salary hike okayed

City Manager Steven Walters will be receiving a 9-percent salary increase retroactive to last July 1, after a city council vote last week.

The raise will bring his annual pay to \$60,580, from its current \$55,578. Personnel committee members Jerry Mittman and Carolann Ayers made the proposal "based on the excellent performance and valuable contributions Steve Walters continues to

Walters, who has served as North-ville city manager for more than 16 years, also earns \$800 a year for longevity pay and \$3,000 a year in car allowance.

The salary hike reflects the general 6-percent increase approved several weeks ago for administrative personnel, following the elimination of the city's previous cost of living adjustment (COLA) formula, and implementation of improved retirement benefits on July 1, 1991.

The raise also includes an additional 3-percent merit increase.

"We feel based on Steve's continued excellent performance and the improvements he's made in the city, (he should) be paid a 9-percent increase," Mittman told the council last week.

Council Member Paul Folino agreed with the raise, saying, "I have no problem with that. The 3-percent merit increase I can support 100

Folino had voted against previous administrative salary recommenda-tions which gave Public Works Director Ted Mapes a 10-percent raise and police administrators only 5 percent, but those recommendations were passed despite his opposition.

Mayor Chris Johnson also agreed with Walters' raise, saying. "We've got a very good city manager and I'm glad he's staying here."

Walters' salary was the subject of press speculation when he was asked to consider taking the position of Plymouth city manager in March. At that time, Plymouth Mayor Dennis Bila said Walters was seeking a salary "considerably in excess of" \$60,000 for the Plymouth position.

Plymouth City officials recently agreed to pay former Battle Creek Manager Gordon Jaeger \$59,500 to fill the vacant city manager position considered by Walters.

Walters' new salary is similar to those of other city managers, according to a survey conducted by the personnel committee earlier this year. The survey found city manager salaries in neighboring communities ranged from \$43,776 in Brighton to \$72,460 in Farmington Hills.

The salary increase will be retroactive to July 1, 1989. The administrative salary reviews were delayed because of negotiations with the Northville Command Officers Association and other unions.



Parking deck plan studied

Northville would get a new parking deck and a relocated Cady Street under a plan under review by city

The new deck would replace the city's deteriorating Cady Street parking deck, and provide parking for the MainCentre development at the corner of Main and Center streets.

The relocation of the proposed deck to Cady Street follows public protest in February against a fivefloor parking structure south of MainCentre.

Under the latest proposal by Rich and Associates, the city's parking consultants, a two-story deck with three floors of parking would be built on the site of the current Cady Street structure, and extend south an additional 150 feet. The deck would measure 270 feet from north to south, and 200 feet from east to west.

Cady Street would be relocated about 150 feet south, under the plan. Also the Main Street entrance to Mary Alexander Court would be moved west slightly under the plan. and a pedestrian bridge would cross Center Street between the deck and MainCentre, through the proposed CadyCentre development.

The proposal was reviewed Tuesday morning by the Downtown Deve-lopment Authority (DDA). City Manager Steven Walters told the DDA the proposed deck would provide 480 parking spaces, where the city's current two-level deck provides 144 spaces. Between the 100 spaces reguired for MainCentre under city ordinances and the parking requirements of other commercial developments like the proposed Long project on Main Street, the new deck would not add any extra parking spaces to

the city's total, he said. But it would replace the spaces lost by tearing down the old deck and provide the necessary parking for MainCentre and the Long

development. Walters also said that if the Main-Centre development sirm of Singh Development receives final city approval of its plan to build CadyCentre, a four-story commercial structure opposite MainCentre on Center Street, the company would be responsible for adding another floor of parking to the structure.

A fifth floor could be added to the deck as well, to accommodate future

commercial needs.

Mayor Chris Johnson said the plan had many benefits over the previous MainCentre parking deck proposal. We found this idea to have a lot of positives," he said. "The first thing it does is replace the existing parking deck, which is deteriorating rapidly. The second item is we put more parking where we need it."

Also, Johnson said, "it gives us good expandability in the future for the redevelopment of Cady.

DDA Member William Sliger agreed that the proposed deck answers several of the city's parking problems. "It wasn't so much the shortage as the location, and we're improving the location," he said.

We faced up to the fact that we have to move Cady Street," he added. Sliger saw the relocation of Cady Street as necessary for the further commercial development of that

DDA member Greg Presley cautioned city officials to consider the implications of relocating Cady Street. "Where you relocate Cady Street indicates to a certain degree where we want the downtown to be,"

Officer foils suspected kidnapping

When Officer Anthony Tilger pulled his patrol car behind an illegally-parked Pontiac on Horton Avenue early Sunday morning, he had no idea he would soon be foiling an alleged kidnap attempt.

But that, apparently, is just what the Northville City police officer did.

What began as a routine stop at 3:27 on the morning of May 27 turned into the arrest of a suspected felon and the freeing of his two alleged victims, who said the man had kidnapped them at knifepoint from a Monroe bar.

"I was just driving around through the streets like I do every night . . . in fact at the time, I was enforcing the overnight parking ordinance," Tilger

But when he saw a Pontiac Grand Am parked on Horton Avenue just north of Rayson Street, the car seemed out of place. "If you work midnights long enough, you know what cars belong where to a certain extent," Tilger said. "It's one of the advantages of working in a small town."

As the officer approached the car, its lights out but its engine running. he saw a young woman behind the wheel, a man next to her, and another woman in the back seat.

When Tilger asked the driver for identification, she told him it was in her purse in the trunk and climbed out to get it. But when she opened the trunk, she leaned towards him and said, "I don't know that man in the car but he has a knife," adding the man had kidnapped her and her

DNR will serve drilling notice

Northville Township has apparently won a round in a selfdetermination debate fueled by the state's oil and gas drilling permit

The state Department of Natural Resources (DNR) has agreed to notify supervisors in Plymouth, Canton and Northville Townships 10 days in advance of permit approvals for oil and gas drilling, said state Rep. Ger-

The 10-day notification period will allow the affected townships time to object to oil and gas drilling sites, Law

This gives the township 10 days to complain or go to court," Law said. "If the companies want to drill in a site that is environmentally sensitive, or is really offensive to residents, it gives the township attorney time to put together an injunction (to halt the

Law said townships have been owerless in the past to stop drilling.

He said the agreement is limited, but does give townships more protection.

They don't have any power under law, but the agreement is significant in that oil companies did not have to give any notification," he said. "I think this compromise is pretty generous.

Law said oil companies became interested in the area — particularly Northville Township — a few years ago and began asking residents to sign oil and gas exploration leases. Some residents complained that oil drilling would devalue their property and Law said he started to work on a system for the DNR to keep local gov-ernment apprised of the permitting

"I've had a long argument with the oil companies and the DNR, and I think ultimately this agreement is an attempt to get rid of me," he said. "We'll see what happens on the first



Meeting requested in kidnap case

The Wayne County Prosecutor's Office has requested a meeting with the grandfather of a 1-year old child allegedly kidnaped in Northville Township April 15.

The meeting is intended to help the prosecutor determine if kidnapping charges will be brought against Doug Allor of Utica, maternal grandfather of Brittany Roberts, said Det. Fred Yankee of the township police department.

A letter asking Allor to attend the meeting was mailed Monday morning, and Yankee said he will allow Allor 10 days to respond to the request. Allor is not obligated to meet with police and the prosecutor, he said.

"The prosecutor's office just wants to hear the grandfather's side of the story." Yankee said. They want to make sure they've got all the sides covered before they decide if they'll pursue the case."

Yankee said he attended a similar meeting May 23 that included a representative of the prosecutor's office and Christopher Roberts, who alleged that Allor and two armed men took his daughter from him during an alternation at a Northville township

residence.

"The prosecutor went over every piece of information they had," he said. "They interviewed him just like I would have."

Yankee said Roberts' description of the alleged abduction has not changed since the initial

report.
All parties involved in the case agree the infant did end up in Allor's hands the evening of April 15,

Yankee said.
"The question is, was the child just handed over, cr was it taken," Yankee said.

Allor has said Roberts was not threatened before he handed the child over to two men in the driveway of his aunt's condominium.

Roberts said the men first identified themselves as police officers before placing a gun to his head and demanding the child. Allor has not told police the

identity of the two men who assisted him that evening. Yankee said composite draw-

ings of the two men have been sent to area police departments in an attempt to establish their identity. Yankee would not speculate on

Yankee would not speculate on when the prosecutor's office would decide on the case, but he said it was likely that Allor would be charged.

"They think they've got enough to go on," he said.







Police urge engraving

A television and videocassette recorder stolen from a Northville Township residence in March are back in the owner's hands because the man engraved an identification number on the back of the items.

Township police Det. William Helke said Friday the television and VCR were recovered from a Redford pawn shop after police matched the man's social security number with information supplied on pawn slips.

And the 24-year old Northville man who pawned the VCR has been arrested on a breaking and entering charge and will face receiving and concealing stolen property charges, Helke said.

"His property was found because he knew the serial number of the VCR and had engraved his social security number on the back," Helke said. We wouldn't have found it on the pawn slip if it didn't have the social security number."

The property was stolen from a residence on Seven Mile Road March

12 and was recovered March 27. Helke said. He said the return of the items points out the importance of engraving identification numbers on

valuable property.
"If they can keep an inventory of their personal property and engrave their name and driver's license, it's easy to identify through the pawn slips," he said. "Otherwise, the chances are not good that they will see the property again."

Helke said a new state law requires pawn shops to provide local police with pawn slips. The law also requires the shops to send slips to the police departments in the residence area of the person who pawned the

The pawn slips contain information such as engraved numbers, the name and driver's license or state identification numbers of the person pawning the items, and the date the items were pawned.

Law enforcement agencies can access the engraved identification numbers through a state computer system.

The VCR and television were

pawned for \$40 apiece, Helke said. Their combined estimated value was \$650, he added.

Township police listed the man who pawned the VCR as a suspect in area breaking and entering cases, Helke said. Information on the man was provided to state police, who arrested him during a breaking and entering at Browning-Ferris Industries Napier Road site April 5.


The man was stealing items from a storage shed, Helke said.

A second man suspected of the township breaking and entering may soon be arrested for receiving and concealing stolen property. Helke said. The man is a suspect because his name appeared on the pawn slip for the television.

Helke suggested people engrave all their valuable items. Engraving tools can be purchased at hardware stores, or may be borrowed from the township police detective bureau, he

Photographs of personal property are also important, he said. Jewelry should be photographed and appraised regularly for insurance purposes, he added.

City master plan is nearing completion

After more than a year of review, Northville City's Master Plan is nearly complete, according to planning consultant Don Wortman.

Wortman gave the city's planning commission the good news at a re-cent meeting. "What I envision is that we could submit an entire package to you at the next meeting," he said.

Commissioner David Totten suggested including preliminary cost estimates on some of the improvements recommended by the Master Plan. particularly with the capital improvements and recreation plans. This may make some of this a bit pie-inthe sky," he said. "But we may not get around to doing something on it unless there's money hanging out there on the tree."

Chairperson John Hardin agreed with Totten, saying, "I think it's supposed to be a little pie-in-the-sky anyways, with an eye on reality.

That's the whole point."

Commissioners noted at least one mistake in the policies section of the traffic plan. Where the commission had previously discussed widening Center Street to three lanes everywhere but in the downtown area, the

draft read. "Make Center Street a three-lane thoroughfare from Cady Street to Eight Mile Road with a center left-turn lane." The policy was changed to encourage making Center Street three lanes between Seven Mile Road and Cady, and between Dunlap and Eight Mile Road.

A street classification system which classified city streets as either minor or major collectors, or major arteries, also prompted some debate. Commissioner Stephen Ball argued against classifying Griswold Street as a major collector. This isn't a main thoroughfare," he said. "It serves no purpose to have Griswold as a major thoroughfare when it doesn't go

But other commissioners disagreed, pointing out that Griswold serves as a major route into the city from Eight Mile Road, and is classifled as a truck route.

This issue takes on a regional importance because the city must have a designated truck route," Wortman said. "In reality, you're sandwiched between two major generators of traffic, one being the downtown itself, and the other being the businesses

north of Eight Mile. Your existing conditions are not very much different than what is being proposed," he added.

After comparing the traffic on Griswold and Randolph streets, Ball who lives on Griswold — finally agreed with other commissioners that both roads could be considered major collectors rather than minor collector streets.

Greg Presley, the commission's Downtown Development Authority (DDA) liaison, asked the commission to hold its implementation of the master plan until he could return

with comments from the DDA.

The commissioners agreed to review the full draft of the Master Plan at their June 19 meeting.



Water main improvements eyed

Water main improvements on Center, Cady, Wing and Fairbrook streets may soon be underway, once the city formally hears from the property owners who will be charged for the improvements.

The mains are being enlarged. some to 12 inches in diameter, to provide more water to MainCentre. Northville Downs and St. Lawrence Estates. Under the proposal approved by the city council last week, the owners of those properties would be assessed the entire cost of the im-

provements, estimated at \$365,766.

The special assessment program would assess \$90,317 to the Northville Downs and Northville Driving Club. \$74,304 to MainCentre developers Singh Development, and \$201,145 to the Selective Group, developers of St. Lawrence Estates. The assessments would be payable over

According to city officials, the enlarged mains are needed to provide enough water for fire protection to the racetrack and new developments.

The water needs of the three deve-

lopments are "in excess of what the existing system will support," City Manager Steven Waiters told the council last Tuesday, May 22. He said the increased water flow is needed "to protect property rather than to provide for a normal increase in water consumption.

It's a combination of the size of the commercial properties and the amount of total demand increased by St. Lawrence," he said.

Walters said the assessments should come as no surprise to the property owners. The Selective Group anticipated this, and Singh Development was aware of it," he

said.
"Northville Downs is included basically because of their long-range plans," Walters added. He said their plans include an anticipated expansion of the racetrack's clubhouse and grounds.

The council agreed with Walter's recommendations, and called a public hearing on the proposed special assessment district for the Monday, June 18 meeting.

The improvements are planned along Center Street from Main to Cady, west on Cady to Wing, south on Wing to Fairbrook, and east on Fairbrook to Center.

Schools seeking partners

Northville schools are launching a new program that will match students with local businesses to form partnerships that will benefit both

The Partnerships for Education project is a direct result of a grant from the Michigan Department of Education and Strategy V of the Northville Public Schools Strategic Plan, which calls for development and implementation of plans to evaluate and improve community

Jan Purtell, district supervisor of the project, said the first step of the program is to promote awareness and identify needs and resources within the school system and the community.

In a pamphlet that Purtell is distributing to district parents and teachers, the following goals of Partnerships for Education are listed: to strengthen the educational process. to enhance economic vitality and develop a better sense of community.

George Bell, superintendent of Northville schools, said the program is a "very positive step for the school district and the community.

There is a chance to establish an

excellent level of dialogue between the business community and the school community," Bell said. "Both can offer each other products to meet each other's needs. At their May 21 meeting, Board of

Education members viewed a videotape produced by the Department of Education that provided an overview of the partnership idea.

The tape stressed the program helps promote investment in the future leaders, employees and consumers. Also, with the increasing arena, children must be better prepared to enter the workplace.

Robert McMahon, board vice president, said he is pleased to see the program in place. The composition of the community — with the state po-lice post, mental health facilities and Chamber of Commerce, for example shows good potential for partners,

he said. Purtell said potential partners are not limited to the Northville area, but that transportation arrangements must be considered. Several members of the organizations to which she has made presentations have provided her with names of businesses that may be interested in becoming a partner, she added.

Purtell told the board that The Northville Record, a unit of Ford Motor Company and a local bank are current prospects for forming partnerships.

She explained that each partnership functions independently. "Its activities can be as flexible and creative as the partners wish," she said.

Several possibilities resulted from preliminary discussion of a partnership arrangement between The Northville Record and Northville schools. For example, staff members could be teamed with high school journalism students.

While students provide additional coverage, they would benefit from onthe-job experience, agreed Managing Editor Ann Willis and Bo Hall, high school journalism advisor.

Purtell said, in any partnership, students might benefit through improved self-image, increased motivation, enriched curriculum, increased career awareness, identification with successful role models and enhanced understanding of the business community and the community

competition in an international at-large. They also can see the work ethic in action, she added.

Teachers, businesses and the community also would benefit in other ways. Purtell explained.

Both partners draw on their combined resources to develop a program that will satisfy the needs of both, she added. Emphasis is on direct interaction and involvement, not financial

assistance. Participants in the Partnerships for Education program in other parts of the state have provided a model for the Northville district to follow, Purtell said. There has been positive feedback so far, she added.

From the models, it's been hard to see who benefits more."

The project coordinator has presented the partnership program to the staffs of almost all the schools in the district as well as the parent advisory committees. Teachers and administrators have been asked to complete survey forms regarding school needs and resource assessments.

"From my presentations, staff members have started to talk — how to match curriculum needs with businesses," Purtell said.

Parents attending a recent meeting of the Parent Advisory Committee at Northville High School welcomed the program and asked Purtell many questions about the proposed fall start-up.

High School Principal David Bolitho said the program would enable teachers to link course content with "real-life" experience.

Also, the students will be provided an opportunity to explore different career areas. Bolitho said.

Bell added, "It's important to get the community involved in what's going on in the school as well as getting the kids out there."



Novi staff to start office-paper recycling program

By JAN JEFFRES

Taking out the trash will never be the same in the City of Novi.

June 1 is the target date for the city staff at the Novi Civic Center, the police department and the fire department to begin recycling office paper. The details are still being worked out, said purchasing director Carol Kali-novik, but typically in an office-paper recycling program the waste is sorted into three bins: one each for white, colored and computer printout paper. The sorting process often begins deskside, as workers drop their papers into small containers. Paper with glue on it, such as envelopes and telephone books, cannot be recycled.

Novi is already trying out several brands of recycled paper, Kalinovik said, to determine which gives the best quality for the money and works well in the city's copying machines.

It's possible that Novi may be one of the first of the eight-member communities in the Novi-headquartered Resource Recovery and Recycling Authority of Southwest Oakland County (RRRSOC) to start office

Lenora Jadun, general manager of the eight-community consortium, has been assisting Walled Lake City Manager Michael Dornan in putting a program in place there on June 1. She also worked with Novi resident Judge Brian MacKenzie of the 52nd District Court in Walled Lake, which began office paper recycling on May 21.

With the Novi government as an example, Jadun said she's hoping that local businesses will jump on the office paper recycling bandwagon.

Office paper recycling is catching on with a number of large corpora-

tions, which find they are realizing substantial savings in landfill tipping fees and earning some cash as well. The paper is purchased by Detroit area distributors, who then sell the material to predominantly out-ofstate paper mills. Kalinovik said she is talking to several companies to determine which will buy Novi's scrap paper at the best rates.

White bond office paper is one of the best moneymakers. If you're going to make any money in recycling. it's that and cardboard," Jadun said, adding that the white paper can sell for as high as \$60 a ton.

RRRSOC estimates that its member communities, including Southfield, Farmington Hills and Walled Lake, will dispose of 8,451 tons of office paper, 19,379 tons of mixed paper and 22,774 tons of newsprint

Jadun said most companies can reduce their trash by one-third through office paper recycling.

Employees were enthusiastic when the 52nd District Court in Walled Lake started its office paper recycling program last week, according to court administrator Michelle Bilger. Staff members keep small

desks The courthouse has an arrangement with Oakland County to pick up the paper, and there's a lot.

Bliger said that beyond the typically voluminous paperwork generated by the court, under state law they may dispose of old files and tran-scripts after 10 years. We've always tried to recycle in-

ternally, through using old scrap paper as notepaper," she said. "In the judicial system there's a massive volume. It's just like an explosion of

Initially, the district court will not

seek to make money off of these discarded documents until the program is in the swing. Bliger said. Later, they'll investigate the economic opportunities.



Volunteers help out at local recycling center

The spirit of volunteerism is alive and well in Northville City, particularly at the city recycling center.

Since May 1, a group of Northville citizens has been working Wednesdays alongside city employees at the 650 Doheny Drive site, monitoring residents and directing them around

Nancy Bohn, a member of Concerned Residents for Northville, is organizing the ongoing volunteer effort. I think it's a concern of everybody in the city," she said, "and I'm trying to get volunteers from every segment of

She has contacted about 20 volunteers so far, and is still looking for more. For more information, call Bohn at 348-5096.

Part of the impetus for the volunteerism came from the city's plan to limit recycling center hours and man the center, Bond said. Because of the volunteers, the center is able to remain open for four hours on Wednesday, from 3 p m. to 7 p m, instead of

two. The center is also open Saturday

from 11 a m. to 5 p m.

The volunteers help in a number of ways. Bohn said. They check driver's licenses at the gate to make sure the facility is only being used by city residents, and that residents are putting the materials in their proper places.

Another important role for the volunteer force is as educators. Residents often ask what materials can be recycled at the center, and how they should be prepared, Bohn said. The more we can educate the people, the better, she said.

Bohn added that the volunteer program may soon be unnecessary as Northville follows the lead of other municipalities in making recycling mandatory. The move has been discussed in theory by city officials, although there is no immediate plan to enact it.

"I have a feeling that eventually it's going to be mandatory, and everybody's going to have to do it streetside." Bohn said. "Everybody seems to be willing, it's just a matter of finding the time to do it.

Public Works Director Ted Mapes said the volunteers provide a valu-

able service to the city. We still have to have a person there but we appreciate the effort, he said. They're checking the people in at the gate. just like our people are.

"With someone right there, it's really under control," he added. "It's a community effort here that's really paying off.

While the fledgling program makes a difference, Mapes said city employ-ces are still needed at the site because of the volume and types of material that come into the center. This isn't just recycling, it's accepting refuse also," he said. "If it wasn't for that, the volunteers could do it. But we have to keep an eye on (the refuse)."

The volunteer program, together with the city's own staffing of the site. pays off in several ways. Monitoring the recycling program helps assure the right recyclables go into the right bins, so the material does not have to be sorted again. Also, people aren't using the bins for disposal of regular rubbish, or littering the site itself.

Tennis buffs wait for smooth courts

Tennis enthusiasts who gaze forornly at Fish Hatchery Park's netless courts will have an extended wait before perfecting their serve and volley game, thanks to court re-surfacing

Northville Recreation Department Director John Anderson said Tuesday that a re-surfacing project will not be completed until at least mid-June, depending upon weather conditions.

The courts are usually open the first week in May, Anderson said. Anderson cited problems with a sealant first applied to the court sur-

faces last fall as a reason for the delay in opening the facility.

Last fall we took the nets down and had an Eagle Scout put on a coating of fill-coat to seal cracks in the courts," he said. "In the spring, we checked it out and found there were areas where the fill-coat had not properly adhered to the asphalt."

Anderson - who described the sealant as "glop that you mix with water and put on the courts with squee-gees" - said representatives from National Paint Company flew in from Tennesee to determine if their fill-coat product was faulty.

"In the early spring, you could actually just pick some of it up," he

Anderson said the recreation de-partment wanted to find out if the sealant had been improperly mixed. applied too thin, or if the elements had caused the coating problems.

The paint company representatives told Anderson their scalant was not at fault and said the court should be allowed to dry before more of the fill-coat is applied.

Now the recreation department is waiting for completion of drainage repairs before moving on to additional re-surfacing, Anderson said.

Drainage problems on the west side of the court resulted in cracks and other damage, he added.
That's one of the reasons the

courts deteriorated," he said. The drainage work should be completed in the next week or so, Anderson said. After that task is completed, a second coat of sealant will be ap-

plied, as will a coat of primer in some

The next step will include spraying the courts with a green paint, followed by outlining the courts in white, he said.

Anderson said the sealant cost the recreation department \$6,400.

"The first thing that goes through your mind when someone says something like that is, 'Did I hear you right? "Tilger said. He recalled saying something like "What?" in reply, and hearing her repeat that she and her friend were being kidnapped.

"So I just told her to back away from the car and I backed away my self and called for backup," he said. Then my next concern, obviously, was with the girl who was still in the

Tilger's main concern was separating the girl from her alleged kid-napper. I figured I had to get him away from he car," he said. So he drew his flashlight and, holding it away from his body to distract the man, he crept around the passenger side of the car. "As I crept up the rear of the car with my flashlight, I could see his hands," Tilger said. As the man opened the cardoor, Tilger drew

"Luckily, he said, 'I want to give myself up,' " the officer recalled. "I said, That's a very good choice.'

At that point, Staff Sergeant David DeLauder arrived. Tilger asked where the knife was, and the man told him it was under the passenger seat. So Tilger ordered the man out of the car, and while DeLauder held the suspect, he retrieved the knife from under the seat.

The man was handcuffed, transported back to the police station, and Tilger realized what he may have pre-

held there until he was transported back to Monroe

Back at the station, Northville City police questioned the two Monroe women about the incident. The women, ages 20 and 21, said they were coming out of "Pete's Garage," a bar on the corner of Telegraph and Hendricks in Monroe, when the 32-yearold LaSalle man first approached them. They said the man claimed to be a detective and asked for identification, and then pulled a knife on them and ordered them into their

When one woman refused to give him her keys, the man reportedly pushed the knife into her arm, causing two small cuts. But he finally allowed her to drive the car while he sat in the passenger seat of the car, and her friend rode in the back, the women said. They said he wanted them to drive him to California.

The three reportedly drove around for some time before stopping to rest

Tilger said he also talked with the alleged kidnapper, who told Tilger he had violated his parole by missing a meeting with his parole officer. That was the motivation for him to kidnap the girls," Tilger speculated. "He didn't want to go to jail because he had violated his parole.

The suspect is now being held by the Monroe police department for his parole violation, while police there interview the two women and investigate the kidnapping charge.

Townships win some control over oil sites

Stories come and go from our front page. There seem to be periods when one story dominates the news for weeks. Most recently it was the Haller Library issue. About a year ago it was something straight out of the Texas panhandle. Oil.

Oil drilling companies from upper Michigan came nosing around Northville Township last year, and residents were justifiably nervous.

What made the residents more nervous than anything else was the complete lack of local control over where oil drilling could occur. Townships, because of their unique lack of local sovereignty in some matters (roads, certain zoning regulations) are unable by law to pass regulations limiting where oil drilling can occur. Cities can pass such ordinances.

In Northville Township the need for some sort of local control was very evident. Residents, concerned about what drilling machinery and oil trucks coming and going would do to their home values. asked that the companies not be allowed to drill on residentially zoned land. The City of Novi, also found to be attractive land for drilling, passed just such an oil drilling ordinance. Oil companies cannot set up on anything other than industrially zoned land in Novi. The township, however, was at the mercy of the DNR when it came to oil drilling. If the DNR gave the oil company a permit, and if the oil company received enough signatures on oil leases from property owners — they were in business.

What happened next is a testament to good grassroots campaigning. Local residents began to research oil drilling and oil lease law. They contacted local legislators, including State Rep. Gerry Law, who was instrumental in getting some action on the problem. Their research was impressive. Binder after binder after binder of material on township law and on other communities experi-



ence with oil drilling, was gathered by the residents.

Most impressive of all was the way in which they used the system. Phone calls to legislators and DNR officials were made regularly. This was not just a flash-in-the-pan campaign. Many residents, once the obvious threat to their home is stopped, let the matter drop. This campaign went on and on as residents realized the oil was not going away and neither was the drilling threat, despite the fact that oil companies had backed off for the time being.

And the outcome, while not as ironclad as an ordinance, does allow the township to exert a measure of local

The state Department of Natural Resources (DNR) has agreed to notify supervisors in Plymouth, Canton and Northville Townships 10 days in advance of permit approvals for oil and gas drilling. The 10-day notification period will allow the affected township time to object to oil and gas drilling sites.

"This gives the township 10 days to complain or go to court," Law said. "If the companies want to drill in a site that is environmentally sensitive, or is really offensive to residents, it gives the township attorney time to put together an injunction (to halt the drilling).

A small step, but an enormous change from no control at all. The residents and Law deserve a round of applause. It's amazing what a little knowledge and a lot of heart can do.

Recycling becomes a way of life

Last week brought news of new recycling initiatives in most of Novi's public buildings: city hall, the police and fire stations, and the local schools.

The school district and the city are both implementing new programs aimed at recycling that which has long been considered worthless waste. The schools this week began an effort in which students will recycle the waste from their school lunches. The city was hoping by tomorrow to institute a program of recycling waste office paper.

Both these ideas show again the many ways in which we all can do more to protect the environment, and the officials involved deserve commendation for setting a good example.

In the school program, students will separate their trash when they're through with lunch. Instead of tossing the whole mess into the can, students will now rinse their trays of food, put the trays in one place and other plastic in another. The recoverable materials are gathered up and taken away for transformation into pellets. Manufacturers will use the pellets to make a variety of different products including hangers and flower pots.

Not only will the program remove this waste from the trash going into landfills, but it serves the even-morevaluable purpose of raising students' awareness of the need for recycling and the processes by which it gets accomplished.

In the city, the new program will simply be to separate waste office paper for resale to companies which will recycle it. In addition, the city is trying out different brands of recycled paper for office use. Again, the removal of this paper from the "waste stream" is important, but even more so is the message it sends: recycling is an important and achievable goal. The city sets a standard for private businesses to match.

These new efforts won't solve the trash problem, but they'll help in more ways than one.

Northville, too, is beginning to get on the recycling bandwagon. Volunteers from the community are helping out at the city recycling center in an effort to keep personnel costs down. These volunteers are helping keep the price of recycling down as well, by informing participants what can be recycled and what can't and by monitoring the things that are dropped off.

Northville Township is exploring ways in which it can use volunteers. Both communities are beginning to make recycling a way of life.

The city currently has a program of recycling copy paper and computer paper. It's been in place for about six

But as Novi has recently shown, there is even more that can be done. The Northville School District would be wise to take a close look at the Novi School recycling program which begins in June. The practical knowledge the students will learn in addition to the good habits of recycling they will employ added on to the need to cut down on all areas of waste - seems to be an ideal situation.

In addition, businesses in Northville, as well as the township and city offices, should take a hard look at the possibility of recycling waste office paper and buying recycled paper products whenever possible. One community is showing us how it can be done. It only makes sense to jump on this bandwagon as soon as possible.

Change habits

To the Editor:

Almost 600,000 people in the United States are going to die of coronary artery disease this year. A major risk factor for this disease is elevated serum cholesterol, which, in many cases is a result of eating the all-American, high-fat diet. Therefore, it is a disservice to all those who need to refluce their dietary fat intake to perpetuate the myth that a low-fat diet is not fit to eat. I refer to your statement (in Ann Willis' column of May 17) that There's half-percent milk (the stuff that's blue and makes cereal taste like it's been sprayed with water)."

The truth is that our food likes and dislikes are only habits, and a lot of our habits are formed and reinforced by the culture in which we live. Since moving to Michigan three years ago. I

Core curriculum to change schools



The big city papers and TV news shows missed it, of course, because it's hard to sensationalize. But a revolution is brewing in the schools.

Last month the State Board of Education adopted a plan to develop a core curriculum for all schools. It is a fundamental change in direction for our K-12 system - away from specifying hours of study and years of attendance, toward defining subjects and testing students for what they actu-

Here's how it is supposed to work:

The State Board has set out five broad subject areas — arts (such as music and painting), health and physical education, language, math and science, and world studies (history,

Next, "Measurement of student attainment of the desired educational outcomes at the state, district and building levels is an integral part of a good core curriculum model." I think this means: "Students will be tested to verify they have learned what they are supposed to."

Local school boards also are supposed to comment on the proposal to the state board during the summer.

In September, the state board is scheduled to approve the model core curriculum and distribute it to every public and non-public school By July 1991, all districts are to start working to the new standard.

Until now, a high school diploma has been one of our society's greatest rip-offs.

To parents and prospective employers, a diploma has been marketed as a proof of education. In fact, a diploma proves nothing except that a kid sat in class 12 years without being

The state board says it will require that children learn, and be examined in, specified subjects. I didn't see anything in the handout from the state Department of Education about denying diplomas to kids who fail the exam, but it seems silly to test and do nothing about those who didn't measure up.

Just maybe we are developing an education system interested in outcomes and not process - i.e., one concerned about what kids actually learn instead of the process by which they are supposed to learn.

Good. Now we should focus on the way we test in America.

American school kids take more tests than kids in any other country. But those tests are almost always about small bits of fact or answers to little problems. They don't assess a student's ability to think or put facts together into a pattern.

Worse: few Americans are ever subjected to an external exam — by someone other than their own teacher. Until recently, achievement tests prepared and administered by a body independent of the local school were rare. The Michigan Education Achievement Program test is now routinely administered to children in our schools. The results (or lack) are driving the state to introduce a core curriculum.

Even worse: The tests with significant effect on a kid's career - like the SAT college entrance test - are deliberately decoupled from the school curriculum. There is no syllabus to be followed in preparing for them, on the theory that students aren't supposed to "cram" for

Result: Our education system doesn't clearly reward academic efforts of either students or teachers. Unlike athletic coaches, who know what kind of contest their teams face and can both coach and motivate their squads, academic teachers are cut off from effort, achievement and reward.

While the state board is preparing its new core curriculum, it might well think how it will assess success. We shouldn't make old mistakes while starting in new directions.

U-M economists foresee stability

A STATE OF THE STA

The U.S. economy will recover in the first half of this year from the late-1989 slowdown brought on Sterling National Bank & Trust Co. to recognize by the Federal Reserve Board's tight money policies, University of Michigan economists predict in an update of their annual forecast.

The real gross national product is expected to grow at an annual rate of 2.2 percent in the first quarter of 1990 and 3.5 percent in the second quarter, up from the 0.9 percent annual rate mea-

sured in the last quarter of 1989.
"Thereafter we expect the economy to be heading toward a more normal and sustainable growth track," according to the U-M economists. To summarize, the Fed appears to have achieved the much-heralded soft landing and the economy is still expanding after seven years of economic

Sectors expected to lead growth include renewed strength in exports, increased investments by producers, a turnaround in home building, and moderate recovery in the demand for cars and light trucks. Unemployment is expected to remain relatively stable at around 5.3 percent over the next year, and "inflation is not expected to show signs of serious acceleration during the next two

The current forecast is an update of the annual forecast presented in November. It was prepared by U-M Prof. Saul H. Hymans, and Joan P. Crary and Janet C. Wolfe, researchers in the U-M Department of Economics. The forecast is based on the Michigan Quarterly Econometric Model of the U.S. Economy, compiled by the U-M's Research Seminar in Quantitative Economics. Hymans

the nation's most accurate economic forecaster.

The federal budget deficit is expected to shrink from \$153.3 billion in fiscal 1990 to \$123.5 billion in fical 1991, "as changing world conditions make it easier to hold the line on federal defense spending," according to Hymans, Crary and Wolfe.

The foreign trade deficit, which has declined sharply from its 1987 high of more than \$150 billion to just under \$100 billion in 1989, "is forecast to deteriorate a bit over the coming year," a result of recent instability in the value of the dollar. The U-M economists say the foreign trade deficit will begin to decline again by mid-1991, after topping out at an annual rate of about \$118 billion in the spring of 1990.

We'll be especially vulnerable to potential instability in the foreign exchange markets during this year-long period," according to Hymans, Crary and Wolfe. "But we're going to have to live with such risks until we get our major imbalances straightened around."

The dollar will decline relative to foreign currencles at a rate averaging 3.25 percent per year through the end of 1991, according to the forecast, resulting in a growing price advantage for Ameri-

Manufacturing capacity will grow at an average rate of 2.75 percent over the next two years, as producers' investments in durable goods increase

by 3 percent during 1990 and by just under 4 percent during 1991 according to the forecast.

Automotive production is expected to surge by 16 percent between the spring of 1990 to the spring of 1991, reflecting increasing demand. Sales of cars and light trucks are expected to recover from the fourth-quarter 1989 sales rate of 13 million units per year to tally 14.5 million units in 1990 and 14.9 million units in 1991. Sales of cars will reach 10.1 million units in 1991, compared with 9.9 million units in 1989 and in 1990. Light truck sales will rise to 4.8 million units in 1991, up from 4.6 million units in 1989 and 1990.

Unemployment is forecast to remain flat at 5.3 percent through the spring of 1991 before drifting up to more than 5.5 percent by the end of 1991.

Consumer price inflation, which averaged 4.2 percent during 1989, will accelerate slightly to an average rate of 4.6 percent from the end of 1989 to the end of 1990 and then will register a steady 4.7 percent rate throughout 1991, according to the forecast. Growth in real disposable income will slow from 4.1 percent in 1989 to 2.9 percent in 1990 and 2.1 percent in 1991.

Interest rates will remain approximately steady over the next two years, the U-M economists predict. The 3-month Treasury bill rate is forecast at 7.8 percent in 1990, "then drifts up to 7.9 percent by late 1991, when we have assumed that the Fed will begin to ease monetary policy in reaction to the slowing of economic growth and the upward drift of the umemployment rate," according to Hymans, Crary and Wolfe.

Interest rates for conventional mortgages are expected to reach 10.25 percent at the end of 1990 and remain at or above that level thorugh 1991, up from 9.8 percent in the last quarter of 1989. Home building activity is forecast to increase by 6.5 percent during 1990 and by 3 percent in 1991 "as activity in the housing market begins to flatten out in reaction to high mortgage interest rates," the U-M economists say.

mum of 7.5 percent each year, leveling off between the second and eighth year, depending on the initial rate reduction. At that point, it remains fixed for the life of the loan.

Tiered payment mortgages have a 15 year term that helps the buyer build equity quickly. They have no negative amortization or prepayment penalties, and some may be used to refinance an existing mortgage.

Another mortgage option for the first-time home buyer is the interest rate "buy-ups". These allow purchasers to reduce the number of points they pay in return for slightly higher rates (one point equals one percent of the total mortgage amount).

"Buy-ups are particularly appropriate for home buyers who can afford a higher monthly payment, but may be short on available cash at the time they are purchasing," explained Bonadeo. "The person who is willing to shop and negotiate for the right home at the right price may find that housing is more affordable now, especially when you take into account the special financing programs that are currently available," he concluded.

The competition for financing home mortgages is constantly increasing. Think resale value when redoing home

ASSESSING YOUR NEEDS

Before you decide to transform your home into a palace, CPAs advise that you make a careful assessment of its current condition. It's wise to fix a leaky roof or drooping gutters before you embark on expensive remodeling jobs. While these repairs are usually not considered capital improvements and do not increase the cost basis of your home or decrease the taxable profits when you sell it. they may protect your investment and enchance the possibility of

DO YOU REALLY NEED A HOT

Before you make personal choice in home improvements, consider the architectural character of your neighborhood. You may think that tennis courts or a hot tub would be a marvelous addition to your home. But would such additions be out of place with the other homes in your neighborhood? CPAs suggest that you keep resale in mind when you plan to make unconventional improvements. Regardless of the improvements made on your property, the resale price will rarely be more than 15 percent above the prevailing value of homes in your neighborhood.

If you are concerned about recovery costs on your investment, consider these figures: the return on investment for a sunroom or green-house is around 5 to 20 percent: for skylights only 0 to 30 percent. However the return on investment for an additional room is around 70 to 90 percent; an additional bathroom 75 to 100 percent; and a deck 65 to 75 percent. You may buck conformity. but when it comes to remodeling, it's not a bad idea to go with the

mainstream. FINANCING OPTIONS

Once you've decided on a particular home improvement, how are you going to pay for it? There are several financing options to explore. CPAs suggest that you begin by shopping around at your local banks, savings institutions, or credit unions to see which interest rates are lowest. If you need more than \$10,000, you may want to take out a home equity loan. The home equity loan is similar to a second mortgage in that it provides acess to 70 to 80 percent of the appraised value of your home, less any amount outstanding on your first mortgage. However, these loans may involve application fees and closing

FINDING RIGHT CONTRACTOR

If you are not the do-it-yourself type, or the remodeling job you have in mind is extensive, you'll want to hire a contractor. Choosing the right one can be tricky. The Better Business Bureau reports that "home improvements rank first in nationwide inquiries and fourth in complaints.* Some common complaints about contractors are that they didn't finish the job on time, that they were sloppy in their style, or that they demon: strated shoddy workmanship.

As is the case with financing, it's best to shop around for a good comtractor. Use references to help you form an initial opinion of their work. If there were delays or times the contractor didn't show up, was the homeowner told in advance? Above all, ask the references about the contractor's attention to detail and commitment to finishing the job. And, by all means, ask to look at completed jobs to see if you like the work.

GROUND RULES

Here are some, but by no means all the guidelines to follow in selecting a good contractor. First of all, the contractor should be bonded and licensed to operate as a home improvement specialist in your area. He should provide a one-year guarantee or warranty for his work and materials. The contract must clearly specify the starting and ending dates and the schedule of payments. Of course, the contractor must be financially stable. Check with his suppliers as well as with the Better Business Bureau.

Your contractor should agree to obtain any necessary building permits, and must understand what types of construction will meet local building codes and zoning laws. In addition, he or she must be insured to cover property and bodily damage, and provide workers' compensation for all workers for the duration of the job. Finally, it should be agreed upon in writing that any alterations to the initial plan will be made only with the homeowner's written permission and that the contractor will be responsible for removing all debris from the

Be prepared for unforeseen problems. For example, late delivery of materials, over which a contractor has no control, can stall the completion date of the job. CPAs advise that you never pay a remodeler for the entire job until the entire job is done and inspected to your satisfaction.

Outdoor furniture enhances your home

Sunny days and warm breezes mean it's time to move from that winter position on the couch or recliner to the great outdoors where a chaise lounge or glider offers relaxation.

Whether you have a patio, a deck, a stone slab, an old-fashioned porch. or a luscious lawn, outdoor furniture can enhance the appearance of your home and make your outdoor experi-ences more comfortable.

Outside furniture comes in a vast array of styles, colors and materials.

The traditional wicker or wrought iron will probably always be favorites, but today, the consumer can also choose aluminum, vinyl-coated nylon mesh, PVC tubing or wood.

Snider commented, "Pastels are the most popular this year and most people like cushioned sets."

Becky Mach, manager of Palm Beach Furniture in Novi's Town Center, agrees. We carry five colors in one group so that customers can choose something that augments their home colors — whether it be beige, gray or whatever."

Mach said probably one of her most popular items right now is the swivel deck chair. People spend \$10,000 on a deck and they don't want it marred by someone dragging furniture around. The swivel lets them sit at the table or swing around

for group conversation." Brown Jordan, one of Mach's more expensive lines of aluminum, runs about \$1,000 for a five-piece set. An umbrella can also be purchased for the table at an added \$100 and up.

"People sometimes buy the table, two dining chairs and two swivel chairs as well as the umbrella," Mach explained.

Main's Pebble Place, on Old US-23, just south of Brighton, offers exclusively wood items for patios, decks and lawns.

This furniture is made of cedar and white pine. Of the two brands carried by Main's, one is varnished, while the other is wolmanized.

Moon Valley wood furniture is very durable and long-lasting, according to Marie Strem, a salesperson at Main's. This furniture is stained with a light-colored marine varnish.

There are also lots of cushions, canopies and umbrellas in a variety of colors to accessorize the wood furniture.

Mach said her store carries two types of the popular PVC-style furni-ture with a variety of cushions and lots of color choice. "One type is ex-truded PVC or blown through a tube. The other is molded resin (resin injected into a mold).

"Allibert is the PVC brand we carry and there are loads of accessories. The chairs run about \$50 and tables about \$150."


Wicker and rattan are also very popular with customers, according to Mach. Rockers and love seats are in demand for "Florida" rooms which are mostly screened and glassed

"Most people really like outdoor furniture in the sling style because it is so easy to care for," Mach added. The slings are made of polyester nylon cord or acrylics which are all easy We like to stress our customer

service, which includes free assembly and and 1-2 day delivery of furniture."

She said the store also has replacement slings and will provide custommade cushions for those hard-to-fit items.

To protect the furniture, Mach and Snider sell rain covers made of vinyl which can be tied down to the furniture. Covers for individual chairs range from \$11-\$24, Mach said. The really durable nylon or heavy gauge vinyl covers for sets that are stored outside all year, run from \$50-\$60.



Primer and paint best on graffiti

Q: We have a block wall surrounding our beach-area home. Pranksters have marked the wall with graffiti.

I am not sure about all of the substances used to mark the wall, but some of it was done with spray paint. We have been unable to remove these unsightly marks.

Do you have any suggestions on how to clean these walls?--M.F.

A: You will probably have to end up painting the wall, and it will be important to use a good primer so the graffiti will not bleed through.

A product often used by contractors is KILZ, manufactured by Masterchem Industries (P.O. Box 168, Antonia, MO 63012). This quick-dry primer-sealer has exceptional hiding power for covering stains even smoke stains, which are difficult to keep from bleeding through.

Cover the primer with a final coat of paint. Check with your paint dealer for products recommended for use on masonry surfaces.

Q: We installed dark brown tile on the floor of a covered patio and used a similar shade of grout. The grout has not held its color. It has turned blotchy gray, and we are not happy with the overall look.

is there anything we can do to restore the darker shade?---O.W.

A: The source of your problem might be efflorescence, which is caused by moisture seeping up through the floor surface and depositing salts on the surface of the mortar.

This can be corrected by scrubbing the mortar with a solution of muriatic acid (mix 1 part acid with 9 parts water) using a stiff bristle brush

Wear protective clothing, eye goggles and rubber gloves. Pour the acid into the water, not the other way. Be careful to avoid splashing. Rinse the surface with plenty of clear water after the acid application.

If this restores the color, treat the mortar with a sealer recommended by your tile dealer.

You also need to attempt to correct the source of the moisture. Check

drainage around the patio. The ground should slope away from the area. Watering plants also can be a source of your problem if they are

It also could be that the mortar is fading and efflorescence is not the problem. There are stains available that can darken the grout. Your tile dealer will have information on these products.

Another solution would be to remove the top layer of grout and replace it with a dark grout that your tile dealer recommends will hold its color. There are special groutremoving tools available at tile dealers. You will need to remove a good quarter-to half-inch of the existing grout before regrouting.

Q: The home we purchased has glazed ceramic tile on the walls and floor of a large shower in the master bedroom. The floor surface is dangerously slippery when wet.

is there anything we can do to this tile surface to make it less slippery and safer?-M.L.

A: Your easiest solution might be to apply peel-and-stick appliques to the surface. The vinyl appliques, available at department and discount stores, have a non-skid finish that give your feet some grip. However, you may not find these very attractive.

Abetter, more permanent solution is to have the tile treated with a chemical solution that etches the tile and makes it slip resistant. The etching is microscopic and does not mar the look of your tile surface.

One such product is "Safe-Stride." 7231 Carved Stone, Columbia, MD 21045, (301) 381-5911. Another is "Slip-Guard," P.O. Box 836, Lake City, FL 32056-0836, [904] 752-8814.

Because they are hazardous, both these treatments must be applied by a professional. The manufacturers will recommend qualified tile contractors in your area.





Ceramic tiles can do the job in areas other than bathroom



"Generally," according to Iskra, "women like cats and men like dogs.

Working to give kids last wishes

Something was not right with 8-year-old Chris Erwin's health. And in late 1985 they put a name on it. Cancer.

They performed surgery on my birthday — September 24," said his mother Kathy Erwin, recalling the painful irony of her son's terminal illness. That initial surgery was thought to have rid his small body of the disease, but seven months later the cancer was back. And it had spread.

The doctors agreed that nothing could be done to save our son," said Doug Erwin, Chris's father.

That is when the family discovered the Make-A-Wish Foundation. A national, non-profit organization with a regional branch in Lansing, the staff of three, together with the help of an army of volunteers, raise money to grant one last wish for terminally-ill children like Chris Erwin.

Chris's wish was to fly out to California to visit Disneyland, Sea World, the San Diego Zoo and the cousins he had never met — together with his

"We did not even know what the organization was when we called and told them our situation," said Kathy Erwin. The next day the check was in the mail."

The Erwins marveled at the hassle-free trip the Foundation helped them arrange and fund. "At that time we didn't want to have to worry about things like that," Kathy Erwin said.

The Foundation attempts to grant all wish requests it receives and has only three requirements: that the wish be the child's own and not the family's, that the wish be reasonable and that the child's condition be verifled by a doctor.

Since its inception in 1984, the foundation's Michigan chapter has granted more than 320 wishes to terminally ill children, with over 103 wishes granted in 1989 alone.

Children have asked for a variety

of things ranging from a family vaca-tion at Disney World to a Persian kit-ten to meeting Hulk Hogan, the big-time wrestling star. They have all been granted.

We have never lost a child before a wish was granted," said Make-A-Wish program director Nanette "We will rush a wish if

Make-A-Wish in Michigan employs only three people with much of the foundation's work done by volunteers. Almost all of the money raised through donations and fundraising events goes directly to granting children's wishes.

Much of the money the foundation receives to continue the program eventually comes from family members of children that have been granted wishes, although the wishes themselves come with no strings

Rather, like the Erwin family, families give because they know the value of the program — they have seen the bright smile a fulfilled wish brings to the face of a child in a great deal of pain.

As third-generation owners of the Erwin Farms produce store in Novi, the Erwins have decided to use their unique position as store owners to see the wishes of other dying children fulfilled.

In 1987, they held a similar fundraiser for the Foundation, asking suppliers to donate ingredients and turning those ingredients into pies and various baked goods to sell for Foundation proceeds. The Erwins raised \$2,700 that year - almost enough to grant a wish to another child. The average wish costs about \$3,500, although they range widely.

"We wanted to pay back the generosity of the organization," said Doug However, since that initial fund-

raiser, held immediately after the death of their son, the Erwins have been less active with Foundation fund raising.

"It was just too soon," said Kathy Erwin. "It was too difficult and

brought up too many memories." And while the pain of losing their son is still evident, they now feel strong enough to work for a cause

they believe in deeply.
"It is just a very humanitarian out-fit to help a child have a wish," said Doug Erwin.

The Erwins will sell hotdogs, cookies and maybe flowers, at their Novi store on June 2 in hopes of raising as much money for the Foundation as possible. The Make-A-Wish Foundation's regional Lansing office will also be showing videos and selling paraphernalia for the same reason.

"We are hoping to do this every

year," Doug Erwin said.

And almost as important as the dying child knowing their wish was fulfilled, are the benefits Make-A-Wish holds for the families, according to Doug Erwin.

The parents will remember that long after," Doug Erwin said.

Erwin Farms is located on the corner of Ten Mile and Novi Road in Novi. The fundraiser will go all day on Saturday, June 2, from 9 a.m. until 6 р.m. Baked goods and other foods will be sold and donations for the Make-A-Wish Foundation will be accepted.



Tall tulips stand out in Garden of the Month

Our May "Garden of the Month" is the lovely garden of Jim and Carolyn Stuart on Thayer Street:

The Stuarts moved into this beautiful older home more than four years ago and have transformed both the inside and outside in just a relatively short time.

Carolyn just completed a master gardener's class through the Wayne County Extension Service — a vigorous 10-week course that meets for four hours, once a week. She thoroughly enjoyed the wealth of information and wonderful speakers and has subsequently signed up for an advanced master gardener's class this summer. This is a one-week course at Michigan State University. Master gardeners volunteer their time to share information with others at plant centers or as speakers.

The Stuart garden has grown each summer as a new era is planned and developed. Carolyn is a special education teacher for the Wayne-Westland School District and plans her weekends to work in the garden, but often stops at local nurseries on her way home from school to pick up interesting plants. She also helps coordinate the Detroit Zoo garden for the Cub Scout dens from Silver

Springs. They plant and tend a shade garden at the zoo and all the plants have animal names such as tiger lillies, dragon blood sedum and snap dragons.

The front yard of this Thayer Street home is rolling and shaded and is highlighted by the newest garden containing tall lilly and peony tulips. A bank leading down from the sidewalk is covered with lilac bushes, daffodils and Rembrant emperor tulips in the spring.

A winding brick path leads through the hosta and spirea beds to the terrace which is covered with white seedless and concord grape vines planted to provide shade on the picnic area.

A lovely pool is highlighted by the perennial gardens which are divided by colors. There is a yellow bed, blue bed and pink section featuring assorted plants and roses. The vegetable and herb gardens are toward the back of the large city lot.

An all-white garden is featured on the north side of the pool containing


white tulips, white daylillies, white poppies, miniature white iris, baby's breath, statice, white astilbe and white coral bells also bloom.

Carolyn says she obtains her plants from friends, catalogues, as well as nurseries.



South Haven popular with tourists

The arrival of summer in South Haven brings thousands of visitors to this quaint town on the shore of Lake Michigan every year.

South Haven is a place of festivals, vineyards and good restaurants, which offers a lot to those who make the drive from Detroit or Chicago to this sunny spot on the lake's white eards

This resort town boasts a rich history of the Eastland and other sailing vessels. The Eastland, a 269-foot twin screw steel ship, was built in Port Huron in 1903 and transported 2,000 passengers. The ship brought many tourists from Chicago to South Haven in those yearly days. But in 1915 the ship capsized in Chicago's harbor on an excursion outing and more than 800 people drowned.

Photographs of the Eastland and other historical ships grace the walls of the Golden Brown Bakery, a combination of excellent cafeteria and baked goods stores with the best salad bar in town. A regular hometown meeting place and the first stop on Saturday mornings, the bakery brews savory coffee and serves home cooking.


Every morning on the sun porch of the bakery, the Breakfast Club interviews local celebrities such as Tiffany artist, William Scudella for WCSY

In the early 1900's South Haven's harbor hosted huge passenger steamers and small launches which carried visitors up the Black River to Riverside, Cresent and Mooney parks and to dances in pavillions or picnics on the parks' grounds.

Today South Haven is a quiet summer resort town of tasteful souvenir shops, fashionable apparel emporiums and book stores galore.

For a small resort town, it offers an abundance of good restaurants. The Coop on Broadway across from the police station, serves quick take out or sit-down dinners of fried chicken and fish. The Coop is known for its good food at moderate prices.

At the corner of Northshore and Dyckman, the Gaslight Haven

stands across the street from the long public beach and provides a lengthy bar menu with weekend entertainment. On North Shore Drive within the North Beach enclave, the Plantation House specializes in breakfast and luncheon delights served in the warm atmosphere of a country inn. Overlooking the lake on 51 North Shore Drive, the stately Plantation House Restaurant features breakfast and lunch dishes such as omelets, waffles and sandwiches. It's busy on Sunday mornings but most people don't seem to mind waiting.

The Idler at 515 William Street at Nichols Landing won the Silver Spoon award in 1985 and features the finest culinary delights including seafood, prime rib dinners and excelent pasta. The Idler restaurant has been converted from an historic salling vessel and the view from the deck is worth the price of the meal alone.

Clementine's Saloon at 418 Phoenix Street features a marvelous wooden bar with superb carvings of wildlife. Waitresses serve cocktails,

sandwiches, steaks and seafood in a casual atmosphere. A range of menu selections include hamburgers, wet burritos and hefty appetizers. It's the place to go for crowd fun.

It's fun to cheer on the wind surfers and sailboat racers from the
beaches or take in historical exhibits
at the Lake Michigan Maritime Museum along the Black River. Visitors
can study lakelore artifacts and
board antique vessels docked beside
the museum. Chicago-style hot dogs
complete with the windy city ingredients of relish, onions and chili may
be bought at beachside stands and
will tantilize even the taste buds of

the most jaded beach combers.

Those who love the outdoors know it's a spot that makes good its brag. The Saugatuck harbor lies among towering dunes and sugar sand beaches. It lures countless sport fishermen who go after big salmon, trout, walleye and perch.


A variety of beautiful marinas provide slips to sailors and a home to internationally famous Broward Marine yachtbuilders. Saugatuck is ranked with the tenth best harbor in the United States, but those of us who love the gem-like beauty of its waters put it at the top for its sapphire sparkle.

The trails in Saugatuck Dune State Park rival those of the great western states. In winter, brave sledders love whizzing down steep, snow covered dunes near Mount Baldhead. Others prefer ice skating and horse-drawn sleigh rides. Saugatuck is a place of blazing log fires and cherry country inns. And with a bit of history, it offers a chance to step back into another century.

The Victorian hand-cranked ferry Queen of Saugatuck gives first-time visitors a chance to relax and tour the harbor from the top deck of a 60 foot paddlewheeler. Many prefer the thrill of a dune buggy ride as a way of introduction.

Airlines planning service to USSR

(AP) — Alaska Airlines executives say they are encouraged by a preliminary agreement that could lead to the first scheduled air service to the Soviet Far East by the summer of 1991.

to the Soviet Far East by the summer of 1991.

"It's definitely a market we think has a lot of potential and will and should open up," Doug Versteeg, vice president for administration, said March 9, from his office in Seattle.

"We see tourism as the biggest component of the market," he said. "Tourists we bring to Alaska already each season we think would be interested in extending their trip to the Soviet Far East."

U.S. and Soviet negotiators meeting in London on March 8, announced an agreement in principle to open commercial air service between Anchorage and the Soviet Far East cities of Magadan and Khabarovsk.

If a final agreement is reached, Alaska Airlines hopes to offer two to three flights a week during the summer, starting in 1991.

"Both countries want to do business," he said.

Gov. Steve Cowper said the memorandum of consultation between the two countries could lead to regular air travel to other Soviet cities by American carriers and service by the Soviet carrier Aeroflot to San Francisco.

"Regular air service to the major cities in the Soviet Far East is the ticket to a permanent relationship with our Soviet neighbors," Cowper said. "It means expanded trade opportunities, easier cultural and educational exchanges, and a greater understanding of our two

stems."
Talks are to resume to prepare a comprehen-

sive U.S.-Soviet aviation agreement for inclusion in the planned June summit between President Bush and Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev, said Dennis Fradley, an aide to Sen. Frank Murkowski, R—Alaska.

Alaska Airlines has been working to establish the routes since January 1988.

Alaska Airlines made charter flights to the Soviet Far East in the 1970s and Aeroflot sends periodic charter flights to the West Coast, but there has been no regularly scheduled air traffic between the two countries over the North Pacific, Versteeg said.

Bering Air currently operates charter flights between Nome and the Soviet port city of Providentva.

It was one of those rare athletic contests that was so close and so competitive that it's almost a travesty that one team had to lose. It's an old cliche, but true nonetheless.

For the winners, it's an unbelievable emotional high. For the losers, deep despair. And what makes the situation even more incredible was the tiny difference between winning and

It may have been the most important dual meet in more than a decade for the Northville boys track prog-ram. And in fitting fashion, the Mustangs staged a dramatic come-frombehind 71-66 victory over Farmington Harrison on May 23.

It was Northville's first-ever dual meet triumph over the Hawks in boys track. And if that wasn't enough, it also guaranteed the program's first winning season since 1977. To put it in perspective, the last time the Mustangs won more dual meets than they lost in one season, Jimmy Carter was president and disco was the musical rage across the country.

We'd never beat Harrison before and they were fired up like we were," Faletti said. They were shooting for a winning season and so were we. And only one team could get it.

Northville trailed most of the meet

- by five points after the field events and by eight points with two events remaining. Heading into the two-mile run and the mile relay. Faletti knew what had to be done to pull it out.

We needed to go 1-3 in the twomile and then win the mile relay in order to win it by one point," he said. "Well, we went 1-2 in the two mile and won the relay in order to win the meet by five."

The heroes in the two-mile were distance specialists Steve Coon and Karl Goerke. They went 1-2 with Coon winning the race in 10:39.0 and Goerke close behind (11:03.7). That set up a winner-take-all mile relay. and the Mustang combo of Rob Subotich, Chris Lehr, Jon Meek and Mark Hilfinger came through with a 3:36.1 good for first place.

"We had good performances throughout the meet," Faletti said. "It feels good because we feel like we are turning around the program. The kids feel like they can win and that's

the most important part."
In all, Northville won nine of 17 events. Coon was the only two-time winner in the two mile and the mile (4:50.0). The others came from Lehr in the high jump (6'-0"), Aaron Wiseley and John Okasinski in the pole vault (10-6 each), Bret Butz in the 110 hurdles (16.4), Sobotich in the 400 (53.1), Meek in the 800 (2:09.1) and the two-mile relay team (featuring Goerke, Parag Parikh, Dave Borg

and Meek). The seconds included Brandon Hayes in the high jump (5'-4"), Jamie Miller in the long jump (20-1/4"), Butz in the 300 hurdles (44.4), Matt Hemp in the 100 (11.7) and Goerke in the mile (4:54.8), The thirds came from Kevin Gill in the discus (113'-0"), Bill Kelley in the long jump (19-8") and the 200 (23.6), Hilfinger in the 400 (53.3) and Parikh in the 800 (2:15.2).

The Mustangs end the regular season at 5-3 overall, 5-2 in the WLAA, and 3-2 in the Western Division.

Is your household pet overweight

Envy a dog's life, just eating and sleeping all day? According to local experts, that luxurious - and boring existence is significantly shortening your pet's lifespan.

Cheryl Brown, a licensed veterinary technician in charge of nutrition and behaviour at Novi Veterinary Clinic, says that half of the dogs and cats coming to the animal hospital are overweight and about 20 percent of these are downright obese.

In Northville, veterinarians Carol Geake and Lorie DeGrazia agree that somewhere from to 30 to 50 percent of the pets they treat carry extra poundage. While they see fat cats, dogs are the pudglest, the doctors say. Spaying or neutering can make the avoirdupois somewhat worse.

Fat does more than disqualify an animal from a blue ribbon in the show ring. When you're talking a maximum of about 15 to 16 years for a dog (nine years for some large dogs) and maybe 20 years for a cat, shortening that by a year or two due to lack of exercise and too many table scraps is significant.

When they're overweight, you're cutting that (lifespan) short a year or two or three or four. They're not around that long, we'd like to keep them as long as we can," Brown said, We get dogs in here that look just horrible. We have a dachshund that should weigh 18 to 20 pounds and he's about 35.

"You know your cat's overweight when people start asking if it's pregnant.

While there is validity to the stereotype of overweight people keeping obese cats and dogs, many owners who stay in shape let their pets go to pot. Brown uses a simple test for determing an animal's weight level you should be able to feel the dogs or cat's ribs with a slight pressure. The ribs shouldn't stick out, nor should they be lost in cushions of fat. Dr. De-Grazia cautioned that an animal

We feel that fat pets are beginning to look normal," Geake said. "We see so many that are fat. People who like to diet their pets get criticized by their friends because their pets are so

And it's not just table scraps that are doing it, although an owner sharing off his or her plate can play a large role. Pet food is getting so good these days that dogs and cats are eating more, Geake explained.

And then they snack more, too. A greater variety of pet treats are on the market. The only delicacy Brown advises for dogs are Milk Bones, but only two to three per day. Don't feed them Bonz, she said "they're loaded with calories, just like a Twinkie." Geake suggests that instead of commercial dog goodies you should let your pet crunch on a carrot or butterless popcorn.

see more sick cats and dogs around the holidays, especially Christmas and Thanksgiving, because they've joined in for the rich fare.

"People cater to whatever their animals want," Brown said. "They're anxious to make them happy. It's guilt, not being with them all day. They want to do something for somebody.

Overweight animals may fall prey to illnesses typical to obese humans: fatty livers, diabetes, stress on joints, lung problems, heat intolerance, dermititis in fat folds, hypothyroid and heart disease. Brown said a dog overindulged with table scraps may suffer from pancreas disease. And giving your dog the fat sliced off your meat is bad idea, DeGrazia warned.

Dogs and cats lose weight the same way people do, by eating less and exercising more. Stop keeping the bov constantly filled, Brown advises. Sne puts overweight animals on a diet food such as Hill's Science Diet, Maintenance Light Formula, but said that grocery store brands such as Alpo Lite can also do the trick. For the dangerously obese, a prescription diet is available from a veterinarian.

'Sometimes cutting out table scraps can bring a dog down to normal. DeGrazia said.

If your dog roams loose, beware that neighbors may sabotage its diet by offering food, or the dog may begin foraging for snacks in garbage cans. Geake said.

Brown advises a tough love program for pets. Feed your pet before you eat dinner, so it's not as hungry. If your pet begs while you're eating, remove it from the room. Or throw a toy to distract it. Just don't give in to the urge to share.

If they only lose a pound, you're going in the right direction. Be patient, don't try to shrink them down too fast," Brown said, "People feel guilty -- 'Oh, he sits there and looks at me so sad.' I figure, I don't bug you when you're eating. Don't bug me.'

Part of the problem is pet dogs and cats are frequently bored and eating becomes a hobby. An exercise regimen can help with this, as well as keep those doggy and feline figures trim. But unless your pet likes Jane Fonda videos, you're going to have to get involved yourself. Get out there and walk that dog, the experts advise. (With cats, this doesn't work that well). Brown starts her patients out with a quarter of a mile hike and builds it up, depending on the age and the health of both the dog and the owner. It's important to a dog's psychic health as a pack animal that it gets out and sees people and other dogs, Brown said.

Tying your dog to your bike so it will run along is not a good idea. Geake said, as the animal's foot pads may be injured by the road surface.

With fresh air, the animal gets peppier. And play should be encouraged, it burns calories. To keep the excitement alive, rotate a dogs toys, Brown suggested.

What to do for a fat cat? Buy it a pet, she advised. Two cats or a dog and cat will play together and keep trim. Catnip is another way to keep your kitty active — "that usually gets them fired up," Brown said.

Fitness Tips

Tips offered to help you battle allergies

Planning ahead for allergy season lergy can be specific (to peanuts) or may be to your benefit. There are 40 million Americans with allergies, and at least 8 million adult asthmatics. But don't let an allergy get you down and don't make it an excuse for not staying physically fit. On the 1984 U.S. Olympic team, 67 athletes had asthma, and between them, they won 41 medals: 15 of them gold. Understanding allergies

As you know, our environment is very complex and our bodies are constantly reacting to it. Foreign substances (allergens) that initiate allenge reactions are located everywhere in our environment. Normally. when these alergens invade the body. the white blood cells in our immune system can dispose of them. But when allergic reactions occur, unfortunately, our body reacts in ways that can make life miserable. An algeneral (to shellfish). Symptoms may develop on the skin (rash, hives, itching.) sinuses (sneezing, runny nose), eyes (watering, conjunctivitis) or in the air passages (difficult breathing, wheezing, asthma). There are as many different reac-

Who is affected?

tions as there are people in the world. Some are afflicted year round with runny and itchy noses; this is called perennial allergic rhinitis and dust. mold and animal dander can be the culprits in this case. Others have seasonal allerges to pollen and ragweed, making spring their season of misery. Further, weather and geography contribute to the severity of

When should you see a doctor? If the symptoms of your allergic reaction are interfering with daily activities, it's time to do something about it.

To describe all the possible sources of allergic reactions would take several pages. However, the most common reactions are to: ragweed. grass pollen, pollen, house dust, mold, cats, milk, eggs, nuts and

Other possibilities could be aspirin and its relatives, industrial chemicals, cigarette smoke, colognes and even to heat or sunlight. Of course, if the obvious causes are ruled out, it will take teamwork with your doctor to figure out the source of the allergic reaction.

Skin tests are quick, easy and helpful in determining if you are allergic to pollens, dust, molds or animals. However, they may not accurately determine the intensity of the

Radioallergoabsorbant (RAST) and Flouroscent (FAST) are detailed blood tests which can reveal more about the immune systems response to allergens.

Food allergies are usually determined by the "elimination diet." With this diet, certain foods are left out for a while, then added back one at a time. If symptoms appear, the last food added in becomes the chief suspect.
