groups," said Novi auto theft Detective Ron Roy.

At the time of arrest, Kelly was already under investigation by state police, the Western Wayne Auto Theft

Unit and the FBI.

The Southwest Oakland County unit arrested Kelly at his Detroit residence after his fingerprints were found at the scene of an April 2 classic Corvette theft on Sleeth Road.

Kelly allegedly broke into the garage and removed a tarped 1966 show car valued at \$45,000, which the unit is currently trying to locate.

The Detroit man was arraigned

April 27 in front of Judge Brian MacKenzie on charges of breaking and entry and auto theft. Kelly waived his right to a preliminary exam, and bond was set at \$500,000 cash.

The auto theft unit later linked Kelly to a Jan. 17 attempted Corvette theft in Milford Township via his fingerprints.

He was arraigned on a second set

of charges, breaking and entering and attempted auto theft, on May 3 in front of Judge Harold Bulgarelli.

The judge reduced bond in the first case to \$150,000 with a 10-percent option and set an identical bond in the second case, against auto-theft unit recommendations.

But Kelly is on parole for previous auto-theft crimes and cannot be re-

leased until a parole violation hearing is set.

Roy said that Kelly's alleged auto theft ring is suspected of operating in the area since at 1985, and five Novi Corvette thefts are being investigated for possible connections.

Roy said that the ring focuses solely on show-quality Corvettes from the '50s and '60s.

Nowka said he spoke with Frieda

Haller Tuesday after he learned that the donor of the 72-acre, Six Mile and Sheldon Road plot had been interviewed by the Record.

"... She didn't know about the potential for a separate election," he said. "At this point, she feels that the

people have spoken and that they have a larger interest in the Ford Plant. She feels the next move is the city's."

Haller did not seem interested in the idea of an August election, Nowka said.

"From her point of view, if the city wants to build in the city, they should," he said. "(Personally) I can't support the Ford Plant and never could."

"To me, the only place for a library in this community is Six Mile and

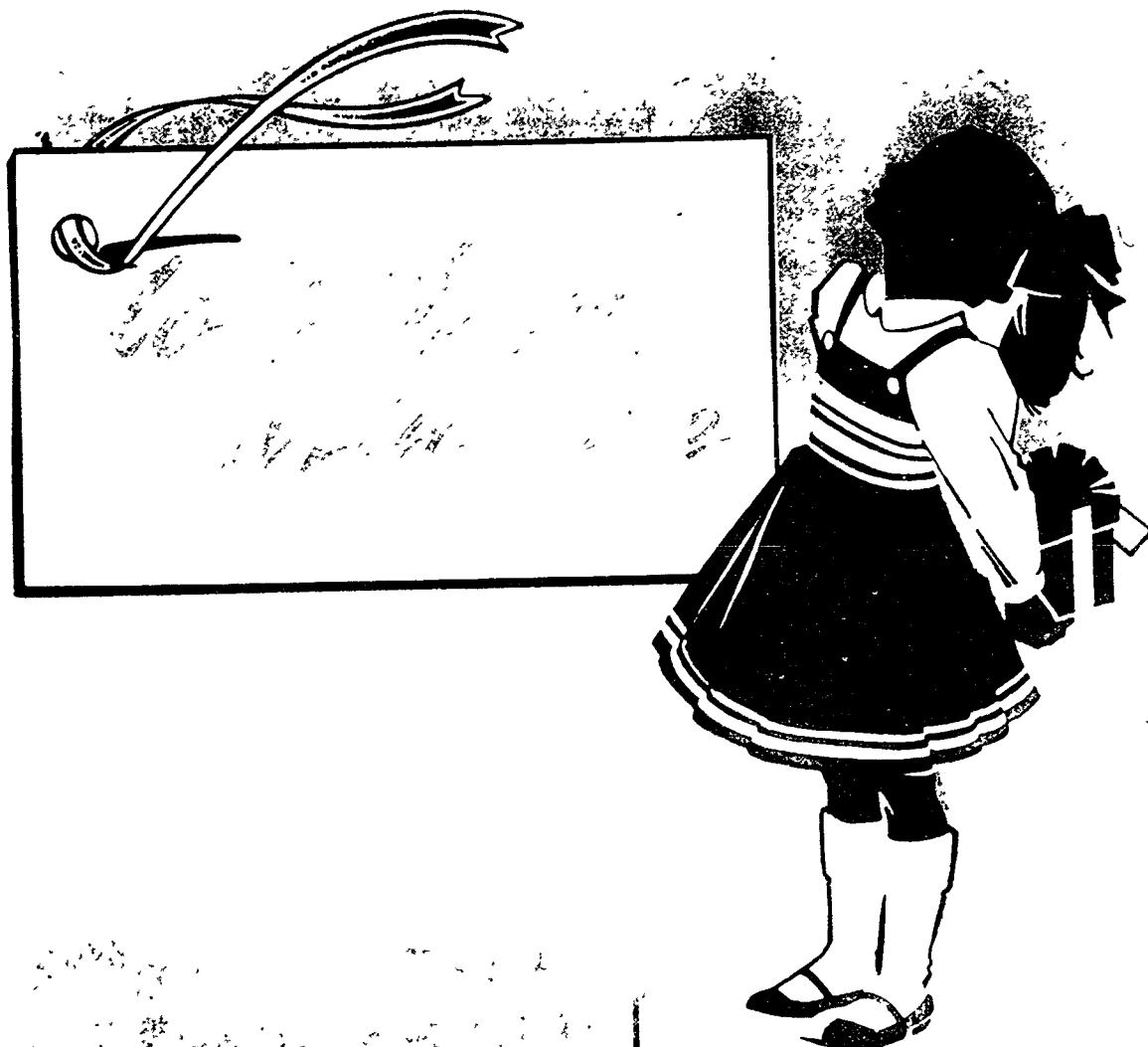
Sheldon. That is the best site. We still have until Sept. 25 to get something done."

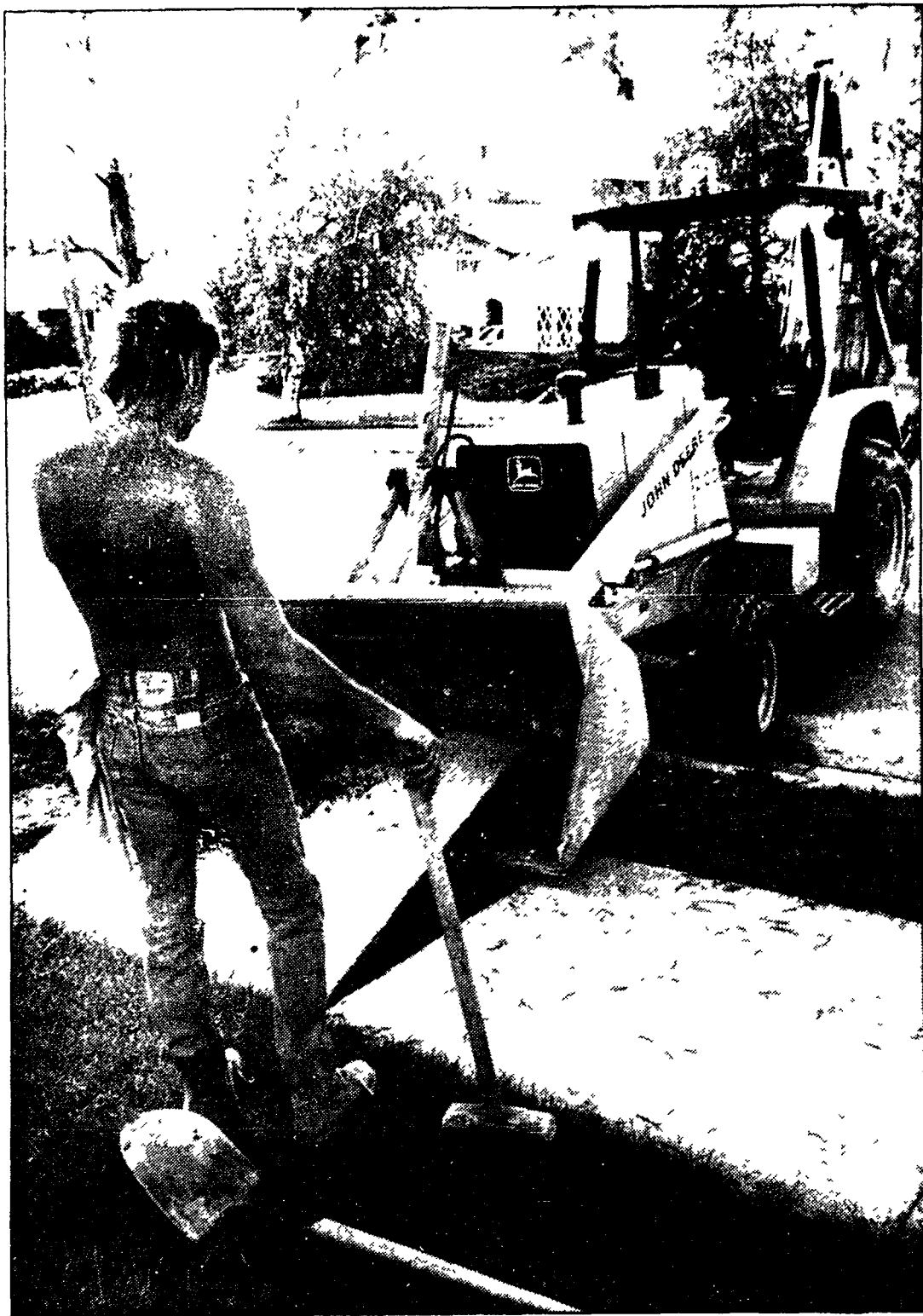

## Sidewalk plan steps taken

Northville City's extensive sidewalk repair program is underway again this year. The program has nearly doubled in size since its start last June.

The work is being overseen by the city engineering firm of McNeely & Lincoln. Suzanne Pangborn, project manager of the sidewalk repair program, said repairs are now being done on the southwest side of the city. The program will move to Bealton toward the end of May. "We'll be working mainly in that area for a month or two," Pangborn said.

From there, workers will move to the northeast side of the city and work their way west.

According to a city ordinance, property owners must pay for all repairs to public sidewalks adjoining their properties, unless the damage was caused by city work or by trees growing between the sidewalk and the curb. "But if the trees are between the sidewalk and the house, that's their responsibility," Pangborn said.

She estimated the average cost per homeowner at \$200, depending on the condition of their sidewalk.

The repair program was begun last July, and ran through November. This year the work began April 16.

"Hopefully, we'll get it all done this year," Pangborn said. "We're getting an earlier start."

The entire program was estimated to cost \$250,000 last year, of which the city was expected to pick up \$40-50,000. But new damage and more requests by homeowners have nearly doubled that figure.

"We've kind of blown that out of the water," Pangborn said of the original cost estimate. "There's so much that needs to be replaced that those figures are no longer true. Main line sidewalks are pretty bad in Northville."

Some of the damage has been caused by tree roots, Pangborn said, though much is due simply to the age of the sidewalk. "In places it's 40-50 years old."

According to City Manager Steven Walters, \$199,356 was spent on the program last season. An estimated \$250,000 will be spent on the repairs this year.

"The residents added quite a lot of private work to what we had marked," he said.

Residents can hire a private contractor for the repair work or leave the job to the city's contractor, Frank Sinelli Cement Co. If a private contractor is used, the property owner must obtain a construction permit from the building department, the work must be done to city standards, and it must be completed before the city contractor begins work in the area.

Residents do not need a construction permit if the city contractor does the work, and may pay the cost out over a five-year period, with interest charged at the 7-8 percent rate obtained on the assessment bonds funding the program. The balance may be paid off at any time to avoid further interest charges.

The contractor also does private work including driveways, driveway approaches and convenience walks in connection with the repair program.

Notices are left on residents' doors five to seven days before repair work in the area is scheduled to begin.

While the work is in progress, peo-

ple are asked not to park on the street between the construction hours of 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Residents who are having driveway repairs done should also avoid leaving vehicles in their driveways, or risk having them blocked by the new construction.

Concrete on sidewalks should not be disturbed for 24 hours after it is poured. Concrete on driveways should not be disturbed for seven days.

Three areas are slated to receive new sidewalks this year. They include Eight Mile Road between Center and Taft, Novi Street between Eight Mile and Allen Drive, and Griswold from Main Street to Mill Race.

But the city has put on hold a controversial plan to install new sidewalks throughout much of the city, after extensive citizen protest to the plan last year.

According to officials, the city council will probably not raise that issue again until after the budget hearings are complete.

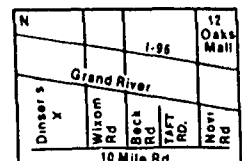

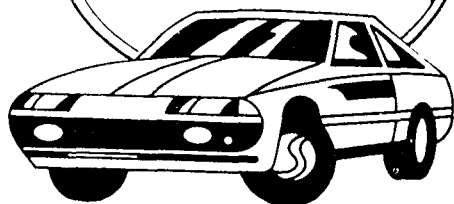

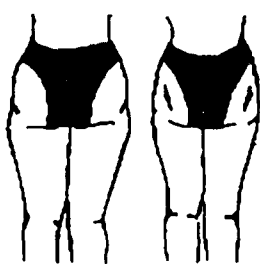

# Mind games

## Local students in competition

In what may well be an unprecedented move, two Northville Odyssey of the Mind teams will be moving on to the world competition in Ames, Iowa at the end of May.

While Northville officials at first thought only one team would go on from the state competition, the second team was added after a scoring challenge was settled.

The Odyssey of the Mind Recycle team, which includes Brandi Beckwith, Eric Campton, Bob Fox, Austin Kurtis, Greg Last, Ben Romine, Brynn Wade, and coaches Sharon Romine and Linda Last, took first-place honors at the State Competition on April 28 at Central Michigan University. The team now advances to the World Finals May 30-June 2 at Iowa State University in Ames.

The team and their coaches have been working since October to find the most creative solution to their Recycle problem, one of five different Odyssey of the Mind problems presented at the competition. They were to develop a non-verbal communication system to guide blindfolded team members to collect trash, avoid obstacles and sort the trash into their appropriate bins. These seven team members chose to act out their solution to the theme of Wizard of Oz.

The Wizard, their dispatcher, was the only team member without a blindfold. He directed his blindfolded collectors (the Scarecrow, Tin Man, and Cowardly Lion) and blindfolded hauler (Dorothy) around a park and through a course laden with trash and obstacles with the use of sounds (hitting a pan, wood, and pipe and honking a horn) — no sounds from the mouth were allowed.

The team members accumulated 180 points out of a maximum 200. The team was judged on the creativity of their 35 pieces of trash, 10 obstacles, hauler's system, method of communication and their ability to pick up all 35 pieces of trash without touching obstacles and sort them in the Emerald City Recycling Center all within an eight-minute time limit.

The judges were especially excited about the team's trash. To carry out the Oz theme, the team created Tornado, Witch, and After Oz trash. The team spent many days with papier-mache pulp up to their elbows in creating their black and white Tornado Trash (before color) of tornado funnels, broken chair, window, door, and roofless house. Their Witch Trash were hats, brooms, cauldrons, flying monkeys and witch heads, fingers and hands all painted in gruesome green. Their After Oz Trash was a diploma, heart, medal, ruby slippers, and yellow bricks. The Oz team knew they each had a heart, a brain, and courage and so all those symbols were just trash in the end.

The Oz team was required to make their obstacles according to certain

size requirements. They created rain (for the Tin Man), fire (for the Scarecrow), his own tail (for the Lion), and poppies (for Dorothy).

The Recycle team's second competition of the day involved their quick thinking to a spontaneous problem. The team was given two minutes to respond with as many creative answers as possible to a question given to them at that moment. They were able to come up with 36 answers before their time ran out. Their question was "Name combinations."

The Recycle Team and the Structures in Harmony team, recently admitted to world competition, will be representing Northville and Michi-

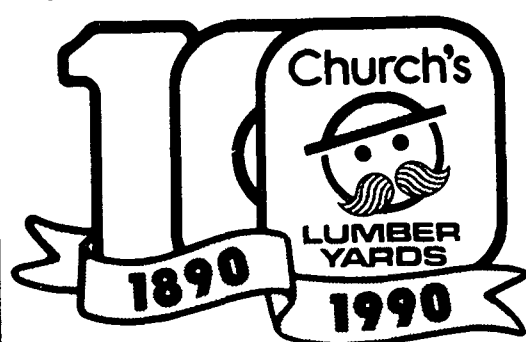
gan's 10,000 Odyssey of the Mind members at the 1990 World Finals in Iowa. They will be competing against teams from 48 states in the United States as well as teams from Canada, Hong Kong, Japan, Mexico, People's Republic of China, Pakistan, Philippines, Poland, Soviet Union, and West Germany. 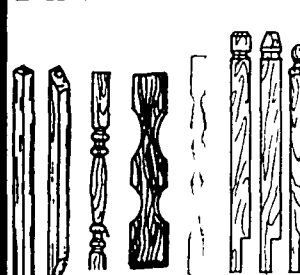

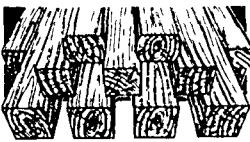

## Authors to sign books

Best-selling authors and Michigan residents William X. Kienzle and Loren D. Estleman will be signing their latest novels at Borders Book Shop in the Novi Town Center on Saturday, May 12, from 2-3 p.m.

Both Kienzle and Estleman write mystery novels which take place in Detroit. Though both authors incorporate in their books places and events familiar to Detroit Metro area residents, Kienzle's stories center around Catholic priest and amateur sleuth Father Robert Koesler, while Estleman speaks through the hard-bitten streetwise detective Amos Walker.

Kienzle, who spent 20 years as a Catholic priest, was formerly the editor-in-chief of the Michigan Catholic. After leaving the priesthood, Kienzle began writing mystery novels, including his first best-seller, *The Rosary Murders*, published in 1979. He has gone on to write eleven mysteries featuring Father Koesler, and has recently published another, *"Masquerade."*

In his latest novel, *Father Koesler* agrees to serve as a consultant for a mystery writer's conference. Both the priest and the students are shocked when a real murder takes place at the conference. The suspects include the other conference speakers: a rabbi, a nun, a monk, and an Episcopalian priest — all successful mystery writers, and each of whom hated the murder victim. Father Koesler becomes enmeshed in a convoluted tangle of emotions and motives, but uses his understanding of the human heart to discover the murderer.

Amos Walker, the detective featured in *"Sweet Women Lie,"* Estleman's latest work, employs his usual street-smart methods in an explosive revenge story. When Walkers ex-wife reappears after several years, he soon finds himself playing a cat-and-mouse game.

## Scout Building parking discussed by city council

A proposed parking lot behind the Scout Building at 215 Cady Street remains in the planning stages, while the Northville City Council tries to agree on the amount of parking needed at the site.

The building is to be used by the Senior Citizens program and local scout troops. The Senior Citizens group must vacate its present facilities at Cooke School by May 31, which is being reopened as a middle school.

A two-week survey of senior citizen parking at the Cooke School facility, found that as many as 34 people drove to the center each day. About half had handicapped stickers on their vehicles.

At the center of the discussion Monday were two proposed parking plans from Rich and Associates, the city's parking specialists. The drawings, labeled "Scheme A" and "Scheme B," would provide 52 or 31 parking spaces respectively.

The drawings are scaled-down versions of the company's original proposals, which were rejected by the council after recent protest by residents.

City Manager Steven Walters first recommended that the city build the 31-space parking lot along the west and south sides of the building. The lot would use 70 feet of the property behind the Scout Building, leaving 216 feet free for green space, and have exits on both the east and west side of the property.

There was no council support for the plan to build a 52-space parking lot that would leave 156 feet of green space at the back of the property.

The city council split over the

amount of parking actually needed at the site, with members Carolann Ayers and Paul Folino arguing for at least 31 spaces originally, and Jerry Mittman and Dewey Gardner arguing for fewer.

The discussion also received considerable input from parents anxious to preserve the green space as a community play area, who attended Monday's meeting.

Joan Wadsworth, a Dunlap Street resident, said "I think sometimes we underestimate our senior citizens. I wonder if it might be reasonable to consider holding off on the parking lot until we see the use of the building."

Judy Kohl, another local resident, argued that the senior citizens would find a way to the program with or without parking at the site. "Necessity is the mother of invention," she said. "We're not talking about idiots here, we're talking about senior citizens. I think they can cross the street."

But Walters argued that the senior citizens' needs had to be taken into consideration. "I think the issue is basically barrier-free access for people of limited mobility," he said. "I think we would be astounded if someone else were to suggest something like (not providing parking on the site)."

Recreation Director John Anderson countered arguments that Cooke School parking is already difficult for seniors, saying, "Any spot that they park at Cooke, they don't have to walk across the street to get to the program. I see that as a problem here."

Anderson also worried that during the fall and winter, when the program is most popular, elderly with limited mobility would have trouble nego-

tiating steps from a parking area across Cady, or crossing the road.

Council Member Jerry Mittman suggested removing an east exit from the parking lot to preserve more green space in front of the building. Though initially agreeable to that proposal, Mittman eventually proposed a reduced parking area along the west side of the lot, to provide 12 to 15 spaces.

But Ayers disagreed with such a reduction. "I can't see not allowing handicapped parking there along the building," she said. "I can't envision not paying anything in back of the building and only paving up the side."

Ayers and Mittman exchanged words over the proposal, with Ayers insisting that some parking needed to be provided behind the building. "We might as well pave over the whole community too," Mittman said sarcastically.

Paul Folino added, "I don't really think we're going to accomplish enough parking facilities by just going along the west side. We're really at a minimum there with just 31 parking spaces. I hate to use the street for counting parking spaces, because other people park there."

"I'm sure that the use of this building for other activities will still require at least 30-31 spaces," Folino added. "There's never been that kind of use before."

The council finally agreed tentatively to a plan drawn up by Walters during the discussion, which was labeled "Scheme C."

"It's a pretty rough drawing, but since it's mine I'll accept it," Walters said.

The plan called for about 20 parking spaces and to make the parking spaces along Cady Street "Handicapped Only."

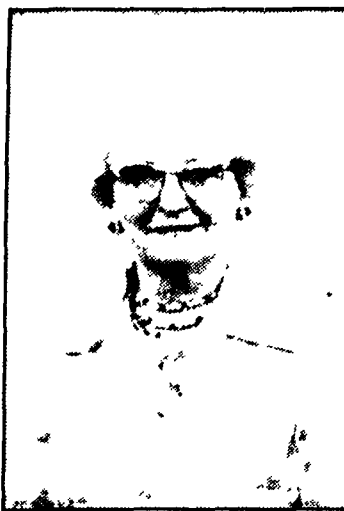

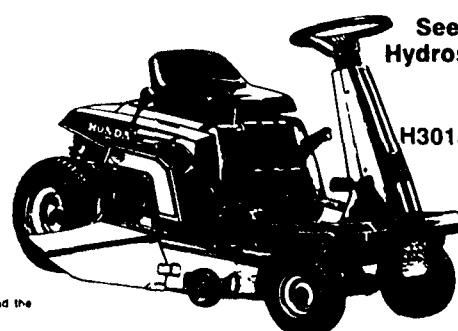

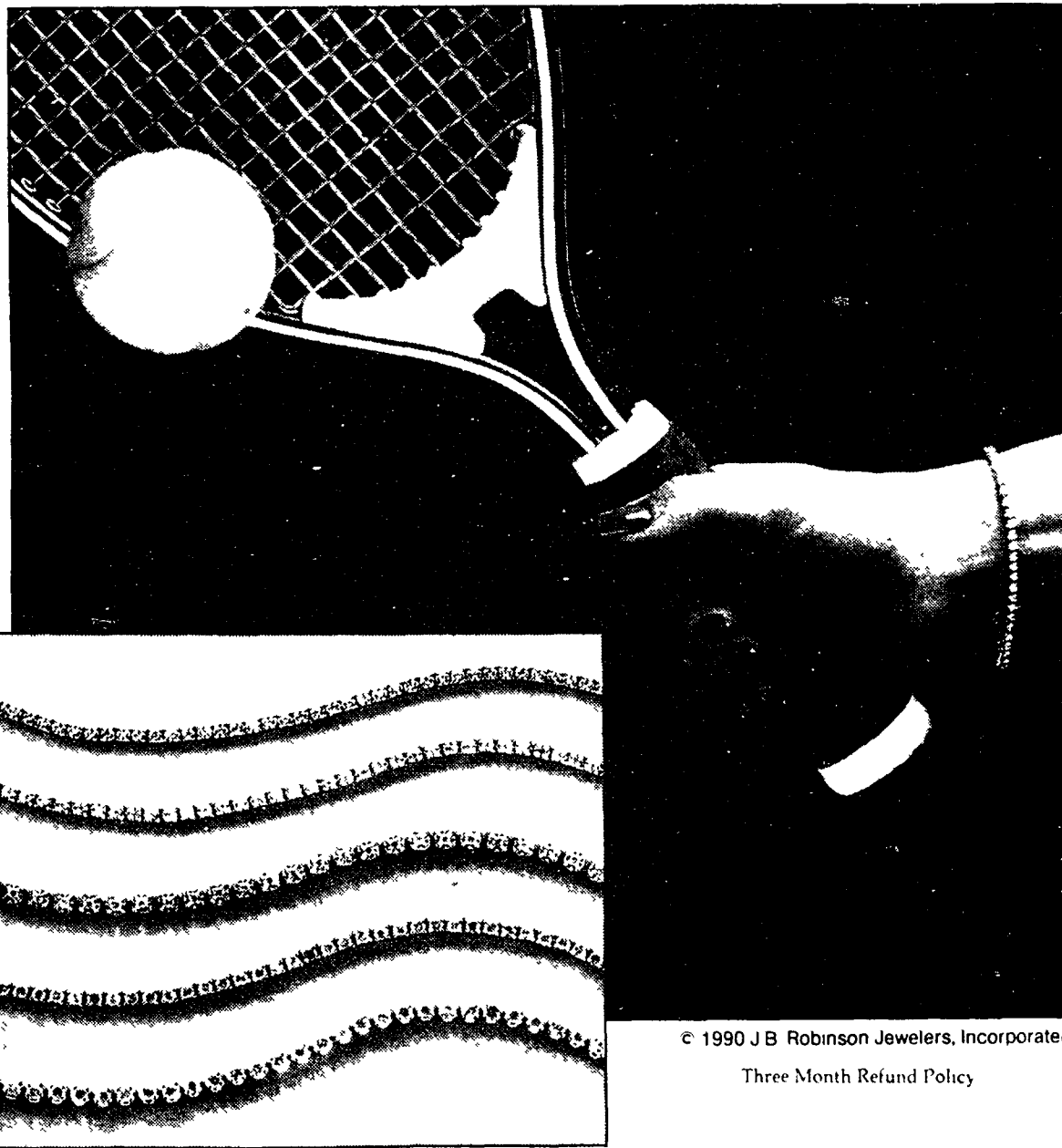

# More aid for growing communities on hold

A bill to guarantee growth communities a bigger slice of state aid ran into a snag in the state Senate — opposition from the Michigan Municipal League.

"The question is, who's gonna pay for it?" MML lobbyist William Davis asked the Senate Local Government Committee last week.

Davis sees other cities, villages and townships suffering if more state aid is automatically funneled to growth communities that take a special mid-decade census and find the population up 15 percent or more.

Committee chair Harmon Cropsey, R-Decatur, postponed a vote on the measure.

An aide to the sponsor, Sen. R. Robert Geake, R-Northville, said Davis had it wrong — no one would lose state aid. The increases to growth areas could be funded by the normal 5-percent growth in state revenue.

At present, communities that take a special census and find growth are entitled to aid increases. But they must fight for them in the supplemental appropriations process. In 1987 Gov. James Blanchard vetoed that bill. The Geake bill would guarantee more aid based on a mid-decade census.

"Not until 1988 were any supplemental appropriations made," Geake's aide said.

If enacted, the bill would have no effect until after special censuses are taken in the mid-1990s.

"Now is the time to do this bill," said Gene Thornton, lobbyist for the Michigan Townships Association, "because we don't know what the gaining cities and townships will be until 1995." Thornton put the current cost of additional aid to growth areas at \$3.5 million.

Geake introduced Senate Bill 520 at the request of Northville Township, whose clerk, Dick Henningsen, supported it in written testimony.

He said the special census helped his township "to forecast with a greater degree of accuracy our expenditures during the development of the community's five-year business plan."

But the "inconspicuous" of the legislative process are making it difficult to project revenue, he said.

Some 38 cities, villages and townships took special

censuses in the 1980s. Geake's staff reported, with Oakland and western counties the big gainers.

Besides Geake's home area in the northwestern corner of Wayne County, winners in Oakland County would be the cities of Novi, Farmington Hills, Walled Lake, Wixom, the Village of Bingham Farms and West Bloomfield Township.

The City of Brighton, at a freeway intersection in Livingston County, also would be a winner. So would two townships in Macomb County.

Others are neighbors of Grand Rapids in Kent, Ottawa and Allegan counties; and resort and retirement areas in the northern lower peninsula, particularly in Grand Traverse County.

## Law runs for fifth term in House

State Representative Gerald H. Law, R-Plymouth, has announced his intention to seek a fifth term in the Michigan House.

As of Wednesday morning, no one else had filed papers for the House seat. The deadline for filing is May 15 at 4 p.m.

Law has represented the state's 36th District since 1982. The district includes the Wayne County portion of Northville City, Northville Township, Plymouth city and township, and part of Canton Township.

Prior to his tenure with the House, Law served for four years as a Plymouth Township trustee.

As a representative, Law has worked for property tax reform. During the current House session, he introduced a bill to reduce property-tax assessments from the current 50 percent of appraised value to 40 percent. He admitted at the time that the bill stood little chance of passing.

Law has also cosponsored legislation to freeze assessments at the prior year's level, and voted for a bill that would limit increases in assessments to no more than the rate of inflation.

"The only real property tax reform since 1963 has been the Headlee Amendment," Law noted. "Unfortunately, that has still allowed residential property tax assessments to take large jumps from year to year. I will continue to seek and work for legislative solutions to this pressing problem."

Law, 45, serves as vice chairperson of the House Committee on State Affairs, and serves on the public health and insurance committees. He is also a member of subcommittees reviewing auto, home and health insurance, infant mortality, nursing homes, steroid and substance abuse.

The representative also serves on the Republican Task Force on Taxpayer's Rights, and Affordable Health Care for the Uninsured.

Before entering the Legislature, Law worked for the Ford Motor Co. He received his law degree from Wayne State University and also holds a master's degree in business administration from the University of Detroit.

Lower-than-expected 1990 Census returns have prompted the Census Bureau to launch an urgent appeal to residents to complete and return their questionnaires as soon as possible.

Dwight P. Dean, regional director of the Census Bureau, said in a prepared statement, "The more people who mail back their questionnaires, the more taxpayers save in census follow-up costs."

The Census Bureau is now delivering questionnaires to many of the households which did not receive one, but undelivered questionnaires are only a small percentage of those mailed out.

If you still have your 1990 Census questionnaire because you think you missed a deadline, there's still time to be counted! Census officials are saying April 1, Census Day, was only a target date, a day to focus on the decennial census; it wasn't a deadline. There is still time to be counted, and there is no penalty for returning a questionnaire after April 1.

The bureau is asking everyone who received a return envelope with their 1990 Census questionnaire to fill out the form and mail it back.

If a questionnaire came without a return envelope, the bureau asks that you fill it out but hold on to it until a census worker comes to your door to pick it up sometime before the end of May.

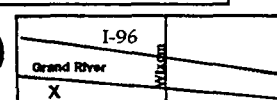

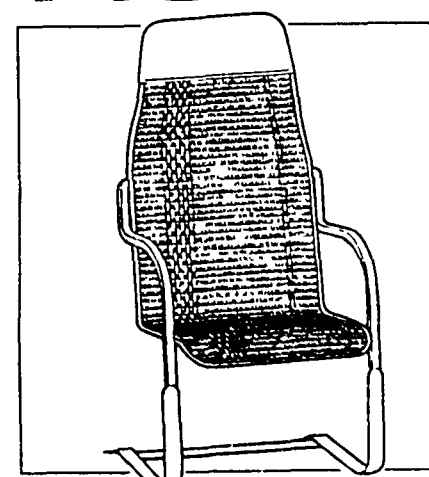
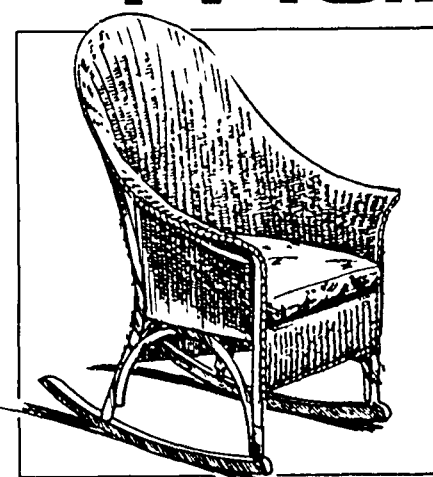

# Heat wilting local vandals?

After weeks of self-promotion, the so-called Smooth Criminals may be shying from the heat created by their alleged acts of vandalism.

Northville Township Police Sgt. John Sherman said Monday the group of youths suspected of spray painting and vandalizing sites in Northville, Northville Township and Plymouth Township may have cut back on their activities in the past week.

"There are still crimes taking place," he said, "but we cannot directly relate them to the Smooth Criminals."

"It may be a case of them just not signing their work," he said.

The Smooth Criminals, characterized by police as local youths ranging in age from 17-20, are known primarily for spray painting buildings and signs in the area and signing their targets with "SC" or "Smooth Criminals."

The group reportedly spray painted several signs and buildings along Six Mile Road in the township, as well as a pair of township police cars April 26.

The youths also allegedly issued

threats to a township police officer and ridiculed a city officer via spray-painted messages.

Sherman said last week that members of the group are also suspects in a rash of larcenies from automobiles in the city and township.

Police in Novi and Plymouth Township have joined local city and township investigators in the search for the group, and Sherman said a list of suspects has been narrowed. He would not speculate on when arrests could be made in the larceny and vandalism cases.

"It's still too early to tell. We're working on things," he said.

"I think they've been scared a little by all the attention they are receiving," he added.

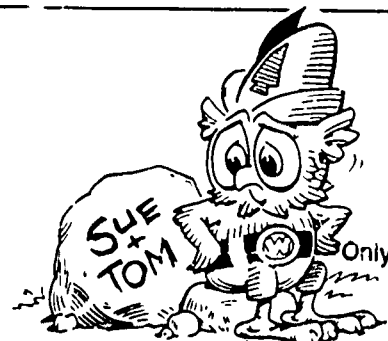

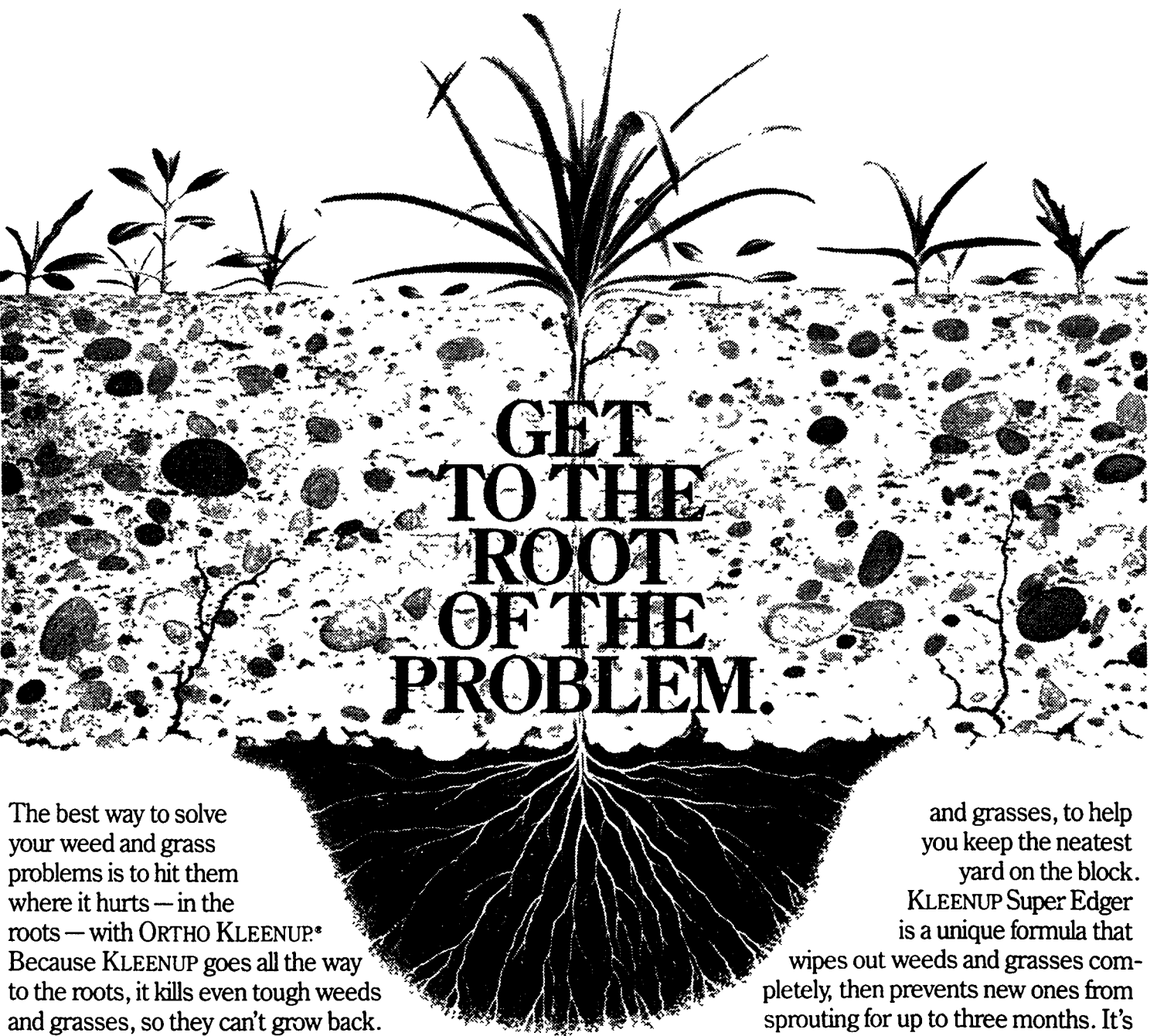

# Suspect nabbed in B&E case

A state police surveillance team, with the aid of Novi and Detroit police, apprehended a 29-year-old Walled Lake man in connection with the March 12 robbery of a Novi condominium off Haggerty Road near Nine Mile.

The suspect, who allegedly stole over \$1,000 in jewelry, is expected to be arraigned today in the first division of the 52nd District Court for breaking and entering an occupied dwelling.

In addition, he faces similar breaking and entry charges in Westland and Canton Township.

The suspect was seen leaving the Novi condo by the owner, who returned home at 10 a.m. the morning of March 12 to find the six-foot-tall suspect push past her and speed away in a gray Ford Van.

She was able to get the license plate number, which police traced to the suspect.

But the victim picked a different suspect out of a photo lineup, so the prosecutor would not issue a warrant, which sparked a 17-day investigation.

State police spotted the suspect's van the morning of March 29 at his girlfriend's house in Walled Lake. They followed the van to Livonia, Canton and Westland, where the suspect made several stops and tried various apartment doors.

They followed him to Detroit, where he was finally arrested after he entered a Westland apartment empty-handed and came out with a bag full of miscellaneous merchandise.

Upon further investigation, items were reported missing from one of the Canton apartments he was spotted entering.

The suspect was arraigned on the Westland charge and bond has been set at \$50,000 cash. He faces a possible 15-year sentence on this charge. It was unknown at press time whether he has been arraigned on the Canton charge.

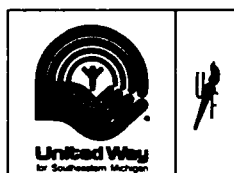
Upon questioning by the Novi police, the suspect allegedly admitted to being in the Novi condo on March 12 without permission, but denied taking the missing jewelry.

One police source said that the suspect told him that he found a key in the Novi mailbox which allowed him easy entry.

The suspect will be tried as a repeat offender in Oakland County, according to police.

He has served a two-year prison sentence for a 1987 robbery and has been on parole since last October.

He was also convicted of a 1980 Novi robbery and sentenced under the Home Youthful Training Act. And he was also sentenced to two years for failing to report back to a Detroit halfway house, according to police records.

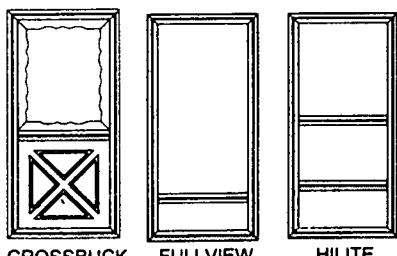

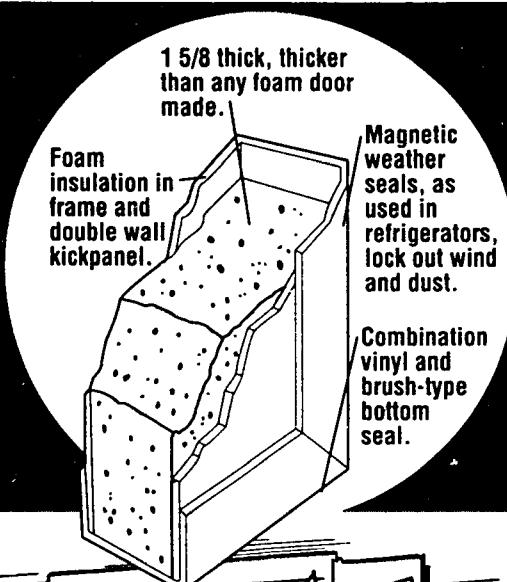

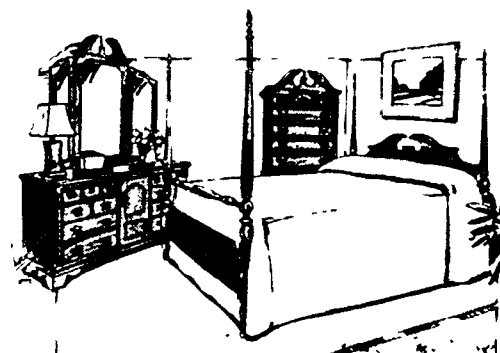

### Tough times call for creative solutions

Last week City Council members voted to lay off one police officer in an effort to trim the 1990-91 budget.

There is no question that times are tough in Northville right now when it comes to balancing taxpayer needs with taxpayer burdens.

The cost of disposing of garbage has ripped a hole right through the Northville budget in past months. Garbage costs have increased 60 percent in the last year, according to city administrators. And as anyone who has ever faced a budget of their own knows — when you need a new roof, you don't buy a new car. In other words, something gets sacrificed to pay the bills.

There is no question that if city council members hope to limit a budget increase to as small an amount as possible, that something is going to have to go. The exorbitant increase in landfill costs has seen to that. But is the layoff of one police officer the right sacrifice to make?

The single largest portion of the Northville City budget is the cost of the police department. This is true of most municipalities. Police and fire costs are normally the single biggest chunks of the general fund pie in any community. Obviously they are important costs and residents should take seriously any attempt made to cut down on these essential services.

Northville is unlike most other municipalities in one essential way, however. Northville City is home to a racetrack for seven months out of the year. During the racing season the additional traffic and population seen in the city require additional police protection. That's just simple math. The state gives Northville a portion of money back from the money it takes in from the race track and that money is supposed to repay the city for some of the additional expense of having the racetrack here. The state does not set the police staffing requirements for the track, however. That is determined locally.

Chief Rod Cannon has told the city council that during the racing season, seven months of the year, the Northville City Police Department is within the national average staffing guidelines set for a city of its size. During the non-racing season Northville would appear to be slightly above that average.

If the city council has done its homework and cutting a police officer is the best way to bring the 1990-91 budget in line, then the city should immediately begin working with Northville Downs on the establishment of a security force of their own. If adequate policing of the Northville Downs facility is beyond the city due to budgetary restraints then it may be time for the Downs to begin picking up some of that cost itself.

City Manager Steven Walters is probably right when he says the city council is faced with a political decision on which service to cut in order to bring the budget in as conservatively as it can. Police officers are not seen by the general public for the most part. They do not create as many ripples when they are gone as a lack of garbage pickup would. However, the public should pay attention to this move and make sure that adequate security will be maintained in the city at all times.

The city will be holding a "Truth in Taxation" hearing on Monday, May 14. The council is proposing an operating millage of 10.93 mills for the coming fiscal year. While this millage is 1.42 mills below this year's millage rate, in actual tax dollars collected the proposed millage would be a 4.8 percent increase for property owners. Why? The "Truth in Taxation" amendment to the state constitution requires that taxpayers be alerted when the community will take in more money this year in tax dollars than it did the year before. Communities are required to roll back their millages to the figure at which they would raise the exact same amount of money as the prior year, minus the input of new construction. That figure in Northville would be 10.43 mills. The 10.93 mills proposed requires the hearing.

### Learning from our environmental errors

When mistakes happen we should forgive them, but we should also learn from them.

An important lesson is to be learned from the rather sizeable mistake made recently by the Northville Swim Club.

According to the DNR, the Northville Swim Club appears to be the party which discharged a large amount of chlorine directly into the Randolph Drain recently, accounting for damage to habitat, water quality and fish.

The mistake was big enough to raise a stink, literally, but was not an ongoing one, so no charges will be pressed. It appears that the Swim Club, like most residential pool owners, generally drains its pool water into a nearby storm sewer. Storm sewers carry water directly to tributaries of the Rouge River, which is what the Randolph Drain is.

We assume Swim Club directors and its contractor have learned their lesson, but we hope an even larger moral can be found. We all need to think before we act, because what seems like a simple

thing — draining a swimming pool into a sewer — can have far-reaching repercussions. That river water eventually becomes our drinking water. But before that happens it flows through our backyards where our children play, it flows through our neighborhoods and through our lawns and gardens. It is a habitat for all kinds of wildlife and plant life and is an important part of our entire ecosystem.

Are we blowing this out of proportion? Maybe, but the point should be made. Draining chlorinated water directly into a storm sewer is wrong. Throwing used motor oil into a storm sewer is wrong. Throwing paint into a storm sewer is wrong. We all have to start thinking more before we act, because as the DNR field inspector described the contamination and fish kill, "It's not minor in terms of the environmental impact . . . It's minor in the sense that it's not an ongoing (problem). It's one that was not done with the intent of harming the environment, and one that we can correct."

Learning from our mistakes, that's what it's all about.

The Haller vote, 2-1 against funding for a library, was not a vote against the library, but a vote against higher taxes. We've had it up to here with higher taxes. Every year we property owners are hit with ridiculously increased property assessments which translates into more taxes and every year we're asked to approve more millage (third year in a row). Enough is enough. We've had over a 60 percent increase in my property tax assessment in four years. And, yes, it's true the value of our home has gone up, but not 60 percent. And also, assure that everybody shares equitably in our tax burden and in future assessment increases.

# After the hype, real work continues



Now that the Earth Day hype has died down, I can write about the environment with a clear conscience.

Maybe I'm grumpy, but the remorseless posturing made me sick.

Worse, I'm part of the media industry that both provokes and indulges it.

General Motors seizes the moment to announce an electric car. Virtually all known elected officials plant trees (only) in front of cameras. Recycling programs are launched with great fanfare. T-shirts promoting the environment are printed by the thousands.

Did all this lead one more family to recycle its trash? Did it encourage McDonald's to quit using non-degradable polystyrene packaging materials? Did Exxon Corp. require double-hulled tankers for oil transit? Did more cities mandate trash separation for curbside pickup?

The theory behind events like Earth Day is that publicity helps raise people's consciousness, gets them focused on doing something. But did anything really happen?

I don't know. Neither the TV people nor the newspapers focused attention on what actually happened as a result of the publicity. It's a bad habit of our trade.

My gut tells me that some things did happen, in part because over many years people have come to recognize the overwhelming good sense of regarding our position on this planet as short-term tenant and not as owner.

Earth Day provoked our newspapers to sum up what they are doing about recycling and to tell our readers where we stand.

Two environmental problems face the newspaper business.

First, the paper on which news is printed is made from cellulose fibers that come from ground-up trees that have been cut down. A sorry thought.

A partial solution is to use newsprint made from recycled fiber — grind up old newspapers, remove the ink and use the resulting slurry of pulp fibers in making fresh newsprint.

Newsprint made from 100 percent recycled fiber is impossible to run through the press, but we can print with 50 percent recycled fiber. So you get 50 percent more newsprint mileage per tree cut, which isn't bad.

Our company's policy is to use recycled newsprint as much as we can. Our other newspapers in Michigan use around 15 percent recycled paper, which will increase as we get more recycled stock from our suppliers.

Second, old newspapers make up a high percentage of the trash in landfills. As a society, we are running out of landfill space.

For years, we have been selling our waste newsprint to a recycling firm. But so many people now recycle their old newspapers that the supply of paper has outrun the demand. (Some day, the newsprint manufacturing companies will build enough paper mills to use all the old newspapers, but that will take years and years.) We need to figure out new and imaginative ways to use recycled newsprint.

The Observer and Eccentric newspapers ran an ad for Earth Day that asked: "What do an apple, a cow and a car door have in common?"

It answered: "Recycled newspapers play a role in all three. Apple growers in the northwest use recycled newsprint for packing, farmers use it for bedding instead of straw, and auto manufacturers use it in car doors."

I invite anybody who has other, better ideas to write me in care of this newspaper.

I'd like to claim our newspapers have been committed to using recycled newsprint ever since the company was founded 24 years ago, but I can't.

Is it a big deal, worthy of Earth Day hype? No. But it's a piece of solid progress. And it will continue.

"After I returned to the United States, I headed to Bowling Green State University where I majored in international trade," Shrestha explained.

By 1986 she was ready to go back to Japan for a 2 1/2-year stay.

"What I learned in Japan and about Japan I try to share with as many people as I can (clients). I have started my business to be ideally a consultant. I have worked with other consultants who deal with Japanese,

yet they have no idea what the Japanese are about.

"By at least having an idea how Japanese will speak or react, my clients are able to communicate with them more effectively. That is the ultimate goal of Cultural Communications."

It is a challenging goal, Shrestha explained, because many people already feel they have an adequate understanding of the Japanese culture.

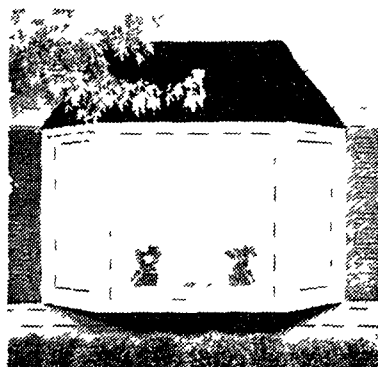

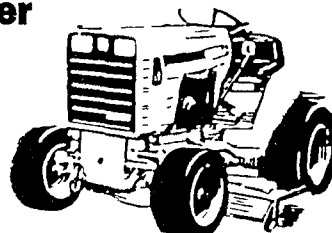

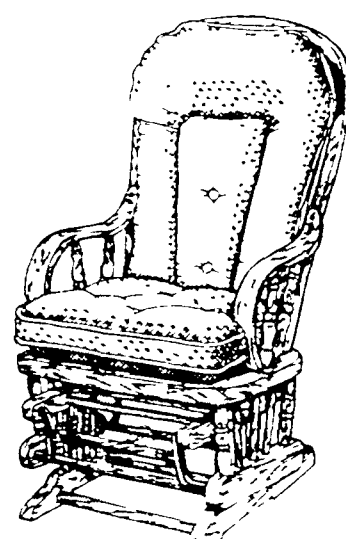

# Cultural awareness is the goal

"I find the saying 'a little knowledge is a dangerous thing' is appropriate in this case. I want to continue to share with as many people as I can what I consider to be a realistic view of Japan."

Shrestha works with both Japanese and Americans to bring the misconceptions of both to the attention of the other. She noted that Japanese do not understand Americans any better than Americans understand them.

"Especially during the last year I was in Japan, I concentrated on making comparisons between the two countries, everything from the educational systems to cultural differences," Shrestha commented.

"I believe my experience was unique (compared with most business people) in that I did this (comparisons) on my own. I was not sponsored by a Japanese and, therefore, was not shown only what they wanted me to see."

"I saw and experienced everything without their influence (except for a few parties — Japanese style)."

In the seminars Shrestha conducts, her goal is to expose Americans to all facets of Japan and her culture, things they will not hear from Japanese themselves.

"If that American business person then goes on to do a joint venture or be bought out by the Japanese, so be it. I feel I will have done my 'duty' in explaining one to the other."

"It is not my place to say (or not to say) that someone should not do business with Japanese. But if they are aware of the Japanese style and thought process, then they will be better able to make their own decision regarding a venture with Japan."

With her Japanese clients, Shrestha is busy trying to do "cross-cultural" training which she said they need as much as do the Americans. She noted that too many Japanese have heard untrue or exaggerated stories about America and Americans ("Like 'if you don't cut your grass, your neighbor will call the police on you.'")

"Hopefully, when my clients return to Japan, they can slow down 'stories about America' at their

source," Shrestha added.

In addition to presenting seminars on American/Japanese culture at Eastern Michigan University and Washtenaw Community College, Shrestha gives language instruction and does some interpreting.

Shrestha said she finds Japanese management style very different from the American style.

"There are more group discussion and problem solving techniques in Japanese companies," she said. "In American companies, there is a distinct 'ladder of command' and upper management making decisions."

On the other hand, Shrestha said American managers don't get as much respect as do Japanese managers (in Japanese companies, particularly).

"If they (American managers) get paid enough, they tend to ignore the act of not getting respect," Shrestha added.

"I don't think most Americans realize how deep the Japanese desire to be number one is. It's a national consciousness to only be number one. Even with school children, being second or third in any competition is

not good enough."

Shrestha said she has found that Japanese have two faces — one outside, one inside. The outside face may be smiling when the inside one is not smiling at all. "They believe to show emotion is to show weakness," she commented.

"They really roll out the red carpet the first time they meet you. You will feel very flattered."

"The Japanese feel the United States is no longer number one — not even in the ballpark. They (the Japanese) believe they are number one in economic success."

Shrestha noted that Japanese are expected to make it to mid-level management by 30-35 years of age and to upper-level by age 50.

"At this point I really want to concentrate on being a goodwill ambassador," Shrestha said. "It (Cultural Communications) keeps me busy doing what I truly enjoy — talking with people and learning and doing."

## Sales look good for homes in 1990

## Plan before you plant

### Perennials: plant early, enjoy late

"Read up before you plan or plant a garden — especially perennials," cautioned Anne Raney Brown of Raney's Rainbow Gardens in Lyon Township.

Brown, who grew up as part of the "gardening" Raney family, said hardy mums are some of the best perennials (plants that come up year-after-year without replanting) to include in a garden.

They can be planted early because they can withstand a light frost, can be cut back after the early blossoms have died and will branch out and bloom again in the late fall, Brown noted.

Both shrubs and flowering perennial plants can provide attractive decoration for a yard and now is the time to plant most of these types of gardening mainstays. Brown said mums can be planted almost any time you can work the soil because they are most hardy.

"Some types of hothouse-grown mums will not live over the winter, but the hardy mums will," she said. Because they are relatively easy to

grow and offer diversity, perennials of many types have been popular with gardeners for at least a century.

According to "Growing Perennials," Cooperative Extension Service Bulletin E-1984, a border bed of only perennials was first suggested in 1890 by George Nicholson, curator of the Royal Botanic Gardens at Kew, England.

In the 1900s, tender bedding plants (those which must be planted annually) were in favor, but perennials came back into their own around 1914.

Perennial borders were developed with taller shrubs and plants at the back and shorter ones along the borders of shrubs and gardens. This provided only a one-sided "front" view of the flowers and soon planting of narrow islands of flowers became popular because they could then be viewed from all directions.

Today's trend is toward mixed borders or beds that include trees, shrubs, perennials, bulbs, annuals and biennials (planted every two years). This offers color and interest on a season-long basis.

Brown said many people hire her to design their perennial gardens and beds because it does take time to plan and plant so that the flowers bloom early, mid-season and late.

Designing a perennial garden, according to the book, "The Perennial Garden" by Jeff and Marilyn Cox, should start with an assessment of the property to be planted. Questions should include what size and shape of plantings the owners desire, as

well as what color and kind of plants those persons enjoy most.

It is always important, also, to consider the zone in which you live. Zone 6 in which this area is located has an average annual minimum temperature of minus 10 degrees (Fahrenheit) to zero degrees. Soil types and moisture should also be considered.

Experts can be consulted on these items if the gardener is in doubt.

All first blossoms in perennial gardens are bulbs which means flowers like crocus, tulips, hyacinths and daffodils. A profusion of color can be achieved by planting these in large beds or they may be scattered throughout a wooded area or set in with shrubs to provide attractive blooms before the bushes themselves begin to flower.

Many rock garden plants are perennials and brightly hued creeping phlox are some of the easiest to grow. They do well in sunshine and seem to blend with almost any other plantings.

Many types of succulents also fill the crevices in rock gardens and several offer blooms as well as interesting foliage.

Some perennial plant lovers prefer to maintain the woody effect of their property and should select perennials which thrive in shady conditions.

Brown said ferns and wildflowers are especially good for this. Rainbow Gardens and other area horticulture businesses offer such things as trilliums, jack-in-pulpit, bluebells and violets for this purpose. Violets do

well in shade or sun and will multiply rapidly so that if something is needed to fill a problem area they are a good choice.

Lily-of-the-valley is another plant which likes shady spots and multiplies with very little effort on the grower's part. Forget-me-nots also fall in this category, according to Brown.

"Hostas have beautiful variegated foliage and are excellent for providing color all through the growing season even though they do not bloom," Brown said.

Wild and cultivated columbine are also good perennials for gardens. They are easy to grow and provide lovely, delicate flowers in a variety of hues. They do not, however, last indefinitely from season to season and must be replanted after a few years as do bulbs and other perennials.

Another perennial which covers a long growing season and a rainbow of colors is the lily. Hybrid lilies such as offered at Raney's are popular because they require relatively little care and produce many attractive flowers over a long growing season. Day lilies are especially nice for providing colorful blooms throughout a summer season.

There are nearly as many types of flowers for perennial gardens as there are gardeners interested in growing them, so look over the selections at local plant merchants and don't hesitate to ask advice from the experts.

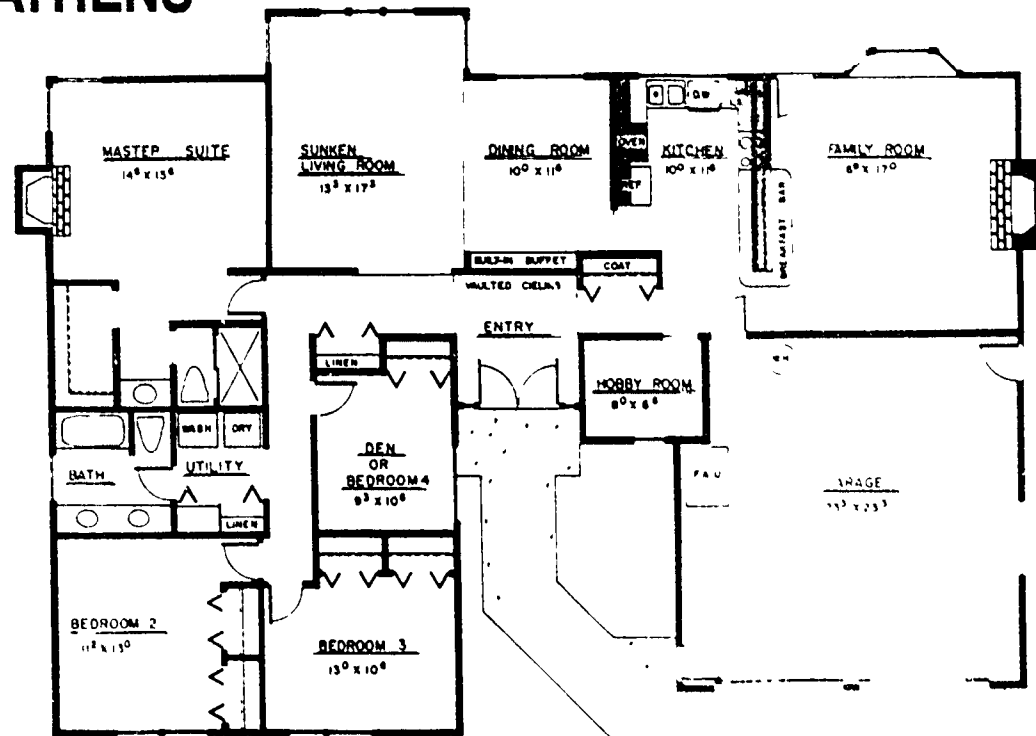
The main bath and utility are conveniently located to the bedrooms, den and linen closets. The roomy bedrooms are buffered from the noise

# Future housing: 'social entities' forecast

A crystal-ball projection, focusing on future housing projects:

Private, for-profit ownership of housing projects will be converted to ownership by "social entities"—e.g., local government agencies, neighborhood associations, tenant associations.

This is the only viable way to provide an adequate supply of affordable housing for American families, according to certain analysts. The conversion of privately owned housing projects to public or community entities

would be financed with federal housing grants.

Social organizations would receive grant funds to purchase, rehabilitate and operate existing residential buildings, or construct new ones. These one-time grants would replace bonds and mortgages in the construction and rehabilitation of housing.

The concept would eliminate debt as the primary means of generating funds for housing. One political leader estimates such a program would cost about \$55 billion annually for the next decade.

The radical new concept was the

outgrowth of a study by the Working Group on Housing at the Institute for Policy Studies, a research group in Washington, D.C. It was described in a special report, "Progressive Housing Program for America."

The primary objective of the plan is to provide a continuing supply of affordable housing for American families. The social owners would produce new housing that would be kept out of the speculative housing market.

The basic concept is already being implemented in some areas, but only on a small or experimental scale. There seems to be growing support

for such a plan.

Legislation has been introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives by Rep. Ronald V. Dellums, D-Calif., that would establish the legal foundation for the plan. It has little chance of becoming law in the near future, but may become a significant trendsetter.

Under the plan, the first housing projects to be converted to social ownership and operation would be those now threatened with foreclosure. Initially targeted would be privately owned and government-assisted housing projects.

The plan would then involve and

expand to convert other types of housing projects.

Michael Stegman, a housing expert with the University of North Carolina, thinks the concept is too big and aggressive for Americans to swallow. The enabling legislation will never be enacted, he predicted.

However, a more active role for government and non-profit groups in acquisition of certain housing projects is a good idea, Stegman said. "But increasing the proportion of socially-owned residential property is no guarantee that it will be well managed, well maintained, and well cared for," he said.

**Q: For the most part, are first-time home buyers squeezed out of today's real estate market?**

**A: No.** First-time home buyers continue to be a large and important part of the current market. New buying and financing concepts help them enter the world of home ownership, despite high prices.

A recent report from Century 21 Real Estate Corp. revealed that 38 percent of the more than 400,000 property transactions recorded during the past year by Century 21 offices involved first-time home buyers.

Authors of "The Perennial Garden" book warn that maintaining perennials so they look good year after year means attending to soil improvement, watering when necessary, keeping weeds down (mulch helps with this) and dividing plants on schedule. When starting new plants, remember to mulch the tender crowns over the winter.

Compost is invaluable for soil improvement and usually only needs to be added once every three years. An average soil is one that is loose and friable (not packed), but not too rich,

according to "The Perennial Garden" book.

Above all, if you really want good results from your perennial garden, seek professional advice and then follow suggestions. When there is a problem with a plant that is not blooming properly or is turning yellow, check at an area library for information that may help solve the problem.

## Pulling tricks out of your hat to lighten dark, heavy rooms

**Q:** Our old Tudor-style house has wonderful woodwork and beams throughout the downstairs—one reason, in fact, that we bought the house. I'm finding that it makes the rooms dark and heavy, however.

**A:** Of course, we'd never think of painting the wood, but is there any other way to brighten things up?—L.C.

**A:** Let Cecil B. DeMille direct you: This is the living room of his estate in Los Feliz, Calif., redecorated as a designer show house by Marsha Broderick, ISID, president of Pink Ladies Design and Construction Inc. in Calabasas, Calif.

The dark beams are the main feature of the house, which was built in 1913 and had also been home to Charlie Chaplin and his wife. Designer Broderick pulled a number of professional tricks out of her hat to make the room look and feel lighter, brighter and more today. She:

•Lightened the wood floors to a golden honey color.

•Used a large off-white rug to reflect light up into the room.

•Used pastel-colored upholstery—the fabric she chose has a silken sheen for an added glow.

Broderick also added the glint of gold throughout the room—a grand gesture appropriate to the memory of DeMille. You might achieve the same effect with, say, brass lighting fixtures, andirons and accessories.

**Q:** Our daughter will graduate from college this year and plans to get her own apartment and furnish it with things from her room at home.

She has a bed with a rounded upholstered head, two matching night stands and a dresser. If she uses it all together in a one-room apartment as she plans, won't it look too bedroom?—A.S.

**A:** Not if she disguises the bedroom beginnings of her furniture by assigning it new living room roles. For example:

•Add a second headboard to the other end of the bed (upholster both sides of it and the original headboard), and add piles of pillows to turn the bed into a sofa by

day—"upholstery" could be a tight-fitting mattress cover.

•Use the two night stands as the bases of a desk-cum-dining table. The top could be a flush door painted something attractive, or—better—a rectangle of 1/4-inch glass.

•Let the dresser function as a storage piece, not for clothes alone, but also for table linens, silverware and dishes.

•A 42- or 54-inch round of 1/4-inch plywood on any base of suitable height would also make a dining table when you add a wardrobe of round tablecloths. Folding chairs for company can live in a closet.

•Accessories should be kept on the tailored side to further obscure the fact that this is an all-in-one room.

## Let the BUYER BEWARE

Ann loved to shop. She shopped when she was happy. She shopped when she was sad. She shopped when she was lonely, frustrated or angry.

Last year Ann stopped shopping.

She owed \$40,000 on her 30 credit cards and was having difficulty making the minimum monthly payments.

"I was borrowing from Peter to pay Paul," Ann said. "I was very frightened. I couldn't see myself getting out."

Although her story sounds extreme, surprisingly, Ann is just one of an increasing number of people caught in the vicious cycle of purchasing on credit. Buying more than they can afford at an impulse moment, many of these people convince themselves that they can afford it or are getting something for nothing until the credit card bills start pouring in and interest payments spiral upward and out of control.

And when the credit limit on one card is reached, people are finding it too easy to simply say "yes" to one of the many offers for new credit cards they are finding in their mail boxes.

Despite popular misconceptions of the wife gone crazy with the husband's cards, credit abuse is not a characteristic possessed by any specific sex or age category, social group or economic class. Anyone can lose financial control of their life. And as more people are getting into their first, but second, third and fourth credit cards, credit counselors expect the debt situation to worsen as people discover the ease of obtaining credit and the convenience of buying with it.

The trend toward an increased reliance on credit has already begun. Purchases made on credit and not repaid immediately more than doubled between 1980 and 1987, the last year for which statistics were available. With a total of \$349.4 billion of consumer credit outstanding in 1980, that figure swelled to \$865.5 billion outstanding in 1987. For purposes of a real comparison, this is an increase from 18.2 percent of disposable personal income spent with credit in 1980 to 21.5 percent spent on credit in 1987, according to statistics from the Federal Reserve Bulletin.

"I have a brother who had a problem with credit cards and I had always promised myself that wouldn't be me," said Lynn, a 30-year-old bookkeeper whose credit card debt ballooned out of control. After accumulating an \$11,000 debt on 21 different credit card accounts, 17 of which she was behind on payments, Lynn forced herself to seek the help of a credit counselor.

And, surprisingly, many people involved with credit counseling agree that a high income is not a guarantee against development of

a credit problem. Rather, income level may just predict the degree of indebtedness.

"I have a good income but I lived beyond it," said Ann, currently a member of Debtors Anonymous, who asked to be identified only as Ann. "I liked to live like a millionaire even though I wasn't one."

The appearance of Debtors Anonymous on the scene in 1982, and its subsequent growth, is one visible response to the enormous cry for help by people with runaway spending habits. Now a national organization, local DA groups have been springing up in Michigan over the last couple of years.

DA relies heavily on the premises and techniques of Alcoholics Anonymous and other self-help groups which treat the outward problem, in this case chronic indebtedness, as a symptom of a deeper, more troublesome disease.

The group espouses self-help rhetoric with the belief that one needs to take charge of one's own

life, one day at a time, accepting help from a supportive network of people with similar problems.

Maureen, who is also in DA, says her previous problem of a continuously mounting shopping debt had roots in her deeper psychological problems and compulsive tendencies.

"Walking into a store for me was like magic — it could change a mood of anger to one of complete ecstasy," Maureen said. "I was on a high the whole time I was there."

Maureen finally hit rock bottom after depleting a \$40,000 joint savings account she held with her husband and running up a credit card debt of about \$12,000.

"I just spent it on clothes and frivolities," Maureen said. "My husband was freaked out. If I'd have kept going, we would have never dug out."

However, since last October, Maureen has halted her quick draw of the plastic cards and her rampant buying spree. She said it is still difficult for her to think about shopping and she often gets

the old, familiar rush of excitement. But now when this happens, she goes to a DA meeting or calls someone else in the program.

She is still trying to pay off the old debts, but says she is hopeful about the future and finds strength and confidence in knowing she is now in control of her life.

Another consequence of the movement toward credit as the preferred method of purchase is the growth of credit counseling services. Operating on a different premise, credit counseling assumes that people in trouble with people having financial problems. The bulk of the people we counsel are people who never look at their budget."

Money management is something that people have to learn," said Joan Witte, public affairs and administrative manager for Credit Counseling Centers Inc. "We take a very educational approach with people having financial problems. The bulk of the people we counsel are people who never look at their budget."

Witte said that although DA

can be a source of strength and a relief from stress for many people, she believes credit counseling centers are a preferred way for people with large credit problems to regain control.

"Money problems and all the resulting problems is a lot for one person to carry," Witte said. She said the DA approach encourages people to try to get back on track by themselves, which can be "quite a heavy load for one person."

And that was true in Lynn's situation. After talking to a Novi credit counselor, Lynn said, "I felt like someone had lifted a tremendous weight off my shoulders."

Since its inception in 1968, credit counseling centers have earned a greater amount of respect and authority from businesses and have more clout than an individual in dealing with creditors. They are uniquely positioned as a neutral conduit to negotiate flexible repayment schedules for a client that is overextended, according to Witte.

"I can't describe the feeling of helplessness," said Lynn, who had eventually gone out to charge an answering machine for screening angry creditor calls. "I needed someone to help me manage my money and get these people off my backs."

Credit counselors help their clients work out a money management budget, they negotiate with creditors for clients who can't make payments, and they will even take over check-writing responsibilities.

"We try to go over everything with them (clients)," said Gail Shultz. "We make suggestions on how to bring costs down."

Shultz, a credit counselor at the Credit Counseling Center in Novi, said she believes people are accruing more debts these days because of the ease of obtaining credit.

"People are getting in over their heads," Shultz said. "Bankruptcies are on the rise, and we are opening more offices."

Statistics from the U.S. Office of the Courts show that Shultz's observation is correct. Personal bankruptcies have been rising steadily since 1980, which recorded 278 filed and 364 pending. Figures for 1987 show more than double that number, with 561 bankruptcies filed with another 809 pending.

Witte shared her thoughts: "We have grown tremendously, which is kind of sad because we are in the credit counseling business," Witte said. In 1988 their organization helped clients pay back \$20 million to creditors. In 1989, that amount rose to almost \$25 million and "based on the projections so far for this year, we will surpass that," Witte said.

"People think that because it's (credit) offered to them, they can afford it," Shultz said.

And although Lynn quickly accepts full responsibility for her eager spending, she agrees that the accessibility of pre-approved credit was one factor leading to her quick fall off the favorable credit-rating list.

"I have a very bad feeling that the credit card companies are doing a disservice to people," Lynn said. "They should have a more responsible attitude about who they give credit to."

Even at her deepest point in debt, Lynn was receiving instant "just sign here" credit cards in the mail. Some of the cards were even from companies she was having difficulty paying.

"I am afraid to use a credit card now," said Lynn, who has chipped her initial \$11,000 debt down to \$5,000 in less than a year. And although she has no savings account, no health insurance and worries about unexpected expenses, Lynn feels better now.

"I can breathe again," said Lynn. "And I swear it will never happen to me again."

## Credit is cash for new generations

Colleen has 15 credit cards, many of which are "maxed out," a basketful of unopened, angry notes from creditors, a total debt of almost \$8,000 and \$150 dollars in her bank account.

Colleen is 22 years old. "I used to be totally neurotic about them (debts)," Colleen said, "but now I just think, 'Hey, it's there, so I'm going to have to work and pay it off.'"

Colleen uses her plastic to pay for everything from buying clothes to paying off other credit cards — and vacations.

A student at the University of Michigan, Colleen has been unemployed for the past few months, which she said has made her credit card situation a lot worse.

But even while she was working as a waitress in a high-priced restaurant, the problem of her compulsive spending habits was still there.

"When I was working I made so much money, but it's weird — I still made only the minimum payments on my credit cards," Colleen said.

Northville resident Virginia Notarainni, 69, has both a Visa card and a Sears card but she uses them both only "sparingly."

"I pay the whole thing off when it comes in the mail every month," Notarainni said. "I don't want that interest."

Similarly, 66 year old Harold Yakey and 66 year old Myron Utley, also Northville residents, both pay off their cards in full each month.

"I pay the balance every month because I don't believe in interest. I get the interest," Yakey said. "I just bought a brand new car and paid cash for it."

And while the differences in attitudes about purchasing on credit between the young and the old seem striking, recent statistics

## Hometown artist

Generally when you go to see an artist's show, you expect to see their actual work.

However, when you go to see a showing of David Barr's work, it is almost impossible to see anything but pictures or videotapes of his work.

Barr, a resident of Northville and Novi for the past 11 years, is not the archetypical artist who sits alone at his easel sketching with charcoal or painting with acrylics, although he does teach conventional art classes at Macomb Community College.

Rather, he has pioneered his own brand of art.

His most talked about pieces are

larger-than-life structures that combine his sculpting talents with complex geometric and geographic calculations and set out to promote his social cause.

"The mixing of people of diversity is one of the greatest things you can put your energy into," Barr said, as he spoke to a group at the Swords Into Plowshares Peace Center and Gallery in Detroit, where his latest show is being held.

Barr's most expansive project was the Four Corners Project, begun in 1976 and not completed until 1985. Dubbed by Barr as the "largest sculpture with the least amount of material,"

tal," the project virtually spans the globe.

Imagining a tetrahedron—a four-cornered, three-dimensional triangular figure—within the globe, Barr selected four land points at which the invisible tetrahedron's corners would touch.

The resulting project took Barr and his entourage from Easter Island to South Africa to New Guinea and Greenland. At each location a small hand-held marble model of a tetrahedron was laid.

"I am making something that no one owns," Barr says of his geostructures.

And it is ambitious projects like this that has won Barr his reputation as a man who does what he sets out to do.

His current project, the Borders project, sounds equally formidable. Barr's basic idea is to erect structures at selected intersections of the borders between the U.S. and another country to promote cooperation and understanding between them.

Amusing the audience with his tales of battling with government bu-

reaucracies, Barr recounted the details of his experience with the sculptures he put up on the U.S.-Canada border.

"These projects take me to completely different problems," said Barr, whose conversation jumps quickly and easily from physics to world politics to geometry. "Every place I have been, there has been a great suspicion of Americans. And this is unfortunate."

Barr is also working out the specifics of placing border sculptures on the U.S.-Mexican border and in the Soviet Union.

"This summer it is very likely that I will be going to Moscow to work out details of a project," Barr said. He anticipates the sculpture to be placed on the southeastern corner of the Soviet Union that is across from Alaska.

A little closer to home, Barr is trying to stir up interest in doing a project in Michigan.

"What I would love to see in Michigan is an art park showing our history and what it took to get here," Barr said. "Not a museum of artifacts, but something that makes you feel it."

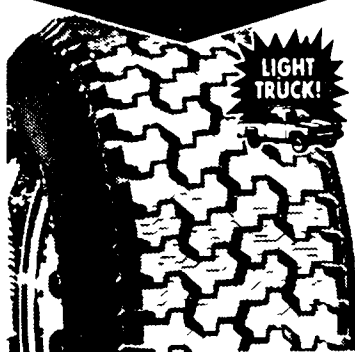

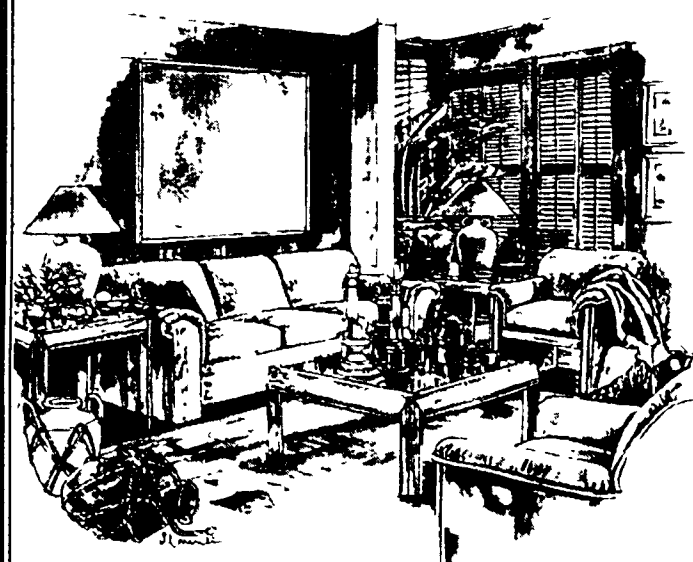

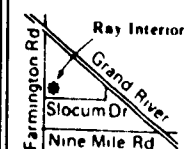

## Service helps caregivers

Bonnie Gates brought her mother into her Northville home 26 years ago. She has cared for her alone for the past 15 years. Gates insists that her mother, at 96, is still basically healthy and able to do a great deal for herself. But, she must be her mother's constant companion, helping her bathe, making sure she is comfortable and always close behind when her mother tries to walk.

Gates herself is 73 years old. "My freedom has been gradually taken from me so it has not been that startling," she said.

Gates — which is not her real name — is just one of many adult children who have opted to care for an elderly parent in their home rather than place them in a nursing facility. And, as medical technologies advance and the average age of the population stretches, the problems associated with who will care for this burgeoning elderly population are mounting.

"The population is getting older and living longer," said Marion Morris, service coordinator for Plymouth Family Services, which provides respite care to many of the local cities including Northville. "Generally it is the primary caregiver that calls needing help."

Morris and Susan Ballard operate a respite care program designed to answer the increasing number of cries for help — not from the elderly themselves, but from those who provide care for senior family members.

"There is a lot of stress out there — these people have been trying to do it themselves," said Morris.

Although based in Plymouth, Family Services Inc. is funded primarily through the Senior Alliance, a source of funding for senior citizen

programs which serves many local cities. Morris said their services are aimed at the people who take on the responsibilities of caring for elderly and disabled relatives at home, but need a break sometimes. The purpose is to provide a few hours relief from this full-time task so they don't have to sacrifice all of their time.

Morris said the service is used for a wide range of reasons. She told of two elderly men who must provide round-the-clock care for their wives. They schedule an aide infrequently so they can go out and play golf. But, respite care is "even for people who simply want to go into their bedroom and shut the door for a few hours," Morris said.

Morris said there are far more elderly receiving care in the home "than any of us are aware of." However, their program has limited funds and is spread very thin over the nine cities and townships they serve.

"It is a real balancing act," Morris said of the scheduling arrangements to ensure aides' time is allocated

fairly. Gates was one of the lucky few to receive some relief time from Plymouth Family Service. She is given an aide for two hours every week. "It gives me a chance to go out without leaving mother alone," Gates said. "This Saturday I might make a luncheon date."

The help Gates and her mother receive is not medical help — but simply companionship.

Respite care services must be flexible to accommodate the wide range of needs by the clients. For many, like Gates, respite care turns out to be largely like a sitting service. Others need someone to help with the housework as well. And still others require someone qualified with medical skills.

"Lorraine comes for the express purpose of letting me get out," Gates said of the woman in her fifties who has helped her since last May.

So for two hours every Saturday, Bonnie Gates does whatever it is she wants to do.

show they are not only attitudes but are actual behavioral patterns.

Of family units, including households of one, with the head of the household between 25 and 34 years old, more than 62 percent had some type of consumer

credit debt. In comparison, only 19.2 percent of families with the head of the household over 65 years old had an unpaid credit card debt.

"The client profile has changed," said Gail Shultz of Credit Counseling Centers Inc. in Novi. "Back then someone was

struggling to keep a roof over their heads. Now some people come in with over 10 credit cards."

However, both Shultz and Witte also agreed that it was misleading to characterize credit purchasing as a particularly young-generation phenomenon.

"We see everything — senior citizens, people just starting out and families where both people work," Shultz said.

## Great Smoky Mountains a challenge for hikers

It defends the claim as the most visited national park in the U.S. The Great Smoky Mountains grace the states of Tennessee and North Carolina as part of the Blue Ridge Mountain chain.

Within this unique ecosystem are found flora and fauna that exist nowhere else in the world.

I made my first visit to the Smoky Mountains with veterans of its steep winding roads, verdant green meadows, enchanting streams, and homesteads bearing witness to a simpler way of life.

I began to make friends with the mountains by introducing myself to their bounties. We hiked beginner trails and quiet woodland walkways. We picnicked beside streams that flowed into the Pigeon River. We hiked more difficult trails as our bodies became accustomed to uphill foot travel. Each day and with each step I became closer to the mountains surrounded by a bluish haze that earns them their distinctive name.

As a challenge ever before us, the day came when we were ready to hike the Chimney Tops. I had conditioned my body for half of my life, walking

three miles a day, seven days a week, almost 365 days a year. But the flat lands of southern Michigan do little to prepare a body, regardless of the age, for enduring the heights of true mountains.

The hike to the Chimney Tops was rated difficult, a rating reserved for seasoned hikers. We had done adequate hiking. Our bodies and our minds told us that we were ready. We began the eight mile climb well-fed and confident. The sway-back trails were steep, but we were young and so was the day. Mile two began to wear our bodies as legs protested climbing the steep incline. Lungs expanded to take in thinning air. Mile three found

us weary. A short rest and a granola snack renewed our spirit of mission. At mile four, we prayed that the trail would lessen its angle of elevation.

Mile five and six are a blur. Mile seven caused our spirits to stir; we had endured this far, we can make it now.

Signs along the way had been our informers. The one before us read, "Chimney Tops — .3 miles, Caution — steep and dangerous trail."

We read the sign with curiosity but no apprehension. We're almost there!

One more bend and we could see it. Rising 100 feet, at an angle popular to mountain goats, were the Chimney Tops. And they did look like

chimney tops from a distance, but up close they looked like a massive deposit of dark mountain material. Many weary hikers sat at the foot of the deposit. A few younger people were cavorting on the huge, imposing metamorphic material.

Why wasn't anyone serious about going up? My partner and I looked at one another. In that moment of emotional eye contact our minds and hearts united; we were going to climb this mountain!

The climb was not easy, nor was it the most difficult thing I had ever done. Physically, it was a definite test of endurance. Mentally, the thought

of falling quickened the clinging impulse. Emotionally, I was at the peak of awareness as the body and soul merged to achieve a goal.

We climbed the Chimney Tops. The view was a portion of our prize. The solitude was healing. The grandeur of the mountains surrounding us opened our senses to the magnitude of the creation.

I will always feel a special bond with the Smoky Mountains. I was only a guest then, but they treated me well. I gave them my footsteps. They gave me determination, appreciation and the insight that the mountain is worth the climb.

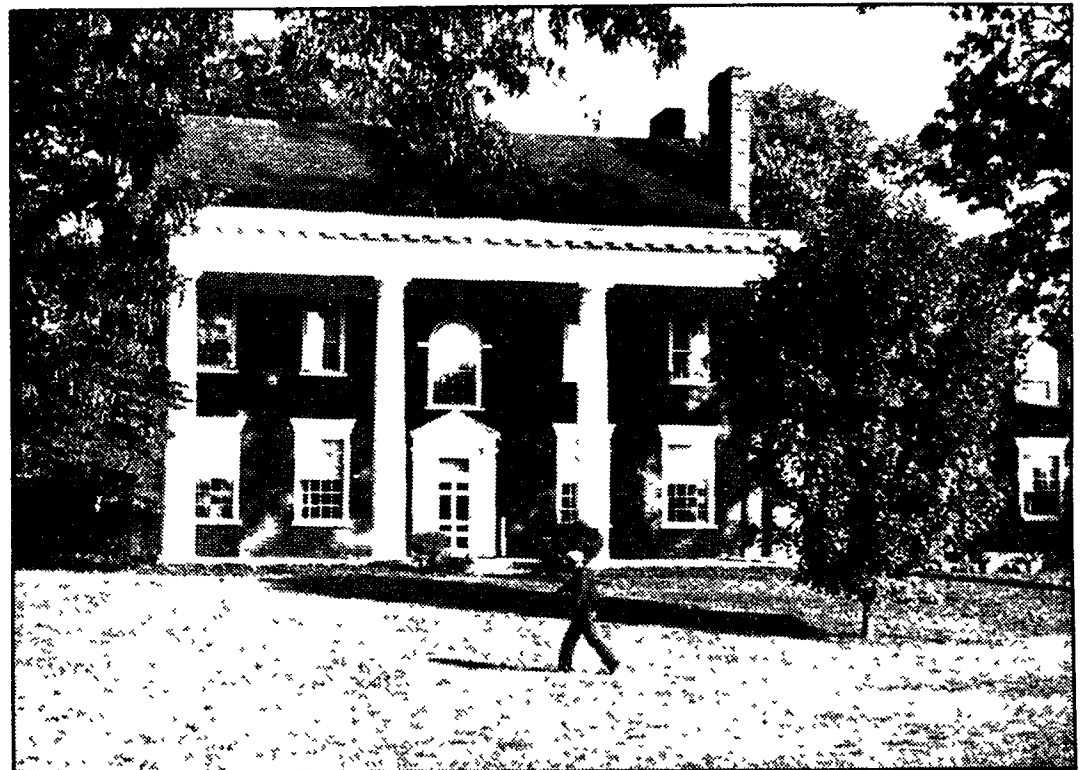

## Pillared Grandeur Bed and breakfasts flourish on antebellum plantations

I have a vivid picture of the Louisiana plantation country, and it has nothing to do with either the Mississippi or the Civil War.

It's a picture of a young guide in a beautiful antebellum dress. She is resting on a grand 19th Century verandah, fanning herself in the summer heat. Her hooped skirt is lifted just far enough off the wooden floorboards to reveal her footware; a pair of scuffed white athletic shoes and a pair of short white socks.

That's the way it is along the Mississippi River north and south of Baton Rouge. The great houses built before the Civil War—they call it the War of Northern Aggression—are there in all their pillared grandeur, but if you peek beneath the surface you find the 20th century.

The best example of this is found in the wonderful old plantation houses offering bed-&-breakfast accommodations on the stretch of Old Man River that runs from New Orleans north past Baton Rouge.

They are old in all the expected ways, but they have the mattresses and modern facilities that you

and I expect when we stay overnight in America.

If you read your history, you won't be surprised to learn that change is a natural part of the Old South. This remarkable collection of plantations, and the lush southern life they represent, come out of a very short period in American history.

Mississippi plantations were built because of four 19th century changes. Innovators learned to granulate sugar and to remove seeds from the cotton plant. Napoleon ceded the Louisiana Territory to the United States. And Fulton invented the engine that put steamboats on the Mississippi.

It was only 50 years between the first grand plantation house and the war that destroyed plantation life, but you should see what is left behind from that half century!

There are b&b accommodations at Oak Alley, Madewood and Nottaway plantations between Baton Rouge and New Orleans; and at Cottage, Asphodel, the Myrtles and Millbank in Feliciana Parish north of Baton Rouge. You can visit but not sleep in Rosedown, Houmas House and other grand plantation houses open to tourists but not to overnighters. Some, like Madewood, are straight out of *Gone With The Wind*.

## LTU announces 29-day tour of the great castles of Europe

Join experts in history and architecture in June to explore the age of kings and aristocracy and tour the great palaces and castles of Great Britain and Western Europe.

## Canoeing fun on state rivers

### Tubing also promoted

From a quiet paddle down a scenic river to a fast-moving ride on the rapids, Michigan's 36,000 miles of inland waterways will lure thousands of canoeists this season. AAA Michigan reports.

In addition to canoes, many liveries also rent innertubes to take advantage of growing interest in "tubing." Some liveries also provide kayaks and paddleboats.

"Canoe rental rates vary widely, ranging from \$12 a day to as much as \$18 an hour depending on the location," said Peter Erickson, AAA Michigan Club Services director. "But most liveries are holding prices to last year's levels."

A survey of 61 liveries statewide showed canoes can be rented on several popular Southeast Michigan rivers including Huron, River Raisin, Clinton and the south branch of the Kalamazoo.

Some liveries charge hourly rates of \$3 to \$18. Others reserve canoes for 2-1/2 hour blocks at costs between \$14 and \$20. Some charge daily rates of \$12 to \$30. Half-day, weekly and group discounts also may be available.

Rivers listed on the AAA Michigan 1990 Canoe Guide range from quiet water to fast moving rapids. For more information about individual

liveries, write to the Michigan Recreational Canoeing Association, P.O. Box 296, Montague 49437. The association represents more than half of state liveries.

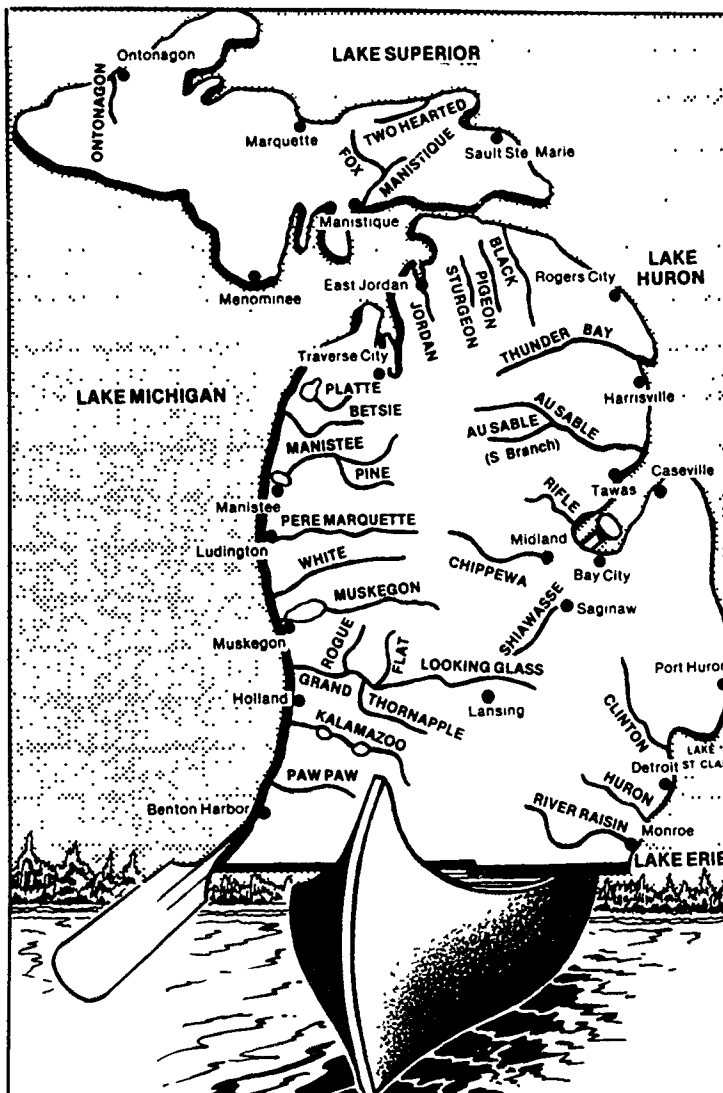
Most liveries open in April or May and remove canoes from the water in October or November. Reservations are recommended, especially during holidays and summer weekends.

Novices can learn to canoe free from May 15 to June 15 at participating liveries. Free, one-hour canoe trips also are available during Michigan Canoe Week, June 1-7, to those registering in advance.

Those heading out for a river paddle should wear tennis shoes and bring a dry change of clothing, sun-tan oil, hat and windbreaker. Leave expensive jewelry home and place wallets and keys in zippered or buttoned pockets.

To keep personal possessions dry, place items in garbage bags sealed separately and packed one inside the other. Attach bags to the canoe.

Alcohol affects balance and coordination and increases your willingness to take risks, so don't drink while canoeing. Canoeists should know how to swim and wear personal flotation devices approved by the U.S. Coast Guard.

## Turnbull pleased despite 60-point defeat

If the Northville girls track Coach Ann Turnbull was looking for a bright spot, her team's 60-point defeat to Plymouth Canton was tempered by 25 personal bests. The Chiefs won the meet 94-34 on May 3, but the Mustangs performed well.

"Although we lost by a lot, it was encouraging to see all those personal bests," she said. "The girls are really improving."

In 16 total events, the locals managed just three wins: Megan Holmberg in the 800-meter run (2:44.5), Trish Lukomski's effort in the 200 (28.5)

and a victory by the 800 relay squad (including Kamal Bagga, Kendra Huard, Rachel Davis and Lukomski).

The runner-up finishes came from Lukomski in the 100 (13.9), Lisa Almone in the high jump (4'-10"), Huard in the 400 (1:05.5) and Mari Kissenger in the 800 (2:47.5). The thirds included Cheryl Mittman in the mile (6:09.3), Angie Tune in the 300 hurdles (53.2), Bagga in the 200 (29.8) and Kissenger in the shot put (26'-7").

"Six performers from our team, including Ris Fleming and Maria Wen, were missing for the Canton meet because of a choir meet, so that didn't help us," Turnbull said.

**STAFFORD RELAYS:** No team standings were available at press time, but the Mustangs placed near the bottom of this 18-team event at Walled Lake Central on May 5 with just two points.

Those points came from a fifth place finish in the high jump relay. Fleming, Almone and Julie Buser combined to clear 13'-9". It was Northville's only top-six finish.

"We were consistent in our times, but we didn't have any outstanding performances," Turnbull said.

The Mustangs are now 1-4 overall in dual meet competition, 1-3 in the WLAA.

With its first loss in 11 tries this season, the Northville girls soccer squad may have already taken itself out of contention for the Western Lakes Activities Association (WLAA) title.

The Mustangs dropped a 1-0 defensive battle to host Plymouth Canton on May 5, thus falling to 8-1-2 overall, 4-1-2 in the WLAA. The locals also plummeted in the state Class A rankings from second to eighth.

"It was by far the most disappointing loss I've coached," Northville mentor Bob Paul admitted. "I felt (Canton) outplayed us the whole game. The bottom line was that we must have lost 75 percent of the 50-50 balls and that was the difference. Canton seemed to want the game more than we did."

"Unless something crazy happens, this may have taken the AA title away from us, and that was our main goal heading into the season," Paul admitted.

Neither team scored in the first half and the Mustang defense, particularly Ma Collizzi, did a nice job of containing Canton All-Stater Jenny Russett. But 11 minutes into the second half, a series of defensive breakdowns led to a breakaway for Russett, who converted the golden opportunity into the game-winning goal.

For the game, the Chiefs had a slight (21-13) advantage in shots on goal.

"We were very flat and non-aggressive against Canton," Paul said. "You just can't do that."

"I'm just hoping our lackluster performance had something to do with the minor Prom being the night before. I say 80-90 percent of our team is there. I don't make excuses but I'm hoping that had something to do with it because if it didn't, and we continue to play like this, we are in a bind."

In the opener, Smojver made his first-ever pitching start and responded with a three-hit victory. He went the distance, fanned two and allowed just two earned runs.

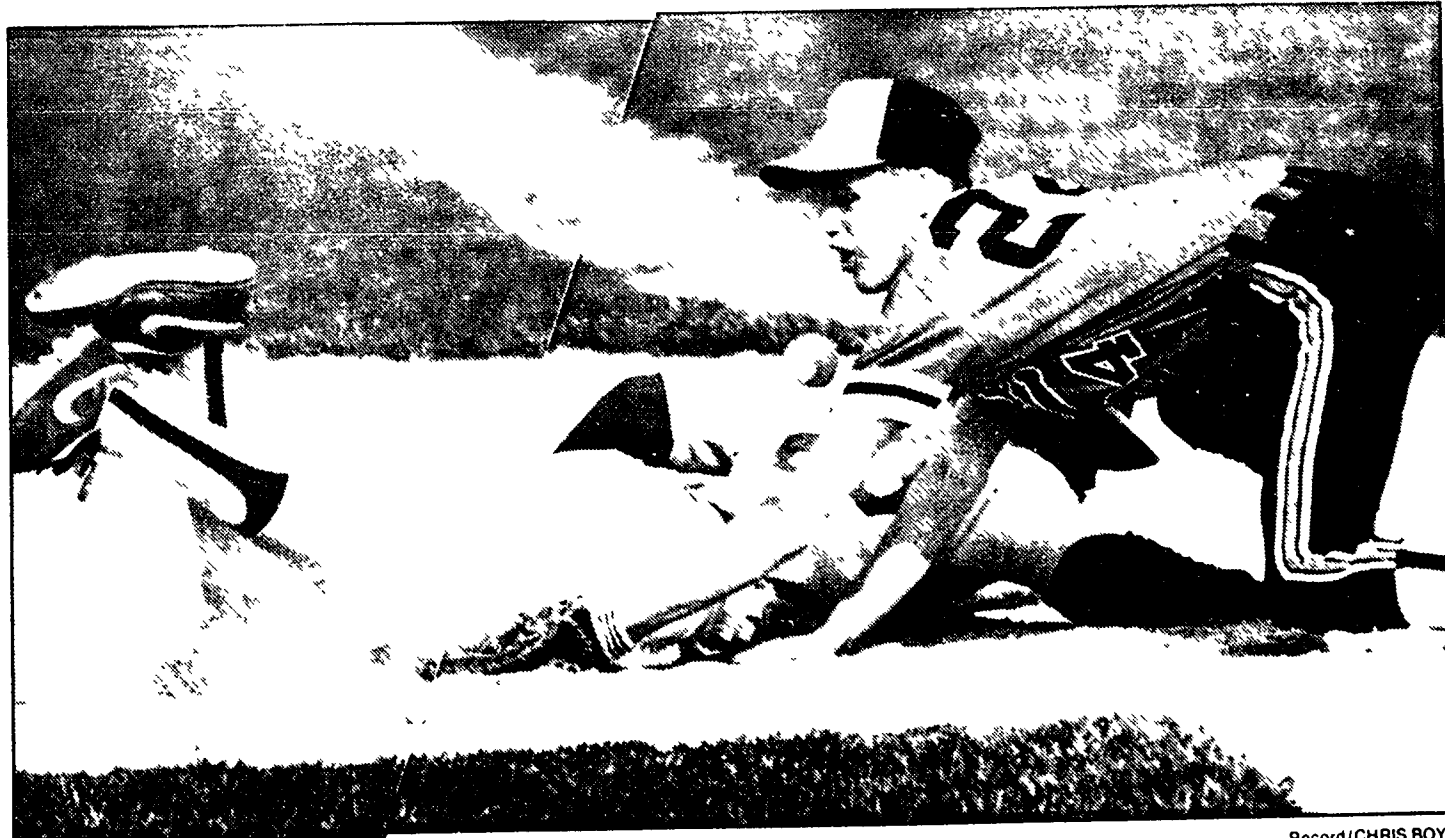
"George pitched a whale of a game," Frellick said. "We are playing well defensively and at the plate, so when we get a pitching performance like this, we are hard to beat."

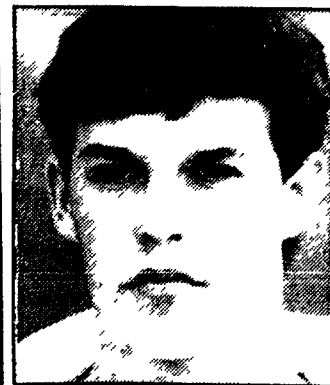

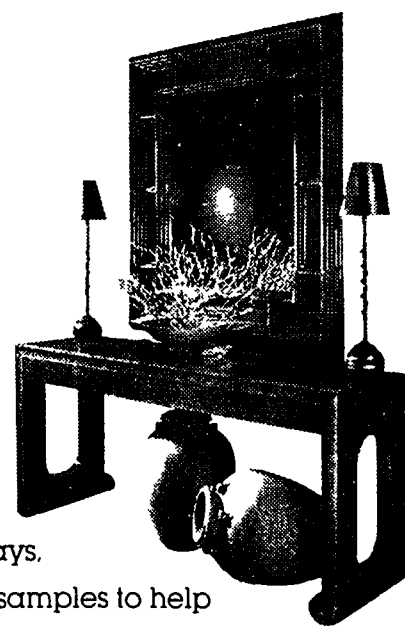
## King Kurtis

## Learn to take the time to eat right

About a fourth of Americans in recent food industry surveys said speed and ease of preparation were their most important considerations when buying food. More than a third said they rarely had more than 30 minutes to fix a meal.

Recent consumer focus-group research conducted by the U.S. Department of Agriculture found people may feel their busy lifestyles—which require them to eat on the run—don't allow enough time to prepare healthy meals. Their primary consideration when determining what to eat or cook may be how to save time.

Many time-saving food options are available. The Association of Home Appliance Manufacturers (AHAM) estimates that 75 percent of American households now have a microwave oven. Today's supermarkets also offer a great variety of heat-and-serve items. The problem, according to Dianne Odland, a nutritionist from USDA's Human Nutrition Information Service, is that many "quick to fix" recipes aren't quick enough; and many convenience foods, which can be real time savers, are high in calories, fat, sugars and sodium.

Odland said, "The key to enjoying nutritious meals in minutes is the same as for meals that take lots of time to fix and serve—and that is to follow the Dietary Guidelines." The Dietary Guidelines for Americans are seven basic principles that encourage variety, balance and moderation in food consumption. The first two guidelines encourage people to eat a variety of foods that provide enough essential nutrients and calories to maintain a desirable weight; the other five describe special characteristics of good eating, suggesting people eat an adequate amount of starch and fiber and avoid too much fat, sugar, sodium and alcohol.

The guidelines are the basis of USDA's new public education effort, "Eating Right... The Dietary Guidelines Way," which explains nutritious ways Americans can fix meals in minutes, shop for and prepare foods, plan menus, enjoy bag lunches, snacks and desserts, and eat out.

When preparing meals is a race against time, you have to be well-

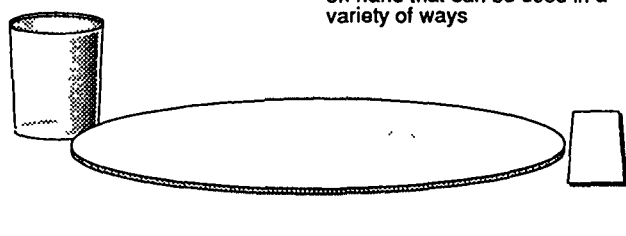

organized in order to play "beat the clock." According to Odland, there are two ways you can save time—by reducing the "active time" you are actually involved in food preparation and by reducing the "total time" it takes to fix and cook the meal from start to finish.

She offered these time-saving tips for Americans who may only have time for fast-paced foods:

- Make sure your foods, cooking utensils and equipment are arranged conveniently for quick work.

- Keep a supply of versatile foods on hand that can be used in a variety of ways—such as an assortment of canned and frozen vegetables, ground beef, chicken, and so forth.

- Give some advance thought to your meals—even if it's only making a mental note of what you want to eat tomorrow so you can remember to do things such as defrosting meat overnight in the refrigerator if you don't have a microwave.

- Make a game plan. Have a logical order in mind for the tasks involved in preparing the meal. Start a portion of the meal that involves more total time than active time—such as putting the rice on to simmer—then work on another portion—such as cutting up your salad ingredients.

- Focus your efforts on one part of the meal. Don't choose a meal where each component requires elaborate effort. If the main dish requires special attention, add a simple vegetable or salad. If the main dish is simple, dress up the vegetables or make an interesting side dish.

- Make the time you do have available work doubletime. If you can cook on the weekends, fix double or triple portions and freeze the leftovers in meal-size portions.

- Use time-saving cooking methods. Try microwaved or stove-top versions of dishes you normally cook in the oven. One-dish meals save clean-up time.

- Use microwave ovens, toaster ovens, countertop convection ovens, pressure saucepans or cookers, electric fry pans and crockpots if possible; they can save total or active time.

- Use cookware in which food can be cooked, served and stored.

One time-saving tip many Americans find helps them make the most of their minutes and meals is fixing dishes that create leftovers with multiple uses. According to Odland, versatile leftovers are those offering a variety of ways to use them that are totally different from the original meal—and more inventive than the sandwich.

Large cuts of meat or other foods that come in large portions often make for good versatile leftovers. Leftover chicken or turkey can be frozen in meal-sized portions for later use in casseroles, stir-fry dishes, sandwiches, soups, stews and salads. Look for new recipes that use foods you often have left over, and create your own line of versatile leftovers to carry you through a busy week.

Many Americans, when pressed for time, may turn to the convenience foods—vegetables in heat-and-serve pouches, mixes to which you add only water, frozen dinners, and so forth. While these foods may save you time in the kitchen, you have little control over the amount of fat and sodium. Be sure to read the nutrition and ingredient labels.

Many convenience foods are available in low-calorie, lowfat or low-sodium versions. It's important to know, however, that lower-sodium versions are not necessarily low in fat. Lowfat products also may be high in sodium. Read the labels to find the ones that are lower in fat and sodium, and think about how the nutritional value of these foods may compare to the foods you typically eat.

## Assess your physical fitness with this quiz

The aspect of wellness that is most easily recognized is physical fitness. You can tell, just by looking, the difference between a person who plays racquetball or takes aerobics dance classes five times a week and one who plays Trivial Pursuit.

Exercising has become a national religion. There are runners, swimmers, bicyclists, tennis players and yoga enthusiasts everywhere. The benefits of all this sweating is well documented. Exercising counters chronic fatigue, premature aging and hypertension. It is closely related to psychological well-being.

At the very least, a well-toned body is good to look at. But tight tummies and big biceps are largely by-products of a more important form of fitness: the healthiness of the whole person.

True physical well-being encompasses proper, natural breathing; it thrives on good basic nutrition; and it requires a rest period that allows the body to recharge.

Diet is an essential ingredient. Mi-

chael Jacobsen, Ph.D., director of the Center for Science in the Public Interest, has said that at least two-thirds of Americans would improve their health by following a few guidelines: less fat, sugar, salt and highly processed food; more unprocessed foods and fiber.

But intake without exercise is not enough. Despite all the press coverage of "fitness freaks," about half of all Americans still say they don't exercise at all.

It's true that the body-beautiful sweepstakes has some spectacular casualties. Compulsive workers can become compulsive runners on the road to burnout or injury. And people who exercise heavily are not immune to heart attacks and other serious illness.

The watchword is "moderation." Anything can be overdone and well-being cannot be achieved merely by whipping oneself into physical shape. What is missing from many exercise routines is compassion for one's body—the loving care that protects it from over-exercising and allows it periods of rest.

The questions below should help you assess your own physical condition. Circle (A) for always, (F) for frequently, (S) for seldom or (N) for never. There is no perfect score. In fact there's no scoring at all, although if most of your answers are "never" you might want to take your pulse right away.

Finally, you might want to make a copy of the quiz before you answer it, so you can take it again in a few months to see how you're doing; or clip it out and answer the questions later in a different color ink to keep a record of your progress.

1. I am conscious of the ingredients in the foods I eat and of the effects on me. (A), (F), (S), (N).

2. I am aware of my need for a balanced intake of protein, carbohydrates, fats, vitamins, minerals, fiber and water and my diet fulfills these needs. (A), (F), (S), (N).

3. I avoid overeating and abusing alcohol and other drugs and don't use these behaviors to try and solve boredom or depression. (A), (F), (S), (N).

4. I am aware of the effects on my health of excessive salt, sugar, fat and caffeine and limit their use accordingly. (A), (F), (S), (N).

5. I eat in a relaxed, unhurried way. (A), (F), (S), (N).

6. I know my ideal weight and stay within a few pounds of it. (A), (F), (S), (N).

7. I notice my posture and the way I am breathing and know that these affect my health. (A), (F), (S), (N).

8. I get aerobic, cardiovascular exercise at least three times a week, for at least 20 minutes at a time. (A), (F), (S), (N).

9. I practice stretching exercises such as hatha yoga regularly. (A), (F), (S), (N).

10. I nurture my physical self through massage, long walks, sports activities, etc. (A), (F), (S), (N).
