## Haller plans to keep land

Former township resident Frieda Haller last week declined a township request for a property donation. Supervisor Georgina Goss said Friday.

Haller said she would not extend a letter of intent that pledged 72 acres to the township in return for construction of a memorial library on the Six Mile and Sheldon site.

Haller's letter of intent expires at the end of this month.

Goss said Haller felt "very hurt" by some of the comments directed at her during the township's campaign to finance a \$6.9-million,

44,800-square-foot library.

The plan sparked controversy throughout the Northville community as citizens debated cost, size and location of the library.

Township voters on May 1 defeated a proposal to build and equip a library on the Haller land.

"Her exact words were that she doesn't want to deal with that issue at this time," Goss said. "She was very hurt by some of the comments in the paper."

"Some of the things that were said apparently caused her a great deal of emotional pain and stress."

Goss said she called Haller to discuss an intent-letter extension. She said she was also prepared to ask

Haller to donate a smaller parcel that could find future use as recreation fields, township buildings, or a possible library facility.

The conversation was not entirely negative, Goss said.

"Her initial reaction was, 'It's over,'" she said. "Then she said she was taking a trip abroad and she would talk about it when she returns."

Goss said Haller did not tell her when she was scheduled to return from her trip.

"She seemed to shut the door and then open it a crack."

Haller was not available for comment Friday.

## Schools' millage vote is Thursday

Northville Public Schools will ask voters to approve a 1.28-mill increase for one year Thursday.

The district needs \$885,000 to prevent program cuts and staff reductions.

Northville was among several out-of-formula school districts that lost state funding for Social Security payments and other programs when the state passed the School Aid Act in July. The state made the cuts in an effort to equalize state funding for school districts.

The increase will cost the owner of a \$200,000 home \$128.

If the millage does not pass, cuts will be implemented on Oct. 15, including the elimination of 22 teachers and all athletic programs except varsity sports.

## Chamber endorses proposal

The Northville Community Chamber of Commerce, often silent in the past on political issues, has voted to support a 1.28-mill increase that Northville Public Schools will ask voters to approve Thursday.

In an 8-2 vote the chamber board decided that a healthy educational system benefits the local business

community, said Greg Spinazze, chamber secretary.

"We feel that the quality of education lends not only to the residential climate but to the business climate," Spinazze said.

In its 1989-90 goals session, the chamber decided to begin taking positions on issues of local importance.

## County OKs land sale

Veteran Northville Township residents may find it hard to believe, but the county land deal is finally done.

The Wayne County Commission on Thursday shook hands with members of Huntington Falls Limited Partnership and unanimously approved the sale of 926 acres of county property in Northville Township.

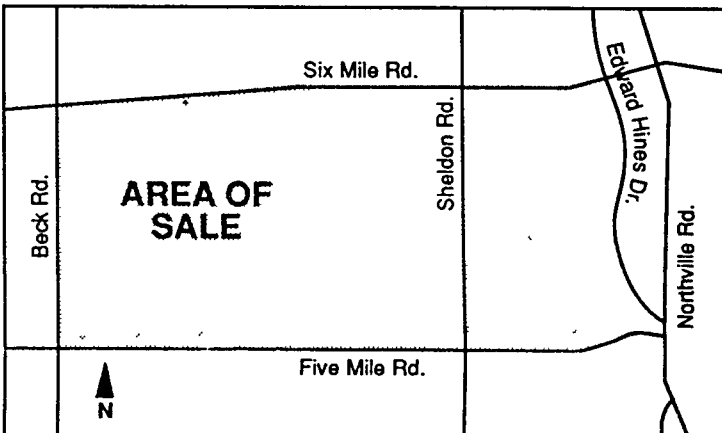
Huntington Falls principal partner and township resident Robert A. DeMattia welcomed the commission's decision.

"What can I say? It's great," he said. "This is going to be a very valuable addition to the community."

Numbers alone describe the impact of the sale.

- A price tag of \$31.75 million.
- A 10-year build-out program that could push the township state equalized valuation from the present \$413 million to almost \$2 billion by the year 2000.
- An estimated \$1 million in tax revenues to the township by the year

The first joint city/township meeting in eight months left both sides agreeing to share in a community-wide attitude survey and a review of shared services with an eye toward sharing more.

"As we're all aware, we've had several big projects going on between the city and the township which have been exciting and yet somewhat disappointing in the final results," City Mayor Chris Johnson told the joint meeting of city council and township board members Wednesday.

Johnson was referring to several recent millage defeats — for the Haller Library plan, recreation improvements and township fire services.

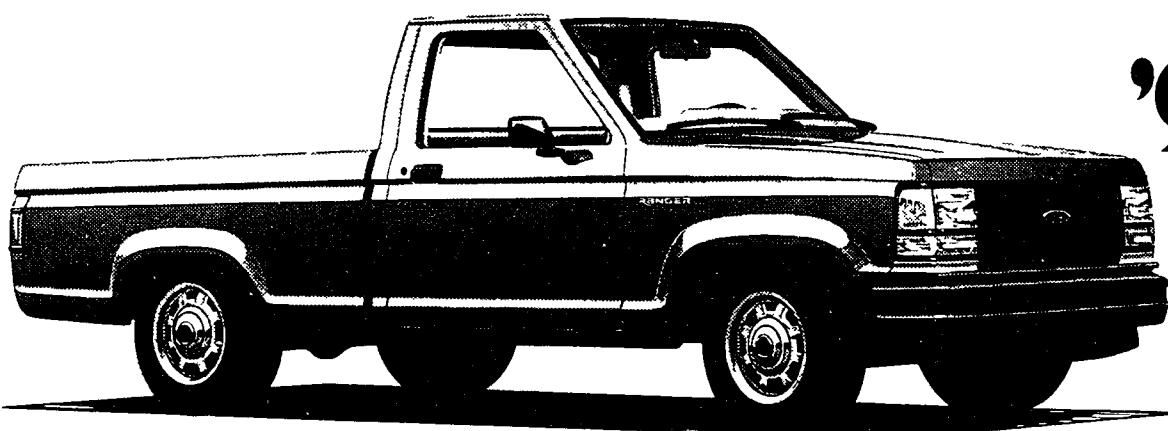
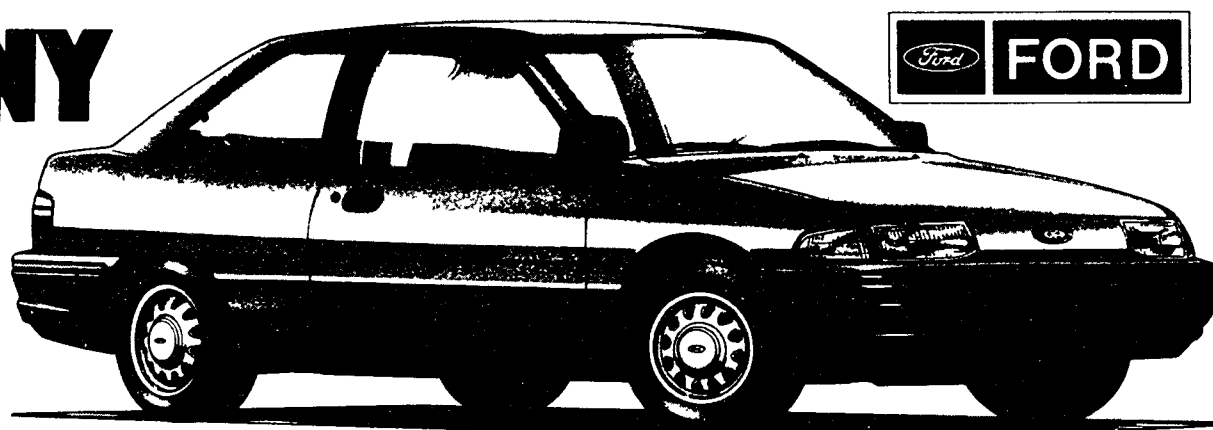

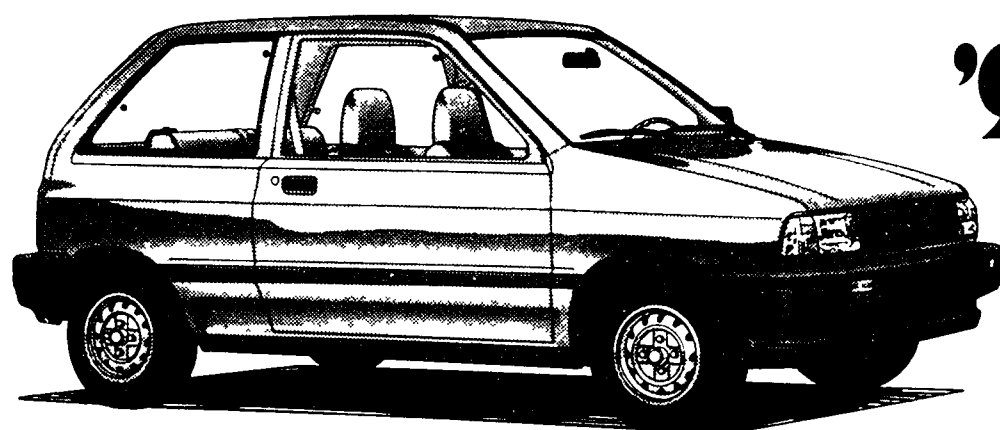

## Special ed still priority in Novi

## Cutbacks mean back-to-basics

The Novi board of education received a report at Thursday's meeting, which one board member said included the "warts and all" of the results of inclusive education in the district.

Inclusive education, called "the cutting edge trend" for special education students by special education director Donna Tinberg, was new to the district last year and remains in effect at all levels this year.

Michigan law requires that handicapped students be educated in the least restrictive environment. Inclusive education, which places special education students in classes with regular education students, is one option for fulfilling this requirement, Tinberg said.

"Our ability to place a special education student in a regular education environment hasn't always been there," Tinberg said.

Inclusive education does not require all special education students to receive their education solely from regular education teachers in regular education classrooms.

"At first people were saying it had to be all or nothing," Tinberg said, "but we're really working in the district to offer a lot of options."

Some students have classes in both regular education classrooms and special education classrooms, and some classes are taught by both special and regular education teachers. For others, regular education classes would not be beneficial at all.

One concern is that students who are educated mainly in regular edu-

cation classrooms could lose their special education status affecting the amount of categorical aid that the district would receive for the student from the state.

Conversely, students who were originally unable to receive special education because they did not qualify for state categorical aid could benefit from having access to the extra aids and services available in the classroom for special education students, said Superintendent Robert Piwko.

Vice president Stephen Hitchcock expressed concern that a special education student could be disruptive to a regular education classroom.

Tinberg said that although classes have occasionally become disruptive, the experience is usually helpful for regular education students to learn to accept differences, although no statistical studies have been done on the issue in Novi.



Our school district had to make some cutbacks. We lost, among other programs, our gifted-and-talented program, which my fourth-grade daughter was in. Why are important programs always picked out when cutbacks are made?

Because when school opens this September, there must be teachers in each classroom to greet the children.

You can't close down two fourth-grade classrooms, leaving the children with no teacher, to support a gifted and talented program no matter how enriching the experience.

Your district had a "pull-out" program with the teacher in a specific area where children came to her and then returned to class. Pull-out programs, gifted-and-talented or otherwise, always go first during cutbacks.

My views of gifted-and-talented programs sometimes differ from some of my peers. Districts which primarily use IQ and test scores for "gifted" identification end up with what I call a class of

"academically disciplined" students, not necessarily gifted.

The gifted in music, art, writing, auto mechanics, etc., can often be overlooked in district efforts.

The worst-case scenario for any district is where parents see being in a gifted-and-talented program as important socially as it is educationally.

The classic story of gifted-and-talented selection is the school district that used a 130 IQ cutoff point for entry.

A parent had a child in the program. The family moved across the river to another absolutely identical socio-economic school district where the IQ cutoff point was 133. Her child, a 130 IQ, was no longer "gifted" and could not get into her new school's 133 IQ program.

The challenge to school districts is to develop other in-class enriching experiences for children.

One specific step is to infuse the gifted-and-talented learning activities that existed in your program into the regular classroom. However, this takes considerable inservice and commitment by building principals and teachers.

We need gifted-and-talented programs. If for no other reason we recognize the talented athlete and spend considerable money on enriching athletic experiences for them.

As an aside, we must realize the number of

gifted-and-talented students in a school district is always determined by the amount of money the district has to operate.

If a district does not have enough money for a gifted-and-talented program, it obviously has no gifted and talented children.

It is amazing how when money becomes available gifted and talented children become available.

This is not a slam at those districts who can afford it; their residents pay for it. It is not a slam at those districts that can't afford the program; they simply don't have the money.

However, it is a reality that gifted and talented children are in every school district whether a program exists or not.

Keep in mind there are many quality teachers in the regular classroom who are offering challenging experiences of the same nature you will find in a gifted-and-talented program. Knowing who those teachers are, hopefully having them for your daughter, will result in the enriching experience you and all parents want for their own.

houses along West Five Mile and north on Beck.

● Approximately 300 acres of residential housing — each costing hundreds of thousands of dollars.

● Involvement by three development heavyweights — DeMattia and partners Heinz Prechter and Michael Horowitz.

The commission's OK came eight months after Wayne County Executive Edward McNamara announced that Huntington Falls Limited Partnership was the victor in an involved developer selection process.

The final stage of the search transformed into a bidding war between DeMattia and an Oakland County development team. County staffers earlier this month said head-to-head bidding boosted the price of the land from \$21-million to \$31.75-million.

Terms of the contract dictate that the development team pay the county a non-refundable \$300,000 deposit. DeMattia and partners will also pay approximately \$42,000 in engineering fees, plus \$215,000 in environmental clean-up costs.

Huntington Falls has seven months to obtain zoning approval from Northville Township. If zoning is not granted, the developers can abandon the project — with no further obligation to the county — or continue to seek zoning approval with the obligation of paying the county the balance of the purchase price.

DeMattia does not expect difficulties with zoning approval.

"I sure hope it won't (be a problem)," he said. "We've worked closely with communities many times. We're going in with something very good for the community."

"I hope they're behind us 100-percent," he said.

DeMattia said Huntington Falls is "already submitting (site) plans to the township."

Township Planning and Zoning Administrator Carol Maise said the group may appear before the township board in October for a preliminary determination. An appearance before the planning commission could soon follow, she said.

Wayne County Commissioner Susan Heintz recalled years of hit-and-miss negotiations for the county land.

"I talked to (township deputy clerk) Eunice Switzer this morning," she said. "I remember we stood out there on the property in 1973 and said something had to be done about this place."

"We laughed that it took 17 years for it to happen."

Heintz said the sale will benefit western Wayne County in more than dollars and cents.

"The great thing is that it will be a very innovative use," she said. "No longer are we under any threat of that land being used as prisons or dumps. 'It's a great step forward.'"

requested the meeting to discuss current shared services and potential new ones, "and a chance to try and build what we hope would be a community-wide consensus for both the recreation projects and the library project specifically."

Johnson added that the city council wants to gauge the entire community's willingness to fund additional library and recreational services. "We became, quite frankly, fascinated with the prospect that you had going on of surveying the community," he said.

Township officials welcomed the city aboard their resident survey, but warned the council that the survey was on the township's back burner while more heated issues like a second vote on a fire department millage renewal took precedence.

"Quite frankly, we would be delighted to have you join with us in a survey," said Township Supervisor Georgina Goss. "We have, however, put it on the back burner."

Goss estimated the initial cost of a township-only survey at between \$7,500-\$10,000. Though the township has budgeted the survey for the next fiscal year, she said, "we don't know if that money's going to be available to us in the next budget year or not."

Both city council members and township trustees agreed on the need to more accurately assess resident willingness to fund a larger library

and more recreation facilities — and the size of increased services that residents are willing to fund.

Trustee Tom Cook cited a township phone survey conducted three years ago as proof that residents do want improved services. But he said that vocal anti-tax groups like Citizens For a Better Northville often shout down the silent majority of eligible voters.

"An overwhelming majority of the people surveyed said they wanted library services, recreation, a good fire department and police department," he said. "Yet when it comes time for an election and we're trying to get the millage, we have a handful of zealots who go out and try to destroy any kind of millage proposal we put on the ballot."

"When it comes time for millage elections, we get shot down."

But Trustee James Nowka suggested that local millage defeats were simply an indication of more widespread voter dissatisfaction. He doubted the ability of local governments to pass any additional millage until the state enacted some sort of tax reform.

Johnson stressed the need to find the size of library that the community would be willing to support. "It's obvious we know that a 44,000-square-foot library isn't going. We know that," he said. "But we don't know specifically whether there's a place between here and there."

Council Member Jerry Mittman

said a survey should include the exact price that an individual homeowner would have to pay for a project. "Whatever we do, you have to include there what it's going to cost you as the typical taxpayer," he said.

He also suggested that this was part of the problem with the May 1 defeat of the Haller Library proposal by township voters. "I don't think the constituents or the voters really expressed their opinions or were asked to express their opinions adequately prior (to) coming to the ballot box," he said.

But Nowka disagreed, saying, "I don't think anybody could have worked harder on the library project than we worked."

Nowka also criticized the role played by the Northville Record in the election. "It seemed somehow that that election was conducted in the newspaper, or the public opinion was shaped by the newspaper," he said.

City Manager Steven Walters emphasized the need to make a survey relevant to those surveyed. "One thing I think would help a survey get a response or not is what kind of introduction it has," he said. "If a reader sees a purpose of the survey they have an interest in, they'll tend to respond."

He warned against drafting a simple opinion survey, saying, "That's just wastebasket material."

Council Member Dewey Gardner suggested offering those surveyed

different total packages, and setting a single millage figure that would be split among several joint services.

Council Member Carolann Ayers agreed, saying that asking about different shared services separately could end up "pitting one against the other."

Nowka recommended having a consultant examine joint services, and suggested that services like police dispatching or a district library could be shared by both Northville governments and surrounding communities like Plymouth and Canton. "We profit by collective involvement, and maybe there are other things we could look at," he said.

The group agreed that federal block grant funds could be used for the two projects, so that, as Nowka said, "it wouldn't cost the taxpayer a dime."

Gardner agreed, and suggested reviewing the joint services before sending out a survey. "We might need to hire an outside firm that isn't politically-motivated, doesn't really have any ideas or misconceptions between the two governmental bodies," he said.

The officials appointed Walters and Township Manager Richard Henningsen to assemble an attitude survey within the next two months, and Goss and Johnson agreed to meet to consider a review of shared services by an outside consulting firm.

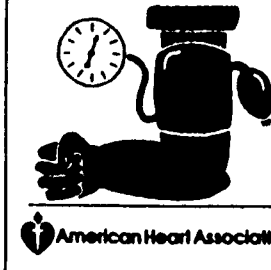

## Fresh! Awesome! Radical!

Spirited shoes have company kicking up its heels

MVP Products of Novi hasn't just hit the target market; it's hit the bull's

Walk down the halls of any area high school this winter and you'll see why. The feet of students in those halls are likely to be clad in MVP's hot new product, customized gym shoes.

The shoes are a contemporary-looking gym shoe — available in low-cuts and high-tops, for men and women. What's unique about them is the logo on the side. Where you're used to seeing the Nike swoosh or the Reebok Union Jack, you might instead find a Northville Mustang or a Novi Wildcat.

Todd Beyer, director of sales at MVP, said that the company is aiming at the high school market, where young peoples' approach to style is feet first.

"What we're doing is going into each school and offering them the opportunity to have their own shoe created, with their own logo on the side," said Beyer.

Beyer, a Northville resident, is quick to point out that this is no cheap shoe. With reinforced leather construction and a traction sole, it's a high-quality item that's as suitable for play on the basketball court as it is for watching from the stands.

But the logo is the key, according to Beyer.

"We're trying to pull together the whole school," he said. "Yeah, they're great for athletics, but we want kids to get back towards being proud of going to school — the spirit and the pride."

With the approval of the school administration, MVP then turns to its graphic artist Mike Koski, who creates a logo and color scheme for the shoe. School colors are used to accent the white shoes. The design is then shown to the school representatives for final approval.

"We haven't missed yet," said Koski.

Orders are then taken from students. Operations manager Paul Przesmycki said delivery is expected by mid-November.

The bulk of the manufacturing is done at a factory in China, with the logo and colors being added at the facility in Novi.

Northville High chose the Mustang mascot for its shoes, with tasteful black and orange panels. Others may choose their school's traditional logo, as Wayne Memorial did in picking the block "W" for its blue-and-gold trimmed shoes.

The response from the students? Well, the wording may be tough to translate, but Beyer is certain it's all positive.

"I am learning a whole new language," he said. "Fresh," "Radical," "Awesome" — it's been a real learning experience, but the response has been fantastic."

The shoes sell for \$61 for a women's low-top, up to \$69 for a men's high-top. That's a bargain compared to the \$125 that Nike's Air Jordans are fetching in stores, or the \$169 ticket for Reebok's Pump.

"We could have created a \$130 shoe, but we're trying to make it affordable for students," said Beyer.

MVP is also committed to giving back to the community what it receives in sales. For one thing, a royalty fee is paid for use of the school logo, "just like the colleges get," Beyer says.

Schools can use that money as

they see fit. Wayne Memorial is putting it into the athletic program to reduce the students' fees in that district's pay-to-play system.

In addition, MVP puts up a \$1,000 scholarship in the school once a certain percentage of shoes have been them. The companies have also come under fire for not hiring enough blacks in management.

"Our focus is to take something which is turning into a negative image — athletic shoes and young people — and turn it into something positive," said Beyer. "We want to develop the tie-in of school spirit with something that's very hot right now — the athletic shoe market."

The project, brainchild of MVP President Harold Martin, was very carefully researched from its incep-

tion eight months ago. With some 2,000 surveys, the company learned what people like about the shoes they wear in terms of comfort, style and quality. MVP combined these qualities in the logo shoes.

MVP also learned, however, that shoe buyers were a fickle bunch. "There was no outstanding loyalty to one particular manufacturer," Beyer said. "People buy what's hot."

For now, MVP has limited itself to selling in 20 schools from Detroit and the close-in suburbs. There will also be a University of Michigan and Michigan State University line on the retail store shelves in time for the Christmas shopping season.

"It's a real thrill," said Beyer. "With U-M and MSU, you can imagine the reaction. When we walk down the

street, people ask, 'Where can I get them?'

"We've had to develop a waiting list for them, and that's just from word-of-mouth and people calling us here."

Future plans are to add 120 more high schools around the state, but to illustrate the long range goal, Beyer sets another shoe on the table. Like the others, it's white. The trim is blue, and the oval logo on the side reads "Ford."

"This is just a prototype," he said. "We've gotten calls from corporations. There are a lot of companies that are into the health scene, and sponsor activities for their employees. They want to design their own shoe."

"The whole thing is just going to continue to snowball. I see some exciting things for MVP down the road."

## Granny Flats

### Are they a solution to senior housing needs?

In New Jersey and California, where they've caught on, they're called Elder Cottages, or ECHO (Elderly Cottage Housing Opportunity) housing.

In Australia, where they reportedly originated, they're called "Granny Flats."

By any name, however, they're a golden opportunity, according to a Bloomfield Hills businessman who plans on introducing them to the Detroit area.

"One of our biggest problems is affordable housing for the elderly," said J. Robert Gillette, who sees a marketing niche that coincides with a growing societal concern.

Gillette is well versed in the housing needs of the elderly. He is president of American House Retirement Residences with 14 senior citizen communities in southeast Michigan, including one in Novi.

With the number of senior citizens growing rapidly — and federal assistance decreasing almost as rapidly — granny flats may be the wave of the future.

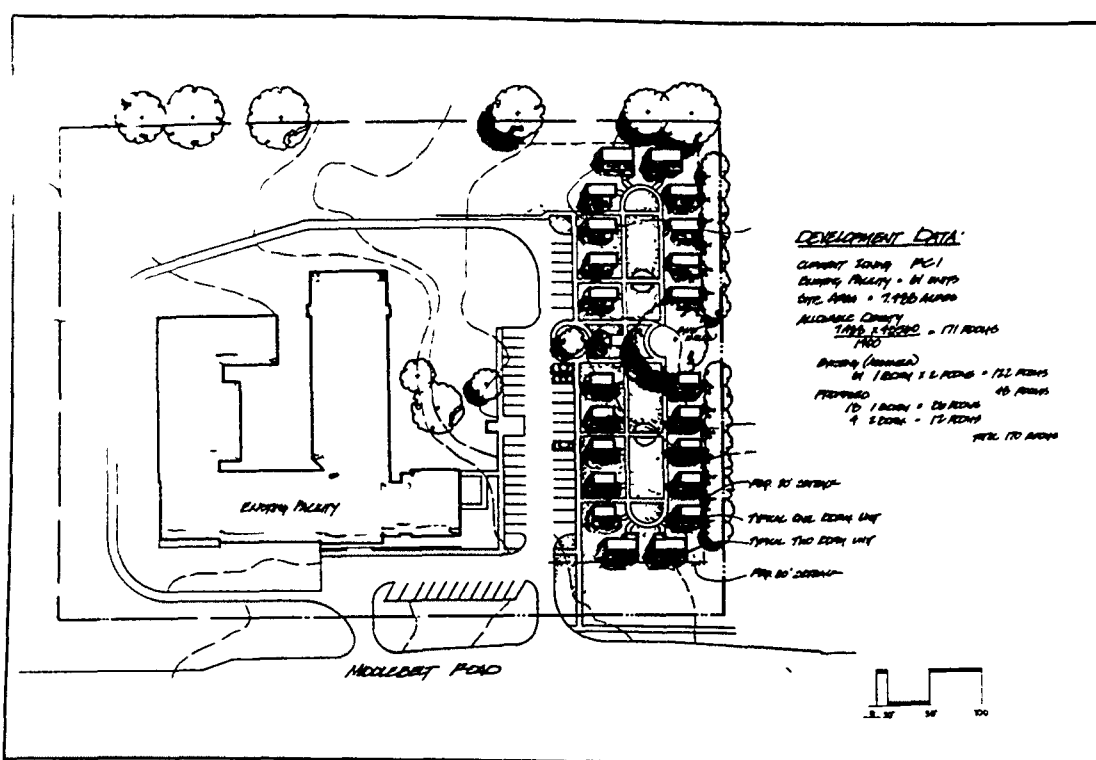
Gillette and associates said they are approaching the cities of Farmington Hills, Rochester Hills and Dearborn Heights with the proposition.

They plan to submit site plans for granny flats — or elder cottages — at their retirement communities in each of those cities as prototypes. They envision 22 in Farmington Hills, 8 in Rochester Hills and 41 in Dearborn Heights.

They will be offered as an option for seniors who don't want, or can't afford, more expensive quarters like those at American House facilities, that can run as high as \$1,400 per month.

The "granny flat" concept has been popular in Australia for years, but hasn't caught on in the United States because conditions haven't been ripe, he said. "Until now."

In Australia, seniors set up the pre-fabricated units in their relatives' backyards, allowing seniors them independence, while keeping them close enough to watch the grandkids grow up. That use probably won't be tried here in the near future, as it would cause too many zoning battles in communities that fear it is like allowing multiple-family zoning in

single-family areas.

"We're looking at putting them in cluster developments for our sites," said Clinton Baller of American House. "We're not going to focus on putting them in people's backyards because it would be too many battles for too few units. Instead we're going to work on forging development alliances with communities and non-profit groups."

On Oct. 9 Baller's group will meet with SEMCOG's Task Force on Community and Economic Development to present the proposal for cluster developments. It's his guess that American House will be asked to build some samples so that people can see what they're like.

The units range from 500 to 700 square feet, with kitchen and laundry facilities. The costs are still tentative, but as envisioned by Gillette, granny flats will lease for around \$650 per month and sell for about \$35,000.

Gillette said as with most new concepts, granny flats may generate some controversy, especially in densely-conscious communities with restrictive zoning regulations.

"I don't see many problems with building the prototypes," he said. "We own the property" and already have favorable zoning.

In Farmington Hills, Katie Ulrich, staff planner, said, "I don't see many problems with them (granny flats) on their property (American House at 24400 Middlebelt)," though she had not yet seen any specific proposals.

Baller said, however, that the company would have to dig a well to supply water to a cluster development there. That may preclude bringing the granny flats to Farmington Hills.

In Rochester Hills, existing zoning would not permit granny flats, according to Susan Danielewicz, associate planner.

Could they come to the American

House site in Novi?

"We'll go wherever people want us," said Baller. "We'll work with anyone. If Novi likes the idea, fine. We'll work with them."

In other areas of the country, according to information provided by Gillette, granny flats are generally taxed as real property (like regular homes), personal property (like travel trailers) or temporary structures. The difference, of course, would affect the cost.

Brigit Hassig, community planner and housing specialist in the Southfield office of the Area Agency on Aging, said she is pleased to see the idea of granny flats coming to southeastern Michigan.

"There are zoning considerations to be worked out," she said. "But granny flats are an excellent alternative for the elderly."

She was concerned, however, the granny flats proposed by Gillette are simply too expensive for most families.

## Robert Meisner/Condo Queries

### New regulations will require enforcement

Our condominium has a prohibition on landscaping property without the association's approval. Our developer has allowed purchasers to do almost anything they want around their unit. Now the board has taken over and wants to impose some restrictions. How should we proceed?

This is a classic problem at condominiums because developers who have controlled their associations do not follow restrictions they have established in the documents. This not only leads to potential liability for the developer-director designees on the board, but also creates the problems you mentioned.

The association should establish a firm landscaping policy and enforce it. To the extent that the developer has allowed modifications to be made, and those modifications are not within the landscaping plan, attempts should be made to compel the co-owners, to the extent reasonable, to make the necessary changes. The co-owners should understand that the association must maintain a consistent and realistic policy with respect to landscaping, as is the case with any other type of aesthetic restriction in the condominium documents. You may well be advised to consult with legal counsel as to how far you may go in dealing with recalcitrant co-owners under the circumstances.

Our cooperative is considering converting to a condominium. We have heard that it may be a good economic vehicle for us to liquidate our units at a much higher price. Do you have any experience in that regard?

It is not unreasonable to expect at least a 30-percent increase in the value of a unit once it is converted from a co-op to a condominium in certain locations. One of the reasons for the marked increase is that cooperative housing is not as easily

marketable because financing is extremely difficult to obtain. Obviously, condominiums are much more widely accepted in certain locales and are readily able to be financed in most markets.

In some locales, there is a stigma of co-ops being subsidized housing, which brings down the market value of the units, but is not universal by any means.

Our documents preclude co-owners from operating a business out of their unit. We have three lawyers in our complex who use their homes not only as a passive office but entertain guests or clients there. Is there anything we can do about it?

This is a difficult question. Obviously, your documents do not cover this point, and it may be a good idea to amend the documents to provide exactly what is meant by a commercial enterprise as opposed to the use of a home for strictly residential purposes that may mean, on occasion "doing work at home." To the extent that the lawyer is using his home not only as an office for conducting paperwork, but also for seeing clients on a regular basis, you may have a good argument for pursuing that attorney. Of course, you know what happens when you pursue attorneys; it is likely they will fight back. That is not a reason for you not to pursue any co-owner whenever there is a violation of the condominium documents.

## Housing starts take mild dip through July

Gary D. Smith of Muskegon, President of the MAHB says, "Overall, residential building has eased in the last months, however, construction activity has not slowed dramatically in Michigan."

Total year-to-date (January-July) starts have increased 13.2 percent, to 28,149, units as compared to 1989 year-to-date units of 24,782.

"After a steep increase in the opening months of 1990, construction activity in Michigan is stabilizing," says Smith. The industry has started 2.17 billion dollars of residential construction activity during January through July 1990 and is up 13.3 percent over 1989.

In Oakland County, starts were up 6.1 percent as compared to last year. At this point in 1989, there were 4,526 new homes started, while in 1990, year-to-date figures showed 4,803 new homes.

Wayne County experienced one of the state's biggest gains at 20.8 percent. Through July, new housing starts stood at 2,435, while there were 2,016 new homes at this point in 1989.

The MAHB in Lansing is comprised of 8,000 member companies representing over 300,000 people in the home building/construction industry.

## Marty Figley/Down to Earth

### Books can lead you to better soil

"Ruth Page's Gardening Journal" (Houghton Mifflin, \$17.95 hardcover) gives sound advice to help make the reader a better gardener.

Page is the host of a public radio program sponsored by the National Gardening Association. The book is endorsed by that association.

Excerpts of her many radio programs, along with her hands-on experience, are given in a down-to-earth manner — from the ins and outs of gardening to soil preparation to how to put up produce, use herbs and disguise a garage with a morning glory vine. Written in a lively, cheerful manner, it is a curl-up-and-enjoy type of book.

Two books from a series of Classic Gardening Guides, edited by Penelope Hobhouse, deal with specific types of gardens. They focus on England's National Trust gardens and include expert advice from staff gardeners and garden advisers (Harper & Row, \$15.95 each, hardcover).

The first, "Borders" by Penelope Hobhouse, describes the traditional herbaceous border, shrub border and mixed border. Each section explains the various designs that fit into the particular category and suggests appropriate plants to use and the maintenance required.

A short history of each type of border is included and the photographs show excellent examples. The steps to achieving a successful border planting from beginning to end are here.

The second, "Planting in Patterns" by Patrick

Taylor, is a complete course on the subject, whether one chooses a few plants or many.

It covers the use of structural plantings such as hedges, topiary, mazes and pleached trees, where they are planted and how they relate to the complete scene shows. With careful planning, the end result will be harmonious. These ideas take time and patience, but can make a garden a work of art.

"Outdoor Floors" by Peter McHoy (Harper & Row, \$24.95 hardcover) is unusual in that it suggests that materials other than grass and groundcovers can be used to create a pleasing outdoor area.

Yes, grass is still a vital element in many designs, and instructions on establishing and maintaining it are included. But alternatives such as pavers, bricks, gravel and wood can be used in its place to set the tone.

Directions for these installations are very clear and easy to follow. The descriptions of many groundcovers, how and where they can be used, and other statistics are well-researched and complete. Some are familiar and others will make us think in different directions for their uses.

"Designing With Trees" by Anthony Paul and Yvonne Rees (Salem House, \$29.95 hardcover) is just the ticket for tree lovers who wish to add to their knowledge or want to select the perfect tree for the perfect spot.

In addition to the more common trees, many

species and new varieties can be used with success. Leaf color, blossom time, color, fruiting and other characteristics of each one are included. Encyclopedic descriptions at the end of the book list both in common and botanical names.

More than 350 trees are listed. Suggestions for designing either a large or small area will help the reader.

Advice is given for container grown, windbreak, specimen, privacy and specialty gardens such as Oriental and shade. Chapters deal with underplantings and climbing plants in relation to trees, their care, how they grow and the continued attention necessary for their health.

"Foliage Plants for Decorating Indoors" by Virginia F. and George A. Elbert (Timber Press, \$49.95 hardcover, 800-328-5680) is a complete guide for the serious indoor gardener as well as the professional.

All phases of indoor plant culture, and the importance of light, both natural and artificial, are explained in detail, including the placement of plants in relation to light. Cultural care completes the first section.

The meat of the book is the second part where more than 200 genera are listed, along with the most interesting or important species and cultivars. A color photograph accompanies the detailed description of each plant. This is a scholarly book written by experts.

## Consumer Mailbag

### Getting rid of that dry-cleaning smell

I just got back some dry cleaning that had a stronger than usual "dry cleaning" smell. What causes this odor? Do all clothes marked "dry clean only" need to be dry cleaned?

This sudden change from winter weather to summer heat has probably got you running to the storage closet to switch your winter/summer wardrobe.

As a result, you probably have a pile of winter items either just taken to the dry cleaners or ready to be dropped off for cleaning before they're packed away until next fall.

Clothes today are labeled "dry clean only" — whether they're made from natural or synthetic fabrics. That's an interesting label because "dry clean" isn't dry. Instead of deter-

gent and water, clothes are cleaned with detergent and a liquid solvent designed to remove spots and stains.

This detergent/solvent mixture is not absorbed by the material. Because the material does not absorb the cleaning solution, the clothes don't stretch, shrink or fade. Dyes don't run; delicate fabrics don't tear; wools don't mat down.

The most widely used dry cleaning solvent is perchloroethylene, a non-renewable petrochemical distillate. The fumes from this chemical are what give your clothes the distinctive "dry cleaned" smell. "Perc," as it is known, is a toxic chemical. While it's very unlikely you'll suffer any health effects from wearing dry-cleaned clothes, these fumes have been classified as a common indoor air pollut-

ant by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

Frequent dry cleaning is unnecessary. Manufacturers in most cases just recommend dry cleaning to avoid complaints from customers when they ruin the garment through incorrect washing. Most clothes can be safely washed at home — if you know how.

To reduce dry cleaning, choose garments and fabrics that can be put into the washing machine or gently hand washed.

For items that can't avoid being dry cleaned, increase the time between cleanings by brushing and/or shaking out the garment after each wearing. Then let the clothes air out overnight. These steps will increase the life of the garment as well as re-

duce cleaning.

Protect yourself from exposure to "perc" fumes. If you can smell the perc, the clothes probably weren't fully dried before being put into the protective plastic bag. You can either give them back and have them re-cleaned correctly, or you can take them home, remove them from the bag and hang the clothes in a well-ventilated area — preferably outdoors — to evaporate the solvent. Perc will evaporate completely.

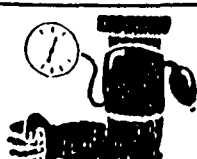

## Cooks come to cable

### Chefs show how to do it

Let these recipe ideas roll around on your tongue.

Swordfish Annie. Wild mushroom strudel. Sliced melon with blueberry sauce. Fat-free chocolate mousse.

Sound good? Two cooking shows, produced and seen on local cable TV networks in Westland and Southfield, are tickling taste buds.

Innovative chefs are the stars, cooking up their own creations for TV audiences.

"I try to do things that are simple, with a little twist," said 23-year-old Scott Winfrey of Westland, sous chef at the Rattlesnake Club in Detroit.

Winfrey is seen regularly on the "Occupations and Avocations" show in Westland, which showcases residents with special talents and interests.

In Southfield, a show called "What's Cooking in Southfield?" has viewers drooling over recipes prepared by renowned chefs such as Miles Chelka of the Golden Mushroom, Chris Carl of the Bijou, both Southfield restaurants, and Douglas Grech, better known as Chef Douglass.

Both shows air on the Channel 8 cable station in their respective communities.

Winfrey, a graduate of Westland John Glenn High School and the culinary arts program at Schoolcraft College in Livonia, created the recipe for Swordfish Annie and named it after his wife, Annie.

For this recipe Winfrey marinates the swordfish in a mixture of fresh lemon juice, fresh thyme and olive oil.

Chelka created the wild mushroom strudel as a warm first course. It combines fresh mushrooms, seasoned and sauced, in a pocket of phyllo dough.

The sliced melon with blueberry sauce is from Chris Carl. Douglass created the fat-free chocolate mousse, which uses baker's cocoa, coffee liqueur, egg whites and unflavored gelatin.

Winfrey's appearances began several weeks ago. "What's Cooking in Southfield?" has been airing for around three years and features a free cookbook of recipes from the show. Both shows are rotated over several weeks.

Feedback from viewers has been positive, said representatives for both shows.

"It has worked out very nicely," said Steve Zieman, Winfrey's producer. "It's something people can relate to."

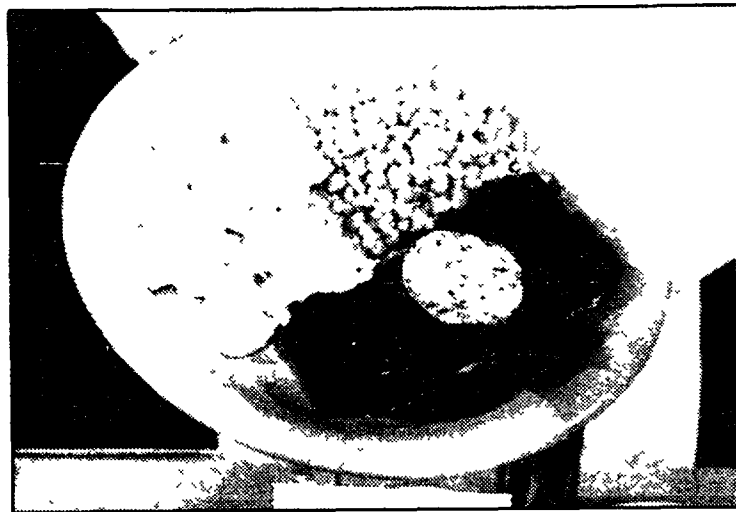
Winfrey previously worked at the Hillside Inn in Plymouth, American Grill in Livonia and Merrithweather's in Southfield. He touts the importance of visual appeal, along with flavor and texture.

"People buy with their eyes," Winfrey said. "If something looks great they are more likely to want it."

Typically Winfrey prepares his special recipe in advance to make sure there are no glitches. Often the ingredients are donated by a local store.

#### SWORDFISH ANNIE

Juice of 3 fresh lemons  
1/4 cup oil (olive or vegetable)  
3 sprigs fresh thyme (or 1 teaspoon dry)  
Salt and cracked pepper to taste

Combine juice of three lemons, 1/4 cup oil and thyme in a bowl. Add salt and pepper to taste and whisk together. Pour over fish and marinate for 2-3 hours. Use marinade as a baste while cooking. Melt butter enough marinade for 4 fish. (Recipe courtesy of Scott Winfrey)

#### CHEF DUGLASS' CHOCOLATE MOUSSE NOUVEAU RICHE

(Without fat, Dertling)

2 cups milk  
1/4 cup sugar  
1 cup baker's cocoa  
2 tablespoons cornstarch dissolved in 1/4 cup water  
1 tablespoon Tia Marie coffee liqueur  
1 tablespoon vanilla brandy  
1-2 ounces bittersweet chocolate (chopped)  
8 egg whites  
1 teaspoon unflavored gelatin  
2 teaspoons cold water

Scald milk. Add baker's cocoa. Add 1/4 cup sugar. Whisk together. Thicken with cornstarch. Whisk again over heat. Let it cook. Add vanilla brandy and Tia Marie. Add chocolate and whisk. Separate cold eggs and put whites in mixer bowl. Whip with electric mixer until it is a soft froth. Add unflavored gelatin to cold water and pour into chocolate. If possible, if (thickened mixture). Fold chocolate into egg whites, whisking as you go. Pour mixture into chilled (frozen) glasses. Before serving garnish with a fresh strawberry fan. On upcoming shows Winfrey will prepare redskin potato salad, shrimp and linguini with creamy garlic sauce and spicy chicken stir-fry.

Michelle Widerstedt of the Southfield has a plum job. She's the host of

"What's Cooking in Southfield?" It's a thrill to work with great chefs and sample the end product, she said.

"You try to make it fun and entice the audience," said Widerstedt, a free-lance paralegal, wife of a "meat-and-potatoes" building contractor and mother of two toddler boys.

Widerstedt, an amateur gourmet cook, asks pertinent questions. Where may the ingredients be bought? Can items be substituted? What kind of wine should be served with the veal scallopini?

"Some of these dishes aren't easy to make," Widerstedt said. "If you have the guts it's fun to try."

Widerstedt marvels at the chefs' skills in creating variations with spices and sauces.

Widerstedt expects to start a new round of shows this month.

One of her recent favorite recipes was Indonesian grilled pork from Chris Carl of the Bijou. Its ingredients included lemon grass, scallions, cardamom, ground cumin and sweet Indonesian soy sauce.

"It's potent but wonderful," Widerstedt said. "I have served it all summer long to all kinds of people."

Experimentation will add excitement to dining, Winfrey said.

"There are thousands of ideas," Winfrey said. "Don't be afraid. If you like it you will come up with a great idea. It's a lot of fun."

Scott Winfrey's appearances are scheduled on a rotating basis between 5 p.m. and midnight on Westland's community access channel.

"What's Cooking in Southfield?" is aired at 10:30 a.m. Tuesdays and 8 p.m. Thursdays. Both shows are on Cable Channel 8.

## Legumes, for those who know beans

Heaven is baked beans. Or a marinated bean salad. Or humus, the middle eastern pate of ground chick peas, olive oil and lots of garlic. Or...

There are numerous ways to enjoy beans, which are simple to prepare, nutritious, inexpensive and good tasting.

The types of beans and legumes are numerous. For definition's sake a legume is a plant that produces a pod with edible seeds inside. Examples are lentils and peas.

Most strains of dry peas originated in the British Isles, lentils from Chile. Dry peas and lentils are believed to be some of the first cultivated crops by man. Bean varieties include kidney, lima, navy, great northern and garbanzo. Michigan is a top producer of navy and great northern beans.

Beans and legumes have long been known for their nutritional value. Because they are a complex carbohydrate they digest slower than other carbohydrates and satisfy hunger longer. The calorie count is modest, 118 calories per 1/2 cup of cooked beans of legumes. They are a prized energy and protein source.

Beans and legumes are not complete proteins since they are missing one of the essential amino acids required in our diets. This is easily remedied with the addition of rice, dairy products or small amounts of meat.

Beans and legumes are touted as a "detergent food" because of their high fiber content, up to 9 grams per serving. In comparison vegetables offer 5 grams per serving, and fruits only 3 grams per serving. Fiber is important in removing food particles, fats, cholesterol and other residual food materials from the digestive system. Some of the minerals and vitamins supplied are iron, calcium, phosphorus and potassium. Sodium content is low.

Beans and lentils are nature's best buy in protein. They are inexpensive, available year round, are easy to cook and will keep almost indefinitely. A pound of beans measures about 2 cups and will yield 6 cups, or triple the volume, when cooked.

Store leftover dry beans and legumes in an airtight glass or metal container in a cool, dry location. Not the refrigerator.

Cook more beans than needed and refrigerate covered for several days or freeze. Larger quantities take no longer to cook than small ones.

Peas and lentils need no soaking. They should be cooked from the dry stage, without soaking. Lentils cook in 30 minutes or less and peas take a bit longer. There are several methods for soaking beans. The preferred is soaking overnight. Pick over beans for any pebbles or dirt and cover with cold water. Six cups of water is recommended. Longer soaking lessens cooking time and dissolves a greater amount of the gas-causing properties in water.

With the "quick soak" method, the beans are picked over, rinsed, covered with water, boiled for 2 minutes, covered and allowed to stand for 1 hour. Then proceed as directed in the recipe. Quick-soak beans will not retain their shape as well as those cooked over night. There are differing views on whether to rinse the beans after soaking or to cook in the same liquid. It is thought that valuable minerals and vitamins are lost down the drain with rinsing.

The standard method for cooking beans is to place soaked beans into a good-sized pot. An old fashioned bean pot is ideal for keeping beans moist. Add 6 cups of hot water, 2 tablespoons of oil or butter and 2 teaspoons of salt. Simmer gently to avoid breaking the skins.

The addition of a quartered onion, several cloves of garlic and the substitution of chicken stock for the water will yield a much more savory bean. Because acid slows down cooking add tomatoes and vinegar last. Change the flavor of beans by adding marmalade or maple syrup for the brown sugar or molasses. Canned beans do not require additional cooking.

The recipes below incorporate dried and canned beans. The canned beans will shorten preparation time but I prefer cooking beans myself since the texture is superior.

#### LENTIL RICE SALAD WITH MUSTARD DRESSING

1/2 cup lentils washed  
1 1/2 cups water  
1 tomato chopped  
1/4 cup diced celery  
1 1/4 cups cooked rice  
1/4 cup diced carrots  
1/4 cup diced green pepper  
1 1/4 cups broccoli flowerettes  
2 tsp fresh chopped parsley

#### MUSTARD DRESSING

1/4 cup rice vinegar  
1 tsp. lemon juice  
1 1/4 tsp. Dijon mustard  
2 1/4 tsp. olive oil

Combine lentils and water in sauce pan. Bring to a boil, reduce heat, cover and simmer 20 minutes. Drain and cool. Combine with remaining ingredients. Toss with dressing and let sit several hours or over night.  
Makes 7 1-cup servings 167 calories each.

#### PASTA E FAGIOLI

4 tbsp olive oil  
1 16-ounce can plum tomatoes  
1/4 tsp. dried basil  
15 ounces white kidney beans, rinsed if desired and drained  
8 ounces dried macaroni  
2 garlic cloves minced  
2 tbsp. minced parsley  
1/4 tsp. dried oregano  
grated parmesan

Heat 3 tbsp. olive oil, add garlic and salt, saute until brown. Str in drained tomatoes (save juice for stock or sauce), cook 5 minutes and add parsley, basil and oregano. Simmer 15 minutes or until tomatoes are soft and broken up. Add beans and heat 5 minutes. Season with salt and pepper. Place cooked pasta in a bowl, toss with sauce. Season to taste. Pass with parmesan. Pork or ham can be added if desired.

#### HUMUS

1 1/2 cups dried chick peas soaked overnight  
3 medium cloves garlic, minced  
1 1/2 tsp. salt  
juice of 2 lemons  
1/4 cup olive oil  
1/4 cup minced parsley  
salt, pepper, cayenne to taste  
1/4 cup minced scallions

Place cooked chick peas in food processor, blender or mash by hand to a paste. Add all other ingredients. Incorporate oil slowly. Adjust seasonings.

## A visit to the Z Moore Winery

Farmington Harrison High School has become known for its championship football teams, but two of its graduates are heavy into food and wine.

Brian Polcyn and Daniel Moore went to high school together in Farmington. Polcyn is owner/chef at the Pike Street Restaurant in Pontiac, while Moore is co-owner/winemaker at Z Moore Winery in Sonoma County, Calif.

Recently, these two classmates teamed up again to show off Z Moore wines with Pike Street food. Moore owns the boutique winery with his wife, Natalie Zuccarelli, thus the name Z Moore — she gets top billing.

The winery is in a renovated hop kiln in the cool Sonoma County growing region known as the Russian River Valley. Here, Moore buys the distinctive chardonnay and gewurztraminer grapes he needs to produce 5,000 cases of wine annually.

Moore moved to California after earning a degree in food science from Michigan State University.

"I stayed in California because it was the first place I found where I could swim and ski in the same season," Moore said.

Z Moore Winery is a small, hand-on operation where the owners handcraft a tiny quantity of wine from premium-quality grapes, specializing in only three wine types.

"I was a white zinfandel lover who got my rigorous job training hauling hoses at Milano Winery in Mendocino County," Moore said. "Later, I worked for Hop Kiln Winery in Sonoma. That's where I got turned on to gewurztraminer."

As small as Z Moore is, it already has two labels. For five years now, Moore has produced a refreshing, spicy, pleasantly off-dry gewurztraminer called Quaff.

"For us this is not a second label," Moore said.

"It is our significant other," Natalie said. "This is a fun wine, seriously made. Drink it at the pool, on a picnic, at the beach, or in front of a fire with someone you love."

The 1989 Quaff (\$7) has fresh, spicy, orange blossom aromas, with juicy, fruit flavors that make it a perfect starter almost any time.

Z Moore also produces an unusual and totally dry gewurztraminer in the style of a crisp, clean Alsace version.

The wine is barrel fermented in 130-gallon, mature oak puncheons that allow the wine to retain its spicy aromas while broadening its palate impression.

Moore's model in Alsace is Domaine Osterberg, where Andre Osterberg has caused a sensation over his barrel-fermented wines in a region that traditionally ferments in large,

neutral oak casks or stainless steel.

Whatever he does, Moore is on the right track. His 1989 Barrel Fermented Dry Gewurztraminer (\$9) shows spicy ginger and orange blossom aromas with a creamy richness and generous body that pairs well with food.

On conservative evenings, Polcyn paired this wine with ragout of creamed seafood in crust one night and spicy pasta with tomatoes and Vidalia onions the next.

Oven-steamed salmon with wild watercress and grilled Columbia River sturgeon with mustard cream were the dishes selected to accompany Z Moore's 1988 Chardonnay (available exclusively at Pike Street Restaurant).

The wine's firm, lean acidity was cleansing against the fish.

"I use Montrachet yeast," Moore said, "because I like how it highlights the wine's toasty character."

Z Moore produces small amounts of red zinfandel, blended with petit sirah, showcasing generous black pepper aromas, forward fruit flavors and a heightened acidity that bodes well for extended aging.

Polcyn created an earthy, peasant-style grilled medallion of beef with braised beef shortrib using some of the 1988 Z Moore Zinfandel (only available at Pike Street) in the

reduction sauce.

The combination elevated the taste of both wine and food. Polcyn's stylized food harmonies, created to complement the Z Moore wines, clearly indicate why he was selected as runner-up in this year's Paul Bocuse Best Native American Chef Competition.

The 1989 Z Moore Select Harvest Gewurztraminer (\$6.50/375ml) is a dessert wine that can be enjoyed on its own or with a variety of fruit desserts. Moore likes this wine with dessert because it is not overly sweet.

Polcyn created summer berries in mascarpone that included fresh raspberries, blueberries and strawberries set in a pool of milk chocolate and butterscotch.

The peach, honey and melon flavors of the wine harmonize well with the dessert, and the wine's crisp acidity left the palate clean and refreshed.

Although most Z Moore wine is sold in California, Michigan does get a healthy allocation. You should be able to find the 1989 Quaff and the 1989 Barrel Fermented Dry Gewurztraminer in better wine shops in the metropolitan area.

"The Cutting Edge" is the first program of its type by an area commercial radio station in a long while. WLBS-FM, and more recently WDTX-FM, tried new music formats in the past that failed.

In the last four years, though, alternative groups such as the Cure, R.E.M. and Depeche Mode have grown in prominence in terms of record sales and gate receipts. (For example, the Cure sold out Joe Louis Arena). Other trendsetting groups, such as the Smiths and Husker Du, have come and gone in the same time.

Commercial radio stations in Detroit have long been criticized for being slow, and in some cases, outright ignoring new music. Instead, they have stuck by AOR (album oriented

rock) and classic rock formats. At least for four hours a night there is an option.

The Windsor-based station has a 100,000-watt signal that reaches Ann Arbor, Lansing, and Toledo as well as London, Ontario, in addition to the Detroit Windsor area.

"The Cutting Edge" will bump against Canadian public radio music shows "Drive New Waves" and "Nightlines" heard on CBB-FM 88.5. On Sunday nights, St. James will compete against WRIF's "Some Rendezvous."

All of which doesn't bother St. James, whose attitude is the more new music the merrier.

His show was seven years in the making. Former WDTX-FM DJ Mike Halloran and St. James made a similar proposal to a then-uninterested CJOM-FM in 1983.

CJOM-FM later became CIMX-FM with new ownership by the CHUM Group. St. James decided to try again in April, this time discussing the idea

with station general manager Al Perrin.

"Al was receptive but cautious," St. James said and jokingly added, "Probably, the video with him and Swedish stewardess and handcuffs changed his mind."

Asked Perrin: "I'm very excited about the Cutting Edge." Fact of the matter is this type of music is not being played in concentrated form in the Detroit area.

"Anytime a radio station can add something... you're doing what radio should be doing — giving people an option."

St. James has been busy working out a play list. He mentions such alternative fare off the top of his head as the Railway Children and Adrian Belew along with staples such as the Cure, David Bowie, B-52s and Depeche Mode.

Since CIMX-FM is in Windsor, "The Cutting Edge" is bound by Canadian content regulations. St. James doesn't see that as a problem

since the north of the border music scene is growing with acts such as Cowboy Junkies, The Pursuit of Happiness, Blue Rodeo and Crash Vegas.

"... So we won't have to play cuts by BTO (Bachman Turner Overdrive) or Anne Murray," he said.

Music by Detroit area bands will be included as well. But St. James wants to intersperse local music with national acts in order not to "ghettoize" it.

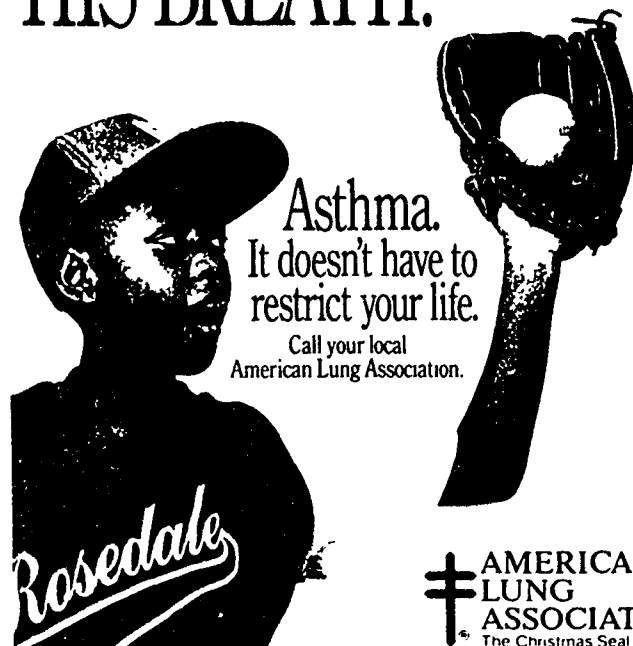
While he readily admits he's not an expert of new music, St. James adds he's quite the fan. He'll listen to suggestions from industry people along with the listening audience.

At WRIF, St. James was instrumental in starting "Local Riffs" that featured local bands. Also, he hosted a new music show, "Dangerous Exposure," on WABX-FM in the early '80s. His alter ego, Twigg Barbust, fronts a band that performs at area clubs.

According to St. James, the show has a year commitment from CIMX management. He believes that's adequate time.

"It's not a question of finding the audience," he said. "It's a question of the audience finding us. We know the audience is there."

## 'Mountains' a miss; older flicks return

"Mountains of the Moon" (1990, color, R, 140 minutes) is one of those major motion pictures which should have been better than it was and, because it wasn't, did very poorly when released theatrically earlier this year.

It became available Aug. 30 at video shops with the additional deficit of being an African adventure whose wide-screen grandeur translates poorly, if at all, to small home screens.

"Mountains of the Moon" is the epic story of Sir Richard Francis Burton, one of those larger-than-life 19th century British explorers whose adventures in Africa were instrumental in expanding the British Empire.

"Mountains of the Moon" concentrates on Burton and Lt. John Hanning Speke and primarily their 1854 expedition searching for the headwaters of the Nile.

One of the film's problems lies in its episodic nature — African footage and adventures, Royal Geographic Society politics in crediting travelers for their discoveries and financing further trips. "Credit" involved publication, and the politics there leads publisher Laurence Oliphant (Richard E. Grand) to manipulate Speke and ultimately destroy his friendship

with Burton. Further complications include Burton's love affair with Isabel (Fiona Shaw).

Cutting back and forth among all these episodes requires many linking elements and transitional devices to maintain continuity and a clear sequence for viewers. But they just aren't there.

Despite a major production staff led by director/co-writer Bob Rafelson ("Five Easy Pieces," "King of Marvin Gardens"), the excellent cinematography, fine costumes and credible performances are lost in an episodic jumble that fails to convey the epic accomplishment these 19th century heroes achieved in trekking through "darkest Africa."

Devotees of older motion pictures are in for a treat with the Aug. 22 debut on home video of 10 MGM/UA films selected by balloting video dealers nationwide. The ballot listed 100 titles as yet unreleased from the vast MGM/UA library.

By rank order, here's the results:

The first choice was "The Tea-house of the August Moon" (1956, color, no rating, 123 minutes) with Marlon Brando, Glenn Ford and Eddie Albert in a story of the U.S. Army

on Okinawa shortly after World War II. No doubt the well-known cast and the nostalgia of old soldiers propelled this one into first place.

Having visited the actual Tea-house of the August Moon on Okinawa in the mid-'50s, I share the nostalgia despite the fact that it was, indeed, more than a tea-house and rather shabby. The film, however, is pretty neat.

Far be it from me to second-guess why "The White Buffalo" (1977, color, PG, 97 minutes) is second on this popularity list. Good cast in an unusual western is the most-likely answer.

Charles Bronson is Wild Bill Hickok. He and Crazy Horse (Will Sampson) search for the title animal of fame and fable. Good supporting cast includes Jack Warden, Kim Novak, Stuart Whitman, John Carradine and Slim Pickens.

Next is the sensitive "A Patch of Blue" (1965, no rating, 105 minutes) with Shelley Winters, Sidney Portier and Elizabeth Hartman. Winters won an Oscar for heat supporting actress that year.

Number four is the African action film, "Khartoum" (1966, color, no rating, 134 minutes), starring Charlton Heston and Sir Laurence Olivier.

Fifth, "Boom Town" (1940, black and white, no rating, 115 minutes) is unintentionally appropriate at this time as Clark Gable and Spencer Tracy appear as rough-and-tumble wildcatters who strike it rich in Oklahoma oil fields. Claudette Colbert, Hedy Lamarr, Frank Morgan and Chill Wills also star.

In order, numbers six through 10 are:

■ "Chato's Land" (1972, color, PG, 110 minutes), an Indian/Western with Charles Bronson, Jack Palance, James Whitmore and Richard Basehart.

■ "Torpedo Run" (1958, color, no rating, 98 minutes) with Glenn Ford, Ernest Borgnine and Dean Jones.

■ "Destination Tokyo" (1943, black and white, no rating, 135 minutes) with Cary Grant, Alan Hale, Dane Clark and John Forsythe in his film debut.

■ "Battleground" (1965, color, no rating, 153 minutes) with Van Johnson and James Whitmore.

■ "The Scalp Hunters" (1968, color, no rating, 102 minutes) with an all-star cast — Burt Lancaster, Ozzie Davis, Telly Savalas, Dabney Coleman, Shelley Winters — in a comic western.

## Producer Fred de Cordova still with Carson

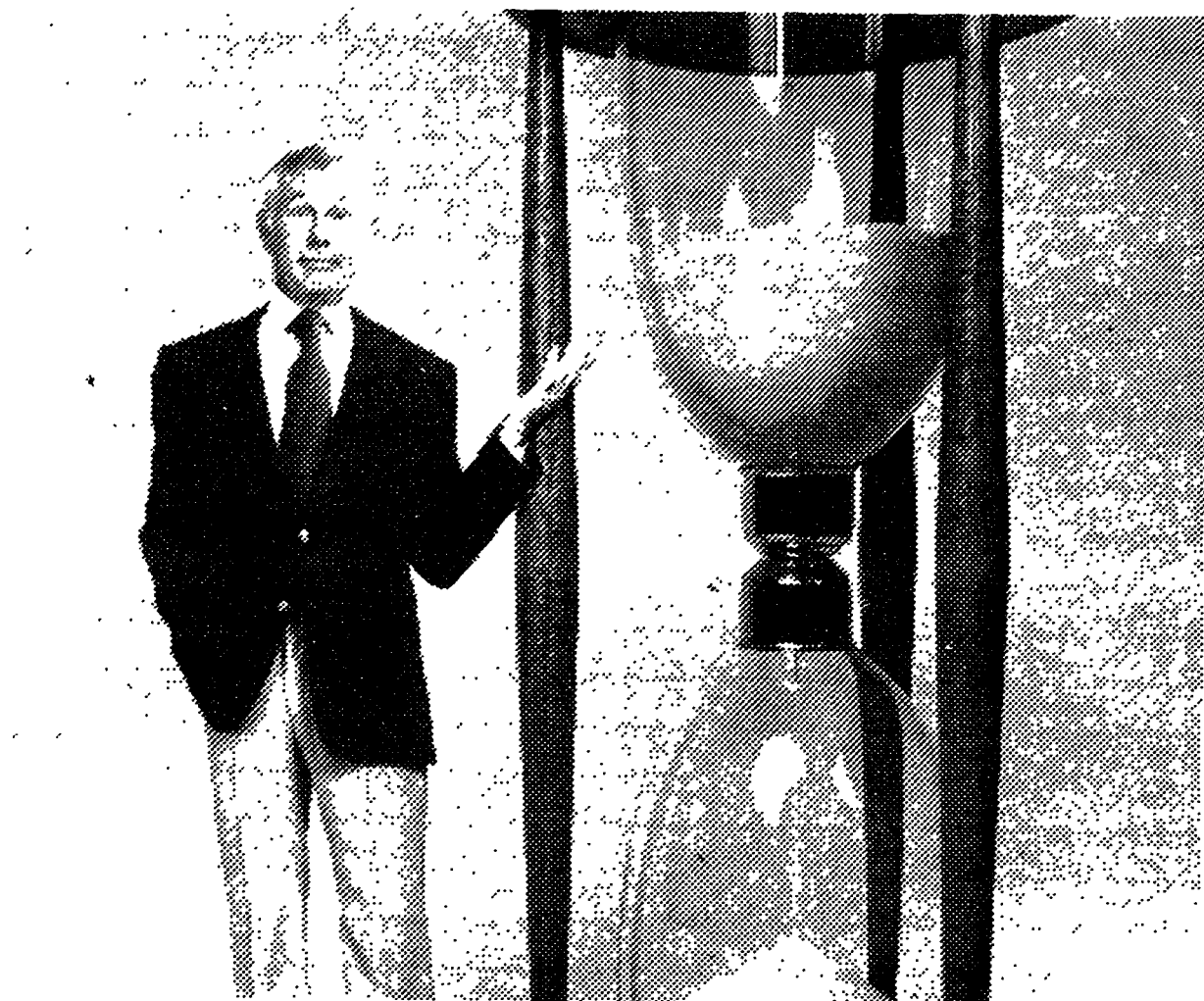

Apparently, he doesn't do talk shows, he just makes movies about them.

Savage was also cast in Rob Reiner's *The Princess Bride*, *Vice Versa*, *The Wizard* and last year's *Little Monsters*, a family affair starring not only Fred, but his younger sister and brother.

Acting isn't so tough says Savage—and having to kiss his series girlfriend Danica McKellar isn't really bad. But, says the young star, a *Wonder Years* in which he had to appear in just his underwear "was embarrassing."

# Cable Comments

There was a quiet hum of dialogue throughout the halls and within every lounge. Yes, indeed, we were ener-

gized telecommunication specialists whose titles ranged from commissioner, cable coordinator, administrator, executive director, manager, operator to consultant. Professors and Doctors were intermingling with attorneys and accountants while engineers took their turns at engaging in challenging perspective twists.

'A Decade of Service' was the theme of the ten year anniversary conference for the National Association of Telecommunication Officers and Advisors that was held September 9-12 at the Hyatt Regency at Fairlane Town Center Dearborn, Michigan.

The workshops hosted experts in regulation, technology, municipal programming and administration/management. Washington attorneys and cable experts gave broad overviews of political congressional and legal developments in telecommunication policy reflecting on the activity in Washington DC over subjects addressed in the Cable Act of 1984. The House and the Senate, meanwhile, are discussing restructuring the policy over rate regulation, consumer and technical standards as well as structures to facilitate competition.

Understanding franchise issues was crucial in workshops. Cities throughout the country have begun to understand the importance of incorporating opportunities through telecommunication to provide more cost effective and efficient services to their residents.

Television and Computer applications about the pooling of public and private resources to bridge the gap

of previously autonomous bureaucracies filled many workshops.

The ever-changing role of local government, as it provides more services, focused upon the importance of Public Information Officers to use Cable as a public relations tool. Creative ideas were showcased for all jurisdictions and all-sized budgets. This included learning how to be everywhere your audience is and how to plan a media blitz.

The State of Michigan hosted a sizeable group of participating speakers including Larence Shepanek of Oakland Schools, Kathy Sherman of CATV CH. 8 in Southfield, David Teitmeyer of Farmington Hills, John Wilson of Troy, Gary Papierski of Artistic Studios in Livonia, Frank Dorsett of Birmingham, Robert Tamarelli of Birmingham, Paul Lewis of Southfield, and myself.

Many Michigan people participated in round table discussions including Nadine Maynard of Bloomfield Hills, Charlene Ladd of Ann Arbor, Neil Lehto of Sterling Heights, Kurt Giberson of Dearborn, Sue Dorris of Berkley, Charlene Jolly of Walled Lake, Ron Choura of the Governors Telecommunication Task Force of Lansing, Cheryl Mitchell of Royal Oak, Frank Jamison of Western University Kalamazoo, Dawn Flynn of East Lansing, Joan Burke of Kalamazoo, Carol Allmen of Lake Orion, Jim Zsenyuk of Huntington Woods and John Wilson of Troy.

Dr. Barry Orton of Madison, Wisconsin described the telecommunication environment thus: "The telecommunication environment is as a stadium where the cities are the gate and ground keepers; the fans are the citizens and the teams are the technological options of telecommunications." Understanding this analogy helps us forge into the future with a current understanding where our responsibilities lie. The games played in the stadium may change and therefore our understanding of the rules and strategies will be challenged. But each of us will continue to be better informed as we encourage more dialogue between the players so as to partnership our communities for a prosperous future!

# Dana Delany proud of 'China Beach' role

## Choice of television over films paid off

For actress Dana Delany, the role of Nurse Colleen McMurphy on ABC's "China Beach" is not just a portrayal that catapulted her to fame and fortune.

Although it did accomplish both of those things for the 34-year old actress, the Vietnam war series is also a project that evokes great pride in Delany.

Prior to "China Beach," Delany had worked steadily in acting for nearly 10 years, with roles on "Love Of Life" and "As The World Turns" to her credit, as well as Broadway and off-Broadway productions. But the spark that lit her career like a Roman candle was a guest spot on "Moonlighting." Delany received an influx of offers after that appearance, and delved heavily into feature film work.

Although she readily identified

with the McMurphy role, she was initially hesitant about taking a part in a series because of her blossoming film career. Among her feature film credits are "Where The River Runs Black," with Charles Durning, "Moon Over Parador," with Richard Dreyfuss, "Masquerade," with Rob Lowe and Meg Tilly, and "Patty Hearst," in which she played a member of the Symbionese Liberation Army.

Delany did take time this year to make a TV movie, which airs this week on CBS. She is paired with William Russ in "Promises To Keep" as a couple facing the tough decision of whether or not to place their four orphaned nephews in separate foster homes.

But for the most part, she chose to forego films for "China Beach."

Now the show is entering its third full season, and the Emmy-winning

actress knew from the beginning the role would be a source of pride. "The script for 'China Beach' was so good, I didn't want anybody else playing her," she says.

The series focuses of Delany's character, Nurse McMurphy, and depicts the war from the female perspective, looking at the futility of relationships and the uncertainties of events. She plays a strong, yet sensitive nurse who's not afraid to tell it as she sees it. "In features, this kind of part would go to Meryl Streep or Jessica Lange," she says proudly.

This season should present a new twist on the series, as flash forwards will show the characters as far into the future as 1985 and how the war changed the pattern of their lives.

"China Beach" has heightened awareness of women's roles in Vietnam. Nurse McMurphy is a strong character, a caring professional, not portrayed as a sex object. Delany, in fact, has said she likes her character's calmness, and even "macho" demeanor during the mass casualty scenes. She said it's not far from what her own reaction would be.

"I am very cool and composed in emotional situations," the actress says. "This girl is tough."

### Alex Trebek broke the odds and became a success

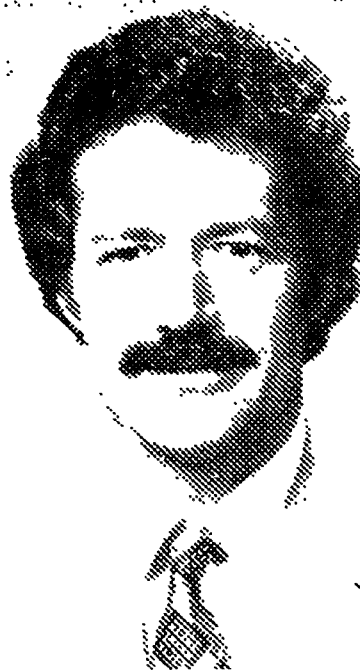

**Q: What information are you able to give about Alex Trebek? Some people say he recently married. If so, to whom? Does he have any children?** —*Ceola Snyder, McCook, Neb.*

**A:** Alex Trebek was born in Sudbury, Ontario, July 22, 1940. He graduated with a degree in philosophy from the University of Ottawa. Over the next 12 years, he worked with the Canadian Broadcasting Company doing a variety of programs. He broke into American game shows 15 years ago when his friend Alan Thicke was hired by NBC to develop a daytime game show. The show was *The Wizard Of Odds*. After a year the show was cancelled, but the host Trebek was a success. He has been hosting various shows and events since then. Previously married, he was divorced in 1981. This past year he married again. He and his wife, Jean, a real estate developer, reside in the Hollywood Hills. When he has the time, he enjoys golf, tennis, water-skiing and exotic travel. There is no mention of children.

**Q: A recent inquiry in your column about old Western stars prompted this question about another old Western cowboy, Rocky Lane. He was a favorite of mine as a kid, though I don't think he ever made it to the big time. Can you give any background information on him? His movies, age, etc.** —*Peg Jones, Burnet, Texas*

**A:** Rocky Lane passed away in 1973 at the age of 64. One of the most handsome of Republic's Western stars

in the '40s and early '50s, he entered movies in 1929 playing the romantic lead in a Louise Dresser-starrer, *Not Quite Decent*; through the '30s, billed simply as Allan Lane, he had similar roles in 25 other movies, including *Charlie Chan At The Olympics*, *Maid's Night Out*, *Twelve Crowded Hours* and *Panama Lady*. During the '40s he starred in several serials: *King Of The Royal Mounted*, *The Tiger Woman* and *King Of The Mounties*; his first starring Western, *Silver City Kid*, was followed by *Trail Of Kit Carson*, *Stagecoach To Monterey*, etc. He portrayed Red Ryder in eight more films before he became known as Allan "Rocky" Lane in 1947's *The Wild Frontier*. His career floundered with the demise of Westerns. He had

supporting roles in just three more films, his last being *Posse From Hell*. He ended his career as the voice of Mr. Ed, in TV's "talking horse" series.

**Q: For years I have been wondering what ever happened to Teresa Brewer. She was very popular in the 1950s. She had a great voice and made some big hit records. But after her last hit went out, so did she. I would like to see a list of all her hit songs and also the latest information you can get about her.** —*R.V. Watkins, Broken Bow, Okla.*

**A:** I too, have heard very little about Teresa Brewer. However, I have a fan club address you may write to for information: c/o Bill Munroe, 584 Prospect St., New Haven, CT 06511.

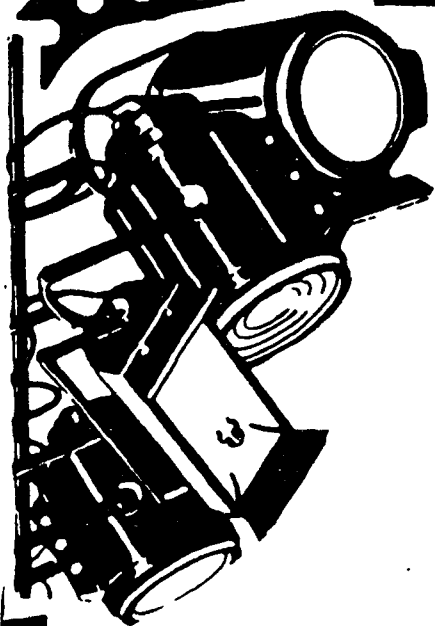

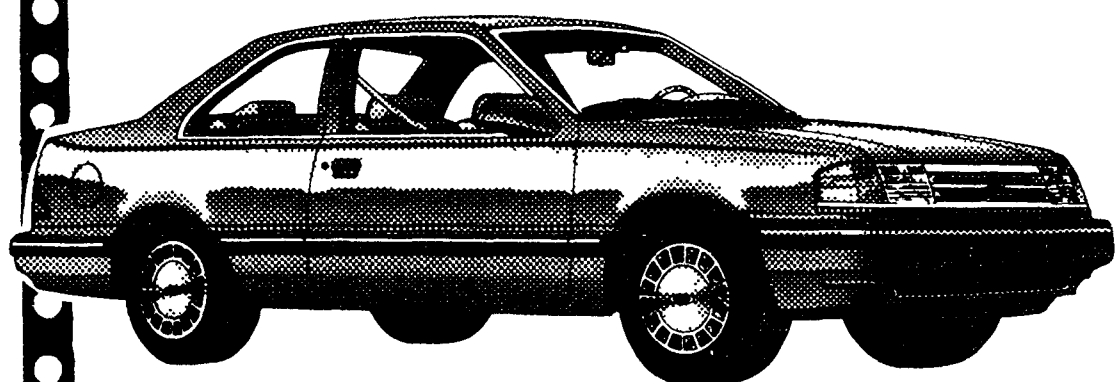

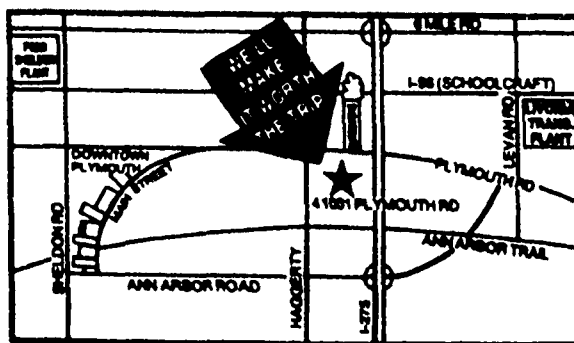
