ers approve school millage request

About 64 percent of voters approved a one-year, 1.28-mill tax increase for the Northville Public Schools Thursday, in an election that Superintendent George Bell said divided what was a cohesive district.

The voter turnout was better than expected with 4,657 voting; 2,949 voted yes, 1,705 no, and three ballots were invalid.

Some people present for the final tallying of the votes guessed more people voted in the millage election than in the 1988 presidential election.

Bell called the campaign the toughest he has seen, and blamed the state for forcing the district into

controversy over school funding. "It's a crime what's happening in

this state." Bell said. The millage increase will raise \$885,000 "recaptured" by the state this year in an attempt to equalize state funding among districts.

Future state funding is uncertain at this point, but the millage's success will postpone, at least for one year, drastic cuts.

The turnout was only about 24 percent of registered voters in the district, but it kept the election workers busy all day.

At Amerman Elementary School, voting precinct four, workers were having trouble fitting in a lunch

"It's so busy I can't catch up," the precinct chair, Shirley Beason, said at about 1 p.m.

But the real rush came when voters began to get off work.

Nervous board members, parents. and teachers gathered in the Old Village School after the polls closed to await the results.

Just before all of the results were in, teacher Bo Hall showed up in a T-

shirt printed with the words: "Expect Success." Under that shirt was another T-shirt reading: "Teachers Make the Difference."

Apparently, enough voters agreed to prevent the district from having to cut an expected 22 teachers if the millage had failed.

Most of the teachers whose jobs would have been cut were in their first year of their teaching career. Worries about these new teachers was what Bell said kept him up at night for two weeks before the

An explosion preceded a fire that gutted a downtown Northville business early Saturday, witnesses said. Witnesses reported an explosion in Tiffany Art Glass, 121 Main, at approximately 7:40 a.m. Saturday.

The shop, which specialized in stained-glass works

and antiques, is located above Holloway's Bakery. No one was injured in the blaze and firefighters reportedly confined fire damage to the one building. Water damage was reported in Holloway's Bakery.

Smoke plumes poured out of the building during early stages of the fire and shards of glass littered a good portion of Main Street. City firefighters brought the fire under control by 8:30 a.m.

SEMCOG studies urban sprawl

Call it fallout from the Auburn Mills mega-mall.

Call it the aftermath from the 1990 Earth Day.

For whatever reason, a shaken Southeast Michigan Council of Governments is taking a new look at urban sprawl — the phenomenon in which new buildings go up on farmland while the population is essentially stagnant, requiring a heavy public investment in roads, drains, sewers and utilities, while older areas and their infrastructures are abandoned.

We're first going to project the future of the region if development continues on its present course - a look at not doing anything," said Marilynn Gosling, a co-chair of the oversight committee studying regional development.

As Gosling sees it, the likely result is an eye-opening education process in which local officials agree that the cost in federal, state and local government infrastructure is too enormous for mega-malls to sprout indefinitely.

"We can't be a Big Brother," said her co-chair, E.A. Jackson Morris, supervisor of Pittsfield Township in Washtenaw County and a vice chair SEMCOG.

Gosling agreed: SEMCOG, a voluntary association of governments fought it in court and lost. for regional planning, itself won't stop urban sprawl. "SEMCOG cannot make decisions. But the people who are members of SEMCOG (local elected officials) are the decisionma kers," she said.

A final report will go to SEMCOG's general assembly in October of 1991.

Politicos oppose axing deduction

Local politicos are up in arms at talk in the U.S. Congress about eliminating state and local taxes as a deduction from the federal income taxes.

Without a dissent, the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments recently called on Michigan's congressional delegation to fight any proposal to restrict the deductibility of state or local taxes. SEMČOG is a seven-county

voluntary planning agency.

The deduction is one of the "loopholes" Congress is looking at as it seeks more revenue to reduce annual deficits projected at \$200

"Rust belt" states and cities, with high local taxes, are particularly alarmed. They say the congressional proposal discriminates against them. They note seven states have no income taxes: Alaska, Florida, Nevada, South Dakota, Texas, Washington and Wyoming.

They also note the plan is biased in favor of private over public institutions. For example, donations to a non-profit school or hospital would be deductible. but taxes for municipal hospitals and public schools would not be.

Briggs throws down gauntlet for debate

Democratic challenger Walter O. Briggs IV is offering to go to Washington, D.C., if necessary, to debate incumbent Bill Broomfield on issues pertaining to Oakland County and the 18th Congressional District, which includes Northville above Baseline Road.

A frustrated Briggs issued a press release offering to fly to the nation's capital in light of Broomfield's claim that he must remain in session and is too busy to debate.

"It's time voters in the 18th District had an opportunity to hear where Bill Broomfield and Walter Briggs stand on the issues," Briggs said. "I'm willing to debate Congressman Broomfield in Washington if he can't find the time to come back and face the voters.

Broomfield's chief administrative assistant, Jack Sinclair, reiterated that his boss simply couldn't find time to debate. "We have budget hearings and I really don't know when we'll get out of here."

Even when Broomfield does get home, his schedule is so tight he "won't have much time," said Sinclair. "He has a lot of commitments to constituents.

In a mailgram sent to Broomfield Aug. 30, Briggs proposed a series of If candidates like incumbent Carl.

Levin and challenger Bill Schuette can make the time for two debates, he and Broomfield should also be able to. talk issues, said Briggs, Levin, a Democratic senator, and

Schuette, a Republican U.S. Representative, are both colleagues of Broomfield in Congress. They debated on Sept. 6, and another is, scheduled for Oct. 8. It may be optimistic to expect...

Having taught courses in research and evaluation at the university graduate level. I designed a similar research study on classroom teaching methods, selected a sample to question and completed the same study in

I asked two principals, four teachers, the mail carrier, my lawn boy, my barber and my wife the following research question: "Should teachers use various methods of teaching as opposed to all lecture or all discussion?"

Amazingly, they came to the same conclusion. Different approaches should be used, they said, because pure lecture is boring and too much discussion without facts is a sharing of ignorance. And these findings didn't cost a million or more dollars.

U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, a senior member of the Educational Appropriations Committee in Washington, D.C., has a long-standing concern regarding expenditures of educational money for studies of the obvious.

He recently took me to Washington, D.C., to meet with Chris Cross, U.S. Department of Education deputy under-secretary for planning. research and evaluation. Cross had seven or eight of his staff there to answer questions of Pursell and me.

It was the first time a U.S. representative had met with the staff to

question them on the requested expenditures of approximately \$134 million for educational studies.

My position in the meeting was: 1. Most of the studies have been done be fore or can be found in doctoral dissertations in the library of local unitversities.

2. Some of the research, in fairness, has much merit and has contributed to education.

3. Field-initiated studies, studies by admirustrators and teachers in the kindergarten to grade 12 field, should occur.

4. Any study that proves a point should be followed with money for staff development and program implement atton. 5. And, finally, some of the re-

earch is a closely guarded joke, or as U.S. Sen. William Proxmire would say, a "Golden Fleece." Yes, education has its entries for



Plans include 1,600 new plantings

An estimated 600 trees were illegally destroyed over the past year by developers of the Thomson Sand and Gravel site, but the township seems willing to let bygones be bygones.

.Armed with developer assurances that 1.600 trees will be planted over the 366-acre site, the planning commission last week recommended to the township board a revised preliminary plat for the Shores of Northville subdivision.

 Four trees — two deciduous, two evergreen — will be planted in each of the development's 400 units, said Vincent DiLorenzo, Shores of Northville general partner.

A mining operations reclamation project engineered by D & T Construction of Mt. Clemens sparked controversy earlier this year when township officials discovered that hundreds of trees had been felled

without a permit A subsequent survey of the af-

fected area, much of which borders the Docksey subdivision, revealed that 4.75 acres of protected woodlands area was destroyed by the developer.

Township planning consultant Larry DeBrincat described the destroyed woodlands site.

DeBrincat said 4.75 acres were removed from an area just south of the Docksey subdivision. He calculated the woodlot contained approximately 126 8-inch caliper and larger trees. based on neighboring lots and aerial photographs.

In addition, 193 trees that had been surveyed are scheduled to be cut or already have been removed. DeBrincat said a total of 793 replacement trees with a 2.5-inch minimum caliper are needed to satisfy town-

ship requirements. DiLorenzo's pledge to plant at least 1,600 trees has prompted generally positive response

The township beautification commission made note of the tree replacement plan in a letter to the planning commission. The beautification commission is

pleased that the developer is willing to restore some of this value by planting at least 1,600 new trees," wrote beautification Chairperson Tina Sellas. Selias asked the planning com-

mission to encourage additional upgrading of the Shores of Northville periphery, including berms and trees planted along Six Mile and Seven Mile roads and Beck and Ridge roads.

Sellas also suggested cluster plantings and the use of diverse species during replacement.

DiLorzeno joined in the sudden mutual admiration club.

Free money available for businesses

I need better information about federal and state money programs. So far, what I've read about grants and loans for business owners has been either too generic or too complicated. Is there some book or reference manual you can recommend based on your experiences as a small business consultant?

Matthew Lesko, president of Information USA. has recently published an excellent reference manual called "Government Giveaways for Entrepre neurs" (Edition II). In it, Lesko not only presents answers to almost any question you may have on the subject of government money programs, but does so in an easy-to-read and humorous fashion.

Some of the major topics covered include: "How Other People Got Government Money," "Types of Money Available," "See a Winning Application First," "Your Chances of Getting the Money," and Federal Money Programs: 40 Free Money Programs." State money program information includes the types of money and help available by state. Lesko also reviews the venture capital option and lists several organizations and government agencies willing to invest in new or growing ventures for a percentage of equity.

Lesko's other topics are government giveaways. free government market studies, how to track state legislation, finding experts and free on-line databases. The manual costs \$29.95 by calling Information USA offices at 1-800-32-LESKO.

All dolled up

Dolls began as a hobby, but turned into a business

Blessed are those who parlay their hobbles into profit for they shall have fun and make money, too.

Livonia resident Lydia Sweatt (pronounced "Sweet") is among those fortunate few - and her success couldn't be

Within a year of opening her doll and collectible shop, Remembrance, in down-town Northville, Sweatt's shop already is paying for itself.

"According to my accountant, many retail businesses don't make it through the first two years and most won't realize a profit for the first two years," she said in the lace-curtained shop as a music box played in the background.

"Business far surpasses my expectations, but quite frankly, I'd be in it whether it made money or not," she said.

The Regina (a type of music box) sound system was tailor-made to fit the atmosphere Sweatt wanted to convey, of being

She doesn't deal in the everyday cutesy dolls, Barbies or even antiques, although she admits to buying those if one should catch her fancy and be in excellent

Rather, Sweatt specializes in new dolls by artists who have recently established themselves in the field. Some of the hothot ones among collectors are Annette Himstead (Sweatt's personal favorite for her "Barefoot Babies"), the team of Lothar Groessle/Gudrun Schmidt of Germany and Yolanda Bello.

"Doll collecting is more exciting than people realize because artists are considered more talented now. They're considered artists rather than doll makers," Sweatt said.

In the not-so-distant past, dolls were made only to be pretty. "In those days, they're made to be more like the real child," Sweatt said.

Limited-edition numbered dolls were produced 250 at a time for worldwide distribution by Groessle-Schmidt. The couple used their real-life son as a model for the sleeping, blonde doll "Robin."

Or Johanna, a 3- or 4-year-old imp in

blue-striped pinafore; her wild corkscrew, sinewy curls caught in two ponytails she's one angry little girl. She's sticking out her tongue, in fact. She's so angry her little fists are balled and the toes on her plump toddler feet are curled.

Sculptured detail on her facial features is so lifelike, one can feel the frown ridges on her forehead.

Johanna is a Groessle-Schmidt. She resembles another little barefoot toddler doll named "Lynn."

Each is immediately recognized as a Groessle-Schmidt because each artist's work is marked by his or her style, like a Picasso or a Van Gogh. "It's the style that intrigues people," Sweatt said.

It's also the style that causes people to shell out \$50 to \$10,000 for a particular artist's doll. "I have one client who said, "Every doll you have of theirs (Groessle-Schmidt), I want it!" Sweatt said.

Though she has been a life-long doll lover, (Sweatt's first doll at age 6 was a "Chatty Cathy," now worth thousands, Sweatt said.) Sweatt got into the business end of collecting strictly by accident.

Having married young and raised three children, she found herself in her late 30's with a desire to have her own business.

Her husband, Ron, a restaurateur in Detroit for 20 years, suggested a doll shop. "Everywhere we would travel in the world, I would buy dolls," Sweatt said.

Even when she was in a funk, she'd console herself with buying dolls rather than

The shop is modeled after her doll room at home. She used the same floral-striped, Victorian wallpaper and antique reproduction furniture, in and on which the dolls are displayed throughout the shop.

"It was a passion for me for years," she said. When I was upset or stressed, I'd go into the doll room and it would be so relaxing."

She may have spent a lot of time in the doll room after making the big decision to go into business. As a first time business

owner, she said she found the prospect and wicker prams all over the place. The "kind of scary."

But husband Ron proved a real asset. "He was totally supportive. He's developed an expertise himself and knows all the dolls by name," as well as their artists, Sweatt said.

He also accompanies her on buying trips during the year and has a good eye for what will sell," she said.

Still, it took her two years to accumulate the trappings for the shop before she opened. You could not move in my house. There were boxes, doll buggles, baby beds

storeroom in my basement is crammed with antiques.

Some of the furniture is munchkinsized reproductions, but all are props used to display the dolls in settings, rather than hide them in sterile glass cases.

But all the props are for sale. Sweatt said she'll just find more on which to arrange her favorite Annette Himstedt dolls: "Kaj," the wild-haired, lute-playing boy, or her Groessle-Schmidt doll, "Heddy."

As she put it: "That's the fun part - putting it all together."



Ratio of land cost to house price grows

"This land is your land, this land is

If folksinger Woody Guthrie were alive today, he'd have to drastically revise the lyrics to that once popular

In high-priced metropolitan areas, particularly along the waterfront, land affordability is just about extinct. That, in turn, drives up housing costs.

The land/house price ratio is normally around 32 percent," said Donna Regner, supervisor of construction lending for Comerica Bank.

In 1980, land represented a mere 10 to 15 percent of the total cost of new housing. In 1990, land acquisition can account for more than half the total cost, depending on location.

"If we're talking lakefront property, the land/house ratio could be as much as 50 or 55 percent," Regner said. The more expensive the land, the more expensive the home. We look at the whole appraised value. I've seen (land) account for as high as 58 percent on a lake in West Bloomfield.

Orchard Lake property is also at premium price, according to Regner. Communities like Livonia and Plymouth hover around 32 percent, she

"Ive heard some stories that are just wild," said James Bonadeo, president of Bonadeo Construction in Plymouth Township.

"It's like an auction. People who have the money will keep bidding until they get what they want. On the lakes, there's just no control over land costs.

Builder Tom Schroder of Corner-

stone Building in Novi has seen the land-price-to-house ratio above 70 percent on lakefront property. He has built homes in the Highland, Milford, Brighton area in addition to western Wayne County and Farmington Hills.

"It can get way out of proportion," he said. "In the early '80s land was a fourth or fifth of today's cost."

Many factors account for the tremendous cost of land acquisition, according to Bonadeo. He spun a scenario based on land selling for \$20,000 per acre.

The developer buys 50 acres. First, there's the Department of Natural Resources, who says 10 acres can't be built on. Now your cost is \$30,000 per acre.

"Next you go through the township, county and state boards — 21 different boards. This process takes 20 months, during which time you've paid taxes and interest on the

Then you get ready to build houses, and there are more regulations. For instance, safety glass must be installed on any window 18 inches above the floor. That gets costly."

In days gone by, builders were responsible for paving roads in new subdivisions. Today, they must sow seed for 15 feet on each side of the road. They also have to plant trees.

"All these costs are charged off the land," Bonadeo said. "Builders pay for every improvement on a lot. Afterward, the city charges \$40 per linear foot for future sewer and water lines.

"It's a Catch-22 situation," he said. "It's nobody's fault and it's every-body's fault."



Land costs are increasing at a faster rate than building costs, especially around the lakes

Despite the high cost, Bonadeo says, "land here is almost free compared to the rest of the world."

Bulletin can help plan a greenhouse

You hate to see the outdoor growing season wind down. You'd like to start your own garden transplants in the spring. You feel so bad when your houseplants suffer the low-light winter blues.

If you're nodding in agreement at this point, there's a good chance that you've given some thought to building a home greenhouse. You may even have toyed with the idea of making a greenhouse serve as a solar collector, too

So what stopped you? Needed more information? It's as close as your county Cooperative Extension Service office.

Through the county office or directly from the bulletin office at Michigan State University, you can buy a copy of Extension bulletin E-1784, "Solar Greenhouses for the

It explains the differences between a solar greenhouse and a conventional greenhouse and an active and passive solar system. It discusses intended use, design, materials, costs, local geographic and climatic conditions, and other factors you need to consider before you pick up a

In Michigan, an added-on solar greenhouse can serve as a solar collector and provide supplemental heat for the building to which it's attached. In the coldest months, however, the temperature in the greenhouse may fall too low to permit year-round growing of plants without added heat.

You need to decide early on whether you'll heat the greenhouse in the winter so you can use it yearround or whether you'll use it to extend the outdoor gardening season in spring and fall. That decision will affect design and construction. It will also influence the cost of building and operating the structure. The bulletin provides fairly detailed information on the various options to help you make a sound decision.

If you're already handy with t the bulletin to build not only several styles of greenhouses, but also hotbeds, coldframes, and a plant germination and growth unit with flourescent lighting. If you're not the do-ityourself type, you can use the information in the bulletin to help you choose from greenhouses available from kits or built on-site by local

The Cooperative Extension Service has a wide range of publications and videotapes on gardening topics and a multitude of other subjects. You can get a catalog from the county Extension office or from the Extension Bulletion Office, 10B Agriculture Hall, East Lansing 48824-1039.

Adult swim would discriminate

Our board voted to have an adult swim on certain evenings, which represent a small percentage of the time that the pool is open. One of the parents threatened to bring a lawsuit claiming that her child's civil rights were violated. In your opinion, can we have an adult swimming time (18 and over) for a reasonable period of time?

Amendments to the Fair Housing Act have made it clear that a condominium or apartment complex cannot discriminate against children in the use of their facilities. Because of severe problems in the past with discrimination against families, the rules are stringent.


Clearly a swimming pool is a "facility," so it is blect to the act. The oard should not make any you can use the plans in the back of restrictions based on age. A rule requiring that small children be accompanied by an adult would be permissible because it does not exclude children and because it has a basis other than that the child is not an adult. Another possibility is for a group of co-owners to have a swim party later in the evening, when children are less likely to

I am the co-owner in a condominium where the board has instructed that all requests be sent to the board in writing, which i do even though the majority of the co-owners call the board members. Apparently my requests irritate the board. The reply to my letter was carbon copied to all of the other members of the association. The board is trying to make me look like a bad co-owner and a constant complainer. is it legal for the board to circulate private correspondence to other co-owners? If not, what legal recourse do I have and to whom may I write who has the authority over the board's actions? I have asked the board for an apology and sent copies of same to the other co-owners but have not received a reply.

If in fact the board is intentionally attempting to embarrass you as a co-owner, you may have legal redress against the board and the association. To the extent that dissemination of board decisions and correspondence are made to the co-owners. there may be what is called a "qualified privilege" on the part of the board to do so, so long as it is not done for malicious purposes or to unnecessarily embarrass or harass a co-owner.

It appears that in this instance the board is attempting to unduly embarrass you because there appears to be no legitimate reason for them to circulate your letters, unless they are doing so with respect to the other co-owners complaints as well. You may well have a legitimate claim against the board and the association for invasion of privacy and may wish to consult legal counsel.

Grow new plants from cuttings

Coleus, impatiens and geraniums grow readily from cuttings and now is the time to get a head-start on the growing season for next year. You might like to try this method.

Cut strong healthy stems about six inches long (just below a node -the place where the leaf or bud meets the stem); trim off the bottom leaves and brush a rooting hormone on each stem end. Insert the cuttings in moistened vermiculite and place them in indirect but bright light.

You may want to cover the container with plastic, making a minigreenhouse. If many cuttings are taken, a rather shallow container works fine for this purpose. Cuttings also root well in water, but the roots may be more brittle that way.

In several weeks, check (carefully) to see if the cuttings are rooted. When they are, transfer them into two three-inch pots, using any houseplant mixture, and water thoroughly. When you see tip growth starting, it is an indication that they need to again be transferred to larger pots. Do be careful not to disturb the roots when

the transfer is being made.
I used a different (and simpler)

method last year with geraniums and they grew just fine. In fact, they have been blooming all summer long on the deck.

I took cuttings as above, but planted them directly into houseplant soil in a large clay pot and set it in a warm east basement window. I watered them a couple of times during the winter and in early March, I cut the taller ones back to 6-8 inches and then watered them regularly until time to set the whole pot outdoors. They were fertilized when I increased the water. I gradually exposed them to more light to accli-

mate them to the bright outdoors. Elvin McDonald of the Brooklyn Botanical Garden tells how to propagate deciduous shrubs at this time of year when they have shed their leaves. The method takes quite a bit longer than with annuals, but if you want to try your hand, the results of this gardening endeavor can be

worthwhile. Mock-orange, forsythia, euony-

mus and cotoneaster are some of the more popular shrubs that may produce results. Cuttings about the size of a pencil with three or four nodes work best. If you want to cut several shoots from one branch, that is OK. but be sure to cut the ends/bottom in a slant so that you will be able to tell the top from the bottom.

Make a bundle of about 10 cuttings with bottom ends even. Tle them loosely together and label the bundle. Now find a spot in the garden that has excellent drainage, dig a trench 18-24 inches deep and where the temperature will remain 40-50 degrees F, perhaps a sheltered area close to a building. Add about two inches of sand and lay the bundles on the sand. Cover with about 12 inches of soil, sand, peat moss or sawdust, then mulch with leaves or pine

By next spring the cuttings will be ready to be moved to an area where they can grow until they are large enough to be planted in a permanent location. In April, I will explain the best way to do this.

Real men do eat finger sandwiches

To quote Andy Warhol, "Everyone is famous for 15 minutes."

Quite frequently I will be standing in line at the grocery store or walking through a mall and get stopped by folks like you who usually say, You don't look at all like the picture that runs on Monday."

Being almost six-foot-seven, with weight appor-tioned to height, I get noticed. Come to think, of it, it's kind of hard not to get noticed when you're my size. Yes it is true that I get paid to eat. It's a tough assignment, but somebody has to do it.

But you don't have to be a card-carrying, 98-pound wimp to enjoy tea sandwiches. You know what I'm talking about. Those frilly little sandwiches that used to have their crusts removed and were spread with the likes of watercress, cream cheese, avocado and other tasty fillings and were more commonly enjoyed during Gatsby-era garden parties.

Tea sandwiches are experiencing a rebirth and once again are finding their way to the trays of experienced hosts and hostesses around metro Detroit. At one time only reserved for serving with tea, these demure little sandwiches are now making headway in upscale picnic baskets and coolers all over town. But forget the boiled ham slices and olive loaf — these sandwiches are being stuffed with unusual mixtures that will please the palates of 8 to 80-year-olds.

The fillings have pretty much stayed the same.

with the usual watercress and pate-like ground meats. What has taken on a noticeable change are the wrappings.

Gone are the days of Wonder bread slices trimmed of their crusts. Instead we have stone ground wheats, fortified ryes that could accompany a hearty winter soup, delicate sourdoughs and crusted French baguettes. Pita bread triangles closed with frilly elongated wooden toothpicks and soft corn and flour tortillas are presently the rage — not to be outdone by foot-long sub-type sandwiches that have the eater slicing off a desired wedge with a wooden-handled, serrated bread knife.

Pair these little finger sandwiches with a bag of chilled grapes and a few slices of imported cheese, and today's kitchen culinarian can wrap up a tasty lunch or light dinner with minimal exertion and maximum raves from any who partake. You don't have to be Upper-East-Side Manhattanish and supply china cups and plates. A few bottles of trendy German beers or wine coolers or a randomly picked assortment of sparkling waters can do for these sandwiches what \$60 per pound tea would do.

The Janes Gang got pretty tired of ironing our red and white checked damask picnic tablecloth and instead switched to a brightly colored flat sheet on which to spread the repast. To keep the picnic basket as light as possible for traveling, the sandwiches can either be stacked in plastic containers lined with lettuce leaf or, for a little added presentation, wrapped in pastel-colored tissue and tied with thin matching ribbons.

When it comes to fillings for the assortment of travels should not have mayonnaise or salad dressing, which spoil easily. Aslways remember to "keep hot foods hot and cold foods cold."

For a zesty alternative to mayonnaise, try a blend of four parts imported mustard to one part olive oil. This will act as a stabilizer when trying to hold chopped meats and poultry inside a

If you think that all tea sandwiches belong on silver platters served only by white-gloved butlers at 4 in the afternoon, let me squelch all previous rumors. Even us big guys eat 'em - and love



The Breakfast Club Schoolcraft dishes up delights

For most of us, breakfast is a chore rather than a treat.

Our brains are still fuzzy, our eyes droop, our mouths are sticky. We can barely put a sentence together, let alone a meal. A balanced, nutritious meal is hard to come by under these conditions, and one that tastes good is practically out of the question.

Oh, sure, you can stop by the local fast-food joint, or sit down at Denny's or Big Boy, where the menu still features the same basic stuff it had 10 years ago - and stuff you could easily cook yourself by getting up a half-

For something creative and unique in the morning, try the gourmet breakfast at the Culinary Arts School at Schoolcraft College. For a mere pittance, you can fill up on some of the latest lessons as they are being

learned by tomorrow's fine chefs.
No stack of pancakes and bowl of Wheaties here. The fare is very upscale, though the prices are not. Everything is made by the students from scratch.

We have an a la carte menu which means people can have what they want cooked to order," said Chef Mary Brady, who oversees students as they whip up breakfast. "We also have a buffet on Thursday."

The buffet is a true bargain at \$2.99, and features such items as cranberry whole wheat pancakes, pesto scrambled eggs and blintzes. A la carte items change daily, but are rarely more than \$4.

"It's a very different type of breakfast," Brady said. "It's not two-overeasy-bacon-hashbrowns-and-white-Wonder-bread. There's lot of imagination here."

And there are plenty of nutritious options. There are egg-white-only omelettes and other low-fat and lowcholesterol alternatives.

Sylvia Hayes, a marketing instructor in the Culinary Arts Department and frequent customer for breakfast. gave the nutritious side of the menu high marks.

(Chef Brady) is watching out for my health," she said. "She has them make up all kinds of nutritious things for me, and it tastes delicious. They can even make a sausage without any fat."

The school makes all its own sausages in the meat-cutting department headed by Chef John Vanderwouw of Northville. There the students learn butchering, use of spices, and smoking techniques, among other things. The meat shop is equipped with two

"A lot of things go on in this little corner," said Vanderwouw.

What comes out is a flavorful bounty that leaves any sausage you've ever had before in the dust. At the lirst Thursday bullet last week five different kinds of sausages were available, with fillings like chicken, ham, and smoked veal and wild mushrooms.

On the buffet line, student Mike Burley was preparing open-face eggwhite fritattas with fresh vegetable

filling, and doing a brisk business. "I like them (fritattas)," he said. *But they're usually gone before I get a chance to eat them."

Within minutes, he was out of eggs

The atmosphere is typical college cafeteria: students sitting crosslegged in vinyl chairs at formica tables. Often the students have their noses buried in textbooks as they fill their mouths with gourmet fare.

Schoolcraft staffers and workers from nearby office buildings mingle. too, and the informal ambience makes for frequent conversation with

This is great exposure for the students," said Jim Utley, a research technician at the college. They experience what it's actually like to be in the workplace. They're in a controlled situation, but they're getting all the exposure they would get on the

*Can you imagine having no outlet for the food, and having to prepare little pieces so they don't waste too much?

Schoolcraft has a highly respected program, and instructors and students win medals regularly in nationwide competition. Chef Jeff Gabriel said graduates often step right into jobs as sous chefs at places like the Rattlesnake Club, the Whitney, the Franklin Hills Country Club, or Novi's Too Chez.

Said Brady, "They're the future of our industry. These are the people that will be cooking for us for the next

Aging wine is a science in itself

In this column, frequent mention of aging or cellaring wine is made. Just how much care does bottled wine

Wine ages and matures as a result of a multitude of chemical changes that eventually reach what is often referred to as a wine's peak.

This peak, or optimum drinking time, is actually more like a plateau. As a rule of thumb for most dry, white table wines, that period is two to three years. Generally, red wines stay on the plateau five years, with the world's greatest red wines maintaining optimum drinking for 10 to 20 years or longer. The enemies of wine ageability are heat, cold, oxygen.

excessive handling, and time. Wines can be stored safely from 40 degrees to 65 degrees Farenheit. If rapid fluctuations of more than 5 degrees to 10 degrees Farenheit occur, the wine may be adversely affected. The cork may work loose due to sudden pressure changes, allowing exposure to air or leakage of wine.

Proper storage temperature depends on the wine's age and how long you wish to keep it. If you cellar wine to drink in a year or two, a warmer temperature (60 degrees to 65 degrees farenheit) will speed development of bottle bouquet.

If your intention is to cellar wine for a longer period of time, cooler temperatures are essential.

Chemical reaction rates generally double with every temperature increase of 18 degrees farenheit. Therefore, wine storage over 70 degrees Farenheit can cause undesireable changes. White wines benefit from cooler storage because the fruity character dissipates more rapidly at warmer temperatures.

A wine bottle should be stored on its side or upsidedown to keep the cork wet. As long as the cork remains wet, the transmission of air through the cork into the

When wines are stored upright, the cork dries out and oxygen in the air will rapidly cause chemical changes in the wine, thus spoiling it.

Wine bottle corks begin to deteriorate after about ten years. If the cork is crumbly, it needs to be replaced in order to maintain a proper seal. Getting wine recorked is possible, but not easy. The best suggestion here --

We discussed what makes an ageable cabernet sauvignon with several Sonoma County winemakers.

When it comes to making a cabernet sauvignon that will last, I put away all restraints," contends Lance Cutler, winemaker at Gundlach-Bundschu Winery. "I let the grape give me everything its got — alcohol, tannin and fruit. I also use new oak barrels. If you want a wine you can't begin to drink for five years and expect to live for another 10, you have to pack it in."

Cutler sums it all up, "Buy the oldest Gundlach-Bundschu Cabernet Sauvignon you can find."

Dave Ramey, winemaker at Chalk Hill Winery, says Years ago, the University of California at Davis was helping put the wine industry back on its feet following prohibition. They provided guidelines to aid winemakers in producing commercially-acceptable products. The guidelines were not those needed to make great, longlasting cabernets.

"Our techniques may seem to be reverting to oldworld methods, but we are paying closer attention to overall vine health, degree of stress — as evidenced by leaf coloration and defoliation near harvest - and the taste of the fruit. When it gets close to harvest, it is most important to get out and walk the vineyard."

John Hawley, winemaker at Clos du Bois Winery maintains that "Fruity Cabernets age better than herbal, vegetative ones. During the winemaking process, it is also important to minimize the extraction of hard, bitter tannins that come from stems and seeds.

They do not disappear with age. This can be achieved by controlled, light pressing. Old wines, having lost much of their youthful fruit, may still remain hard, bitter and astringent because of the type of tannins they were "born with."

This techy lingo can be summed up easily. If a young red wine does not taste good when it's young, it won't get better with bottle aging. Red wines do round out with cellaring, and they do develop a bottle bouquet.

If, however, red wines are hard, bitter, tannic and astringent when young, they'll age ungracefully and be hard, bitter, tannic, astringent old wines!

Hors d'ouvres get things started

No course of a meal offers a cook more exciting variety than appetizers. They range from spreads and mousses to country pates, dainty stuffed eggs, cold "finger foods" and hot savories.

Virtually every cooking method known to man, and any ingredient can be used to make these delightful dishes meant to "whet the appetite" for the meal to follow. Hors d'œuvres offer a tremendous opportunity to be creative. Variations are endless.

Appetizers originated in Western Europe when wealthy Russians moved in - mainly to Paris, but also to Rome, Madrid and London. In Paris, at the demand of the Russian emigres, appetizers became a meal in themselves. A whole trade developed to cater to this first course meal. It was the Russian custom to taste several small dishes before the main meal . . . with vodka.

French chefs refused to cook this type of food on demand so hotel owners added a new category to their me-

nus, hors d'euvres or, "brought in from the outside." Hotels literally served food prepared outside their

Hors d'oeuvres are beautiful to look at. They must be made from the freshest ingredients, and artistically prepared and presented. Done correctly each should be as uniform as all the others of its kind. Arrange only one type of hors d' oeuvre per platter or serving piece, avoiding choices.

The visual effect of a tray filled with perfect, bite-sized morsels of the ame variety is stunning. Any garnishes must be just as beautiful as the appetizer, and chosen for enhancement of the main item. The display should be simple and beautiful.

Flowers, ribbon, fresh herbs, herbs and lace are wonderful for decorations. A tray not garnished looks bare next to one with a sprig of herbs or dotted with edible flowers.

A well-equipped kitchen makes preparation much simpler. Expensive tools are not required and can be found in kitchen supply stores or through mail order catalogs. I have found many items in garage sales and I am always on the look-out for unusual molds, serving dishes and utensils. One of life's true pleasures is finding a unique piece of equipment when least expected.

Some tools I find very useful are: a food processor; blender; hand and counter mixer; sharp, high-quality knives (chef's, paring, boning, slicing); an assortment of miniature quiche and tartlet pans; pastry bags; assorted trays; baskets and "odd" serving dishes. As you become more proficient so will your equipment.

Probably the most versatile form of entertaining is the cocktail party. It is one of the easiest ways to entertain at home, whether formal or casual. Light hors d'oeuvres are passed or set on a buffet table (or tables) and served with beverages for two to three hours. Replenish as needed.

The number of pieces per person varies with the type of occasion. If dinner is to be served light selections should be made. If appetizers are all the food to its served they must be more substantial. Examples would be a barbecue, antipasto or tapas

When selecting an appetizer always bear in mind the rest of the menu. It is important not to repeat ingredients or dominant flavors. Consider the occasion, season, and your imagination when making your choices.

Remember to give some time and attention to beverages and glassware. For large parties it is preferable to rent while smaller intimate gatherings can provide a chance to show off a special glass or dish collection.

Situate the food and drink throughout your home to avoid large groups lingering in one or two spots. Force your quests to mingle. When making up guest lists include people that will compliment each other, not all of the same background. My favorite parties have had people of all ages and walks of life in attendance.

Book catalogues our heritage

This book has been in my mind for 20 years," says Novi businessman Doug Miller. The real reason? Because people are so ignorant of the

country they live in. Miller, a part owner of R&RIndustries, a machine shop in Novi, felt so strongly about the average American's lack of geographical and historical knowledge that he decided to do something about it.

On Aug. 10 of this year, the Webberville resident published a book called "Our United States." Designed like a calender, the book has a spirial binding and has information on each of the fifty states in alphabetical order. The top page has each state highlighted on a map of the U.S.; while the bottom page gives statisti-cal information and brief paragraphs on history, geography and economy for each state.

The book also includes the order in which states were admitted to the union and on what dates; the pledge of allegiance; and a list of all 41 U.S. Presidents. Miller says he learned a lot during the two years he spent putting the book together.

The roughest one for me to do was the District of Columbia," Miller says. I always wanted to know where a state got its name from. So we dug up all the name origins of every state . . . and the District of Columbia was a real devil. I couldn't find out where it got its name. I finally found it. It's named after Christopher Columbus.*

The cover of the book features a montage of American icons including the Declaration of Independence, which Miller wanted to include in the text, but was too long; the flag, the statue of liberty, the space shuttle and Miller's maternal cousin, Abraham Lincoln.

Rather than deal with the large New York publishing houses, Miller self-published, and had his book printed by Book Crafters in Chelsea.

They did a good job on it," Miller says of his publishers. They did the book exactly as I wanted it, as far as paper weight and all. I wanted to make sure the book used a heavier paper so there would be durability."

I found a literary agent in Royal Oak who wanted several hundred process of getting an ISBN (Interna-dollars just to read it. Then, if he liked tional standard book number) a



"I think you could do a lot of sequels with this book," Miller says. My plan would be to do Mexico, which is divided into states as we are, and then the provinces of Canada. Actually, you could take literally every country in the world."

Although Miller says there is room for many sequels, he also says that he would like to live in European countries before writing books on them. He also might include the U.S. possessions in future printings of Our United States.

He dealt with a variety of sources in accumulating his information and initially wrote to the chamber of commerce of each state. Other sources include encyclopedias, travel guides, and dictionaries.

Miller says writing the book was a good experience and that he learned

a lot. "I never thought of it in that aspect when I started," he says.

The publishing goal for this book is five million copies. About 11,000 copies have been published so far, and, although the book is not yet available in stores, it can be ordered from Miller at P.O. Box 994, Novi 48376. The phone number is (313)

The cost for the book, which comes in a shrink-wrapped plastic bag, is \$14.95.

Miller is a member of the Michigan Publisher's Association which meets in Lansing every other month.

Miller recommended that writers interested in knowing what expectations publishers have concerning submissions, should consult the Writer's Market, an annual reference book listing practically every book and magazine publisher in existence.

Actor treasures move from film to television

Joe Pantoliano doesn't worry about getting bogged down with his work on the new NBC series *The Fanelli Boys*.

The actor, who has been seen in big-grossing feature films for the past 10 years, is actually looking forward to what others may consider the grind of weekly television.

"The medium is completely different from the mediums I've practiced in—theater and film and television—this is a combination. You're filming the show in front of a live audience, so you're getting the immediate response, but the cameras are covering you like you're on film, so you can't really play the audience because then you'd be too large for the people that are going to watch you on television. It's a medium that intrigues me in terms of conquering it," he said.

Pantoliano has always loved the challenge of conquering new things. Having "slipped through" grade school in Hoboken, N.J., the actor was evaluated with having a third grade reading equivalency when he was in

high school. With the help of a concerned history teacher and a tutor, Pantoliano soon set a goal for himself. "It was just practice, I just needed to read and learn, my comprehension was good. So I started reading a book a week for like the next 10 years, and it got better."

Whether it was the ability to read or talent or both, Pantoliano has done well with acting.


Throughout the course of his 18-year professional acting career, Pantoliano has played Maggio in the miniseries From Here To Eternity, Gino in The Idolmaker, Guido the killer pimp in Risky Business, a photojournalist in The Mean Season, a punk rocker in Running Scared, Ritchie Valens' manager in La Bamba, and a retarded brother in Orphans, as well as many other roles.

Kay was one of the first people to have faith in the concept of Community Televison. She was the first to take the Garden Clubs and to share their colorful splendor. I will never forget what a wonderful time two of my staff people, Todd Whitman and Intern Julie Smith, had with Kay as she drove them all over the area introducing them to lovely gardens. They could hardly keep up with her.

Kay has traveled throughout the world as well as the United States. She used to take pictures with film.



Now she has a 8mm camcorder. Among the areas Kay has shared with us are: Iceland, New Zealand, Vienna, Austria, Rome, Italy, Africa, Israel, Japan, Venezuela, Ireland, Scotland, China, Tibet, Spain, Peru, the South Pacific, Switzer-

land, Iraq, the Phillippines, the Baltic States, the Orient, Alaska, the Galopogus Islands, the Colorado River, England, Yugoslavia, Sri Lanka and the lower Mississippi.

The emphasis of the program has been to show the people and well known sites of the visited area. Her advise to fellow travelers with a video camera is, "Think a smile!" Approach people in a pleasant way and everyone, everywhere, returns it. She always asks the people permission to tape them, especially parents. They have always been pleased.

When I asked Kay what could she share with us as result of traveling throughout the world she replied, "Except the Netherlands and Belgium the standard of living is much lower than ours. Yet people are happy and proud of what they have. They like to share what they have, too." Her favorite country is New Zealand as "the scenery is a microcosm of the world." There are mountains, hot springs, rain forests and large cities. "Christ Church, New Zealand, is a very British City, says Kay, "it looks more like the English than England."

For Kay the most work of the entire project is to edit all the footage afterwards. The decision making necessary to create a program that flows well is a lot of work. Editing doubles the television production time for her. MetroVision's staff works closely with her.

I asked Kay to give us a piece of advice. Her voice was full of warmth and enthusiasm as she chirped, "Do it now when you can!"

Look into your life. What do you already do? Who do you already know? Through Community Access Television you may have the knowhow to make a difference in someone else's life. Through Community Access Television you can add challenge and purpose to your life. All you have to do is share. This concept is what makes advertisers flock to be placed within network talk shows. If you have something to say, someone will be in the viewing audience to listen.

Randy Travis, Reba McEntire co-host CMA Awards show

Ceremonies mark another first for country's Randy Travis

Country star Randy Travis knows all about firsts. His first album, "Storms of Life" in 1986 became the first debut LP by a solo country performer to achieve platinum status in less than one year. He was also the youngest male singer ever to be inducted into the Grand Ole Opry.

His career undergoes another first on Monday, Oct. 8, when he takes the stage for the first time as host of an awards program. With Reba McEntire, Travis co-hosts "The 24th Annual Country Music Association Awards," to air live from Nashville's Grand Ole Opry House on CBS.

Travis, undoubtedly has won a good portion of awards, but this marks the first time he will officiate any of the ceremonies.

"I would imagine I'll feel a little nervous about it, especially being the first time. Working with Reba though, she's done it a couple of times before and she'll probably be fairly comfortable with it, so maybe she'll help me a little bit," Travis speculated.

In addition to serving as host,

Travis is also up for two awards this year, Entertainer of the Year and Music Video of the Year for "He Walked On Water." Likewise his cohost McEntire is up for two awards, Vocal Event of the Year, for her performance with Vince Gill, and Female Vocalist of the Year.

The singer/songwriter remains low-key, yet fully appreciative about the multitude of awards he has won from The Country Music Association, The Academy of Country Music, Music City News and others. Now a multiple Grammy Award-winner, too, Travis received the CMA's Horizon Award, an award given to newcomers, as recently as

The years have gone by so quick it just seems amazing to me. It's just hard to imagine. It's hard to imagine the awards that I've won, and the record sales. All that was such a surprise anyway. 




Eric Pierpoint's youth spent accompanying journalist dad

Q: I am fascinated by the young actor, Eric Pierpoint who plays George in Alien Nation. How did he get started in show business? Is he married? — Vivian Pollard, Lenox, Iowa

A: Eric Pierpoint was born in Redlands, Calif., Nov. 18, 1944. Growing up as the son of CBS correspondent Robert Pierpoint, Eric has wonderfully jaded memories of flying on the presidential press plane in the 1960s, his dad's typewriter in tow. Traveling with those many salty press corps characters perhaps prepared him for his many travels in theater. He attended the Landon School and Walt Whitman High School in Bethesda. Md., excelling at soccer and tennis. But by the end of his college days at the University of Redlands and Catholic University, he knew an athletic career wasn't in his future. So he "shifted to theater as a means of expression." During the 1977-78 theatrical season, a year he considers to be "the biggest influence" on his career, Eric joined up with the National Players touring company to take classical theater on the road, dropping Shakespeare into towns around the States. He was married once, but at present has no immediate family. His TV credits include a recurring role on Hill Street Blues, a series regular part on Fame, a starring role in the series Hot Pursuit, and starring roles in Bud Greenspan's documentaries on the 1932 and '36 Olympics.
