Budget bartering: Three Novi City Council members — Nancy Covert, Joseph Toth and Tim Pope — tonight plan to unveil an alternative to the \$11-million budget now proposed for 1990-91. Pope said Friday the trio isn't ready to make any disclosures before the meeting, because they'll be fine tuning their suggestions this weekend. The countdown is on for the council, because the final budget must be okayed by May 21.

The city council meets at 8 p.m. at the Novi Civic Center.

Cicchelli's Grievance Denied: The Novi School Board voted unanimously at its May 10 meeting to deny John Cicchelli's grievance which alleged that he was dismissed from Novi High School's varsity basketball coaching position without due process. Details of that ruling will appear in the Thursday edition of the Novi News.

Horsing Around

Special equestrians benefit from largess

When 9-year-old Carrie Searfos donated her horse Crackers to the Tollgate 4-H Education Center, it wasn't because she had tired of riding.

Rather, she understood the fun and value of horseback riding and wanted to share the joy of riding with other disabled children.

"It was partly her idea," said David Searfos of his daughter, who is disabled. "She thought it was a shame that he stood there (in its former stable) for days before she would come and ride him. She wanted to share him with other kids."

So in April, Tollgate's 4-H Exceptional Equestrians, a horseback riding program for physically, developmentally and emotionally disabled riders, received a new horse.

Tollgate Farm is located on the corner of Twelve Mile and Meadowbrook roads in Novi.

Although the riding program at Tollgate Center is still in its infancy, statewide the program has been in existence for the past 18 years.

"We had always had a waiting list for kids to get in," said Thomas Schneider, who has been involved with several other riding programs in Oakland County before becoming director of the newly created Tollgate program. "We thought this would be a marvelous place to get this going."

Employees and volunteers at Tollgate have been working diligently to get the Tollgate grounds prepared and are excited for the program kick-

off on June 1.

"This program gives them freedom," said Cindy Richards, who coordinates the program at Tollgate. "Some of these kids can't walk and when they get on a horse they are able to move."

And Searfos praises the riding program for the same reason.

"For you it is nothing to ride a horse, but for a child that is in a wheelchair they can move around like never before," Searfos said.

Searfos' daughter is not confined to a wheelchair, but he said that she does have "certain limitations."

Before handicapped children are

accepted into the riding program, their medical records and general physical condition are gone over thoroughly. Richards said they are able to accept children with many different types of disabilities but there are certain cases their particular program cannot service.

"For example we cannot service someone that is paralyzed from the neck down," Richards said.

The children are always with certified handicapped riding instructors, and the education center recruits many volunteers who work with the children.

"Each child starts off riding with

three volunteers," Richards said. And once their skill level improves and the children are more comfortable with the animals, they require less supervision.

"They (the children) come in scared, but once they leave you can't get them off," Richards said.

Currently the Tollgate program has five horses and are shopping for more. Richards estimates that they need a total of eight horses to get their spring and summer programs off the ground. The center looks for people willing to donate very friendly, docile horses, which are ideal for their particular riding program.

"There is such a tremendous need for programming for the handicapped," said Richards, who estimates there are 50,000 handicapped children in Oakland County.

"This program is for therapeutic and educational purposes as well," Richards said. Not only do the children come out to ride for an hour once a week, but they are taught animal care, and social and decision-making skills, Richards said.

The Tollgate Center is equipped to take on as many as 75 student riders during their spring and summer sessions. They have not yet filled the roster and it is on a first-come, first-served basis. The cost of the program is \$40 for an eight-week session and they also offer a two-week summer camp for the same price.

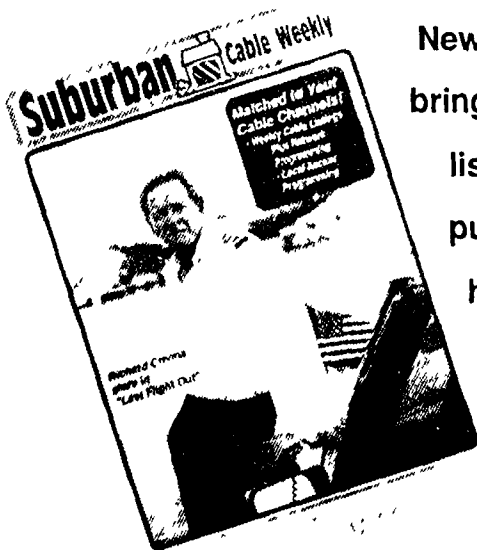
But because the program is funded through the 4-H organization as well as grants and donations, there is financial aid available for riders that qualify.

The Monday-Thursday publication dates not only give advertisers a second-of-the-week option, but also allow

them to more easily coordinate their advertising with any or all of the 13 suburban Observer & Eccentric newspapers which are also published on Mondays and Thursdays.

The Record, the News and the Observer & Eccentric newspapers all have the same parent company which is Suburban Communications Corporation, based in Livonia.

The news department for both the Monday and Thursday editions will be directed by managing editor Ann Willis and editor Bob Needham. Sales efforts will be directed by sales manager Mike Jetchick.

The Monday newspaper will carry a newsstand price of 50 cents, but current subscribers to the Record will receive the Monday paper free of charge for three months.

State mulls equal education

A subcommittee of state representatives is mulling three proposed constitutional amendments aimed at "equitable opportunity" in state school funding.

They anticipate a lawsuit in which Michigan's school funding system may be held unconstitutional because it provides only \$2,500 per pupil in some districts and \$8,000 in others.

"There are districts out there twisting in the wind," said Rep. William Keith, D-Garden City. A nine-term lawmaker, Keith chairs both the subcommittee and the House Education Committee.

The trick is to write constitutional language that (1) a court could use in saying Michigan is failing its poorer school districts and (2) allows the Legislature to rewrite the budget itself to meet the "equitable" test.

"It should be illegal to have a \$2,500 to \$8,000 disparity in school funding," Rep. Kirk Profit, D-Ypsilanti, said at last week's meeting. A freshman, Profit has a district that neighbors western Wayne and southern Oakland and Livingston counties.

"The danger," replied the veteran Keith, "is that we're putting ourselves at the mercy of the courts."

Rep. James Kosteva, D-Canton, agreed, noting that the Kentucky Supreme Court ordered an education program costing \$1.2 billion.

A legislative staff analysis said the highest courts in Arkansas, California, Connecticut, Kentucky, Montana, New Jersey, Texas, Washington, West Virginia and Wyoming have declared unconstitutional their states' school financing plans.

But Kosteva, a third-term, and freshman Susan Grimes Munsell, R-Howell, are uncertain the public will accept an "equitable opportunity" amendment.

Munsell wants to see such an amendment supported by two of the biggest players in educational funding: the Michigan State Chamber of Commerce (business) and the Michigan Education Association (teachers union). "I don't feel we can move forward without those two," she said.

Kosteva has grave questions about whether the public will buy equitable funding. "Politically, there's a real lack of support. No one has fire in their belly," he said.

Kosteva also fears the public will see it as "a pig in a poke" — something costly that fails to benefit their hometown schools.

Here are the three proposed constitutional amendments:

- House Joint Resolution (HJR) Q requires the Legislature to provide "an efficient system" of public schools ensuring "equitable opportunity for a thorough education."

- Sponsored by Profit and co-sponsored by Keith, it is the shortest and simplest of the three. For that reason, Profit says it's the most understandable, the most salable and the best.

- HJR-S requires the Legislature to fund schools "on an equitable basis." It also gives constitutional status to local boards of education — the meaning of which puzzles lawmakers. Further, it adds sex to the list of reasons (religion, race, color and national origin) for non-discrimination.

Sponsor is Rep. James O'Neill, D-Saginaw, the acknowledged House expert on school funding. Keith is a co-sponsor.

- Senate Joint Resolution O started out identical to HJR-S but was amended in the Senate Education Committee to make education "a fundamental right."

Keith thinks the term is "overkill."

SJR-O is sponsored by Dan DeGrow, R-Port Huron, the Senate GOP expert on school funding. The Senate Education Committee reported it out without recommendation. Thus, SJR-O is in limbo, not on the Senate calendar but not dead.

Some subcommittee members, such as Munsell, like the idea of prohibiting sex discrimination. But the consensus is that it doesn't belong in an "equitable funding" proposal.

The House and the Senate, each by a two-thirds vote, would have to place the measure on the ballot.

A majority of all Michigan voters would have to say yes to amend the constitution.

And that presents another problem to Keith. "We could put this out (on the ballot), and the public could say no. Then what do we do?" he asked. "There would be no pressure on the Legislature."

Members recalled that voters in 1989 rejected two separate sales tax increases for educational funding and virtually all "reform" proposals in the last 20 years.

Said Kosteva to Profit: "Your goal is laudable, but how do we sell it? I'm trying to keep one foot in reality."

Support for mandatory school age

YPSILANTI — City officials gave Gov. James J. Blanchard his warmest applause in a recent speech when he renewed his support for raising the mandatory school attendance age to 18.

"If we think we can keep them only to 16 and think we've really joined the world, then we are completely out of it," Blanchard said to city, township and county officials from the 15th and 16th Congressional Districts.

Prospects are good in the House of Representatives, but the Senate has turned down the idea, he said.

"As a matter of courtesy, we sent the matter over to the State Board of Education, and they voted 4-4, meaning it was turned down. The dummies didn't know the law was written so we could do without them,

and we are.

"So the bureaucracy in our state Department of Education and state board is, from time to time, part of the problem."

The State Board of Education, an elective body, is split 4-4 between Democrats and Republicans.

The mandatory school attendance age has been 16 since the 1940s. In his "State of the State" message, Blanchard advocated raising it to 18 or until the student graduates, whichever comes first.

The governor made it an economic development issue, saying Michigan needs a better-educated work force to compete in the world economy.

National statistics show Michigan has a highly regarded education system but relatively low high school graduation rates because in the past it was easy for young people to get high-paying auto plant jobs.

The age plan is embodied in House Bill 4616, sponsored by Rep. Claude Trim, R-Waterford, and co-sponsored by James Kosteva, D-Canton.

Trim has not asked for hearings on the bill, according to a staff member of the House Education Committee.

In interviews, many suburban lawmakers have been cool to raising the mandatory school age. Their general view is that teachers would be forced to put up with older, unmotivated students who resent being in a classroom.

Blanchard, speaking to a largely favorable audience in Eastern Michigan University's conference center, also asked municipal officials to:

- Watch closely how Youth Employment Corps workers perform. "Make sure it works." YES puts 15,000 young people into summer jobs, "more than all other states

together. But if five make a mistake, we hear about it in Lansing. Every year it's a fight to get it through (the Legislature)."

- Lobby legislators for his COPS program, a system of two-year grants to enable city police departments to hire additional staff for neighborhood work in crime prevention. "It works in Kalamazoo," he said.

- Support his school property tax relief plan. It would limit school operating tax increases to the rate of consumer price inflation and provide \$25 million in the existing state budget to pay school districts the difference.

Blanchard admitted it wasn't a cut, but added: "The only reason we haven't had more meaningful property tax relief in the last 20 years is that someone always promises more — a pie in the sky."

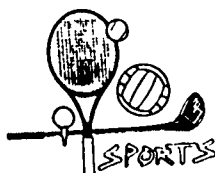

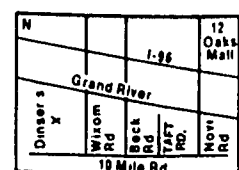

MONDAY UPDATE

Township reconsiders Haller vote

The door may be ajar for an August vote on a Haller library proposal.

Trustee James Nowka told the Northville Township Board of Trustees Thursday he would like to see the library issue on the Aug. 7 ballot and asked for a special board meeting this evening (May 14) to discuss a second election.

"The responsibility to respond to the needs of the community just doesn't go away," he said. "I recognize that we have had an election . . . and we may lose again (but) we should have a meeting to see if it is worthwhile." Board action would be required this evening to place a

library question on the August primary ballot. The deadline for issues for the primary is May 15 at 4 p.m.

The balance of the board refused to close the door on the Haller plan — which met a 2-1 defeat at the polls May 1 — but members did not rush to Nowka's side.

"I hate to lose the property (but) whether to put it on the ballot or not . . . I've got to think it over," said Trustee Donald Williams.

Trustee Richard Allen called the vote a "landslide." "I'm disappointed it failed, but it was so overwhelming that it sent a message," he said.

Trustee Thomas Handyside agreed.

"The community lost an opportunity for a wonderful asset," he said. "But the people have spoken. I would not

be in favor of putting it on the ballot again."

But Nowka said the pro-library forces "did not address the issue — taxes."

"We need to identify how much (of a resident's tax bill) goes to the township so people have a clearer idea," he said. "I hope that we can find a vehicle so people can appreciate their condition."

Supervisor Georgina Goss said she could not support the Haller proposal in its current state, but suggested that negotiations could provide new ideas.

"I'd like to see us work with Mrs. Haller on other alternatives," she said. "(Maybe she could) extend the letter of intent."

Nowka said he would place a call to Haller over the weekend to ask for direction on the 72-acre parcel on the corner of Six Mile and Sheldon roads. He suggested the board call a special Monday meeting if she was amenable to changes in her original letter.

"If this deal falls through, I think the issue will be remembered for a long time as a negative turning point for the township," he said.

The board must announce special meetings at least 18 hours in advance of the meeting. If a 7:30 meeting is called for this evening, notice would have to be posted at township hall by 1:30 a.m. May 14.

Freak storm leaves wheels under weather

Heavy winds wreaked havoc with electrical wires in Northville City Thursday, and were doubly responsible for the destruction of a car.

Firefighter Hugh Jordan, responding to a 2 p.m. report of a downed electrical line at 362 Welch Road, parked his 1985 Mercury Cougar on the corner of High and Main streets opposite the city's fire station. He returned to find a 40-foot maple tree lying across the trunk of his car.

While workers from the Northville-based Mountain Top Green Ridge Tree Service quickly removed the tree, Jordan had to put up with some

teasing from people passing by about his new "low-rider."

"I'm just worried because my golf clubs were in the trunk," he joked.

"Today's my day off, too," he added, saying, "Oh well, I guess that's what insurance is for."

Firefighters responded to several other calls of wind damage to wires. At 5:43 a.m., a wire was reported down at 240 Fairbrook St. At 9:12 a.m., a cable television wire was down behind the Northville Park Apartments at Eight Mile and Novi roads.

Winds in the metropolitan Detroit area were reportedly gusting as high as 53 miles per hour, according to the WDIV, Channel Four Weatherwatch, with sustained winds between 20 and 30 miles per hour.

City hitches ride on Heritage Trail

Northville city officials have voted to participate in a historical project that would make the local Ford Valve Plant a major stop on the Ford Heritage Trail.

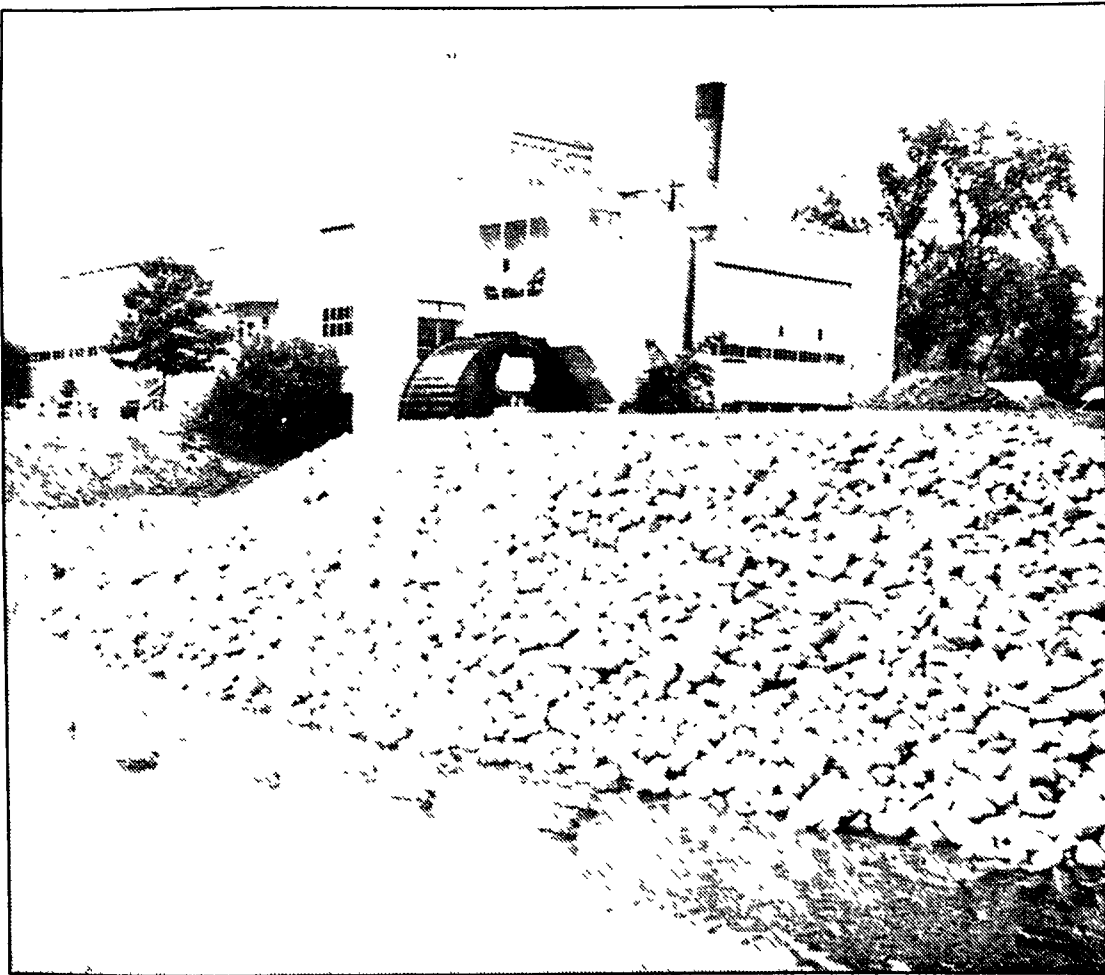
The trail, featuring more than 20 historical sites in and around Wayne County, commemorates the contributions of Henry Ford to the history and economy of southeastern Michigan.

The Northville City Council agreed to donate \$1,000 to the local match of a state grant to print flyers advertising the project.

The \$1,000 donation comes from the City Council Ceremonial account, a fund which is used to pay for items like the annual board employee dinner and contributions to the Jaycees Fourth of July celebration.

City Manager Steven Walters called the city's initial donation "seed money," saying, "If the thing gets off the ground and gets recognized, it's conceivable that the state will contribute some regular funding."

"I'd also note that this will help the city to upgrade the plant from a secondary structure to a major historical structure," said Mayor Chris Johnson.

The Northville Plant is listed as a contributing structure within the boundaries of the city's National Register historic district. Also, because the plant is more than 50 years old, it meets the secretary of the Interior's eligibility requirements for historic structures.

The original building was constructed in 1936, and additions were made in 1957 and 1966.

Several other communities and Comerica Bank have donated \$1,000 to the program. The communities include the cities of Dearborn, Plymouth and Westland, Plymouth and Canton townships, and the Village of Dundee. The Fairfield estates Foundation has donated an additional \$10,000, and Greenfield Village has pitched in \$2,000 for the program.

Grant coordinator Nancy Watkins of the Westland Historical Commission called the Northville Plant "one of the most important sites to be featured on this trail." She added, "Northville has been exemplary in its appreciation of its history, and the Mill Race Village is one of the best historical museums in the area."

The program's first project, publication of 500,000 travel brochures featuring the village industry mills, will be a joint effort between the Wayne County Parks Division and state Department of Transportation. The pamphlets will be distributed through state tourist agencies, travel information centers, and selected tourist attractions in and around Michigan.

The parks division also plans to publish a detailed booklet on the histories of each of the sites, including the Northville Plant. Interpretive signs would be erected at each of the sites as well. The first sign has already been put in place at the Waterford village industry plant in Northville Township.

"The Ford Heritage Trail will be a great asset to the City of Northville in that it will promote tourism and complement the image of Northville as a historic country town," Watkins wrote in a letter to Johnson. "The trail route will take visitors right down Main Street, where they can see the many beautifully restored Victorian buildings in your central business district."

The city council on April 25 knocked out a rezoning proposal for a 300-acre industrial park in Section 18, but the Meijer store, an integral part of the Grand Plan, may not even be down long enough for the count.

"They (Meijer) called me right away and said, 'We'd like to go forward; what do we need to do?'" I said, "Let me think ahead about it for a while." They have put a big investment in it. I don't think they're about to walk away from it at this point," said Community Development Director James Wahl.

Wahl said that a revamped Grand Plan might surface before either the planning commission, the city council or both sometime next week. But Meijer Inc. also has the option to go it alone. The industrial park and the store have been proposed as developments on land owned by former Novi resident Milford Campbell of the Cayman Islands.

"Sure," said Rick Morgan, senior real estate representative for the firm, when asked if the company would pursue its plans for a store at the southwest corner of Grand River Avenue and Wixom Road in Novi. Twenty-six acres of the proposed site are in Novi; 11 acres for the parking lot are in Wixom. The council's ruling meant that the 26 acres did not get the necessary rezoning to a business classification.

At an April 11 special city council

meeting on the Grand Plan, Morgan said that Meijer had entered into a purchase agreement with Campbell, the owner of the land, and had "considerable non-refundable money at risk."

In an April 2 Meijer letter to Campbell, a copy of which was packaged by the city in a volume on the Grand Plan, the corporation confirmed that it wished to exercise a Dec. 16, 1989 option agreement on the land. A copy of a check to Campbell for \$15,000 was enclosed.

Morgan referred all further discussion of the project to the company's public and consumer affairs coordinator, Jennifer White.

"At this point, we're reviewing this. We're looking at our options and trying to decide what our next course of action will be. A final decision has not been made at this point. This is the site we're interested in at this point," White said.

Meijer has a store in Northville Township eight miles away from the proposed Novi site, one in Brighton 15 miles away, and owns an additional site eight miles away in Commerce Township on Haggerty Road bordering Novi.

The proposed Novi store would also serve the growing communities of Wixom, Milford, Lyon Township and Milford Township.

White said the company has no set formula for store placement: "each market and each store is evaluated separately."

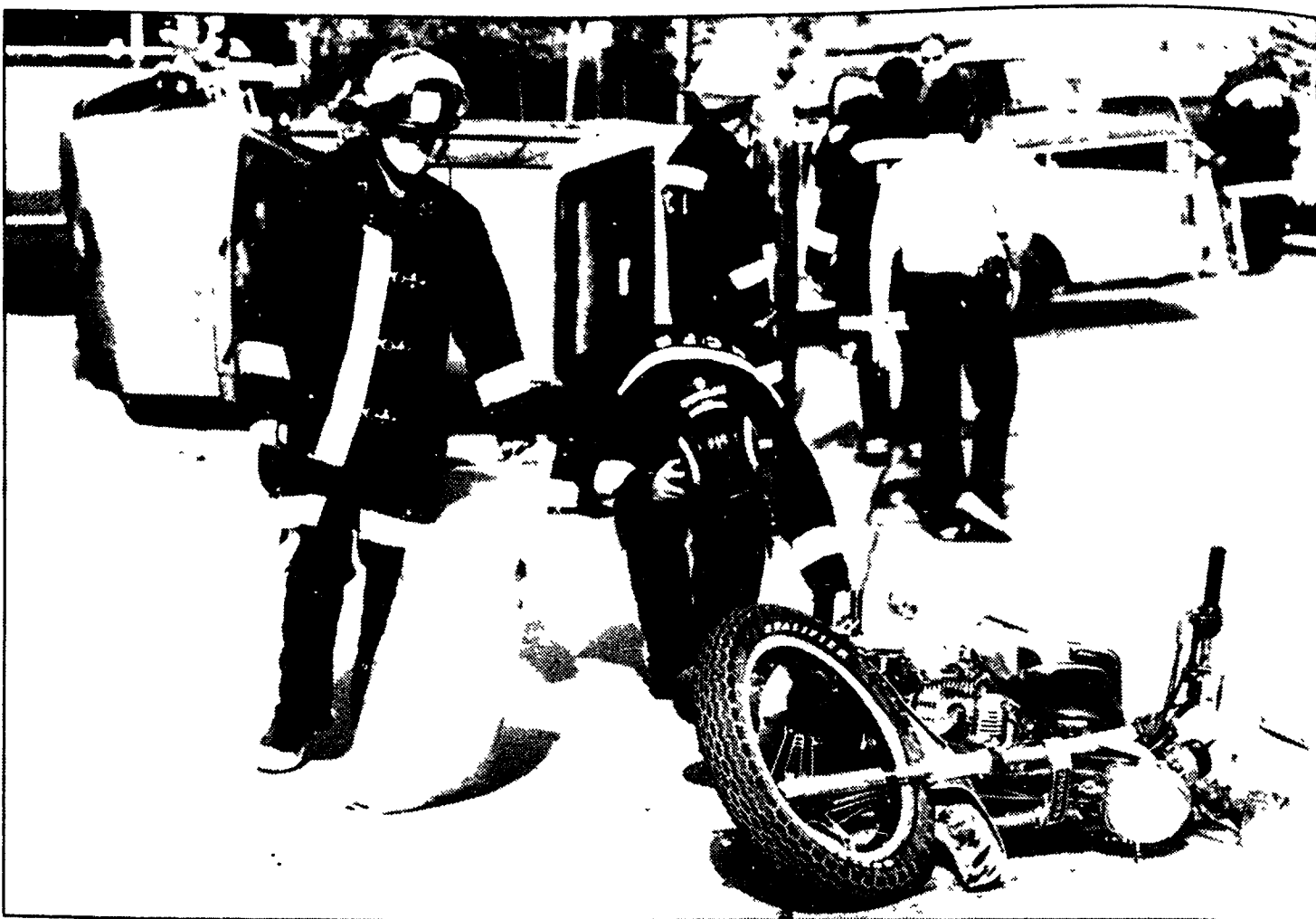

Student in motorcycle mishap

A Northville High School senior remained in intensive care Friday after being knocked off a motorcycle Tuesday, May 8, at the corner of Eight Mile and Sheldon roads.

Mark Edward Klokkena, 18, was listed in guarded condition at St. Mary Hospital in Livonia Friday morning.

According to witnesses at the scene Tuesday, Klokkena was turning onto Eight Mile from Sheldon at about 5:20 p.m. when he was struck by a Volkswagen Fox heading west on Eight Mile. The car flipped onto its left side during the accident, and was left lying in the middle of the intersection.

Gary Powell, the Novi resident driving the vehicle which struck Klokkena, said, "It wasn't my fault... he turned in front of me. I had the green light going west on Eight Mile."

"I don't know if he stalled or what, but he was right there in front of me," Powell said. "It was a pretty terrifying experience." Powell said the accident happened so fast he did not see

where Klokkena was coming from.

"I feel terrible," he added. "I wish I would have hit a car, I wish I would have hit a tree, anything but a person."

The left side of Powell's windshield was smashed in during the accident, apparently by Klokkena. "He took the full brunt of it, his head hit the windshield," said one firefighter at the scene.

The Honda motorcycle was left lying on its side near the middle of the street, its front wheel broken from between the mangled forks.

Community Emergency Medical Services and Northville rescue personnel responded almost immediately to the accident.

At the scene, gasoline was trickling from both the motorcycle and the overturned car. Several firefighters spread absorbent material on the gasoline to soak it up, while one stood on the side of Eight Mile with a hose in his hand, ready to put out any blaze.

The north two lanes of Eight Mile were closed and westbound traffic was routed onto the next lane south while emergency personnel strapped Klokkena to a board for transport.

As they splinted his shattered right ankle, Mark was heard to yell in pain.

Mark was taken to St. Mary Hospital in Livonia, where he spent several hours in surgery. Though he was reported to be in stable condition after surgery, Klokkena was readmitted to the intensive care unit Wednesday.

Klokkena's brother John, 23, said Thursday, "He's in a lot of pain but he's all right. Right now they think his brain might be bruised so they have him in intensive care under constant surveillance. He got his bell rung pretty good."

John said Mark's right ankle was broken at the joint and his toes dislocated in the accident. Mark was wearing John's motorcycle helmet — and driving John's bike — when he was hit.

"He just turned in front of the car, he just didn't see it," John said of his brother. "It usually happens the other way around, where the car driver doesn't see the bike."

"He just remembers flying through the air, landing on the pavement, and his leg hurting,"

Mark's father, Don Klokkena, re-

ported Friday that Mark's condition was improving. "There's nothing wrong but the broken ankle," he said.

"He had a concussion and he's bruised everywhere, but nothing else is broken," Klokkena expected his son would be able to return home within the week.

As to the cause of the accident, Klokkena said Mark had not talked much about it, because he remains under sedation. "I don't even know what direction he was going," the elder Klokkena said. "All he told John and I was, 'I never saw the car until he hit me.'"

After the accident, Powell said he wanted to see the speed limit on that stretch of Eight Mile from Novi Road to Taft Road dropped from 40 to 35 miles per hour. "It's just way too fast," he said.

Powell and several witnesses were taken to the Northville City police department after the accident, to file their accounts. City police were planning on interviewing Mark Friday afternoon, and would not comment on their findings or possible charges in the case until after they released their report.

Garlic becomes new herb of choice



Last month I was on the East Coast and I noticed it there.

Last week I was on the West Coast and saw it again but was told that it's been the "in" vegetable for the past six months.

Chicago is going crazy and using it in soups, garnishes, sauces and appetizers. Even here in the metropolitan area, where food trends are running six to nine months behind the coasts, garlic is cropping up as the herb de rigueur.

Even though garlic is experiencing a resurgence, it has been cultivated for the last 5,000 years. Ancient Egyptian writings attest to its importance as a crop as early as 3200 B.C.

And what a crop it was. Bulbs of garlic have been used medicinally — for strength and virility, as a germicide — to ward off vampires, and, lastly, as a food source.

We can credit the poor people of Yunnan, China, with bringing garlic to the culinary forefront.

They used the lily relative by mixing it with chopped liver and ate it raw because they had little fuel for cooking.

The Italians became known as garlic lovers, although it is mainly the Calabrians and the Sicilians who used the seasoning in so many of their dishes. Ironically, Northern Italians prefer various other spices.

More than three million metric tons of garlic are produced worldwide each year.

China, South Korea and Thailand rank as the top three garlic producers, followed by Spain, Egypt and India. The United States ranks seventh with about 100,000 metric tons grown annually, all or most being fresh bulbs from California.

The U.S. crop is mainly dehydrated for garlic powder, garlic salt and seasoning salt because these forms are more convenient for the food industry than raw garlic bulbs, which are susceptible to spoilage.

Gaining in popularity (and a big hit in the James Gang kitchen) is the processed chopped garlic available packed in oil in small glass jars. This virtually eliminates the peeling, chopping and potential sprouting that always occurs with the fresh variety.

I always keep a few bulbs of the fresh garlic around, and when I see them beginning to sprout, I peel them and place them in a small glass jar filled with oil in the fridge.

The oil is great for stir-frying and the garlic will keep almost forever.

Ah, but what are metropolitan Detroit's best kitchens doing with garlic? A random sampling found baked garlic appearing as an appetizer at R.I.K.'s, tossed with escargot and puff pastry at the Lark and pureed and reduced with top cream as a flavorful sauce for hearty venison and buffalo steaks at MacKinnon's.

Yours truly will never be able to forget the garlic soup which was a staple at the old Aliette's on Porter and 24th streets in Detroit's Mexican town.

Last fall, on a business trip to Chicago, upon being seated at Bistro 110 and ordering a glass of chardonnay, the waitperson brought a small breadboard with a few slices of warm bread, a mini-tub of whipped butter and a whole baked bulb of garlic.

I immediately thought about what would happen to may taste buds upon biting into a bulb of garlic, and sensing my trepidation, the waitperson suggested I use my butter knife to pry out the tender cloves and spread them like a paste over the butter spread bread. For a few minutes, I thought I had died and gone to heaven.

By the way, a side of Listerine is not needed because as the garlic bakes in liquid it mellows out dramatically.

Kitchen reigns as home's focus

There was a time not all that long ago that American kitchens were designed with one type of consumer in mind: the full-time homemaker with 2.6 children and a breadwinner husband.

Today, manufacturers are recognizing that the typical consumer has gone the way of newsreels and tail fins. One kitchen design simply can't meet everybody's needs. More and more, today's appliances are being designed for and marketed to groups such as disabled or elderly people, whose needs are much different from other consumers.

Nearly 40 million Americans have a permanent disability, the number of Americans 45-64 is expected to increase by one-third in the next decade, and more children than ever are helping with housework.

Considering the needs of the least-able user is the key to modifying or designing houses, work areas and products that everybody can use. This might range from simple and in-

expensive measures such as using a potato masher to turn knobs on a range; removing cabinet doors for easier access or something more extensive, such as building a kitchen around an adaptable "universal design."

A universal design includes wide, barrier-free aisles and smooth floors to allow for wheelchairs and walkers to move easily about. Work surfaces of varying heights accommodate those who are short or tall or who work seated. Good contrast between cabinets and appliances and in graphics on control panels are helpful to those with limited vision.

In the cooking area, built-in products are the most adaptable to special needs. Installing a drop-in range or cooktop at 32 inches — compared to the standard 36-inch counter height — can be a boon for wheelchair cooks — or at a higher level for a person who can't stoop or bend.

Microwave ovens are especially

useful for people with limited physical abilities. They can be installed at any height. The shallow cooking cavity is easy to reach, there's no flame or heating element, and the interior stays cool.

Side-by-side refrigerator/freezers have narrow doors for easier handling. Some models have deep door shelves and bins, baskets and shelves that pull out for easier access and use.

There are many simple in-home modifications that can help physically limited people. For example, elevate appliances with front-opening doors (dishwashers, clothes dryers) to the height needed for a wheelchair user or someone who can't stoop or bend. Lower a built-in oven for wheelchair use or raise it for someone with back problems.

Whirlpool Corp. offers use and care guides and microwave oven cookbooks in Braille, large type or on audio cassettes. Control panel over-

St. Julian is state's oldest winery

St. Julian Winery in Paw Paw is this state's oldest winery. It was founded by Mariano Meconi in Windsor, Ontario, as the Italian Wine Company in 1921. After the repeal of Prohibition in 1933, Meconi moved his operation across the river to Detroit.

To be nearer a source of fresh grapes, the winery relocated to Paw Paw in 1937.

An anti-Italian sentiment, prevalent during World War II as America fought fascist Italy, caused Meconi to rename the winery. He chose St. Julian, the patron saint of his village birthplace in Italy.

In the late 1940s, Meconi's sons Eugene and Robert and his son-in-law Apollo Braganini expanded the winery's influence. Through the 1970s — a heightened period of interest in dry wine nationwide — St. Julian Winery responded by planting French-American hybrid grape varieties, capable of withstanding the state's sub-freezing winter temperatures.

Since 1978, under the direction of David Braganini, Apollo's son, St. Julian Winery has become the state's largest single buyer of the hybrid grape varieties — Chambourcin, Chelois, Cayuga White, deChaunac, Foch, Chancellor Noir, Seyval Blanc and Vidal Blanc. These varieties produce dry, semi-dry and sparkling wines.

Additionally, St. Julian produces wine from two vinifera varieties, chardonnay and johannesberg riesling, that have shown promise of survival in the cold Michigan winters.

Within the domestic wine industry, winemakers make more hops, skips and jumps among wineries than a fast-packed checker game. This frequently causes product inconsistency. This is not the case at St. Julian since

winemaker Chas Chatterman has been with the winery since 1974.

St. Julian Winery can lay claim to a host of firsts. Among them, it takes credit for being the first Michigan winery to establish a wine-tasting room — in 1959. Currently, more than a quarter of a million visitors tour and taste at the winery each year.

Additional tasting centers and retail outlets are located throughout the state: in Frankemuth, Mackinaw City, Parma, Holly, Union Pier, Monroe and South Haven.

In the 1989 Michigan State Fair Wine Competition, St. Julian winery won two first places (gold medals), for the 1988 Vignoles (Sweet Reserve) and 1986 Chancellor Noir.

With a production of 45,000 cases of wine, made entirely from Michigan grapes, St. Julian is Michigan's largest producer, laying claim to 37 percent of the total sales from Michigan's 20 wineries.

A recent tasting of some of the winery's newest releases gives clear indication that St. Julian has the potential for remaining at the top of the state's wine industry.

Because of limited chardonnay plantings within the Lake Michigan Shore appellation, there are only 80 cases of the 1989 Chardonnay (\$14). Grapes for this wine were purchased at the premium price of \$1,500 per ton. The wine is Chablis-like, with typical earthy, steely aromas, but solid apple, pear flavors.

It was 100 percent barrel-fermented in one-year-old Nevers French oak and left four months *sur lie* for added complexity. Its crispness makes it a natural seafood accompaniment.

"Vignoles is an interesting wine to sell," Braganini contends. "People are unfamiliar

with it and are surprised to find how comparable it is to the style of a California chardonnay."

The 1988 Vignoles (\$9.50) is bone dry with good fruit characters. Its bold style is reminiscent of California chardonnay and its clean, fruit finish is appealing.

Punctual harvest (as opposed to late harvest) 1989 Riesling (\$9.50) showcases floral, apple blossom and apple fruit with hints of orange zest. The 1.75 percent residual sugar is not evident on the palate because it is balanced by high-side acidity which keeps it fresh and clean. It's a clear winner at this price.

"Seyval Blanc is our most popular wine," remarks Braganini. "We call it Paw Paw Piesporter." The 1989 version (\$5.50) is too sweet, by our standards, to accompany food, but it is a nice springtime sipper with fruit and mild cheese.

St. Julian produces an outstanding, lighter-style red wine from chambourcin grapes. The 1988 Chambourcin (\$9.50) sports berry, cherry, fruit characters with hints of American oak. It's soft and approachable — a red wine for people who say, "I don't like red wine."

If you like cream sherry, St. Julian produces one of the best. It's labeled Michigan Light Solera Cream Sherry (\$7.50/500mL). Wines in the solera date back to 1971. It's full, rich, nutty, and dessert in itself. It could be poured over vanilla ice cream or incorporated in a vanilla cheese cake recipe.

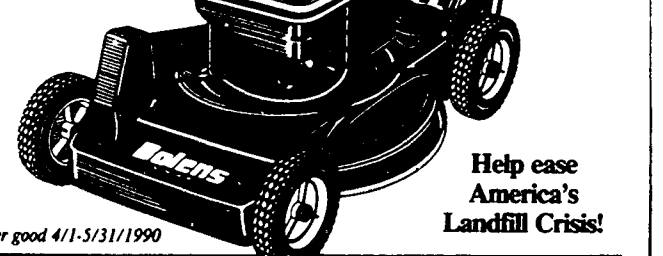

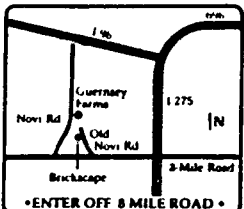

'Tis the season to build houses

Spring, the season of renewal, also signals a rebirth in the housing industry.

More builders appear to have work in progress, more buyers seem to be in the market, and financial institutions are pitching mortgages, some in a big way.

Comerica Bank and a major acquisition, Bloomfield Mortgage, processed more than 6,600 mortgages and home equity loans with an aggregate value of \$578 million last year in Wayne and Oakland counties.

But the bank isn't resting on those laurels.

Comerica recently aired radio ads advising that it will meet with mortgage applicants at their convenience outside of normal business hours and the traditional bank setting.

"I don't think we're doing any more advertising now than in the last several years," said Douglas Cook, president of Comerica Mortgage. "The market has always been very competitive here."

Comerica spends three times as much money advertising during the first three months as it does the rest of the year, Cook said.

While radio ads are designed to put a financial institution's name in

the public eye, most advertising is directed to real estate agents and publications likely to catch the eyes of builders, bankers said.

"A lot of our product advertising is delivered by hand to Realtors' offices," said Micheal Lubig, manager of the mortgage department at Standard Federal Bank. "It gives us a chance to go into their offices, try to see if we can help them."

Comerica also focuses on agents and builders, Cook said. "Consumers aren't in the market all the time—maybe only every five to 10 years," he said.

Appealing directly to home buyers can be a hit-or-miss proposition, agreed John Owens, director of marketing communications for National Bank of Detroit.

"From an advertising perspective, we want position in the mind," Owens said. "Someone may not want a mortgage this year, but maybe next. We want to make them aware we're in this business."

NBD is running a television ad which depicts a father and young children running through a sprinkler at home. The voice-over extolling the desirability of homeownership, con-

cludes, "The right bank can make the difference between worrying about it and enjoying it."

The goal is to promote both mortgages and home equity loans, Owens said.

"A home loan for most people is one of the hardest decisions. It really is an anxiety process. We want to make them feel comfortable with the process," Owens said.

Comfort means different things to different lenders.

Shore Mortgage of Southfield has introduced a telephone application procedure where a buyer can talk to a loan officer, select a loan package, get a completed application through the mail, sign it and send it back for processing.

Changing times call for different business practices, said Kathy Foley, spokeswoman for Shore Mortgage.

"When you have two working people in a household, they can't routinely take time out from 10 to 4 to take out a loan application," she said.

Vantage Mortgage of Southfield offers a free, pre-qualifying certification. Everything except an appraisal and credit history is verified before a buyer finds a specific property on

which to make an offer.

"We are trying to do the most we can to get the most business," said Donald VanAkin, Vantage president.

"Basically, everything competition offers, we've already done," said Lubig of Standard Federal. "We call it the anytime, anywhere mortgage and we pre-qualify."

Lubig sees the period "now through the end of July" as the prime season for mortgage hunters.

Extra touches like pre-qualifying, pre-approval, taking application information over the telephone and meeting customers outside of regular business hours are becoming increasingly important for financial institutions.

"I think they do shop service more than ever before," Lubig said. "One of the worst things a consumer can do is shop rates and after closing find out they're sending the payment to San Francisco or something."

"If you looked down the table, we are all fairly close to each other," said Owens. "Many people come to their primary institution first."

"You'll find generally service is what sells a mortgage, not the rate," VanAkin said.

Be informed in buying business

I am thinking about buying a small business that has been in existence for more than five years. What are some of the questions I should be asking the seller to obtain information that significantly will influence my decision to buy?

You want to find out everything you can about the business under consideration. When buying a company, there is no unimportant information.

Unfortunately, many prospective buyers rely primarily on financial statements' data and other available documentation the seller offers to make "informed" purchase decisions.

Although all of this may be very useful, it is not where you should start and stop. You should feel free to probe and investigate every aspect of the operation.

Ask the seller if you may speak with some of the firm's past and present customers. You

may also ask to conduct a random sample survey among company employees.

Other key questions directed at the seller would relate to the major areas of the business such as production, marketing, financial and personnel. This may be done during the first few meetings with a seller.

After that time, you will be in a position to ask the following questions:

• Which aspect of this business do you enjoy the most? (The answer should take a while.)

• What aspects of the business do you find the most challenging? (Wait for the answer and don't stop probing until you get it.)

• If you had to do it all over again, what would you do differently? (This one works to identify all the "lost opportunities" as well as any "mistakes" the seller feels personally responsible for.)

• If money was not a constraint at times, what could you have done with this company? (He or she probably will tell you in the next five minutes everything that is wrong with the business.)

• Should an independent audit be used to reveal problems with a company?

An audit is verification of financial data using procedures and test known as GAAS (generally accepted auditing standards). While these procedures are the best known for checking the reliability of financial data, they have not been designed to uncover fraud and actions of collusion on the part of company management.

It's a home buyer's market in Metro Detroit

Metropolitan Detroit is one of the best housing buys in the country, according to The Prudential Home Affordability Index.

The index measures the percentage of a family's gross monthly income it takes to make a mortgage payment with a standard down payment of 20 percent on an average-priced home in an area.

Detroit, with an average monthly mortgage burden of 18.5 percent of gross household income, ranked 33rd on the "favorability" scale of 150 U.S. markets surveyed. Peoria, Ill., ranked first with an average monthly burden of 8.8 percent. San Francisco, at 54.1 percent, was 150th.

The latest index covers the last three months of 1989. As a general rule of thumb, financial institutions here limit monthly mortgages, including principal, interest, taxes and insurance, to 28 percent of income . . . 36 percent including all other debt.

The index for the fourth quarter showed that in 97 of the top 150 markets, homeowners wouldn't have to set aside more than 28 percent of income . . . percent including all other debt.

Three metro areas in Michigan — Grand Rapids, Flint and Lansing/East Lansing — ranked better than Detroit. Grand Rapids, with an average monthly mortgage burden of 15.6 percent of household income, ranked sixth. Flint, at 16.6 percent, ranked 14th. And Lansing/East Lansing, at 17 percent, ranked 16th.

Ann Arbor, the only other metro area in the state to appear on the listing, ranked 51st with a monthly mortgage payment of 20 percent.

A good balance between supply and demand has resulted in a favorable affordability rating for housing in Detroit, said Jerome M. Maranski, vice president of The Prudential Great Lakes Realty in Birmingham.

For the study's purposes, metro Detroit includes Oak-

land, Wayne, Macomb, Monroe, St. Clair, Livingston and Lapeer counties.

Metro areas in California make up eight of the 10 most expensive housing markets in the survey. They ranged from 45.1 percent in Oxnard/Ventura to 54.1 percent in San Francisco.

Tremendous appreciation in the value of real estate in California is one big reason that financial institutions there generally allow a greater percentage of income to be applied to mortgages, said Jeanne Henderson, spokesperson for The Prudential Real Estate Affiliates.

"For some reason if they default, we'll take the property and make money anyway," Henderson said.

As good as housing values are in metro Detroit, several areas in the Midwest had slightly better percentages, according to the survey.

They include:

- Kansas City, Missouri — 17.1 percent
- St. Louis, Missouri — 17.4 percent
- Indianapolis, Indiana — 18 percent
- Cincinnati, Ohio/Covington, Kentucky — 18.1 percent
- Cleveland, Ohio — 18.2 percent
- Midwest metropolitan areas with worse percentages than Detroit include:
- Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where the monthly mortgage payment on the average-priced home is 19.1 percent of gross monthly income.
- Chicago, Illinois — 21.6 percent
- Buffalo, New York — 21.7 percent
- Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania — 22.5 percent

The index is compiled quarterly by WEFA of Philadelphia.

Aging baby boomers segment housing market

As the baby boomer starts worrying about retirement and the baby bust matures, housing demand will become more sharply segmented than in the past, according to the National Association of Realtors.

The study, "Demographics in the U.S. — The Segmenting of Housing Demand," anticipates strong housing demand and stable house values over the next decade in spite of the smaller baby bust population producing fewer prospective buyers than the baby boomers.

The demand will be fueled by widely varied housing needs — for affluent trade-up baby boom couples, baby boomer thinking about retire-

ment and growing numbers of non-traditional households and immigrants, the report says.

"The healthy markets will offer diversity. They will have a variety of niche-oriented housing," said NAR President Ira Gribin.

The study explores several current and projected demographic changes that may have the greatest effect upon the housing industry over the next decade. Foremost among these are the changing age structure and housing composition of the U.S. population.

The total number of households in the nation rose by an average of 1.3 million annually during the 1980s,

dropping from 1.7 million annually during the 1970s. The population ages 25-34, the group at which household formation is typical, is getting smaller, while the age group 65 and older is getting larger.

The number of married-couple households is declining. The decline is being countered by an increase in single-person household, female headed households, non-family households and larger number of 18- to 24-year-old men living with their parents. Additionally, the average household size dropped from 3.13 people in 1960 to 2.66 people in 1987.

Households are moving more fre-

quently, which is causing and will continue to cause a higher housing turnover rate. Legal immigration, notably by Asians and Hispanics, is increasing. The average rate of 570,000 was 30 percent higher in the 1980s than in the 1970s.

Increased demand by foreigners seeking to rent or buy in the United States will contribute to housing demands in the 1990s, the study says.

The changing needs of changing households will help offset a drop in housing demand due to the smaller baby bust population said NAR chief economist John A. Tuccillo. Predictions that house values will sour due to a decline in demand are too sim-

plistic, and such projections fail to consider the continuing effect that baby boom generation will have, Tuccillo said.

Increased savings by baby boomers, combined with a smaller federal deficit and larger Social Security trust fund, likely will push interest rates lower over the next seven years, he said.


Baby boomers previously unable to buy houses will be buying. "As the leading edge of the baby boom moves through its peak earning years, demand will pick up for second homes and retirement homes," Tuccillo said.

He predicted that demand will


shift significantly toward "smaller units in sunny climates."

In spite of house purchases by baby boomers and baby busters, houses will continue to be too expensive for poorer consumers. According to the study, it appears that a widening gap in household demographics is accompanied by a growing disparity in house-buying power.

For example, the study says, typical real incomes for families in the highest-earning fifth of the population rose by more than 29 percent between 1970 and 1986. But real income for families in the lowest-earning fifth rose by just 9 percent.

mitigation, and the developer is usually required to build the replacement wetlands twice the size of the one he destroys

While mitigation might help the state toward its goal of adding 500,000 additional wetland acres, Harris questions the viability of man-made wetlands

"In five or six years, we may have something that (just) looks like a wetlands," she said. "We need many more experiments at lower risk."

Harris suggested the state should buy former wetlands areas from private owners and put the wetlands back where they were to begin with.

She said the places where wetlands naturally occur offer the best chance for their survival.

While the Goemaere-Anderson Wetlands Protection Act of 1979 goes a long way in preserving Michigan's wetlands, some communities don't feel it's restrictive enough. Several have established local wetlands ordinances that place more restrictions on developers than the state does.

In Oakland County, Novi, West Bloomfield Township and Rochester Hills have adopted wetlands protection ordinances. While West Bloomfield's ordinance is considered restrictive, Rochester Hills is being sued by a developer over its more recently-enacted ordinance. "Many

communities are deciding that it's well worth the cost," Harris said.

Government regulation of wetlands is well and good, Harris suggested, but environmental education in public schools is important too. Schools, she said, should have programs

Harris has been active environmentally since the early 1970s. A longtime member of her 20-year-old

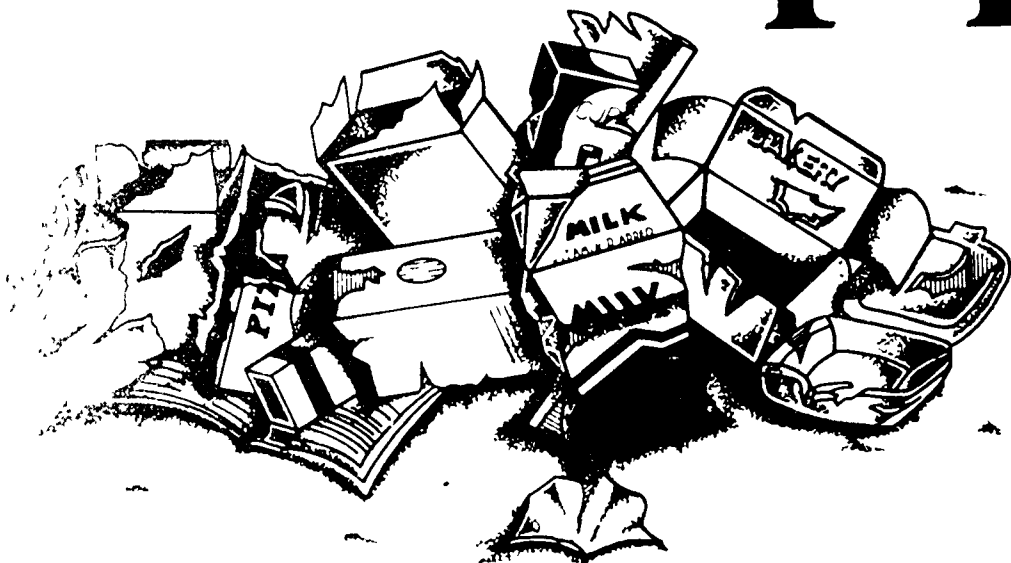

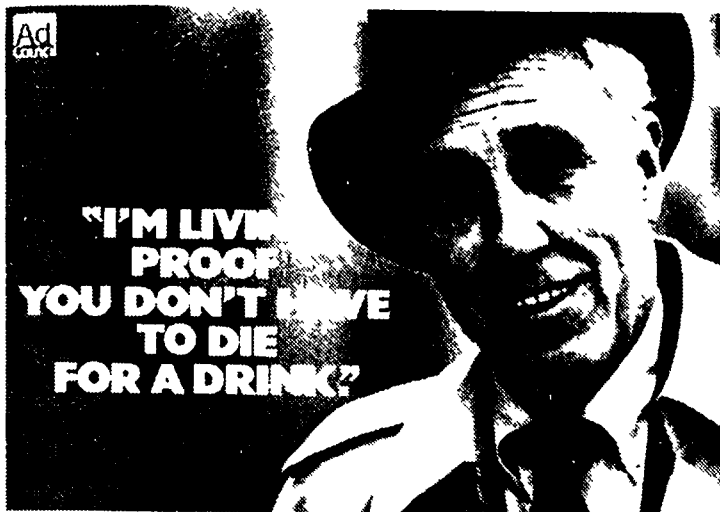

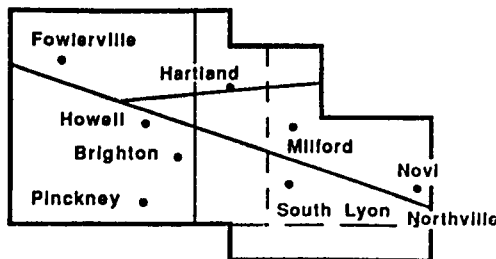

Many original cast members 'Return To Green Acres'

It was old home week in Hooterville earlier this year when eight members from the original *Green Acres* cast reunited to film a two-hour special movie that will air Friday, May 18, on CBS.

Reprising their roles in *Return To Green Acres* are Eddie Albert and Eva Gabor as Oliver and Lisa Douglas, Alvy Moore as county agent Hank Kimball, Pat Buttram as conniving junk man Mr. Haney, Tom Lester as hired hand Eb Dawson, Frank Cady as shopkeeper Sam Drucker and Sid Melton and Mary Grace Canfield as carpenters Alf and Ralph Monroe. Mary Tanner plays Daisy Ziffel, and Arnold the Pig returns to welcome special guest star Henry Gibson.

According to Alvy Moore, who recreates his role as bumbling and indecisive Mr. Kimball, his co-stars had changed. Well, they hadn't actually changed, just maybe added a few years since the show ended nearly two decades ago. Actually, on second thought, not much had changed at all.

"We slipped back into it very easily, you know, you see the people and say 'Hi,' as if it were yesterday," Moore said.

The actor said that although he's gone on to other things, he has kept in touch with several of the *Green Acres* cast members through the years. He has collaborated with Lester on two horror movies released on video and a couple of television projects, has played in some charity golf tournaments with Cady and has run into Buttram at breakfast in Palm Desert.

Although he admits critics of the time lambasted the show in its original run from 1965 to 1971, Moore said the viewing public has proven the show's worth through its mega success in syndication. He attributes brilliant writers for the show's staying power. They subtly touched on universal topics, like transportation, taxes, bureaucracy—many of the problems we still have today.

"Our problems haven't changed, we've still got the same problems—and

that's why I think today these shows seem right on key, they're modern. Our problems are the same problems they were writing about then," Moore said. "I think that's one of the reasons that the show keeps up to date, you can go along with it in a nonsensical way."

In *Return To Green Acres*, Oliver and Lisa (Albert and Gabor), finally convinced farm living wasn't the life for them, try again to adore their Park Avenue penthouse view. Meanwhile, back in Hooterville, Mr. Haney (Buttram) has gone into cahoots with developer E. Mitchell (Gibson) and has dreamed up a scam to trick residents into selling their land. Once they realize the land won't be spreading out so far and wide, the Hootervillians seek out Oliver's legal help.

Moore counts *Green Acres* among his two greatest career achievements. The other is producing the near cult-status science-fiction film *A Boy And His Dog*, starring Don Johnson and Jason Robards.

"There's been a couple of things in my life that I look back on in this industry that many, many people will never enjoy, and *Green Acres* is certainly one of them," Moore said of his hitch as Hank Kimball. "It's one recognizable character that I'm just delighted to be associated with."

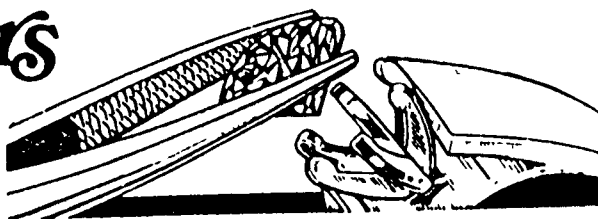

Since 1982 Community Television in Northville, Plymouth & Canton has taken on the concepts of three types of programming:

- Ch. 15 Public Access — produced programming by the residents.
- Ch. 8 Local Origination — produced by Omnicom and other Cable Companies.
- Ch. 15 Community Programming sourced by the combination of Community and Omnicom Staff.

I will be your guide and liaison throughout the coming journey, your link to what is happening as it relates to the media or television. You can use me as a pipeline for your views, questions and comments.

Maria Holmes, Omnicom Programming Director and Community Affairs Coordinator will be our resource person. Resident producers will want to send in pictures and press releases of your shows to her. John Martin is Omnicom's Executive Staff Producer who will lend an encouraging word as he works directly with the residents within the Studio and on-location.

- Network channels, cable channels and local access

- Local celebrities will be spotlighted right along with national television and film personalities.

Through the *Suburban Cable Weekly*, we are going to unite the definitions of Community and Communications. Together we are going to travel through a lifetime of new knowledge so that we may thoroughly understand the definitions and the applications.

Together we will open chapters that will bond family members more closely together, citizens to their community, local government and schools to clarity of service and, create a more prominent path of communication for local-county-state-federal governments and a return path back to you, the individual-citizen-voter-consumer.

Because the *Suburban Cable Weekly* is unique in including the community local access non-commercial channels, some people may not be familiar with the history of such channels. During the development of the cable television industry, the focus of purpose changed from enhancement of signal quality in the 40s to a means of providing increased diversity in television programming for the more densely populated areas in the 70s. As the philosophy changed, cable television franchising became common. Michigan is developing, through the Governor's office, a study of networking and potential interfacing of telecommunication sources to strengthen business, education and government services. Within our urban areas many television studios are available free to the public. Omnicom of Northville, Plymouth and Canton host a successful developed community service as they cablecast the Canton City Council Meetings on Channel 10. The meetings are taped on the 2nd & 4th Tuesday of each month and scheduled for your viewing the following Wednesday at 3 and Friday and Saturday at 6 p.m.

- Learning about critical local issues such as tax assessments, solid waste, capital improvements, etc.

Civilians risk own lives in evacuation maneuver

As despicable as events in the Vietnam war became, even that war produced some happy endings. "Last Flight Out," airing Tuesday, May 20, on NBC, tells the true story of a brave group of people who risked their lives to evacuate others just before the fall of Saigon.

James Earl Jones and Richard Crenna portray American Pan Am employees who organized their own unofficial, separate evacuation efforts, but combined them to help 463 Vietnam nationals escape certain death at the hands of the communist Khmer Rouge.

Jones plays Allan H. Topping, the director in charge of operations in South Vietnam who was organizing the evacuation of Pan Am employees and their immediate families. It proved a bittersweet task, since Vietnamese include any relative as an immediate family member, so more people wanted to leave than room allowed.

"The process took place by reducing the numbers to immediate families, basically people living within the same household: mother, father, sister, brother, and in some cases, grandmothers," Topping explained. "That was a very difficult process because people were aware of the fact that Saigon was deteriorating rapidly, and they wanted a way out."

A happier ending brought about by the evacuation, however, was the story of Dan Hood, who piloted the plane safely to the Philippines.

Hood had personal reasons for riding the last plane into the country, but had no intention of piloting the craft out of Vietnam. He had gone to Saigon at the request of a former classmate, a doctor who was caring for children of an orphanage injured earlier in an airplane accident. Hood was to help take the children to Medivac planes so they could leave the country. He was able to help many, but many were left behind.

"We were on the airplanes, we were taxiing out of Saigon, and all I could think of is all those little kids that we left behind, who didn't have a chance — half-American, half-

Vietnamese — who are shunned by their own society over there. And I wish I could have done more. And that stuck with me all these years," Hood said.

Hood made quite a change in the life of one of those children, however — he adopted a little boy. Now 20, Hood's son was not quite 5 during the evacuation. Hood said he has spoken with the boy's mother twice since that day in 1975.

"The Vietnamese had a tremendous underground pipeline of communication, and she was able to get a letter out to me through France, and all she wanted to know was, 'was her son OK, and what was his situation?'" Hood said. Then he got another letter in 1985. "I received another letter just requesting a picture and wanting to know if he was OK, which — I sent a picture back and told her that he was doing just fine."
