Millage question is renewal

An Aug. 7 primary request for a five-year, .5-mill fire services tax does not necessarily mean township tax bills will increase, officials said last week.

The .5 fire operations ballot proposal is "an opportunity" to raise taxes that must follow a detailed public process before it can be assessed, township Manager Richard Henningsen said.

Headlee rollbacks would bump the fire millage from .38-mills to approximately .33-mills in 1990, said township Finance Director James Graham. Voter approval of the .5 fire millage means the township could assess at least .33-mills, up to .5-mills under state guidelines, Graham said.

"That doesn't automatically mean we would set it at .5," Graham said. "There seems to be a lot of speculation about a tax increase that may not even occur."

Graham said if voters approved the ballot proposal, the township board would have to set a Truth-in-Taxation hearing to reset the millage rate to .5.

According to state law, the board

would then have to approve by resolution a proposed additional millage rate and place a public notice in a newspaper of general circulation not less than six days before a public hearing is to take place.

The public notice must indicate the proposed additional millage rate and the percentage the rate would increase revenues, Henningsen said.

The board would then have to hold a public hearing "for the purpose of receiving testimony and discussing the proposed additional millage rate," Henningsen said.

The board could then approve an additional millage rate not less than seven days after the public hearing, he said.

Graham said the specific amount needed for 1990-91 fire operations has not been determined. Preliminary budget figures will not be announced until September, Graham said.

Graham said the fire budget could be influenced by a pair of economic indicators.

"We'll get information on the 1990 Census and also see if there is a tail-off in area building (projects)," he said. "That information is crucial. It could sway (portions of the budget)."

Selective wins water main bill

The Northville City Council backed down on its proposal to charge the owners of MainCentre, Northville Downs and St. Lawrence Estates for some \$366,000 in city water main improvements.

Instead, the city plans to spend roughly \$120,000 to forge a new connection with a Detroit water main under Seven Mile Road, and charge The Selective Group for 80 percent of the improvements. The Selective Group is the developer of the St. Lawrence Estates subdivision.

The remaining 20 percent of the cost, or roughly \$24,000, would be paid out of the city's water and sewer fund.

"Because there's an inherent benefit to the system as a whole, it

doesn't seem fair to assess 100 percent to St. Lawrence Estates," said City Manager Steven Walters.

Under the new proposal, engineers would install a new connection to the Detroit water main under Seven Mile Road near Edward Hines Drive and Center Street, rather than enlarging the water mains under Center, Cady, Wing and Fairbrook streets as had been planned.

The city's decision follows protests from attorneys representing the three developers at a recent public hearing.

In a recent report to the council, Walters recommended the city enter into a voluntary special assessment agreement with The Selective Group for the water pressure improvements, "since they appear to be the

Youth world series play comes to town

Northville has hosted the National Amateur Baseball Federation (NABF) World Series since 1983. And Northville has been plagued with the

kids from all parts of the country. But I think more importantly, you'll see the best of what Northville has to offer."

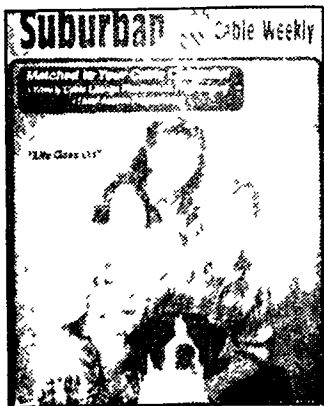

Schools ask for input on funding

Northville school officials are asking taxpayers for direction on how to compensate for the school district's expected loss of state funding.

Additional taxes and / or cuts in school programs will be required in order to balance the Northville Public Schools budget for the 1990-91 school year if the proposed state school-finance bill becomes law, said John Street, Northville Schools director of business and finance.

Members of a special school finance committee will try to determine the course of action preferred by the majority of Northville homeowners.

They were assigned that task at a special meeting at the high school Wednesday attended by approximately 40 members of the district's Strategic Planning Committee, four Board of Education members and several administrators.

Supt. George Bell said the legislative proposal calls for specific action by the affected districts, and the board and administration do not want to act without public input.

Members of the central committee and funding action planning team will meet again Aug. 8 to develop a recommendation for the board.

The district is expected to fall short \$1.04 million because of the state plan to "recapture" funding from out-of-formula districts, such as Northville.

The state Legislature June 29 approved the 1990-91 State Aid Act, which includes the school finance bill. The package awaits Gov. Blanchard's signature.

The bill reroutes state funding that formerly would have been allocated to property-rich, out-of-formula districts to poorer, in-formula districts, based on a complicated "Ability to Pay" formula.

The 1990-91 budget approved by the Northville board in June anticipated approximately \$1.5 million in funding from the state. The legislative proposal would "recapture" most of that.

Northville's budget allowed \$250,000 for recapture.

Trustee Glenna Davis said Friday the board members set aside that amount based on what they were advised was the most likely scenario — the Legislature would "freeze" state funding to out-of-formula districts for the coming school year and then gradually implement a recapture plan.

"We were not expecting a change of this magnitude," Street said. "We could have been holding more than \$1 million in abeyance. Then we would not have \$1 million worth of teachers or we could have had high classroom numbers... then the legislation might not have passed."

"We would have been starting at the cuts that we're (talking about) making now for no reason," Street said. "We were kind of stuck either way."

The school board passed a resolution Wednesday urging the Governor to veto the act and return it to the Legislature for "responsible action."

The resolution requested that action, with recognition that "1990-91 budgets are already formulated and that districts like Northville with an increasing student population are already hard-pressed to maintain quality programming."

"Northville is getting a double whammy," Bell said, losing the state funding and increasing enrollment at the cost of approximately \$5,000 per each child at the same time.

Approximately 250 new students are expected to enroll in Northville schools for the 1990-91 school year.

Davis said, "We wouldn't be in trouble if we weren't getting these new kids."

"We're performing at a level par with other districts spending \$2,000 more than us per pupil — that means we're operating on a lean budget," she added.

If the state proposal is signed into law, the district has two alternatives — increase revenues or cut programs in order to balance the 1990-91 budget, Bell said.

Some out-of-formula districts are considering using their fund equity to compensate for the money the state is recapturing.

Northville had projected \$426,000 in general fund equity by the end of the 1990-91 school year. But with the \$1.04 million shortfall, the budget still would be short in compensating for the recapture amount, explained Street. That money could be used to fund part of the shortfall in conjunction with another form of revenue, he added.

However, leaving the district with a zero fund balance for the 1991-92 school year is not a favorable alternative either, he said.

Davis said, "Cuts would have to be substantial. \$1 million is a lot of money in a district the size of ours."

The school board approved the application to the county for an election date with the amount of millage to be determined after the Strategic Planning committee's Aug. 8 meeting.

In response to a resident's question about a contingency plan, Bell said, "Either we solve the problem financially or we make the cuts."

"We'll decide what we have to do. We'll let every one know what we're doing and we'll do it," Bell said.

After the vote, Treasurer Carol Rahimi said, "I want to note that it is the board's intent to pursue millage so we don't have to cut programs."

Physical education has dim future



Q: I read where Bo Schembechler, former University of Michigan football coach, gave a special graduation speech to the 75 physical education majors who were graduated from U-M last month. My son wants to be a physical education teacher and a coach. I am concerned about his opportunity for getting a job four years from now. Are my concerns legitimate?

Unfortunately yes. A simple calculation tells me about 450-500 phys ed majors are graduating this year. My estimate does not take into consideration the juniors who will be seniors next fall, and the sophomores and freshmen presently in the physical education programs.

Potentially, there could be close to 1,500 of the present phys ed majors now in colleges graduated

and looking for a teaching job by your son's senior year in college. We don't have enough gymnasiums in the state to accommodate those numbers.

It is not my purpose to bring doom and gloom to those who wish to coach and teach physical education. But somehow, young adults need to know the facts before committing to a four-year physical education degree only to find very few physical education jobs available when they graduate.

One fact is that today's couples are having fewer children. Fewer children mean fewer teachers are needed.

Also where students are required to take English, math, science and social studies for three or four years, phys ed may be required for only one year. Therefore a school district needs fewer phys ed teachers for their middle schools and high schools.

And, unfortunately, if cutbacks in staff occur, elementary art, music and phys ed have traditionally been the first areas cut.

And with the proliferation of athletic events, which now include women's sports, many schools

are hiring part-time coaches who have other jobs. Many of these part-time coaches played the sport but are not necessarily phys ed majors. Many have degrees in other areas and they are cost-effective.

I taught chemistry, a couple phys ed classes and coached varsity basketball early on in my career. I learned then and still believe in the value of a sound body as part of a sound mind.

Health and physical education programs in school districts too often have been after-thoughts and do not receive the recognition they deserve. Our present cultural trend, however, is beginning to appreciate the value of a sound body.

What I suggest is that your son get a double major, one in physical education and one in a subject such as general science or language arts, biology, social studies etc.

Northville hosts youth world series baseball

During the sophomore World Series, youngsters 14 and under are admitted free and those 16 and under gain free admittance during the junior series.

"I think it draws attention to the quality and level of baseball that can be played at that age," Johnson said.

But despite all the apparent draws the event offers — low price and good baseball — it has so far failed to attract crowds, besides family, sponsors and volunteers, Frellick said.

In hopes of alleviating the attendance plague, organizers plan to step up advertising to boost community awareness of the event.

"I keep telling people that you can pay \$10, \$15, \$20 at a Tiger game and not see better baseball," Frellick said. "As you know, it's more enjoyable with 50,000 people at Tiger Stadium than 2,000."

Further, the event directly benefits Northville youth, in terms of funding the baseball teams and also funding scholarships that are

awarded to high school students.

But Mickey Mantle Coach Joe Staknis said, "We're trying to get a higher interest level among the residents. But at this point, I'd probably say it's going to be like it was in the past."

Another segment of the past both coaches hope to shake is the performance of Northville teams — zero tournament wins in eight years for the juniors and zero for the sophomores in three.

But first the Mickey Mantle team must pull itself back together after watching its record shrink from 9-3 to 9-7, finally finishing the season at 12-8.

"It's not the ideal way to prepare for a tournament of this size," Staknis said of his team's four game skid.

While Mickey Mantle hopes to shake a slide, Johnson's team enters the series confident after capturing a Livonia tournament. The team's record stands even at 12-12.

St. Lawrence to bear bulk of water line costs

only major party receiving substantial benefit from the improvement at this time.

"Further analysis of water flow rates has indicated that the requirements of MainCentre are met by the existing system without enlargement," he wrote. Also, Walters added, "Since the proposed alternative does not involve water main reconstruction directly serving Northville Downs, and they have been operating in their present state for many years without water pressure problems, it does not appear to be feasible to involve their property in an assessment district related to the proposed improvement."

Walters told the council Monday that further study by the city engineers found MainCentre's water supply "marginally within the requirements for the maximum fire flow rates."

He said the new proposal would improve the system's water pressure at least as much as the original plan, and possibly more. But he noted that the "residual benefit" of having brand-new water mains would be

lost, and that those mains would have to be replaced sooner than if they were upgraded now.

In their final engineering report on the expansion project, McNeely & Lincoln officials said the new concept was explored after "it appeared that needed project was in jeopardy due to its cost, and the removal of the MainCentre development from the special assessment district." The report called the proposed hookup to the Detroit water main on Seven Mile "an unconventional alternative solution to the fire flow deficiency."

The Selective Group has long known that water main improvements would be needed to support its St. Lawrence Estates project, according to the engineers' report. The company petitioned the city to form a special assessment district to extend a water main from their development to the transmission main at the corner of Wing and Cady streets. But the permit was only granted on the condition that the water main between the development and the city's master connection be upgraded.

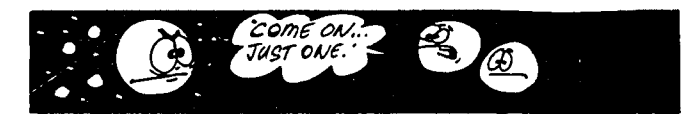
The new connection would maintain water pressure in the city even if the existing connection broke.

City aids in video aimed at children

To most people, firefighters are life savers, heroes in red during times of crisis.

But tragically, one segment of the population often fears firefighters when they are needed the most.

As City Fire Inspector Robert Turner explained, young children sometimes flee from rescue personnel during a blaze rather than running toward them, and toward safety.

Turner said the sights and sounds of firefighters in their gear and breathing apparatus scare the children, who then run and hide. "We find them in closets, under piles of clothes, between mattresses . . . wherever they can squeeze into," he said.

"That's our worst nightmare, trying to find a child who is hiding."

To help allay those fears, Turner has teamed up with Norm Fankell of Industrial Video Productions in Northville, and Rob Stenger, a communications major at the University of Iowa. The team has spent the last several weeks videotaping the Northville City Fire Department in action. Their aim is to create a videotape that will teach children that firefighters are their friends.

Turner and Fankell first came up with the idea after a softball game in which the two friends played together.

"We were just having a couple of beers after a game and talking about video," Fankell recalled. "We thought that would be a good tool for Bob to use. I guess the goal is to show that the fireman is the children's friend."

Since then, the idea has grown into a safety video that could be used by fire and law enforcement personnel around the state. Stenger, who is completing a summer internship with Fankell's company, has taken over the filming and editing of the tape as a school project.

Stenger is using the production studio in Fankell's basement, and Fankell's video equipment to make the tape. "Rob's doing most of the work, I'm just supervising," Fankell

said. "At the same time, though, I want to put out something quality."

Stenger anticipates the finished product will be about 15 minutes long. "It's probably one of the bigger things I'll have done," he said.

"Right now I'm in the process of getting all the video I need."

That includes the footage from the Northville fire department, shots of actual fires from Farmington Hills, and shots of the full-time fire department in Sterling Heights. The Sterling Heights footage shows firefighters relaxing in the fire department's TV room and kitchen, to make the point that the fire hall is often a home away from home.

Stenger has also written the script for the video, and most of film will be narrated by an off-camera speaker. But Turner does some on-camera speaking, taking off equipment and explaining what each piece is for.

"I'm going to wade through all the footage I've got tomorrow," Stenger said last week. "Then it's time to set down at the editing bench and put it all together."

Stenger said that process could take one to two weeks, or longer.

"I'm just going to use it for my resume, and the fire department can use it for their presentations to groups like schools," Stenger said.

Fankell added, "If it's good enough, we'll be glad to donate it to other fire departments . . . if we make any money, we'll just donate it to the children's fire fund."

"We've got a purpose and we're trying to satisfy a lot of needs. . . . It's something that everybody should benefit from."

Fankell also has a personal interest in the subject — his three-year-old daughter Mackenzie. "I'd certainly like to make sure that she knows someone is going to come in and save her," he said.

Mackenzie is one of the stars of the video, and may be called upon to do some voice-overs on the tape. But Fankell admitted that even Mackenzie was nervous around the firefighters at first, when she first saw them in their suits and fire helmets.

But once she got to know them, her fear quickly wore off.

Site important, but shouldn't be 1st concern

I've bred dogs at home as a part-time business since 1987 but now want to start a pet shop. Recently I noticed available lease space within a new strip shopping center in my neighborhood. I haven't developed my business plan yet, but I don't want to pass up what could be the perfect business location for my future shop either. How should I proceed?

Selecting the right location is very important when starting any new business. But there are several other major decisions that need to be made before the location issue can be successfully addressed. Unfortunately, many new business owners ignore or put off these decisions (such as those required as part of business plan development) in favor of the site selection process, which is more fun.

This is a serious mistake because the location ultimately chosen should be based on the crucial finance and marketing-related decisions that define the specific nature and extent of your operation — not the other way around. As the third major reason contributing to half of all small business failures in the country, choosing a bad business location is one mistake you can't afford to make.

At this point I suggest that you take advantage of the information and experience that others in the same business have to offer. You can start by obtaining a copy of Entrepreneur Magazine's "Pet Shop Start-Up Manual" (No. X1007), which is available for \$69.50 by calling 1-800-421-2345. Once you have had an opportunity to review the manual, you may then want to schedule information interviews with one or more area pet shop retailers to answer any additional questions you have. Taken together, this information will assist you with the development of our own business plan as well as the best location-related options you should consider.

Senior facility eyed for St. John's

If legal hurdles can be cleared, St. John Provincial Seminary in Plymouth Township will become a retirement center for about 1,000 residents.

Retirement and Health Services Corporation of Baltimore, Md., would operate a retirement center with ancillary medical facilities at what was once Michigan's largest seminary.

Retirement and Health Services Corporation operates facilities nationwide. It is unaffiliated with any religious group. "It's a long way from being concluded, but an offer has been made that's acceptable at the appraisal price. We have reason to believe it's an offer that could possibly be concluded with everything else falling into place," said Jay Berman, spokesman for the Archdiocese of Detroit.

The archdiocese and the prospective buyer are in the midst of a 30-day fact-finding period, said a spokesperson for Byron W. Trerice Co., the Birmingham Realty firm handling the sale. Principals involved with the deal declined further comment.

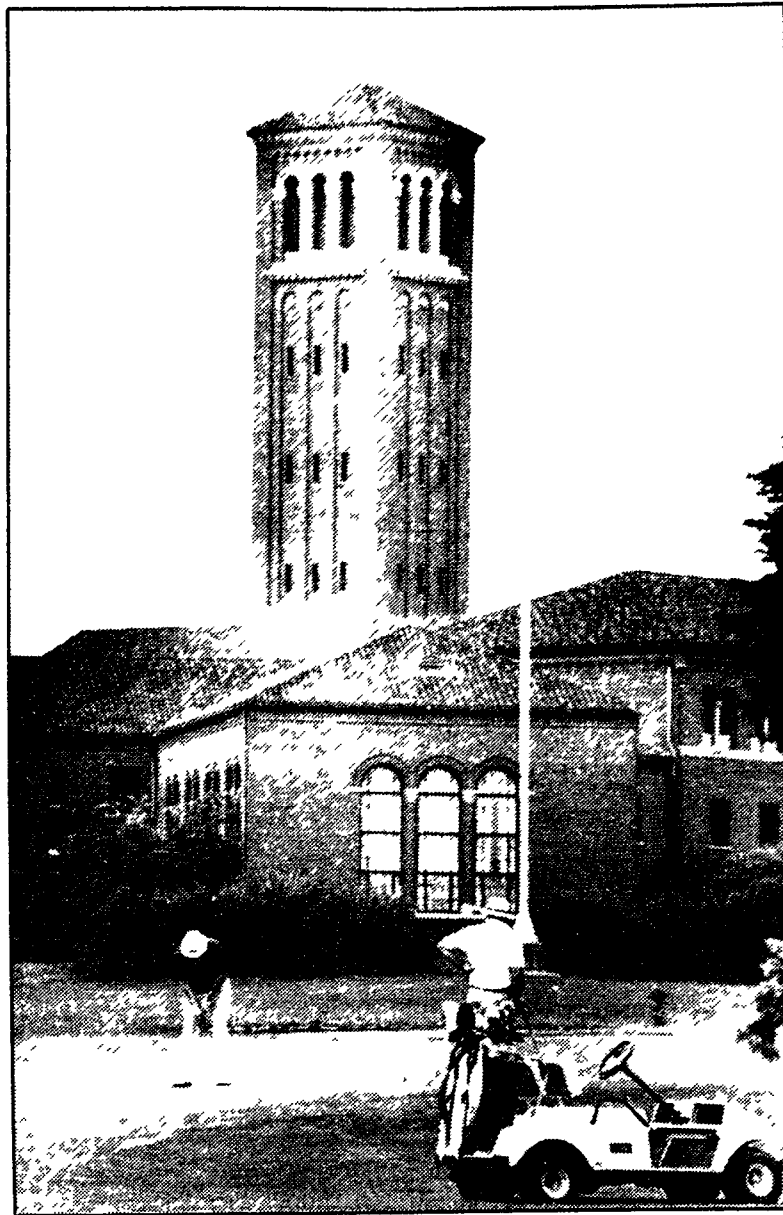
The 40-year-old seminary at Five Mile and Sheldon was closed by the Catholic Bishops of Michigan in June 1988 because of declining enrollment and rising costs. Fifty-seven seminarians — down from a one-time high of 250 — transferred to Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit.

The site includes an 18-hole golf course, leased to the operators of Mission Hills. Potential buyers have been offered two packages, one including and one excluding the golf course, Berman said.

The archdiocese listed the entire 175 acres, including all buildings on the property, at \$20 million. Retirement and Health Services Corporation is interested in just the seminary buildings and 35 acres, which listed for \$7.5 million, according to the Byron W. Trerice Company.

Because the land is church-owned and tax-exempt, there's been no need for a formal appraisal. But roughly speaking, township officials assess the entire site, including the buildings, at about \$3 million. That translates to about \$170,000 in potential new tax revenue for the township, said assistant assessor John McLanahan.

The land is zoned residential, for lots

at least one acre in size.

"Things are very preliminary, but I'd guess that they'll need special use con-

sideration," said township Supervisor Maurice Breen. "They may need pure rezoning. What's clear is that it can't go in

its present designation."

Living quarters at the seminary are so confined that individual bedrooms can't remain as is. "We wouldn't give them a permit to do that," he said.

"I'm sure the facilities were good for students slaving over their books, but everyone recognizes the need for extensive renovation. There's a brand new gym, bowling alleys, a library, study area, and beautiful chapels. There's really some grand space there. But it's a real job to renovate."

Jim Anulewicz, township public services director, said no formal application has been submitted by the buyer.

"We have talked with them once on an informal basis to get some idea of the type of project they're talking about. But we still don't have a handle on exactly the nature of the activity or the extent of it," Anulewicz said. "Until we have a better perspective of what that entails, it would be difficult to answer exactly what kind of modification, if any, would be required. We may be looking at a zoning change, or we could be looking at potentially another district."

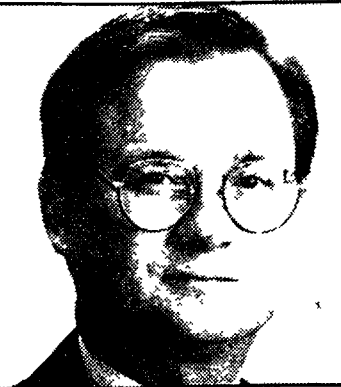
The delay in selling the facility has been less a function of the asking price than of the archdiocese's desire to comply with the township's wishes, said Berman.

Township officials hoped someone interested in running a convention center/golf course would buy the facility. It was rumored for awhile that the seminary would become a Japanese cultural center.

"There have been other potential buyers whose plans the archdiocese didn't feel would be the best possible thing for the whole community," said Berman. "Sometimes you say no even when it hurts."

St. John's buildings and grounds have been maintained by a skeleton crew. "We've kept building security and maintenance facilities there. You have to do that so a building doesn't deteriorate," Berman said.

Wildlife photography

Good shots come to those who wait

Photographers don't get intimate pictures of animals by standing close to the animal.

Most professionals take wildlife photos from their cars or from a great distance away, said professional wildlife photographer Chuck Bartlebaugh of Bloomfield Hills.

To emphasize his point, he held up the lens he normally uses. It is a 400-millimeter lens that weighs 18 pounds.

"This can get pretty heavy when you're climbing up in the mountains," he said.

Heavy, but necessary

"People see these pictures and think they can get close."

Not so. Often an amateur photographer getting too close is what causes an animal, such as a bear, to attack.

Attacks are not caused by vicious bears, but by humans who don't know the rules of the forest.

"Bears basically leave people alone," said Bartlebaugh. "I know of no unprovoked attacks. Most are caused by animals defending their young or food source. People have got to remember that they are intruding in a bear's 'house.'"

Bartlebaugh feels so strongly about teaching would-be wildlife photographers that he formed the Center for Wildlife Information, a group dedicated to teaching photo ethics.

"We're not here to tell people what not to do," he said. "We tell them what to do. We want to teach people how to teach others."

The group formed officially in 1988 when a group of animal photographers met in a rustic bar in Montana.

"People see these pictures and think they can get close."

They decided to research how people made mistakes when dealing with animals.

For this, they developed an "unorthodox, unapproved and unofficial" research team in which members went out to national parks and observed how humans interacted with animals.

Their fears were confirmed — they found the humans to be full of misconceptions about how to interact with animals.

"They were nice people," Bartlebaugh said. "They appeared to have an above-average income, some were members of the Sierra Club, they seemed to be college educated."

But not educated in how to deal with animals.

"Some of the guys tried to be macho and get as close as possible to the animals," he said. "We saw people trying to put their kids on a buffalo."

Not smart. Contrary to popular belief, the most dangerous animal isn't the bear, it's the buffalo.

To clear up this sort of misconception, Bartlebaugh is trying several tactics to educate the public. He recently spoke at the University of Montana's International Wildlife Film Festival.

The center has developed all types of promotional material — everything from slide shows and bumper stickers to placements designed to teach others how to photograph animals.

But, perhaps his most effective teaching method is the sticker about photo ethics that he attaches to the back of each of his pictures.

It says, in part, "All of us share the responsibility for our own safety and for that of the animals when we observe them."

In a time when photographers proportionally outnumber their animal subjects, this is sage advice indeed.

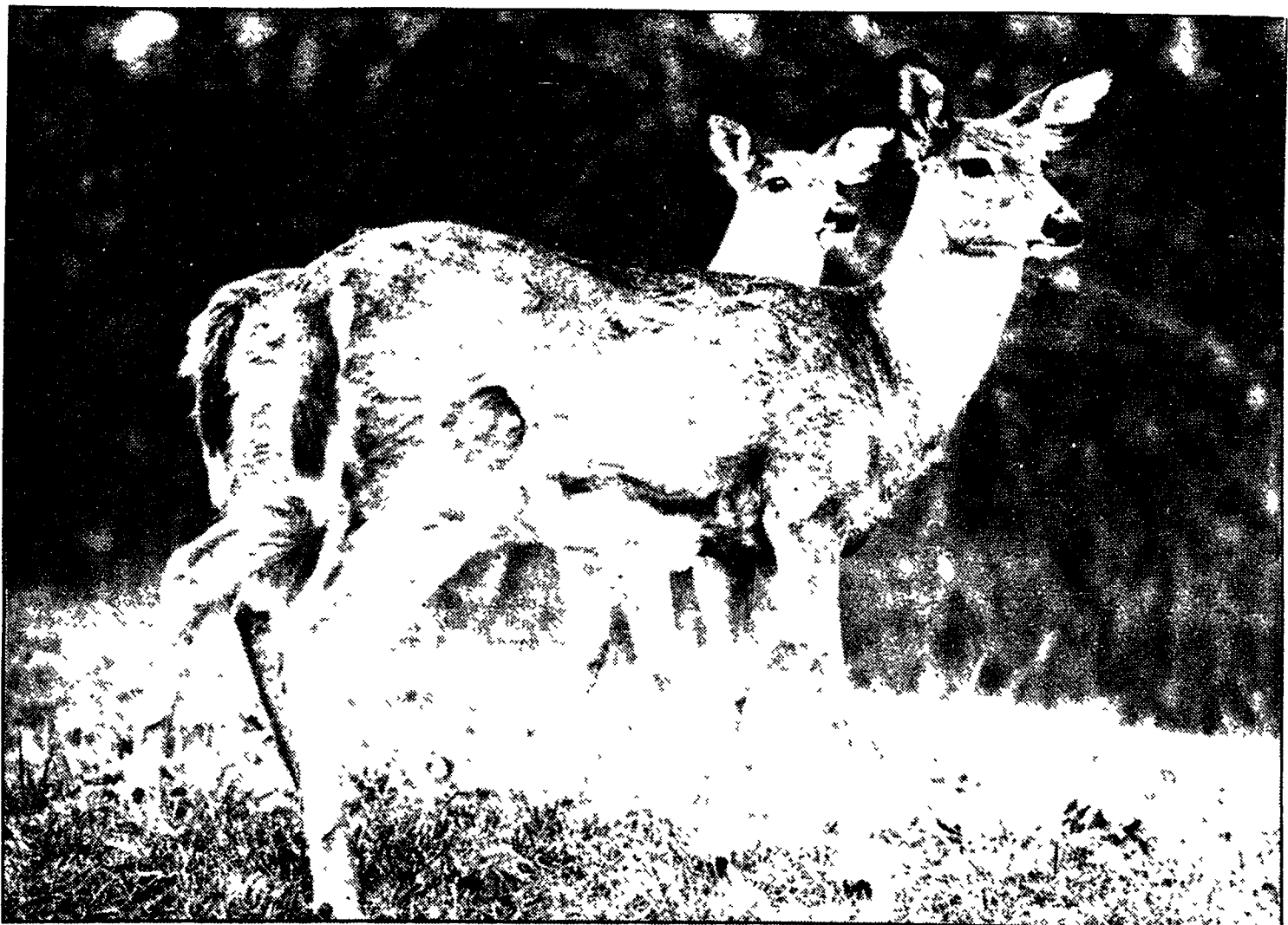

How to get good shots

The Center for Wildlife Information says the following bears are the most dangerous: Cuts, friendly bears that appear to be completely disinterested in you; a sow with cubs; a bear with fresh kill; and a bear habituated to human food and no longer able to feed itself naturally.

How do professional photographers get such great photos? The Center for Wildlife Information uses these guidelines: By using captive and conditioned animals; photographing in specially controlled areas; traveling into the back country; and using a very strong telephoto lens and patience.

The Center for Wildlife information offers the following tips for photographing animals:

- Remain alert to potential danger in spite of your attempt for the perfect photo;
- Maintain a distance of no less than 500 to 1,000 feet to avoid provocation;
- Never surprise a bear or other animal, retreat at any sign of stress or danger;
- Use a 400-millimeter or longer lens. Avoid direct contact with animals, even through the lens;
- Don't crouch or take a stance that may resemble an aggressive stand;
- Don't follow or chase an animal;
- Don't make animal sounds or walls to attract an animal's attention;
- Don't crowd or surround an animal;
- Stay out of dense brush;
- Don't approach or walk in the direction of an animal. This may be interpreted as aggressive behavior and the animal may respond by charging.

Local lands big one in Bass Blastoff

Plastic worms seemed to be the bait of choice, at least as far as the fish were concerned, in the Bass Blastoff held recently on West Bloomfield's Cass Lake.

When questioned about the type of bait used, members of the top four teams each mentioned plastic worms. Gitzits and spinner bait were also mentioned, but the unanimous choice was the plastic worm — dark colors were preferred.

Twenty-one two-person teams registered for the tournament and reeled in a total of 58 fish.

The Bass Blastoff is a catch-and-release tournament and has been held on Cass Lake for the last five years. It is cosponsored by Metro Bass Anglers and the Walled Lake Community Education program.

Brothers Joe and Mike Durand, of Farmington Hills and Union Lake respectively, earned big fish honors for a lunker 2.7-pound largemouth. Mike actually caught the fish — on a K&P purple worm — in about eight feet of water over a weed bed on the edge of a drop off. He won the "big fish pool" of \$84.

"This is actually the second tournament we've fished, because we fished this same tournament two years ago," explained Joe. "That was the only

other time we fished the lake so we were fishing just on luck.

"We fish this tournament because it's not too big and it's close to home. We both love fishing. We do it just for fun. We never expect to win."

The Durands finished the tournament in seventh place with five legal bass that tipped the scale at 4 pounds.

Ralph Blasey, of Pinckney, and Whitmore Lake's William Jones won the tournament with seven fish that weighed 9.2 pounds. They each received a plaque and a \$135 gift certificate to Kelly's Sporting Goods for their efforts.

Larry Aubrey, of Union Lake, and Lou Berti, of Keego Harbor, placed second with eight fish that weighed 8.6 pounds. They each received a plaque and a \$70 gift certificate.

Plaques and \$40 gift certificates went to third place finishers Robert Snor, of Flint, and Dallas Maybee, of Grand Blanc, for their catch of six fish that weighed 6.3 pounds.

Fourth place honors went to Mike Kernon and Kevin Schefferly, both of Walled Lake, for five fish that weighed 5 pounds. They each received a plaque and a gift certificate for \$25.

It was the first tournament for Kernon and

Schefferly, but the two are now hooked on the aspect of competitive fishing.

"It was an excellent time," admitted Kernon. "It was better than just fishing for fun because every cast counted. We're definitely looking forward to doing it again."

"It was different going out there with the big boys. We really didn't know what we were doing, as far as the tournament itself, so we just followed what everyone else was doing."

Last year's champs, Westland's Bill Lunn and Mike Lohn, just missed earning an award, finishing the tournament in fifth place. They landed five fish which weighed 4.6 pounds. Last year, they won the tournament with 10 fish that weighed better than 22 pounds.

"Basically, this year's tournament was about the same as last year's except the fish were a little bigger last year," admitted tournament director Jim Arnold. "We had 21 boats and that's right about where we want to be. We want to keep it to a maximum of 25 boats. The tournament is designed for fun — get together with your buddy and go fishing. There aren't any big prizes or cash awards. It's just a fun way to spend the day."

Take precautions against Lyme disease

Summer has arrived and people are spending more and more time outdoors.

For the most part, summertime activities are enjoyable and risk free, but people should be aware of Mother Nature's own dangers.

For example, this is the time of year when people are most susceptible to Lyme disease. The illness is caused by tick bites that can lead to severe arthritis symptoms and a number of other effects.

According to the Michigan chapter of the Arthritis Foundation, people who live, work near or enter wooded or marshy areas are more susceptible to Lyme disease because the deer

ticks which carry the disease-causing bacteria live in such areas.

Most people who are bitten by an infected tick develop a large, expanding rash around the area of the bite. Rashes vary in size, shape and color, but often look like a red ring with a clear center.

At the onset, signs of Lyme disease include flu-like symptoms out of season, such as a stiff neck, chills, fever, sore throat, headaches, fatigue and joint pain. And unlike some types of arthritis, the pain seems to move from joint to joint.

Some people who become infected develop more serious problems. An irregular heartbeat may occur, some-

times requiring implantation of a temporary pacemaker.

Lyme disease also can cause problems with the central nervous system, causing meningitis, facial palsy or encephalopathy.

While people should be on guard against Lyme disease, people shouldn't become alarmed or paranoid to the point where they're afraid to go outside. By taking the needed precautions against the disease, people can still enjoy their favorite summertime activities.

There are several things people can do to guard against the disease, according to the foundation:

- Wear protective clothing like long

skirts or pants with the legs tucked inside of socks.

□ Check yourself and your children for ticks. Look closely at the hair, ears, underarms, trunk of the body, groin and back of the knees.

□ Inspect pets for ticks before letting them indoors. They may carry the ticks into the house, where they may fall off and then bite family members.

□ Homeowners can clear away brushy and grassy that attract ticks.

Builders seek ways to recycle materials

Recycling of building site materials lags behind other parts of the solid waste stream, but there may be hope as the opportunities for such recycling become more readily available.

Until then, it's up to the building industry to cut back on its waste and reuse whatever scraps remain.

Builder Association of Southeast Michigan (BASM) Executive Vice President Irving Yackness said builders are aware of a need for recycling, but they don't have the opportunities.

Building materials like scrap wood, wall board, scrap metal, poly/polyvinyl chloride (PVC) and metal piping, paints and chemicals don't generally fall in the same categories as the common recyclables.

Loch McCabe, an economist and program analyst with the consulting firm Resource Recycling Systems Inc. of Ann Arbor, recently told a gathering of BASM members that there are few options for the builder who wants to be environmentally friendly.

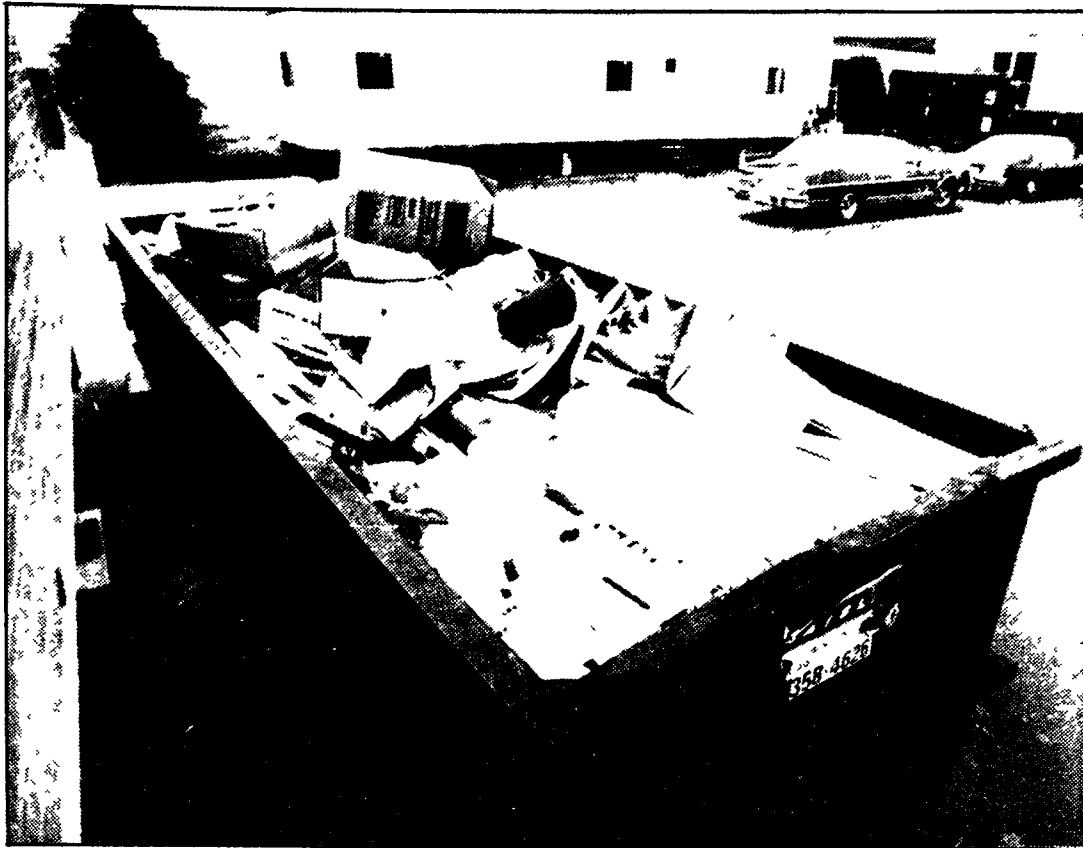
While communities and the private sector offer alternatives to the private citizen—glass, some plastics and paper recycling is becoming common—builders' options are limited, McCabe said.

Builders can still recycle paper, plastic and glass resulting from office work, but until recycling becomes a viable alternative for construction materials, the builder's best option is to reuse and reduce waste.

"If you throw out something you've paid for, you're wasting money right there," McCabe said.

Dave Denske, president of Canton Waste Recycling Inc., is the first to offer recycling services to the builders in this area. "We're experimenting with it, and it's something we're looking forward to."

The increase of waste disposal costs, he said, is the very reason that recycling is becoming a reality, Denske said.

Canton Waste Recycling is accepting only waste lumber, which is ground up into wood chips and distributed as mulch.

Denske is experimenting with concrete and scrap metal recycling on a smaller scale with township residents, but is not offering it as a commercial service yet.

Drywall and PVC piping present a different problem. "I've talked to people about it, but I haven't been able to find anyone to take it yet. We can't recycle anything we can't get rid of," he said.

Denske said, "Everything has a value once it's separated."

Denske speculated that recycling will create a great many jobs and bolster the economy as more companies create products from recycled materials.

Cindy Burgess, Public Administration Research Group in Plymouth, a consulting firm, said recycling, reusing and reducing waste are not enough. If alternatives to the throw-away society are to work, builders and everyone else must "complete the loop."

A growing willingness to recycle and be responsible for waste, while admirable, must be complemented by consumer demand for products made from recycled materials.

"You're not doing any good if you're not buying (products made from recycled materials)," Burgess said.

Burgess said the main obstacle to recycling has always been lack of interest. It was always cheaper and more convenient to throw out than recycle and so public and private interests have not been galvanized toward a market based on recycling.

"My feeling is it hasn't been sexy enough—but now it's hitting in the pocket book," she said.

There are already some recycled building products available. The Office of Waste Reduction Services, according to spokesperson Bill Kesling has obtained and is distributing copies of the Recycled Products Guide, a publication listing manufacturers of products made from recycled materials, Kesling said.

Recycling is more than just collecting

The recycling symbol's familiar three arrows may be more important than you realize. The three arrows represent collection, processing and reuse—the three elements that must balance for recycling to be successful.

Because collection is the first step, most recycling programs have directed their efforts at establishing sound, dependable collection. Their plan has worked, almost too well. As many recycling programs have discovered, the current markets are not usually sufficient to handle the volume of materials currently being collected for recycling. We must begin to build these markets.

The 1990s are being proclaimed the "decade of the environment." Individuals and businesses throughout the country are participating in recycling and conservation programs. If these programs are to continue to be successful, individuals, businesses and organizations must take a leadership role in creating markets for recycled products.

The first step in establishing these markets is to request, buy and use recycled products—both at home and at work.

The next step is to encourage governments and businesses to buy recycled products and establish ongoing procurement programs for recycled products.

In the past finding information about suppliers of recycled products was difficult. This information has become more readily available.

RECYCLED PRODUCTS GUIDE: The American Recycling Market Inc. published the first "Official Recycled Products Guide" in 1989 which listed product suppliers and vendors. This guide may be purchased or may be borrowed from local libraries, university libraries, local government purchasing departments or solid waste management offices. If you can't buy or borrow a copy, call the American Recycling Market at 1-800-267-0707 for the nearest source.

EPA PROCUREMENT HOTLINE: The hotline has information about recycled products suppliers and vendors that meet the EPA standards for paper, oil, insulation products and

retreaded tires. The hotline number is (703) 941-4452.

LOCAL SUPPLIERS: Many local suppliers may already carry a supply of recycled products. Seaman-Patrick Paper in Detroit and their Paper & Graphics outlet stores carry a whole line of recycled paper and have sample books. Check the yellow pages for the nearest location.

Governments significantly impact the marketplace, both in terms of purchasing quantity and by encouraging the private sector to buy recycled products whenever possible.

The Michigan Legislature enacted PA 412 in 1988. This law amends the Management and Budget Act by requiring that all paper products purchased by the state be recycled if the cost does not exceed 110 percent of the non-recycled price. It also states that by 1991, 50 percent of the state's total paper purchases must be recycled paper.

Encouraging the purchase of recycled products begins with getting yourself involved. Set an example with your own purchasing practices. Then share your ideas with family, friends and community groups.

Learn whether and to what extent your local and county governments are currently purchasing recycled products. Commend them for any positive efforts. If they're not using any recycled products, express your desire for them to begin purchasing recycled products by calling, writing, and meeting with the mayor, county executive, city council and solid waste officials.

Use the same procedures when contacting local businesses about their use of recycled products.

If we are to enjoy the benefits of recycling—reduced landfilling, energy conservation and efficient use of resources—we must encourage individuals, businesses and governments to buy recycled products whenever possible to expand the markets for these products.

Joint owner can't cut out in-law

I hold title to some real estate with my brother-in-law. The deed says that we hold it as "joint tenants with full rights of survivorship." Can I convey my interest in the property, which I am told is a life estate, and cut off the interest of my brother-in-law upon my death?

The answer is no. There is no rule prohibiting you from transferring your life estate interest in the property to someone else. On the other hand, your conveyance of your life estate to someone else would not destroy what is called a "contingent remainder" of the joint tenant who was holding the property with you. In other words, even if you convey your life estate to a friend, if that person dies before your brother-in-law, your brother-in-law will have legal title to all of the property.

Simply put, upon the death of either of the original co-tenants, the other co-tenant, or any person to whom he has transferred his contingent remainder, takes the whole estate. The state Supreme Court has recently confirmed this conclusion and also has held that the joint life estate may be partitioned without affecting the contingent remainder. This simply means the property can be divided up during your lifetime but that does not affect the right of the contingent beneficiaries of the life estate to their interest in the property.

Our management company has just submitted a new contract with us in our condo, and they apparently have divested some of the partners and are

In the process of forming a new corporation. Our present attorney has had some affiliation with the old management company in that it was responsible for sending him a number of accounts and, in fact, he had some business relationship with the management firm in that they were joint owners of a building, among other things. Several members of the board think that it is necessary to retain another attorney to review the new management contract to look into its legal and financial background. Do you think that is necessary?

Your board is astute in ensuring that they will be free from any criticism on the part of the members of the association by retaining an independent attorney who has no affiliation with the management firm, either financial or proprietary.

To the extent that the management company is responsible for the attorney receiving numerous accounts almost exclusively, and if the attorney has some business relationship with the management firm, the attorney may well be in a conflict of interest. Even if he or she is not, it may appear that he or she is and the best judgment of the attorney may be altered because of this financial relationship with the management firm.

Prudence being the better part of valor, you have made the right decision in retaining someone who is totally independent of any tie-ins with the management firm.

My husband and I have found a condominium that we really like, but it is a cooperative condomini-

um where we would own the condo but not the land. In the cooperative all property is owned by the corporation which is owned and operated by the members. We would lease the land and the lease is good for 99 years. It is a community of people 55 years and older. Could you please tell me what is your opinion on such an arrangement?

Obviously, without reviewing the "Condominium Documents," it is hard for me to determine exactly what you are intending to purchase. It appears that you may be dealing with a leasehold condo wherein the land is not part of the condo project but it is being leased under a 99-year lease.

You may be confused as to whether, in fact, it is a cooperative where all of the premises of the project are owned by the condo association. It may be that you are confused as to what you are intending to purchase.

The best advice I can give you is to get a knowledgeable attorney to review to "Condominium Documents" in regard to the cooperation-condo/leasehold-condo to determine exactly what you are thinking about purchasing and to give you an opinion in regard to it.

Ignore bells, whistles when building a home

When it comes to product selection in a new home, nearly every new home buyer leaves all the decisions to the builder. But that doesn't mean you can't be educated about what goes in, on and around your new home and select the products with your builder, says Richard Binsacca, new products editor of Builder magazine.

Although many products installed in a speculative housing project are dictated by the type of buyer the builder hopes to attract, you should still be aware of the quality of the products relative to the price of the house. Almost all builders offer upgraded product packages.

"Buying a new home is one of, if not the, biggest investments you will ever make," Binsacca said. "Yet most buyers make that decision based on nothing more than aesthetics and location. Ignore the latter for now and think about how far good looks really go. The attraction starts to wear thin if the windows are drafty, the linoleum floor peels and the siding fades."

Basic home appliances and building products can be easily researched at consumer-targeted showrooms, do-it-yourself home center stores and in home-improvement

magazines. Binsacca cautions against upgraded products for the sake of getting more whistles and bells.

"New high-tech toys with a lot of flashing lights and push-button controls often mesmerize buyers without really doing more than their standard counterparts," he said. "Technology should be functional as well as attractive and fun."

"For instance, what does a touch-control dishwasher do any better than a conventional, turn-the-knob model? Probably not much. But if the upgraded appliance offers better performance (varied cycles, a more powerful spray, better energy efficiency) then it might be worth it."

Binsacca says one high-tech product worth buying is a thermostat. Electronic programmable controls for the heating and cooling system can reduce your energy consumption by allowing you to schedule the system to operate at peak efficiency.

But even in energy-conscious areas, where builders make a point to offer an energy package, many buyers don't think about it beyond the sales brochure. High-efficiency furnaces, heat pumps and air conditioning systems are a bit more expensive but worth the money, Binsacca said.

Poll reveals homebuyers' preferences

Professional Builder magazine polled 814 people nationwide who plan to buy new houses in the next six months and asked what they require in their next dwelling. Here's what they said:

- Increase the size of the family areas, like the kitchen and family room, and add closet space.
- Of those polled, 42.8 percent favor single-level homes; 29.7 percent

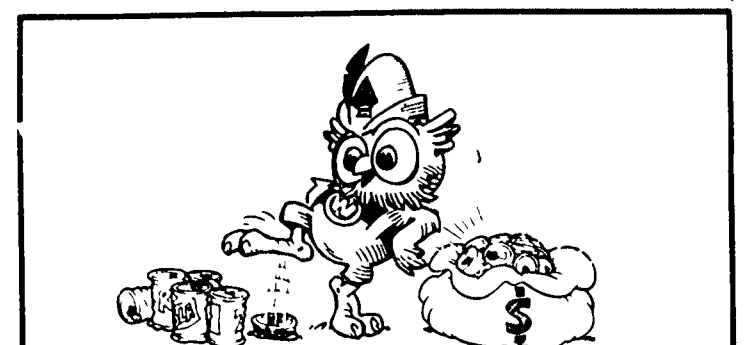
give the note to two-story houses.

- Detached houses are favored by 85 percent. Those favoring attached housing favor townhouses.
- Energy-saving features and quality of construction ranks tops in concern, and buyers want formal guarantees.
- Houses with three or more bedrooms are preferred.

- Two-car garages are preferred by 61.1 percent.
- Buyers want at least two bathrooms, regardless of the house's price range.
- Traditional architectural style is the top selection. Regionally, West Coast and New England house buyers lean toward contemporary style.
- Most buyers want to eat in a separate dining room, but they also

want eating space in the kitchen.

- Brick is the overall favorite exterior finish. Regionally, New Englanders like wood shakes; the West Coast likes stucco.
- Most buyers would trade lot size for upgraded amenities.
- When the choice is size or amenities, buyers of detached houses want more size. Condo buyers want amenities.

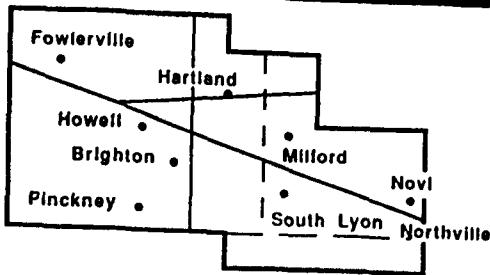

PBS series explores survival of world's gentlest animals

A National Audubon Society series on PBS this summer travels from the Arctic mountains to the Pacific Ocean detailing the fight for survival of some of the world's gentlest creatures.

The one-hour specials, broadcast Sunday evenings, stress the importance of conserving our natural heritage.

"Sea Turtles: Ancient Nomads," airing Sunday, July 15, is a good prototype of the series. For more than 100 million years, the remarkably instinctual sea turtle has survived—weathering several ice ages and outliving dinosaurs.

Now the animal's existence is being challenged by progress. Through stunning wildlife, underwater and hidden-camera photography, the documentary captures the essence of their fight for survival.

The sea turtle population has a lot to fight, from egg thieves and leather and shell poachers to shrimp nets and

environmental pollution. Jane Alexander hosts the program.

Another episode in the series, airing July 29, is "Arctic Refuge: A Vanishing Wilderness," hosted by Meryl Streep.

The show investigates the threat posed by the oil industry's development plans for the pristine coastal plain of Alaska's Arctic National Wildlife Refuge.

Looking ahead, don't miss "Crane River" on Aug. 5, hosted by Leonard Nimoy. The spring arrival of the cranes to the Platte River in Nebraska is an annual event that attracts scientists and sightseers from around the world.

Nowhere else is there such a gathering of cranes. About half a million cranes stop and rest on the Platte during their long migration from the south to their nesting grounds in Canada, Alaska and even Siberia.

Here's news for those of you out there interested in learning about television production. Internships are

available at the various cable franchises. The scope of the internships will vary as programs may include students currently attending college with an internship requirement, internships approved as a result of the interest from the student and dedicated community residents. Some internships receive hands-on experience, while others will include formal training and certification. Internships may be unpaid or paid.

At Omnicom, Cathy O'Loughlin is the Intern Coordinator. There one may secure either a Production or an Engineering Internship of twenty hours a week for four months. Students must be majoring in Television or Journalism. Interns in both areas may also be volunteer community residents. The primary purpose of the Internship Program through Omnicom is to provide a practical understanding of Production, Operations and Programming in exchange for volunteering in television production. There is also an Internship for graduates who are looking for a job. This program is more structured and includes a production skill test as well as the requirement that a videotape be completed.

MetroVision's Internship Program emphasizes direct involvement with the community producers. Joan Lilles is the Intern Coordinator. The applicants must be students majoring in Telecommunications or Broadcasting. They must possess knowledge of basic production skills. The Intern will create programming of Community Interest as well as crew for shows other than their own. The purpose of the Internships are to enhance the schools' program and provide a thorough hands-on experience. Paid Internships are also available with specific job responsibilities such as Cablecasting the Channels, recy-

cling of tapes, art work and working on productions.

The Southwestern Oakland Cable Commission also offers Student and Community Internships. I coordinate those Interns. Internship applications from students of curriculums in Communications, Telecommunications, TV, Radio and Journalism or Public Relations will be considered. Students or residents must be proficient in television production because they immediately join our team. One of the most refreshing family shows to hit the networks last season was the ABC hour-long drama "Life Goes On," featuring a middle class family giving support to their 18-year-old son with Down syndrome.

Christopher Burke stars as Corky Thacher, a young man who has spent years in special education programs, but now is taking steps to be mainstreamed into a "normal" high school.

The character was fashioned after the actor who plays him. Burke, who was born with Down syndrome, might not be playing the part of Corky on the series if it weren't for his own initiative. After seeing actor Jason Kingsley, who also has Down syndrome, guest star on an episode of "The Fall Guy," Burke wrote a letter of congratulations, and a pen pal relationship was formed. From that came an audition for Burke for a movie for the week called "Desperate," where he met and impressed producer Michael Braverman so much that Braverman developed "Life Goes On" patterned after the young actor.

But it is not only the actor's and character's enthusiasm and zest for life that makes the show so endearing, it is also the other characters' reaction to Corky that provides the

refreshing change. They are truly proud of Corky, rather than just coping with his difficulties.

Starring as Corky's family are Bill Smitrovich, as his father, Drew Thacher, Patti LuPone as his working mom, Libby, and Kellie Martin and Monique Lanier as his sisters Becca and Paige.

Smitrovich's own life was changed drastically when he was in high school. His father died of a stroke when Smitrovich was a senior. He vowed then that he would live up to his father's dream of attaining a college education. Having supported himself through school working as everything from a bouncer and a cab driver to a lab technician, it was in college that he found his love for acting. The actor resides in Redding, Conn. with his wife of four years and their 2-year-old son, Alexander John "AJ."

LuPone plays his loving mother. She describes Burke's ambition as "hungry...an inspiration," and obviously moving, since she cried when, during the filming of the pilot, Burke read "The Raven." Acting has been her life since her first appearance on the stage at her elementary school. In fact she and husband, Matt Johnson, were married on the stage of New York's Vivian Beaumont Theater at Lincoln Center while LuPone as performing in "Anything Goes."

The Thacher's love for their family is demonstrated in another way. They welcomed back an adult daughter into the household. Paige (Monique Lanier), Drew's daughter from his first marriage, has moved

back home. The character's return thrills Corky, but the others have reservations.

Kellie Martin plays Corky's younger sister Rebecca "Becca," a high school student who at first had reservations about her brother being in the same class, but has since come to support him in whatever he does. Martin's real-life school record speaks for itself. An eighth grade honor student at the school she attends in Newbury Park, Calif., she is also an avid student of tap dancing, jazz and ballet.

A: The movie you seek (I think) is *Final Jeopardy*, which starred Richard Thomas and Mary Crosby, as his wife. It was an NBC World Premiere Movie and first aired on the network in December of '85. It is now in syndication and airs on various channels (I think).

Q: Could you please give me some history on Marion Lorne, the door knob collecting Aunt Clara on *Bewitched*? Also, Brian Mitchell "Jackpot" on *Trapper John*? —John Clare, Mount Pleasant, Mich.

A: Marion Lorne was born in Wilkes Barre, Penn., in 1886. She acquired much of her stage experience in England, extending back to the early years of the century. Before appearing in *Bewitched*, Lorne played Mrs. Gurney on *Mr. Peepers*, a popular TV comedy series in the early '50s; her next series was *Sally*, another comedy airing from 1957-58; she became a

regular on the *Garry Moore Show*, from 1958-62. She won an Emmy Award as Best Supporting Actress in a comedy in 1968 for her role on *Bewitched*. Viewers knew her as a delightfully dithery old lady. She was still performing in 1968, when she died in her eighties. She said toward the end of her years, "show business is still the most exciting thing I know." Brian Mitchell was born in Seattle, Wash., the youngest of four children. His father, an electronics engineer for the Navy, kept the family moving. Brian

spent his childhood in Guam and the Philippines. When he was 14, his family moved to San Diego where Brian developed his skills as an actor. He appeared in school plays and joined the San Diego Conservatory of Performing arts. He arrived in Los Angeles in 1977 where he promptly landed the role of John Dolan in *Roots: The Next Generation*, followed by his critically acclaimed performance in an episode of *The White Shadow*. Although, he loves acting, his first love is music. He is continuing to refine his skills and talents in the arts of orchestration, arrangement, composition and picture scoring privately and at UCLA.
