## Counts should be done quicker

Township election workers were forced to count more than 3,000 ballots by hand the evening of the May 1 Haller library proposal.

That painfully slow task — due to ballot-counting equipment failures — kept workers at township hall well past midnight.

Hoping to avoid a repeat of past difficulties, the township tomorrow will use a leased tabulation system designed to streamline the vote-counting process.

The township is anticipating a light voter turnout for the primary, meaning results of the treasurer race and the fire millage request may be known early.

"If voter turnout is low, the number of ballots we need to count will be low," said township Deputy Clerk Eunice Switzer. "If everything goes right, we could be done by 9 p.m."

Switzer said two representatives of Doubleday & Doubleday will be on hand to monitor the operation of the leased equipment. Township officials hope their presence will signal an end of the mechanical woes that have plagued past elections.

Elections workers will run a vote-tabulation test at 6:30 p.m. tomorrow and can begin to count absentee ballots at 7:30, as long as results are not made public until after the polls close at 8 p.m., Switzer said.

The new system will tabulate votes and produce copies of results for posting in township hall, she said.

## Ward gets plan okay for church

Their prayers have been answered.

Supporters of a Ward Church plan to build a sprawling — and controversial — house of worship on Six Mile and Haggerty rejoiced last week when the township planning commission approved the church's revised final site plan.

The commission's 6-3 conditional vote came after Ward complied with the township's height ordinance by re-designing its roof structure.

Gone is a 107-foot sanctuary that became the symbol of a court battle between the church, township and neighboring residents.

In its place is a spire — an open-air structure topped by a cross — that stands nearly a hundred feet at its zenith, but is exempt from the height ordinance.

Also gone is the threat of continued litigation against the township by residents opposed to the previous church plan.

The commission's vote opens the door for the Livonia-based Presbyterian church to proceed with engineering and traffic control plans and environmental studies in anticipation of actual site development.

"We're very pleased, very excited," said Ward Communications Director Kelley Sharkey. "If everything goes smoothly, groundbreaking could be done in a year."

Sharkey said the church could be

ready for occupancy "by 1993-94."

The township board must approve the site plan, which may appear on its September meeting agenda.

Exemption of the spire portion of the church brought the ridge height of the structure to 45' 8" from 65 feet and negated the need for a height variance.

The township height ordinance is 48 feet. Township residents challenged a Sept. 1989 zoning board of appeals (ZBA) decision to allow a 20-foot variance and a Wayne County Circuit Court judge in April remanded the case back to the ZBA for further review.

The church then decided not to go back to the ZBA and altered its site plan to conform with the site plan, said Ward attorney Harold Larsen.

"We have abandoned the height issue, which allows us to move forward," he said.

The building height was the primary concern to church opponents.

"We're very satisfied they chose to build within the ordinance," said Sue Hildebrand, one of six plaintiffs in the suit against the township and ZBA. "We're going to keep an eye on what they are doing (but) all we asked was that they build within the guidelines of the ordinance."

Commission Chairperson Charles DeLand instructed Planning and Zoning Administrator Carol Maise to monitor revisions to the plan Ward submitted.

## Several races up in primary

Northville voters will have a lot of choices to make in tomorrow's primary elections, despite several uncontested primary candidates.

Registered voters can choose to vote in either the Republican or Democratic primary, but not both. That restriction does not hold for the Nov. 6 general election.

Though Patrick McDonald is unopposed as the Democratic competitor to Robert Geake's long-held 6th District State Senate seat, Republican Gerald Law faces Kathleen Keen-McCarthy in the primary for his 36th District State Representative seat. The winner of that race will face Dennis Shrewsbury in November.

Six candidates are running for the new probate

court judgeship created in April, to hear mental competency hearings at Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital and cases involving western Wayne juveniles.

Carolyn Blanchard of Northville, Peter Bec of Plymouth, Sean Patrick Kavanagh of Livonia, William Leo Cahalan of Grosse Ile and Patricia Campbell and Robert Costello of Detroit are all vying for the eight-year judicial seat.

The two top vote-getters in the Tuesday, Aug. 7, primary will meet in the general election for the position.

Voters may only cast a ballot for one candidate Tuesday.

Elmer White is the sole Democratic contender for Republican Carl Pursell's current U.S. representative seat.

Wayne county voters will also decide on a prop-

osal to renew a 10-year one-mill tax to fund existing county services. The services include arrest, detention and criminal prosecution programs, juvenile court services, public health, parks and recreation, job training, senior citizen services, and medical programs.

Meanwhile, Oakland County voters in Northville City's Precinct No. 2 will help decide which Republican — Ben Marks, Terry Sever, Alfred W. Smith Jr. of Northville or Denise Richman Alexander — will run against Democrat Jack Faxon for his 15th District State Senate seat.

Primary voters in Oakland will also choose between Republicans Michael Teagan and Kay Schmid to run against Jeff Potter in November for the 24th District County Commissioner seat being vacated by John Calandro.

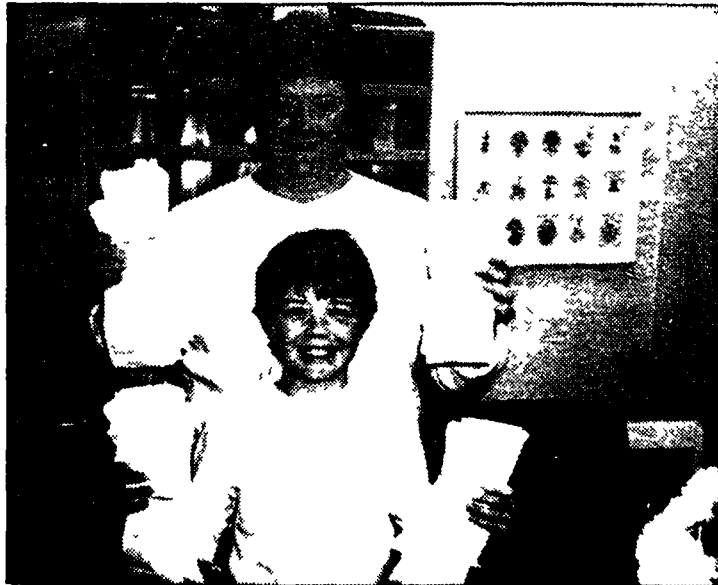
Costume Ball Tickets: The social event of the season is fast ap-

## Quality teachers can be from any college

My daughter wants to go into teaching and is looking for the best college to attend for a teaching degree. From your experience, where did the best teachers come from in the districts where you were an administrator?



Let me pose this question. Think of the 10 finest elementary, secondary or college teachers you had. What college or university did they attend? Can't answer it, can you?

For me to tell you which college has the best teacher education program is impossible.

A major research study of every education department, and its professors and their performance would be necessary to draw any conclusions. Then, those education departments rated average or below by the study would reject the findings.

However, all things being equal, the following criteria is what I would use in determining the best experience for getting a teaching degree.

I would look for those teacher education departments whose major focus is teaching, followed by professional journal writing and then seeking research grants from the federal government.

Look for departments where the professors make themselves available to meet and counsel their students on a one-to-one basis. Also look for one where the professor hasn't abdicated all his or her student contact hours to a teaching assistant.

To answer your question, the best teachers sort of evolve once they are in the field, in the classroom. They learn from peers, the quality and exemplary teacher role models in their own building and from dynamic staff development experiences.

They don't come from any certain college. They come with a desire and commitment to be the best. They are teachers who are constantly self-evaluating their own performance. They improve every day.

They are more concerned with their performance than their administration is — they are those with that certain, special gift. Don't kid yourself, students know them and parents know them.

## Board sets bond issue date

A Sept. 25 bond election — designed to provide for a growing student population — was approved Thursday by the Novi Board of Education.

The bonding proposition will ask voters if the Novi Community School District should borrow \$5.4 million to connect Novi Middle and Novi Meadows schools and to add to Novi Woods Elementary School.

The \$5.4-million project cost includes a \$3.1-million instructional/technology center linking the two buildings, a preschool addition, middle school renovations and a site development allowance.

Also included is a 10-percent building and site contingency, furniture and equipment, professional fees and miscellaneous expenses — as well as an accrued interest allowance.

Novi Superintendent Robert Piwko said the district may have to levy an additional quarter-mill to pay for the principal and interest, equaling approximately \$25 per household a year. Or, he said the district may not have to levy any additional millage to pay for the project.

For the 1990-91 school year, the district currently is planning to levy 3.10 mills toward the debt fund.

The district may not have to increase the number of debt mills because the district's state equalized valuation — by which the millage rate is multiplied — has continued to rise, Piwko said. When a millage rate is applied to rising property values, revenues increase.

Voter approval in September would allow construction to start in the spring and the additions to be open for the start of the 1991-92 school year, Piwko said.

The proposed instructional/technology link between Novi Meadows and the middle school was one of the alternatives recommended by the district Facilities Committee to address the projected enrollment increases at the fifth-, sixth-, seventh- and eighth-grade levels.

Board members approved the "techlink" concept as shown at the Thursday board meeting in a drawing by the district's architects, TMP of Bloomfield Hills.

Piwko said the project is continually evolving and TMP will adapt the plans to the district's needs

as the board continues to incorporate input on different aspects of the project.

The project proposal also includes the addition of four classrooms at Novi Woods to house the district's growing Novi Community Education preschool program.

The construction of the techlink will eliminate the need for portable classrooms for the grade 5-8 levels, but will displace the preschool program which also is located there.

Rita Traynor, assistant superintendent of instruction, said the 7-year-old program previously was moved to whatever facility had room.

More than 160 pupils have enrolled in preschool for the 1990-91 school year, she said, and the program continues to "grow in leaps and bounds."

The board members concurred that it would be better for the 3- and 4-year-olds to be located in an elementary school than somewhere in the techlink.

Piwko said that the proposal is in line with the concept of an education "campus."

"It's starting to fall into place," the superintendent said, "from 3-year-olds to eighth graders all in one setting."

## Residents air gripes over calendar

Residents requested better communication from Novi Community School District officials Thursday.

The timing and manner in which the district informed residents that school will start a week earlier this year prompted that request during the audience participation portion of the Board of Education's regular meeting.

In addition to the earlier starting date — Aug. 28 — the schedule of the 1990-91 school year features a longer winter recess — from Dec. 22 through Jan. 6.

Novi Superintendent Robert Piwko said the revised calendar brings the Novi district in line with the Oakland County schedule and other programs in which Novi students are enrolled.

The calendars for the next three school years were spelled out in the contracts negotiated by the district and Novi Education Association. The agreements were formalized on the last day of the 1989-90 school year, June 21.

When the board members tentatively ratified the new contracts at their June 14 meeting, they discussed methods by which to inform district residents about the calendar changes.

Piwko said Monday the latest issue of the district newsletter, "Focus," includes the revised calendar and has been mailed to each district home. Rita Traynor, assistant superintendent for instruction, said the newsletters were mailed later than expected due to problems with the printer's press.

However, parents Judy Dostal and Diana Gowing, who said they represented a group of their neighbors, told the board that news of changes in the school calendar reached dis-

trict residents too late or not at all.

"The lack of communication was a little bit unprofessional as far as we're concerned," Dostal said. "I'm very unhappy with this school district right now for the first time in the 15 years I've lived here."

Dostal said moving the first day of school to before Labor Day interfered with long-standing family vacation plans. Also, she said although she agrees with the community's emphasis on education, she thinks children should be able to play during the summer.

"I know many parents are unhappy with the extended break at Christmas time," she added. "I would

like to see the calendar left the way it was."

Gowing said that she does not mind the changes, but rather how parents found out about them.

"The teachers knew the day after school let out; that's what upset us," she said. "The issue is the lack of communication."

Piwko apologized for any inconvenience.

"I can appreciate what you are saying in terms of the communication aspect," Piwko said. "In retrospect, there are things that could have been done, perhaps including the information in the report cards."

The superintendent also said that he has heard positive comments about the calendar changes from parents.

Board President Robert Schram said the calendar always has been a negotiating tool.

"The district got things too," he said. He said he has never heard of a rattled contract in which everyone was happy about everything.

# WEDNESDAY UPDATE

## Four battle for appellate seat

Four candidates are vying for a single open seat in the 2nd District of the Michigan Court of Appeals. The top two vote getters in the Aug. 7 primary will slug it out for the six-year term in the November general election.

The following is a brief synopsis of each candidate's background, judicial orientation and answers to pertinent questions facing the court of appeals.

### E. THOMAS FITZGERALD

The Owosso lawyer is a three-time loser for a Court of Appeals post, falling short in 1988, 1978 and 1976. In 1978 and 1976, however, he lost by only 1 percent of the vote.

He also made a bid for a Michigan Supreme Court post in 1986, finishing sixth out of 24 candidates.

Fitzgerald, who specializes in criminal law, tries cases at all levels of the state court system, including the Court of Appeals. He has also tried several cases in the federal court system.

He is the senior partner in the Owosso law firm of Fitzgerald and Dumon.

**What special qualifications do you bring to the bench?**

"I have 24 years of extensive trial experiences; compassion, intelligence, work ethic and perseverance."

**What is your view on the role of the judiciary in our society?**

"One of respect and one that the people in our society should look up to for leadership and guidance, so that this nation can remain a land of the free and the home of the brave."

**What is the most pressing question facing the court of appeals? What solutions do you propose?**

"I think there are two main problems. First, I think the court of appeals is terribly overcrowded. About 40 percent of the cases are appeals of right, which is when someone has pleaded guilty and wishes to withdraw that plea as a matter of right. I would propose to eliminate some of these cases."

Another problem Fitzgerald cited was conflicting decisions rendered by different panels of the Court of Appeals. "I propose that panels with controlling issues should sit *en banc* to decide issues, avoiding a burden to the Supreme Court."

**Other comments:**

"I will admit that I might lose something by not being a circuit or district court judge first. However, one of my close friends has always been the incumbent or was running in those races so I never took them on. But I don't think a previous judgeship is necessary for this position."

"I think I have a good shot this time. I have been on the ballot so many times that people think that I am the incumbent."

### LINDA S. HALLMARK

As an Oakland County Circuit Court referee, Hallmark has extensive experience in deciding divorce and custody matters. During her 10 years in the quasi-judicial role, she has conducted numerous evidentiary and show-cause hearings, taken testimony, and issued written opinions.

Hallmark, 38, received her law degree from Wayne State University in 1977. While in school, she worked as a clerk for the Michigan Attorney General's appeals division.

After graduation she was an associate in the firm of May and May, where she specialized in probate and criminal matters. During this time, she appeared in court three or four times a week.

**What special qualifications do you bring to the bench?**

"I am fortunate in having practiced in a number of legal areas, including probate, criminal and general civil practice. For the past 10 years, I've been hearing cases in the domestic relations area. Many of these have involved the most difficult and emotional issues facing the court today. They have included child custody, physical and sexual abuse, and visitation issues."

"In the course of these cases, I've developed a great deal of sensitivity toward the impact of the court on human lives. I understand how important it is to treat all persons coming before the court with courtesy and understanding. It is also important to prevent undue delays which result in cost and frustration to both attorneys and litigants."

**What is your view on the role of the judiciary in our society?**

"The judiciary is an essential element in our system of checks and balances. The courts exist to enforce existing laws rather than create new laws. Judges also have a unique opportunity to become leaders in their communities."

**What is the most pressing question facing the court of appeals? What solutions do you propose?**

"The most serious and urgent problem is the rapidly increasing volume of cases the court is required to review and decide..."

"First, more judges can be added, either by creating new seats or by use of visiting judges... I support the conclusion that some new judgeships are required in the near future."

"A second and better approach for the long term is to reduce the number of new cases at the trial court level which ultimately result in an adversarial trial from which one party feels compelled to appeal. This reduction should not be accomplished by restricting access to the court or by limiting the right to appeal. But judges at all levels should understand and encourage the use of alternative dispute resolution in civil cases."

**Other comments:**

"I have been interested in running for a judgeship for a long time. I feel that I am most comfortable with the Court of Appeals because of the amount of research and writing involved—I have a lot of experience in this area."

### THOMAS EDWARD KENNEDY

In his 14 years as a 37th District Court Judge, Kennedy has had only one decision overturned by the Michigan Court of Appeals.

During this time his courtroom has remained open to the media with the exception of one criminal sexual conduct case involving a 6-year-old. Prior to becoming a judge in 1976, Kennedy was an attorney for General Motors Corp. specializing in allegations of design defect. He also had a personal practice from 1972-76, during which he tried criminal and civil cases.

He has appealed two criminal cases in the Michigan Court of Appeals and has appeared before the Michigan Supreme Court on behalf of the 37th District Court in the case of City of Center Line vs. 37th District Court Judges.

**What special qualifications do you bring to the bench?**

"Since taking office Jan. 1, 1977, it is estimated that I have conducted each year, an average of 80

preliminary examinations, 10 criminal jury trials, 200 criminal bench trials, 15 civil jury trials, 100 civil bench trials and hundreds of civil infraction, landlord-tenant, small claims and other miscellaneous matters."

"I have served as a circuit judge, by assignment in the Wayne and Monroe County Circuit courts, handling domestic relations and criminal matters. In total, I have conducted over 4,500 criminal and civil trials and preliminary examinations."

**What is your view on the role of the judiciary in our society?**

"It is the responsibility of the judiciary to provide a forum for dispute resolution which is, and is perceived by the public to be fair and impartial. The judiciary should not attempt to legislate but should apply constitutional and statutory law in a manner consistent with legislative intent."

**What is the most pressing question facing the court of appeals? What solutions do you propose?**

"The challenge to all courts in the 1980s, and now into the 1990s, is the substantial increase in caseload. I have taken personal control over case scheduling, as well as requests for adjournments to ensure that cases are resolved without undue delay. In my court the average civil case is concluded within six months and the average criminal case within 90 days. The same attention to the scheduling can be expected to improve caseload in the Court of Appeals."

**Other comments:** "At this point in time, with my 14 years in the district court, I feel I have the ability and writing skills to be a Court of Appeals judge."

### MICHAEL D. SCHWARTZ

The Macomb County Circuit Court Judge, who was appointed to the bench by Gov. James Blanchard in 1986, has 26 years of legal experience to his credit.

Schwartz, who describes himself as a workaholic, can be found in his chambers past 7:30 p.m. most nights and advocates that judges work quicker and harder to combat docket overcrowding.

He has also been a visiting judge on the Court of Appeals.

**What special qualifications do you bring to the bench?**

"I have been an attorney for 26 years; I have been a circuit judge for four years; I have been a visiting judge in the Court of Appeals."

**How do you view the role of the judiciary in our society?**

"The judiciary plays an extremely important role in our society. Its decisions affect many people's lives, careers, families and other aspects of the individual. The judge's rulings must be within the law, and yet common sense plays a significant role in their decisions."

**What is the most pressing question facing the court of appeals? What solutions do you propose?**

"As a sitting circuit judge, I find that there is a lack of experience on the part of the Court of Appeals judges. It is my feeling that Court of Appeal judges should have at least several years of experience on the circuit or district bench. I would make it mandatory that, prior to being elevated to the Court of Appeals, those persons seeking that office should have experience in either the circuit courts or the district courts."

# Hospital's court seat up for grabs

## Blanchard is local candidate

A local lawyer wants to become Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital's first probate court judge.

Carolyn Blanchard, 38, of Northville Township is one of six candidates running for the new judgeship created in April for the hospital. The judge will hear mental competency hearings at the hospital, a move expected to benefit patients and taxpayers alike.

Right now, patients and hospital support staff have to be driven into Detroit for such hearings, a costly and time-consuming process.

An attorney for nine years and in private practice for six, Blanchard works out of an office in downtown Detroit. "I do a lot of work out of Juvenile Court and Records Court, and appeals out of both courts," she said. "I've also done the mental docket, developmentally disabled, guardianships, some wills and estates and other matters in Probate Court."

She said the new position dovetails well with her experience and career plans. "Running for judge was in my long-term plan and then this new judgeship was announced, so there's no incumbents to run against," she noted. "It's in the area of my expertise and I believe I'm qualified for the job."

Blanchard's first career was in public health. While working with the Visiting Nurses Association, she traveled throughout the county visiting families in their homes, and teaching people about nutrition. "I've been in all the (housing) projects in Wayne County, I bet, and been in a lot of private homes. So I feel I have a

good understanding of the people of Wayne County, and also of the law. I feel I've been a provider on both sides of the fence here."

Blanchard believes her background and personality will give her a good judicial temperament. "I think I'd work hard and put in a full day and listen to what people have as needs," she said.

Probate court judges typically deal with the certification of wills, administration of estates and guardianship of minors and the mentally incompetent.

"Probate work is code — everything is done under the probate code and its statutory, and it's sort of cut-and-dried law as opposed to civil practice," she said.

Blanchard cited at least two reasons why probate law appeals to her. "I frankly don't find it as depressing as doing continual criminal matters, and civil matters are big-business issues and that's not necessarily where my heart is," she said.

Blanchard has been rated as "qualified" for the position by the De-

troit Bar Association and Civic Searchlight, and been endorsed by Detroit City Council President Maryann Mahaffey and several Democratic organizations.

She is running against five other candidates for the newly formed position: Peter Bec of Plymouth, Sean Patrick Kavanaugh of Livonia, William Leo Cahalan Jr. of Grosse Ile, Patricia Campbell and Robert Costello, both of Detroit. The judge will be elected during the Aug. 7 primary.

When he announced the new judgeship in April, Chief Judge Freddie Burton Jr. of the Wayne County Probate Court noted that an average of 25 Northville cases were heard in Detroit each day.

He called the new plan "more viable, diversified, and . . . an opportunity for patients to receive treatment and justice at the same time."

The judge will also hear cases involving western Wayne juveniles. The move has been discussed for five years, but has fallen through in the past over the source of funding,

## 6 are in the running for new post

Six candidates — including three from western Wayne County — are on the ballot for a new Wayne County Probate Court seat.

The two top vote-getters in the Tuesday, Aug. 7, primary will meet in the general election for the eight-year judicial seat.

Voters may cast a ballot for one candidate only.

Candidates are Peter E. Bec, Carolyn Blanchard, William L. Cahalan Jr., Patricia B. Campbell, Robert K. Costello and Sean P. Kavanaugh.

Bec, of Plymouth, is an attorney with a Southgate-based law firm and is a former Southgate municipal judge and city attorney.

Blanchard, of Northville, is a Detroit-based attorney who has practiced before the probate court.

Cahalan, of Grosse Ile, is a Detroit-based attorney and former assistant Detroit Records Court law librarian.

Campbell, of Detroit, has been a referee in the probate court's juvenile division since 1981. She also has been a legal adviser to the probate court and juvenile division attorney.

Costello, of Detroit, is a 36th District Court magistrate. Before that, he was an attorney who practiced before the probate court.

Kavanaugh, both lives and has his practice in Livonia. He is a former 16th District Court magistrate.

# County officials plead for millage

Wayne County officials predict dire times if a 1-mill county operating tax isn't renewed by voters during the Tuesday, Aug. 7, primary.

Losing the millage will delay opening of the new county jail, close county parks, restrict county health care programs and force layoffs for more than 400 county employees predicted County Executive Edward McNamara.

While McNamara's prediction might be overly pessimistic there's no doubt the executive will be out campaigning for the millage — even to the point of forming a campaign committee.

"The millage is the most important thing in our lives right now," said Deputy County Executive Michael Duggan.

The committee, Citizens for a Better and Safer Wayne County, is raising money to promote the millage renewal.

The millage provides an estimated \$24 million. Losing it, McNamara said, would jeopardize the county's fiscal recovery.

"If we are to continue that success, it is critical that we pass the 1-mill tax renewal," McNamara said.

County Commissioner Susan Heintz, R-Northville Township, said she supported the renewal and expected her fellow commissioners to do likewise.

"I've said I wouldn't support new taxes, but this isn't really a new tax," Heintz said. "I think the board is pretty much together on supporting the millage."

The tax translates to \$1 for every \$1,000 of a home's equalized value. It would be \$50 a year for a person living in a home valued at \$100,000. (For tax purposes home value is cut in half before being

multiplied against the millage rate.)

McNamara, Chief Wayne County Circuit Judge Richard Kaufman and County Prosecutor John O'Hair are expected to make appearances on behalf of the millage.

In stressing its necessity, McNamara is expected to highlight cost-saving measures already undertaken by the county, including a restructuring of its expensive indigent health care system.

The new Hamtramck jail could be a selling point for tax-weary suburbanites, Heintz said. "If people know their hard-earned dollars are going to something worthwhile, then I believe they'll support it," she said.

The millage renewal will appear on the same primary ballot as county primaries.

McNamara is unopposed in the executive's primary, as is Heintz in her Livonia/Northville/Plymouth commission district.

Also in Oakland County, Democrat Walter Briggs IV is running unopposed in the primary against Republican William Broomfield for his U.S. Representative seat, while Democrat Robert Taub faces no opposition in his bid to unseat the unopposed Willis Bullard Jr. for his 60th District State Representative seat.

Nonpartisan Oakland County races include the four-way battle for the Second District Court of Appeals seat being vacated by retiring Judge Walter Cynar. Linda Hallmark, Thomas Edward Kennedy, Michael

Schwartz and E. Thomas Fitzgerald are vying for that seat. Though voters may only choose one in the primary, the two top vote-getters will advance to the November elections.

Six candidates — Colleen O'Brien, James Sheehy, Deborah Tyner, Thomas Brennan, Dennis Drury and Rudy Nichols — are vying for two new Sixth District Circuit Court seats. Voters may cast votes for two in the primary, and the top four vote-getters will advance to the November elections.

Two Oakland County park millages will also be on the ballot. One calls for a one-quarter mill renewal for operation of county parks, and

the second is a one-half mill increase to fund development of Orion Oaks County Park in Orion Township.

The renewal will generate \$5 million in revenue. This rate was rolled back to .221 mills in 1990 because of the Headlee Tax Amendment.

A mill is equal to \$1 on every \$1000 of state equalized valuation (SEV), which is one-half a property's market value.

The additional one-year millage would generate \$13 million and cost \$22.50 for the average homeowner with a \$90,000 home.

Voters in both counties will find Democratic party members running

unopposed in congressional, state and county primaries, with Republicans battling it out for the chance to hold onto their seats or usurp Democratic incumbents.

Carl Levin is running for another six-year U.S. Senate term, while Republicans Clark Durant and representative Bill Schuette face off for the chance to oppose him in November.

James Blanchard is running unopposed in the primary for his third four-year term as governor while John Engler and relative unknown John Laue seek the Republican slot against him.

## Kicking off her own company

### Burrill eyes continued success

Karen Burrill deals in images. So, as a business person, picture this: you secure the former vice president of a well-known developing company to market your venture in a full-service capacity. That is, writing, design work, public relations and corporate planning and identities.

In early June, Burrill started her own company, Market Express, making those exact services available in what she sees as a different market for the '90s.

This different market, Burrill said, involves one in which companies are more cost- and image-conscious. And where companies will begin to realize the importance of product recognition.

"Market Express was formed to get companies to their marketplace fast — to make certain their clients recognize their name before the salesman shows up at the door," Burrill said. "Once that is accomplished, a good salesman will take care of the rest."

Today, marketing is nothing new to Burrill. But when she started as director of marketing services eight years ago with the R.A. DeMatia Company, she was still green.

"That's about when it started," Burrill said. "I enjoyed working in the development industry. That's where the bulk of my experience lies."

Burrill graduated with honors from Michigan State University with a double major in human ecology and advertising. While running a graphic arts department at Alexander Hamilton in Farmington Hills, she completed her master's degree in business management.

In 1983, Burrill moved over to DeMatia. After building a marketing program and redesigning the industrial developer's corporate identity and sales material, she was promoted to vice president of marketing in 1986.

Sales rocketed from \$6 million in 1982 to over \$70 million in 1989 at the Plymouth-based company, she said. Burrill attributed that to the company's strong stand in an expanding market.

Her most successful campaign was tagged "Boots." It portrayed a

pair of worn construction boots on the feet of an executive whose legs were in a business suit.

The ads also showed an expensive briefcase nearby, hinting that the company was always ready to move on any building project.

Later ads showed the boots accompanied by a man in formal wear, dancing with a lady in an evening gown.

Burrill also said she spearheaded the "Burning the Midnight Oil" ad campaign, which showed the DeMatia headquarters lit up and doing

business after dark.

With a string of successes behind her, it came time to pay closer attention to her own personal growth in business, she said.

"I wanted to keep a foothold in the industry, but branch out into other areas as well," Burrill said.

The solution was to form Market Express, which will enable her to diversify in some areas, and specialize in others — "increasing my portfolio" as Burrill calls it.

"Most companies make a big mistake in trying to please themselves

with their marketing efforts," Burrill said. "If they miss the mark, it doesn't matter what they produce or sell, they've simply missed the mark."

Burrill is now working with several companies to map out their marketing needs.

"I always begin with a plan, and build with firm criteria, whether it's a marketing thrust or my own company," she said. Currently, she operates out of her Northville home.

And she said, "It looks pretty promising. People are very aware of their image."

## Only in California: a commuter therapist

Los Angeles recently passed up Southfield Road between Ten Mile and Eleven Mile as having the worst traffic in the nation. An earlier record had been set by stretches of the Long Island Expressway, which lost its standing when traffic stopped completely three years ago and they paved it over to start afresh.

As Los Angeles traffic slows, Los Angeles drivers begin to fidget. Then they begin to notice cracks in expressway overpasses that didn't

seem to be there before the last 4.3 quake the night before.

Or they start to worry about the guy in the car in the next lane, who looks too much like Clint Eastwood run amok. Smog is bad, and even after voting to ban charcoal lighter fluid, it seems to be getting worse.

For some very good reasons, Californians worry a lot, and recently more than a few have had anxiety attacks that end with someone off the shoulder, hands still clenched to the

The phenomenon is called amonophobia, or fear of driving, and enough Californians have been affected so that there now is a new brand of psychotherapy that treats auto anxiety with specialized counseling on the freeways. (Honest, I'm not making this up. I read about it in an airline magazine.)

At least one prominent auto psychotherapist is a former driving in-

structor who discovered he had become a compulsive workaholic, on the road 16 hours a day. Anyplace else, a good mid-life crisis calls for moving to California, but in California, this kind of thing calls for a period of self-evaluation that includes lots of self-improvement courses in a therapy think-tank, after which, as a licensed therapist, the guy ends up back behind the wheel, using the

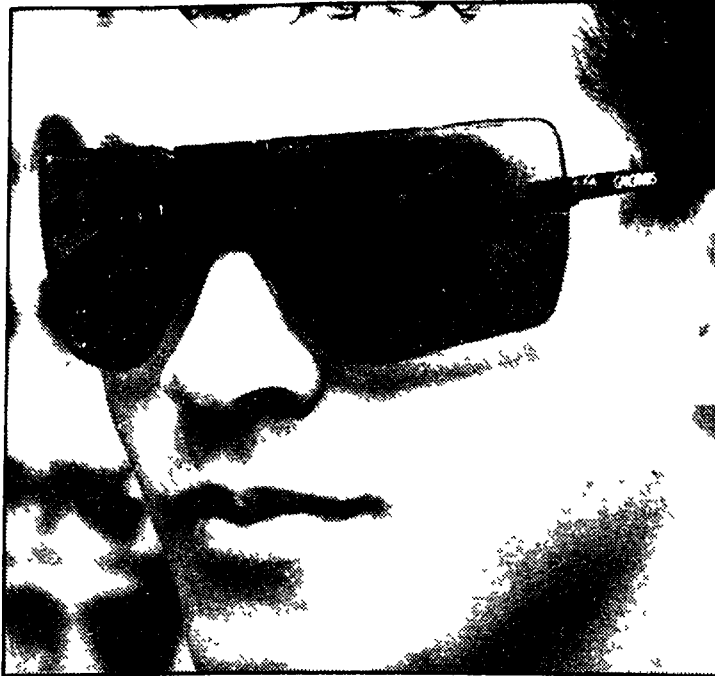

## Hot sunglasses are for form and function

What would Jack Nicholson be without his sunglasses?

Uncool? Exactly. Uncomfortable? Exactly. And unprotected? Unequivocally.

Despite the image of the tinted spectacles, sunglasses are more than an expensive fashion statement for the jet set's rich and famous and its wannabes.

Where the eye is concerned, the somewhat frivolous accessory is now considered a health and safety necessity.

Who says? The American Optometric Association, for starters.

Some of its pronouncements are old news: The sun's brightness and glare may cause discomfort when you're accustomed to lower light levels. Concrete, glass, chrome, asphalt and snow can create glare situations that aggravate that discomfort.

Some news is relatively new: Recent research indicates long-term exposure to the sun's ultraviolet radiation may cause cataracts or other sight-threatening conditions.

And cataract surgery reduces the natural protection against ultraviolet radiation, due to the removal of the eye's lens, exposing the retina to direct ultraviolet radiation.

Ophthalmologist Dr. Amy Eston of Metropolitan Eye Surgeons in West Bloomfield wouldn't see or be seen in the daylight hours without her polarized pair.

Why does she wear them?

"Other than the fact that I look cool?" she said. "It reduces glare. It doesn't have to be extremely sunny to get

glare and my polarized sunglasses decrease that glare. Some sunglasses only make it dark.

"And there is some thought that ultraviolet light precipitates cataract damage.

"I recommend wearing sunglasses for most people, although I recognize that some people just don't like wearing glasses. It's a good idea to use them, not just for comfort but for reducing exposure to ultraviolet rays."

Wearing sunglasses on a bright day can help you see better that night, said a spokesperson from the optical department of Henry Ford Medical Center-West Bloomfield.

Unprotected eyes become tired with the strain of squinting, and that tiredness carries over into the evening hours.

Now that to wear or not to wear is no longer the question, what type of sunglasses to wear is.

Don't go by price, said an August 1988 Consumer Reports article. Price has little relation to performance.

Most sunglasses of among 180 pairs tested did a commendable job of reducing ultraviolet rays, whether they cost \$2 or \$200.

While some people, cataract patients for example, may need extra protection from UV, most wearers can get adequate performance from inexpensive lenses, the consumers group said.

Following is a sunglasses primer for those in the market for eye protection.

Sunglasses basically come with four types of lenses: Standard tinted, available in glass or plastic, will meet the needs of most people.

They come in a variety of colors, but that has nothing to do with blocking ultraviolet light. A good choice is medium gray because of all the tints, it distorts color perception the least.

Polarized lenses are best at reducing reflected glare and are especially suited to driving (when glare bounces off pavement) and fishing (when it reflects off the water).

Light sensitive (photochromatic) lenses are made of glass. They lighten and darken according to the amount of light and some change color.

Unfortunately, the process is not instantaneous and can be affected by automobile windshields, which may block out the UV light that triggers the darkening process.

They are also temperature sensitive, darkening more in cold weather than hot.

Mirror lenses or flash lenses have a metallic coating over tinted lenses. They reflect unwanted light instead of absorbing it like tinted lenses. They're designed primarily for wear under intense glare from snow or water.

For performance it makes no difference if the lens is glass or plastic. Both must meet federal impact-resistance standards, but tests show that plastic is more impact-resistant than glass.

And if it makes a difference, plastic lenses are also lighter, though they scratch easier.

Watch out for lens distortion in less expensive sunglasses; they can be uncomfortable to wear, though they cause no eye damage.

It's easy enough to try before you buy. Hold the glasses at arm's length and look through them with one eye,

focusing at something rectangular, a door jamb or floor tile.

Move the glasses up and down and back and forth. If the lines are distorted or wavy, try another pair.

The darkness of the lens depends on the wearer's comfort zone, within reason. Glasses that screen out 75 to 90 percent of available light are adequate protection for most outside activities, the American Optometric Association said.

These would allow you to see your eyes while wearing them as you look into the mirror in a well-lit room. Sunglasses that filter out 85 percent are recommended for extended, especially bright conditions.

Generally speaking, the larger the sunglasses the better the protection. The larger lens shades eyes from sunlight slanting in.

Look for frames that follow the contour of the face and keep the lenses close to your eyes. Make sure the frames don't block side vision.

Be aware of the blue light controversy. Some scientists believe that prolonged exposure to blue light — the shorter waves of the visible light — may injure the retina. Others disagree.

They do agree, however, that blue blockers at the least increase the clarity of distant objects and enhance detail outside.

Can wearing sunglasses ever be dangerous?

"When you wear them at night," says ophthalmologist Eston. "Only because it can cause accidents."

And take them off indoors, too. Unless of course you want to be recognized, while appearing not to want to be recognized.

## Don't leave your lair without a pair

There are sunglasses and there are sunglasses.

Steven Franklin Optics in Boardwalk sells sunglasses. Designer sunglasses, ranging in price from the \$36 funky, iridescent Frogskins, to the \$480 sleek and chic, gold-filled frames by Alain Mikli of Paris.

"We're selling fashion and color," said the company's namesake, Steve Franklin, an optician with 15 years' experience and a Ferris State associate's degree in applied optics behind him.

"There's too much competition out there to sell the mundane. If they're searching for something mediocre, they can get that anywhere. If they want something different in quality and flair, we're here."

Sunglasses should be worn as more than a fashion statement, however, Franklin said.

"When you're driving east in the morning and west in the evening it's a necessity, not an alternative."

Light sensitivity is a major concern for many especially contact lens wearers and those who are taking certain medications.

"Antihistamines, beta blockers, cortisone derivatives can all make the eye more sensitive."

And concern about protection from ultraviolet rays is mounting, in light of the increased ultraviolet light penetrating the hole in the ozone layer, he said.

Fortunately, "Almost any reputable sunglass manufacturer provides that protection," the optician said.

The coating is independent of the color and darkness of the lens.

"It's pure and simply a coating that can even be put on clear lens and

many do just that for occupational reasons."

Franklin is impressed with a new product this year produced by Dow Corning in the Serengety sunglass collection.

Strata, as it has been named, filters out the troublesome blue light without removing all the blue in the landscape. It is polarized and somewhat photochromatic (light sensitive).

The bad news on Strata is the retail price, \$275-\$300, and the limited (two) styles.

"Unfortunately (the style) is generic," said Franklin. "They were not willing to stick their necks out. When people pay that much for sunglasses they'd like people to notice them."

And more bad news — it won't be available in prescription glasses for at least a year down the road.

The lens color of choice for summer?

"There's been a resurgence of green and gray-green," said Franklin. "Gray used to predominate because of all the colors available, it creates the least color change."

Green was the first sunglass color, Franklin said, but Bausch and Lomb introduced gray-green in the '40s. The gray-green goes well with the vintage small wire frames that are also returning, he said.

The large, straight Laura Bigottis (\$99) are fading in popularity, but the eccentricities of Alain Mikli — purple variegated (\$228), for instance — are gaining.

People are not as fearful buying sunglasses as they are with regular glasses. They get a little crazier. Everyone becomes a Jack Nicholson

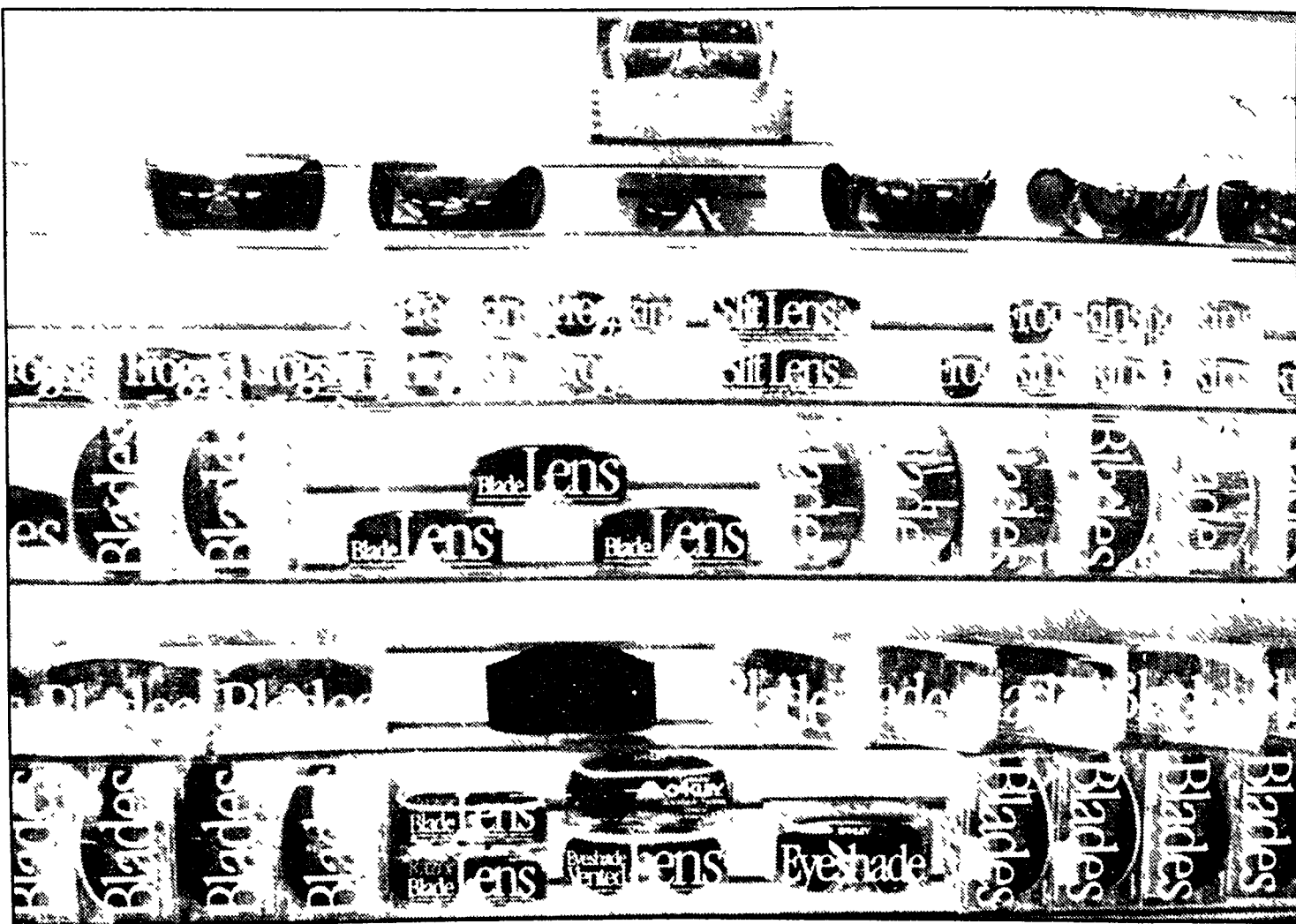

when they put on the shades."

Lower down the price ladder are Oakley's Blades and Razor Blades, popular with skiers, skateboarders and other money-bearing teens.

They feature "iridium" lenses, a sort of mirror finish in an iridescent wraparound frame.

Oakley also creates the mirror fin-

ish in \$51 Frogskins with conventionally shaped but iridescent colored frames.

In between are Gargoyles, another wraparound, some in mirror finishes, \$62-\$78.

Franklin's most popular line today is Oliver Peoples, creators of the vin-

tage look, which started in California and swept east. The glasses are seen in Detail, Elle, Vogue and other upscale fashion magazines.

Oliver Peoples features the downsized, upsweep or cat-eye styles reminiscent of the '50s. Oliver Peoples produces them in several colors, pat-

terns and textures for around \$142.

"It's always a flattering shape, but anything small and round is also in"

Other designer shades in the Franklin showroom are made by Porsche, Paloma Picasso, Optical Affairs, Cazal, Christian Dior, Ellen Tracy, Giorgio Armani and Guess?.

front seat as a sort of mobile counseling couch.

It's been a risky business, even after he realized he shouldn't start the sessions by asking his patients to lie down and relax. In fact, he is one of the few auto therapists to actually conduct sessions behind the wheel.

He talks his patients back on the road slowly, emphasizing that the trick is to stay mentally in the present, not worrying about the past or think too much about the fu-

ture. Remember, this is where our presidents come from. These follow-up sessions are real follow-ups, as he tags along in another car to be sure his patients keep on the move.

His technique is results-oriented, and in fact he claims roughly three-quarters of his patients eventually get over their phobia well enough to make it down to the 7-11. That's a far greater success rate than most therapies, although the incentive is great since in California, if

you can't drive, you starve to death.

All of this seems pretty funny until you realize that the state of California has more people driving from one place to another than there are standing still. It's like the truck that can safely carry 10,000 pounds carrying 20,000 pounds of live chickens. The driver has to keep stopping and banging on the side. If too many people in California go catatonic and stop on the expressways, the whole state will collapse, and then where would we be?

## Skipper's take on challenge

### Interlake races are for newcomers to boat racing

Brisk breezes and lapping waves. Serene solitude. A test of raw skill. These qualities and a plentiful supply of lakes comprise the basic elements in Michigan sailboat racing, a sport that lures aficionados who revel in adrenalin-rushing competition and success born of stark proficiency and a bit of luck.

But not just any sailboats. Small sailboats, 17-foot sloops. And not just any racing. Interlake racing, where expertise is the telling edge.

This, lovers and masters of the sport say, is the absolute best.

"In small boats, you really get the feel for sailing. You get a chance to do everything. You're the skipper," said Mike Golden, an Oakland County insurance agent who has been sailing 22 years.

Golden helps oversee a comprehensive sailing program offered by the Michigan Council of American Youth Hostels (AYH), likely the largest program of its kind in the country. AYH also hosts a summer schedule of interlake racing on Kent Lake in Kensington Metro Park.

"Interlake racing is a true test of skill between skippers. There are no advantages," Golden said, because each craft weighs the same and carries identical sails and equipment.

"Until you've raced a small boat, made it perform the best it can, you haven't really sailed," Carol Boyke, 27 of Rochester, said of interlake racing. Boyke, who learned to sail "from a book" as a youth, enrolled in the AYH basic sailing class because "I wanted to learn other than by the book."

Boyke got more than she bargained for. A year ago she married the sailing instructor, a 28-year-old seasoned sailor and automotive engineer named Bill Boyke.

"We'd have hot and heavy races and then go out to eat afterwards. One thing led to another," Carol Boyke said with a laugh. The couple's dream: "We hope our kids will be sailors and in 15 years we want to take the family and sail around the world."

Bob Clarke of Farmington Hills, a retired accountant, also learned to sail as a youth, during summer vacations at Clark Lake. After years of membership in the Pontiac Yacht Club where he raced larger boats, Clarke recently completed AYH instruction, enabling him to compete in interlake races.

"Racing is very exciting, very exhilarating and quite competitive. It adds a great deal of interest to sailing," said Clarke who, at 70 years of age, eagerly anticipates the new challenge of interlake racing. He enters his first race this summer.

An added bonus: daughter Margaret Panzer, Clarke's former crewmate at the Pontiac Yacht Club, is now enrolled in AYH instruction. The mother of three, Panzer may again crew for her father or even race against him.

"The solitude. The quiet. The wind blowing in your face. I always figured sailing would be perfect for me," said Jim Corcoran, a 39-year-old Southfield fireman from West Bloomfield

who got "hooked" on sailing three years ago during a week of sailing on Lake Huron sponsored annually by AYH.

Corcoran has since completed the AYH basic and advanced sailing courses, earning his skipper rating during basic training and honing racing skills in the advanced course. He is now enrolled in the captain course, becoming qualified on a 26-foot keelboat. AYH also offers voyager training on a 30-foot S-2 keelboat.

Dave Pitts, a Southfield insurance manager from Livonia, helps coordinate the AYH sailing education program. A Californian who learned to sail during high school 30 years ago, Pitts revived his interest in sailing after moving to the Great Lakes state

from Utah and Montana where sailing is virtually unknown.

Last year, some 100 novice sailors completed land and water AYH instruction offered in the spring and fall at Livonia's Schoolcraft College and three additional locations. The program also maintains 11 boats at Kent Lake and another two at Stony Creek Lake in Rochester.

"We pretty much have our hands full," Pitts said of the program, the largest offered nationally by AYH.

"It's purist racing," said Keith Helfrich in describing a typical, interlake race. Helfrich, of Birmingham, has been racing two years as a crew member, one of three required on each boat. He holds a skipper rating but is not yet certified as a racing skipper.

"Starting, it's critical, or you're out

from the beginning," he said. "Strategy, if you don't have strategy down, you're just reacting and at a disadvantage. The finishing leg. Very infrequently can you point to a spot and get directly there."

The race begins at an imaginary line, signaled by a referee in a motorboat 10 minutes before the start with a blast of a horn and a raised flag. Crews count down to the split second hoping timing is accurate enough for a good start.

The race normally includes a course run twice around three buoys. Each turn requires new strategy. Wind direction is essential in figuring the number of sails in order to maximize speed and when to tack.

"I'm always amazed how extremely

sensitive (the sloop is) to minor wind changes," Helfrich said. "A drop in wind or a slight change in direction changes everything."

Each race, he added, is a singularly intense experience.

"You're very involved, from beginning to end," he said.

Golden, a veteran racer who won last year's seasonal competition, said it took nine years of racing to fit everything into a winning combination. "Winning is rewarding because a lot of sweat and work go into a race," he said. "It requires confidence."

His biggest reward, however, is teaching others and watching them derive pleasure from the experience.

## Boldness marks Palmer's Legend

Whoa! That's a normal reaction to one's first look at The Legend golf course, nestled among the poplars, pines and evergreens at the Shanty Creek-Schuss Mountain resort just northwest of Traverse City in Bellaire, Mich.

You'll likely have the same reaction upon spotting the tree-lined fairways that follow. Many are viewed from some of the highest elevated tee areas in the state.

When Arnold Palmer was the toast of the PGA tour in the late '50s and early '60s, they called the legions of fans that followed him from hole to hole "Arnie's Army."

In contrast to the more solemn, business-like Jack Nicklaus, Palmer was known for his charging style — hitting a driver off the fairway to reach a par-5 green in two, or boldly aiming for the flagstick with a long iron, ignoring disaster posed by a gaping bunker or water hazard.

The Legend, designed by Palmer at Shanty Creek and opened for play in 1985, embodies that touch of boldness Palmer is known for.

For sheer natural beauty, this 18-hole layout is hard to beat. From those elevated tees, golfers are treated to sweeping vistas of woodlands and the rich blue of Lake Bellaire.

And this is just in spring. This course must be a real knockout in

autumn.

The second hole, a 303-yard par-4 from the blue tees, reverses the trend toward elevated tees. That's because a player must hit 200 yards over a scrubby, rocky chasm, to reach an elevated fairway.

That is possibly the most demanding shot on the course. But occasional golfers should know that The Legend is well-suited to their games.

Compared to The Bear, there are fewer sand traps surrounding greens. And few of Palmer's traps are lipped, like those designed by Nicklaus at The Bear. This means that on several holes one can roll a ball onto the green from the fairway, whereas The Bear often demands that the player drop fairway or pitch shots directly on the green.

To get to The Legend from the pro shop, players must take carts down a winding path and through a tunnel under Shanty Creek road. Upon entering daylight, one spots a sloping

hill to the left where "The Legend" logo is spelled out on a hillside.

Corny? Nah. It just heightens the expectation for what's to come.

The first hole is representative of the entire course. It has an elevated tee area — actually, four separate tee areas, black, blue, white and red. From the black tees, the course is 6,764 yards and rated at 73.5 (par is 72).

The blue and white tees are for golfers of more average ability. The course plays at 6,269 from the tougher blues, and 5,801 from the whites. The Legend is 4,953 from the red, or ladies' tees.

While the notion of plenty of trees may scare occasional golfers — 70's shooters too — know that fairways are generally wide, and flanked by several yards of not-too-deep rough, making The Legend playable for all.

Water doesn't come into play until the sixth hole, where a small pond sits in the right rough more than 200

yards from the blue tees on this 370-yard par-4.

Ah, but water comes more into play on No. 7. It's a par-5 dog-leg left, 474 yards from the blue tees. It's the No. 1 handicap hole, the toughest on the course.

A lake on the right encourages slicers to keep left on their tee shots. And the boulder-lined, swift running Shanty Creek gurgles about 20 yards from the seventh green. If your approach clears the creek, it can still end up in a sand trap that guards the front edge of the green.

The front nine is the most beautiful of The Legend's two nines. The earlier mentioned vista of woods and water come into play on the third tee and green, and the No. 4 green.

As a writer and photographer recently rhapsodized on the beauty of the course while leaving that green, they swung their cart through a wooded area to behold the most beautiful hole of all — No. 5, a 380-yard par-4, dog-leg left.

Here, the tee areas are carved into the upper reaches of a tall hill. It's possibly the highest elevated tee in Michigan.

They were moved to tee it up from the highest tee, the blacks, and both knocked drives about 230 yards out into the fairway below.

Never mind how they did the rest of the way.

## Tips help to make you heart smart

Did you know that . . .

- According to one study of 361,662 adults ages 35 to 57, the likelihood that a person will develop coronary heart disease is directly related to the amount of cholesterol he or she has in the bloodstream. Among men whose cholesterol levels were 180, four per thousand died during a six-year follow-up period. Approximately 12 per thousand died among men whose cholesterol levels were 260. In contrast, heart disease was virtually nonexistent in men whose cholesterol levels were below 150.

- Regular endurance exercise may improve the body's ability to break down life-threatening blood clots and avoid heart attacks. Scientists have discovered that regular exercise increases the activity of tissue plasminogen activator, a natural clot busting protein now being used in drug form to halt heart attacks in progress. The investigators found that TPA levels increased by an average of 29 percent in participants who completed a six-month aerobic exercise program.

- Increasing evidence suggests that daily low-intensity activities such as pleasure walking, gardening, yardwork and dancing may have considerable long-term health benefits in terms of lowering the risk of heart disease.

- There is now a simple paper-and-pencil test that will calculate a woman's risk of developing breast cancer. It uses a mathematical formula involving her age at menarche and at her first-born child, the number of immediate family members (mother and sisters) who have had breast cancer, and the number of times she has had a breast biopsy. For additional information about the test, call the National Cancer Institute at 1-800-4-CANCER.

- One clever inventor has developed a will-power aid to help you diet when hunger makes you weak — the Fridge Freak, available for about \$20 in specialty stores. According to the manufacturer, the Freak creates "a kind of negative reinforcement" to eating.

## Fat count more important than weight

Dear Myrna: In recent years, I have heard about the importance of knowing my percent body fat in addition, or even instead, of just body weight. I am interested in finding out what percent of my weight is fat. Where can I have this done and how much would it cost? Thank you.

It is great you understand body composition. I agree it is important to know. The very best and most accurate way to measure body fat is underwater weighing.

Most athletes consider this the 100-percent perfect method. Actually, there is no perfect measurement. Underwater weighing and skinfold caliper measurements each have potential inaccuracies, particularly if performed by marginally trained technicians.

Let's discuss each method.

- Despite popular belief, underwater weighing does not measure your body fat. It measures your body density (muscle). When measurements are put into a mathematical equation, the body density figures get translated into percentage fat. Some error can creep into this translation.

- Skinfold calipers are large pinchers that measure the thickness of the fat layer at specific

body sites. They are best used by people who have been well-trained in the technique. If measured hastily, pinches of fat an inch above or below the standard landmark, you will end up with a false answer. This happens many times with a large group being tested at one time such as at sports fairs, etc.

Individual fat patterns can also contribute to an inaccurate fat percentage. If you have inherited fat arms, for example, the rest of you might have a lot less fat. This arm measurement contributes to the final tabulation.

- Body impedance is a computerized system that sends a tiny electrical current through your body via electrodes attached to your wrist and ankles. The amount of water in your body affects the flow of current. This reading can be converted into percentage body fat, since only fat-free tissue contains water. If you are dehydrated, you will get an inaccurate reading. If you have just eaten a large meal or had a few drinks, you will also get an inaccurate reading as well as if the measuring device is placed in an improper position.

Generally speaking, I recommend you use body fat measurement as a measure in itself to reflect changes in your body as you shape up. I do firmly

believe that body composition is really where it is at. How much a person weighs is less important.

After a little research, I think I have found the most competent people in this field of testing body composition.

Beaumont Hospital has an outreach program headed by Dr. Charles Lucas, director of Nutritional and Preservative Medicine. His office is located in Birmingham and can be reached at 646-6500.

The clinic performs all three body compositions — underwater weighing, caliper (skinfold) and bio-impedance. Each patient must be tested two out of the three listed ways to ensure accuracy.

Marty Lillystone of Central Michigan University is the exercise physiologist at the clinic and states "people are becoming more aware of their body composition than scale weight."

Well, unfortunately, I don't think so. Not yet. # Races work together on 'In The Heat Of The Night'

## Carroll O'Connor not just a Southern Archie

When envisioning the series "In The Heat Of The Night", ace executive producer Fred Silverman and actor Carroll O'Connor could have gotten into some risky show business—race relations in a small Southern town.

Both recalled the motion picture of the same name, a five-time Academy Award winner starring Rod Steiger and Sidney Poitier. Both Silverman and O'Connor believed they could adapt a sensitive dramatic series from the film.

And they did. The critically acclaimed "In The Heat Of The Night", in its third season, returns to television this fall on NBC after finishing well near the top in 1989-90.

For 12 years Carroll O'Connor portrayed Archie Bunker, one of the most memorable characters in television history, on "All In The Family." For his role, he won four Emmy Awards as Best Actor, having been nominated eight times; he won a prestigious Peabody Award and two Golden Globes. Additionally, Archie's chair is now enshrined in the Smithsonian Institute.

But the actor has proven to the skeptics that he can handle the role of police chief Bill Gillespie on "In The Heat Of The Night" without becoming Archie Bunker with a Southern accent. In the show's first season, O'Connor added another Emmy to his collection for Outstanding Lead Actor in a Drama Series.

O'Connor co-stars with Howard Rollins (nominated for an Oscar for "Ragtime"). Rollins plays Virgil Tibbs. Tibbs, having distinguished himself with the Philadelphia police department, has returned to his hometown as the force's only black chief of detectives. Tibbs, a sophisticated cop, and O'Connor's character, who is something of a good-old-boy, are coupled together solving cases.

"It is a natural," says the show's award-winning screenwriter and playwright, James Lee Barrett, "a white chief of police for a small Mississippi town and a black Philadelphia detective always at odds with each other, but always working together, make an interesting dramatic team." When the two come to terms with one another, out of the conflict comes harmony.

Rollins downplays this, however: "I wasn't drawn to the part because of the race aspect," he says. "It was the chance to work with Carroll O'Connor."

Last season O'Connor and Rollins handled with finesse the touchy subject of acquaintance rape. Tibbs' wife, Althea, played by Anne-Marie Johnson, was raped by a co-worker. In another episode, special-guest star Susan Blakely was an incest victim who had murdered her father. A drunk driver who had killed three teenagers constituted the plot of yet another storyline. O'Connor and Rollins handle these dark topics with a delicacy you would never believe "Archie Bunker" and company

capable of.

There is an element of "All In The Family," in the show, however. O'Connor's son, Hugh O'Connor, who also acted in "Archie Bunker's Place," stars as police officer Jamison Jefferies. Other cast members of "In The Heat Of The Night" include Alan Autry, who plays a 10-year veteran on the force, Bubba Skinner. Lois Nettleton stars as Joann St. John, David Hart is Parker Williams, and Geoffrey Thorne plays Willson Sweet. "In The Heat Of The Night" airs Tuesday nights.

(Isabella Hoffmann), who has always seemed too pretty and too well-adjusted for the group, but we'll find out she's just as messed up as everybody else.

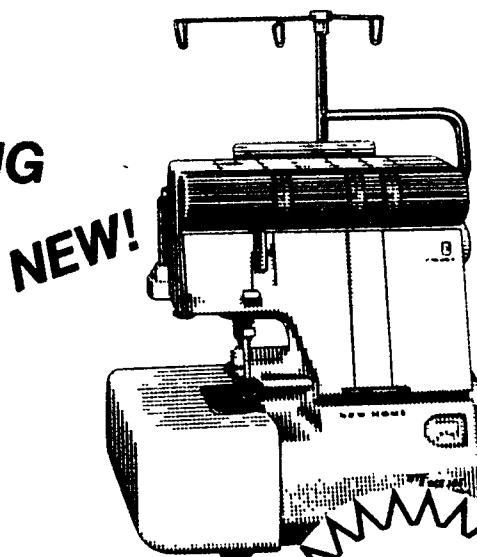
