## sparks

The Northville First United Methodist Church was not the 'marketplace of ideas' its members had hoped it would be when they permitted an open forum to be held in their building to discuss the Michigan health model Thursday night.

The pastor of the church had to calm a shouting match between organizers and attendees of the event. Further, the pastor was openly critical of the forum's organizers for not allowing opposition opinion to be heard.

The meeting lost its "open forum" status, according to the organizers, when Northville administrators and Board of Education members declined to attend.

About 250 people — mostly but not entirely Northville residents — did attend, with several people on both sides of the controversy surrounding the Michigan Model for Comprehensive School Health Education present.

The health model is used in Northville to fulfill a state requirement for health education.

Founder of the DADS Foundation and former professional soccer coach Bob Lemieux spoke against the model.

When a man raised a question during Lemieux's speech, Lemieux gave an "uncharitable response," said the church pastor, Eric Hammar.

Lemieux read a breathing exercise directly from a former seventh-grade exercise in the Michigan Model for Comprehensive School Health Education.

The breathing exercise, which directs the teacher to count backward from 10, has been removed from the program. Lemieux said that although the program has been removed he "is not letting (the state) off the hook that easy."

Lemieux addressed a man in the audience with a comment after he finished reading the exercise.

"What's wrong with it?" Jerry Rupley, a member of the church, asked.

"It sounds like Lamaze," said another audience member.

Lemieux said he was just presenting the facts for individual interpretation by audience members.

"I'm just reading this material to you; if you don't find anything wrong with it, (there is) nothing wrong with it," Lemieux said. "I guess you're at the wrong meeting."

## General election tomorrow

Northville residents will vote on two local issues at Tuesday's election — a township request for renewal of a .33-mill fire millage and a city request for approval of \$1.6 million in street repair bonds.

Township voters defeated a .5-mill request for fire department operations three months ago, and officials immediately placed a scaled-down version of the same request on the November ballot. The current .33-mill request would raise \$130,000 for the fire department.

Township officials argue that the millage is needed to avoid possible service cuts in 1991 — and certain cuts in 1992. Equipment, safety programs and staffing may suffer if the .33-mill request does not pass, they say.

Millage proponents also point out that a loss in equipment or services could lower the Fire Department's service ratings. Regression from the department's current status would cost taxpayers via their insurance premiums.

As the township's proposed budget now stands, all fire revenues will come from the general fund. Approval of the .33-mill plan will

remove the bulk of fire service costs from the general fund.

Opponents to the millage argue that defeat of the .33-mill fire department operations request will not cut fire services, because the department will still be funded out of the general fund.

Northville city is asking voters to approve \$1.6 million in general obligation bonds to fund continuing city street improvements.

The bonds will allow the city to finish a four-year street repair program, and continue repaving, recubing and landscaping many of the city's key downtown and residential streets

## Residents fight McDonald's on Six Mile Road

Quality of life. It's a familiar phrase to those who seek out Northville for its almost oasis-like atmosphere and rural feel.

And an apparent desire to protect that quality of life led to an emotional confrontation last week when the township planning commission heard a developer's request to build a McDonald's Restaurant near the Six Mile/Haggerty intersection.

Township residents clearly do not want any more cheeseburgers in their particular slice of paradise.

Word of a McDonald's site plan review spread like a grease fire prior to the Oct. 30 planning commission meeting. Vocal residents packed township hall and blasted McDonald's plan to build on a 1.5-acre site on the south side of Six Mile west of Haggerty.

If approved, the proposed fast-food restaurant would be placed next to a Standard Federal Bank building now under construction.

Residents and individual planning commissioners questioned the necessity of a third McDonald's in a three-mile area. The company presently operates restaurants on the corner of Five Mile and Haggerty and Eight Mile and Haggerty.

Chief among residents' concerns were increased traffic woes at the Six and Haggerty intersection and a perception that the 11,000-unit burger franchise is improper as a community gateway symbol.

"I think a McDonald's restaurant is inconsistent with the character of the township and the way that section is developing," commission Chairperson Charles DeLand said. "This is going to cause a lot of traffic ... (but) I don't know if there's anything we can do about it."

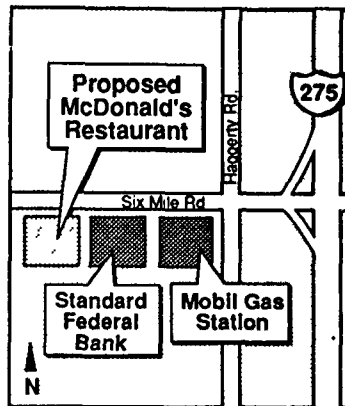
Township resident Jeanne Parzuchoski touched a recurring theme when she addressed the commission.

"I feel there are enough fast food restaurants in the geographical area," she said. "I think we're setting a precedent."

Residents also complained about traffic problems at the Six/Haggerty intersection and said the addition of a high-volume business like McDonald's would heighten driving woes and create a safety hazard.

But a major barrier exists to residents plans to thwart the restaurant.

Township planning consultant Claude Coates, of Vilcan-Leman & Associates, told planners a McDonald's is an acceptable use for a free-



way service district.

"A drive-in facility is allowed in such a district," he said. "It's a permitted use."

Coates said the site — which is located directly south of the proposed Ward Church property — "was intended to serve the freeway" under conditions of a 1986 master plan change along Haggerty Road. He said freeway service district zoning was intended to act as a buffer to sprawling Haggerty-fronted subdivisions.

"At the time it was a reasonable use," he said. "This specific plan (McDonald's) was not foreseen by us."

McDonald's spokesperson Bernie Whitman said he was surprised by residents' reaction to the site plan. He downplayed traffic impact concerns.

"I cannot see how we're going to create a traffic problem," he said. "We're a family restaurant; we're not a nuisance."

"Our peak hours do not coincide with peak travel hours," he added. "(As far as) the amount of additional traffic, McDonald's really is an impulse use. Over 70-percent decide to use our services when they see the arches."

Whitman did not return calls to the Record for additional information.

Planning Commissioner Larry Sheehan asked residents to ponder legal ramifications of the proposed site.

"We should have anticipated this when the master plan was changed," he said. "Today we have to make legal decisions. We can't look at it emotionally."

Planners then tabled the issue until Whitman could provide traffic impact statements.

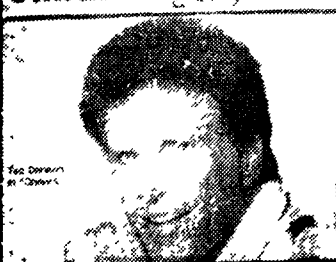

### FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

**UPDATE:** The Northville footballers made good on their first playoff appearance ever, pulling out a hair-raising 23-22 overtime win over Wyandotte.

## Footdragging cited in 'recapture' lawsuit

An attorney told his 56 school district clients, including Northville and Novi, that the state Court of Appeals has failed for seven weeks to take the first step in their \$72-million suit against the state.

"It borders on being scandalous," said Dennis Pollard, who filed the suit Sept. 13 on behalf of the districts.

The Birmingham attorney said he asked the appellate court to assign the Macomb Circuit Court their request for a preliminary injunction to prohibit the treasury from cutting their state aid.

"The court routinely could decide what forum to send adjudication of an injunction. Where's it going to be heard? We haven't heard," Pollard told his superintendent clients Thursday.

"In 'Durant' we had a decision (on assignment) within a week," said Pollard, referring to a similar suit he won on behalf of Fitzgerald School District in Macomb County against the state.

Pollard predicted the case could drag on 10 years or more.

Polard wants the appellate court to assign the new case to the same judge — George Deneweth — who upheld the school on every major legal point.

Ten percent of the state's 562 school districts — mainly in the metro suburbs and along the Great Lakes shores — are suing the state over the 1990 aid act. The law "recaptures" \$72 million of aid for special education teaching, special education transportation, bilingual teaching

ing and Social Security.

The "recapture" would cost Novi \$890,000 and Northville \$1.3 million this year.

The schools contend the Legislature violated the 1978 Headlee amendment to the Michigan Constitution by failing to pay for programs mandated by the state.

"That 'recapture' offends me," said Lawrence J. Nichols, superintendent of Royal Oak and former superintendent of Northville. "It says somehow we managed to sneak in, in the middle of the night, and stole it. The state government has failed to fund its own — not our — formula."

"Recapture" is a term coined by legislators.

The 56 plaintiffs are all "out of formula," meaning they receive no general state aid. The "recaptured" money was put into general state aid in a bill engineered by Reps. William Keith, D-Garden City, and James O'Neill, D-Saginaw, and Sen. Dan DeGroot, R-Port Huron.

Keith, chair of the House Education Committee, makes no secret of his desire to end all categorical aid. He wants to put the "recapture" money into formula aid and increase

the number of districts in the formula.

Currently about 70 percent of districts are in formula. Keith would increase that to 80 or 90 percent.

Many superintendents said the aid loss would force them either to make layoffs or ask voters for local property tax increases.

One superintendent asked Pollard if the appeals court's long delay were connected to the gubernatorial election.

"We have no idea what's going on," Pollard replied.

Both Gov. James Blanchard and his challenger, Sen. John Engler, supported the categorical aid cut. They and legislative leaders see it as necessary to reduce the funding gap between the richest districts (\$8,000 per pupil) and the poorest (barely \$2,500).

Nichols said that since 1978 the state routinely had underfunded categorical aid, but usually by only \$20 million. This year the underfunding leaped.

"Sad? Sordid? Yeah, I think so — a tale littered with broken promises," he said.

## Escape from Kuwait strains family

Mohammed, Renee and their four children thought their troubles were over when the family finally reached America after a harrowing escape from occupied Kuwait.

But the six have found little support in their continuing quest to locate employment and a permanent home.

The family temporarily moved in with Renee's parents, Robert and Jane Lattin of Northville. The eight lived in the Lattins' two-bedroom condominium since coming back to the United States Sept. 13, hardly an ideal situation for any of the family members involved.

"It's not large enough for eight people," June said. As Renee explained, "The thing that's hard for us is coming from someplace where you had a place to live, you had furniture, and now you have nothing. . . It's hard to explain to the kids."

Since their first talk with the *Record*, the family has found a temporary home in Farmington Hills, and Mohammed has been hired by a local firm. But the couple say they still need help paying their bills and furnishing the home.

The local relief organization Civic Concern is helping them find such assistance.

It's not as though the couple are strangers to the Northville community. Mohammed worked in Northville and as an engineering technician in Livonia before the family decided to move to Kuwait, where he has relatives.

Mohammed, who asked that his last name not be used for fear of retaliation against family members still living in Kuwait, found employment as a sales engineer there. Renee worked as well, in a preschool for handicapped children. The family lived just outside Kuwait City for

three years.

The couple decided to flee, Mohammed said, "when they (Iraqis) started looking for the Americans."

The family was contacted by the American Embassy after the Aug. 2 Iraqi invasion, and told of the demand by the Iraqi government that all foreigners report to hotels in Kuwait. "I decided not to go to the hotels because I knew they were just going to grab us and send us to Baghdad," Mohammed said. "At night I listened to 'Voice of America' and they advised Americans not to go."

Mohammed had first learned of the early morning invasion on his way to work that day. "It was a Thursday," he recalled. On his drive into Kuwait City, Mohammed said he came across barricaded streets, and people warned him that troops and tanks were roaming around the city. "So I just went home," he said. "I contacted the American Embassy and they said, 'Iraq has invaded.'"

But it was nearly a month before the family found a way out of the beleaguered country. Mohammed could not drive because of the driver's license that identified him as a United States citizen, and Renee could not even leave the house for fear that someone would recognize her as an American.

With the help of relatives, Mohammed eventually contacted officials at the Palestinian Embassy.

There he was given papers identifying he and his family as Palestinians.

They left their home by taxi on Aug. 28. "I had to pay the taxi driver \$2,000 just to take us to the Iraqi border," Mohammed recalled. Renee sat in the back seat with a veil across her face during the trip, to disguise her appearance as the taxi passed through checkpoints manned by Iraqi soldiers.

Because the Iraqi army had already sealed Kuwait's border with Saudi Arabia, the family had little choice but to drive through Iraq to escape.

Once they had crossed the border into Iraq, the six hitched a ride to Jordan with a truck driver hauling sheep and several Sri Lankans. "We went into Iraq and through all of their checkpoints . . . It took 24 hours to get to Jordan," Renee recalled.

Needless to say, Mohammed said, "We didn't stop to eat or anything."

At the Jordanian border, Renee said, "everything was in such a mess that they had people (from the American Embassy) stationed at the border, but nobody told us . . . nobody in Jordan seemed to think it was important." So the couple paid another taxi driver \$500 to drive them to the American Embassy in Amman, nearly 200 miles away.

Two weeks later, the family flew to the United States.

Though the fear has subsided, the family's frustration over what they left behind still lingers.

In Kuwait, they had a home, a car, a life of their own. They left it all behind. "Our car, our house, everything is just gone," Renee said. "You couldn't sell anything. And almost all our savings were used to get out of Kuwait."

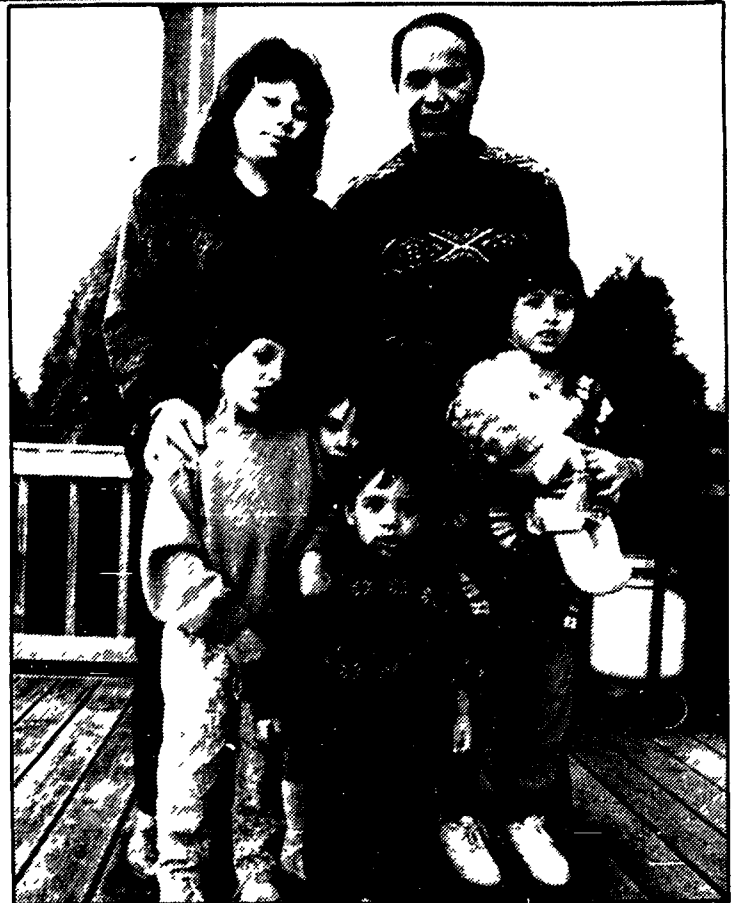
The family has been searching for a home since their arrival in Michigan in mid-September. "We started looking right away, but it's hard to find an apartment with four kids," Renee said. "One place I called, the lady asked how many kids I had and I said 'four.' She said, 'Well, you'll have to get rid of three of them.'"

The children, from daughter Giselle, 7, to son Khaled, 1, have also had a hard time adjusting to life since their escape. As their grandfather Robert recalled, "They came back and said 'The whole world is upside-down.'"

Also, because the family has had no permanent address, the older children have not yet been enrolled in school.

Mohammed's previous success finding employment and providing for his family makes his current situation all the more unbearable, he said, and the thought of accepting government handouts that much more unacceptable.

"I was doing fine here, I was doing fine in Kuwait, better in Kuwait," he said. "I couldn't stand just going into a welfare office, asking for money. I'm not coming here to live on welfare."

When Lemieux finished his speech a woman stood and began speaking. A shouting match ensued with several audience members joining in.

"Call the police; I didn't come to listen to you," someone yelled. The church pastor quieted the room with a short speech criticizing the speaker and the organizers of the program.

"It was our understanding that this was a forum where several positions would be presented," Hammar said.

"I do object, sir, to what I felt was an uncharitable response to a person who did raise their hand for a question, and (your) saying that they were perhaps at the wrong meeting."

"I think in keeping with the integrity in which this meeting was, first of all, publicly announced from the pulpit of this church and others, that there would be the opportunity for several expressions of opinion."

"All are welcome here; they are not in the wrong meeting."

The meeting stopped for a 10-minute break before written questions

were taken from the audience.

Lemieux said he was glad people who favored the health model were present.

"I'm glad that there's opposition here tonight, I'll tell you that right now," he said. "I'm looking forward to answering your questions."

During the break, Hammar said he felt the speaker's refusal to take any questions that were not written down and turned in was suspicious.

"People become very dubious as to the nature of the meeting," Hammar said. "I do feel the group did themselves harm."

Church members allow controversial issues to be discussed in their building, but both sides must be shared. This meeting, he said, did not meet that goal.

"It did not allow the proper opportunity for sharing opinions," Hammar said.

Rupley may have had his question about the breathing exercise answered, but not by Lemieux.

"I don't think that that's something that I have to answer," he said. "I think that's something you folks will take care of in here yourself."

according to city officials. The officials attribute the cost overruns since the program was initially approved to the fact that more street repairs were needed than originally thought.

The street program is almost complete, but repairs are still needed to Hutton, East Main between Hutton and Griswold, Fairbrook, and South Wing. Streets including Baseline Road, West Main, Grace, Carpenter and Horton have already been improved. Many of those roads were

entirely rebuilt rather than simply repaved as originally planned.

The 10-year bond does not represent a specific amount of additional millage, said City Manager Steven Walters. The city will try to pay the bond from general funds, rather than asking voters for a millage increase.

## CBN member opposes fire tax

Rick Engelland was an interested observer at last week's township preliminary budget hearing. Engelland — former treasurer candidate and member of Citizens for a Better Northville — saw and heard enough to convince him that the township's .33-mill fire department operations request should be defeated in the Nov. 6 general election.

"The 1991 budget is already set," he said. "The fire department's budget is completely intact. The board approved 99.4 percent of Chief (Robert) Toms' budget (and) everything he asked for has been approved."

"The rationale that we need the millage for the fire department is unfounded because (the department) is fully budgeted for 1991 out of the general fund."

The township is asking voters to approve a .33-mill request to raise approximately \$136,000 to supplement the fire department's \$346,000 budget. If voters turn down the five-year millage plan, township officials say the department will have to be financed in full by the township general fund.

Without the millage, township officials say the fire department faces cutbacks. Engelland disagrees.

"If the millage passes, the additional money is going to other departments," he said. "Township voters need to know where their money is going."

Engelland said comments by township board members last week indicated the fire department is in no great need of the extra millage.

"(Treasurer) Betty Lennox said some (money raised by the millage) should go to increasing the fund balance and some should go to capital improvements and police officers," he said. "(Trustee James) Nowka said there won't be much left after the fund balance is increased."

"We had a public meeting and no one said anything about putting (more funds) into the fire department," he said.

In an interview last week, Toms said the fire department needs newer equipment. He cited the department's aged water pumpers as an example of equipment that needed updating.

Engelland said Toms should have used the new budget to request additional equipment.

"If the fire department needs a new pumper, the

chief should have come in and asked for one," he said. "He should have gone through the board. They had a perfect opportunity to tell voters exactly what they were going to do."

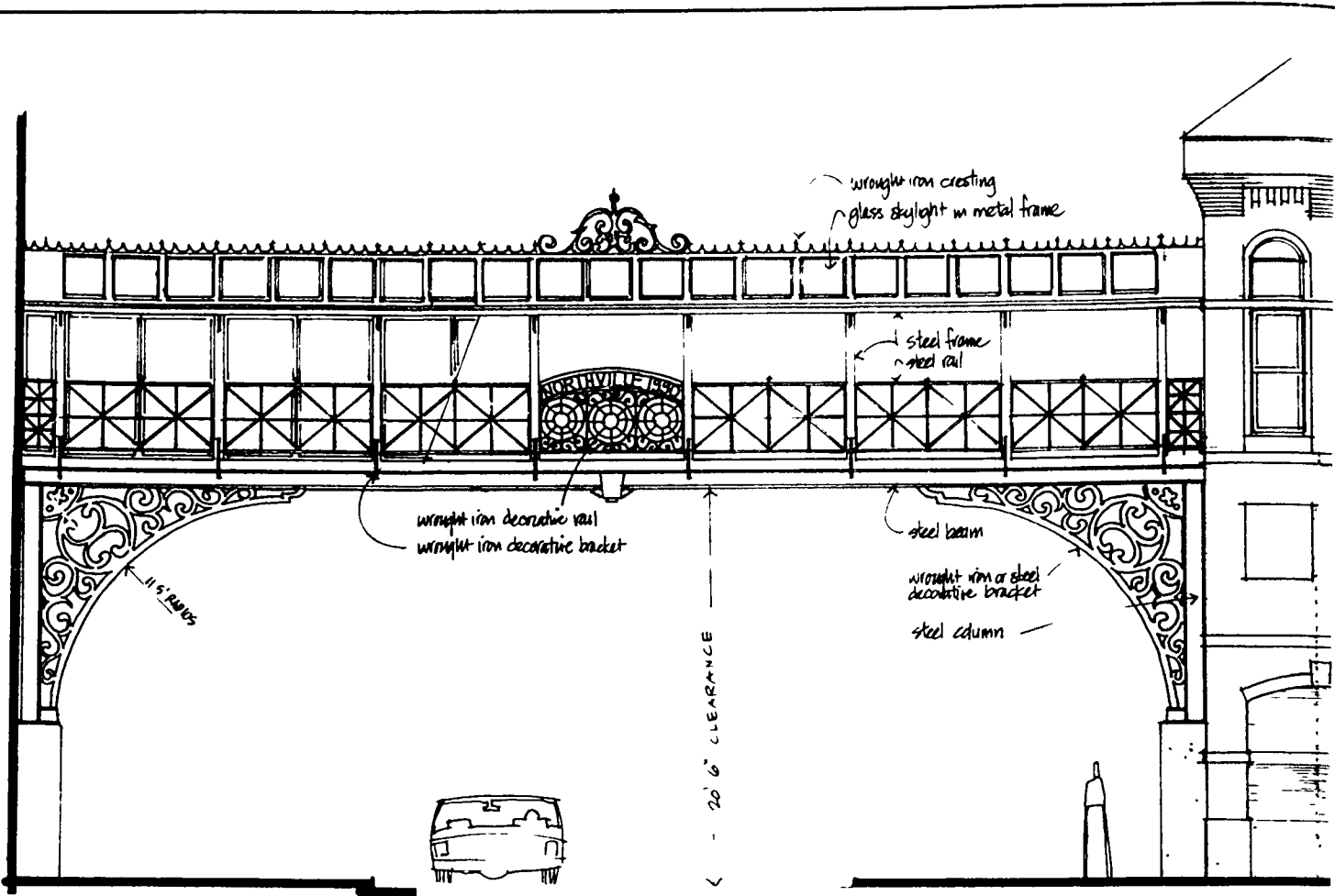
"(The board) should have said this millage was for a pumper, or whatever. Right now it seems like it's going to the fund balance and other items (and not the fire department)."

Engelland praised the fire department as a "hard-working, dedicated group" but compared the millage to state lottery funding of public education.

"We were not going to oppose the millage if it was a detriment to the fire department," he said. "The (millage) money will be spent on other projects. They should drop the general fund by comparable amounts."

Engelland called the 1991 budget "a fair, but not a bare-bones, recession budget." He expressed dismay that the millage was appearing on the November ballot.

"The voters spoke in August; they voted no," he said. "The current administration's not going to add to the fund balance. I think they're going to spend everything they get their hands on."

# MONDAY AT HOME

## Designers mix and match with flooring

Step into a new house today and you probably won't see one kind of floor treatment throughout.

You're more likely to find a mix—something like marble in the foyer, wood in the den and dining room, carpeting in bedrooms and the family room, vinyl in the kitchen and ceramic in the bathrooms.

Maybe not to that degree or exact configuration, but some kind of mix. And in some instances, you might find two different treatments—vinyl or marble squares set within wood, or carpeting surrounded by a wood border—in one room.

All to make a statement. "A lot of products now weren't readily available 10 years ago, even five years ago. Things like marble," said Pat Zatina, design director for Scott-Shuptrine in Novi.

"There are now more options, and they're more readily available," she said. "Consumers are much more educated. They are demanding more."

"The industry has become more sophisticated," said Debra Osborne, a sales consultant for Virginia Tile of Southfield. "A lot of people will come into the showroom and have no idea what they can do. They get intrigued."

"There's a bigger variety of hard surfaces," said Vicki Bockart, owner of Harbor Floors and Interiors in Keego Harbor. "I think the average customer has two if not three surfaces in the house."

A quick look at what a couple of area builders did at the fall Homearama, a showcase of idea homes, illustrates the point.

Richard Koch, a Troy builder, showcases a foyer of Italian marble and Brazilian cherrywood and a kitchen with granite squares inlaid in cherry in his Dynasty model.

Timothy McDonald, a Rochester builder, put marble in the foyer, wood in the den and carpeting in the dining room all within a few steps of each other in his Glengarry Model.

"People are looking for ways to make their home stand out," said Terrie Koch, project manager for her father's company. "It's hard for people to envision new ideas. When they see it, they want it."

Costs vary for different treatments and even within a category depending on quality.

"A lot of products now weren't readily available 10 years ago, even five years ago. Things like marble. There are now more options, and they're more readily available."

Wood starts at about \$5.25 per square foot installed, ceramic tile \$9, marble \$12 and granite \$20, Bockart said. Vinyl tiles range from \$1.30 to \$3.30 per square foot.

Marble, wood and granite are natural products. Vinyl is a petroleum-based synthetic and ceramic is fired clay.

"The more labor involved, the more you're going to pay," said Jim Moody, owner of Paynter Floors of Novi.

"Every time you do something more creative it pushes costs up," said Bockart.

But buyers could upgrade a bit and get more bang for their bucks by using two relatively inexpensive treatments in a single room, suggested Kerry Bentivolio, a Millford builder.

"Maybe they will make part of the room an oakwood flooring and put a carpet inlay in the center," he said. "That way, they'll spend \$1,000 rather than \$4,000."

All treatments aren't appropriate to every room and every family situation.

Wood, which expands and contracts, would be a poor choice for a high-humidity bathroom with a lot of towels lying around, Moody said.

"Hard floors (wood, marble, ceramic) are not good where you want acoustic quality, like a media room,"

Zatina said. Carpeting would do better there.

"I wouldn't sell the best vinyl to a family with five kids and a dog," said Bockart.

Different treatments make different statements. Few things impress a first-time visitor to a home as a granite or marble in the foyer, especially if it flows to wood.

"Tiles say cleanliness and beauty in a powder room, carpets the same in a living room," Moody said. "Wood says warmth in kitchens, living rooms and dens."

"Wood is a product that I think works pretty much for everyone and is in a price range for almost everyone," Bockart said.

"Marble and vinyl tile are great in high-use areas," Zatina said. "The material itself cleans well. It's easy to maintain."

All kinds of people can have a hand in making decisions on floor coverings.

"A lot of times the architect determines what's going to be in the house," Zatina said. "Sometimes, builders are stubborn about the flooring and windows they want."

"In custom-built homes, builders would never make those decisions," she said. That's where designers working directly with buyers come into the picture with their expertise.

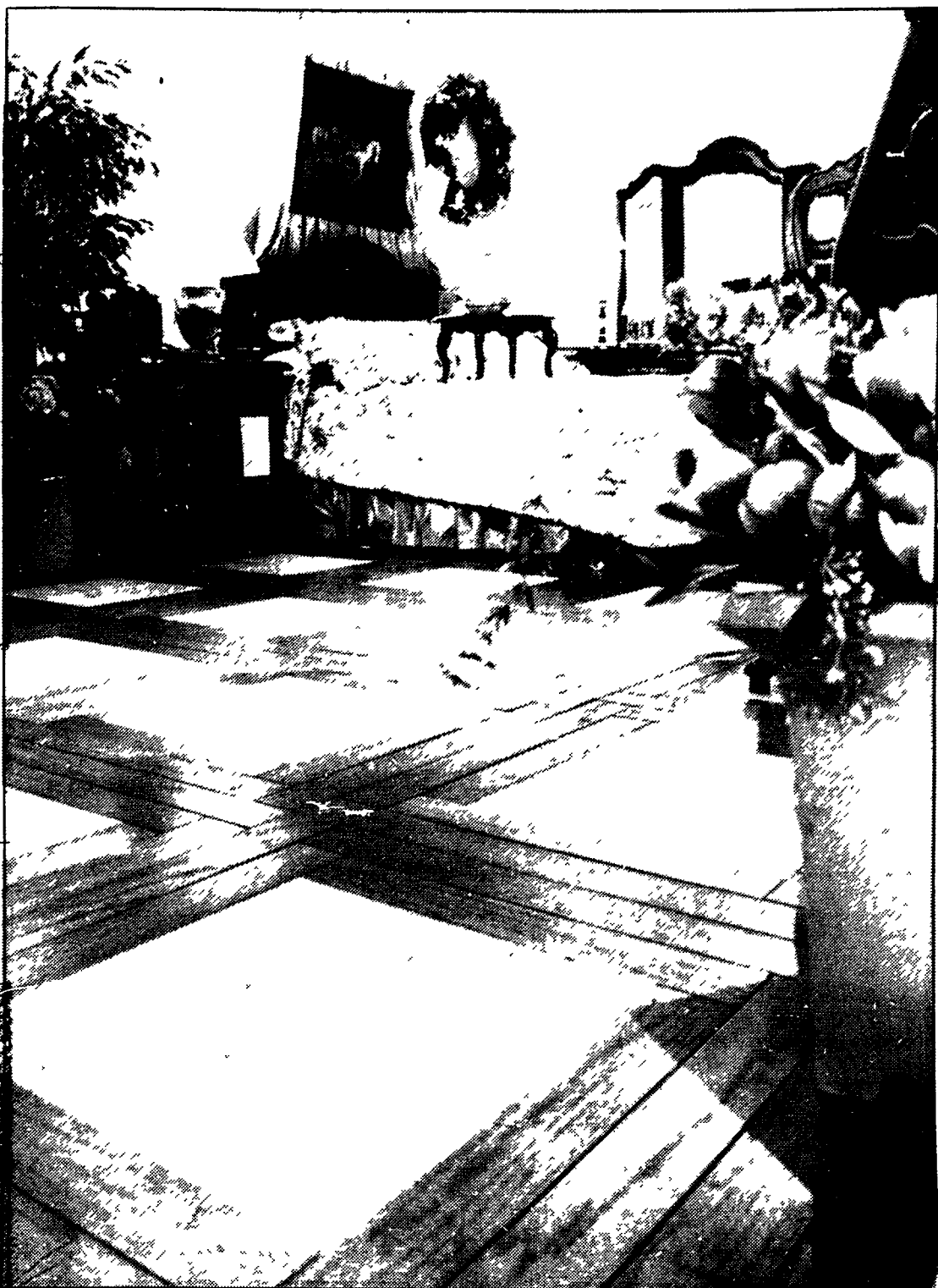

### Honey has as many varieties as wine

"My son, eat thou honey because it is good; and the honeycomb, which is sweet to thy taste."  
— Proverbs 24:13

Ever since man discovered honey, this delectable product made by bees from flower nectar has been the standard for judging one of the most pleasant human sensations — the taste of sweetness.

Since ancient times, the words "honey" and "honey-sweet" have been used as terms of endearment. In cooking, honey can replace white or brown sugar in most circumstances. Because honey contains 80 percent sugar and 20 percent water, some adjustments must be made.

For baking, use about 25 percent more honey than sugar by weight and reduce the amount of other liquids accordingly.

When a recipe calls for sugar, start by replacing honey for half the amount of sugar and experiment from there.

As a seasoning, honey helps bring out hidden flavors.

Root vegetables like carrots and rutabagas will always profit from a touch of honey.

In rural parts of America, home-grown tomatoes still are eaten with a sprinkle of sugar or sparingly spread with honey — the sweetening bringing out the flavor better than salt.

Most of us are used to the multitude of plastic and glass jars of honey available locally in our grocery stores.

But honey comes in an infinite variety of flavors, each taking credit from the assortment of nectar gathered by the bees.

Single-source honey is produced in regions where a crop that is a good honey plant — apple trees, alfalfa and clover, for instance — is grown over a large area. Hives of bees are brought into the area for the flower-

ing period of the crop, usually several weeks.

(By the way, bees seldom left permanently as they would have no food for the rest of the year.)

Bees tend to gather nectar from one kind of blossom, if possible, and they fill their combs in orderly fashion.

Smaller-scale beekeepers, by keeping track of blooming times of the flowers in their vicinities, are quite accurate in naming the dominant flower sources and tastes of their honey.

Balducci's in New York City, one of the largest food shops in the country, offers 34 kinds of honey, including Tasmanian leatherwood, and Italian chestnut honey that is so thick it must be gouged from the jar with a spoon.

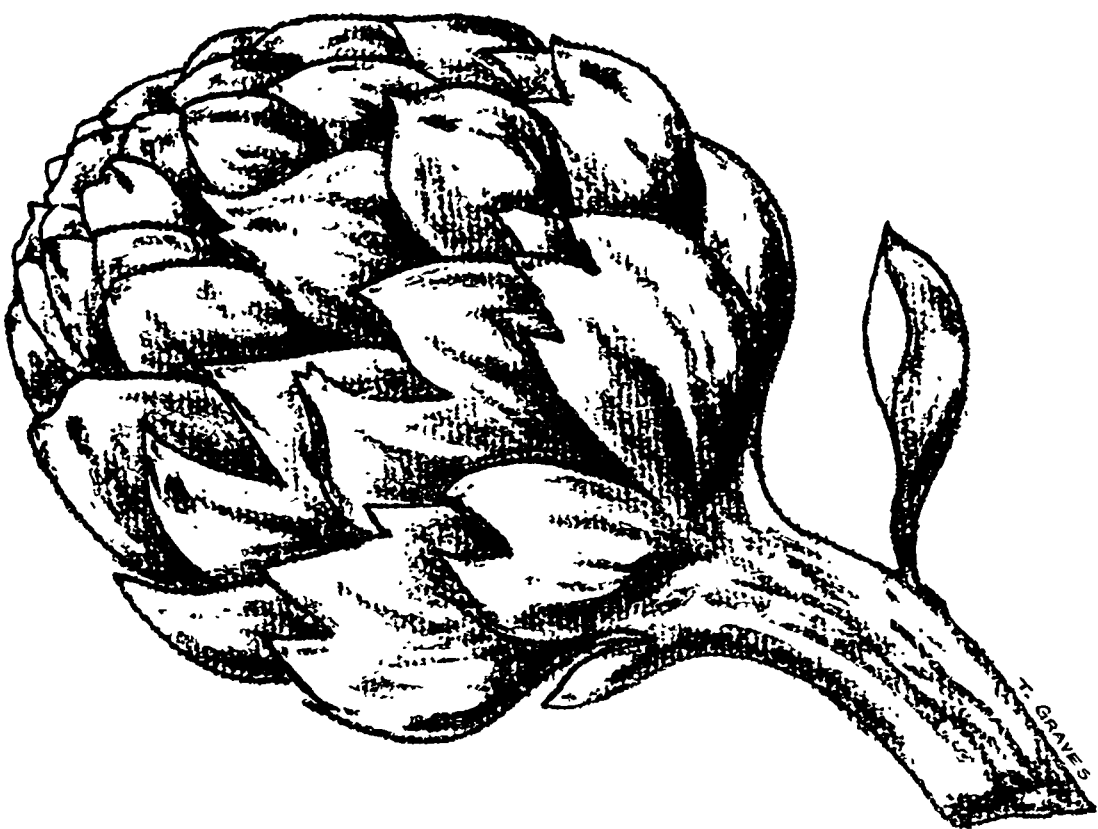
More locally, Zingerman's Deli in Ann Arbor's Kerrytown has just as impressive a list of honeys from which to choose.

Janet Mason, in retail sales at Zingerman's, said their biggest sellers are the Petoskey-based American Spoon Foods assortment of Blueberry Blossom and Northern Wild Flower honeys.

Both sell for \$4.49 for 11 ounces and have equally impressive flavors to match the prices.

They also feature an unheated, creamed honey with pollen and an Oregon Apiaries line of apricot, strawberry, blueberry and raspberry-flavored honey, which she said is outstanding on waffles and French toast and while cooking wild game.

Their prices are comparatively a little higher than the \$4.50 I paid recently at the Eastern Market for a 4-pound jar of pure Michigan honey from the T.M. Klein and Sons farm, but if you have a discerning palate for intriguing flavors, the extra cost might just be worth it.



## Artichokes: The artistic vegetable

According to food authority Waverly Root, in his last culinary endeavor, "Food" (Simon & Schuster, 1980), artichokes were a rare and unknown luxury in the United States in the 1920s. Most reference books cite that the artichoke was first introduced into Europe in the 15th century.

Chroniclers such as Jane Grigson give Catherine de Medici credit for popularizing artichokes. It's said that once, "She ate so many artichokes at a wedding feast in 1575 that she nearly burst." This was considered scandalous because young women in the 16th century were not supposed to eat in public any foods considered to be aphrodisiacs.

It is certain that artichokes grew in the vicinity of Naples in the 15th century, and their popularity spread to other parts of Europe, especially France and Spain. Most food authorities agree the Spanish first brought artichokes to California where they are cultivated today. Nearly 50,000 tons of artichokes are harvested each year in Castroville, Calif., which claims to be the artichoke capital of the United States.

I have to admit that the artichoke may be one of the most artistically designed vegetables, but it also is the most time-consuming to prepare and eat. Once you have mastered the fine art of preparing them and the pleasure of eating them, the extra care and cooking time won't matter to you. In fact, you'll be using a large knife. Once that is done, trim the prickly point of each leaf using a scissors.

Next step is to remove the feathery choke out of the center. This may require a little twisting and tugging. Lastly, carefully scoop out the tiny, sometimes pinching fibers which are attached to the artichoke bottom. Best method to accomplish this is to

### CARCIOFI ALLA RICOTTA (Artichokes Stuffed with Ricotta Cheese)

4 medium trimmed, artichokes, parboiled 20 minutes  
1 pound fresh ricotta cheese  
1 large egg  
4 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese  
1/2 cup dried currants  
1 cup dried bread stuffing  
Salt/pepper  
1-2 tablespoons olive oil, for parboiling artichokes  
1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil

Mix together cheeses, egg, stuffing and seasoning in a medium-size mixing bowl. Divide filling into quarters. Using a large spoon fill each of the artichokes. Set them in a Dutch oven with 1/2 cup and about 3-4 inches of hot water. Make sure that they remain upright. Bring pot to a boil and simmer partially covered about 20-30 minutes. The artichokes are cooked when the leaves can be easily removed and a paring knife inserted into the center of the stuffing is hot when touched. For extra-large artichokes allow for extra stuffing. Makes 4 stuffed artichokes.

### CARCIOFI RIPIENI DI PROSCIUTTO (Artichokes Stuffed with Prosciutto)

4 medium artichokes, trimmed and parboiled 20 minutes  
1/2 cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese  
4 generous cups of bread stuffing  
1-2 large eggs  
1/2 cup sliced and chopped prosciutto (Italian smoked ham)  
1/2 cup pine nuts  
1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper  
Salt to taste  
1 teaspoon dried basil  
Pinch dried marjoram  
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder  
1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil

In a medium-size mixing bowl combine stuffing, cheese, egg, prosciutto, pine nuts and seasonings. Mix well and divide into 4 equal parts. Stuff each of the artichokes and set in a Dutch oven. Add olive oil and 3-4 inches of hot water to pot. Bring to a boil, reduce to a rolling simmer and cook until tender, 20-30 minutes, partially covered. Serves 4.

them with the lid on the pot also will cause them to discolor. Once tender, they may be removed gently with a pair of tongs, draining off excess water. At this point they can be served with a garlic butter sauce or a mayonnaise-mustard sauce.

To serve them with a stuffing, follow the procedure just described, but parboil them only about 20 minutes, then drain and fill or stuff. When using traditional Italian cheese or bread stuffing, as my grandmother did, an additional 20-30 minutes of steaming is necessary after stuffing. The artichokes are cooked when the leaves pull out easily and the base or artichoke bottom (my favorite part) will be soft enough to pierce with a fork.

Once you have accomplished this technique and become "hooked" on artichokes, you undoubtedly will want to include them in your meal plans on a regular basis. This natural, cooked vegetable cup also becomes a great garnish or small serving accessory, for warm sauces to be served with a fillet of fish or an appropriate salad, as well as for stuffing with tossed mini-vegetables or a traditional shrimp salad.

To appropriately eat a cooked artichoke, remove one leaf at a time, using your thumb and index finger. Then, gently scrape the tender inside of the leaf with your teeth. Discard the remainder of the leaf by setting on your dinner plate. The stuffing, artichoke heart and bottom can then be eaten with a fork.

Whole artichokes may be cooked in advance, refrigerated and then reheated, either stuffed or hollow before serving.

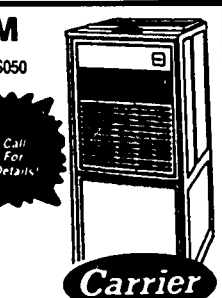

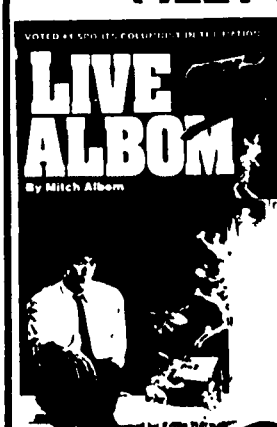

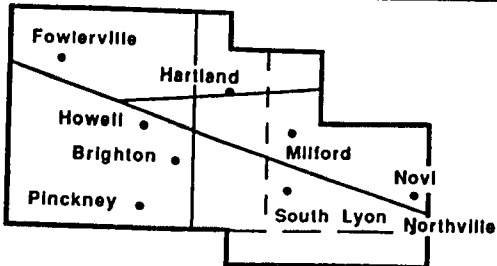

# 'On Thin Ice' about more than ice skating careers

## Tai Babilonia hopes movie offers encouragement

For Tai Babilonia, making a TV movie about her heartbreaking figure skating career was a painful, yet gratifying experience.

*On Thin Ice: The Tai Babilonia Story*, airing Monday, Nov. 5, on NBC, tells how Babilonia's passion for skating eventually tore her life apart. But more importantly the drama shows how she is getting back on her feet after depression over an Olympic defeat sent her on a path of self destruction.

The film opens with 6-year-old Tai watching idol Peggy Fleming on TV and moves rapidly to her matchup with figure skating partner Randy Gardner three years later.

In just four short years, the two were setting records as the most successful pair-skaters in U.S. history. Their success continued throughout the '70s.

It seemed only natural, and perhaps even expected, that the two would walk away with a gold medal at the 1980

Olympics. However, it was then that they became known as America's "heartbreak kids." The two entered the ice ready to perform their routine at the Olympics in Lake Placid, but an earlier injury rendered Gardner unable to perform. In front of millions of fans, they had to leave the rink without having the opportunity to live out their lifelong dream.

The incident was not only a crushing blow to the pair's dreams, but it also marked the beginning of a downward turn in Babilonia's personal life.

"I got through the worst night of my life without breaking down or exposing my true feelings, and that set the pattern of behavior I would follow for the next eight years," Babilonia said.

Her disappointments and feelings of isolation sent her on a self-destructive path that included drug and alcohol abuse, involvement in volatile relationships, and ultimately a suicide attempt in 1988.

Babilonia stressed, however, that *On Thin Ice* is not just a chronicle of the pair's career. Instead it offers a

message of hope to others who believe they have hit rock bottom.

"It was very therapeutic, and it was, in a way, a healing process," she said of working on the movie.

With that healing, however, came some pain.

"Actually the more emotional scenes for me were the drinking, the alcohol parts. Some days I wouldn't go in to watch. It was just too painful," Babilonia said.

But, she admitted, it was also fun. Gardner and Babilonia reunited for the first time in a year to perform some of their own routines for the movie. They also worked with the three sets of actors and actresses who portray them as children, teenagers and adults.

Canadian actress Rachael Crawford and actor Charlie Stratton play the duo as adults.

"It was so funny having so many Tai and Randys running around. Not only were there actors, but there were doubles," Tai explained.

"So whenever they would call Tai, like six people would turn. It was pretty funny," Randy added.

They both laughed when I asked if it was easy to get back into the swing of their routines for the movie.

"It's never easy to just step into it. I wish it were," Randy said.

- Determine your Set. Acknowledge all people and stores who contribute. ("This is just like picking out furniture," exclaimed John.) For instance, Terrace Casuals of Farmington

# 'Cheers' remains a success for variety of reasons

## Comedy's 200th episode set

A certain something special has had the customers — and viewers — coming back to 'Cheers' for eight years.

Now in its ninth season, the show last week celebrated its 200th episode with an hour-long special. The actual 200th taped episode airs Thursday, Nov. 15, on NBC.

That certain something special isn't the beer. Actor George Wendt, who plays Cheers patron Norm Peterson, confirms the stuff on the set is near beer. No, there is something more that has kept the show in the top of the Nielsens for nearly a decade.

First and foremost is the writing, as Wendt and actress Rhea Perlman, who plays saucy barmaid Carla Tortelli LeBec, agree. The team of Glen and Les Charles is hard to beat, as is director and co-executive producer James Burrows. (One of the team's past credits was the successful series 'Taxi'.) Wendt attributes the show's success to those even further up the ladder.

There weren't any weak links in the chain. The ultimate answer is the writing, but also it was a real good time to be at NBC, with

(Grant) Tinker and (Brandon) Tartikoff allowing us to be a failure for a year and a half, two years, ratings wise. It's a good studio, Paramount. Everything just sort of fell together," he said.

The show has bounced back from some major cast changes, such as when Nick Colasanto died near the end of the third season and when Shelley Long left as her five-year contract expired.

"When Nick died, that was a big blow, a really big blow," said Perlman. "I think he was kind of the Daddy of the show. He was a great actor and he ... was the heart of the show. No one could imagine who was going to be able to take over for that part."

Woody Hfarrelson managed to step into the role as the naive bartender, even though the character of Woody is not the father figure Coach was.

"And (about) Shelley leaving, Kirstie just took off. It just worked, it just did," Perlman continued. "Of course everybody was scared because the show was about Sam and Diane. It was a scary thing for us all. But I guess the show was really about more than that or it

wouldn't have worked. We felt it was about Sam and Diane, but it was about the bar. It was about Sam and the people at the bar."

She added that she didn't know whether the show could survive if Ted Danson left. Danson won an Emmy this year for his portrayal of Sam Malone, a former baseball player who has owned the neighborhood bar off and on through the series' duration.

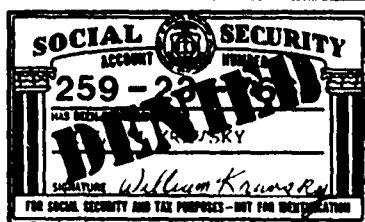
One of the writers' biggest successes is the chemistry that has developed between the characters. THE Cheers regulars and workers are a family that has stuck together through unforeseen situations. That, according to Burrows, was a concept the producers had from the beginning.

"The show has always been an evolutionary show," he said. "We never could predict how we would end up at the end of the year."

Perlman's character has gone through marriages, births and loved ones' deaths, but her ascerbic character has really changed very little. The actress likes that.

"I'm just real happy to have the lives to say, because in real life, I'm not real quick with lines," she said. "That's the great thing about Carla, she's always got the right thing to say at the right moment."

## 'Winnie the Pooh' still strong at 65

Winnie the Pooh turns 65 this year. The old bear's been a hit ever since author A.A. Milne first created him back in 1926.

Inspired by Milne's 4-year-old son Christopher Robin, the name "Winnie" came from a bear in the London Zoo and "Pooh" from Christopher's pet swan. The author created a host of winsome characters — Tigger, Piglet, Eeyore, Owl, Rabbit and Kanga — to scamper about "Hundred Acre Wood," a pastoral setting similar to Milne's home of Sussex, England.

What has explained Winnie's success? ABC story editor Bruce Talkington has an idea: "Little kids love Pooh because they can really relate to not being able to make the connection to some of the adult things that are always going on. And adults love Pooh because it touches some kind of hidden memory — that childlike thought that you never really lose." The ABC cartoon *The New Adventures of Winnie the Pooh* is now in its third season. It has won two Emmys, a Humanitas Award, an Action for Children's Television Award and a Parents' Choice Award.

Milne's first book, *Winnie the Pooh*, sold 150,000 copies its first year. *The House at Pooh Corner*, the second book about Christopher Robin and friends, was published in 1928. Today, the books have sold more than 14 million copies.
