## Police eye combined dispatch

A proposal to combine township and city police dispatching facilities in a shared-services arrangement could signify major changes in the structure of local police services.

The township board last week took the first public step toward shared police services by adopting a resolution that will create a joint police services study panel.

Merging the two dispatching facilities is the initial goal of the interlocal venture. It is believed the dispatching system will serve as a precursor to expanded shared police services.

Township and city officials have previously discussed combining facets of police services, but a September township board/city council meeting sparked intensified talks.

Township representatives — including Manager Richard Henningsen and Police Chief Chip Snider — met with city Manager Steven Walters and police Chief Rodney Cannon

Oct. 5 to lay groundwork for combining some police services (see related story, page 4-A).

Snider and Cannon held four additional meetings and Snider unveiled preliminary findings to the township board last Thursday evening.

No firm timetable has been set for combining dispatching services. Snider, Henningsen, Cannon and Walters will continue to meet to iron out legal, financial and strategic wrinkles.

According to Snider's report, the township would provide space for a dispatching facility. Employees and equipment would be combined in a single police nerve center at township hall.

Both departments currently operate dispatching units. Dispatchers take telephone calls from the community and coordinate police and fire responses, as well as performing computer checks of vehicles and in-

## Township adopts revised budget

The township board increased fire department spending and bolstered a sagging fund balance by adopting a revised 1991 budget last Thursday evening.

Buoyed by voter approval of a .33-mill fire millage (estimated to raise \$135,000) Nov. 6, the board directed \$17,250 to the fire department for additional equipment, training and salaries.

The board also established a \$152,000 fund balance, a figure Finance Director James Graham called "the best guess of where we're going to end up at the end of 1991."

The fire millage acts as a subsidy for the fire department. General funds freed by the millage boosted the proposed fund balance from \$63,537 to \$152,000.

Budget changes were recom-

mended in six other areas by treasurer and budget review committee chairperson Betty Lennox.

Lennox suggested additional funding go for maintenance, capital improvements, general administration equipment, and police services. She recommended adding \$27,500 for road maintenance to the budget.

But other board members preferred leaving non-fire funds in the fund balance. The board directed Graham to keep a close eye on the additional programs and funds.

"The money will be put in the fund balanced but will be earmarked for those items if they are needed," Graham said.

Supervisor Georgina Goss said the township has adopted a solid budget.

"I'm pleased with the way the budget looks now," she said. "The board is going to monitor it carefully and we'll be asking department heads to stay within their limits."

**LEAVE THOSE LEAVES ALONE!** Northville City police are warning residents not to park on piles of leaves that have been raked up for collection by the Department of Public Works (DPW). Besides hampering DPW cleanup efforts, parking on leaves poses a safety hazard.

Police believe a fire which burned a car parked on West Street the morning of Nov. 2 was caused by leaves ignited by the car's exhaust system. The car sustained an estimated \$1,800-\$2,000 in damage, and had to be towed from the scene after the fire melted one of its tires.

**WILDCAT UPDATE:** Looking strictly at the numbers, the Novi girls basketball team improved itself by about 33 points in the span of less than a month.

# Northville 1st to be evaluated under new plan

Northville High School was the first school in the state to be evaluated using a new individualized approach Nov. 6.

From the days not too long ago when schools were evaluated by the number of books in the library and the number of chairs in the average classroom, a new approach has evolved.

"We're breaking new ground," said David Fultz, chairperson of the evaluating committee and superintendent of Grand Blanc schools. "It's futuristic, innovative."

For the new evaluation procedure, the North Central Association (of which Northville is a member) asks educators from around the state to study the district's Strategic Planning Initiative goals for this school year.

The strategic plan was developed by district educators, administrators and parents to provide an ongoing program to improve the quality of education in Northville.

This year's evaluation is different because it studies the district's goals as defined by district parents and staff, and how well those goals are achieved. Previously the NCA set district goals.

The evaluation will study how well and how many of the goals have been achieved in April.

"We're looking at the quality of the action plan and also evaluating the progress they're making," Fultz said.

Other districts with strategic plans may eventually use the new evaluation process, but Northville, the first school to come due for an evaluation under the new plan, will always have done it first, said Susan Couzens, Northville High School chairperson of the program.

"We're the first ones to do it this way; that's what is important," Couzens said.

Evaluators were chosen from the few districts in the state that, like Northville, use a Strategic Planning Initiative to set annual improvement goals for quality in education.

The evaluators will be back April 16 to review the progress made in reaching the five objectives set by the district for this school year.

A former Northville student is on the evaluating committee completely by chance.

Peter Wharton, superintendent of the Reeths Puffer school district in western Michigan, was chosen to be on the committee because of his district's work on their own strategic plan.

Wharton, who said he was impressed with student involvement in the evaluation process, attended Northville High School between 1961 and 1965.

"We've been really impressed with what we saw," Wharton said.

The students involved in the evaluation agreed their input was important. High school senior Beth Ursel helped show the evaluating committee around the building on Tuesday.

"They had a lot of questions about different classes and we showed them what we

thought they should see and then what they wanted to see," Ursel said.

The evaluators will send a written report of their ideas and impressions of Northville High School to the North Central Association, which evaluates member schools every seven years.

The purpose of the visitation is not to determine the accreditation status of the school, but to make sure the district is complying with North Central standards and fulfilling the objectives of the district's own self-study.

A written report with comments and suggestions will be submitted to North Central at the end of the evaluation.

Accreditation is determined based on a written report from the district to North Central and cannot be revoked based on the evaluation.

Northville High School's five objectives to be studied by the evaluating team for the current school year are:

- To increase course selection options.

- To present an established course content to each student.

- To increase student satisfaction with the school.

- To evaluate the counseling program and its effectiveness regarding academics, career and extracurricular activities.

- To improve the counseling program at each grade level based on the results of the evaluation.

The goals were set to bring the quality of education on par with recent building improvements, said Superintendent George Bell.

"We're looking in the next seven years for educational changes to match the physical changes of the last seven years," Bell said.

The first day of the evaluation was a success for evaluators, Fultz said.

"Our day has been profitable mainly because we have been able to look at the strategies," Fultz said.

Bell thanked the evaluators for working with the district's strategic plan.

They made the cookies at Mike's house. His mom, Bonnie, is a den mother.

"This is not a requirement, it's just an extra project," Bonnie Pilarz said.

Although cub scouts don't have to send cookies to Marines in Saudi Arabia, they figure they are somewhat required under the part of their pledge that says they will "do my duty to God and my country."

Even though they will not receive a badge for their work, making cookies isn't all that bad, especially since they were allowed to sample the fruits of their labor at the end of the project.

"We just do it for fun," Vetter said.

The cookies are not the old standby chocolate chip. Chocolate melts easily in the desert. Instead they sent something called "ranger cookies" loaded with oatmeal, Rice Krispies, coconut and raisins.

They won't send the cookies packed in popcorn to provide edible protection from breakage. Popcorn might attract bugs, Bonnie Pilarz said.

## Plot thickens as area family sues pet cemetery

Imagine going to the cemetery where a loved one is buried and discovering a for-sale sign on the property.

This is the reality Roger and Vicki Burrows faced two years ago when the property on which their dog Sheppy was buried was put up for sale.

The Novi couple bought a plot at the Metropolitan Pet Cemetery in Huron Township for Sheppy after his death in 1984. The land, which was owned by Henry Vanderwerken III and John Vanderwerken Sr., was put up for sale in 1988. The current owners of the 10-acre site, James and Charlotte Bush, bought the land in November of last year.

"They want to sell it for development," said Vicki Burrows. "We thought if we could get to Sheppy's remains we would move them."

But, Roger Burrows couldn't get to the dog's remains. After getting the permission of the Burrows' to excavate Sheppy's remains in August, he discovered the remains of several dogs buried where his animal was supposed to be. None of the dogs was Sheppy.

"I feel I did an injustice to my faithful friend," said Vicki. "That dog was a very big part of our family. I feel like I handed him over to a butcher."

As a result of the mass burial of their dog, or misplacing, the Burrows have joined forces with more than 100 disgruntled pet owners to file a class-action lawsuit against former and current owners of the pet cemetery.

Wayne Woodford, a Taylor lawyer, is representing the group in the action. Woodford said the group charges that the Vanderwerken's sold the property without protecting cemetery owners. He added that plots at the cemetery may have been sold several times to different owners and that some animals may have never been buried.

The action charges that the Burrows have refused to let plot owners visit their pet's graves. Woodford said. He said headstones have also been removed from the cemetery.

"The Vanderwerken's promised it would be a pet cemetery into perpetuity," Woodford. "We want a decent resting place for the pets. That is our utmost concern."

Donald Rivard, a Dearborn Heights attorney representing the current owners of the pet cemetery, disputed that headstones have been removed from the site.

"The Burrows say they never removed any headstones," Rivard said. "They have allowed pet owners to get remains and remove the headstones."

A motion for summary judgement in the law suit will be asked for Dec. 7 by the the current owners. Rivard said he will ask the court to dismiss the case because the Burrows, and other plot owners of the cemetery, have no property deeds.

"Unless they have a deed," he said, "they can't stop the Burrows from operating the land the way they want."

The current owners have no intention of developing the land or selling it in the near future, Rivard said. He added that a no-trespassing sign was posted to keep the appearance of the land in good condition and to protect people renting a home (from the Bush family) adjacent to the cemetery.

The pet owners will also seek compensation for the mental anguish involved in the case, Woodford said. He added that a final resolution to the suit will likely come sometime next year.

"All we want is the dog back," said Roger Burrows. "We could care less about anything else."

The couple paid a total of about \$200 to the Vanderwerken's to bury their dog at the pet cemetery. The fee

was to pay for a separate grave, body bag and headstone.

Sheppy was picked up from the Burrows veterinarian by the cemetery owners after he was put to sleep in 1984. They weren't on hand when he was allegedly buried.

"We should have been there when they buried him," said Vicki Burrows.

"Sheppy could be anywhere," said Roger.

The family intended to take the dog's remains, when the cemetery was sold, to their cabin near Newberry. Despite being unable to find Sheppy's remains in August, Roger said the family did remove his headstone and make a memorial for him at their cabin.

# Bettor is found guilty of contributing to delinquency

Bryant was fined \$65 by 35th District Court Judge John E. MacDonal and her conviction was taken under advisement for a year. If she has no other convictions at that time, the charge will be dropped.

She had missed a previously scheduled trial on Sept. 18.

# City sees dispatch as possible first phase

City Manager Steven Walters sees the combination of city and township dispatching services as the first step to a potential union of police departments.

He made the observation after the township board passed a resolution Nov. 8 to create a panel to study joint police services.

Walters said the police department has always been a good target for consolidation. "Frankly, that service is the most plausible to look at for two reasons," he said. "That service is the one which we both operate the most similarly, and it's by far the one we spend the most money on."

The annual city and township police budgets add up to nearly \$3 million.

Walters said a full consolidation could save both municipalities hundreds of thousands of dollars a year. "I think the long-term potential (budget reduction) is perhaps \$200,000-\$300,000 apiece, but that's not by combining dispatching. That's by combining the whole department," he said. "Initially, I would say we could save anywhere between \$25,000-\$75,000 apiece."

To save money by combining dispatching, Walters said, the size of the staff would need to be reduced. But he said full-time staff members may not have to be laid off to do that.

"Part of these people are part-time, so it's not a matter of a person losing a full-time job," Walters said. He added that any surplus of dispatching staff might disappear as people leave the police force. "Over a period of time, attrition would probably take care of it," he said.

Consolidating dispatching services may also include consolidating recordkeeping and lockup facilities, Walters said. "But regardless of

which approach is taken, you're still going to have to reduce the number of dispatchers."

The township currently employs one full-time clerk/dispatcher, three full-time dispatchers and three part-time dispatchers. One part-time and four full-time dispatchers work for the city.

Thursday's township board resolution by township police Chief Chip Snider.

Snider's report said a consolidated dispatching facility would be provided at township hall. Walters agreed that a township dispatching center was likely, but not certain. "I think that's quite feasible because their facility is newer and better than ours," he said. "But that isn't a decision that's been made."

"That's an example of a detail that would be worked out in the next phase of the process."

A new dispatching center would use the city's one-year-old radio transmitter system and console, because the township's system needs replacing already, said Walters. "I would expect we would move our radio equipment over to Township Hall."

Walters noted several factors which make a combined dispatching service feasible. "We're all on the same radio frequency, the citizens

think of us as a single community, and the city is in the middle of the township, so to speak," he said.

"There just seems to be a lot of things that fit," he said.

Dispatching could be the first of several combined police services. "If this makes sense, and it works, then the next step makes as much sense to look at, which is a combined patrol function," Walters said. "And then you would have two administrations left, at which point you would look at combining administrations."

But such a consolidation is not inevitable, Walters said. "There's no obligation on either of our parts to do something in the future just because we're doing this now."

City council members are "very enthusiastic" about the proposal, Walters said. The council will discuss it at their Nov. 19 meeting, and can then adopt a resolution authorizing a committee to propose a specific implementation plan, as the township board did Thursday.

If the council approves and the committee proposes an implementation plan within the next two months, Walters said, "I would expect to see some sort of actual physical implementation sometime next spring... and our operating jointly by April."

Walters also foresaw the potential of a larger consolidation of dispatching services. "There's some possibility, I think, that Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Northville and Northville Township could look at combining dispatch. We would then be a community somewhat like Westland and Canton," he said. "We'd operate with a single dispatch desk with two dispatchers."

But Walters said there has been no official discussion between Northville and Plymouth officials about such a plan.

dividuals and additional administrative tasks.

Snider said the plan to combine staffs is based on sound community planning.

He said contiguous borders and identical radio frequency and labor representation make for a feasible shared services plan. Finances play a big role in the proposed change, Snider said.

"It's about time the governments look to save money," he said. "I think

the city and township will see a decrease in costs."

Combined township/city police budgets are nearly \$3 million.

Snider did not say if savings would come from staff cutbacks.

"We haven't determined the labor factor yet," he said. "(We'll probably keep) the same people on board... There will be a lot of job security."

The township employs three full-time dispatchers and one full-time clerk/dispatcher. Four full-time dispatchers work for the city.

Cannon called the potential move

toward shared services "preliminary."

"We're just talking about concepts," he said. He also said it was premature to speculate on other joint police operations.

"All we've talked about is the idea of (combining) dispatchers," he said. Township Supervisor Georgina Goss was cautiously optimistic about the plan.

"I think it's something that can be achieved," she said. "Concur and the board concurs that a study about combined police services could be beneficial."

## SITE PLANS: *Designers mix one part art, one part science*

The best-designed sites are those that don't interfere with the natural conditions of the property.

And some say you can go nature one step better.

Defining a good site is difficult because it's hard to quantify many of the intangibles that are the site's makeup: individual site shapes, the layout of the roads, the preservation of indigenous flora and fauna, the subtlety with which the lots blend with the natural setting. A good development site is part science, part art. They have what the French call — a certain "je ne sais quoi."

Gary Shapiro, president of the Ivanhoe Companies in West Bloomfield, said he looks for the difficult, yet interesting sites others may have passed up: those that have environmental assets and natural amenities.

Shapiro developed Mission Springs on Darb Lake, a single-family residential project in West Bloomfield, which was chosen by the American Planning Association Michigan Chapter as the best-designed development of 1989.

Shapiro is also developing Woodland Ridge, another single-family development, and The Pointe on Pleasant Lake, a condominium development, also in West Bloomfield.

"Good development," he said, "means individually balanced lots and a balanced development site." Excavations of each site should be limited, using excavated soil for basements or foundations on the site.

Wetlands are built around, rather than destroyed; mature trees are saved; roads and house sites are put in with little grading; the natural topography is used to enhance developments; and when it comes to utilities, the distance between two points need not be a straight line.

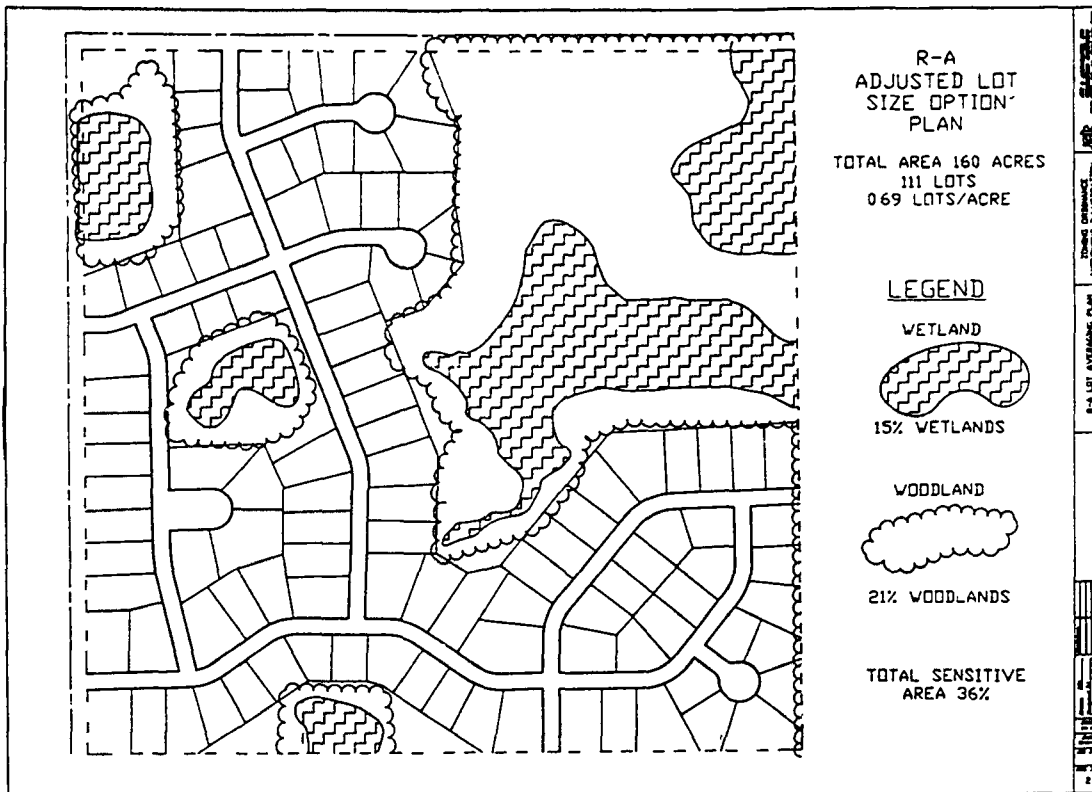
"Sometimes there has to be some mitigation of one to help the others," he said.

Shapiro said many good sites are ruined because they are overdeveloped. "Not every square foot needs to be developed."

In the past, builders would squeeze an extra home on a development, but builders have discovered a nicer, less cramped site will sell for more and make up for the lost home sale.

Robert Leighton, president of Robert C. Leighton Associates Inc. in Ann Arbor, said good site development involves looking beyond the boundaries of the property to be developed. Open spaces between two properties should match up and complement each other, and nearby architectural or natural characteristics should blend smoothly from one area to the next.

Robert C. Leighton Associates designed the site plans for Blue Heron Pointe — which was chosen by the

American Planning Association Michigan Chapter as the best-designed development of 1990 — and Huntington Falls, the multi-use Northville Township development being put together by a team headed by the Robert A. DeMatia Co. in Plymouth.

"We like to start out with a site inventory," Leighton said. Existing slopes and topography are measured, vegetation and soil types are catalogued, and views and even solar orientation are noted.

"Any constraints or any features you might want to consider are taken down at this point," he said. "The site sets the stage for the design."

Although the site's existing characteristics largely determine the end design, there are still alternatives, Leighton said. "There are going to be tradeoffs."

For example, it may be necessary to cut down some trees to preserve some wetlands, he said. "You try to balance everything out." Leighton said the problem with many sites is they lack sound design principles. For example, repeating landscaping treatment and the placement of buildings gives a site a sense of order, but then the developer must be careful not to be too repetitious, which makes a site monotonous.

"It's very subtle — there's a symmetry and rhythm to good site development," Leighton said. Good sites

have balance, they harmonize with their surroundings, and they have focal points that emphasize site characteristics.

"And a good site should have a little mystery as well," Leighton added, saying not everything should be revealed at first glance.

Dennis Dickstein, chairman and chief executive officer of Ralph Manuel and Associates in Birmingham, said good sites start with good land.

Dickstein is managing the lot sales for the Pine Creek Ridge subdivision in Brighton, developed by Abbey Homes in Birmingham, which is the site of the Builders Association of Southeast Michigan Homearama.

Control of the site, from the first walk over until turning over the keys on the last homes or structure, is paramount for the success of the project, he said.

The way land is developed today has matured within the past decade. In the past, the developer would bend the land to his will, bulldozing trees, excavating tons of dirt and filling wetlands with little thought.

But today developers work with the land, using the rolling topography, natural and mature landscape, and even saving and preserving wetlands as water retention and natural areas.

Why? "Because that's what people want," Dickstein said. Developers are

in business to make a profit and the best way to stay in business, he said, is to make sure people get what they want.

And that means going that extra step. "People don't want straight streets with similar homes in rows. In some (developments) you can take a piece of string and run it down the street and some part of each house will touch it — you won't see that (in good developments)."

Dickstein said sometimes a developer just knows when a site is going to be special, but potential and realization are not the same thing. Good sites may start with a good piece of land, but ecologists, landscape architects, planners quickly are worked into the equation.

Dickstein said Abbey Homes president Robert Katzman set out with

## Shake up business with old customers

Throughout this series, I have frequently made use of the term "current and potential customers" to identify two of the major target markets served by any business organization. But what about the forgotten "third" market — your firm's inactive customers?

Believe it or not, this market may represent your greatest opportunity for increased sales. Before spending time and money on promotional strategies to attract "current and potential customers" this year or next, you may want to focus on this potential business that's right under your nose.

Research conducted on the topic indicates that active customers become inactive when a business stops paying attention to them. A much smaller percentage ceases dealing with organizations because of unresolved complaints or inferior products and services.

The data here suggests that customers should never be taken for granted if you expect them to remain loyal over the long term.

The first step in bringing your dead customers back to life is to identify who they are. Using your customer list as a guide, isolate those who have not done business with you as often as can reasonably be expected.

Depending on the nature of your business, customers may be considered inactive after as little as two weeks or as long as two years.

Prepare a letter to all of these inactive accounts. Let them know what is going on in your business and give them one or more good

reasons to start buying from you again. It is, of course, vital to emphasize how valued these customers are to your company.

If you operate a retail business, don't make the mistake of sending out fliers or coupons in lieu of a letter. The same rule applies for business service firms that merely mail out newsletters or announcements to their inactive accounts. These supplementary materials may be included with a letter, but they do nothing to prompt the reactivation process.

Remember that the purpose of this first contact is to get your foot in the door so you can begin to rebuild your former relationship.

If an inactive customer does not respond to your initial letter(s), try calling him or her personally by phone. Ask why the individual or their organization has stopped dealing with your business.

If they mention a past conflict or complaint, resolve it right away. Then you will be in a better position to offer customer incentives that work for your business rather than against it.

In general, it takes a minimum of four contacts during a 30-day period to re-establish your business identity with inactive customers. It takes approximately 60 days and from four to six contacts before these customers become active once again.

the intention of preserving the individual sites by maintaining a supervisory role throughout the construction.

Diversity is important, Dickstein said, not only in home styles, but in lot shape, size and layout. There's nothing worse, he said, than a row of

homes that are positioned on a straight line.

"It's boring," he said. "We don't care if a house is set back (from the road) 50 feet or 75 feet — we're going to look for a natural clearing and put the house there — that's how you get good developments."

# Bettor is found guilty of contributing to delinquency

A Detroit woman was found guilty Nov. 6 of contributing to the delinquency of a minor, after leaving her 3-year-old son in a car at Northville Downs last December while she went to gamble inside.

Bryant told the officer that she had

just gone inside for two races, he said. She said she had left her son with her sister, who was not at the scene when Stewart arrived.

Bryant was fined \$65 by 35th District Court Judge John E. MacDonald and her conviction was taken under advisement for a year. If she has no other convictions at that time, the charge will be dropped.

She had missed a previously scheduled trial on Sept. 18.

# City sees dispatch as possible first phase

City Manager Steven Walters sees the combination of city and township dispatching services as the first step to a potential union of police departments.

He made the observation after the township board passed a resolution Nov. 8 to create a panel to study joint police services.

Walters said the police department has always been a good target for consolidation. "Frankly, that service is the most plausible to look at for two reasons," he said. "That service is the one which we both operate the most similarly, and it's by far the one we spend the most money on."

The annual city and township police budgets add up to nearly \$3 million.

Walters said a full consolidation could save both municipalities hundreds of thousands of dollars a year. "I think the long-term potential (budget reduction) is perhaps \$200,000-\$300,000 apiece, but that's not by combining dispatching. That's by combining the whole department," he said. "Initially, I would say we could save anywhere between \$25,000-\$75,000 apiece."

To save money by combining dispatching, Walters said, the size of the staff would need to be reduced. But he said full-time staff members may not have to be laid off to do that.

"Part of these people are part-time, so it's not a matter of a person losing a full-time job," Walters said. He added that any surplus of dispatching staff might disappear as people leave the police force. "Over a period of time, attrition would probably take care of it," he said.

Consolidating dispatch services may also include consolidating recordkeeping and lockup facilities, Walters said. "But regardless of

which approach is taken, you're still going to have to reduce the number of dispatchers."

The township currently employs one full-time clerk/dispatcher, three full-time dispatchers and three part-time dispatchers. One part-time and four full-time dispatchers work for the city.

Thursday's township board resolution followed a report by township police Chief Chip Snider.

Snider's report said a consolidated dispatching facility would be provided at township hall. Walters agreed that a township dispatching center was likely, but not certain. "I think that's quite feasible because their facility is newer and better than ours," he said. "But that isn't a decision that's been made."

"That's an example of a detail that would be worked out in the next phase of the process."

A new dispatching center would use the city's one-year-old radio transmitter system and console, because the township's system needs replacing already, said Walters. "I would expect we would move our radio equipment over to Township Hall."

Walters noted several factors which make a combined dispatching service feasible. "We're all on the same radio frequency, the citizens

think of us as a single community, and the city is in the middle of the township, so to speak," he said.

"There just seems to be a lot of things that fit," he said.

Dispatching could be the first of several combined police services. "If this makes sense, and it works, then the next step makes as much sense to look at, which is a combined patrol function," Walters said. "And then you would have two administrations left, at which point you would look at combining administrations."

But such a consolidation is not inevitable, Walters said. "There's no obligation on either of our parts to do something in the future just because we're doing this now."

City council members are "very enthusiastic" about the proposal, Walters said. The council will discuss it at their Nov. 19 meeting, and can then adopt a resolution authorizing a committee to propose a specific implementation plan, as the township board did Thursday.

If the council approves and the committee proposes an implementation plan within the next two months, Walters said, "I would expect to see some sort of actual physical implementation sometime next spring... and our operating jointly by April."

Walters also foresaw the potential of a larger consolidation of dispatching services. "There's some possibility, I think, that Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Northville and Northville Township could look at combining dispatch. We would then be a community somewhat like Westland and Canton," he said. "We'd operate with a single dispatch desk with two dispatchers."

But Walters said there has been no official discussion between Northville and Plymouth officials about such a plan.

dividual tasks and additional administrative tasks.

Snider said the plan to combine staffs is based on sound community planning.

He said contiguous borders and identical radio frequency and labor representation make for a feasible shared services plan. Finance plays a big role in the proposed change, Snider said.

"It's about time the governments look to save money," he said. "I think

the city and township will see a decrease in costs."

Combined township/city police budgets are nearly \$3 million.

Snider did not say if savings would come from staff cutbacks.

"We haven't determined the labor factor yet," he said. "(We'll probably keep) the same people on board... There will be a lot of job security."

The township employs three full-time dispatchers and one full-time clerk/dispatcher. Four full-time dispatchers work for the city.

Cannon called the potential move

toward shared services "preliminary."

"We're just talking about concepts," he said. He also said it was premature to speculate on other joint police operations.

"All we've talked about is the idea of (combining) dispatchers," he said. Township Supervisor Georgina Goss was cautiously optimistic about the plan.

"I think it's something that can be achieved," she said. "I concur and the board concurs that a study about combined police services could be beneficial."

## SITE PLANS: *Designers mix one part art, one part science*

The best-designed sites are those that don't interfere with the natural conditions of the property.

And some say you can go nature one step better.

Defining a good site is difficult because it's hard to quantify many of the intangibles that are the site's makeup: individual site shapes, the layout of the roads, the preservation of indigenous flora and fauna, the subtlety with which the lots blend with the natural setting. A good development site is part science, part art.

They have what the French call — a certain "je ne sais quoi."

Gary Shapiro, president of the Ivanhoe Companies in West Bloomfield, said he looks for the difficult, yet interesting sites others may have passed up: those that have environmental assets and natural amenities. Shapiro developed Mission Springs on Darb Lake, a single-family residential project in West Bloomfield, which was chosen by the American Planning Association Michigan Chapter as the best-designed development of 1989.

Shapiro is also developing Woodland Ridge, another single-family development, and The Pointe on Pleasant Lake, a condominium development, also in West Bloomfield.

"Good development," he said, "means individually balanced lots and a balanced development site." Excavations of each site should be limited, using excavated soil for base-ments or foundations on the site.

Wetlands are built around, rather than destroyed; mature trees are saved; roads and house sites are put in with little grading; the natural topography is used to enhance developments; and when it comes to utilities, the distance between two points need not be a straight line.

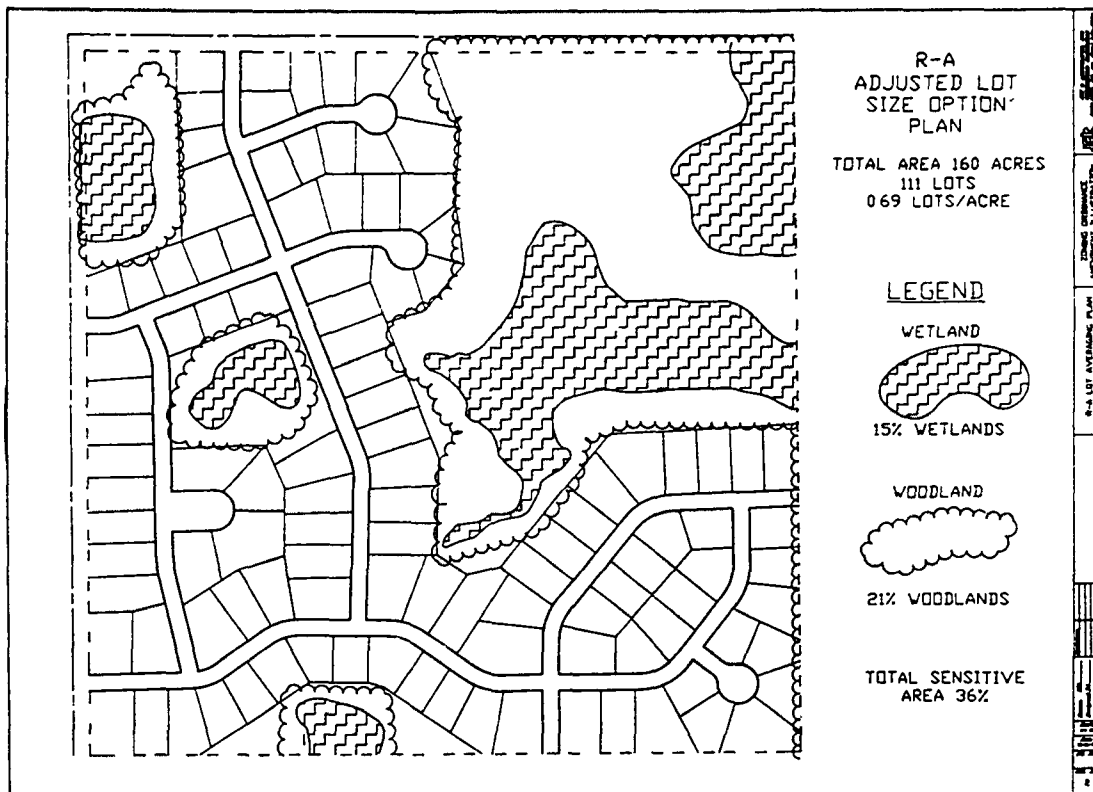
"Sometimes there has to be some mitigation of one to help the others," he said.

Shapiro said many good sites are ruined because they are overdeveloped. "Not every square foot needs to be developed."

In the past, builders would squeeze an extra home on a development, but builders have discovered a nicer, less cramped site will sell for more and make up for the lost home sale.

Robert Leighton, president of Robert C. Leighton Associates Inc. in Ann Arbor, said good site development involves looking beyond the boundaries of the property to be developed. Open spaces between two properties should match up and complement each other, and nearby architectural or natural characteristics should blend smoothly from one area to the next.

Robert C. Leighton Associates designed the site plans for Blue Heron Pointe — which was chosen by the

American Planning Association Michigan Chapter as the best-designed development of 1990 — and Huntington Falls, the multi-use Northville Township development being put together by a team headed by the Robert A. DeMatia Co. in Plymouth.

"We like to start out with a site inventory," Leighton said. Existing slopes and topography are measured, vegetation and soil types are catalogued, and views and even solar orientation are noted.

"Any constraints or any features you might want to consider are taken down at this point," he said. "The site sets the stage for the design."

Although the site's existing characteristics largely determine the end design, there are still alternatives, Leighton said. "There are going to be tradeoffs."

For example, it may be necessary to cut down some trees to preserve some wetlands, he said. "You try to balance everything out." Leighton said the problem with many sites is they lack sound design principles. For example, repeating landscaping treatment and the placement of buildings gives a site a sense of order, but then the developer must be careful not to be too repetitious, which makes a site monotonous.

"It's very subtle — there's a symmetry and rhythm to good site development," Leighton said. Good sites

have balance, they harmonize with their surroundings, and they have focal points that emphasize site characteristics.

"And a good site should have a little mystery as well," Leighton added, saying not everything should be revealed at first glance.

Dennis Dickstein, chairman and chief executive officer of Ralph Manuel and Associates in Birmingham, said good sites start with good land.

Dickstein is managing the lot sales for the Pine Creek Ridge subdivision in Brighton, developed by Abbey Homes in Birmingham, which is the site of the Builders Association of Southeast Michigan Homearama.

Control of the site, from the first walk over until turning over the keys on the last homes or structure, is paramount for the success of the project, he said.

The way land is developed today has matured within the past decade. In the past, the developer would bend the land to his will, bulldozing trees, excavating tons of dirt and filling wetlands with little thought.

But today developers work with the land, using the rolling topography, natural and mature landscape, and even saving and preserving wetlands as water retention and natural areas.

Why? "Because that's what people want," Dickstein said. Developers are

in business to make a profit and the best way to stay in business, he said, is to make sure people get what they want.

And that means going that extra step. "People don't want straight streets with similar homes in rows. In some (developments) you can take a piece of string and run it down the street and some part of each house will touch it — you won't see that (in good developments)."

Dickstein said sometimes a developer just knows when a site is going to be special, but potential and realization are not the same thing. Good sites may start with a good piece of land, but ecologists, landscape architects, planners quickly are worked into the equation.

Dickstein said Abbey Homes president Robert Katzman set out with

## Shake up business with old customers

Throughout this series, I have frequently made use of the term "current and potential customers" to identify two of the major target markets served by any business organization. But what about the forgotten "third" market — your firm's inactive customers?

Believe it or not, this market may represent your greatest opportunity for increased sales. Before spending time and money on promotional strategies to attract "current and potential customers" this year or next, you may want to focus on this potential business that's right under your nose.

Research conducted on the topic indicates that active customers become inactive when a business stops paying attention to them. A much smaller percentage ceases dealing with organizations because of unresolved complaints or inferior products and services.

The data here suggests that customers should never be taken for granted if you expect them to remain loyal over the long term.

The first step in bringing your dead customers back to life is to identify who they are. Using your customer list as a guide, isolate those who have not done business with you as often as can reasonably be expected.

Depending on the nature of your business, customers may be considered inactive after as little as two weeks or as long as two years.

Prepare a letter to all of these inactive accounts. Let them know what is going on in your business and give them one or more good

reasons to start buying from you again. It is, of course, vital to emphasize how valued these customers are to your company.

If you operate a retail business, don't make the mistake of sending out fliers or coupons in lieu of a letter. The same rule applies for business service firms that merely mail out newsletters or announcements to their inactive accounts. These supplementary materials may be included with a letter, but they do nothing to prompt the reactivation process.

Remember that the purpose of this first contact is to get your foot in the door so you can begin to rebuild your former relationship.

If an inactive customer does not respond to your initial letter(s), try calling him or her personally by phone. Ask why the individual or their organization has stopped dealing with your business.

If they mention a past conflict or complaint, resolve it right away. Then you will be in a better position to offer customer incentives that work for your business rather than against it.

In general, it takes a minimum of four contacts during a 30-day period to re-establish your business identity with inactive customers. It takes approximately 60 days and from four to six contacts before these customers become active once again.

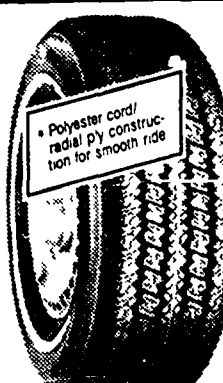
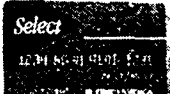

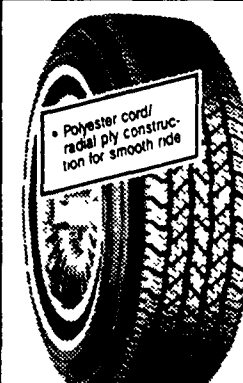

## Board needs education in responsibility

Our board refuses to increase the assessment to meet urgently needed repairs to the common areas and to hire a lawyer. The board is afraid it will be ridiculed by members, some of whom are on fixed incomes. I am concerned about the propriety of their actions as I am on the board with no insurance. Do I resign?

No. Even if you had insurance, which you should, you would still be vulnerable to being sued for mismanagement. Your board suffers from the malady of many boards — an unwillingness to raise and then spend adequate monies to properly run the association's affairs. This malady affects affluent as well as modest or low-income condominiums.

The answer is educating the board members as to their liabilities and responsibilities to run the condominium like a business, which requires proper maintenance of the project together with property management and legal assistance. A book full of legal cases where boards have been found liable for their misdeeds might be a therapeutic and mandatory reading session for the board encouraged by you.

Don't quit. Stay on and fight for what you know is right and what is correct and in the best interests of all members of the association.

The railroad is tearing up and removing some track just outside the confines of our condominium. We want to use it for recreational vehicle storage. What can we do to get the property for the association?

Find out if the railroad is selling the right of way in individual parcels or whether it is being dedicated to a municipality or the like. Contact the railroad to express the association's interest in the right of way.

If so, the association would obtain a warranty deed to the property. Watch out for any potential title problems plus access problems. Get a survey and a title insurance policy with the help of your association's lawyer. Also, get an environmental report on the property and make sure your association has the authority to "buy" the tract.

## Common problems plague exteriors

A successful house exterior starts with an honest assessment.

According to Remodeling Ideas magazine, most houses in need of help suffer from one of these problems:

- Not enough detail: A house without interesting architectural details is rarely memorable. Details can be added with shutters, window boxes, trim, moldings or other new features. Use paint to accent present detailing.

- Too much detail: Some houses mix too many materials and styles. Take such houses back to basics. Strip away oddball elements. Paint mismatched material the same color, or invest in unified cladding.
- Poor proportions: Use landscaping tricks or a new color scheme to shape up a house with awkward lines. Consider dormers, porches or a new entry to balance the exterior.

As architectural details are added and subtracted, go for a look that's consistent with the basic lines, age and setting of the house.

To help visualize the changes, try this: Enlarge a photo of the house's exterior, then put tracing paper over the top. Trace the house, then sketch in features that are being considered.

Many exterior makeovers start with paint. To bring out the best in a home, use three colors: a basic field color for siding or brick; a trim color for borders around windows and doors and the soffit and fascia; and an accent color for shutters, the front door and any other small details. Keep in mind the roof color as the scheme is planned.

Ideas for color schemes can be picked up from houses that are admired, or from groupings suggested by paint manufacturers.

Some paint stores offer a video color selection service. Homeowners can look at a video image of a house styled like theirs and see how it looks painted in different combinations.

Cladding a house with new materials may be the best choice if the old exterior is unattractive, mismatched, or if an all-new

look is wanted. Choices include:

- Wood siding: Beveled wood siding, especially narrow clapboard, is still the look of tradition. For a contemporary look, use a top grade of cedar or redwood and stain it.
- Synthetic sidings: Vinyl or aluminum sidings mimic the look of wood, sometimes very well.

Consider leaving special window or door trims exposed so character isn't sacrificed. Or, have trim custom-clad with aluminum that's molded to fit on-site. To add detail, ask about special trims for windows, doors and eaves.

- Wood shakes and shingles: Shakes are rough-hewn for a more rustic look. Shingles are cut smoother; trim siding with

fancy-cut shingles for a Victorian flavor.

- Brick and stone veneers: These are premium products, and they denote long-lasting quality. They can be applied only on the front, or around the entire house.
- Stucco: This mixture of cement, sand and water makes the look of many Southwestern, Tudor and contemporary houses. New stucco systems not only refinish a house but insulate it, too.

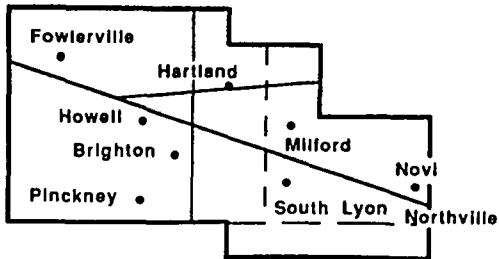

But the fact is, it cut short the life of this majestic oak.

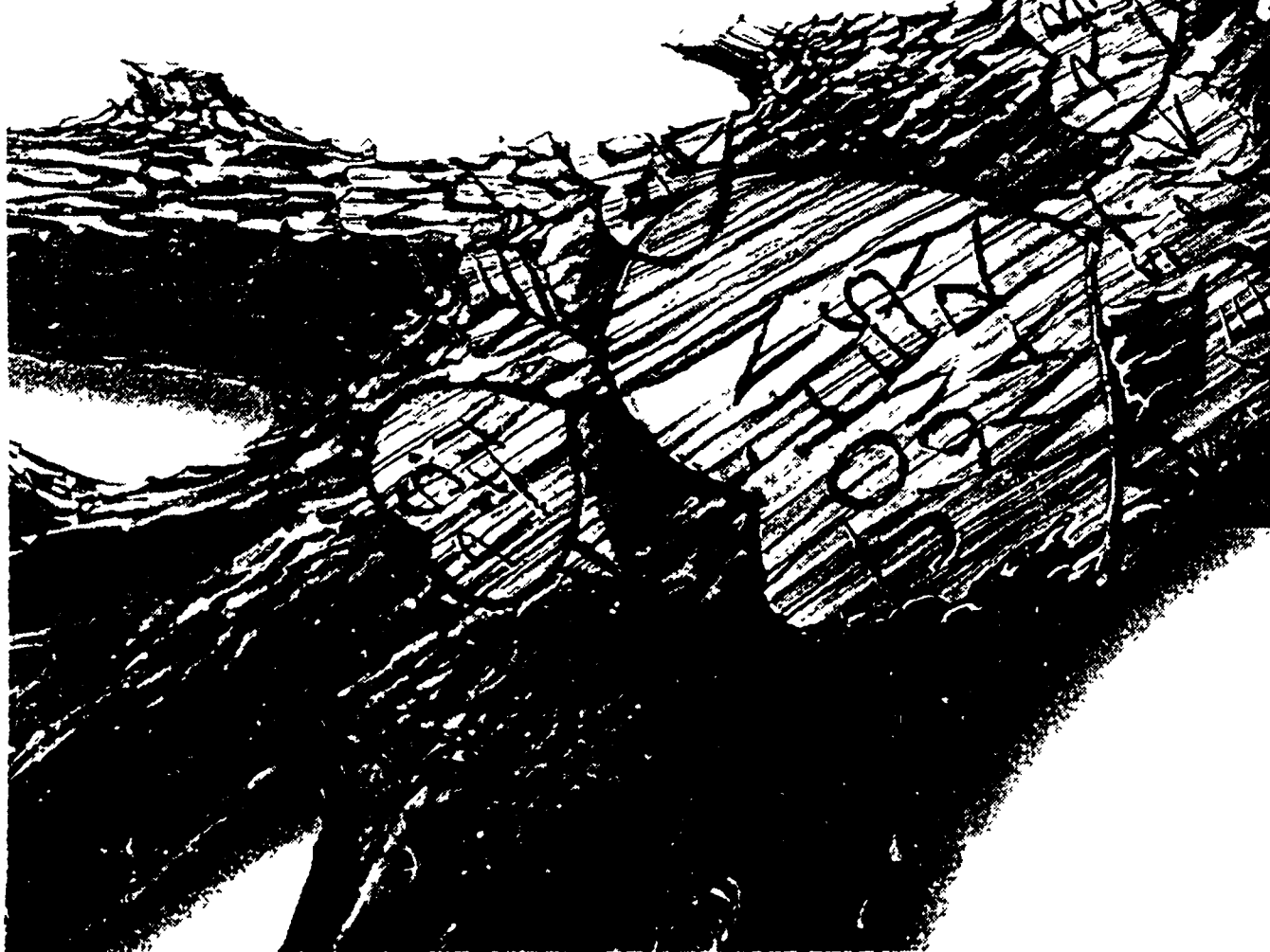
By gouging into the bark, vandals crippled the tree's vascular system. So, like thousands of other innocent victims each year, the tree slowly died.

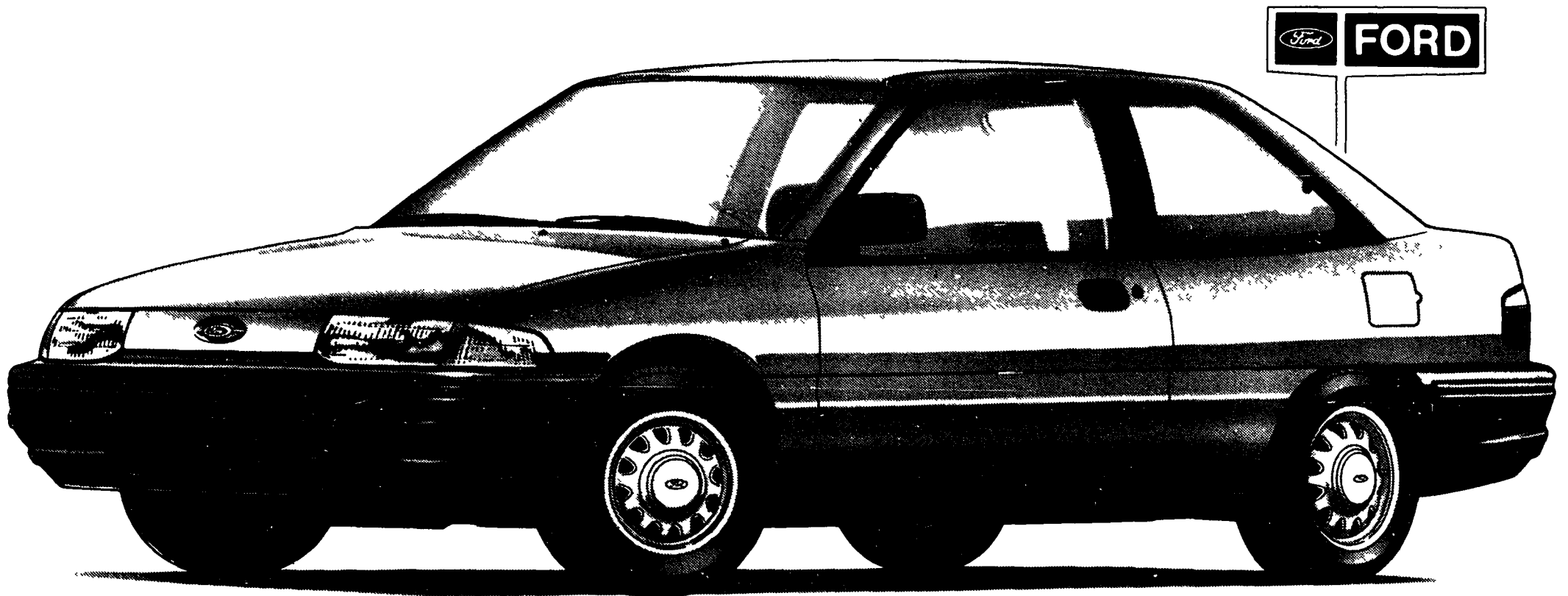

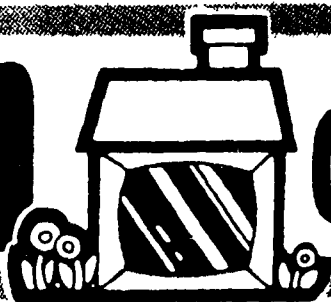

As I walked through the studio door, Betty Schelling and her production crew of Vita

Accioli, Fran Dudas, Gretchen Pugsley, Ken Glide, Bob Wightman, Mel Shulman, Linda Newman and Cathy Stolzer were all quietly setting up for the shoot.

This group of warm and professional people are diligent volunteers who produce very fine television.

I was asked by Producer-Director Betty Schelling to host her series entitled, "WOMEN ON THE MOVE." it is quite a privilege to be able to do an interview and then go on to other responsibilities. The tough part however, is forcing yourself to concentrate on a subject intently for a couple of hours and wiping out all other projects. Most of the shows are taped in the morning. I am a morning person, but a "quiet energy" morning person. Though I move around quickly, talking is an effort.

However, I am motivated by the special opportunity to have a conversation with special people who represent a cause or an organization. Guests on "WOMEN ON THE MOVE" are always such caring and interesting people. With an hour to explore the subject matter, the dialogue goes far beyond the superficial level. As interviewer I must concentrate, be curious and work hard to bring out the unique personality of the guests. All these elements insure that the program has the continuity and the dynamics to keep the attention of the television audience.

Interviewing in this manner is very hard, but rewarding. I am always exhausted afterward. Nevertheless, each production has run very smoothly. The preproduction planning and the

precision of the production crew is evident in the final product. The guests comment on how laid back and organized everyone is. This is the ultimate compliment to a Producer.

My style of interviewing is to spend a couple of minutes beforehand with the guest. I don't ask them many questions so that I will not lose the important element of spontaneity. I explain to the guest the format of the interview and ask if there are any areas which they do not want me to broach. I approach an interview as if I were writing a book about the person. This encourages them to share details they might otherwise not discuss.

In this way an interview becomes much more intimate. The conversation then becomes intriguing to the television audience. They become very involved and feel as if they are sitting there with us.

"WOMEN ON THE MOVE" guests have been insightful and stimulating.

Barbara Levin warmly shared her life experiences as our guest. It was interesting to hear of her career changes and role priorities. She has worked on war missile research and computers; she also has a law degree. She has practiced law in Washington D.C., raised a family and has been a supportive wife of Senator Carl Levin. She was knowledgeable and interesting yet relatively low key. I was impressed with her charisma and drive. Barbara Levin is definitely a woman on the move.

Nancy Swanborg, Marcie BloomVettese and Marlene Kershaw joined us as representatives of Schoolcraft Colleges Women's Resource Center. The Center deals with changes and transitions in people's lives. Programs are available to lend support services, grants and education to women and men who are adjusting to divorce, separation, death or a disability, and

need to find paid employment. These three women were a wonderful representation of determination and resourcefulness. So many services these days are token, but not the Womens Resource Center. Through three different programs they try to secure the most appropriate means of enhancing the potential for success in each individual, while they open a new chapter of their lives.

Botsford General Hospital's Director of Volunteers, Adele Emmer, shared with us the excitement generated through the Volunteer Organizations of Botsford including the Red Cross Volunteers, Volunteer Guild (Gift Shop) and a new program for Patient and Guest Room Service. Nancy Lawton, Doris Gaiser and Nancy Adams spoke on their experiences as they personalize the services provided through Botsford General Hospital. As women on the move, they shared the wonderful experiences that both the patients and they have had through the years, as each benefit from the relationship developed by giving to one another. The Volunteer programs include the entire hospital, spreading hard work among their staff so that the burden is easier for everyone.

Nancy Schmidt of the Rehabilitation Institute of Michigan challenged our television audience to bring humor into our lives. She told us of the studies and specific cases where a sense of humor has enhanced the lives of people and family members who are stricken with ailments that require extra patience and commitment. Most people think one needs to be happy to find humor in a situation. She suggests that humor is a mind set and that if we look for it and smile, the rest will fall into place. Humor simply makes us feel good and eases tension, therefore, it is healthy and healing.



# Candice Bergen identifies with 'Murphy Brown' character

## Show going strong in its third season

In a career that has included stage, television and film, as well as journalism. Candice Bergen has found a role that fits like a glove and allows her to do the comedy she has desired to do since childhood.

She is firmly set in the third season of her critically acclaimed series on CBS, "Murphy Brown."

Mostly the laughs belonged to Charlie."

Now Bergen is in her third year of getting the laughs as television journalist Murphy Brown. Mixed with the pressures of her profession is quite a bit of humor, from the diverse personalities on the "F.Y.I." staff to Eldin, the housepainter who seems to be eternally working on her apartment.

Bergen said people seem to relate to the situation with Eldin, and newspeople with whom she has spoken fully understand the ironies that come from juggling journalism

with home life.

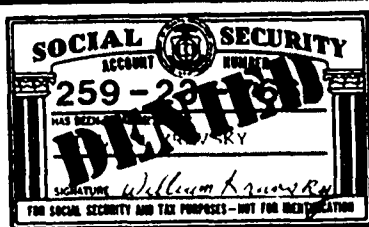
"Almost everyone had a story that was the equivalent of hanging up on a Secretary of State to talk to the house painter," she said.

Playing housepainter Eldin Bernecky is Robert Pastorelli. The character is a thorn in Murphy's side, but he is also a source of support once she gets home from the studio.

### Jane Pauley to continue to explore 'Real Life'

Jane Pauley has signed a five-year contract with NBC News, and her new program, *Real Life with Jane Pauley*, will return to the NBC prime-time schedule mid-season as a regular weekly series. *Real Life* presents a fresh look at life in the 1990s. The program premiered with five specials this summer and was a critical and ratings success, examining subjects that interest the average American and probing the problems and concerns we all confront daily.

U.S. troops in the Middle East will be receiving "home video" letters from the cast and crew of *Knots Landing*. In the taped messages, Joan Van Ark mimics her role as Val, Larry Riley sings and Kent Masters-King talks about her grandfather, the first African-American Marine. The theme of the messages: "We're thinking of you; you mean a lot to us; and we hope you get home soon."

*Motown 30: What's Goin' On*, a two-hour special celebrating the Motown Sound and the music and artistry of African-American performers who have influenced popular entertainment in America and around the world, was taped live at the Pantages Theatre in Los Angeles for broadcast in November on CBS.

International superstar singer Julio Iglesias will headline his first full-length concert special for American TV when HBO presents *Julio Iglesias: Starry Night*, debuting Nov. 24. The hour-long special was filmed in Los Angeles at the Greek Theatre.

John Spencer, who played Detective Lipranzer in *Presumed Innocent*, will join the cast of NBC's *L.A. Law* as a "rumpled but talented litigator." He becomes the 14th regular cast member.

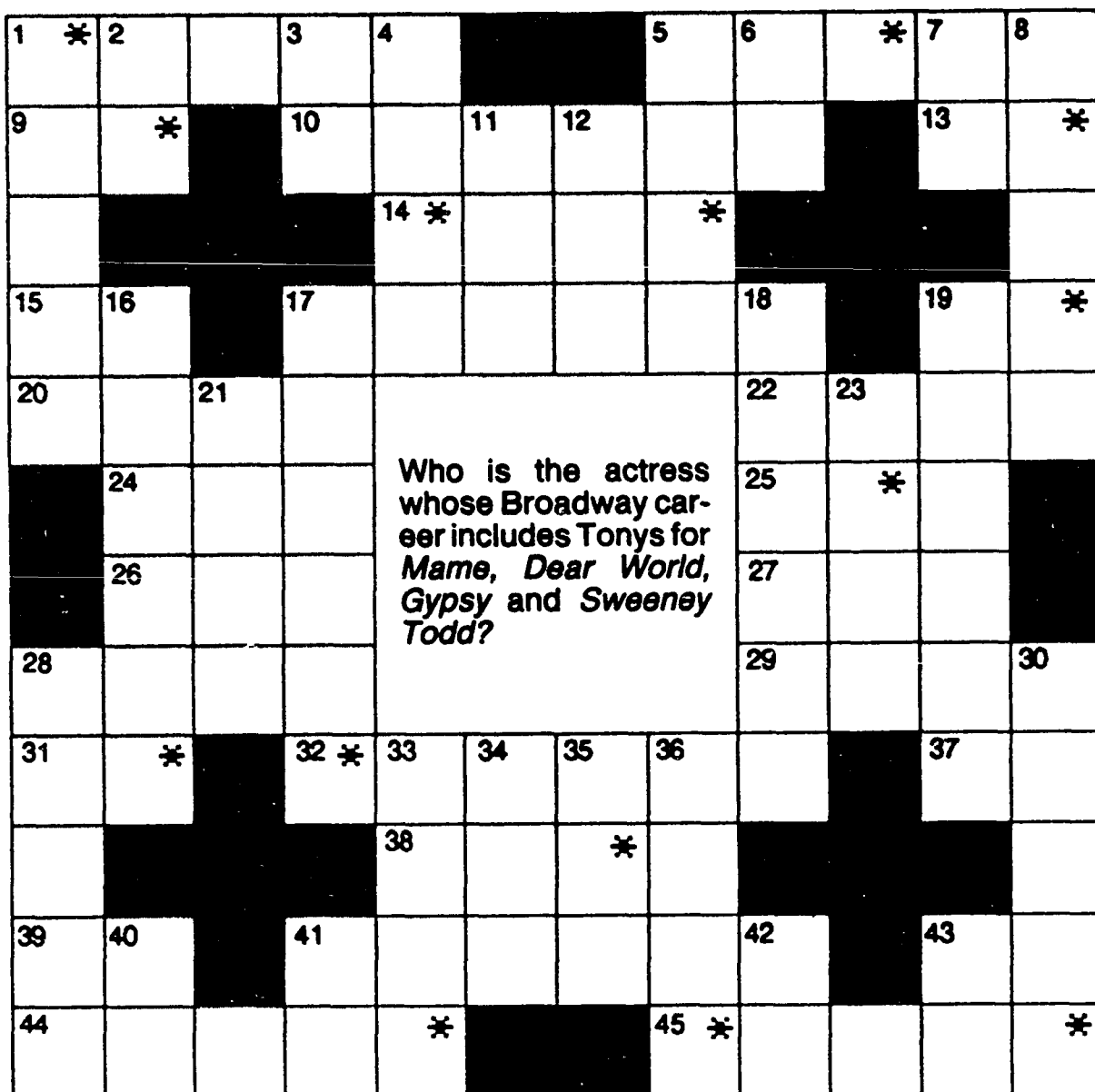
Williams first traveled to Hollywood in 1981 to play a key role on the TV series *Fame*. For a time she appeared on *Fame* and *Y&R* concurrently.

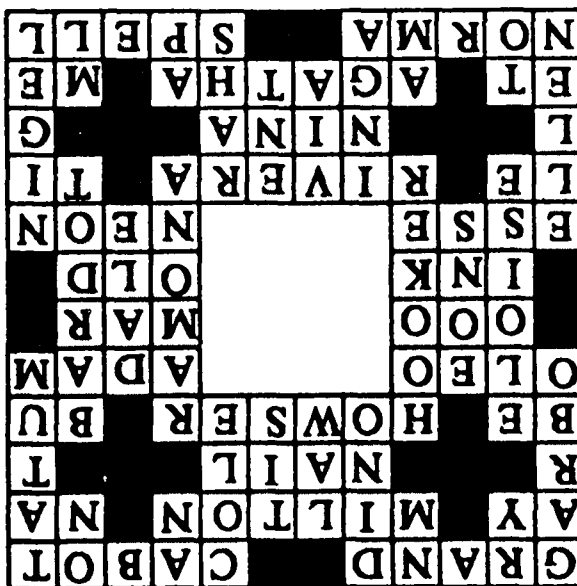

## TNT presents salute to Bugs Bunny

Over the course of 50 years, "wascally" Bugs Bunny has outsmarted Daffy Duck, frenzied Porky Pig and baffled Elmer Fudd — all with a carrot, a wink and an "Eh, what's up, Doc?" Monday, Nov. 12, TNT presents the two-hour special *What's Up Doc?: A Salute to Bugs Bunny*.

In the best of Bugs, producer-director Carl Lindahl goes behind the scenes to meet the cartoon's animators — the crazy people whose gags and pranks made the bunny a legend.

"The special shows not just where Bugs Bunny came from, but where the spirit and fun of Warner Bros. cartoons in general came from," said Lindahl.
