Corrections: Novi City Council Member Nancy Covert was misquoted in a June 7 article about hiring a consultant for Novi's Grand Plan of industrial relocation.

Speaking of her support for a study by an independent consultant, Covert actually said it would "remove any doubt of in-house bias."

There were two errors in the Police News section of Thursday's Northville Record. A 19-year-old man arrested for stealing items from a car behind Cooke School June 1 was a Northville resident. Also, the story of a missing Northville woman who has since been found was first reported to city police by the woman's father.

School elections today: Polls are open today in the local school districts, but some voters may find the ballot a little bit dull.

In the Northville School District, the only items on the ballot are two open school board seats. The only people on the ballot to fill those spots are the two incumbents, Glenna C. Davis and Joseph Dunkerley Jr.

In the Novi Community School District, there is one open seat on the school board which is also uncontested. Incumbent Robert Schram faces no opposition for his four-year seat.

However, Novi voters in the Oakland Community College District do have a decision to make: Richard A. Blonde and Jay B. Shah, both newcomers, are vying for a four-year seat on the OCC board. In addition, incumbents Sandra L. Ritter and Douglas H. Wakefield both run unopposed for six-year terms on the OCC board.

The situation is more lively in the Walled Lake Consolidated School District. Walled Lake voters will decide whether to let their taxes increase faster than inflation rate — a Headlee Amendment override which school officials have called necessary to avoid massive budget cuts.

Headlee overrides failed in the district in 1987 and 1988. This proposal would allow the district's millage rate to increase from 33.98 mills to 36 mills.

In addition, Walled Lake district voters also have a local school board race: incumbent David Flammer, appointed to fill a vacancy in January, is running against challenger Jim Fugit. The winner will serve out the remaining two years of a four-year term.

Polls in each district are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. For information on polling places, contact the individual administration buildings: in Northville, 349-3400; Novi, 348-1200; Walled Lake, 624-4801.

Northville's jazz orchestra returns: The Northville Jazz Orchestra starts its summer season this weekend at the bandshell in downtown Northville, but director Rick Balek promises a new name, a new look and a better-than-ever sound.

The group has recently christened itself the Metro Jazz Orchestra because of a concert season which is now area-wide, Balek said. The band still makes its home in Northville, rehearsing on Monday evenings at the Community Recreation Center on Main Street.

The orchestra will play from 7:30 to 9 p.m. at the bandshell, just off Main between Center and Church.

Survey: Novi retail good as gold

If I-96 can be called a golden corridor of retail trade in Michigan, Novi has the Midas touch.

The city came in third in Oakland County in retail growth along the freeway from 1982 to 1987. According to the U.S. Census of Retail Trade, shopping opportunities along I-96 in the county increased 53 percent in the five-year timespan. The corridor is bounded by on the north and south by Eight and Fourteen Mile Roads, and on the east and west by Dequindre and Napier Roads respectively.

Figures recently released by the Oakland County Department of Community and Economic Development show that in 1982, Novi had 216 retail establishments employing 3,820 people. By 1987, 316 stores (a 46-percent increase) employing 5,683 workers (a 49-percent increase) had located here. Sales skyrocketed 97 percent, from \$263 million to \$561 million.

"I think the important thing there is all this growth took place before the freeway opening," said Oakland County Special Projects Coordinator Jack Driker. "In a lot of parts the building of the freeway actually hindered the growth. There's every reason to believe that with the freeway open the conditions for retail growth will continue during the next five-year period."

Within the study's timeframe, two major local shopping centers — Novi Town Center and West Oaks II opened. The first stores in West Oaks I began opening in 1981.

By the end of the five-year period, only two of the 18 communities in the study area accounted for more retail outlets along the freeway than Novi: Southfield with 16,450 and Farmington Hills with 6,692. Royal Oak came close with 5,165 shops. Other municipalities within the region include Oak Park, Hazel Park, Beverly Hills, Madison Heights, Clawson and Ferndale.

Countywide, retail sales along the corridor in the five-year period jumped from \$2.8 billion to \$4.3 billion. The number of stores along the corridor expanded from 2,874 to 3,388 and the number of retail workers grew from 37,623 to 50,718.

"It's undoubtedly one of the most important corridors in the state retail trade," Driker said. "The balance of the county grew a little bit faster than

it did in this corridor area. Oakland County as a whole and south Oakland County are very major parts of the retail trade in the state."

Data on retail trade for the final three years of the '80s has not yet been compiled by the county, he added.

Neighboring Wixom saw large percentage increases in retail growth — 54 percent more stores, 45 percent more retail workers and 83 percent

more sales. However in the five-year time span, overall Wixom added seven to its existing 13 stores and 42 retail employees to the existing 94. Sales went from \$6 million to \$11 million.

The portion of Northville within the perimeters of the study was one of six communities showing a negative retail growth (others were Royal Oak, Pleasant Ridge, Lathrup Village, Farmington and Beverly Hills). From

1982 to 1987, Northville had a 50-percent decline in retail establishments along the I-696 Corridor, a 76-percent decline in workers employed at these companies and an 83-percent decrease in sales figures. Northville's eight retail establishments registered in 1982 dropped to four in 1987, the number of people employed dropped from 22 to six and sales plunged from \$6 million to \$1 million.

House endorses recycling bills

Yard-waste measure left up to Senate

LANSING — Homeowners would have to stop putting their yard clippings in the trash and burning them beginning in 1994 under two bills that cleared the state House of Representatives and are on the way to the Senate.

"It doesn't make economic sense to spend \$30 a ton to put yard clippings in valuable landfill space," said Rep. James Kosteva, D-Canton, sponsor of House Bill 4872 that passed 77-10 on May 31.

In other action, the House gave final passage to three Senate bills aimed at recycling old motor oil and sent them to Gov. James Blanchard for his signature.

The bills were supported by area Reps. Willis Bullard, R-Highland, Gerald Law, R-Plymouth, and Susan Munsell, R-Howell.

If Kosteva's bill becomes law, Michigan would more than meet its state goal of composting 10 percent of its solid waste stream by 2005.

"It's estimated that 20 percent of landfill space is yard clippings," said Kosteva. Michigan United Conservation Clubs' estimate is even higher — 25 percent.

"We've gotten away from the garden ethic, though it's still very much the European ethic," Kosteva said. Homeowners could leave grass clippings on their lawns.

He said many cities, villages and townships already are setting up programs of composting, a process of naturally converting dead plants into fertilizer. He cited the Northville-Plymouth-Canton area and a

14-community consortium in southeastern Oakland County.

"Composting does not emit an odor. Only if there are food or animal wastes will there be any odor," Kosteva said.

In committee, the bill was

amended to define yard clippings to include tree trimmings less than four feet long and under two inches in diameter. Clippings which are diseased or infested would be exempt and could be disposed of in landfills. A week earlier, Kosteva's bill sur-

vived a challenge from some outstate members who wanted to allow counties the option of accepting yard clippings.

The companion measure, House Bill 4834, would prohibit burning of leaves unless specifically authorized by local ordinance. That would occur only in rural areas not covered by air pollution laws, said Kosteva, floor manager of both bills.

All area lawmakers, including Spaniola, favored the no-burn bill, which was passed 74-18.

All supported the three oil regulation bills which the House passed on 91-0 votes. The bills are aimed at keeping oil out of underground water supplies. The primary target is do-it-yourself oil changers, according to a House staff analysis.

"It's estimated that 11-plus million gallons (of oil) are improperly disposed of in the state of Michigan each year. That's more than the Exxon Valdez spill off Alaska," said Kosteva.

"There is a market of used oil to be re-refined or sold. There is a hope this will stimulate recycling. In Canada, you can purchase recycled motor oil that meet the standards suggested by auto manufacturers."

Sponsored by Sen. Vern Ehlers, R-Grand Rapids, the bills would:

- Prohibit dumping of used oil onto the ground or into sewers after July 1, 1991. The state Department of Natural Resources is to publicize a network of collection facilities.

- Prohibit incineration of used oil beginning in 1993.

- Prohibit spreading used oil on roads and other driving surfaces for dust control.

Go Ask Alice Project focuses on anti-drug message

Two Northville High School students are sharing with their classmates a lesson about drug abuse they learned from a character they know as "Alice."

Touched by the troubles of the main character in *Go Ask Alice*, Tami Johnson and Pamela Spigarelli chose the book as the topic for their final project in Individualized Reading class.

The book, author anonymous, tells the story of a real 15-year-old's struggle with drugs. "Alice's" joys and woes are related through her detailed diary entries.

The two seniors said they are trying to show the effects drugs can have on a person by using Alice as an example of someone like whom their peers do not want to end up.

Teacher Lisa Rohde assigned her class to relate the theme of a book to their choice of a project — a speech, mobile, bulletin board, poster board or collage.

Johnson and Spigarelli created a bulletin board that combines the confused thoughts of the character in the book with dramatic illustrations as well as general information on preventing drug abuse.

Rohde complimented the girls' efforts. "I think their (project) is particularly good because they applied the theme as it relates to everyone's life in the classroom," she said.

The two students included a picture of a casket, captioned "grounded at age 16," and an illustration of a "guy coming down off crack" to help convey the book's theme.

The girls agreed, "It makes you stop and think about things that you wouldn't normally think about. It makes you think about what drugs can do to you."

They also incorporated information from pamphlets they obtained from Charles Stilec, student assistance program coordinator.

"What these students have done is read a book, get energized and become aware," Stilec said.

"They took a risk to state their beliefs. In the process, they took their own feelings and actions into account about drug and alcohol abuse."

"This is one more step toward helping students make safe and positive decisions in a school class environment," Stilec added.

Similar to the cases of drug abuse

they read about in the literature. "Alice started experimenting," explained Johnson.

"She ended up dying from her abuse and all along struggled to get out of it."

Spigarelli explained the character in the book is experiencing the same

pressures "that anyone can feel."

"That's why we have the girl in the bottom corner (of the bulletin board) and show her thoughts above. 'Why shouldn't I when my parents do, etc.," she added.

Stilec said education, awareness and peers working with peers — on

projects such as this one — is the key to prevention.

Because Alice's relationship with her parents was described at length in her diary, both Johnson and Spigarelli formed strong opinions about a parent's role in preventing drug abuse.

"If the parents see a change in their kid's attitude, it's their responsibility — not to bother them — but to be aware," Spigarelli said.

Johnson added, "Parents have to be open-minded about it. It's going on and they need to be aware of it."

Avoid playing the name game with colleges

In Kurt Vonnegut's "Jailbird" the main character was heard to sigh in times of distress. "He must have been a Harvard man."

Harvard, and the Ivy League for that matter, doesn't shine in Loren Pope's new book, either. "Looking Beyond the Ivy League: Finding the College That's Right for You" (Penguin) is designed to be a how-to guide in selecting a university.

But a few volleys are fired at the prestigious schools.

He might run into a little poison Ivy tearing down the myths. One of the major ones is that the Ivy League or a big university is the only way to go.

Pope characterizes such institutions as a mass vortex of impersonal amphitheater-sized settings with classes taught by teaching assistants instead of professors. Understandably, grads from such schools are a bit miffed by his book.

"I was on a talk show in Cleveland and a caller was really rabid," said Pope, who was in Southfield recently to promote his book. "He said I was hurting the universities. I said, 'I think they will survive no matter what I say.'"

To take a swipe at big universities and the Ivy League wasn't Pope's intention. The idea for the book came about 35 years ago when his own children were looking for a college.

At the time, Pope was the education editor for the New York Times. He also served as an administrator at Oakland University. He sought advice from contacts in the education field.

Much to his dismay, little advice or information was available. He wanted to do a consumer research project but found no one to finance it.

As a result, Pope founded the College Placement Bureau in Washington, D.C. Some 25 years later came the book.

Pope doesn't hide his beliefs. In his opinion, the smaller school is often the best route for students — especially those pursuing a degree in the liberal arts.

"Ever since Sputnik, universities have become research institutes," Pope said. "The prof's job depends on research and publishing. It's either publish or perish. In an undergraduate college, teaching is more important."

Often students find this out too late. Only one-third of all students are in the same school four years later, according to Pope.

One reason for the mass exodus is the lack of research done by the student. Pope recommends those planning to attend college first make a thorough visit by themselves.

Prospective students should spend a night in a dorm, eat in the cafeteria and ask other students "Ralph Nader-type" questions. Also, they should meet with one or two faculty members.

According to Pope, one tell-tale question to ask professors is how many people at the school do they believe actually have an interest in learning.

"If many of them say 5 percent, then I'd shake the dust of that school off my shoes," Pope said.

Of course, selecting a college or university doesn't always only include the student. Too often, parents have a big say picking the place. Pope said this is often disastrous.

Most of this stems from the self-esteem attached to attending a major university or Ivy League school. Pope said the mystique of big name schools started back in the 1950s after the Korean War.

The "college scare," as he calls it, came with the notion that an Ivy League education was the end-all savior for financial and personal success. Not so, according to the author.

"The world is changing so fast," Pope said. "The old-boy network is dying out. We've changed from a manufacturing, industrial economy to a service economy where knowledge is what counts, not connections."

His also dispels other myths and reveals interesting statistics in his books. Of 137 Nobel Prize winners from the United States, only nine are from Harvard. By comparison, smaller City College of New York has seven.

Some of the smaller schools are producing a large number of doctorates. He cites Kalamazoo College as a prime example. It had the fourth-highest percentage (9.3 percent) of doctoral graduates in the nation from 1951 to 1980.

Such schools are producing a good portion of scientists, who are declining in numbers.

In the final analysis, Pope said the college's impact on one life can be overrated.

"In my book the most college can do is find out who you are," he said, "and help you to take a step or two in that direction."

MainCentre carports may appear yet

A parking proposal that Northville officials thought would never materialize appeared at last week's planning commission meeting, much to the commissioners' dismay.

Under the proposal, 76 carports would be built on the MAGS parking lot just south of Singh Development's MainCentre project on Center Street.

Singh Vice President Mike Kahm told the commissioners last Tuesday the carports may be necessary to provide covered parking to MainCentre apartment residents, if the proposed Cady Street parking deck is not built in time for the building's occupancy. Under an agreement made with Singh more than a year ago, the city is obligated to allow the carports to be built if the deck is not.

As City Manager Steven Walters explained, "This was a hedge by the developer, being realistic about the ability of a governmental unit to proceed expeditiously. It was not agreed to with any expectation that carports would be built."

Kahm said his company, which had planned to put the deck project out to bid in March, was still recovering from the deck's change in location. The deck had been the subject of negotiations between Singh and the city for more than a year when citizen protest to the plan in February led to its reconsideration, and to the city's proposal to build it on Cady rather than Center Street.

"To say that we were rather devastated with this would be to put it mildly," Kahm said. "My problem is I don't know, and I don't think the city knows, how this process is going to turn out (this time)."

While the concept of a three-floor parking structure to replace the city's existing Cady Street deck has received a favorable response from the city's Downtown Development Authority, final site plan approval by the Planning Commission could take months. Kahm said his company needs parking for MainCentre apart-

ment dwellers when the apartments are opened. He estimated the first apartments would be ready for occupancy in January 1991.

According to Walters, under an "ideal schedule" the deck's construction would begin this fall and take six to eight months to complete. Walters said the latest proposed two-story, three-floor deck would likely be easier to build than the taller five-floor deck that had been proposed for the lot south of MainCentre.

Neither Kahm nor the planning commission was thrilled with the prospect of carports off Center Street.

As Planning Consultant Don Wortman put it, "We pointed out that technically, for the most part, it conforms to the zoning and land use requirements of the CBD (Central Business District). But we're asking if that's the best use for that area."

"If we had our druthers, I wouldn't want to put up carports either," Kahm said. "Our problem is strictly one of marketing."

The commissioners said they would be more in favor of the plan if the carports would be removed after the deck was done. Commissioner David Totten, who described the carports as "kind of a stopgap," said, "I feel more comfortable approving something that may be here a year, year-and-a-half, or two years . . . than as a permanent feature of the Northville landscape."

"I guess I find this thing aesthetically grim," said Planning Commission Chairperson John Hardin. "I would like to have some assurance that this isn't a permanent fixture in the community."

Said Kahm, "I don't have any problem with that."

Kahm also said if the parking deck was finished shortly after the apartments were ready for occupancy, the carports may not be needed at all. "I'm certain we can work around that," he said.

Recreation fields under discussion

A plan to create a recreation area on township property on Beck Road is alive, the spokesperson for a wetlands mitigation applicant said last week.

Detroit Partners Realty of Kansas City will petition the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to move a portion of protected wetlands from a site on Eight Mile and Haggerty roads to township Beck Road property, development liaison Don Henkelman said.

The developer will ask the DNR to allow the establishment of 5.1 acres of wetlands on a site north of Scott Regional Correctional Facility, between Five and Six Mile roads, Henkelman said.

The developer would then construct recreation facilities — including soccer and multi-purpose fields — on 28 acres adjacent to the wetlands area, Henkelman said.

"We want to create an environment for wetlands that will be surrounded by plantings and will attract birds," he said. "Most of all, it would create recreation fields that Northville really needs."

"I'd say we'll be presenting our plan to the DNR within the next 30-45 days."

Henkelman said the development firm wants to build a six- to eight-screen indoor cinema at its Eight Mile and Haggerty site.

The DNR has determined that a portion of the property falls within the guidelines for protected wetlands, a fact Henkelman disputes.

"The wetlands area there is a creation of a watershed from I-275

culverts dumping on the property," he said. "The water there is almost stagnant . . . No duck in his right mind would want to be in it."

Henkelman said the development team had an attorney view the Eight Mile and Haggerty site last Tuesday.

"In his opinion, it's a cesspool," he said. "We think our application to the DNR will show that we can clean up that cesspool, enhance the area with a cinema and create the wetlands and recreation fields."

A DNR representative has said the state will not allow mitigation just for the sake of development.

Dave Pingel, water quality specialist at the Pontiac DNR office, said wetlands protection takes precedence over development.

"The applicant must show that there are no feasible alternatives to mitigation," he said. "Any impact permitted would be a last-resort situation."

Township officials had been hopeful that mitigation on the Beck Road property would help alleviate area recreation field shortages.

Township Manager Richard Henningsen admitted that he was not holding out much hope that the plan would be approved, but he said Henkelman's comments buoyed his spirits.

"I hadn't heard anything about it, but if it's true, maybe we can get something out of it," he said. "It would be fantastic."

Negotiations between the township and developer earlier this year resulted in the developer agreeing to clear and grade the township property, plant grass and prepare four soccer fields, three multi-purpose

fields and four tennis courts.

The developer would also construct concession stands, according to the agreement.

Township officials estimated that the mitigation plan could mean \$400,000 in improvements to the

Beck Road site.

Henkelman said he was enthusiastic about the chances for the mitigation application.

"We're moving forward on this," he said. "It's a positive plan and we're very much on the go with it."



House approves campus police bill

LANSING — On the second try, the state House of Representatives last week passed a bill allowing university boards to give police powers to campus security forces.

This time the vote was 72-27 in favor. A week earlier, the bill got 55 votes, one vote shy of a majority.

"This bill does not create a separate force that doesn't exist today," said Rep. James Kosteva, D-Canton, floor manager of the bill. Senate Bill 254 goes back to the Senate for concurrence in House changes.

Area members supporting it were Willis Bullard, R-Highland, Gerald Law, R-Plymouth, and Susan Munzell, R-Howell.

Opposed were Kirk Proft, D-Ypsilanti, and Francis Spaniola, D-Corunna.

The bill was fought by University of Michigan students and some black legislators, who saw danger in a police force reporting to boards not locally elected.

The Michigan Sheriffs Association and most university boards supported it. The sheriffs, who can deputize campus cops, want to give up their liability because they have no effective supervision over them. Campus police would have full power to enforce state laws as well as campus regulations.

"Campus police are more sensitive to campus problems," said Kosteva. He added it would be optional for the governing boards of 15 state universities.

"This is an open invitation to universities to degrade police service," said opponent Perry Bullard, D-Ann Arbor.

"It is extremely unfortunate to invite the University of Michigan to establish an unaccountable, separate police force. The university is seeking to return to the old days when the university acted, in loco parentis, as Big Daddy and Big Mommy."

The bill would:

- Empower governing boards of four-year public colleges to grant their public safety officers the same powers as police have, once the personnel have met state standards.

- Permit campus police to enforce state laws as well as institutional ordinances.

That part bothered Bullard, who said it would cost the City of Ann Arbor \$1 million a year. U-M pays the city \$450,000 for police protection, he said, and the university would be able to pick up \$550,000 the city now collects from parking tickets.

"We want the police force to reflect the community," said another opponent, Ted Wallace, D-Detroit. "There is a danger with having a police force on a university campus."

Kosteva replied, "There is no extension of police powers because the law now allows the deputization of officers. The campus police would be fully accredited. They would have the same training. This just changes who allows the deputization."

Three university boards are elected statewide — U-M, Michigan State and Wayne State. All other university boards are appointed by the governor.

Two weeks ago, the House rejected amendments to:

- Grant the power to community college boards. It failed 20-72.
- Exempt the U-M Board of Regents from the bill. It went down 23-67.

Man bound over on kidnap charge

A LaSalle man arrested two weeks ago in Northville by city police was bound over to 38th Circuit Court Tuesday, June 5, on kidnapping and assault charges.

Gary Joseph Standridge, 32, the

LaSalle man charged with two counts of kidnapping and two counts of assault Thursday, June 1 in First District Court, faces up to life in prison for the alleged kidnapping of two Monroe women outside a bar in Monroe May 26.

According to the women, Standridge had threatened them with a knife and ordered them to drive him

to California, and they had stopped in Northville to rest before the drive.

He was arrested early on the morning of May 27 by Northville City Police Officer Anthony Tilger and Staff Sergeant David DeLauder.

Standridge was held on \$500,000 cash or surety bond after being charged in district court. His bond

was kept at \$500,000 when he was bound over to circuit court.

At his arraignment Friday, June 8 before 38th Circuit Court Judge Daniel L. Sullivan, Standridge stood mute rather than enter a plea. Sullivan set a pretrial date of June 27, and Standridge was placed back in police custody.





House fulfills many fantasies

Earns funds for homeless

There are luxury houses, then there are *luxury* houses.

James D. Compo, a Farmington Hills builder, has constructed a house in the Pheasant Hills Subdivision of Northville with features most of us wouldn't dream of.

For starters, there's 6,350 square feet of living space and a fully insulated 4 1/2-car garage.

But that's just the basics. Other elements include:

□ A swimming pool and spa in an indoor garden room.

□ A lower-level media room with stereo surround sound, a separate workout room and an additional recreation room/sauna with ballet barre.

□ A kitchen with an octagonal cathedral nook and three ovens including a micro-convection unit.

□ An oak paneled library.

□ Four bedrooms including a master suite of nearly 700 square feet.

□ Five full bathrooms.

□ Five fireplaces.

It's luxury that fantasies are made of. But for some, just having a roof over their heads is a fantasy. Knowing that, Compo held two recent open house parties at Villa Fantasia to aid the homeless in metro Detroit.

The semi-formal parties, at \$30 per person, included a tour, hors d'oeuvres, non-alcoholic punch and musical entertainment. Informal tours will also be given daily through the month of June for a \$5 fee.

All proceeds will be distributed to the Pontiac Area Transitional Housing program.

Janet Compo, chief executive officer of the family building company, planned on the benefit long before the Villa Fantasia model was finished.

"I've been concerned about the homelessness issue all along," she said. "We wanted to get involved through the builder's association, but on a personal basis as well."

PATH is renovating an apartment building to provide temporary housing for single mothers with children, Compo said. Child care will be available so the adults can learn job skills and, after a couple of years, move to more permanent housing.

Rent will be charged, but subsidies might be available, Compo said. The opening is targeted for fall.

There's another educational purpose to the PATH program more directly related to housing.

"So much of public housing has deteriorated because people are moving in without any idea how to care for it," Compo said.

Compo's benefit will supplement other efforts to assist the homeless.

"They got a tremendous amount of volunteer labor and material, to help keep the program going, but they need more (money) for job training and administration," she said.

The Villa Fantasia model probably will sell in the range of \$850,000 to \$900,000, Compo said. A couple of potential purchasers already have expressed interest.

Who would buy such a large, expensive house?

"A top-line executive in a company," Compo said. "In Pheasant Hills, we have a lot of people who own their own business. It's surprising what some people can afford. I'm always amazed."

Compo said she's especially proud of the energy features of the model including a 97-percent efficient furnace, R-27 insulation in walls on the main floor, R-35 on lower level walls, R-30 in cathedral ceilings and R-44 everywhere else.

The higher the R factor, the more energy efficient the house.

Compo cited other extras in the house she finds especially attractive,

including an oak paneled telephone booth with a leaded glass door, window and separate stereo system.

"My son, Chris, had a lot to do with it," she said. "When you have teenagers in the home, they can tuck themselves in—so can mom and dad—and use the phone without interruption."

"We have an aquarium built into the wall in the lower level. That was an interest expressed by customers."

"You just have to see them," Compo said of other extras. "That's why it's called Villa Fantasia."

The Villa Fantasia house is on Anderson north of Eight Mile just west of Taft.

Tours of the model will be offered 1-5 p.m. weekdays and 1-7 p.m. weekends through the month of June. The \$5 per person admission fee also will be directed to PATH.

Area housing market slows

Fewer incoming execs blamed

Concerns about the economy and job security apparently are slowing the pace of new home sales in suburban Detroit.

When that happens, information and publicity become especially desirable commodities to builders.

Several sales representatives and real estate professionals made those observations recently during a get-together sponsored by the Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan.

"It (the market) is substantially off from last year," said David Bubes, a sales representative for Wineman & Komer Building Co. "Doom and gloom in employment has put caution in people."

"I hear there's more transferees going out than coming in," he added.

Bette Kessler, a sales rep for the Herman Frankel Organization, said houses and condominiums in its Woodcliff development, which start at \$340,000, are moving fairly well.

But sales are slower in its Simsbury condo development, where units start at \$177,900.

Kessler attributed that to younger people having to sell their current house or condo to buy up. Those who buy into the more luxurious Woodcliff development are more settled in their lives and better off financially.

The market was described as "not wonderful but getting better" by Beverly Weingarden, an associate with Bordener Realty which also represents Wineman & Komer.

Lesley Mancen, affiliated with Ashton & Associates, which does publicity for the Irvine Group, described the market as soft.

"We've got very educated buyers, very professional buyers," she said. "There's a lot to look at. They may go back to look at a place 13 times before buying."

Upwards of a dozen builders mingled with real estate professionals to talk over what's available in the increasingly competitive housing market.

Although the turnout was fairly light, participants spoke well of the experience, especially agents who deal with transferees who want to buy new.

"Young executives don't have time to drive neighborhoods. They have to rely on agents to help

them out," said Benita Hoge, an associate with Ralph Manuel Associates. "Sometimes I get a whole group (of agents) from different offices to do a tour. There's so much of it, it's hard to keep track."

Dolly Hill, manager of Ralph Manuel's Birmingham office, said, "You have to keep abreast of what's out there."

Ron Brodzik and Al DeZell, broker associates with Coldwell Banker, picked up some literature on new subdivisions of which they weren't previously aware.

"We came to see new developments, what's available," Brodzik said. "They (builders) have a very good interest in being cooperative. The market is a little on the tight side. Everyone's trying to generate sales. Since our livelihood depends on it, we go forth."

Transferees make up about 30 percent of the firm's business.

"Our purpose is to save them time driving all over the country," Brodzik said. "We schedule appointments after interviewing them. We're knowledgeable because we do go around and preview developments."

"When you get people from the coastlines . . . transferees to this area, price doesn't seem to be a problem," DeZell said. "You get people from the Midwest, Cincinnati, Kentucky, they get sticker shock."

"Taxes (here) really scare people," he added. Weingarden found another reason to attend the program besides publicizing the Boulder Park development in Bloomfield Hills.

"People do comparison shopping. I have to know what's out there," she said. "The more I know about other products, the more I know about mine. I have to be knowledgeable about the entire market."

Real estate professionals are interested in prices and specifications, but those aren't the major concern, said Pat Hansen, sales rep for Robert R. Jones Associates.

"They want to know what's available today, what can they move their client into immediately," she said.

Rental market feeling crunch

Office, retail and residential rental markets in Detroit and its suburbs are slumping, several property managers said in recent interviews.

Richard Roeser, owner and manager of more than a dozen office buildings, cited a study by Grubb & Ellis that projected an office vacancy rate at upwards of 20 percent here by the end of the year.

With supply exceeding demand due to overbuilding, office owners and managers have been offering financial incentives to retain tenants and attract newcomers, Roeser said.

But that's not the first thing he likes to do. When the market cools, Roeser said he redoubles efforts to make sure his buildings are in top-notch condition and tenants' whims are satisfied.

"Planting flowers, making sure the office is clean—that it's a pleasant place to be," Roeser said. "If you haven't taken care of the building or customers, they're going to move."

"Stale" was the word used to describe current retail and office markets in metro Detroit by Harold Lawson, president of a development and management company.

"We need more growth from outside. That's our problem," he said of office space. "You're going to need some companies coming to the area with faith in the future."

"The office market is probably more overbuilt than any segment. Everyone's competing. Tenants know that."

And ask for concessions.

An influx of major retailers like Target, Kohl's and Mervyn's has contributed to an overabundance of shopping centers here, Lawson said.

"Developers have to build a center for each one," he said. "There's not enough little guys (tenants) to go around. I think we have too many centers for total purchasing dollars available."

Supply and demand and interest rates are the biggest variables impacting the residential rental market, said Ron Slavik, who founded a company 16 years ago to manage apartments.

What to look for in buying small business

I am thinking about buying a small business that has been in existence for more than five years. What are some of the questions I should be asking the seller to obtain information that significantly will influence my decision to buy?

You want to find out everything you can about the business under consideration. When buying a com-

pany, there is no unimportant information.

Unfortunately, many prospective buyers rely primarily on financial statements' data and other available documentation the seller offers to make "informed" purchase decisions.

Although all of this may be very useful, it is not where you should start and stop. You should feel free to

probe and investigate every aspect of the operation.

Ask the seller if you may speak with some of the firm's past and present customers. You may also ask to conduct a random sample survey among company employees.

Other key questions directed at the seller would relate to the major areas of the business such as production, marketing, financial and

personnel. This may be done during the first few meetings with a seller.

After that time, you will be in a position to ask the following questions:

• Which aspect of this business do you enjoy the most? (The answer should take a while.)

• What aspects of the business do you find the most challenging? (Wait

RAP BRIDGES THE GAP

City kid, suburbanite rhyme for a reason

This rap has no rhyme and a reason.

Perhaps that might not be clear at first. A duo of black rapper and white disc jockey might throw you. But when Ronnie B. takes to the mike and spews out his bitter poetry, ripe with images of city living, the message becomes clearer.

Organized Rhymes consists of Ronnie "Ronnie B." Bryant of Detroit and Brad "D.J. B.A.M." Kallen of West Bloomfield. Their alliance symbolized a goal of uniting city and suburb, white and black — two areas that have become quite polarized.

"That's what we're doing," said Kallen, a 1988 graduate of West Bloomfield High School. "You think about it. I live in West Bloomfield and he (Ronnie B.) lives in Detroit. He only lives 10 minutes away and yet, it's a culture shock."

The rap duo has a single out on Just Chillin' Records in Detroit and has been performing a number of shows in the area.

Kallen said he's always had an interest in dance and rap music. He learned the art of spinning discs in part thanks to boxer Thomas Hearns. His mother, Jackie Kallen, served as the Kronk fighter's publicist.

Young Kallen practiced scratching on dated equipment until Hearns stepped in.

Hearns gave Kallen some state-of-the-art stereo gear, including a pair of turntables.

"That was the best present in the whole world," Kallen said.

Enter a street-wise guy named Ronnie B., whom Kallen met working construction. The two hit it off.

At one get-together, Kallen put on an instrumental record and Ronnie B. let loose with a torrent of rapper's prose for 10 straight minutes.

"He rapped off the top of his head," Kallen said.

"I just go into the studio and listen to the music," said Bryant, 18, who lived on the northwest side of Detroit,

"and say what's on my mind."

Except these weren't merely a rhyme of obscure words. Most of the lines dealt with the cruelty of the streets, where children die with frequency and drug pushers have their own fiefdoms.

Ronnie B. and Kallen collaborated on several numbers, on an anti-drug song "Walk Away." One day, the two had both just lost a friend. Brad had an acquaintance killed by a drunk driver, Ronnie B. a friend left dead by a bullet.

The end result turned out to be "That's Life," which is on the group's current single.

"We wanted to do a serious, realistic song — what you'd see in the streets," Kallen said.

Kallen said Ronnie B. has a gift for lyrics. He's no slouch at the turntable, either. He continues to perfect his craft.

"Everything looks easier than it is," he said. "You have to have control of the record itself and do exactly what you want to hear. . . . You have to train your ear and your mind to do it."

Kallen has his influences, ranging from Ice-T to Third Base, an all-white rap group. Ice-T, along with others such as Public Enemy and N.W.A., have come under criticism for the controversial nature of their music and for the violence at some of their shows.

Kallen doesn't feel rap music is a natural catalyst for such incidents, blaming it instead on a few "drugged up" individuals who infiltrate the shows. He hopes Organized Rhymes brings a much more positive image to rap.

Organized Rhymes will perform a series of shows at area schools. Like all local aspiring artists, Kallen envisions a major record deal, videos and stardom. One objective has already been achieved.

"It's just that kids, white and black, can get together peacefully and make music," he said.

Releases fit only for background

For those who view television as background entertainment, well, Academy Entertainment has two-just-for-you on the video racks.

"Rebel Storm" (R, 1989, color, 99 minutes) is a look at the future that is short on originality and bears too much resemblance to "A Handmaid's Tale" and a number of other post-apocalyptic films.

In this instance the apocalypse is the ascension to the White House of a hereditary line of evangelical rulers. When "Rebel Storm" opens in 2099, that line is represented by the Blessed Reverend Jimmie Joe II (Rod McCary) whose rule is enforced by shock troops roaring around on motorcycles and in rather decrepit vans. Their garb is somewhere between Darth Vader and the Roman Arena.

Their leader, Don Waldo (John Rhys Davies), is a sadistic fanatic who will stop at nothing to repress and eliminate the Kropfelders. The latter, it turns out, sum up everything abhorrent to fundamentalists — atheistic rock 'n' roll and sexuality.

Things get pretty silly when a film's dramatic focus and political turning point is popular music. Elliot Kropfeld, it turns out, was a rock 'n' roll disc jockey who refused to knuckle under when the Christian evangelists assumed power.

The Reverend Jimmie Joe and his well-to-do supporters profess fundamental Christian values but hypocritically live a decadent life with, for ex-

ample, a copy of "Playboy" selling for \$120,000. Scapegoating the Kropfelders is a major technique of this corrupt ruling elite.

The governmental fiction is that the Kropfelders are anti-social monsters to be eliminated and there was no Kropfeld in the first place.

Enter the heroines of the Kropfeld under-ground, the Hart sisters, Milla (June Chadwick) and Blaise (Elizabeth Keifer), whose mission is to discover VHS tapes which prove that Kropfeld existed. By coincidence they join up with two would-be heroes, the Cage brothers, Artie (Zach Gilligan) and recently paroled Joe (Wayne Crawford).

After all the usual shoot-'em-up, desert chase sequences which are pretty well staged, well, do I have to tell you? Rock'n'roll may be where it's at, but this film is simple-minded by any measure.

If you believe the premise of "Rebel Storm," however, you probably are so well anesthetized by the media that you won't question "Blown Away" (1989, color, PG-13, 92 minutes) and its preposterous assumption that high-fashion model Lauren La Salle (Loni Anderson) doesn't know that her husband, Rick (James Naughton), is a top-level drug dealer.

During several years of marriage, viewers are expected to believe, all these hard types landed at their country estate in helicopters and she never caught on. That's life in the suburbs with a major

modeling career and a cute daughter.

When Lauren does overhear an incriminating discussion, she confronts Rick with her knowledge of his nasty occupation. His reaction, of course, is positively unfriendly when she raises the question of divorce and custody of their daughter.

Given his refusal, she manages to slip away with \$2 million in cash that conveniently happened to be in the house where she could get at it. Lauren changes her identity, launders the two million bucks and takes flying lessons with Charlie (John Heard).

Of course, the next step is to evade Rick's gang of thugs and kidnap the baby. The finale of the epic is quite incredible.

No doubt these two tapes will make money with their clichéd but standard chase-and-shoot formula. Cars, trucks, vans, planes, choppers, bikes — everybody likes a good chase even if it's a replay of the last 17 chase sequences.

Of course, there is so much interest in tapes of every sort and so much money flows in that everyone is interested in being part of video cassette's success story. The large number of Oscar-nominated films available on tape this year prior to Awards night is an indication of the shift in the business from the box office to the home VCR.

But this kind of success bodes ill for the country's intellectual level. When anything sells, producers will sell everything.

Nugent lends licks to Damn Yankees

DAMN YANKEES
— Damn Yankees

First, there was Bad English, in which Neal Schon, Jonathon Cain and John Waite joined forces in a calculated move to land a few chart singles. They succeeded, but mostly on the pop side of rock.

Now, meet the Damn Yankees, who are also likely to succeed commercially, but with a slightly different audience — and in a much louder fashion. Group ringleader Ted Nugent, Michigan's own guitar hero, saw to that. He and his cohorts, Tommy Shaw (formerly of Styx), Jack Blades (formerly of Night Ranger) and drummer Micheal Cartellone, have created an album that should put AOR program directors across the country in a state of nirvana.

Despite this being Nugent's most overtly commercial project in years (if ever), it's difficult to find any signs of compromise. Each song contains at least one heavy dose of signature Nugent riff, not to mention a dash or

two of the subtle sexuality that makes Nugent's music so endearing to the faint of heart.

Blades and Shaw split the vocals throughout the album, with Blades getting the nod for "Coming of Age," the current single. Shaw contributes some old Styx harmonies to Blades' vocals in "Bad Reputation," yet another guitar workout. "Runaway" sounds like an outtake from the last Shaw solo album that Terrible Ted souped up in his inimitable way.

This album sounds like a bunch of rock veterans who got together to share some licks, crank up the amps and have a heck of a good time. Blades even borrowed the idea from the debut Night Ranger release of having a self-titled song on the album — the result is a fun, lyrically worthwhile romp.

Each of the three main components makes their own distinctive contribution to the project, making the album a worthwhile buy for more than just Nugent, Styx, and Night Ranger fans.

READING, WRITING
AND ARITHMETIC
— The Sundays

The Sundays are a brilliant band. That's all that need be said. But, for most, that simply won't do. Of course, people would like to know why.

After countless listens to The Sundays' debut album "Reading, Writing and Arithmetic," (Geffen) the ways to The Sundays' joyous music outnumber succinct answers. And therein lies the beauty.

The Sundays hail from North London and are pegged as the band of 1990 by the British music press. Skeptics, naturally, would doom the outfit to wither in its own hype.

But the four-member outfit could win over the most jaundiced music listener with a steady, unrelenting stream of gorgeous guitar melodies and breathless vocals by its lead singer, Harriet Wheeler.

Part of The Sundays' appeal is they've seemed to encompass all that was positive musically of the 1960s and refined them.

On a cursory listen, one could draw comparisons between the lovely, almost schoolgirlish vocals of Wheeler and those of 10,000 Maniacs' Natalie Merchant. The major difference is Wheeler is not strung out on vocalizing about social issues and causes.

Instead The Sundays' lyrics are laid back, open for introspection and interpretation. Singa Wheeler in the uplifting "My Finest Hour": "We are who we are/What do the others know/But poetry is not for me/So show me the way to go."

David Gavurin's guitar play is often understated, but nonetheless outstanding. He displays occasional flashes of swirling guitar buzz that leaves your head spinning.

- If you had to do it all over again, what would you do differently? (This one works to identify all the "lost opportunities" as well as any "mistakes" the seller feels personally responsible for.)

- If money was not a constraint at times, what could you have done with this company? (He or she probably will tell you in the next five minutes everything that is wrong with the business.)

Should an independent audit be used to reveal problems with a company?

An audit is verification of financial data using procedures and tests known as GAAS (generally accepted auditing standards). While these procedures are the best known for checking the reliability of financial data, they have not been designed to uncover fraud and actions of collusion on the part of company management.

isn't particularly catchy. It is not really like anything else.

Perhaps it is supposed to be artistic. That's probably the most feasible answer.

The lead singer, guitarist and founding member of the band, known only as "Robert," explains the album thusly: "You don't have to be out of your skull to listen to repetitive music. Our music is trance-like anyway. There's this cycle, and there's always things coming off the cycle, taking to a completely different tangent. It all depends on the listener. It should be a hold, a conglomerate. Nothing in the music should be more important than anything else. It should be a total onslaught of everything together."

As strange as this "explanation" sounds, it actually does make a little bit of sense. You see, the album is full of loud, fuzzy guitars, thumping bass and pounding rhythms — common stuff in energetic rock or punk albums. What is unusual is that instead of "revving up" the listener, these sounds work together to lull the listener into a trance.

The sounds are repeated to a monotonous degree. Hence, the description of "trance-like."

It seems impossible to believe that music made with fuzzy guitars, thumping bass, etc. . . . could be hypnotic, but Loop has managed to do it with this album.

The group said that it was influenced by such divergent elements of popular culture as Vietnam films, MC5, new age, Stanley Kubrick and Sun Ra. Judging by "A Gilded Eternity," Loop doesn't seem to be lying. Their music is something that can only be described with almost meaningless oxymorons like "loud new age" or "relaxing hard rock."

In other words, this is challenging music. It can't be adequately explained either in words or by comparisons to any other type of music — it has to be heard to be understood.



WHEN SLEEP WON'T COME

Testing may be the cure

In the middle of the night last Labor Day weekend, a local man calmly and deliberately opened the long, narrow window of his second-story condominium bedroom and stepped out . . . into nothingness.

Minutes later, he picked himself up from the lawn and just as calmly and deliberately rang the doorbell of his condominium. His spouse let him in and called 911. Some time later he was in the emergency room of Providence Hospital undergoing treatment for 12 broken ribs and a broken shoulder, all for an event he couldn't even recall. He had been sleepwalking and apparently mistook the window for a door.

While sleepwalking and other violent and strange behavior during sleep are not common, sleep problems of one sort or another are. They affect the nighttime rest of at least 15 percent of the population.

That's the estimate of Dr. R.B. Sangal, director of the Sleep Disorders Institute, a private practice located since April 1 in the Beaumont Medical Building in West Bloomfield. The local address houses offices for consultation and referral for testing and treatment at Sangal's full-service sleep disorders center in Troy.

Sleep-related disorders include snoring and breathing difficulties in sleep, daytime sleepiness, insomnia, impotence, strange behavior and seizures in sleep.

Although the medical specialty has been around for 20-25 years, "The problem has always been present," Sangal said. "People just don't like talking about it. If you're not sleeping well, there's the suggestion that it's your own fault when that's not really true. As if you could sleep if

you only tried harder."

Excessive sleepiness is the complaint of many of Sangal's patients, also manifesting itself in chronic fatigue or decreased alertness. Common causes include sleep apnea, narcolepsy, idiopathic CNS hypersomnolence, closed-head injuries or chemical imbalance in the brain.

Insomnia, the inability to sleep, is a symptom related by many institute patients, and the result of various conditions, including stress, depression, drugs and alcohol and the chronic use of sleeping pills.

Perhaps as many as one in six have sleep apnea — stopped breathing during sleep, associated with heavy snoring.

"Most have no idea they even snore," said Sangal. "It's the spouse who first becomes aware of the problem. They only know they're tired and sleepy the next day."

The apnea may last 10-12 seconds and may occur several hundred times per night. With each apnea, blood and brain oxygen drops, the heart slows down and blood pressure rises.

Then a brief arousal occurs, too short for the patient to be aware of, Sangal said, often accompanied by a snort, gasp, or leg or body jerk. The patient resumes breathing, falls back to sleep and repeats.

The severity of sleep apnea depends upon the frequency and the depth to which the heart rate falls each time. Mild apnea may cause no symptoms other than snoring and may not need to be treated. Moderate sleep apnea can cause daytime sleep-

iness. But severe sleep apnea has been associated with high blood pressure, irregular heartbeat, strokes, heart attacks and sudden deaths.

"Thirty percent of those with severe apnea will die in 8-10 years," Sangal said.

Many sleep problems are inherited. "It's astounding how much we're a creature of our genes," Sangal said. Among those inherited disorders are narcolepsy, described as sudden, uncontrollable lapses into deep, restful sleep.

Another is idiopathic CNS hypersomnolence, excessive sleepiness which is not relieved by napping.

Most sleep disorders can be treated, Sangal said. The first step is evaluation in the sleep lab. Patients arrive for an overnight stay in the hotel-like setting around 9 p.m. Electrodes are attached to the scalp, face, chest and legs. The patient goes to sleep at 11 or 11:30 p.m.

Surprisingly, Sangal said, they often sleep better in the lab than they did at home. "They leave all their problems at home, which is sometimes the cause of the sleeplessness . . . Sometimes the problem is only a perception. The insomnia is being caused by poor sleep habits. The mechanisms are OK but there is stress."

While the patient is in safe, comfortable sleep, a technician is observing "electrically, physiologically, visually and audibly," Sangal said. A thousand pages of paper record heart, muscle movement and more, to be interpreted the next day by the technician and reviewed by Sangal. "I

confirm what was found or what was not found," Sangal said.

He then recommends treatment.

For those with moderate sleep apnea, weight loss and medicine. For those with more severe symptoms, surgery may be required to remove excess tissue in the throat which is blocking the airways, or use of pumps to mechanically inflate the airways. "For sleep apnea, the success rate is 90-95 percent," Sangal said.

Narcolepsy and idiopathic CNS hypersomnolence can be controlled with medicines.


It is possible that those suffering from insomnia may require nothing more than behavioral changes, Sangal said, sometimes as simple as regular sleep patterns. "There are some people who go to bed one day at 9 p.m., one day at 1 a.m. and wake up at different times. For some people that's fine. They can tolerate it. For others, it causes havoc."

For occasional insomnia, Sangal said, "Prescription pills are wonderful if used occasionally, but they can be abused. When used for more than one or two months they may create addiction, leading to withdrawal symptoms and rebound insomnia. It's used in treatment as a last resort."


Over-the-counter sleeping pills are not recommended because of the side effects, Sangal said.

The average adult needs 7-8 hours sleep per night, Sangal said, "but some can get by with four. Others need 10-12. It's whatever makes you feel good during the day."



On December 15, in response to an emergency call, Michigan Humane Society (MHS) cruelty investigators arrived at a house that had been abandoned by its former tenant for over a month. 

Every person has their own reason why they watch television, then why they select particular

shows. Well this also applies why one decides to produce a television show. An important factor that all advertisers know is that television is a very powerful tool. For several years the "commercial" world was very vocal to tout Community Access Channels as being not of any significance. Not so anymore. All National Competition and National Television Programming Services are recognizing all types of produced television product.

A fine example of this was through the 'Emmy' and the 'Ace' Awards Programs. The 'Emmy' is representational of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences. Their purpose is to advance and foster creative leadership in the television industry. Granted the past membership was very dominated by the familiar Broadcast Channels. Each year the membership represents a more realistic view of the Television Spectrum.

The Michigan Chapter held its Annual Awards May 5, 1990 at the Troy Marrit Hotel. Everyone you see on the local TV was there. It is interesting that those who we most commonly recognize are the News Commentators.

We attended to lend support to our very own Fred Shaheen. Fred produced a Documentary in support of the organization P-Flag. The Documentary is entitled, "Listening, Learning, Loving: Parents of Lesbians and Gays." How proud we were of Fred, that evening as the excitement rollicked through the room. In the Documentary Category were commonly recognized heavy hitters. Philip Handleman of WTVS and Mort Crim, John Owens of WDIV and then there was Community Access with Fred Shaheen of Ch. 12 MetroVisionWOCC. The winning Documentary was "Remembering the Holocaust" by Philip Handleman-WTVS. What a thrill and an honor for all.

The evening saluted forty-six cat-

egories. They also honored "zany comedian" Soupy Sales, with the Governors' Award. This Award is presented each year at the Emmy Gala to a person whom the Board of Governors deems having made a significant contribution to the broadcasting industry.

The "Ace" Awards represent the National Cable Television Association which consist of Cable Companies throughout the United States. The 'Ace' Award Evening drew international appeal with participants from Europe, Japan, Canada and the United States.

Our Local News Intern Coordinator, Farmington Resident Tracy Thompson covered the event. Tracy is an instructor at Wayne State in the area of Television and Film SDcript Writing. She headed up an entourage of students to support our local entrant. Denise Swope, a Canton resident, began and has continued her advocatin in Community Television through producing of socially significant documentaries. She had been nominated in the Public Service Announcement single spot category for her PSA, "Stop Child Abuse".

Accompanying Denise Swope to the awards were two of her production crew-Victor Spicer, the animator and John Prusak, the videographer. Terry Kelly and Tom Daughtery, other production members did not attend.

Tracy reported that local producers are honored in over thirty-five categories, which range from News, to talk shows, educational series and documentaries. Martin Mull hosted this twelfth annual "Ace" competition.

In the opening remarks, "Visions for the '90's," it was predicted that by the end of the decade, cable television systems could offer menus with up to 250 channels. Viewers would pay only for what they consume.

Tracy reports that the show was also saturated with exhibitors displaying their cable offerings such as: Disney Channel, ESPN, TNT and the Movie Channel.

Several of the new items attracted Tracy's attention. The Sci-Fi Channel plans to mix old TV series, Fantasy and Horror movies with original programming starting in 1991. Two other channels plan to of-

fer legal programming, one of which is "N COURT". This channel operates in New York. It features real trials from "44" states.

How our world is becoming so accessible to us! Also the 'aura' of television stars are reaching more and more into our own homes. Just think of the people in our neighborhoods who are now being seen on television, and the most powerful of all, they are being heard and listened to! Watch and Recognize and Listen and See if You Agree. Then please know that you have your own very own opportunity to share in the excitement of the 'aura' within television not too far from your home. Learning to handle kids a 'major' accomplishment

Gerald McRaney stars as tenderfoot dad

Most families just have a generation gap between parents and offspring to conquer, but in "Major Dad," one of this past season's hit CBS comedies, there is much more to overcome than the two generations.

Not only do the three children in the show come up against the typical differences between parent and child, but they also face a "major" difference of opinion between their parents about child rearing. That difference of opinion is what has made the show a success.

Gerald McRaney stars as Mac MacGillis, a conservative Marine major who, in the premiere episode, fell in love with and proposed to Polly Cooper, a liberal journalist played by Shanna Reed. Mac's new assignment soon became the most difficult one he had ever faced, heading up a household of an independent wife and three daughters.

"The producers of 'Simon &

Simon,' John Stephens and Rick Okie, sort of together came up with the idea, basically, of a guy in an odd profession, a la Army, Marine Corps, some sort of seemingly terribly right-wing sort of profession having to deal with kids for the first time in his life seriously," McRaney explained about the show's genesis.

"I think a lot of people have this notion of a Marine being about as far right-wing as you can go without becoming Genghis Khan, and a lot of other people have the notion that journalists are about as left-wing as you can go without actually pledging allegiance to the red flag," he joked.

"The thing we'd like to carry out in this show is the notion that you can have divergent points of view, but we're all in the same game, here," he added. "Maybe it's too much of a cliché to say that 'love conquers all,' but it can conquer a lot."

The first season of the show has proven that point time and time again, as Mac has dealt with situations he never thought he would.

McRaney's real-life parenthood has had its share of hard knocks, but determination pulled him through the rough times. The actor was

faced with a difficult decision when his son from his first marriage, Angus, now 19, was diagnosed at age 3 as having been born deaf. At one point, McRaney considered giving up acting to seek more reliable employment and help his son.

But a flurry of parts kept him from having to change careers, and enabled him to help his son in other ways. For two grueling summers, McRaney joined his son in an intensive program at the John Tracy Clinic in Los Angeles, a clinic named after the late actor Spencer Tracy's son, where speaking and lip reading, rather than signing, were taught. His son's vocabulary quickly improved to the levels of other children his age.

"Mackie's what used to be called a square," said McRaney's one-time co-star Jameson Parker when the two were starring in "Simon & Simon," "a very stable guy, a family man."


