## Committee scans police chief finalists tonight

A five-member search committee will interview three police chief candidates tonight and is expected to select one finalist for the township's top law-enforcement post. The committee will interview James Davis, Beverly

Hills (Mich.) director of public safety; Michael Swope, Inspector with the Michigan State Police Criminal Investigation Unit in Livonia; and Chip Snider, Plymouth Township Deputy Police Chief.

If the committee reaches accord, the finalist will be recommended to the township board at an Aug. 30 special

meeting, township Manager Richard Henningsen said Thursday.

Board acceptance of the nominee would fill a nine-month-old vacancy atop the police department, a vacancy created when former chief Kenneth Hardesty resigned amidst allegations of an improper gun sale.

Finalists will undergo 45-minute interviews tonight —

the latest round in a serpentine search process that began in May and wound its way through numerous written and verbal tests, interviews and job simulation exams.

Tonight's interviews will be prefaced by a conference call with Bartell & Bartell, the Pennsylvania consulting

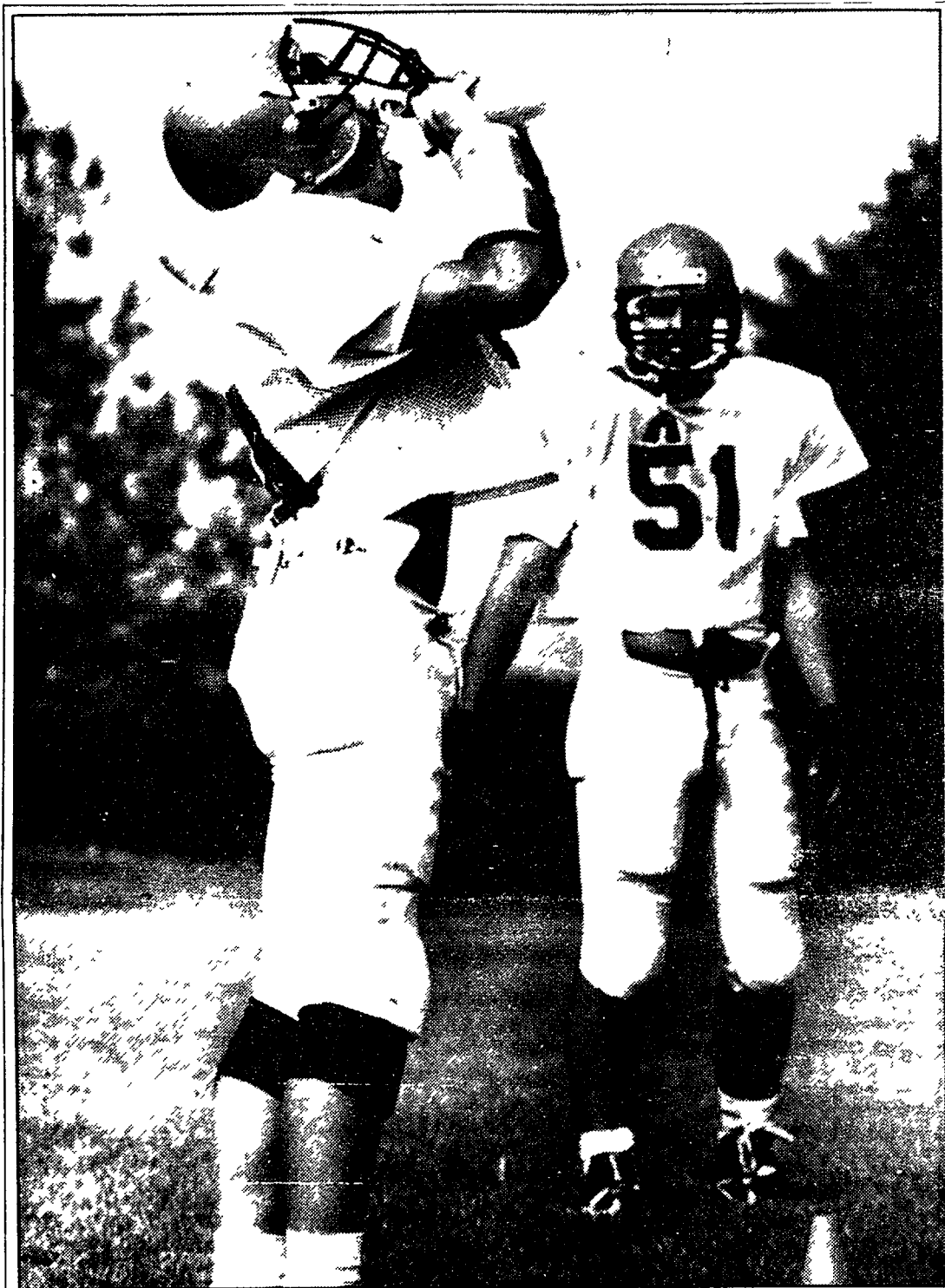

## Candidates underwent extensive test program

Three township police chief candidates recently traveled to Pennsylvania to take part in a detailed examination conducted by personnel consultants Bartell & Bartell.

Police chief finalists Michael Swope, Chip Snider and James Davis completed a lengthy written test and spent Aug. 1-2 in State College, Pa., facing a battery of simulated situation tests.

The simulated tests were designed to "analyze the traits" of each candidate, said township Manager Richard Henningsen.

"The test covered all types of situations the chief might find himself in," Henningsen said. "It covers man-

gerial skills, public relations skills, etc., to determine how he seems to handle diverse situations."

Test results included grading of the candidates by graphs and charts, and written commentaries and analysis, he said.

All three finalists did well in the Bartell testing, which looked at individualized elements such as perception, tolerance, vocabulary and site scanning accuracy, Henningsen said.

"In my opinion, no one was weeded out," he said. "They all are good candidates and all have high points. We're just looking for the traits that are best-suited for this position."

Henningsen would not say who his favored candidate was, or if any one finalist had moved to the forefront of

the search.

"We just have to pick one now who will aid this police department and make sure it runs correctly," he said.

The township spent \$1,700 per candidate for the two phases of the Bartell test. Additional expenses included air fare for one of the candidates and mileage expenses for the other two men.

The township also provided hotel accommodations and three meals for the finalists, Henningsen said.

Henningsen said the Bartell review was well worth the cost.

"This one is the most comprehensive test we've had," he said. "For professional testing of candidates, this is one of the best things we could do."

## MAGS lot reconfiguration may add 103 parking spots

The long-awaited reconfiguration of the parking lot south of the MAGS (Michigan Association of Gift Salesmen) Building and Main Centre could add 103 parking spaces to the lot.

But the redesign could also leave 19 fewer public parking spaces, depending on which of four options the city and Singh Development decide to pursue.

The council considered all four options at last Monday's meeting: running Cady Street through the middle of the lot to align with the relocated Cady east of Center, allowing Singh Development to install 74 carports on the lot, doing both, or doing neither.

The lot currently provides 283 surface spaces. Simply reconfiguring it would add 103 spaces, relocating Cady as well would add 62, building carports would add 97, and doing both would add 55.

But because the carport spaces would be reserved for Main Centre residents, the latter two options would

either leave 19 less public spaces than presently or add 23 spaces, depending on whether Cady Street was relocated or not.

Council members agreed to postpone relocating Cady Street through the middle of the lot in order to maximize the number of additional spaces.

"In terms of the traffic pattern we observe in the post office . . . I don't really see myself the value of the road going through in terms of the loss of parking spaces," said Manager Steven Walters. Walters noted that the present configuration has resulted in no obvious traffic problems, "no lines waiting to get in or out."

Walters pointed out that the road could be run across the middle of the lot later, because the city controls the property.

He added, "The local traffic flow still gets to go between Wing and Center, but it doesn't seem to be a general traffic pattern."

Council Member Paul Folino agreed. "If we're going to have some type of east / west route there, I think it should be on the south side of

the lot," he said.

Council Member Jerry Mittman recommended a drop-off area near the MAGS and Main Centre buildings, or a 30-minute parking area.

**Census shows growth:** Northville Township's population grew more than 20 percent during the 1980s, according to preliminary figures from the 1990 U.S. Census.

Friday's mail brought the new census figures, showing the township's population at 17,238, township Manager Richard Henningsen said. That's up from 14,276 in 1980, a growth of 20.7 percent. Housing units in the township numbered 6,481, Henningsen said.

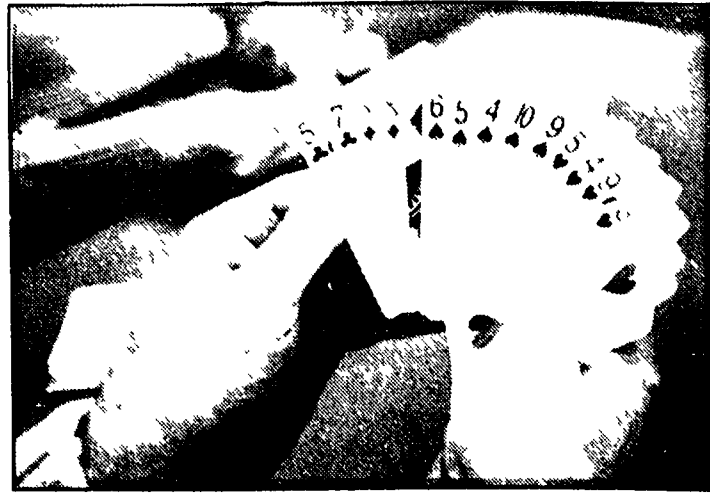
name will be picked at random from all entrants.

## Novi trio gets a glimpse of life in Soviet Union

A visit to the Soviet Union replaced preconceptions with cultural appreciation for three Novi youths.

Tammi Brandon, Kathleen Daly and Christopher Frelich toured Moscow, Kiev, Kharkov, Ulyanovsk, Leningrad, Kazan and Helsinki, Finland from June 29 to July 21.

The 1990 Novi High School graduates said they returned with a new attitude about Soviet culture and about what they have at home too.

The trip was arranged by the People to People High School Student Ambassador Program. The national program was founded in 1956 by President Dwight D. Eisenhower with the belief that "private citizens reaching out in friendship to the people of other nations could make a significant contribution to world peace."

The People to People program requires students to submit an application, letters of recommendation and a screening questionnaire. Maturity, well-rounded interests and the ability to adapt are as important to a student's selection as academic standing, according to People to People officials.

Fifteen students and two teachers from the metropolitan Detroit area traveled together, staying for four days in each city. The itinerary included visits to cultural events, monuments, commerce centers and meetings with representatives of the young Communist Party and International Club.

Qualifying as "student ambassadors," called for Brandon, Daly and Frelich to attend seven orientation sessions where they were instructed on topics such as how to pack, how to exchange currencies, why to stay away from the "black market," how to cope with the language barriers and some words to get by.

Brandon said the lessons often came in handy during the three

weeks and could be applied to future trips.

The three said they were grateful for the group leaders' suggestions to take toilet paper, sheets and snacks. There were some limits to the extent they wanted to substitute Soviet ways for their own, they laughingly agreed.

Before they left, the students were reminded that they were representing the United States' values and cultures. They also were briefed on what they might expect to find once they arrived in the Soviet Union.

The most striking difference the three students observed was in living conditions.

Their hygiene habits were different, Frelich pointed out. But the Novi youths said they were allowed to maintain their shower-a-day routine in the hotels they stayed at during their visit.

Temperatures during their stay remained at approximately 98 degrees, with little rain. Natives told the students that was the normal climate for that time of year.

None of the buildings were air-conditioned and refrigeration — and therefore ice — was a luxury, they discovered.

Frelich said none of the American students liked the portion of the entire they termed "mystery meat."

"The meals there were the same for three weeks — meat, potatoes and cabbage," Daly said.

Even the Moscow McDonald's was a disappointment, they said.

Another distinct difference the students noted was the Soviet mode of transportation.

"People there walk everywhere," Daly said. "(Now) I feel so guilty driving my car to the grocery store."

Brandon added, "We're so wasteful."

Daly said, "What we accept as every day is extravagance to them."

She said that all Soviet citizens appear to live in flats.

"We only saw four houses while we were there and they were shacks," she said.

A tour guide informed the group that most often four people live in a three-room flat.

"Not three bedrooms," Brandon said, "three rooms." She said there was no comparison with the lifestyle to which Novi residents are accustomed.

At the same time, the three students agreed, the environment was far from their preconceived notions. They said they saw areas designated for open discussion.

"They can really do anything they want," Brandon said.

Daly said, "I thought everything I would see would be . . . drab. That's why it was such a shock."

Some of the landscape was very beautiful, very hilly, she added.

Most of the Soviets they talked to were open and friendly, the students said.

Frelich said that people were willing to respond when asked about Mikhail Gorbachev — some liked him, some didn't.

Brandon added, "They said they were impressed with his foreign policy, but not his domestic programs."

"Some liked speaking English to us," she added. Brandon said they were in "total disbelief" when they exchanged information about lifestyles, living accommodations and families.

Daly added, "Only those with high political power gained such privilege." She said the housing was an example of how the government is designed to make everyone equal.

Brandon said their group was immediately identifiable as Americans

because they wore People to People red t-shirts, blue jeans and tennis shoes.

"Older generations would just look at us and walk away," Frelich said. "The younger people were really fun — trading items like pins, gum, pens, t-shirts."

Some store owners' preference for francs or U.S. dollars taught them about the value of "hard currency," they said. "Everyone wants American money."

Daly said she had a hard time spending a 50-ruble bill because of the low cost of many items. Approximately six rubles equal one U.S. dollar.

The students brought back posters, lacquered boxes, Pepsi bottles with Cyrillic letters, a flag, military

paraphernalia, a Ukrainian shirt, records, rubles and lots of photos.

Frelich, who plans to major in international business, said he would like to return to the Soviet Union to study.

He said he was a little disappointed that the trip turned out to be more of a tour than an educational experience. The group was allowed a lot of free time to walk around the city without any guidance, he said.

Daly, who will attend the University of Michigan-Dearborn this fall, also plans to continue her pursuit of Soviet culture.

"I'm going to take all the classes about Russia I can, literature, language, history. There's somewhere that I can use the knowledge I've gained," she said.

## History course comes to life

Marilyn Kaestner has been combining two of her favorites this summer — history and teaching.

The third-grade teacher at Amerman Elementary School has devoted hours to researching the lives of past Northville children in order to develop individual histories.

Once she gains enough information about a Northville inhabitant of yesteryear, she will assign his or her identity to one of her current pupils in an effort to let them gain a real sense of the era.

The boys and girls are encouraged to act in character, and to pursue additional information about their "siblings," their eventual profession, whether they married and other aspects of "their" lives.

The teacher said she tries to track the lives of children so that her pupils

can compare directly their own situations. From those comparisons the children will draw the lessons about their community, she believes.

"I think it's going to really excite them to learn about Northville," Kaestner said.

She said her ongoing project is one of several that Northville teachers are working on "to make the history of Northville come alive."

For example, other teachers are working on historical novelettes, based on the history of Northville.

"The goal is to gain information for all third-grade teachers to have access to," Kaestner said. "It's an idea bank to make (social studies) interesting."

She said when she has collected enough names to assign to the pupils, she ideally would like to transfer her notes to computer, then onto cardstock so that each teacher would have a set to use.

Kaestner's project began with a list of names of children who may have attended Northville schools. She said she started with familiar names, such as Parmenter, Benton, Yerkes, Simmons, Dunlap, Starkweather and Lapham, that have long-established ties to Northville.

Kaestner said her sources include the libraries, old Northville Record issues, and birth, death and school records.

From census records in the Burton Historical Section of the Detroit Public Library, Kaestner said she obtains little more than the names and ages of children who may have attended Northville schools in the 1870s.

She chose that era because that is when the Wash Oaks School in the Historical Mill Race Village was built. The third-grade curriculum includes a visit to the school when the children

## Ex-Record editor settles in up North

Jack Hoffman almost ended up in his own obituary column six years ago.

At 52, he had just suffered a massive heart attack and was running the suburban Detroit weekly newspapers — including The Northville Record and the Novi News — with a combined circulation of 59,159. His was a high-salaried, stress-packed, report-filled, bottom-line job with a media conglomerate.

Once solidly back on his feet, Hoffman told his surprised boss, "I quit."

Hoffman had convinced his wife Joan, an executive secretary for a Detroit Industrialist, that they should operate their own country weekly.

So in 1985 they bought the tiny Straitsland Resorter, located at the tip of northern Michigan in the summer vacation town of Indian River, population 4,000.

Joan and Jack now produce a 30- to 44-page weekly tabloid. Their equipment: two Apple computers, a laser printer, 35mm camera and darkroom and pasteup tables, all in two rooms attached to their spacious home overlooking the Little Sturgeon River.

"On May 9, 1985 we produced our first paper (using a CompuGraphic typesetter). It was just awful," Hoffman remembers. "We worked all night long. I realized the sun was coming up. 'It can't be,' I told myself. 'I'm supposed to be in Petoskey (where the Resorter was printed).'"

"We drove there, about 20 miles, and I handed them the flats. 'Hey, you're missing one,' the fellow told me. I had to drive all the way back to get it. We were three hours late."

Since that fumbling start, the Hoffmans have settled in as small-town publishers. Circulation has grown to a summer peak of 3,325. During Indian River's winters of 36-inch-deep snowfalls, when newsstand sales tumble, the press run drops to 2,650.

Gross business in 1990 will top \$270,000, Hoffman predicts.

From the moment the Hoffmans landed in Indian River, Joan, without a minute's experience in newspapering, became a full partner in the weekly operation. Jack magnanimously gave her the title of publisher. That means she takes care of the books, sets and paginates ads on her Mac, handles classified and circulation.

In a typical issue, the Hoffmans will have 50 to 60 stories, including several well-researched and deftly written features. Subscribers are also treated to a wide variety of Jack's photos, some extremely arty.

The editor usually writes a personal column, "His Turn." Sometimes Joan does "Her Turn." Editorials are dubbed "Our Turn" and reader letters, which often fill a page,

run under the heading, "Your Turn."

Mainly because of the quality and depth of product the Hoffmans create, advertising has been amazingly vigorous.

"The Resorter is the most effective advertising source we have, our best producer," says Indian River realtor Dick Kolb, whose firm regularly buys two pages in two colors. "We also run from time to time in the Ann Arbor News and the Detroit Free Press and Detroit News."

Hoffman, a 1956 journalism graduate of the University of Michigan, spent a year as a reporter with the Saginaw News. In 1957 he was hired as editor of The Northville Record by publisher Bill Sliger, a sage in the field of community journalism.

Hoffman's skills as a writer eventually were spotted by public relations brass at General Motors. In 1964 GM offered Hoffman a high-salaried PR post. Hoffman accepted, then quickly began to regret the move. "I hated the job, just hated it."

One morning two years later, as Joan and Jack sat at the breakfast table, he confessed, "Going to GM was a big mistake." Almost as if on cue, the phone rang. It was Sliger, asking Hoffman, "What would it take to get you to come back to Northville?"

"My old job," Hoffman replied. The next day he gave GM notice. Hoffman remembers the reaction of

his boss.

"He thought I was crazy. The first thing I did back at the Record was shoot pictures of the high school band marching through downtown Northville. I told myself, 'My God, this is so much more fun than working for General Motors.'"

Hoffman and Sliger were a matched set. They agreed that a weekly first must pack its pages with well-written local news. Circulation will climb, followed closely by advertising. With Hoffman back, Sliger began to buy other area weeklies. Hoffman assumed more responsibilities and the Sliger group prospered.

Then one day, Phil Power's Suburban Communication Corp. offered Sliger a bundle of cash for his group of weeklies and a corporate vice presidency. Sliger accepted. Hoffman agreed to stay as a key management player with the new owner.

In 1981 Suburban named Hoffman general manager of its nine-paper Sliger/Livingston Division. Pressures multiplied for Hoffman. He found he dreaded all the report writing and big-business politics.

His near-fatal 1984 heart attack in reality probably saved his life. Propelled into the entirely different lifestyle of the North woods, Hoffman soon returned to vigorous health.

At the Resorter, he is back to the basics he loves — reporting and writ-

ing, taking pictures and selling ads, pasting up pages, carting papers to 20 widely spaced newsstands.

For the most part, life is sweet. True, he works horrendous hours the first three and one-half days of the week, especially in summers, but, from Thursday afternoons until Mondays there are hours for casual work, occasional fishing and hunting, and carving his magnificent wood ducks.

What is this 58-year-old country editor's philosophy of the weekly newspaper business?

"I think the newspaper and its people should be actively involved in the community. The ivory-tower concept says newsmen ought not to get involved — this might affect their objectivity. I've always felt I had to be involved and, if I couldn't, then newspapering no longer would be fun."

"We sit and editorialize about what we ought to be doing. By not participating, it seems to me, you're defeating the whole purpose."

Then Hoffman ticks off his Indian River connections.

"I'm secretary of the chamber of commerce, director and past president of Kiwanis and secretary of the Walleye Association that stocks Burt Lake."

Hoffman adds that in his Northville Record years, "I served on the City Commission and charter revision committee. I was president of the historical society." Hoffman even wrote a history of Northville, *The First 100 Years*, which took most of his spare time for three years.

One of community journalism's most skilled wordsmiths, Hoffman writes or rewrites everything that appears in the Resorter. That means an average of 36 hours a week at his Apple screen and keyboard.

"After a story is written, I go back to the beginning and write the head so it will come out at the top of the laser printer, all on one sheet. I never liked to do it that way until I came up here. Later, I may rewrite 10 percent to fit layouts."

The two Macs and the printer cost \$12,000, replacing the CompuGraphic. Hoffman calls his laser "the best investment we ever made."

The Hoffmans' deal for Indian River came to \$240,000. This broke down to \$60,000 for the Resorter and \$180,000 for the two-story brick home with office and darkroom attached.

"I have no desire to go back. It's just too nice up here. We live in the woods on the river, wildlife around us all the time. The seasons are just gorgeous, particularly wintertime."

"Joan misses friends, city life and shopping, but the traffic drives me up a wall. I'll get downstate as far as Saginaw and find I'd like to turn around."

"We've got a lovely home and a great business. I'm not socking away a lot of money, but we're paying all our bills. I just love it."

## A day in the life of a small-town editor

While interviewing Indian River, Mich., editor Jack Hoffman, I asked to tag along on his regular Thursday morning press-day adventure.

Hoffman grinned. "Sure thing. I'll pick you up at 5 a.m."

And he did, in his Dodge Dakota pickup, with the back deck holding a sturdy cardboard box filled with keylined pages of that week's Straitsland Resorter.

It was pitch-black, misty and chilly as Hoffman sped onto Interstate 75, heading south for the 25-mile run to Gaylord's Central Printing Co. With my watch, I logged many of the morning's major happenings.

• 5:50 — Arrive at web printing plant (where 42 weekly publications are run, says Paul Gunderson, general manager). Hoffman turns over flats, plus seven ad photos for screenings. He waxes last-minute auction ad and puts in into place on page 18.

• 6:30 — First Resorter plate comes out of the Pyrofax plate-maker (which needs no negative, according to technician Isie Brock).

• 6:35 — We leave plant for hearty breakfast at nearby Big Boy restaurant. As breathtaking northern Michigan sunrise greets us, Hoffman comments, "That's what it's all about."

• 7:25 — Back at plant. "Today, when we're done, I'll have driven over 100 miles. Going around the lake will take a while."

• 7:36 — Central's nine-unit Goss Community starts to run. Hoffman scans the 36-page issue alongside press foreman Ken

Katchman. Top story on page one: "We'll be ready" (quote from superintendent on fall openings of classes); deck: "Kiwanians preview new school facilities"; bottom of page: "Arizona teacher named principal of Inland Lakes." Another masterpiece is birthed.

• 7:41 — Editor begins to place post office tags into metal clamps on bag. (Resort subscribers include 50 percent summer people. Joan has informed me, and copies go into 35 states.)

• 7:53 — Press run ends with counter showing 3,371.

• 7:57 — Crew switches to mailing mode. Addressograph labeling begins. Julie Nester, a press flyer, tells me: "He puts out a nice paper. I like reading it. Indian River is a cozy little town — beautiful steams, rivers."

• 8:25 — Mailing ends. Hoffman tells me, "We know we're done when this label comes up." He holds up paper for my inspection: "Alex Sawyer, P.O. Box 55126, North Pole, Alaska 99705."

• 8:27 — Bags and stacks of Resorters for newsstands are now loaded into pickup. Delivery begins.

• 8:50 — First over-the-counter stop, Interstate Party Store, at the Wolverine exit off I-75. Hoffman drops 70 papers.

• 9:01 — Wolverine post office. Editor sprints in with bag.

• 9:11 — Indian River EZ Mart, across from Catholic shrine with world's largest outdoor crucifix (of redwood). Clerk greets Hoffman as he hops 175 papers into the rack. "About 10 people have stopped to get the paper," he replies. "We're running about 45 minutes late."

• 9:22 — Ken's Super Market. We — reporter now helping — haul in 300 papers, placing them in stacks next to checkout counters.

Postmaster Ed Guindon tells me, "It's a fine paper."

will act out in the proper setting their 19th century identity.

Kaestner said she pursues leads on the names she accumulates any way she can and invites residents with history on Northville children from that era to contact her.

She has been having a particularly hard time tracking women, Kaestner said.

"Their identity vanished when they got married," she said. "I can't follow up on them because they no longer used their maiden name."

The most frustrating aspect of the project has been poor record keeping and her inability to find information.

"It's an ongoing project," Kaestner said. "You get on a roll and it's really interesting."

"It's going to take some hours, but it will be worthwhile."

A self-described "history nut," Kaestner said, "I love to have kids get excited about it. It's a fun way to teach history."

# New courses build awareness

Several Northville elementary school teachers are working on projects to make history come alive for their pupils.

Their ideas were prompted by the Board of Education's approval in May of revisions and text recommendations for the kindergarten-through-grade 12 social studies curriculum.

Northville teachers and administrators worked on the revisions for three years, according to Dolly McMaster, assistant superintendent for instructional services.

At the elementary level, the new curriculum emphasizes begins with the family in kindergarten, followed by families, family roles and

a child's place in time and space in first grade.

The second-grade social studies course material focuses on traditions, celebrations, heroes, monuments, geography and current events.

Bill Hamilton, director of instructional services, said all the elementary social studies curriculum is divided into two parts — conceptual and geographic.

The concept of "What is a community?" is introduced in the third grade. Objectives for the children include the ability to define the term "community" and to understand that a community is a product of its past, present and future, for example.

Other concepts that are explored at this level are the effect of

geography and climate on the community, and that communities have likenesses and differences.

Hamilton explained that the children start by learning about Northville's people, government, history and business.

"We start with looking at our own city," he said, "and then extend those units to look at broader areas."

Northville's characteristics will be compared with those of other cultures, Japan in the east and France in the west, for example, Hamilton said.

In their approval of the revised curriculum, school board members agreed the materials would encourage greater awareness in the pupils.

## Surviving dog days without A/C

This may come as a surprise to anyone under 30, but once upon a time there was (gasp!) a world without air conditioning. This of course was eons before the introduction of VCRs, microwaves, and Nintendo and only slightly after the Stone Age ended.

Mind-boggling, is it not? A time without frigid air blowing in your face every time you take the Chevy out for a spin?

A time without cricks in your neck from frigid air aimed at that part of the anatomy from the ceiling vent above your office desk?

A time when you could hear song birds, crickets, tree frogs the battling neighbors and the rest of the outside world from within the confines of your home?

We know there are others of you out there doing the same (although many of you are shutting your windows so the neighbors won't know you're WITHOUT A/C) and we've

compiled a list of more suggestions for preventing heatstroke when you're WITHOUT A/C. Be cool.

□ Rent "Dr. Zhivago" or old "Sgt. Preston of the Yukon" movies and watch them on the VCR while eating Cream-sicles. Of course, it really won't make you any cooler physically, but you can prove or disprove the theory that it's all in your head.

□ Review January's heating bill. Again, it won't really decrease the

temperature, but it will make you grateful that you're not in the middle of winter.

□ Ditto for restacking the firewood. □ Buy a block of ice from Ardwin-Hayes Wholesale in Detroit. A 10-pound block is \$1.25. Place it in the middle of your toddler neighbor's plastic wading pool while he's napping and slide in alongside it.

□ Find a cool, school pool. If you time it right, you could spend a few

waterlogged hours each day by making the rounds of community high schools.

□ Cruise the malls. Take your jacket; most of them are overly air conditioned and your body will have difficulty making the adjustment. Scoff at the thermometer by looking at the new fall fashions.

□ Remove unnecessary clothes. Obviously, the fewer you have on the

cooler you'll be, although some say wearing a hat keeps the sun off your head and therefore keeps the body cooler. Perhaps you could experiment wearing only a hat? Use discretion.

□ Get a haircut. Again, when the head stays warm, the body stays warm. Therefore, if the head stays cool, the body stays cool. Maybe.

□ Get to know the ushers at the local cinema, the personnel at the local bowling lanes, and just hang out.

□ Spend more time at the library. Do some research on downhill and cross country skiing or life in Antarctica. Or reread "Winter of Our Discontent."

□ Rent a watercraft on Orchard Lake and go cruising or fishing. Orchard Lake Boats and Windsurfers, corner of Orchard Lake Road and Indian Trail rents rowboats and windsurfers. Rowboats are \$14 for all day weekdays, \$16 on the weekend. With a motor it's \$30 and \$35. Windsurfers rent for \$14 an hour during the week, \$16 per hour on the weekend.

The shop is open 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. weekdays, 5 a.m. to 9 p.m. weekends. They also sell pop, candy and chips for people, nightcrawlers for the fish.

□ Make friends with a lake dweller. If you're low on friends trudge over to Kensington Metropark's Kent Lake and jump in; the water's fine.

□ And finally, make a decision. Will you buy an air conditioner for the half-dozen days when life is unbearable without it? On sale, of course. Or will you tough it out for one more summer?

## Heat poses a serious threat in summer

So far this summer Dr. Bradford Walters, a specialist in emergency medicine at Henry Ford Medical Center in West Bloomfield, has seen 10-15 cases of heat exhaustion and one case of overt heat stroke — a Fourth of July jogger.

"There's a lot of confusion about what heat stroke and heat exhaustion are," Walters said.

"Heat cramps, heat exhaustion and heat stroke are the same disease, but just the continuum of a scale."

Heat cramps are at the least serious end of the spectrum, and victims seldom end up in the emergency room. It's the depletion of body fluids and electrolytes (acids, bases and salts) in the muscles, most often seen in weekend athletes.

"Typically it's abdominal muscles, but with runners it could be in the legs — the muscles they're using most. With swimmers it could be abdomen and shoulders."

"People believe you don't sweat when you swim, but that's not true, you just don't realize it. Some pools have heating units, some water is warm from the sun, and you can be laying out in the sun by the pool."

Heat cramps can be very painful, Walters said.

For treatment he recommends "rest, fluids and replacing lost electrolytes with Gatorade to rehydrate."

"I'm not pushing Gatorade but it is the most commercially available electrolyte replacement and you can get it in any 7-Eleven."

More serious is heat exhaustion. "The patient has sweated and lost fluids to the point that he's lost enough to lose a significant volume of blood."

"Curiously enough, it's not characterized by an elevated temperature. He becomes lightheaded, confused."

A typical patient was one Walters saw while supervising a marathon.

"He was obviously fatigued," he said. "His skin was tight and he had lost tone, but he was otherwise normal. He didn't have an elevated temperature. But when I asked him how he was doing in the race he answered, 'What race?' He was obviously confused."

Heat exhaustion can also produce nausea and vomiting and whopping headaches, Walters said, in addition to rapid heart rate, hyperventilation and lowered blood pressure.

As treatment, Walters prescribes rest, fluids and electrolytes, as he does for heat cramps, but in more severe cases he may begin to rehydrate intravenously.

When the body loses the ability to regulate its temperature, heat stroke is the diagnosis.

"Now he is not sweating instantaneously. Sweating takes energy. He's dry as a bone, red-hot and prostrate. He's unable to get up. At this point he's very, very ill."

"It represents a real medical emergency. It can cause significant injury to the brain. Basically, he's cooked himself."

## KISS-FM gets some new digs

### Oldies show faces tough competition

"Shop 'til you drop" has given way to "shoo-bop-shoo-bop" as Troy's newest slogan, now that one of metro Detroit's top oldies stations has come to town.

For the first time in anyone's memory Troy has its very own radio station. WKSG, 102.7 FM, moved from its Mt. Clemens headquarters to the 850 Building on Stephenson Highway three weeks ago, and is still unpacking boxes, according to disc jockey Mike Kay.

"We didn't make a great deal of hoopla over this. A listener only wants to hear the music, and the music stays the same," said Kay, a native Detroit who until last March spun hits for stations in Tulsa, Cincinnati and Louisville.

What Kay means is, other than giving out their new phone number to listeners, KISS-FM execs haven't been touting their tony new location.

"There might be people who think this is a more prestigious address," said Kay.

"But you don't want people in Macomb to think we're abandoning them," added Kay's boss, Al Wilson, the station's general manager.

Actually, the move had more to do with space constraints than anything else, and wanting to be closer to advertisers, they said.

To be sure, no one out in radioland would even know the difference. The station's signal is transmitted over phone lines to Mt. Clemens where it's broadcast from the same transmitter.

Another thing that isn't changing,

according to the men, is the station's fight to reclaim the No. 1 spot among Detroit's five oldies stations. Right now they're No. 2, edged out slightly by WOMC, 104.3 FM.

"There's not room for five oldies stations here," in the nation's No. 6 market, said Wilson, who described WKSG's format as "upbeat oldies" all the time.

"You're not going to hear any Karen Carpenter here," Kay said. "We play what makes people feel good. Our niche is not to be light and easy."

The station, which has researched its market thoroughly, is giving listeners what they want, he added. "We're targeting a 37-year-old adult," said Wilson.

And, because "most people in the morning don't want to hear 12 minutes of talk," WKSG plays the most music of any oldies station during morning drive time, Kay said.

And exactly what constitutes an "oldie?" you ask. "Anything from the late '50s to '72," said Kay. Of course with that narrow time frame, KISS deejays have to worry about playing the same old songs all the time, or what Kay called "burnout, or the fatigue factor."

So to combat the burnout, the station has regular features like "Secret Sound," where deejays play some prerecorded sound like rubbing sandpaper, and has callers try to

guess what it is: "Three for Thursday" and "Feel Good Friday."

One time, said Kay, after Kenneth Weiner escaped police custody in Southfield, the station gave away a "Ken Weiner Escape Kit" to callers, which included food and free movie passes "to get off the streets for a couple of hours."

And of course, WKSG gives away "a lot" of cash — just how much, Kay and Wilson wouldn't say, but they claimed the amount was within the same range as their competitors.

But there is nothing like having the highest ratings.

"It's terrible being No. 2," said Wilson.

## Glimpses of east-west relations

It's interesting how quickly entertainment media reflect political, economic or cultural changes in the world.

With the end of decades of Cold War conflict, the change is dramatic, the implications wide-ranging and spy movies are suddenly very different.

HBO consistently produces and releases pretty decent films for its cable channel, motion pictures and comedy and concert performances that quickly arrive on the video racks for home viewing.

Two recent HBO video releases deal with Cold War terrorism and spies who are losing their rationale for snooping. Both films are 1989 color productions with well-known casts. Neither is all that great, but both have their moments and are worth checking out for entertainment and for their interesting socio-political ideas that go beyond the shooting and chasing.

The first, "Red King, White Knight" (106 minutes) is not rated, but probably deserves an R. It looks at the great changes sweeping Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union since Gorbachev instituted glasnost.

What does glasnost mean to hard-line Communist officials, in particular KGB types, who have thrived on Cold War activities and the budgets associated with high-tech lurking in the dark? Well, comrades, there's political unemployment as well as technological and economic ramifications.

To avoid the poorhouse, KGB officer, Tulayev (Tom Bell), organizes a plot to assassinate Gorbachev.

Clancy (Gavan O'Herlihy), an IRA terrorist, is to be the hit man. Naturally, the CIA gets wind of these doings and sends in a special agent, Stoner (Tom Skerritt).

Here things get cornball and confused as it turns out that Stoner is a retired, former hot-shot maverick agent with a chip on his shoulder and the burden of his wife's death on his soul.

Since all these matters are highly sensitive, Stoner is sent "unofficially" into the unnamed Eastern European country (Hungary) where Tulayev is plotting. If caught, Stoner will be disavowed, disowned and neither rescued nor ransomed. Not to worry, he gets around pretty easily and calls Washington from a pay phone.

Hungary just happens to be the station where Stoner's wife was murdered and where Stoner had an affair with Anna (Helen Mirren). In the background of these unbelievable coincidences is a retired KGB type, Szaz (Max von Sydow).

Some of the acting isn't too bad — von Sydow is appropriately dismayed at the proceedings. Skerritt, however, tends to posture and mug too much. Bell is quite hard, as he should be.

The really interesting facet of "Red King, White Knight" is the American CIA Committee discussion whether or not the President should be informed and advised to call and warn Gorbachev. As it turns out, peace is bad for a lot of people's business.

The other side of the ocean gets into glasnost as well in "The Cold Front" (R, 94 minutes) starring

Martin Sheen as John Hyde, a Drug Enforcement Agent doing some secret stuff in Vancouver. He and his Royal Canadian Mounted Police Detective partner, Derek McKenzie (Michael Ontkean), get involved with the CIA and the KGB, both of whom are trying to eliminate a rogue terrorist/assassin, Mantha (Kim Coates). Sound familiar?

Right — and so does the well-worn plot device of an ex-wife and the husband's guilt and longing. In this case, Hyde's wife, Amanda (Beverly D'Angelo), conveniently sings in a local supper club where Mantha hangs out. The sax player has some pretty neat solos.

It gets pretty murky insofar as figuring out who is doing what to whom, but it is clear that too many CIA and KGB types find peace and the crumbling of the Berlin Wall bad for budgets.

The film concludes with the usual — and in this case fairly well-done — chase sequence. Amanda runs through dark, lonely streets; Mantha chases her. Hyde chases Mantha. Hyde corners Mantha high up on bridge girders. They fight — and so on.

Both films are fairly entertaining but of greatest interest are their very clear messages: Entertainment media have a lot to say about what's going on in the world.

The world, in particular spies and businesses that deal in confrontation, may not be able to afford peace and good will to all men, women and children. Now, that's depressing.

## Forget the starving artist stereotype

Rene LaMar doesn't underestimate the power of hard work, a bit of creative thinking and a little help from some corporate friends.

"I see other artists' groups screaming for grants and complaining that there is no art in public places," said LaMar, founder of the Ann Arbor Artists' Co-op. "We go to businesses, point to a blank wall and, bingo, you have work displayed."

LaMar has combined a savvy business sense with the delicate creative process of art and is not only getting his artists' works shown but is also managing to sell a few pieces along the way.

He thinks it's time to forget the stereotype of the starving artist — he has a better plan. It has to do with his uncanny knack for understanding the concepts of capitalistic society.

"For a group of artists, we're pretty professional here," said LaMar, standing in one of the tangible results of this philosophy — the airy studio that serves as the co-op's headquarters.

On a long work table in front of the large window overlooking a street, a young man works diligently at carving grooves into a chunk of wood. A young woman gazes intently at the smooth white ceramic piece on which she is working.

LaMar managed to get a few free

months of occupancy in the studio from the company that owns the building in exchange for fixing up the place. Co-op members build several private studios in the building, which are rented to other artists. The income from those studios pays rent for the entire building.

"It's a recyclable program, everything keeps paying for itself," LaMar said. The income from selling a piece of work goes into buying more art supplies which, in turn, allows more work to be created.

LaMar steps in front of one of the group's ongoing projects — a mural going up the front stairwell of the studio. The mural is filled with big yellow suns, blue dolphins, red mouths, televisions, happy faces, mermaids and skeletons.

"It's not finished," LaMar said. "It's just a way for us to learn to work together. We're all doing our own thing. There's no restrictions on color, size or subject matter."

LaMar's talent for deal-making has helped the co-op perform some remarkable feats. What began as a tiny group of friends looking for ways to display their art now has more than 250 members.

The co-op offers free communal space where members can work 24 hours a day. They provide free art supplies, like a typesetter, kiln, and

airbrush. Members can get assistance in everything from solving their framing problems to finding the right photographer. Workshops are available on a variety of subjects, including cutting-edge jewelry making and the art of silk screening a T-shirt. Co-op members even get discounts on art supplies at area stores. The cost of membership is \$10 a year.

"We try to help artists with the little details they run into," said LaMar.

One of these little details is how to get work shown in a town glutted with artists.

"The galleries around here have a 'Don't call us, we'll call you' attitude toward local artists," said LaMar. "Some take 40 percent of the sales."

LaMar responded to this by creating the "roving gallery." He asked local stores if they would be interested in exhibiting some of the co-op's art.

The proposition was a success, since it benefited both parties — the store owners got free art for their businesses and the artist got prime exhibition space.

Unlike area galleries, these businesses will often ask for little or no commission for showing the work. They're just happy to have it around.

Co-op members don't eschew earning money as somehow "unartist-

tic" or "selling out," nor are they motivated by greed. Money is simply a way to do what they want to do — make art, get it displayed and maybe help someone out along the way.

"We're striving to give a lot back to the community," said LaMar. The co-op worked on plans for Earth Day in conjunction with the Rainforest Action Movement. The groups put 10 percent of the Earth Day-generated monies toward saving the rain forests.

"I have this secret theory that art can save the planet," LaMar said sheepishly.

The co-op plans to continue to devote itself to discovering the needs of the artists, then finding ways to fulfill those needs. It may install a color darkroom and publish an expanded, full-color newsletter.

"I guarantee that in one year we will have more art displayed than any other group," said LaMar.

Given the co-op's track record, that may not be an unrealistic prediction. In April, less than a year after LaMar started the organization, the co-op celebrated the grand opening of its artist-owned gallery.

Mr. Rogers offers tips for first-time school goers

Mister Rogers Goes To School, airing on PBS stations Aug. 20 through 24, helps to prepare children for two big steps: kindergarten and first grade.

Of his own experience Rogers says, "My first school was a small-town school that had eight classrooms: one for each grade. It was the same school where my mother and dad had gone ... I do remember that I was scared to go the first day, but I guess I had a lot of help in having it all turn out in a positive way."

Children have many questions about school such as, "What will school be like?" "Will I have to know my letters and numbers the first day?" "Can I come home when I want to?" "What if I don't like it? Do I have to go back?"

"By talking together in the weeks before school starts, you are allowing time for the questions to be asked and talked about and absorbed gradually," says Rogers.

To help children feel more comfortable on the first days of school, Rogers offers many helpful tips: Parents can arrange play times with other children in the neighborhood who will also be going to school. Knowing even one other child can help your child feel less alone; some parents try to arrange for their child to tour the school building and meet the new teacher before classes begin; sending your child off with a "Have a good day at school," is more encouraging than telling her or him "Be good;" one mother put a photograph of the entire family in her son's lunch box to remind him that at the end of the day the whole family would be together again.

"With encouragement, your child might want to talk about the day's school activities—what was fun, what was bad, what was easy, what was difficult, what the other children did, what the teacher said," Rogers comments.

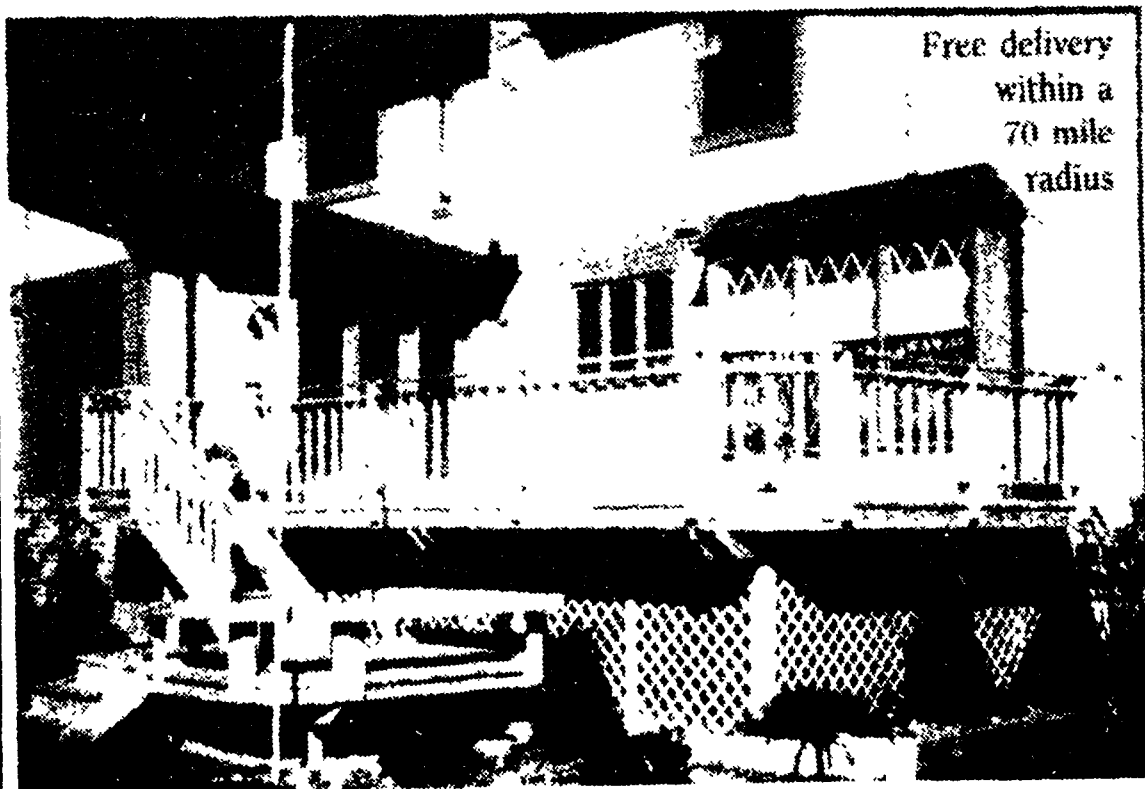

Being part of an on-location television crew is exciting. Pulling up on site hours before an event really gives one a feeling of purpose. The television vehicle always creates curiosity. Most cable systems have a van or a truck which carries a studio on wheels. The reason for an on-location van shoot is to enhance community events and encourage diversity in television programming. A cable company staff person accompanies every shoot so that community producers can feel secure that technical advice is nearby.

The kind of productions for which the remote van/truck studios are most suited are outside events such as parades, musical performances and on-the-spot news coverage as well as indoor performances of plays, musicals, documentaries, meetings, etc.

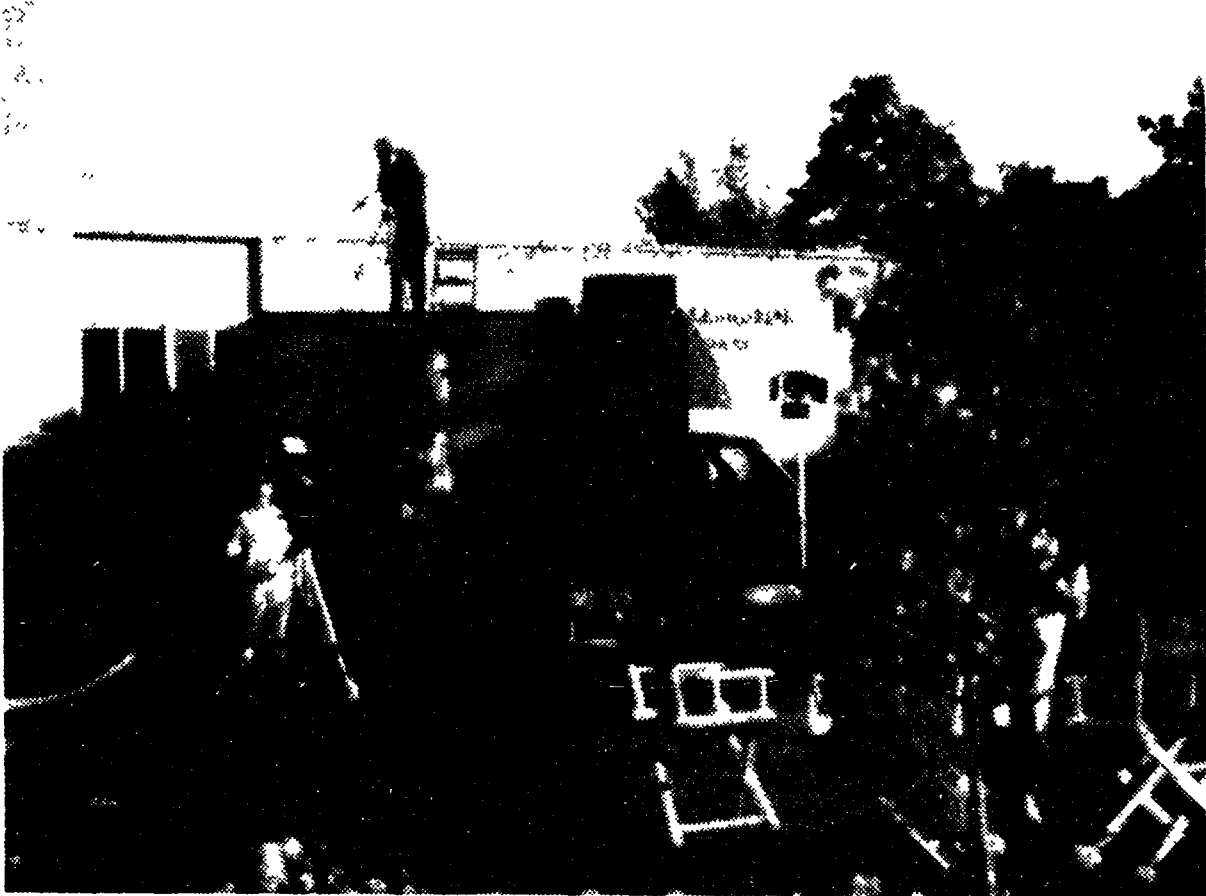

Reproduction planning is important in anticipation for use of the van. Any time a shoot is away from the studio there is no longer a controlled environment. Anything can happen! Besides the television equipment inside the van/truck, the vehicle is a technical piece of equipment in itself. Maintenance on the engine and body are imperative. Although the remote vehicles may be seen around our communities at most large events, keep in mind the true frequency of which the vehicle is used. Michigan weather is not kind to such finely tuned studios on wheels. Therefore, cable staffs always include maintenance checks as part of their regular routines.

The equipment configuration of the van/truck determines the power supply needs. The Omnicom Van incorporates a suitcase studio within and uses the 110 power supply outlets. This enables them to be versatile. They can unload and go into situations that can only be covered with portable equipment. The MetroVision Truck has a studio and editing decks built into the equipment panel. This requires a 220 power supply. The advantage is that the show may be completed on site.

Planning ahead for an on-location site involves considering the floor plan, location of the fuse box-circuit breaker, where the electrical outlets are and their voltage, doors, windows, lighting (types of), set design, prop sizes, location and number of chairs, location of audience, traffic



pattern of entire set up, traffic pattern of performance participants.

Lighting and Audio details can make or break a video and extra lighting will probably be needed, especially at evening events. An ideal Audio plan is to be able to patch into the already existing sound board. Use of auxiliary microphones may sound hollow at best.

Set up time with the vans can take two to four hours, depending on the complexity of the event. Take-down time is approximately one hour.

The excitement surrounding an on-site production crew is worth the extra effort involved.

It is a fact that the production crew will be on center stage for the crowds that are there to watch. But they should enjoy themselves while being professional, as they are walking diplomats for Community Television Channels.



# Mickey Mouse helps kick off new college football season

## Pre-season game to be played with a little Disney magic

After a week of festivities including a golf challenge, a Southern California fashion show and a tailgate party/pep rally, 1990's first pre-season college football game gets underway in the grand style of Disneyland.

The first ever Disneyland Pigskin Classic kicks off the new college football season with a matchup between the University of Colorado Buffaloes and the University of Tennessee Volunteers. The game will begin at noon Pacific time, and air live on NBC.

Sponsored by Disneyland and administered by the Orange County Sports Association, the game is the newest NCAA sanctioned pre-season game, and is part of Disneyland's year-long celebration of its 35th anniversary. The event, designed to kick off college football in a grand manner, each year will include two top college teams from the previous football season.

"It is our hope that the Disneyland Pigskin Classic will grow into one of America's premier annual athletic events," said Jack Linquist, executive vice president of creative marketing concepts for Walt Disney Attractions. Linquist, who also serves as president of the Orange County Sports Association, continued, "Intercollegiate football deserves a spectacular opening each year, and the Disneyland Pigskin Classic should excite not only Anaheim and Southern California but the entire country."

Naturally popular Disney characters like Mickey Mouse, Donald Duck and Disneyland's

perennial "star athlete," Goofy, will perform at kick off and half time of the game.

Even the pep squad will reflect Disney's magical attention to entertainment. Comprised of 35 high school students selected from Orange County schools, the Disneyland Pigskin Classic Pep Squad will be taught by former world class gymnast and Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus assistant choreographer Stephanie Stromer. Each of the participants will be given a casting opportunity with the park.

The game promises to be exciting, as both teams are coming off impressive 1989 campaigns which saw the two schools each post 11-1 seasons.

The Buffaloes of Colorado went into the Orange Bowl rated No. 1 in the country, before losing their only game of the season to Notre Dame 21-6. Tennessee's Volunteers topped Arkansas in the Cotton Bowl, 31-27. The school's only loss was to Alabama in the sixth week of the season.

All signs point toward another run at the nation's top spot again this year for Colorado. Only seniors J.J. Flannigan and Erich Kissick graduated from the potent backfield. The team's offense is led by the return of quarterback Darian Hagan, who rushed for 1,004 yards, scoring 17 touchdowns; and tailback Eric Bieniemy, who gained 561 yards on 88 carries, averaging 6.4 yards per attempt. He scored nine touchdowns.

A staple of the Tennessee football program is legendary head coach Johnny Majors whose record stands

at 93-54-6 for this 12 years as the Vols' leader. He was recently installed as president of the American Football Coaches Association.

Tennessee is led by its own vaunted running game. Last season the Vols ranked near the top 10 nationally in rushing statistics. Of special note is Chuck Webb, who at one point notched five straight 100-yard games, including a school record 294 yards against Ole Miss. He battered Arkansas' defense for 250 yards in the Bowl victory.

Mickey Mouse leads the festivities as the 1990 college football season kicks off in the "Disneyland Pigskin Classic," airing Sunday, Aug. 26, on NBC. The University of Tennessee meets the University of Colorado in the game in Anaheim, California.

Since Bell is one of the most liked actresses, by teens, it only makes sense that her character be involved in these storylines.

While Bell is not one of my favorites, I must admit that she has come a long way in her acting abilities in just a few short years. I would like to see her move on and challenge herself with other roles, and perhaps then Y&R could bring in some new blood.

## Val Kilmer had prestigious beginnings in acting career

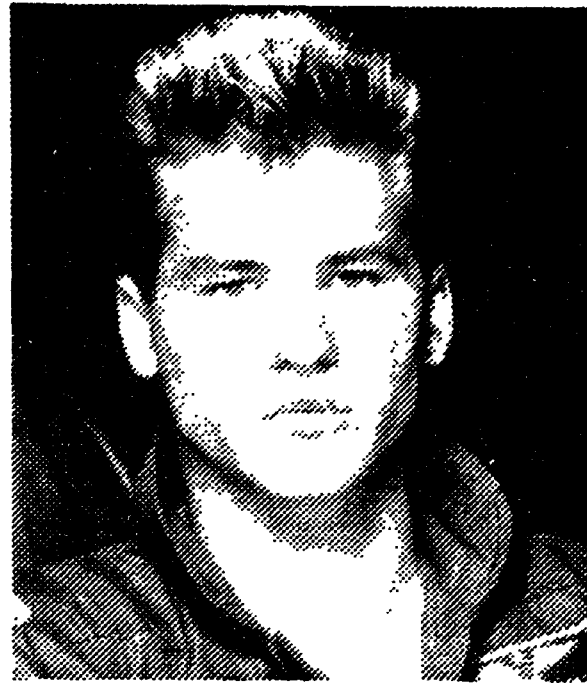
