## Layoffs top list of cuts if school millage fails

Twenty-three teacher layoffs and downscaled athletics are among the budget cuts Northville school officials plan to make if voters don't approve a one-year, 1.28-mill tax increase Sept. 27.

The list of cuts includes layoffs and reshuffling of the entire student population, reduced athletic and co-curricular programs, decreased transportation and maintenance services, fewer course options and elimination of some special programs.

Cuts are planned across the board, Superintendent

George Bell said. "The Strategic Plan says K-12 comes first."

"We tried to retain as much of the program as possible . . . Students would be pinched in the options open to them."

The superintendent said the list is "as close as we can come right now" to describe what actually would take place if the proposal is defeated.

Specific levels would experience different types of cuts — elimination of the seventh period and collegial planning (team-teaching coordination) at the middle schools, increase in the number of split classrooms at the elementary level or elimination of many high school extra-curricular activities, for example.

The administration's proposal would reduce \$168,000 in elementary teaching staff, \$168,000 in middle school teaching staff, \$84,000 in high school teaching staff, \$21,000 in high school counseling staff, and \$42,000 in middle and elementary school gifted teaching staff.

Those 23 layoffs would take effect Oct. 15, Bell said. "If teachers seem to be hit inordinately hard, it's because that's where our people are," he said. Eighty percent of the district's \$21-million budget is employee costs.

Bell explained that the district's entire teaching staff would experience the "trickle-down effect." An administrator or high-seniority teacher displaced by program cuts is forced back into the teaching ranks, he said.

Teachers at the bottom are laid off, he said, resulting in savings of \$21,000.

Examples of where that would occur are the district's gifted facilitator and the educational technology resource teacher.

Board Vice President Jean Hansen asked if maintaining a lower class size for kindergarten and first grade had been considered, "because those levels are so important."

Bell said if those teachers were maintained, class size at higher grade levels would increase to 35-40 students.

The proposed cuts would create a 32-to-1 student-staff ratio at the middle and high school levels and 31-to-1 at the elementary level, Bell said. The initial

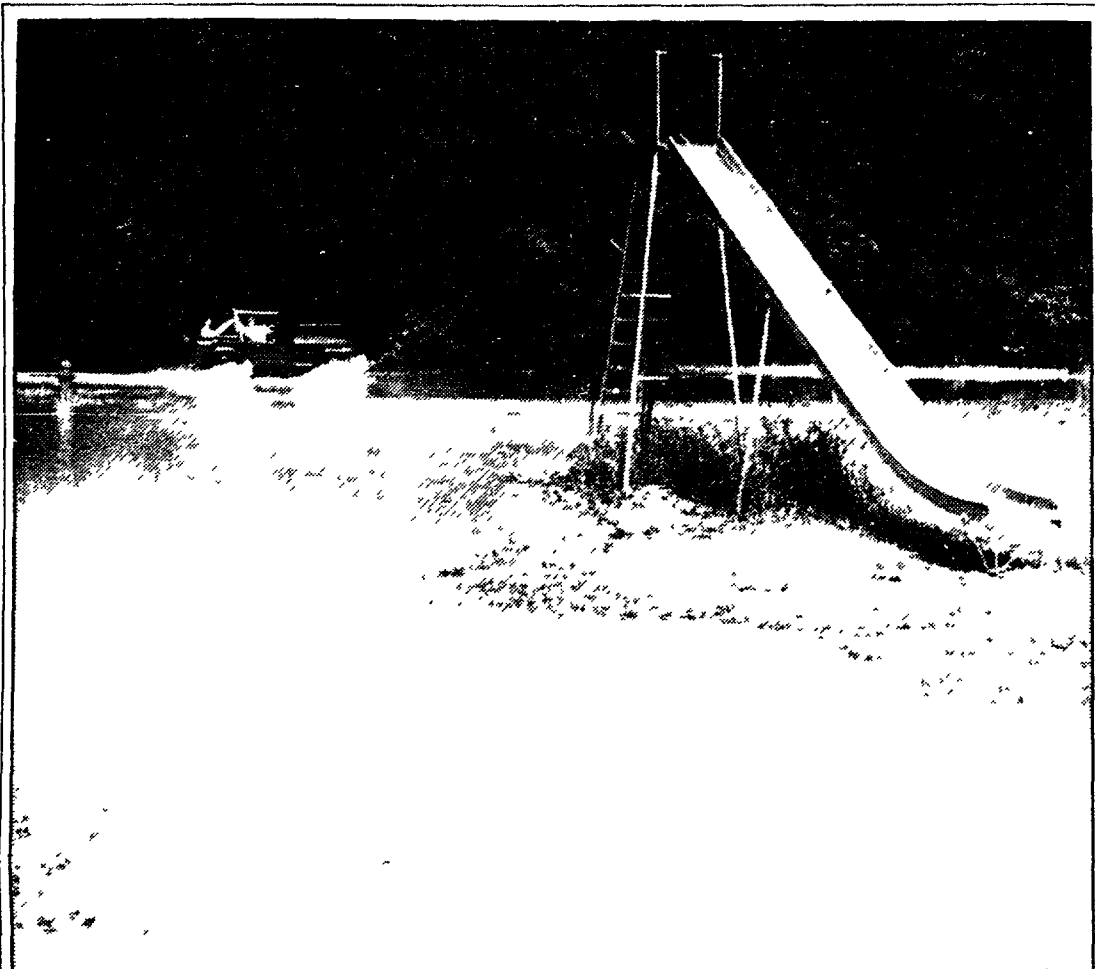

## Rains drench area

The Northville area fared better than many Wayne and Oakland county communities during the brutal late-summer storm that raged late Thursday and into the morning hours Friday.

A downpour totaling almost four inches flooded low-lying areas and kept local police and fire departments on edge throughout the evening.

A tornado was sighted near I-275 and Michigan Avenue in the Canton area shortly after 10 p.m. Thursday evening. A tornado warning was posted for Northville but was modified to a tornado watch by approximately 10:45.

No tornado-related damage was reported.

## Planners finish blueprint

The city's planning commission completed its review of a new draft Master Plan Tuesday night.

The plan now goes to the city council, downtown development authority (DDA) and historic district commission for their input.

Major points of discussion Tuesday included the possibility of widening Center Street between Seven Mile Road and Cady Street, and between Dunlap Street and Eight Mile Road. One of the Master Plan's

"Street and Circulation Improvement Policies" is to widen the street to allow a center left-turn lane.

City Manager Steven Walters noted that most of those street areas are already wide enough to allow a third lane.

One point of contention Tuesday was over the role the commission should take in the redevelopment of Cady Street.

"I think we can decide on our own individual basis what role Cady Street should play in the city, and I think that's a legitimate function of the Master Plan," Commissioner Rol-

land Stapleton said.

But Chairperson John Hardin suggested that Cady Street should be addressed by a reworked Cady Corridor Plan, the DDA plan that was postponed with the relocation of an expanded parking deck to Cady Street.

The planning commission and city council still agreed to disagree about the relocation of Cady Street west of Center. Commissioners had argued to allow Cady to continue west across Center Street after the east section of Cady is relocated south to allow an

## Marilyn break-in nets four guns

Four weapons — including handguns and rifles valued at \$2,100 — were stolen from a Marilyn residence Sept. 2, township police said Friday. Det. Fred Yankee said police have

developed suspects in the breaking and entering, which netted thieves a .357 Magnum and a semi-automatic handgun, as well as a .12-gauge shotgun and a .306 rifle.

Yankee said one or more suspects gained entry to the residence by breaking and climbing through a window. He said police have obtained evidence that points toward suspects, but he would not specify or identify the evidence.

## AIDS classes reach K-6 level

Novi Community School District kindergartners will be taught that AIDS is making lots of grownups very sick.

That is one of the first lessons in the new kindergarten-through-sixth-grade AIDS education curriculum the Board of Education approved Thursday. The new state-mandated course content will be added this school year, said Rita Traynor, assistant superintendent of instruction.

AIDS curriculum is now in place for all Novi K-12 students.

Prior to the board's unanimous vote to approve the curriculum, Trustee Michael Meyer said, "It's very important what we're doing for our children."

"There is a tremendous awareness regarding AIDS in the community," he continued. "It's important that we educate our children."

Information on the virus that causes AIDS — Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome — will be incorporated in the Growing Healthy Program, the total health education program adopted by the district eight years ago.

Superintendent Robert Piwko said integration of the materials through an existing program will be more effective than adding a separate unit on AIDS.

"We wanted (AIDS education) to be part of our total health program," he said.

The Growing Healthy program teaches total wellness, decision-making and skills for resisting peer pressure.

The new course content is designed to encourage student behaviors that will diminish the spread of HIV (human immunodeficiency virus), the virus that causes AIDS.

The new curriculum was reviewed by Novi teachers, administrators and parents, and county health officials.

The Growing Healthy AIDS supplement provides information for the district's teachers on why certain approaches are appropriate for different grade levels.

The Novi district will mail a letter to parents prior to instruction that informs them that their child's health curriculum will include a study of HIV and AIDS.

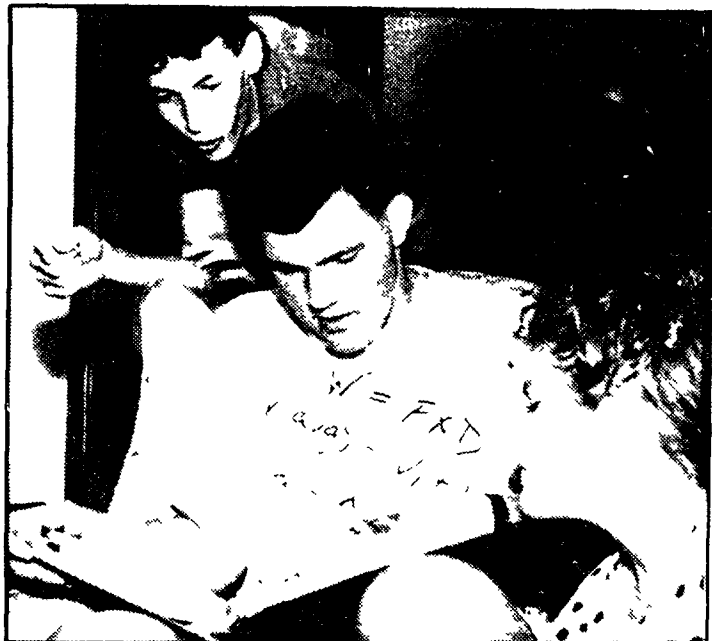

## Students view Europe in depth

Sixty-four Northville High School foreign language students were able to apply their lessons this summer in the country they studied.

The students traveled England, France, Spain, Switzerland, Austria and Germany for 20 days. Ten adults — teachers and their spouses — accompanied the students.

The trip, arranged by Spanish and French teacher Emily Serafa-Manschot and German teacher Judy Kammeraad, continued the long-established tradition of a biennial trip to Europe for high school French, Spanish and German students.

The students loved using the language they studied, the teachers said.

"That is always such a thrill for them," Kammeraad said.

Serafa-Manschot added, "They realized they could read and get themselves around."

Senior Kamal Bagga said, "It was really fun to even halfway attempt (to use the language), like getting on the metro."

"We had to ask them to repeat their directions again and again," she laughed.

Senior Kendra Huard, a fourth-year Spanish student, said she enjoyed Spain because of the language edge she had. But she also like Germany and Switzerland a lot.

"We had a taste of everything — cities, the countryside," Huard said.

Serafa-Manschot said, "They see that these things (they learn about in class) actually exist. It sparks them to learn more."

Senior Joe Kupsky enrolled in a beginning French class as well as his fourth-year German course.

"We got to see the differences between the countries," Kupsky said. "It made me want to learn more about different countries."

He said he particularly enjoyed how much he got to use the language he is learning.

"The trip was great," Kupsky said. "It (the expense) was my spring break, my summer and my car, but I wouldn't give it up for anything."

Students always benefit from the trips, the teachers said.

"They learn that people do things differently," Kammeraad said. "Taking a nap in the middle of the afternoon is normal in Spain."

The trips mature students, the teachers agreed. They said they enjoy watching their students grow from the experience.

"At some point it comes to the kids," Kammeraad explained. "It just clicks. 'It really is different.'"

"They get the idea that the whole world is not just their little area."

Serafa-Manschot added, "They realize it's not just learning verb conjugations."

They also appreciate more what they have at home, she added.

Junior Lauren Somershoe said, "I thought the trip was wonderful."

"I think because I'm taking German, I enjoyed Germany the most," she said. "It was neat to see how other people lived; not just how Americans live."

The cross-cultural trip was the students' idea, Serafa-Manschot said.

Kammeraad said past trips, which had concentrated on one country and language, had been successful. The five to 15 students who would sign up would be immersed in the culture, she said.

"This trip was a totally different type of trip," Kammeraad said. "It was more of an introduction to what Europe is like."

The Northville group stayed from one to three days in cities such as London, Canterbury, Dover, Calais, Paris, Versailles, Nice, Barcelona, Madrid, Toledo, Liechtenstein, Garmisch, Munich, Noerdlingen, Dinkelsbuehl, Rothenburg and Frankfurt.

Serafa-Manschot said they traveled by plane, train, underground subway, ferry, bus, cable car and taxi.

They did a lot of sightseeing and shopping. Highlights the teachers described included visits to Notre Dame, gothic cathedrals, baroque churches and the Louvre and Prado museums.

"I loved the museums," Bagga said. "We got to see things, like impressionist paintings, that we're going to study in Humanities this year."

All the students could name a spot to which they would like to return.

"I'd like to revisit pretty much everywhere we went," Huard said.

Serafa-Manschot said they began planning the June trip in January of 1989. This trip presented an even larger challenge to plan than those in previous years because of the number of countries on the itinerary.

The two teachers said the trips are arranged only every two years because of the amount of planning required.

After receiving Board of Education approval, Serafa-Manschot and Kammeraad met with the travel agent, created an itinerary, obtained commitments from students, met with parents of students who had signed up, held regular meetings to acquaint students with what to expect in Europe, assigned roommates and finalized details.

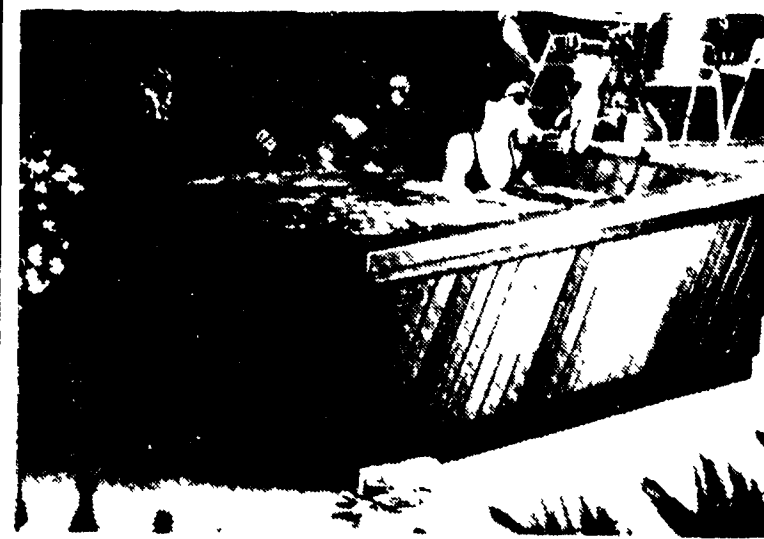

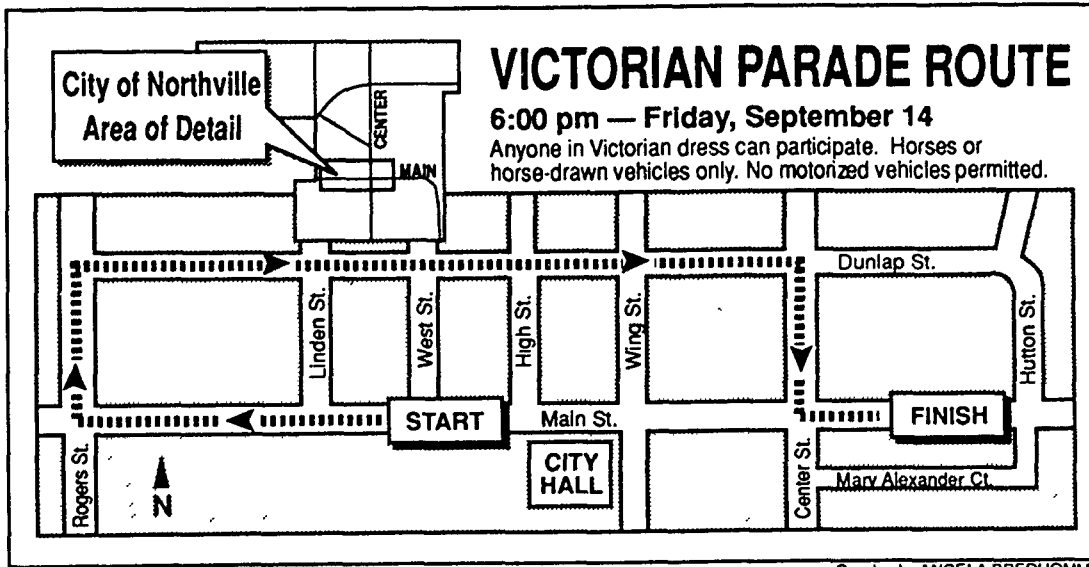

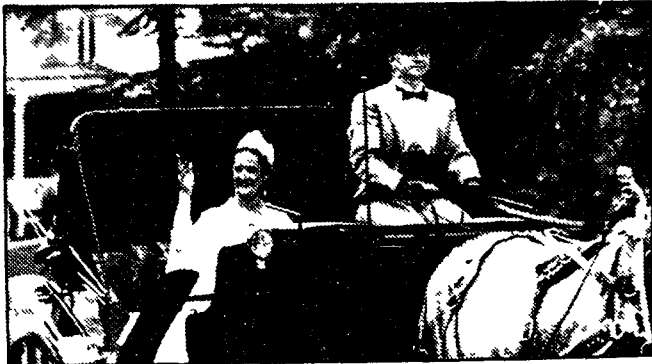

## Anti-tax group plans to fight school millage

A local anti-tax group was undecided as of Thursday on whether to support the Northville school district's proposed millage increase, a spokesman for the group said.

"Whether we're going to support it or not has not yet been determined," said Jeff Hampton, a spokesperson for Citizens for a Better Northville.

The Board of Education voted to hold a Sept. 27 election to ask if the district should levy an additional 1.28 mills for one year to provide funds for operating purposes.

Members of Citizens for a Better Northville met Thursday night. Hampton said the group was planning to discuss a possible meeting with Northville school officials.

Details of that discussion were unavailable by press time.

Hampton said very preliminary discussion by the group included plans to put forward certain condi-

tions for supporting the proposal.

"As the proposal stands now, we wouldn't support it," Hampton said.

However, he added, "If the Northville system needs a breather for a year, we would support it if the administration will try to come up with some creative alternatives."

For example, Hampton said, alternatives may include streamlining the bureaucracy and putting more competition into the system.

The Northville district has been compared to neighboring Novi, Farmington and Livonia districts, Hampton said.

"That's not the real competition," he said. "The real competition is in Tokyo, Rome, Moscow and Berlin. And we're still way behind."

He said he thought the group would want to accept Superintendent George Bell's invitation to discuss the bond proposal.

"Every cloud has a silver lining," he said. "This could be a chance to implement alternate solutions that might not normally come up in a well-funded school system."

Data shows that money is not the prime factor in determining the quality of education, Hampton said.

"The argument that money is the sole determining factor is not it," he said.

"This is a golden opportunity to say let's really do it — an opportunity to really come up with something different," Hampton said.

Citizens for a Better Northville campaigned against the last three local millage proposals, including a city recreation millage in November 1989, a township library proposal in May and a township fire millage in the August primary. All three proposals were defeated.

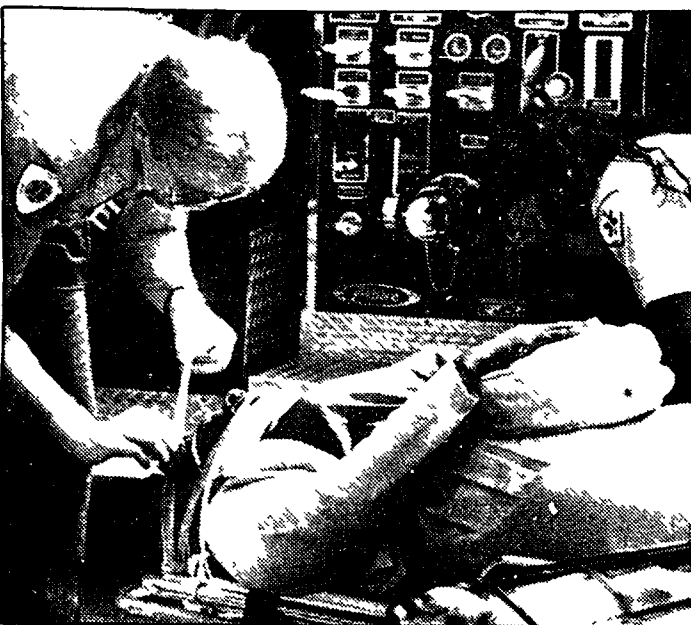

## Crash injures five

Five people — including two young children — were injured Sept. 4 in a three-car collision at the intersection of Seven Mile and Haggerty Roads.

A five-year-old Livonia boy was treated at Botsford General Hospital for lacerations of the head, mouth and arm after the Plymouth Voyager mini-van in which he was riding was struck by a Ford Thunderbird Coupe, according to Michigan State Police reports.

The boy's 7-year-old brother was treated for less serious injuries, police said.

Impact from the initial collision sent the mini-van into the path of a Ford Tempo, state police Trooper R.R. Rochell said. The Tempo was driven by a Detroit woman, who suffered neck injuries and was also

treated and released at Botsford General Hospital.

The driver of the Thunderbird was treated for minor injuries at St. Mary Hospital.

State police would not release the names of those involved in the accident.

According to police reports, the driver of the Thunderbird was northbound on Haggerty and ran through a yellow caution light at the Seven Mile intersection, striking the mini-van, which was turning eastbound on Seven Mile.

The mini-van then spun into the Tempo, police said.

Traffic at the Seven Mile/Haggerty intersection was disrupted for almost an hour as workers cleared wreckage.

The driver of the Thunderbird was cited for entering an intersection on a yellow light, state police said.

# Administration writes list of cuts if millage fails

budget allowed for one teacher for every 28 students.

Also to be cut would be \$52,000 in middle and high school athletics, \$25,000 in middle and high school co-curricular activities and \$25,000 in athletic direction.

Beginning with the winter season, middle school athletics, intramurals and cheerleading would be eliminated. All ninth-grade and junior varsity sports, assistant coaching positions, cheerleading and pom-pom squads would be eliminated.

Also, the \$25,000 in co-curricular cuts would affect the vocal and instrumental groups, all festivals and contests, forensics and the spring musical, for example.

"Those cuts are yet to be defined," Bell said. "To save a significant amount of money, you have to select areas where a lot of kids are involved."

Bell said varsity sports would not be cut because those

students have worked for years to get to that stage and they need exposure for any possible scholarships.

"We're trying not to hurt the kids," he said.

Further cuts would be \$40,000 for the high school substance abuse coordinator's position, \$50,000 in transportation and field trips, \$88,000 in aides, and \$50,000 in custodial-maintenance staff and services.

There would be no field trips, the superintendent said. The distance the district would travel to transport students would be increased from one-half to one mile, he said.

Aide positions would be eliminated at all district buildings, he said. Some elementary aides would be maintained for playground and bus supervision where there are safety concerns, Bell said.

The proposal also would cut \$10,000 in the business-education partnership, \$20,000 in secretaries, \$21,000 in central office administration and \$21,000 for the gifted

facilitator's position.

The part-time position of business-education project director would be eliminated, Bell said, "even though all I hear is that's the direction the Northville district should be going."

The director of instructional services position would be dissolved, Bell said, forcing the redistribution of central office responsibilities.

"We would be reshuffling responsibilities throughout the district," he said.

The district is distributing sheets at all district buildings that list frequently asked questions about the millage proposal and responses.

Bell said board members and building administrators, in addition to himself, will be available to answer questions about the election at upcoming open houses.

Open houses are scheduled at 7 p.m. on the following dates and locations: Sept. 11, Meads Mill Middle School;

Sept. 12 and 13, Winchester and Moraine elementary schools; Sept. 18, Amerman and Silver Springs elementary schools; Sept. 19, Cooke Middle School; Sept. 25, Amerman; and Sept. 26, Silver Springs.

Bell prepared the list of proposed program reductions to total \$885,000 at the request of the Board of Education. The district budget currently is short \$885,000 as a result of the passage of the 1990 State Aid Act that "recaptured" state aid money the district had counted on to fund operations for this school year.

The millage proposal asks voters whether the district should levy an additional 1.28 mills for one year "in order to avoid program cuts caused by a reduction in state funding."

"People have to understand this isn't some kind of bluff," said Board President James Petrie.

readings indicated that 3.52 inches of rain fell at Metro Airport. A slightly greater amount fell in the Northville area, he said.

"The storm swept right across there," he said. "You got close to four inches."

The Allen Park area recorded 4.2 inches of rain, the high for the metro Detroit region, Deedler said.

Heavy rains closed the entire length of Hines Drive Friday, and the Middle Rouge River flooded its banks

and spilled into large areas of Hines Park and Waterford Bend.

A flood warning was posted for the Middle Rouge Friday.

City and township police said most of the calls they responded to involved fire alarms sounding after brief power outages. City police said "the majority" of 15 weather-related calls were from activated fire alarms.

Lightning was blamed for a Thursday evening fire at 19820 Fry, township Fire Chief Robert Toms said.

Toms said lightning struck the house at approximately 10 p.m. and

cracked a basement gas line. The basement then caught fire, he said.

Toms said firefighters shut off the gas line and extinguished the fire. He reported that the basement received extensive damage.

Toms also said a woman was treated for smoke inhalation at the scene.

"She had respiratory distress upon arrival," he said "She was given oxygen and refused transportation to the hospital."

Township fire department personnel also responded to a report of a

burning utility pole near Eight Mile and Meadowbrook at approximately 8:30 p.m. Thursday. The fire department fielded approximately seven weather-related calls, Toms said.

Township police responded to five fire alarms and assisted the fire department on three calls.

The city fire department went on standby during the tornado warning.

Fire Chief Jim Allen said men and equipment were posted at strategic points around town during the length of the warning.

"My procedure is to space equip-

ment around town," he said. "If a tornado hit, not everything would be in one place."

City firefighters attended to a pair of downed electrical wire calls Friday morning.

Downed wires were reported outside a residence on Whitegate Drive and on Orchard just north of Seven Mile. The wires on Orchard were inactive upon arrival, a city firefighter said.

expanded parking deck.

But the city council favors a Main-Centre carport plan which would cut across the location of a relocated West Cady on the MAGS parking lot, arguing that West Cady could be relocated in the future if necessary.

City Manager Steven Walters did assure the commission that Cady Street could be relocated through the middle of the MAGS parking lot later, and the present north and south crossings through the lot could be closed.

Commission liaison Jerry Mittman and Walters also convinced the

commission to add fire hall expansion to the Master Plan's capital improvement plan.

Commissioners also agreed with Commissioner Stephen Ball's recommendation to add acquisition of control over the Ford Valve Plant to the capital improvement plan. The fate of

the Ford plant was a topic of long discussion at the previous Master Plan review.

The commission set Oct. 2 as the tentative date for its preliminary approval of the reworked plan, and hopes to send the plan to other boards and hold public hearings in

October and November.

The planning commission has been laboring for two years on the new plan, between site plan reviews and other commission business. The Master Plan was last rewritten in 1981.

## Co-ops may evict member in default

I am considering a co-op, as opposed to a condominium. I have been told that the cooperative association can evict me if I do not pay the monthly assessment. Is that true?

Unlike a condominium, when you buy a cooperative you are renter of the cooperative unit, having signed a proprietary lease for that unit.

If you default in your obligations to the cooperative association of which you are a member, the cooperative association can institute eviction procedures against you in landlord/tenant court to evict you from the premises. You may also be deemed to have defaulted in your obligations as a member of the corporation and your interest in the cooperative association can be terminated.

In a condominium, if you do not pay your assessments, the condominium association must foreclose against your unit in the same manner as a mortgage company would foreclose if you defaulted in your mortgage payments.

I am a broker and have a listing with a client who has turned down at least two offers concerning the sale of his recreational condominium. In both instances, the offer was close to what was being asked and the terms and conditions were reasonable. My listing agreement is about to expire, and the seller has indicated that he would verbally guarantee me any future sale should I come up with it. What do you suggest I do?

It seems to me from your question that you do not accept the credibility of the seller's desire to sell the property in a timely fashion. If your seller is playing games or if he is refusing to sell the property to persons on the basis of race, color, creed, national origins, sex, marital status or other prohibitive category, you may be well advised to terminate your listing agreement with him as soon as possible and disassociate yourself from him in all respects. Also, as you should know, contracts for commissions in this state must be in writing to be enforceable.

## Apartments without compromise

### Complex fills luxury niche

At the River Oaks West apartments in Novi, you can expect to pay \$595 a month for a studio apartment, between \$855 and \$1,000 a month for a two-bedroom apartment, and up to \$1,575 a month for a three-bedroom townhouse.

"You might say that's a bit expensive," says Anita Kremer, vice president of operations with Troy's Solomon Group, developer of River Oaks. "But we have included in that an attached garage, a full-size washer and dryer and a large laundry room area. You're really getting a lot of value for your money."

The three-bedroom townhouse, for example, is 2,500 square feet, including a full basement. All apartments have spacious living rooms, bedrooms and bathrooms. They all have individually controlled air conditioning and heating, and are prewired for cable TV. Some even have fireplaces. All have either balconies or patios.

"Renting is not, as people used to think, throwing out your money," says Kremer. "The appreciation of real estate in single-family homes is not as great as it was 10 or 15 years ago. Besides, if you could buy a home and have your taxes included and pay \$1,500 a month, the type of home you'd get would not be of this quality."

There are to be 420 units on the 60-acre property, which is divided by a wetland. A bridge will be built over the wetland to connect the two halves of the property. Building began in early 1989, and by the summer of 1989, apartments were being preleased before the building had even been completed.

"Now," says Kremer, "every week or two weeks a building turns over, and people move right in because they've been preleased." Kremer estimates that there are at least 200 families already living in the 220 completed units of phase one.

Kremer says about 10 percent of the apartments are three-bedroom townhouses and 5 percent are studios. The rest are divided between one and two bedrooms. The apartments come in three styles: Tudor, traditional and contemporary.

According to Kremer, one advantage of

preleasing is being able to choose from one of three colors of decor: beige, clay or gray. People not only select apartment style, but depending on the building, the coloration as well.

Tenants are encouraged to make their apartment their home. They can wallpaper or paint the walls however they like. However, they must revert the apartment to its original appearance or pay to have it done if they move. Should any problems arise, the manager and a maintenance supervisor live on the property year-round.

River Oaks West also offers corporate suites. There are seven available, ranging in price from \$1,500 a month for a one-bedroom apartment to \$1,800 for a two-bedroom. Unlike the residential units, the

corporate suites come furnished.

Kremer reveals that there is more to River Oaks West than just spacious apartments. "One of the major advantages of River Oaks is a 12,000-square-foot clubhouse. The clubhouse has a billiards and TV room, social room and a library area. Our lower level has a health club which the residents have 24-hour access to."

There is also a business center with a personal computer and typewriter available during business hours.

The health club includes an indoor pool and whirlpool, racquetball courts, exercise room, tanning rooms and saunas. There is also an outdoor pool with whirlpool as well as tennis courts and an expansive sun deck. The deck will feature

a juice bar and be the site of weekend barbecues during the warm months. The clubhouse is also handicap accessible.

Access to the clubhouse is obtained by the same computerized cards which admit tenants at the gatehouse at the front entrance. A guard is on duty 24 hours to announce and admit visitors.

Kremer estimates that all 420 units will be completed by spring of 1991. However, people will be able to start moving into phase two by November of this year. After River Oaks West is completed, Solomon Group plans to build another property in Rochester, where the original River Oaks is located.

River Oaks West is located on Novi Road between Nine and Ten Mile. The leasing center is open seven days a week. Call 348-7870.

## Ask right questions of your free-lancers

When looking for a qualified free-lance writer to help expand your company's word power, there are several questions you should ask. By doing so, you will help the two of you learn about each other's needs and work styles; you will also know whether you feel comfortable with the idea of doing business together.

"What are your writing qualifications?" is a basic question. But it isn't asked nearly as much as it should be by small business owners and managers. Even if you are familiar with the writer's previous work, ask about specific past training and experiences. Also ask for published samples that relate to your business or industry. Your writer should also provide you with references without being asked to do so.

Next, most free-lancers follow a formal planning process before beginning a given project. The "turn-around time" from start to finish may range for one to several weeks depending on the project's length and complexity. When asking about turnaround time, you must make your deadline dates clear to your free-lancer. He or she will be able to tell you if your project expectations are realistic.

If your project is complex, you might want to receive and approve it in stages. For example, you can ask the writer to submit a full outline before developing a first draft; or pre-

sent the layout before submitting any final revisions. This practice offers both you and your writer the opportunity to continue with the project or turn it over to someone else when and where appropriate.

The form of your final project may range from a very rough draft to a printed copy of your material. Regardless of the form you may request, your writer should be willing to produce as many rewrites as you require with adequate review time in between. If the free-lancer is unwilling to produce no more than three versions before calling it quits, you may want to search for assistance elsewhere.

Additional questions to ask relate to your writer's need for office space if appropriate, supplementary services offered (such as writing skills training, serving as project liaison between you and the members of your production team and market testing), contract requirements, out-of-pocket expenses and payment arrangements. If you have any other concerns, do not hesitate to discuss them before agreeing to a project.

## Employers face grads with high standards

Four out of five college students expect to change industries or careers during their work life, according to a study by Right Associates Inc., Southfield.

Almost half of those interviewed expect to start their own business, said Right Associates, a career management firm which surveyed 239 college students in 12 major cities across the United States.

"We think these findings present a unique dilemma for employers," said John Bourbeau, managing principal of the firm. "On the one hand, young people are ambitious. On the other hand, they expect to change jobs or start their own business if a job does not meet their immediate expectations."

"These findings indicate a significant new trend. Employers will have to find new and progressive ways to keep young people motivated and interested in working for their company."

Other highlights:

- Advancement and job challenges are the most important factors in selecting an employer.

- Approximately 70 percent expect to receive starting salaries of \$20,000 to \$30,000 annually. None expected less than \$15,000.

- More than 80 percent expect to be supervisors or managers within five years; one in four expects to be promoted to a supervisory or management position within one to two years.

- Banking, finance and communications are preferred industries for college students; marketing-sales is the most preferred assignment.

- Three out of four students plan to earn advanced degrees.

Bourbeau said recruiters and employers will need to design career development programs to meet the career aspirations of this new work force. "The impending labor crisis will make these activities even more important," Bourbeau said.

# THE GRILL OF YOUR DREAMS

## Pizza is possible on the grill

Remember when someone found a way to cook a roast on the manifold of a car? Next thing you knew, fish found their way into the dishwasher. What's next?

As far as Carl Oshinski, the well-known Pizza Gourmet, is concerned, it just wouldn't be summer without firing up the coals and preparing pizza — you guessed it — on the barbecue.

Pizza on the barbecue? "Why not?" claims local entrepreneur and pizza bon vivant Oshinski. "There's no sense heating up the kitchen on a sweltering summer day when a red-hot barbecue underneath a tall shade tree can do it with more flair, more taste and definitely, a cooler brow."

And, when it comes to pizzas, Carl Oshinski is truly the sole heir to the title "Pizza Gourmet." Many readers have probably seen Oshinski locally doing what he does best, making pizza, in local kitchen shops. In addition, he does in-home pizza catering.

But his greatest claim to fame is his syndicated "Pizza Gourmet" series, shown nationally on PBS. Couple that with a best-selling pizza cookbook and a "Pizza Gourmet" line of equipment hawking the likes of pizza stones and pizza pans, and you've got the makings of a true Pizza Gourmet.

This lover of the pizza works 16-hour days representing himself and his goods. So when does he find time to cook pizza on a backyard grill?

"I make the time because I love the product," Oshinski said. Seems he first saw a barbecued backyard pizza at a restaurant in Providence, R.I., called "Lucky's."

"I liked what I tasted, especially the smokiness of the crust," Oshinski said. "Then, think about the fact that all your sauces and toppings can be kept hot right at your fingertips."

So, back in June, Oshinski tried out his idea at the St. Francis/Sara Fisher Benefit and walked away with rave reviews from those in attendance.

The secret, according to Oshinski, is the use of a standard pizza dough with a double baking technique. After the dough is rolled and tossed, it is lightly greased and thrown on a white-hot grill. The white-hot coals are essential because, according to the pizza gourmet, you want to bake it as fast as you can, as hot as you can.

Then you brush the top lightly with oil and give it a flip with the tongs. Layer on the sauce, the cheese and your favorite toppings and voila — a barbecued pizza!

Having sampled Oshinski's grilled pizza at both the benefit and at a recent tasting in Hines Park, we can report that the taste is out of this world. The grilling makes for a chewier dough with a drier crust. The texture is a cross between what Keith Farnie and Ed Janos (of Too Keiz in Novi) are doing to pizzas and the flavored crust pizzas from Hungry Howies.

Chefs Farnie and Janos have mastered the art of bistro pizzas, opting for a thinner, almost cracker-like crust that makes for an interesting texture, coupled with the sauces and

toppings. If you've yet to try one of the flavored crusts at Hungry Howies (with locations all around town) they offer crusts flavored with butter, cheese, poppyseeds and a few other combinations.

Carl Oshinski's barbecued pizza combines both of these worlds. Imagine barbecuing a chicken breast or two, then roasting some red and green peppers over the hot coals until their skins peel. The dough is lightly greased and then tossed onto a hot grill.

A sizzle erupts, sending wisps of delicate smoke and penetrating the crust. Oshinski said he has gotten excellent results by tossing wet mesquite, flavored hardwoods and herbs on the hot coals just before the dough. Practical pizza lovers could then use an ordinary sauce, but Oshinski recommends a subtle brushing of a premium, bottled bar-

becue sauce for an added dimension.

Dice up the chicken breast, toss on the chopped peppers and smother with a couple of handfuls of mozzarella and let the party begin.

The Pizza Gourmet offers these timely tips for enjoying what's left of the outdoor pizza barbecuing season:

- For the first-time pizza barbecuer, double the dough and make a few "test" pizzas so that you can get the hang of what a white hot grill can do to a thin hunk of dough.

- Do as much on the grill as possible first. Heat your sauces, precook your toppings, roast the vegetables, etc. Brush as much of the grill as you can, then lightly wipe with oil before adding the crust. Most important, cook it hot and fast.

- Don't worry about the dough falling through the grill. If you started with a good dough it will firm up immediately. Keep a pair of tongs handy

for flipping and positioning.

- Maintain a uniform thickness for the dough: 1/4 inch throughout is what the pizza gourmet suggests. Forget the clock. Look for visible signs of doneness like grid markings and brown edges. If it gets too hot, use tongs to position the dough over lower heat.

For the less adventuresome, Oshinski also recommends that you cook pizzas in a pan on a covered grill. Assemble the pizza as you normally would, but instead of firing up the oven, light up the coals. As mentioned before, the secret is cooking it hot and fast.

## Burger: more than just ground meat

Whatever your budget, whatever your schedule, whatever the occasion, you can rely on hamburger to fill the bill. And what better time to talk burgers than barbecue time.

Few cuts of meat have as much going for them — or you — as hamburger. As far as most of us are concerned, "hamburger" is just another word for ground beef. There is, however, a distinction. And this distinction is one that you should know about when it comes to the shopping scene.

Federal laws specify the amount of fat permitted in various types of ground beef, so it really is the amount of fat (or conversely, the amount of lean) that will determine the label (see sidebar).

Anyone who has made the trip past the ground beef section of the grocery store or butcher shop has quite a choice between burgers. Do you want hamburger, ground beef, ground chuck, ground round, ground sirloin, ground turkey, or, even now, ground chicken?

"A burger is a burger," you say? Ah, but did you know that certain varieties of meat make a better burger? Yep. For a juicy, broiled or grilled burger, your choice should be either ground beef or ground chuck. The amount of fat in both types allow the burgers to baste themselves as they cook. If you prefer to choose leaner cuts, you will probably end up with a less-juicy patty. But, remember the more fat, the greater the shrinkage.

Ground chuck and ground round are usually reserved for casseroles and other main dish entrees, although the fattier cuts work just as well providing they can be drained of excess fat after the meat has been browned.

Preparing burgers on the grill isn't easy as choosing the proper cuts of meat. There are a few tricks that can help turn this summer's barbecue into one that will surely be remembered by all.

First off, let's talk about the grill. There are many schools of thought when it comes to choosing grills. Coal fired or gas, lava rock or mesquite? We've tried them all and, as far as we're concerned, you just can't beat the old charcoal briquettes on an open grill.

If you have yet to get the "old faithful" out from the garage amidst last summer's put-aways, now is the perfect time to clean it up and get it ready for the weekend. Remove any old ash and dead coals. Window cleaners and a pile of hot, soapy water, combined with a little old-fashioned elbow grease are the best defense against a dirty grill.

If the grill grid still bears last summer's food build up, an easy way to clean it is to place the grid in a plastic bag and add three cups of household ammonia. Tie the bag up and place on a flat surface in direct sunlight. Within two hours, the ammonia will have done its job, and the grid should pretty much wipe clean.

Be sure to rinse the grid well with a garden hose to remove any and all ammonia residues. To keep the grid easy to clean and to help make it virtually stick-free, a light spraying of Pam or other food-release agents, or a healthy brushing of an old rag dipped in vegetable oil will leave an easy-clean coating.

Now that the burgers have been formed and the grill is cleaned and ready to roll, remember that your choice of charcoal will directly affect the overall outcome. When it comes to purchasing charcoal, you get what you pay for. Cheaper briquettes made from sawdust fillers are OK, but you just can't beat the heat and staying quality of a good hardwood charcoal.

You can ignite the coals in costly containers available at most seasonal shops, but an old, empty three-pound coffee can with both ends removed works just as well. Igniting the coals this way will make for evenly heated coals and will prohibit cool spots when cooking.

You might be interested in the kitchen magazine compiled by the fabled Cooks report (July/August 1989) which states, "If you like the flavor of wood smoke in food, stick to wood chips that will produce a strongly scented smoke: mesquite, hickory, maple and oak. If you like the taste of herbs on quickly grilled foods, chop and rub them into the food. Don't sprinkle them on the coals."

For grilling the best burgers in town, after the coals have been heated throughout to a fiery orange glow, disperse them evenly throughout the bottom of a foil-lined grill, with the shiny side the foil looking at you. This serves two purposes: first, to help make clean-up so much easier and, second, to reflect heat upward from the foil, therefore cooking your burgers more effectively.

Lining the grill grids with foil before cooking will only result in burgers "frying in their own grease."

In all honesty, however, Momma always packs a roll of foil for campsite or park barbecues to cover the grids because "God only knows what's been on there before you arrived."

Our next suggestion for the best burgers will surely provoke some controversy. Personally speaking, when we grill foods high in fat content (like burgers), we always place an old, shallow, cake pan under the burgers so that when the fat begins to cook out of the burgers, it can be "caught" without landing on the hot coals.

There are two reasons for doing this. First, it makes clean-up so much easier. Second, it eliminates dangerous fire flare-ups that have been known to turn a grill into a roaring campfire, turning the best burgers into blackened cow-chip look-alikes.

Speaking of fire flare-ups, it is always recommended that you keep a clean squirt bottle filled with ordinary water or broth within arm's reach to quench any sudden fires that might start from the grease released during cooking.

When it comes to recommended cooking times for burgers, the only judge is a chef's gut-level instinct. There are so many variables — from how hot the fire is to the thickness and temperature of the burgers — that naming an exact cooking time is difficult, even for an expert.

As a general rule, when the coals just begin to get a gray dust after being red hot, that is the time to begin cooking. Typically, a one-inch-thick burger will take about four minutes for rare, five minutes for medium rare, six minutes for medium (still with some slight pink in the center), seven minutes for burgers cooked through but still juicy, and eight minutes or more for a well-done burger.

If everyone in the family requests burgers of different doneness, it's best to "stack" them like pancakes when desired doneness is achieved. This will dramatically slow the cooking process without allowing them to overcook, and still be piping hot.

Everyone has his or her own favorite additions to hamburger. Whether it be a simple shot of Worcestershire or a shake or two of a secret seasoning, you can create a burger so tempting and delicious you will have all the neighbors wishing for an invite.

Why spend an evening slaving over a hot stove when a grill, a lawn chair and a six-pack of your favorite brew is all that's truly necessary to make the best burgers in town?

# Tempranillo: Spain's softer grape

Due north of Madrid and 74 miles southwest of Rioja in central Spain lies a growing region stretching for 30 miles along the upper Duero Valley known as Ribera del Duero.

Here, the deeply colored tempranillo grape grows at elevations of more than 2,500 feet. Grapes nurtured by intensely hot days and long, cool nights are not harvested until mid-October. Nowhere else does tempranillo achieve such high concentration while maintaining good acid balance.

Adega Fernandez, owner/winemaker at Bodegas Tinto Pesquera, is the master of the tempranillo. His skill with this grape produces wines of power, richness and body. "Tempranillo grows throughout Spain, but its ideal, true home is the upper Duero Valley," Fernandez explains.

"In the Duero, the wine is 100 percent tempranillo, whereas in Rioja it must be blended with high-acid white grapes to balance the characteristic low acidity of tempranillo grown there."

"Many of the world's great wine regions produce cabernet sauvignon and merlot. These varieties tend to dominate their origins rather than reflect them. Tempranillo wines mirror the 'terroir' in Ribera del Duero."

Varietally, tempranillo is comparable to pinot noir rather than cabernet sauvignon. The wine has good tannins, but the grape itself is not astringent, exhibiting the softness of a good merlot.

Our personal favorite is the 1987 Tinto Pesquera (See Wine Selections of the Week), but the 1988 and 1989 are showing excellent promise, according to Fernandez. If you get hooked on the 1987, don't worry. The best may still be on its way. The 1986 Reserva Pesquera (\$26) boasts berries, spice, cedar and licorice aromas followed by full, broad, palate warmth and a spicy finish.

Sherry is a wine name most Americans recognize but few really understand. Richly sweet and dark amber, cream sherries represent our common conception, but there is a world of dry wine that has not been generally discovered.

Sherry production differs from the way most white wines is made. The light, white juice is fermented in barrels where it reaches 12-16 percent natural alcohol. It is then fortified with spirits, adjusting its strength to 15-18 percent depending on the desired quality and flavor characteristics.

After fortification, sherry's unique aging process begins. Not all barrels of wine develop in quite the same way. The essential difference is that some develop a floating yeast known as "flor" and others do not. The finest, most delicate sherries are blessed with this creamy surface yeast and are only lightly fortified to maintain their inherent finesse.

"Flor" grows to a depth of several inches. Because it floats on the surface, it naturally protects the wine from air and the dangers of oxidation.

This protective cap that excludes oxygen explains the pale color of the light, elegant sherries known as "finos."

These wines are ready to drink at an earlier age than the darker, heavier sherry styles. Age is not indicated on the bottle because the product is blended to maintain consistent flavors.

The blending method in the sherry region employs a "solera." It consists of several rows of barrels stacked on top of one another. At bottling time, a portion of the bottom barrels is removed for bottling. The barrels are refilled with a portion of wine from the level above. The top row is refreshed with wine from the most recent harvest.

Once a "fino" sherry is removed from barrel and the protection of the "flor," its color begins to deepen and the flavor broadens as it matures. Called "amontillado," the wine develops a deep amber color as it ages. Intense nutty flavors develop and it becomes rich and concentrated.

Juan Luis Hidalgo produces dry, delicate, bone-dry sherry in Sanlucar de Barrameda on Spain's Southern coast. His specialty is "manzanilla," an elegant fino sherry made possible by humid Atlantic air and a complex "flor" which not only protects the wine in the barrel from oxidation but develops a toasty bouquet.

The pale, dry Manzanilla La Gitana (the gypsy woman) (\$8) is Vinicola Hidalgo's flagship wine.

## Butcher case guide

If the variety of burger meat available at the butcher is a mystery to you, it's not surprising. The U.S. Department of Agriculture standards governing meat labeling are quite complicated. To help you learn the differences, here's the simplified version in plain English (compared to the 19 pages the USDA uses to identify the differences).

- **HAMBURGER:** Any ground beef bearing this label can legally contain up to 30 percent fat. This fat may consist of the natural fat attached to the beef, plus "loose" beef fat from the trimming process.
- **GROUND BEEF:** This is where it gets a little confusing. The amount of fat allowed under the law also may be 30 percent fat. The big difference between ground beef and hamburger is that ground beef can contain only the fat attached to the beef. No other fat may be added to reach the 30 percent ratio. Thus, the fat content of meat labeled ground beef is usually less than 30 percent.
- **GROUND CHUCK:** This meat is really lean ground beef bearing approximately 20 percent fat.
- **GROUND ROUND:** This extra-lean ground beef usually contains about 15 percent fat.
- **GROUND SIRLOIN:** This is what most restaurants call ground steak, supposedly containing between 10-12 percent fat.
- **GROUND TURKEY AND GROUND CHICKEN:** These products combine both the white and dark meat of the fowl, combined with usually no more than 15 percent fat, usually from the ground skin.

## River Front Theatre

### Venue draws top reviews

As the sun sets, an orange glow is cast over the concrete edifice. The Detroit River splashes along against backstage as cabin cruisers bob in the waves. A cool breeze off the water makes shirt sleeves rustle.

The sights of summer, sure. But at Chene Park's Riverfront Music Theatre you get the sounds of the season as well.

But that almost seems secondary as the view at the Detroit city park is stunning at first.

The outdoor amphitheater has reopened this summer, featuring a busy schedule of pop, jazz, classical and blues music.

Diverse acts such as Jimmy Cliff and Fela, Freddie Jackson, Najee, Little Feat, Frankie Valli and the Four Seasons, B.B. King and John Hiatt have performed. Free concerts with Detroit Brass Society and Summer Jazz are also offered.

The final act of the summer will be this weekend when Cameo takes the stage on Sept. 8 at 8 p.m.

All of those acts perform against the backdrop of the Detroit River and the city of Windsor beyond, offering certainly the most panoramic of views for outdoor concert goers. Chene Park has 5,500 seats.

"First of all, we are a much smaller, intimate facility," said Kathy Haberthur, marketing and public relations director of the Riverfront Music Theatre. "Also, we have nearly 50 percent of our shows free to the

public."

Chene Park has other upgraded features, keeping the music listener in mind. A new canopy hovers over the amphitheater so inclement weather is not a problem.

On our visit, we checked out other important features like concessions, restrooms, the vantage points and overall comfort of the facility.

Of the latter, we stood on the last blade of the lawn behind the pavilion for the recent Najee show at Riverfront Music Theatre.

Remarkably, the view of the stage was unobstructed and close enough that binoculars are only an option — not a necessity. Acoustically, the subtleties of the jazz music being played were highly audible.

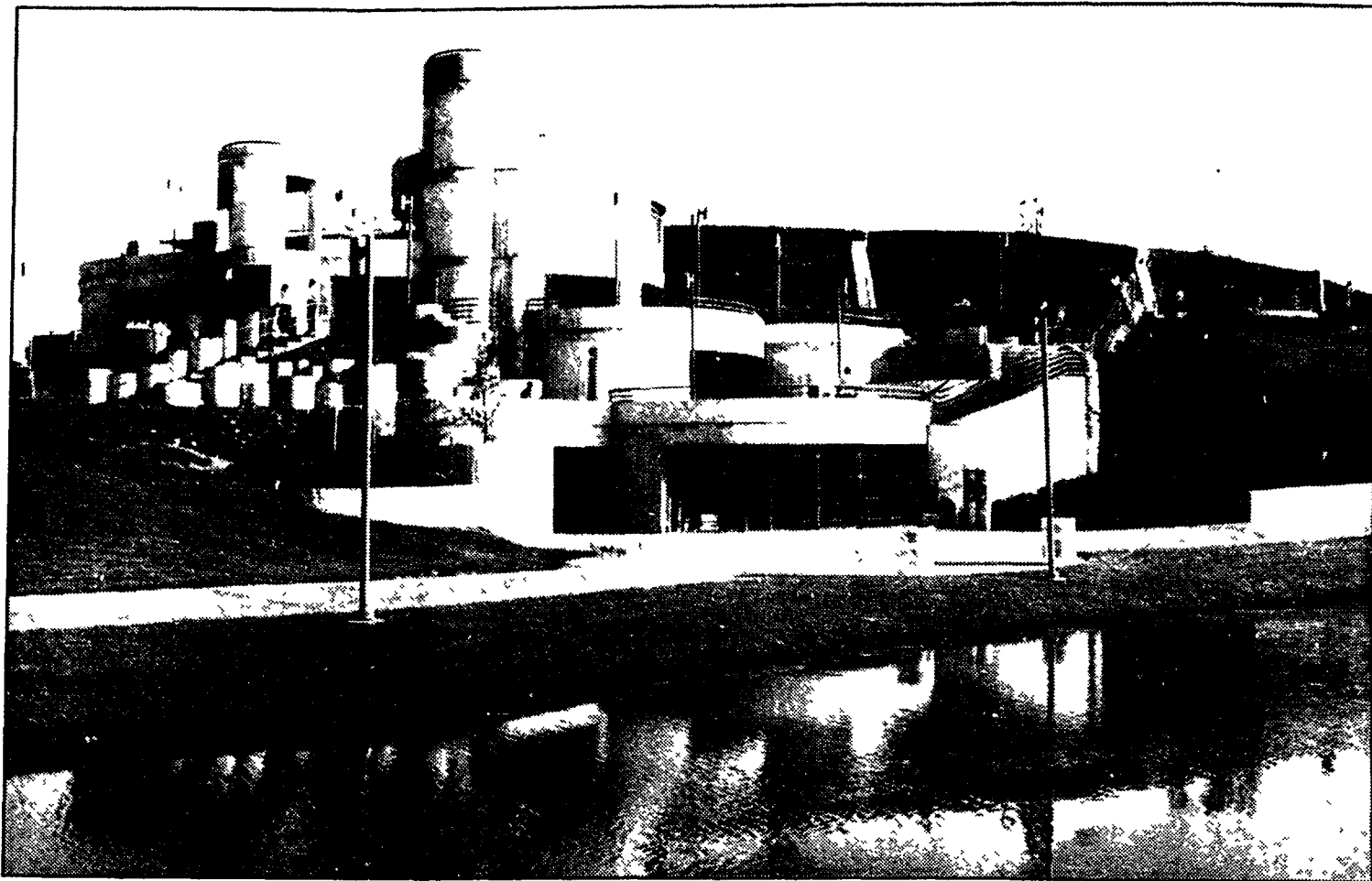
We moved down to the bleacher section, which includes 14 rows of benches that sit behind the chair-back seats, and found the view and acoustics splendid as well.

A plush section of lawn veers down the right side of the facility, providing another excellent viewing spot.

On our subsequent return for the John Hiatt/Little Feat double bill, we took up shop on the grass. Again, the sound was excellent as Hiatt and crew burned through their set.

Both the bleachers and the section of lawn on the right side of the stage will be replaced by chair seating next summer, according to Haberthur.

The choice seating up front features metal lawn furniture-type

chairs with wire-mesh backing. The aisles are wide enough to allow for two-way traffic.

The only crowd is at the concession stand in the upper area of the facility. Our wait in line took only a few minutes.

The standard fare includes kosher franks (\$2.50), hot dogs (\$1.75), cheese and cracker snack plates (\$3), chicken picnic baskets (\$4.25) and popcorn (\$1.25). Soft drinks were \$1.50 for a regular, \$2 for a large.

Budweiser was sold at separate stands — \$3.75 for 24 ounces and \$2.75 for 14 ounces.

Restroom facilities were clean and uncrowded, although the theatre was only half-full when we attended.

Parking in a gravel lot in front of Chene Park is an additional \$3.

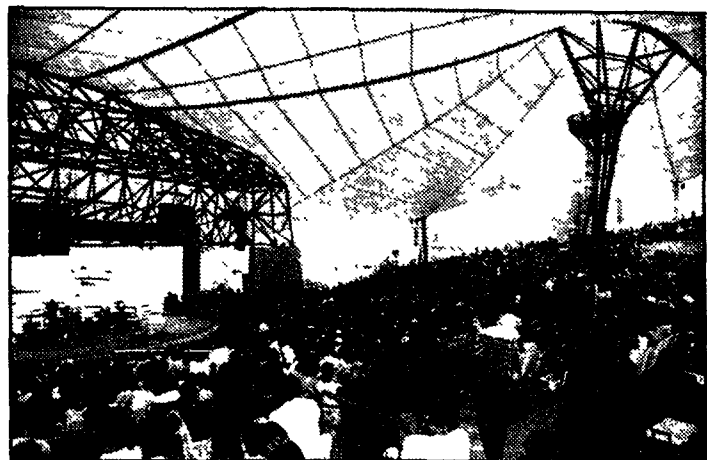

## New offerings have world view

Two documentaries about areas crucial to world peace, areas of major significance on the international scene — the Middle East and Indo-China (Laos, Cambodia and Vietnam) — are now available for home video viewers.

They are "Israel's Shattered Dream" (1987, color, no rating, 173 minutes) and "Peter Jennings Reporting From the Killing Fields" (1990, color, no rating, 150 minutes).

The first, "Israel's Shattered Dream," is in English, Hebrew and Arabic with subtitles for those last two languages. It is a much-touted British documentary film, directed by Victor Schonfeld and produced by him and Jennifer Milestone. Unfortunately, both politically and cinematically, it falls short of its highly touted critical assessments.

"Shattered Dream" is a confused jumble of historical footage, current interviews and contemporary actuality shots with voice-over commentary by Jack Klaff. In this context, "current" and "contemporary" presumably mean just prior to its 1987 release. The fact that viewers must assume that and have absolutely no way of knowing when the historical footage was shot is a fatal flaw for a documentary which pretends to deal accurately with issues.

As any filmgoer will testify, images may be arranged and rearranged to prove almost anything. Seen any good science fiction lately?

"Shattered Dream" is guilty of not dating its materials which, in our rapidly changing world, makes all the difference. As well, the film fails to identify personalities or issues clearly. Even for viewers well-versed in Israeli politics, it's a struggle to sort out the details of this long, often repetitious documentary.

"Peter Jennings Reporting From the Killing Fields" is an MPI Home Video Presentation of an ABC News Production which originally aired in April on the 15th anniversary of the U.S. withdrawal from Vietnam. The video cassette jacket is mislabeled and there's a real bonus on this tape — the 50-minute ABC News special is followed by a fascinating 100 minutes — "ABC News-Time Forum: Beyond Vietnam."

Originally broadcast after the 11 p.m. news the same night as the Jennings special, it's the sort of program that's hard to watch late at night. Hence,

MPI Video performs a valuable service by making it available for viewers to watch at their leisure.

The premise here — and quite well-developed — is that the U.S. government is still fighting the Vietnam War even though that means supporting — directly or indirectly — Pol Pot and the Khmer Rouge. The world seems to have forgotten that these criminals killed at least a million of their own people, the Cambodians, in the mid-'70s after the U.S. left Vietnam.

This genocide was detailed in Sidney Schanberg's Pulitzer Prize-winning New York Times story about his Cambodian photographer, Dith Pran. That story later became an Oscar-winning film, "The Killing Fields." Despite all this, the U.S. government supports the Khmer Rouge in order to continue the battle against the Vietnamese.

That premise and the background of the Indo-Chinese conflict is well-defined in the Jennings News Special. The "Forum" which follows is even more fascinating with an incredible collection of personalities in the studio discussing the issues.

It's a fascinating, carefully moderated exchange that, with Jennings' documentary, ought to be required viewing in every American school.

## Tim Allen sees comedy star rise

The comedic star of Birmingham's Tim Allen has risen faster than the old Saturn rockets that took men to the moon — and at about the same incredible rate of speed.

Last month Allen took his "Men Are Pigs" act to Kalamazoo, home of Western Michigan University — his alma mater. The overriding purpose of the visit, however, was not to retrace any past scholastic steps.

Allen and a complete production crew were there to film his first solo Showtime comedy special, which is scheduled to air in September.

"It was phenomenally successful," Allen said from a hotel room in Montreal recently, where he was participating in the International Comedy Festival. He served as a sort of comic color commentator on Showtime for some of the event's activities and performed a set in the big Saturday spectacular — along with Bob Newhart.

Upon his return to Detroit, the busy Allen will complete work on his portion of a local television project called "The Funny Side of the Street." A production of RE: Comedy (Mark Ridley of the Comedy Castle and Robert Elrick, a local television man who produced the syndicated show "Hot Fudge") in association with WJBK-TV, the show is currently set to hit the Channel 2 airwaves in September.

If that isn't enough, Allen also confessed from his Montreal hotel room that he has inked a deal with Disney that could lead to a major television network series in the future.

"I've got a development deal going,"

Allen said. "They're going to develop a sitcom around me."

"We were very specific about what we wanted. (The concept of) 'Men Are Pigs' at home. Somewhere between 'Roseanne' and 'The Cosby Show.' A loving family, not a hostile thing like 'Married... with Children.' Just a very unusual dad. They (the Disney people) were very amiable to that."

Any resulting series from this infant arrangement is still far off, however, so Allen keeps doing what he does best — making people laugh themselves sick in clubs across the country. He also tries to keep a close eye on his growing fame in an effort to maintain a solid grip on his life in Michigan. He seems determined not to get too lost in the sea of fame.

"My career is like I'm riding a stagecoach," Allen said. "It's moving along. I've got a pretty fair set of steeds, and I don't want them getting out of hand. I don't want them running me to death. Could I stop this thing if I wanted to?"

Allen has managed to get this far on the road to comedy superstardom without having to leave Birmingham — and he has a few reasons for wanting to keep it that way.

"I want to raise my little girl in Michigan," Allen said.

His other reasons for staying were much more in keeping with the macho handyman persona he maintains on stage — and to some extent, life.

"I like getting back (from the road) and mowing my lawn and cleaning out the gutters. It keeps things in perspective."

Discovery Channel presents probe of sunken ship filled with treasures

On September 12, 1857, the S.S. *Central America* sank 200 miles off the Carolina coast. The ship carried more than 500 passengers and three tons of gold.

On Sunday, Sept. 9, almost 133 years to date, The Discovery Channel will air *Treasures Of A Lost Voyage*, an exploration of the recovery of the S.S. *Central America* and the country's richest treasure-trove.

The S.S. *Central America* set sail from Panama on Sept. 3, 1857 with a group of 49ers and their California gold rush fortunes, when on the sixth day of the voyage, the ship was besieged by a fierce hurricane. Passengers and crew, in vain, bailed the rising waters for 30 hours in an attempt to save the ship. In the 18 minutes after the ship began to sink it had drifted a mile-and-a-half under the sea.

The two-hour Discovery Channel special will include documentary footage of the original vessel, its 1986

discovery, and hi-tech salvage effort by a crew called the Columbus America Discovery Group. Its members will likely get to keep nearly a billion dollars in loot.

Highlighting the recovery efforts will be an underwater robot called "Nemo," developed to lift salvage up from the crushing depths and extreme cold of the ocean floor. Co-host Doug McConnel will narrate the documentary from the recovery vessel. Morris Jones via satellite will introduce segments about the California Gold Rush era; the ship's captain, William Lewis Herndon, whose writings on the Amazon influenced writer Mark Twain; and the legal battles surrounding ownership of the treasure.

Scientists, oceanographers, marine biologists and ocean engineers are currently studying the wreck site to determine the biological, chemical and physical nature of the sea. To date they have isolated at least three new marine species.

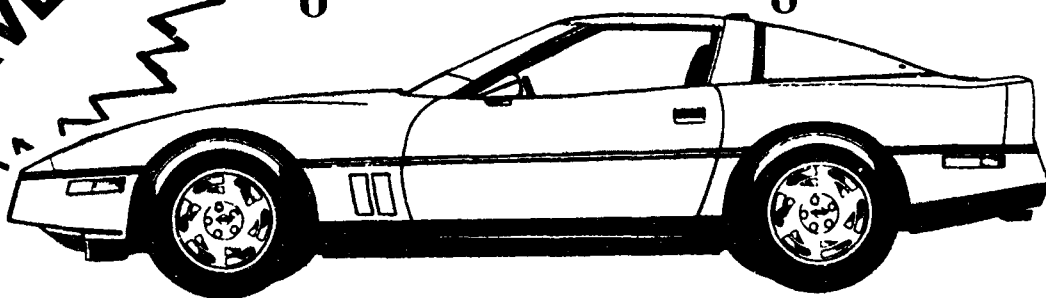

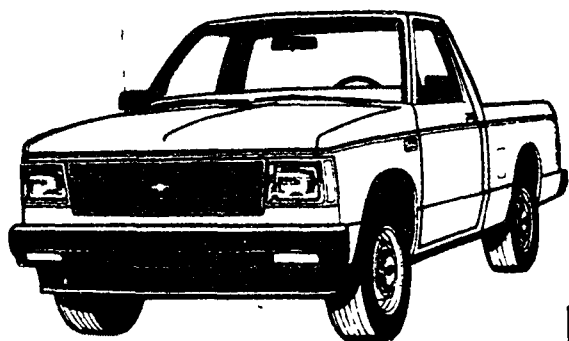

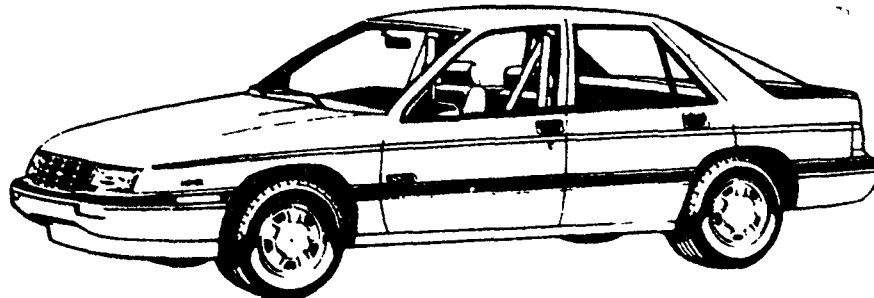

# Cable Comments

It never fails; Turn a home video camera on the most trained television professional and

they turn into a waving tonguetied doll who manages to get silly and yell out, "Hi, Mom!"

A similar phenomena occurs on the set in Community Television. Many a spirited personality becomes docile, dry of mouth and an epicure of one word answers.

Enough of this nonsense, let us guide you into the world of the talented talent. How a show is planned has much to do with the behavior of the talent. When and when not to look at the camera is always a quandry and some general guidelines are advisable. An in-studio shoot is a controlled environment in which the stage may be neatly set and plans usually run as expected. When in a multicamera shoot and in a conversational set up, participants should let the camera find them. The host looks for specific direction from a 'floor manager' whose role is to help direct the talent to the 'hot' camera so that transitions in and out of the body of the program will be accurate and crisp.

Another type of tv show would necessitate looking straight into the camera. News format and documentaries are the most common examples. Once again the floor director is a key component for the talent to correctly switch from one camera to another.

A remote (on-location) setting requires even more concentration from the talent and a significantly greater ability to 'go with the flow.' This type of shoot is full of distractions including

weather conditions, location changes and multitudes of 'other curious folk' gathering around.

A one on one interview at the site of a new service or event calls for the host to have a prepared dialogue pertaining to the information to be shared. This ideally should be collaborated upon before hand. Even though details are premeditated the conversation should be spontaneous. An on-location environment lends itself to colorful visuals which, if a little though is put into it, will also be a reinforcement to the subject at hand.

The talent takes instructions from many different sources. Having the savvy to remain composed and the ability to concentrate on the subject is a skill well worth marketing. A personal style and self confidence is a foundation on which the television viewer relies to determine whether or not they keep watching the show.

If you have the chance to appear on television, remember one's personal style takes concentration. Become thoughtful of who you are and what you believe in and what platform you stand for. Remember, television is a visual and audio medium. The combination strongly affects the television viewers senses at a gut level. You have only a couple of seconds to give a good impression of yourself.

Knowing subject matter and understanding the expectations of your host, the director of the television shoot and the producer of the entire event will help you feel settled.

Even though I emphasize the importance of being prepared, please note that knowing too much about your guest can take the zip out of your natural curiosity. As a successful inter-

viewer and talent, it is crucial to really be interested in your guests and listen to them with curiosity and a readiness to learn. This enables you to actually develop a relationship with your television audience. So many times people have commented to me that when they were watching one of my interviews that I asked a question of the guest that they had just thought about. Frankly, these feedbacks were the nicest compliments I ever had. For it meant that the true intent of the show was accomplished.

Personal style also lends itself to grooming and mannerisms. We have often heard 'dress for success'. I have found that a successful formula is to dress so that you are most comfortable and feel that you look your best. There are technical considerations regarding color. Camera lens are sensitive to vibrant reds and stark whites or other shiny dazzling colors. They become alive and seem to add dimension to your size. Consider also the color and texture of the background. Do not blend in. For example beige on beige will zero you out. Black hair in front of a black curtain will need a contrasting hairpiece or another prop to add contrast. Backlighting also is an effective solution and is also very kind to one's face. Avoid severe patterns as the camera lens go nuts with these. Also, the camera likes to add poundage. Counter such by wearing a more contoured outfit rather than a layered one.

I could go on and on. However the most important television and radio message is 'perception, perception, perception'. If you prepare, try, believe and then behave the way you want to be perceived, this is exactly the person who will be seen as the 'talented talent!'



# Networks try new concepts

The new fall season is the time when the networks try out new concepts on their viewers. Well, this season is no different, as it offers a variety of departures from television's norm.

Sure there is the tried-and-true sitcom formula, and many of the shows that are premiering conform to that mold. But then there are the more daring shows that will either make it or break it based on their efforts to be different.

As for controversy, turn to CBS' "Uncle Buck." Parents once warned you to stay away from uncles like this, and they probably still should. Kevin Meaney plays Buck, an ill-mannered, irreverent uncle who has become the head of his late brother's household. The street-smart uncle means to do well by the three kids, but the sassy language used in the series suggests otherwise. Uncle Buck would win parental approval if he exerted a little more discipline toward his young charges.

NBC's "Hull High" is high on the

list of controversy as well. Although press releases euphemistically describe "Hull High" as a "musical comedy, set in a contemporary high school, with an unique format that stylistically blends drama, humor, dance and irreverent humor," one word really sums up the show: "sex." Among the characters are a popular American history teacher, a "really" popular (not to mention sex-y) English teacher, and "inquisitive" students.

The show with the most unusual new format is a toss up between ABC's "Cop Rock" and NBC's "Lifestories."

Reminiscent of the old Doris Day movies when she would suddenly burst into song and a full orchestra would accompany her, Steven Bochco creates another breakthrough series juxtaposing the raw and gritty world of inner city law enforcement with songs and elaborate musical production numbers, ranging from rock to rap to ballads. Part opera, part rock concert and part intense police drama, the series is definitely a "breakthrough." One mem-

orable scene takes place in a courtroom when the jury is suddenly transformed into a blue robe-clad gospel singing choir, bathed in a heavenly light, as they render their verdict. Who said there is never anything new on television? Try it, you may like it.

"Lifestories" is peculiar in its own way. The one-hour medical anthology series dramatized how people respond to an illness, both physically and emotionally. And like real life, the stories don't always have a happy ending. The show traces patients' lives from the time they find out about their disease until they are cured or die. Graphic biological film footage is interspersed throughout the dramatization to show the progression of the disease clinically, while actors demonstrate the emotional impact.

And finally, as the other networks are experimenting with new shows, FOX is experimenting with a new lineup, expanding its schedule to Saturday mornings and five nights a week (Thursday through Sunday), as opposed to three.

## Corky a good conflict role on CBS' 'Murphy Brown'

### Faith Ford understands kookiness of Corky

Faith Ford had just returned from a grueling day of filming when I spoke with her earlier this year.

But it wasn't a segment of *Murphy Brown* that she had just completed, it was a short program about the local crawfish industry in her home state of Louisiana that will air sometime this fall on cable.

That same kind of downhome quality can be found in Corky Sherwood, Ford's character on the popular *Murphy Brown*, returning to Monday nights on CBS for its third season.

Ford is not nearly as hyper, and certainly not as whiny, as her character of Corky, but she has a good understanding of the role, having been reared in the Deep South. In fact, she has been nominated her second year in a row for an Emmy as Best Supporting Actress in a comedy series.

"I like the fact that she's larger than life. She's just completely different publicly than anybody you know, yet she comes out with things that I've seen growing up in my life," Ford said. "She's very Southern and I find that very funny, I think Southern people are very eccentric, and they don't realize that they are."

When she first took the role, Ford

feared Corky was going to amount to little more than another ditzy blonde. But executive producer Diane English soon put her fears to rest, and now Corky is beginning to get a backbone, even around her role model, Murphy Brown. Yet much of her courage is simply innocence, and that is Corky's charm.

"She's a conflict character, a character who's always in a major conflict

with Murphy or whoever it might be, which is also interesting to play," Ford said. "I just think she says what comes off the top of her mind. She always means well, no matter what she says."

This week CBS repeats last season's finale, where Corky is set to marry a man she's known only a couple of weeks.

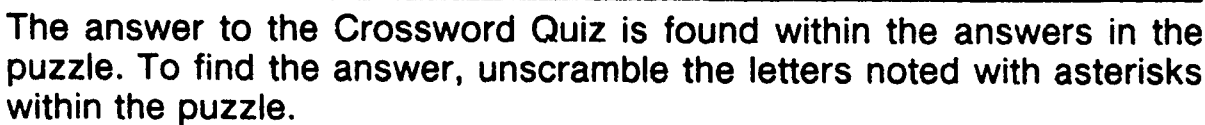

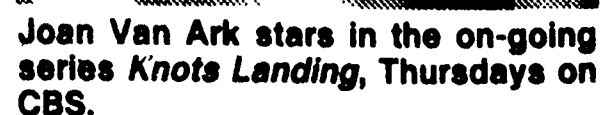

**Q: Could you tell me some things about the late Irene Ryan who played Granny on The Beverly Hillbillies? I have never seen or read anything about her life and am just curious to know whatever you could tell me such as: when and where she was born, previous acting background, if she was married and any children, how old she was when the series debuted and her age when she passed away. —Thomas Colvin, Vidalia, Ga.**

**A:** Irene Ryan was born Irene Rior-dan, Oct. 17, 1903, in El Paso, Texas.

Her career began at the age of 11 when she won an amateur contest on a San Francisco stage. Since then she had a notable career as a headliner in vaudeville, radio, motion pictures, nightclubs and television. She starred with her husband, Tim Ryan, in their own radio series, *The Tim And Irene Ryan Show*. The act and the marriage split up in 1942. During the war years she entertained servicemen with the USO, returning to Hollywood after the war as a character player in many Hollywood films. At age 59 she was cast as the pipe-smoking Granny

Clampett. Irene Ryan became a millionaire through investments and savings of the money she earned portraying Granny. She had no heir and used her estate to establish a foundation that provides scholarships to noteworthy theater art students. She passed away on April 26, 1973, at the age of 70.
